

DAILY SITREP FOR 27 JAN 96

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 28. ALL CAME FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 10821 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES NSTR.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), ON 22 JAN 96 IN BAADA SECTEUR (GR 0031), THE RPA CONFIRMED TO LOCALS THAT THEY HAD KILLED SIX MEN WHO THEY HAD ARRESTED EARLIER IN THE AREA. THEY CLAIMED THAT THESE PEOPLE WERE FRGF MEN. THAT ASSERTION WAS NOT CONFIRMED BY MILOBS. ALSO ON 24 JAN 96 AN 18 YEAR OLD BOY WAS KILLED ACCIDENTALLY BY THE RPA IN RWUMBA (GR 1333), DETAILS OF THE KILLING TO BE CONFIRMED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), IN CYABINGO COMMUNE, ONE FRGF WAS ARRESTED ON 16 JAN 96 AND KEPT IN THE COMMUNE CELL BUT ESCAPED. BOTH THE LOCAL RPA COMD AND BURGOMASTER CONFIRMED THAT HE CAME FROM ZAIRE WITH A SABOTAGE MISSION.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 82 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT RUYENZI CAMP FROM KIBUNGO, BUTARE AND NKAMIRA. 27 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI TOWN AND KIBUNGO. A TOTAL OF 167 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

A. INDBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO "CONCERN INTERNATIONAL" FOR DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS AND FOOD STUFF FROM KIGALI TO VARIOUS COMMUNES IN BUTARE, ALSO DISTRIBUTED 100 PACKETS OF SWEETS TO MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY (MOTHER TERESA'S GROUP)



ORPHANAGE AT KIGALI AND KIBUNGO ON THE OCCASION OF INDIAN  
REPUBLIC DAY.

B. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED 2 DOZERS AT ALTERNATE TRANSIT  
CAMPS IN BUTARE AND CYANGUGU AND ALSO PROVIDED A VEHICLE TO  
ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

C. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF  
WOOD FROM RUNDA TO KIBAYA ON THE REQUEST FROM A LOCAL  
ORGANISATION ARDEC.

D. MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 46 MEDICAL AND 8 DENTAL PATIENTS

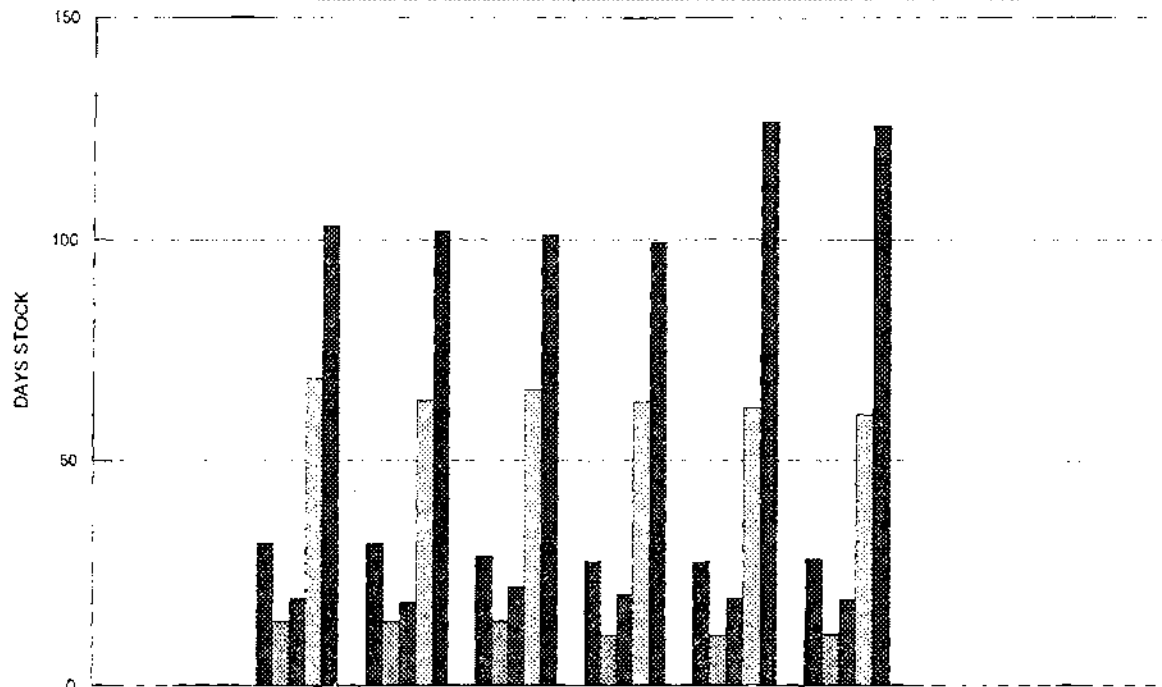

DAILY SITREP FOR 26 JAN 96

111. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 207. 158 ARRIVED FROM ZAIRE AND 49 FROM TANZANIA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 10793 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO UNAMIR ON JANUARY 96, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, DR. ANASTASE GASSANA TOOK STRONG EXCEPTION TO THE REMARKS OF THE UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCERNING RWANDA. HE STATED THAT THE POLICY OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION IS BEING DULY FOLLOWED AND FAIRLY EVIDENT BY WAY REINTEGRATION OF 4000 SOLDIERS OF AND OFFICERS OF EX-RGF, RECEPTION WITHOUT PROBLEMS OF 15000 REFUGEES EXPELLED FROM ZAIRE LAST YEAR.

B. AS TO THE RETURN OF THE REFUGEES , THE PROBLEM IS BEING CREATED THROUGH MANIPULATION BY INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL FACTOR BY THE FORMER LEADERS OF THE COUNTRY, THE MILITIAS, THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GENOCIDE.

C. ACCORDING TO RWANDAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, THE UNITED NATIONS PRESENCE AFTER THE EXPIRY OF THE UNAMIR MANDATE COULD WELL BE FELT WITH WORKING OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL, UNDP, UNICEF AND UNHCR. HE SUGGESTED THAT THE MONEY BEING SPENT ON UNAMIR MUST HENCEFORTH BE MADE AVAILABLE TO INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR IT TO BE MUCH MORE OPERATIONAL THAN IT HAS BEEN UNTIL NOW.

D. UNITED NATIONS MAY CONTRIBUTE IN THE FUTURE BY WAY OF DEVELOPMENT AID. ACCORDING TO DR. GASANA 70,000 PUPILS ARE WAITING TO ENTER SECONDARY SCHOOL, WHEREAS THE GOVERNMENT CAN HARDLY TAKE 10 PERCENT OF THEM. INSTEAD OF MAINTAINING UNAMIR, CONCLUDED THE MINISTER THE UNITED NATIONS SHOULD BUILD SCHOOLS FOR PUPILS. THAT IS WHAT THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IS WAITING FOR.



3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES NSTR.A. RPA/GENDARMERIE NSTR.B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) SECTOR 5 -[ GISENYI] LOCALS CONFIRMED THE RE-EMERGENCE OF FRGF ACTIVITIES AT GACURABWZENGE SECTOR[GR 2625]. SOURCE DISCLOSED THAT ONE MR. SAMUEL NYANKINDI WAS ABDUCTED TO ZAIRE ON THE 22 JAN 96. HE WAS RELEASED THE NEXT DAY. DETAIL BEING OBTAINED.

(2) ON THE NIGHT OF 25 JAN 96 THERE WERE EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN RPA AND FRGF WHEN ABOUT 10 FRGF RAIDED GACURABWZENGE SECTOR [GR2625] TO STEAL GOATS. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED.

(3) AT MUKINGO COMMUNE A BOX CONTAINING MILITARY UNIFORMS AND MINE WIRES WERE DISCOVERED AT RWINZOVI SECTOR[4830] IN A BUSH ON 23 JAN 96. NO ARREST HAS BEEN MADE.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 94 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT RUYENZI CAMP FROM GIKONGORO AND NKAMIRA. 54 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI , NYAGATARE, BYUMBA ,KIBUNGO AND GITARAMA. A TOTAL NO OF 112 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED 2 DOZERS TO ALTERNATE TRANSIT CAMPS IN BUTARE AND CYANGUGU. AND ALSO PROVIDED ESCORT TO ESKO VEH FROM KIGALI TO NYUNDO.

C. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUNDA TO KIBAYA ON THE REQUEST FROM A LOCAL ORGANISATION ARDEC.

D. MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 96 MEDICAL AND 4 DENTAL PATIENTS

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 5, AT RUGANDA VILLAGE [5192] IN RAMA COMMUNE THREE PERSONS WERE REPORTEDLY KILLED AND 18 OTHERS SERIOUSLY WOUNDED WHEN THEIR VEH DETONATED ANTI- TANK MINES ON 25 JAN 96.

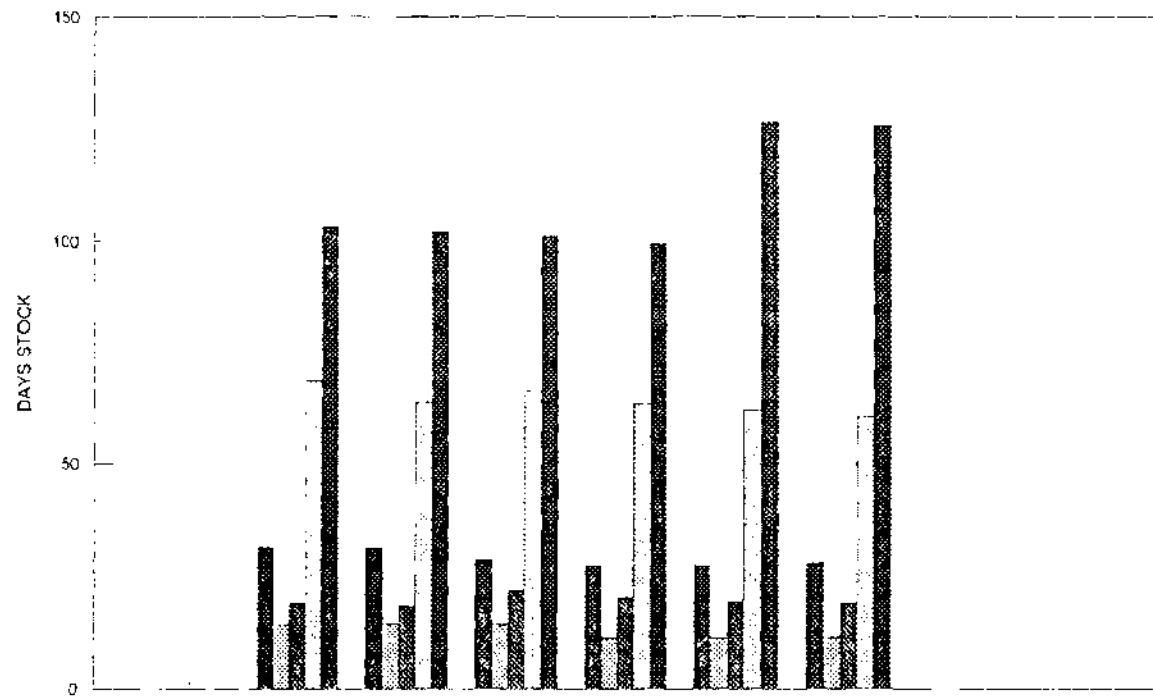



111. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 207. 158 ARRIVED FROM ZAIRE AND 49 FROM TANZANIA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 10793 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO UNAMIR ON JANUARY 96, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, DR. ANASTASE GASSANA TOOK STRONG EXCEPTION TO THE REMARKS OF THE UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCERNING RWANDA. HE STATED THAT THE POLICY OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION IS BEING DULY FOLLOWED AND FAIRLY EVIDENT BY WAY REINTEGRATION OF 4000 SOLDIERS OF AND OFFICERS OF EX-RGF, RECEPTION WITHOUT PROBLEMS OF 15000 REFUGEES EXPELLED FROM ZAIRE LAST YEAR.

B. AS TO THE RETURN OF THE REFUGEES , THE PROBLEM IS BEING CREATED THROUGH MANIPULATION BY INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL FACTOR BY THE FORMER LEADERS OF THE COUNTRY, THE MILITIAS, THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GENOCIDE.

C. ACCORDING TO RWANDAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, THE UNITED NATIONS PRESENCE AFTER THE EXPIRY OF THE UNAMIR MANDATE COULD WELL BE FELT WITH WORKING OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL, UNDP, UNICEF AND UNHCR. HE SUGGESTED THAT THE MONEY BEING SPENT ON UNAMIR MUST HENCEFORTH BE MADE AVAILABLE TO INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR IT TO BE MUCH MORE OPERATIONAL THAN IT HAS BEEN UNTIL NOW.

D. UNITED NATIONS MAY CONTRIBUTE IN THE FUTURE BY WAY OF DEVELOPMENT AID. ACCORDING TO DR. GASANA 70,000 PUPILS ARE WAITING TO ENTER SECONDARY SCHOOL, WHEREAS THE GOVERNMENT CAN HARDLY TAKE 10 PERCENT OF THEM. INSTEAD OF MAINTAINING UNAMIR, CONCLUDED THE MINISTER THE UNITED NATIONS SHOULD BUILD SCHOOLS FOR PUPILS. THAT IS WHAT THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IS WAITING FOR.

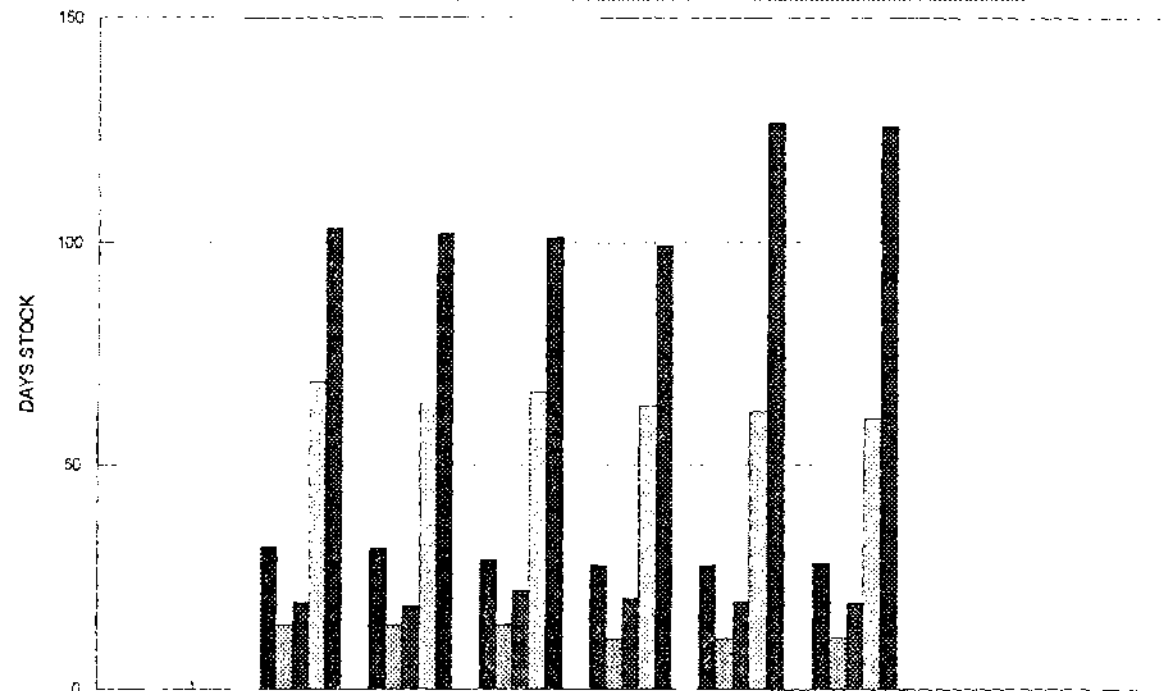



111. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 354. 321 ARRIVED FROM ZAIRE AND 33 FROM BURUNDI. IN ADDITION TO THE CROSSINGS REPORTED EARLIER 98 CAME FROM TANZANIA ON 24 JAN AND 06 FROM BURUNDI ON 23-24 JAN 96. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 10,586 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE MINISTER FOR REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL INTEGRATION MR. PATRICK MAZIMPAKA HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE ON WEDNESDAY, 24 JAN 96 IN WHICH HE REAFFIRMED HIS GOVERNMENT'S COMMITMENT TO WELCOME ALL REFUGEES BACK HOME UNCONDITIONALLY. HE SAID, RWANDA APPEALS TO ALL AGENCIES, ORGANISATIONS AND GOVERNMENTS TO EXERCISE REASONABLE INFLUENCE IN FACILITATING THE RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES NOW IN EXILE IN THE NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES.

