    - (1) HAC and RPA LO investigated a report of torture and murder of a nun in NGENDA. Investigation revealed that the lady involved was a caretaker at the church and had been accused by four witnesses of killing two children. She had been beaten by RPA soldiers but torture was not evident. A full report is available from CHAO and a copy of the report has been forwarded to UN Human Rights rapporteurs.
    - (2) Mr O'Mahoney of CONCERN remains as of 1800 hrs 03 Nov in custody of Gendarmerie in KIGALI due to incident reported on yesterday's SITREP. All attempts by Head Representative of CONCERN to meet with Gendarmerie Commander to negotiate release were unsuccessful. HAC was informed that a Ms Wong who represents the Irish Government has attempted to obtain release of the prisoner with UNAMIR RPA LO. As this incident has now reached the diplomatic level, CONCERN has been advised that HAC considers the case closed at HAC level.

Mr Fergus was released however Head of Gendarmerie would not release Mr O'Mahoney and will hold him in custody for the evening. RPA LO Lt Cameron visited the prisoner and reported him to be in good shape. Expected he will be released to Concern tomorrow and it would appear that he will be forced to leave the country soonest.

Sector 3 told to determine who is ordering the move, where it is planned to move them, and if nowhere is available then to negotiate that orphans remain until an orphanage can be found to accomodate them.

1. During the past 24 hours the following incidents are significant:

a. Displaced Persons

- (1) Routine IOC/UNHCR movement of DPs continued. DPs were moved from KIGALI to BYUMBA, KIBUNGU and NYAMATA. Numbers of DPs will be forthcoming from UNHCR. All three convoys were escorted by UNAMIR MILOBS.
- (2) Op HOMEWARD continued with BRITCON. DPs were transported from KIGALI to NGENDA. Numbers of DPs will be forthcoming from BRITCON.

b. Humanitarian Assistance

- (1) BRITCON assistance to ADRA in moving 60 tons of seed to GITWE continued.
- (2) UNAMIR transport assisted the Rwandese Government in transporting humanitarian assistance delivered by Guinea Bisseau to a government warehouse of the Minister of Rehabilitation.
- (3) HAC has received three requests for UNAMIR transport to assist with the movement of seeds to areas within Rwanda. To date requests have been received from TROCAIRE, SWISS DISASTER RELIEF and ADRA involving a total of some 120 tons of seed. At present six BRITCON vehicles are available for the task. HAC suggests that Op HOMEWARD be put on hold for several days to concentrate on seed distribution which is considered to be of a higher priority at this time.

c. Miscellaneous.

- (1) MSF representative in KIGALI approached HAC to determine what UNAMIR's response would be to the incident in NDABA camp in Sector 4B whereby DPs were fired upon by RPA soldiers and shelters were burned and DPs forced out of the camp. They expressed that this constitutes a violation of human rights and should be protested. They substantiated the FRAFBAT report as they had aid workers in the camp at the time of the incident. HAC advised them that they should seek updates from

their representatives in the camp to determine if the incident should be resolved at the sector/NGO level and advise HAC of any information in this regard. Incident was reported by FRAFBAT on daily SITREP fo 18 Oct 94.

- (2) A humanitarian delegation from NIGERIA arrived in KIGALI to discuss delivery of humanitarian assistance to Rwanda.

(1) HAC arranged transport of 25 tons of OXFAM water equipment to GIKONGORO. Transport desk UNAMIR organized transport for 03 Oct.

(2) HAC and UNAMIR LO investigated robbery at Fraternite Saint Dominique at KACYIRU close to the Egyptian Embassy. At 301900 SEP 94 two men dressed like RPA soldiers entered the compound of the fraternite and ordered 2 Canadian, one Swiss, one Italian, one burundese and 3 rwandese citizen to give them all their money. Then the victims had to lay down on the floor and a soldier armed with a pistol threatened to shoot them. Meanwhile the other soldier armed with a rifle looted the house. One soldier guarded the vehicle of the culprits in front of the building. The victims have reported this incident to Gendarmerie which have guarded the house for the rest of the night. Gendarmerie has agreed to do this also tonight. RPA/ Gendarmerie is investigating this case. UNAMIR LO monitors progress of investigation.

(3) HAC attended Transport Coordination Unit meeting. This meeting was attended by IOM, UNHCR, ATLAS, UNREO, WFP and HAC. Main points were:

- a. Total of DPs transported has decreased by 50 % compared to last week. Exact figures will be available on 03 Oct.
- b. For present requirements enough transport is available. However ATLAS and WFP have stated that they are more and more often confronted with requests for 4x4 transport as rainy season and seed distribution is progressing. WFP has a demand for 15 tons per day for 4x4 trucks for short distances in Sector 3. HAC will contact UNAMIR transport desk on this matter.

Although SOLITARITE could provide proper documents, Prefect of GIKONGORO is reluctant to return vehicles. He stated that this type was the standard troop carrier of former RGF and as SOLITARITE is also operating in BURUNDI, there might be a connection between RGF and this trucks.

HAC has clarified this case with RPA LO to UNREO and hand over of trucks to SOLITARITE should take place late afternoon of 30 Sep or early 01 Oct. If hand over does not take place at that dates SOLITARITE intends to forward formal complaint to RPA through UNAMIR HQ. HAC monitors closely.

(1) BRITCON had planned to redeploy trucks back to KIGALI in the afternoon of 28 SEP because DPs in SECTOR 4 refuse to return to SECTOR 3. Reason for that refusal is most likely radio station transmitting anti-RPA propaganda and rumors (ref. our sitrep 156 dated 28 SEP).

The stations accuses RPA ~~to~~ <sup>of</sup> massacre <sup>of</sup> returning refugees and to loot their belongings. The station also suggests to come to take refuge in BURUNDI. *urges displaced persons.*

(2) HAC liaised with MilOb HQ in GITARAMA. MilOb report that the evacuation of refugees in KABGAYI is almost completed. MilOb also report that CONCERN are not capable ~~to~~ <sup>of</sup> providing sufficient food and supplies for orphans in this area. A detailed report on orphanage situation has been furnished and the future responsibility for these orphanages will be reviewed with UNREO, UNICEF and CONCERN.