B. THE MINISTER STATED THAT SINCE 1994 RWANDA HAS RECEIVED 130,000 REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI INCLUDING 10,000 THAT RETURNED IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER AND JANUARY. HE ALSO STATED THAT NECESSARY MECHANISMS HAVE BEEN ACTIVATED TO TAKE ALL REFUGEES IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CLOSURE OF NTAMBA CAMP. FURTHER, THE GOVERNMENT IS DESPATCHING A HIGH RANKING DELEGATION TO BUJUMBURA ON 28 JAN 96 TO HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE BURUNDIAN GOVERNMENT AND UNHCR ON THE WAYS OF ENHANCING A QUICK RETURN OF ALL REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI.

C. THE ABOVE STATEMENT IS IN RESPONSE TO THE UN SECRETARY GENERAL'S CONCERN REPORTED BY RADIO RWANDA THAT THE RWANDESE IS NOT PURSUING A POLICY OF RECONCILIATION SO VITALLY LINKED TO THE PROCESS OF REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES NOW BASED IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER ADDRESSED ALL MEMBERS OF THE INDIAN CONTINGENT IN KIGALI 25 JAN 96 ON THE EVE OF THEIR NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATIONS.



A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT AN RPA FOOT PATROL FIRED ON SUSPECTED FORMER MILITIA ON THE NIGHT OF 10/11 JAN IN NDORMA SECTOR (GR 4717) AND KILLED TWO OF THE SUSPECTS WHILE THE REST MANAGED TO ESCAPE.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ALSO REPORTED THAT RPA, DURING THE SEARCH IN KABERE 1 AND KABERE 2 SECTORS ON 22 JAN 96 ARRESTED 27 PERSONS ON CHARGE OF COLLABORATING WITH THE FRGF.

(3) ON 24 JAN 96 IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) AT NKOTSI SECT GR 6025 RPA NIGHT PATROL SHOT DEAD A MAN FOR VIOLATING THE NIGHT CURFEW AND FAILING TO STOP WHEN CHALLENGED.

(4) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT TWO RPA SOLDIERS DIED AND 16 WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED ON 16 JAN 96 WHEN AN RPA TRUCK DETONATED AN ANTI TANK MINE IN NANGA SECTOR (GR 4218) IN KARAGO COMMUNE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 3 (BUTARE) REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 23 JAN AN ARMED GROUP FIRED AT THE HEALTH CENTRE AT MUGANZA SECTOR BUT NO ONE WAS INJURED. THE SAME GROUP THEN MOVED TOWARDS THE PRIMARY SCHOOL LOCATED ABOUT 200 METRES AWAY AND THREW EXPLOSIVE SUSPECTED TO BE GRENADE IN ONE OF THE HOUSES SERIOUSLY WOUNDING ONE MAN AND THREE CHILDREN.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 3 (BUTARE) REPORTED THAT AT 2330H ON 23 JAN 96 SOME STUDENTS OF KIVU SECONDARY SCHOOL WERE FOUND IN POSSESSION OF KNIVES. THE DIRECTOR SOUGHT THE HELP OF RPA. JUST WHEN THE RPA ARRIVED GUN SHOTS WERE HEARD FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE SCHOOL DORMITORY AND LATER FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE DIRECTOR'S RESIDENCE. IT WAS LATER FOUND AT ABOUT 0400 HRS OF 24 JAN THAT TWO STUDENTS AND THE WIFE OF THE DIRECTOR HAD BEEN SHOT. THE TOYOTA PICK UP DONATED BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION WAS ALSO FOUND BURNT.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT ON 11 JAN 96 A FARMER FROM RAMBURA SECTOR (GR 4514) DIED OF MINE BLAST INJURY WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI-PERS MINE ON THE TRACK USED BY SCHOOL CHILDREN. TWO SUSPECTS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE INCIDENT. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT A STUDENT OF SECONDARY SCHOOL OF KAYOVE SECTOR (GR 2790) ALSO LOST HIS LEG IN THE MINE BLAST.

(4) THE MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ALSO REPORTED THAT A



HE HAND GRENADE WAS FOUND IN NKOTSI SECTOR (GR 6024) OF NYAKINAMA COMMUNE (GR 5827) ALONG A FOOT PATH ON 24 JAN 96.

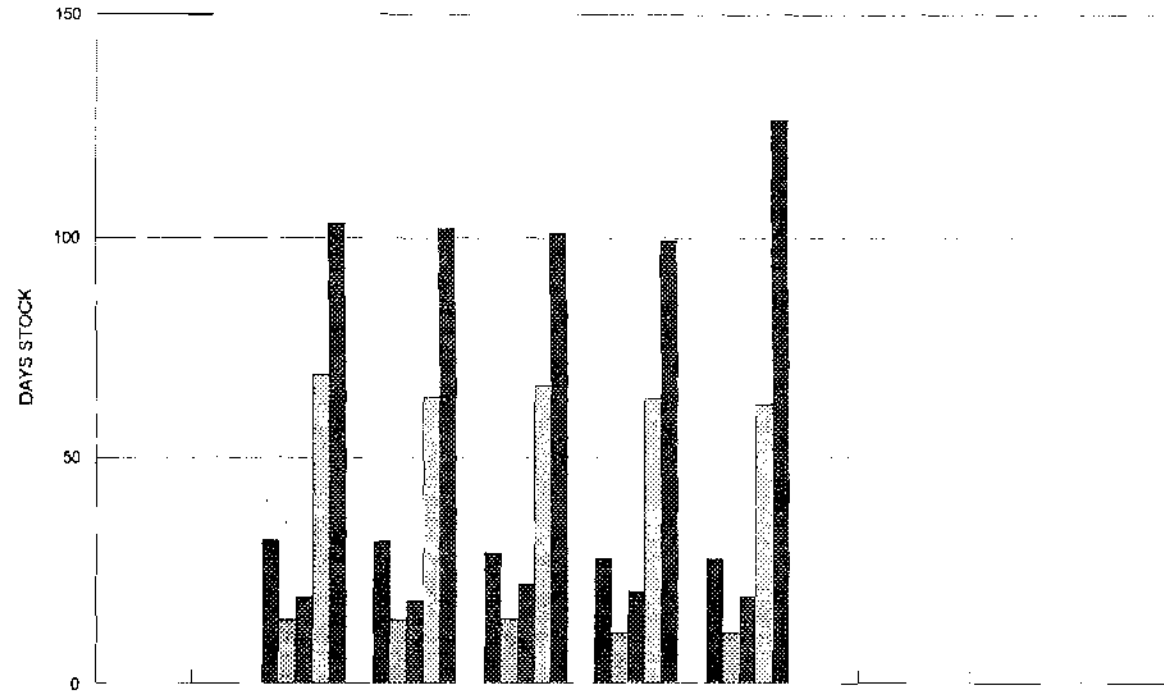

DAILY SITREP FOR 25 JAN 96

111. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECT 5 CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 354. 321 ARRIVED FROM ZAIRE AND 33 FROM BURUNDI. IN ADDITION TO THE CROSSINGS REPORTED EARLIER 98 CAME FROM TANZANIA ON 24 JAN AND 06 FROM BURUNDI ON 23-24 JAN 96. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 10,586 AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE MINISTER FOR REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL INTEGRATION MR. PATRICK MAZIMPAKA HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE ON WEDNESDAY, 24 JAN 96 IN WHICH HE REAFFIRMED HIS GOVERNMENT'S COMMITMENT TO WELCOME ALL REFUGEES BACK HOME UNCONDITIONALLY. HE SAID, RWANDA APPEALS TO ALL AGENCIES, ORGANISATIONS AND GOVERNMENTS TO EXERCISE REASONABLE INFLUENCE IN FACILITATING THE RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES NOW IN EXILE IN THE NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES.

B. THE MINISTER STATED THAT SINCE 1994 RWANDA HAS RECEIVED 130,000 REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI INCLUDING 10,000 THAT RETURNED IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER AND JANUARY. HE ALSO STATED THAT NECESSARY MECHANISMS HAVE BEEN ACTIVATED TO TAKE ALL REFUGEES IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CLOSURE OF NTAMBA CAMP. FURTHER, THE GOVERNMENT IS DESPATCHING A HIGH RANKING DELEGATION TO BUJUMBURA ON 28 JAN 96 TO HOLD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE BURUNDIAN GOVERNMENT AND UNHCR ON THE WAYS OF ENHANCING A QUICK RETURN OF ALL REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI.

C. THE ABOVE STATEMENT IS IN RESPONSE TO THE UN SECRETARY GENERAL'S CONCERN REPORTED BY RADIO RWANDA THAT THE RWANDESE IS NOT PURSUING A POLICY OF RECONCILIATION SO VITALLY LINKED TO THE PROCESS OF REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES NOW BASED IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES THE ACTING FORCE COMMANDER ADDRESSED ALL MEMBERS OF THE INDIAN CONTINGENT IN KIGALI 25 JAN 96 ON THE EVE OF THEIR NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATIONS.



A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT AN RPA FOOT PATROL FIRED ON SUSPECTED FORMER MILITIA ON THE NIGHT OF 10/11 JAN IN NDORMA SECTOR (GR 4717) AND KILLED TWO OF THE SUSPECTS WHILE THE REST MANAGED TO ESCAPE.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ALSO REPORTED THAT RPA, DURING THE SEARCH IN KABERE 1 AND KABERE 2 SECTORS ON 22 JAN 96 ARRESTED 27 PERSONS ON CHARGE OF COLLABORATING WITH THE FRGF.

(3) ON 24 JAN 96 IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) AT NKOTSI SECT GR 6025 RPA NIGHT PATROL SHOT DEAD A MAN FOR VIOLATING THE NIGHT CURFEW AND FAILING TO STOP WHEN CHALLENGED.

(4) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT TWO RPA SOLDIERS DIED AND 16 WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED ON 16 JAN 96 WHEN AN RPA TRUCK DETONATED AN ANTI TANK MINE IN NANGA SECTOR (GR 4218) IN KARAGO COMMUNE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 3 (BUTARE) REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 23 JAN AN ARMED GROUP FIRED AT THE HEALTH CENTRE AT MUGANZA SECTOR BUT NO ONE WAS INJURED. THE SAME GROUP THEN MOVED TOWARDS THE PRIMARY SCHOOL LOCATED ABOUT 200 METRES AWAY AND THREW EXPLOSIVE SUSPECTED TO BE GRENADE IN ONE OF THE HOUSES SERIOUSLY WOUNDING ONE MAN AND THREE CHILDREN.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 3 (BUTARE) REPORTED THAT AT 2330H ON 23 JAN 96 SOME STUDENTS OF KIVU SECONDARY SCHOOL WERE FOUND IN POSSESSION OF KNIVES. THE DIRECTOR SOUGHT THE HELP OF RPA. JUST WHEN THE RPA ARRIVED GUN SHOTS WERE HEARD FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE SCHOOL DORMITORY AND LATER FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE DIRECTOR'S RESIDENCE. IT WAS LATER FOUND AT ABOUT 0400 HRS OF 24 JAN THAT TWO STUDENTS AND THE WIFE OF THE DIRECTOR HAD BEEN SHOT. THE TOYOTA PICK UP DONATED BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION WAS ALSO FOUND BURNT.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT ON 11 JAN 96 A FARMER FROM RAMBURA SECTOR (GR 4514) DIED OF MINE BLAST INJURY WHEN HE STEPPED ON AN ANTI-PERS MINE ON THE TRACK USED BY SCHOOL CHILDREN. TWO SUSPECTS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH THE INCIDENT. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT A STUDENT OF SECONDARY SCHOOL OF KAYOVE SECTOR (GR 2790) ALSO LOST HIS LEG IN THE MINE BLAST.

(4) THE MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) ALSO REPORTED THAT A



HE HAND GRENADE WAS FOUND IN NKOTSI SECTOR (GR 6024) OF  
NYAKINAMA COMMUNE (GR 5827) ALONG A FOOT PATH ON 24 JAN

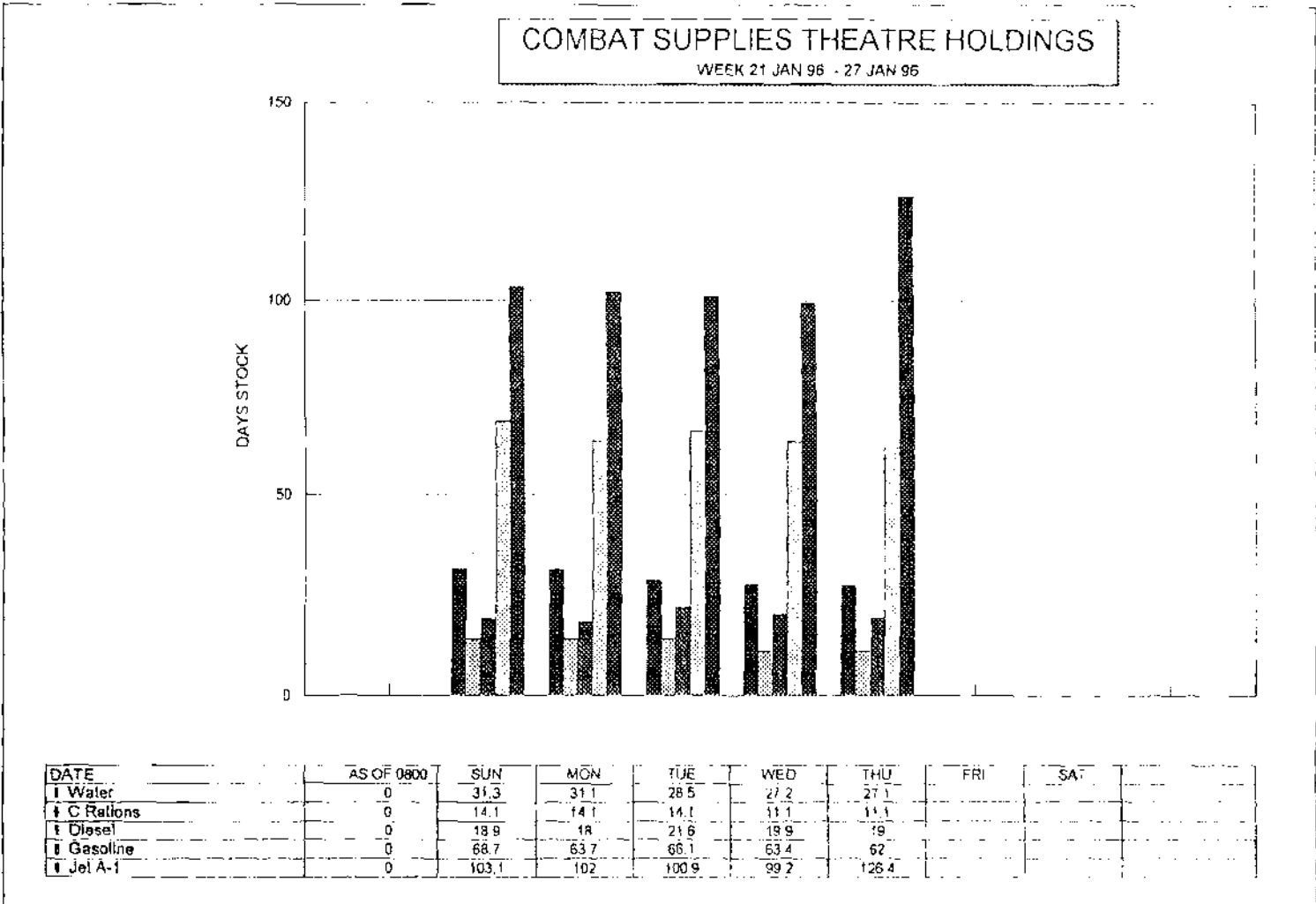

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 622. 157 CAME FROM ZAIRE. 465 FROM BURUNDI. IN ADDITION TO THE CROSSINGS REPORTED EARLIER 65 CAME FROM TANZANIA, 29 CAME FROM UGANDA BETWEEN 8 - 22 JAN 96. AND 14 FROM BURUNDI ON 21 JAN 96. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 5, GISENYI, IN RWERERE COMMUNE, MILOBS WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGUEMESTRE THAT THE COUNCILLORS OF FIVE SECTORS WERE RELIEVED RECENTLY. THREE OF THEM FOR COLLABORATING WITH FRGF AND TWO FOR SEGREGATING TRIBES.

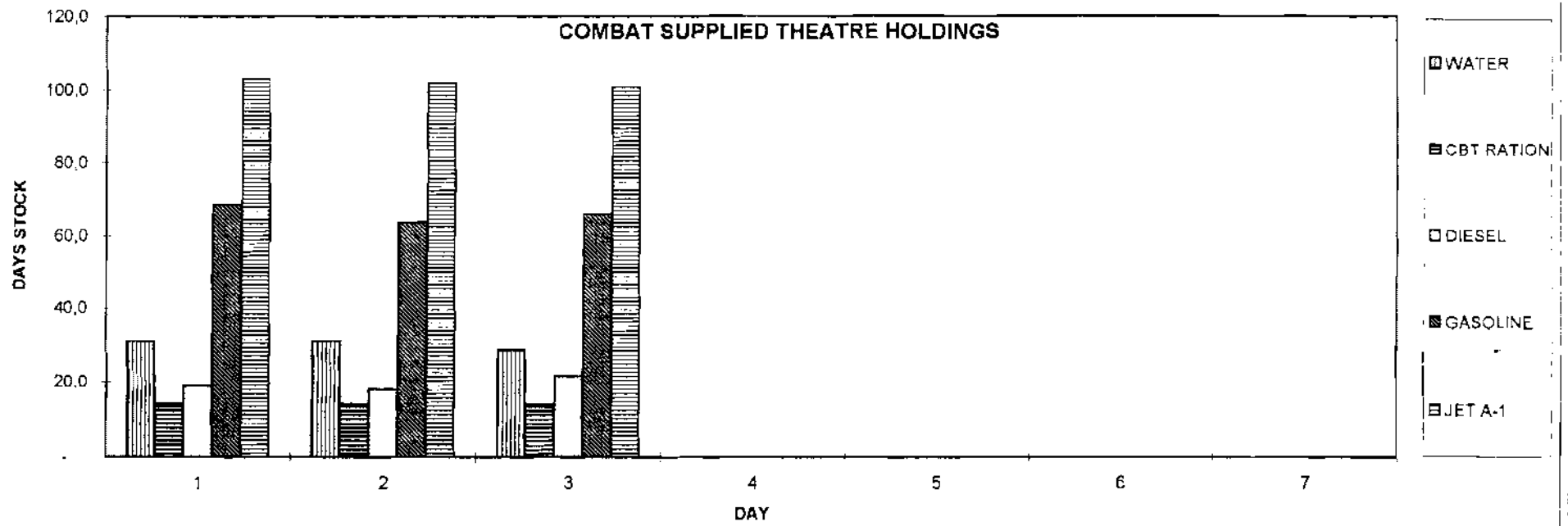

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 16 JAN 96 TO 22 JAN 96.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SITUATION ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI OPENED TO NORMAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 3768. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. FROM THE VIEWPOINT OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS, THE WEEK WAS MARKED BY THE VISITS TO RWANDA OF THE US AMBASSADOR TO THE UNITED NATIONS, MS. MADELEINE ALBRIGHT, OF H.E. GENERAL TOURÉ, FORMER PRESIDENT OF MALI AND ONE OF THE FACILITATORS OF THE PROCESS SET IN MOTION BY THE CAIRO CONFERENCE, AND BY THE VISIT TO VARIOUS EUROPEAN CAPITAL-CITIES OF H.E. THE PRIME MINISTER, MR. PIERRE CÉLESTIN RWIGEMA. DURING HER VISIT, AMBASSADOR ALBRIGHT, WHO IS TOURING SEVERAL AFRICAN COUNTRIES PARTICULARLY AFFECTED BY RECENT CONFLICTS, ASSURED H.E. THE PRESIDENT AND H.E. THE VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE CONTINUING SUPPORT OF THE UNITED STATES IN THE PROCESS OF SEEKING PEACE, JUSTICE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR RWANDA. H.E. GENERAL TOURÉ IS CURRENTLY VISITING RWANDA AND TANZANIA, UGANDA, BURUNDI AND ZAIRE IN HIS CAPACITY AS FACILITATOR OF THE CARTER INITIATIVE AND IN ORDER TO FOLLOW-UP ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMMITMENTS UNDERTAKEN BY HEADS OF STATE OF THE SUB-REGION AT THE CAIRO CONFERENCE. THE EFFORTS OF THE FACILITATORS ARE ALSO GEARED TOWARDS SEEKING CONSENSUS FOR THE POSSIBLE CONVENING OF A WIDER REGIONAL CONFERENCE TO TACKLE PROBLEMS COMMON TO ALL COUNTRIES CONCERNED. H.E. THE PRIME MINISTER CONTINUES HIS VISIT TO VARIOUS EUROPEAN COUNTRIES IN ORDER TO BETTER THE UNDERSTANDING OF THE PROBLEMS CURRENTLY FACING RWANDA AND SECURE ADDITIONAL FUNDING AND DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS ALREADY PLEDGED FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF RWANDA.

B. REGARDING ADOPTION OF NEW LEGISLATION, THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY AMENDED THE RWANDAN CONSTITUTION SO AS TO INCORPORATE TO IT CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS WHICH, TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION THE EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES RWANDA HAS GONE THROUGH, WOULD ALLOW TO ADOPT LEGISLATION ON CRIMINAL PROCEDURE WHICH WILL RETROACTIVELY REGULARIZE THE ARRESTS OF THOSE SUSPECTED OF CRIMES RELATED TO THE GENOCIDE AND TO TRY THESE SUSPECTS FOR



GENOCIDE, ALTHOUGH THE RWANDAN CRIMINAL CODE DOES NOT CONTEMPLATE SUCH CRIME. ADDITIONALLY, MODIFICATIONS WERE INTRODUCED SO AS TO ALLOW MILITARY COURTS TO TRY CIVILIANS FOR CRIMES COMMITTED JOINTLY WITH MILITARY PERSONNEL. DURING THE COURSE OF THE SAME SESSION, THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY DECIDED ALSO TO ADD ENGLISH AS AN OFFICIAL LANGUAGE IN RWANDA. KINYARWANDA REMAINS THE NATIONAL LANGUAGE, WITH FRENCH AND ENGLISH BOTH AS OFFICIAL LANGUAGES.

C. IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE MDR HAS PUBLISHED A COMMUNIQUE ON 13 JANUARY ALLOWING IN EFFECT FORMER PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU TO REINTEGRATE THE MDR, AFTER HE HAD BEEN EXPELLED FROM THE PARTY THROUGH A COMMUNIQUE DATED 21 NOVEMBER. IT MAY BE NOTED THAT, SINCE HIS DEPARTURE, MR. TWAGIRAMUNGU HAS HELD A VERY CRITICAL STANCE AGAINST THE RPA.

D. A SEMINAR ON THE CULTURE FOR PEACE, ORGANIZED BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION WITH SUPPORT FROM UNESCO, WAS HELD IN KIGALI. THE RESULTS OF THIS SEMINAR WERE TO RECOGNIZE THAT THE ACCENT HAS TO BE PUT ON THE SETTING UP OF A HEALTHY JUSTICE SYSTEM AND CONSISTENT PROGRAMS FOR PEACE EDUCATION IN RWANDA.

### 3. MILITARY

#### A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) A SITUATION AROSE IN GITARAMA, KABGAYI DIOCESE UPON THE ARRIVAL OF A UNAMIR GENERATOR TEAM AND ESCORT. THE TEAM WAS TASKED TO REPAIR THE DIOCESE OWNED GENERATOR AND RETRIEVE A UN OWNED 100 KVA GENERATOR. UPON BEING INFORMED OF THIS AND OBSERVING THE GENERATOR BEING LOADED ON A UN VEHICLE, THE DIOCESE PRIEST BECAME QUITE AGITATED AND LOCKED THE GATES TO THE COMPOUND WHERE THE GENERATOR WAS HELD, LATER POSITIONING TWO VEHICLES DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF THE GATE TO PREVENT ANY POSSIBLE EGRESS OF THE UNAMIR VEHICLE. SUBSEQUENTLY THE BISHOP INDICATED THAT THE DIOCESE HAD NOT BEEN PAID FOR THE USE OF FACILITIES SINCE AUGUST 1994. ACCORDING TO THE BISHOP, THE VEHICLE AND GENERATOR WERE BEING HELD PENDING PAYMENT OF AN INVOICE WHICH THE DIOCESE WOULD SUBMIT TO UNAMIR. THIS TYPE OF INSURANCE WAS NEEDED BECAUSE, IN HIS OPINION, THE UN WERE LAX IN THE PAYMENT OF BILLS. THE INVOICE WAS PRESENTED TO THE FSA AT APPROX 1500 HOURS. IN THE INTERIM THE BISHOP REQUESTED SUPPORT FROM THE RPA AND THE LOCAL PREFECT. THE RPA INITIALLY DEPLOYED A PL. THIS ACTION WAS REPORTEDLY INITIATED DUE TO THE FACT THAT GENERATOR TEAM WAS ACCOMPANIED BY AN ARMED MILITARY ESCORT WHICH IS STANDARD PROCEDURE. CONTINUED NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE BISHOP AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES BY THE SECT COMD AND FSA DIFFUSED THE SITUATION SOMEWHAT, HOWEVER, THE RPA BDE COMD AGREED WITH THE BISHOP THAT THE VEHICLE SHOULD NOT



BE RELEASED UNTIL UNAMIR HAD RESOLVED THE ISSUE OF PAYMENT FOR USE OF THE FACILITIES. A FOUR MAN DET WAS LEFT IN PLACE TO PROVIDE OWN SECURITY OF THE VEHICLE AND THE RPA MAINTAINED A THREE MAN SECURITY GUARD ON THE COMPOUND THROUGHOUT THE NIGHT. NEGOTIATIONS WILL CONTINUE ON 20 JAN TO RELEASE THE VEHICLE. CAO HAS DIRECTED MEMBERS OF HER STAFF TO COMPILE THE RELEVANT DOCUMENTATION WITH RESPECT TO AGREEMENTS WITH AND SUPPORT GIVEN TO THE DIOCESE IN ORDER TO FACILITATE FURTHER NEGOTIATION AND TO GIVE ASSURANCES THAT ANY AGREEMENTS ENTERED INTO BY UNAMIR FOR THE USE OF THE KABGAYI DIOCESE WILL BE HONORED AND PAYMENT EFFECTED AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE.

(2) IN SECTOR 2 (GITARAMA), AN RPA SOLDIER WHO WAS ARRESTED IN KIGALI FOR A MURDER IN THE COMMUNE, WAS REPORTEDLY SHOT DEAD ON 19 JAN 96 WHEN HE ATTEMPTED TO RUN AWAY.

(3) IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE), ON 19 JAN 96 ABOUT 1000 HRS, A GENDARMERIE STOPPED UNAMIR 1141 AND DEMANDED THAT THE CAR AND THE KEY BE HANDED OVER TO HIM. HE CLAIMED THE VEH WAS WANTED IN CONNECTION WITH AN ACCIDENT WHICH OCCURRED IN SEP 95. ON 20 JAN 96, THE OPS OFFR AND TWO MILOBS WENT TO SEE LT THEOS WHO PROMISED TO LOOK INTO THE CASE AND STOP THE SEIZURE OF THE VEH.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), AT GAKARAR SECTOR GR 3921 OF KARAGO COMMUNE, LOCALS REPORTED THAT 3 PERSONS WERE ARRESTED BY RPA ON 19 JAN 96. THE MOTIVE BEHIND THE ARREST IS NOT KNOWN. IN THE SAME SECTOR, THE MSF CLINIC AT KABATWA GR 3227 WAS RE-OPENED ON 18 JAN 96.

B. FRGF/MILITIA

(1) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), AT GORA (GR 2712) IN KANAMA, COMMUNE, ONE MAN WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED BY SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE ON 15 JAN 96. NO FURTHER DETAILS AVAILABLE.

(2) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), LOCALS INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 12 JAN 96, TWO FRGF MEMBERS WERE ARRESTED AT KABATWA SECTOR (GR 3322) AND HANDED OVER TO RPA. THE LOCALS EXPRESSED SERIOUS CONCERN ABOUT FRGF ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTOR OF LATE.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT SUSPECTED FRGF MEMBERS HAD INFILTRATED INTO RWANZEKUMA SECTOR (GR 2620) OF RWERERE COMMUNE (GR 2722). THE RPA AND IPJ ARE REPORTEDLY SEARCHING FOR THEM.



(4) IN SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), FOUR PERSONS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED IN MUKO SECTOR GR 5828 OF NYAKINAMA COMMUNE GR 5827 BY UNIDENTIFIED ARMED MEN ON 19 JAN 96. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(5) A TRADER OF MUKINGO SECTOR GR 2618 IN RWERERE COMMUNE GR 2722 WAS KILLED BY TWO FRGF ELEMENTS ON 16 JAN 96 AT ABOUT 2200 HRS. SOME PROPERTY OF THE DECEASED WAS STOLEN. ONE OF THE FRGF MEMBER WAS ALSO ACCIDENTALLY KILLED BY HIS OWN COLLEAGUE IN THE INCIDENT. THE DEAD FRGF MEMBER HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED BY THE LOCALS.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) ON 18 JAN 86, THE A/FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO THE FORCE SIG COY. 47 SOLDIERS FROM MALAWICOY DEPARTED TO MALAWI ON FINAL REPATRIATION AS PART OF THE DRAWDOWN PROCESS.

(4) ON 19 JAN 96, THE A/FC PAID A VISIT TO GHANBATT I PRIOR TO THEIR DEINDUCTION AND MILOBS SECTOR 1 HQ TO DISCUSS THEIR PRESENT ROLE. HE ALSO BRIEFED TWO FOREIGN JOURNALISTS FROM AFP AND DIE ZEIT ON THE CURRENT UNAMIR MANDATE AND REFUGEE REPATRIATION.

(5) ON 21 JAN 96, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND A/FC ATTENDED A LUNCH HOSTED BY US AMBASSADOR IN THE HONOR OF MS M ALBRIGHT AND HAD INFORMAL DISCUSSIONS WITH HER.

(6) ON 22 JAN 96, THE ED AND THE A\FORCE COMMANDER HAD A MEETING WITH H.E. GENERAL AMADOU T.TOURE, FORMER PRESIDENT OF MALI AND LATER ALSO ATTENDED THE MEETING HELD BETWEEN THE AMBASSADORS OF USA, CANADA AND EUROPEAN COUNTRIES AT EU HQ. THE A\ FORCE COMMANDER ALSO HAD A MEETING WITH MR. STEINER SUNDALL, THE REPRESENTATIVE OF NORWEGIAN REFUGEE COUNCIL.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 38 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. A TOTAL OF 50 REFUGEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 967 MEDICAL AND 78 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY MED CENTRES IN VARIOUS SECTORS.



D. OWS ( OVER NIGHT WAY STATION) AT NDERA WAS SHIFTED TO RUYENZI GR 9783 IN RUNDA COMMUNE. INMATES OF THE OWS WERE TRANSPORTED TO THEIR NEW LOCATION ON 16 JAN 95. INDBATT RECCE PATROLS WERE DESPATCHED TO THE NEW LOCATION OF OWS TO ASSESS THE SECURITY REQUIREMENTS.

E. INDBATT INSTALLED A 1500 LITRE WATER TANK AT REMERA ORPHANAGE.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. ON 19 JAN 96, 10 REFUGEES WERE BROUGHT FROM NAIROBI (KENYA). SEVEN OF THIS NUMBER HAD SINCE BEEN RESETTLED IN KIGALI WHILE THE REMAINING 03 WERE SENT TO KUYENZI TRANSIT CAMP IN SECTOR 2 AOR.

C. ON 22 JAN 96, MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT THE VICE PRESIDENT, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, VISITED GISENYI AND MET REPRESENTATIVES OF GOVT INSTITUTIONS TO DISCUSS THE SECURITY MATTERS AND VOLUNTARY REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL

A. ON 16 JAN 96, SOME UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS BROKE INTO THE ZAMBIAN/NIGERIAN HOUSE IN GITARAMA AT APPROXIMATELY 1045 HRS AND STOLE A VCR BELONGING TO UNAMIR. THE THIEVES HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES ARE MAKING EFFORTS TO APPREHEND THE CULPRITS.

B. ON 21 JAN 96, A LOCAL BOY WAS APPREHENDED BY OWN TPS AT THE SVC STATION ATTEMPTING TO CUT ELECTRIC CABLES IN THE YARD. THE BOY TOLD RPA PERS PASSING BY THAT HE HAD BEEN BEATEN BY THE TPS. THE BOY WAS SENT TO THE HOSPITAL BY UN MPs AND THE REP FROM THE GENDARMERIE TO VERIFY THE ALLEGATION. MEDICAL EXAMINATION CFM THAT THE ALLEGATION WAS FALSE. THE BOY WAS LATER RELEASED BY UN MPs AND THE GENDARMERIE.

9. COMMENTS

A. THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION REMAINS STABLE. THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES FROM NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES HAS STILL NOT PICKED UP MOMENTUM. THE PREVAILING SITUATION IN BURUNDI AND THE CLOSURE OF TANZANIA - BURUNDI MAY FORCE SOME OF THE RWANDAN REFUGEES IN BURUNDI TO RETURN. NECESSARY COORDINATION IS BEING CARRIED OUT WITH UNHCR TO MEET SUCH A CONTINGENCY.

B. ATTEMPTS TO STEAL UNAMIR PROPERTY ARE ON THE INCREASE AS THE MANDATE DRAWS TO A CLOSE. ALL UNAMIR CIVILIAN AND MILITARY PERS HAVE BEEN WARNED TO BE EXTRA VIGILANT AND SECURITY CONSCIOUS.



2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. AMBASSADOR ALBRIGHT, US AMBASSADOR TO UNITED NATIONS, DURING HER VISIT MET H.E. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU AND H.E. VICE-PRESIDENT MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME. Ms ALBRIGHT ANNOUNCED THAT HER COUNTRY HAD OFFERED \$ 1 MILLION IN ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATIONS IN RWANDA AND HAS STRESSED THAT THE UNITED STATES REMAINED A FRIEND AND ALLY OF RWANDA IN ITS QUEST FOR PEACE, JUSTICE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

B. H.E. GENERAL AMADOU TOUMANI TOURE, FORMER PRESIDENT OF MALI, ARRIVED ON 21 JAN 95 IN RWANDA WHERE HE WILL STAY UNTIL TUESDAY 23 JAN MORNING. DURING HIS VISIT, GENERAL TOURE HAS HAD MEETINGS WITH GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AS WELL AS REPRESENTATIVES FROM UNAMIR AND UNHCR. GENERAL TOURE WILL MEET ON 23 JAN WITH H.E. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU AND H.E. VICE-PRESIDENT MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, PRIOR TO HIS DEPARTURE FOR BURUNDI TO FURTHER HIS CONSULTATIONS.

ON 20 JAN 96, THE OPS OFFR AND TWO MILOBS WENT TO SEE LT THEOS WHO PROMISED TO LOOK INTO THE CASE AND STOP THE SEIZURE OF THE VEH.

(3) SECTOR 5 - AT GAKARAR SECTOR GR 3921 OF KARAGO COMMUNE. LOCALS REPORTED THAT 3 PERSONS WERE ARRESTED BY RPA ON 19 JAN 96 THE MOTIVE OF ARREST IS NOT KNOWN. THE MSF CLINIC AT KABATWA SECTOR GR 3227 WAS RE-OPENED ON 18 JAN 96.

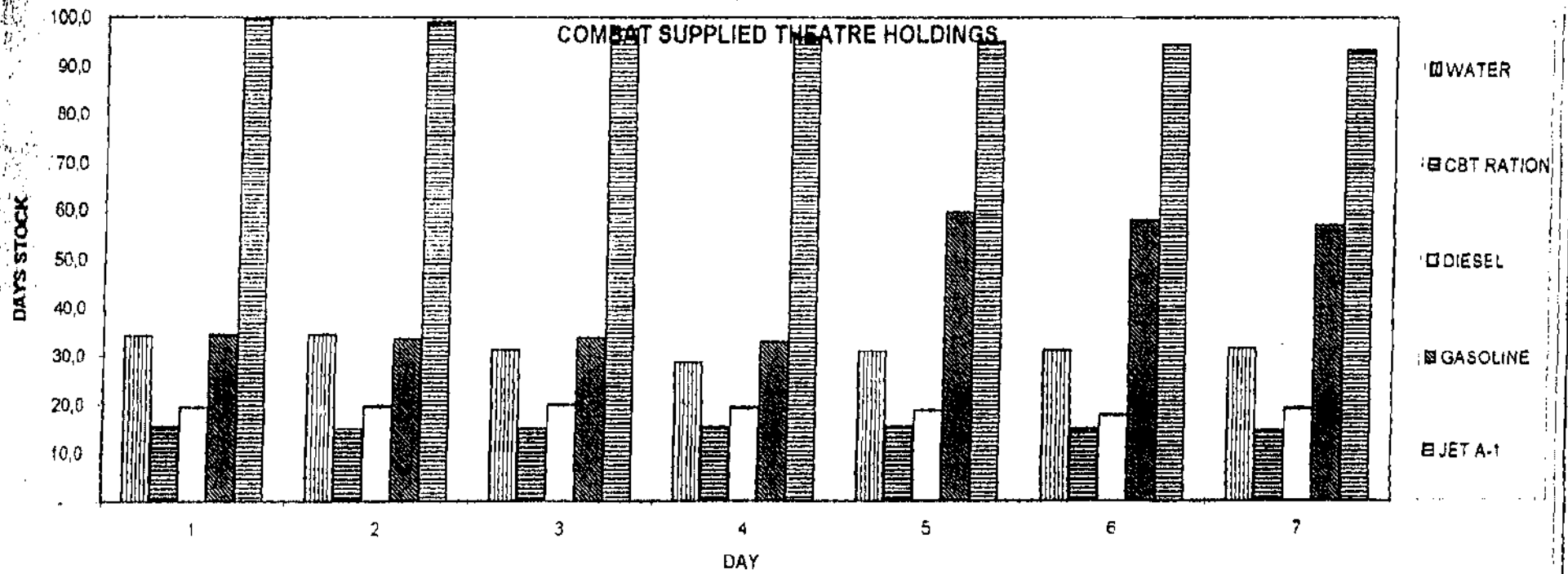



1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI ARE OPENED TO THE TRAFFIC BETWEEN RWANDA AND BURUNDI. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 194. ALL CAME FROM ZAIRE. IN ADDITION TO THE CROSSINGS REPORTED EARLIER 728 CAME FROM BURUNDI ON 18 JAN AND 02 ON 17 JAN. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 7347. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA /GENDARMERIE. A SITUATION AROSE IN GITARAMA, KABGAYI DIOCESE UPON THE ARRIVAL OF A UNAMIR GENERATOR TEAM AND ESCORT. THE TEAM WAS TASKED TO REPAIR THE DIOCESE OWNED GENERATOR AND RETRIEVE A UN OWNED 100 KVA GENERATOR. UPON BEING INFORMED OF THIS AND OBSERVING THE GENERATOR BEING LOADED ON A UN VEHICLE, THE DIOCESE PRIEST BECAME QUITE AGITATED AND LOCKED THE GATES TO THE COMPOUND WHERE THE GENERATOR WAS HELD, LATER POSITIONING TWO VEHICLES DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF THE GATE TO PREVENT ANY POSSIBLE THAT THE DIOCESE HAD NOT BEEN PAID FOR THE USE OF FACILITIES SINCE AUGUST 1994. ACCORDING TO THE BISHOP, THE VEHICLE AND GENERATOR WERE BEING HELD PENDING PAYMENT OF AN INVOICE WHICH THE DIOCESE WOULD SUBMIT TO UNAMIR. THIS TYPE OF INSURANCE WAS NEEDED BECAUSE, IN HIS OPINION, THE UN WERE LAX IN THE PAYMENT OF BILLS. THE INVOICE WAS PRESENTED TO THE FSA AT APPROX 1500 HOURS. IN THE INTERIM THE BISHOP REQUESTED SUPPORT FROM THE RPA AND THE LOCAL PREFECT. THE RPA INITIALLY DEPLOYED A PL. THIS ACTION WAS REPORTEDLY INITIATED DUE TO THE FACT THAT GENERATOR TEAM WAS ACCOMPANIED BY AN ARMED MILITARY ESCORT WHICH IS STANDARD PROCEDURE. CONTINUED NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE BISHOP AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES BY THE SECT COMD AND FSA DIFFUSED THE SITUATION SOMEWHAT, HOWEVER, THE RPA BDE COMD AGREED WITH THE BISHOP THAT THE VEHICLE SHOULD NOT BE RELEASED UNTIL UNAMIR HAD RESOLVED THE ISSUE OF PAYMENT FOR USE OF THE FACILITIES. A FOUR MAN DET WAS LEFT IN PLACE TO PROVIDE OWN SECURITY OF THE VEHICLE AND THE RPA MAINTAINED A THREE MAN SECURITY GUARD ON THE COMPOUND THROUGHOUT THE NIGHT. NEGOTIATIONS WILL CONTINUE ON 20 JAN TO RELEASE THE VEHICLE. CAO HAS DIRECTED MEMBERS OF HER STAFF TO COMPILE



THE RELEVANT DOCUMENTATION WITH RESPECT TO AGREEMENTS WITH AND SUPPORT GIVEN TO THE DIOCESE IN ORDER TO FACILITATE FURTHER NEGOTIATION AND TO GIVE ASSURANCES THAT ANY AGREEMENTS ENTERED INTO BY UNAMIR FOR THE USE OF THE KABGAYI DIOCESE WILL BE HONOURED AND PAYMENT EFFECTED AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT FOOT MARKS OF INFILTRATORS, SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF BY RPA, WERE IDENTIFIED IN RWANZEKUMA SECTOR (GR 2620) OF RWERERE COMMUNE (GR 2722). THE RPA AND IPJ ARE REPORTEDLY SEARCHING FOR THEM.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE A/FC PAID A VISIT TO GHANCOY 1 PRIOR TO THEIR DEINDUCTION AND MILOBS SECTOR 1 HQ TO DISCUSS THEIR PRESENT ROLE. HE ALSO BRIEFED TWO FOREIGN JOURNALISTS FROM AFP AND DIE ZEIT ON THE CURRENT UNAMIR MANDATE AND REFUGEE REPATRIATION.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 272 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT RUYENZI OWS FROM NKAMIRA AND KIBUNGO. 93 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO RUHENGARI, KANOMBE, BYUMBA, KIBUYE AND KIGALI. A TOTAL OF 249 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED 7 TONS OF FOOD STUFF FOR KING COLLEGE (CHRIST ROI) ORPHAN HOSTEL FROM KIGALI TO NYANZA IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE.

C. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED A DOZER EACH AT REHABILITATION CENTRE KIGALI AND ALTERNATE TRANSIT CAMP AT BUTARE. THEY ALSO PROVIDED ONE VEH EACH TO ARDEC AND ESKO AND DEPLOYED A TEAM FOR FENCING OF AMAHORO STADIUM IN KIGALI.

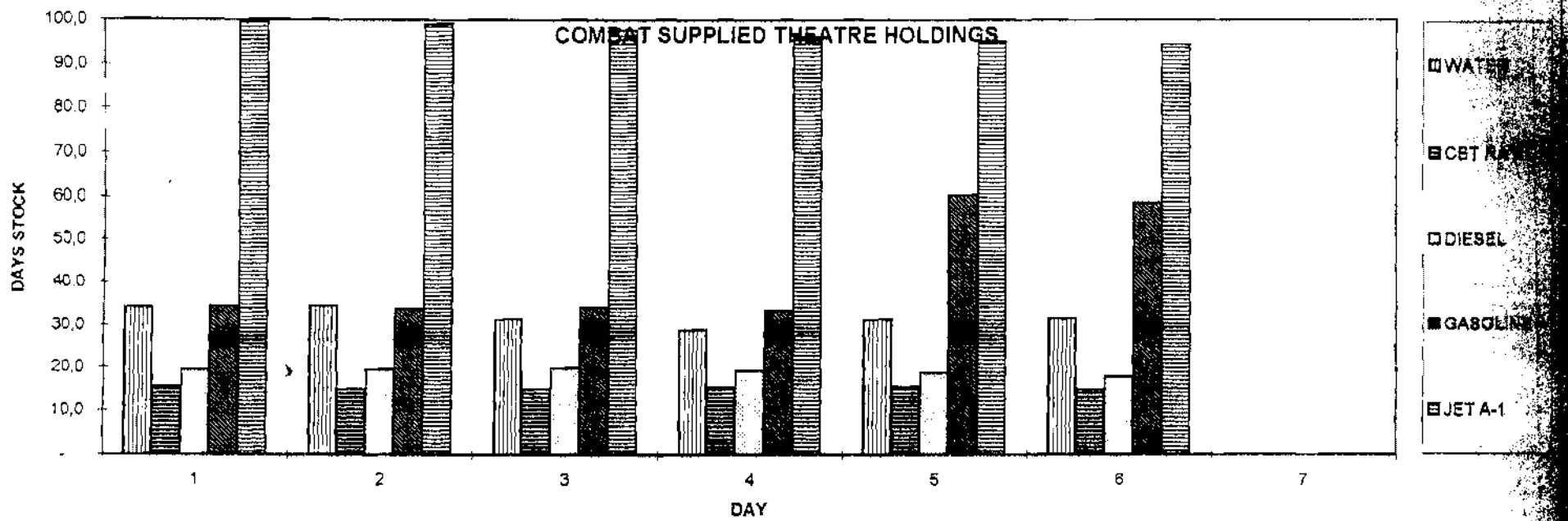

DAILY SITREP FOR 19 JAN 96.

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. THE BORDER POSTS AT UVIRA AND RUSIZI ARE OPENED TO THE TRAFFIC BETWEEN RWANDA AND BURUNDI. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5 REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 194. ALL CAME FROM ZAIRE. IN ADDITION TO THE CROSSINGS REPORTED EARLIER 728 CAME FROM BURUNDI ON 18 JAN AND 02 ON 17 JAN. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 7347. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA /GENDARMERIE. A SITUATION AROSE IN GITARAMA, KABGAYI DIOCESE UPON THE ARRIVAL OF A UNAMIR GENERATOR TEAM AND ESCORT. THE TEAM WAS TASKED TO REPAIR THE DIOCESE OWNED GENERATOR AND RETRIEVE A UN OWNED 100 KVA GENERATOR. UPON BEING INFORMED OF THIS AND OBSERVING THE GENERATOR BEING LOADED ON A UN VEHICLE, THE DIOCESE PRIEST BECAME QUITE AGITATED AND LOCKED THE GATES TO THE COMPOUND WHERE THE GENERATOR WAS HELD, LATER POSITIONING TWO VEHICLES DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF THE GATE TO PREVENT ANY POSSIBLE THAT THE DIOCESE HAD NOT BEEN PAID FOR THE USE OF FACILITIES SINCE AUGUST 1994. ACCORDING TO THE BISHOP, THE VEHICLE AND GENERATOR WERE BEING HELD PENDING PAYMENT OF AN INVOICE WHICH THE DIOCESE WOULD SUBMIT TO UNAMIR. THIS TYPE OF INSURANCE WAS NEEDED BECAUSE, IN HIS OPINION, THE UN WERE LAX IN THE PAYMENT OF BILLS. THE INVOICE WAS PRESENTED TO THE FSA AT APPROX 1500 HOURS. IN THE INTERIM THE BISHOP REQUESTED SUPPORT FROM THE RPA AND THE LOCAL PREFECT. THE RPA INITIALLY DEPLOYED A PL. THIS ACTION WAS REPORTEDLY INITIATED DUE TO THE FACT THAT GENERATOR TEAM WAS ACCOMPANIED BY AN ARMED MILITARY ESCORT WHICH IS STANDARD PROCEDURE. CONTINUED NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE BISHOP AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES BY THE SECT COMD AND FSA DIFFUSED THE SITUATION SOMEWHAT, HOWEVER, THE RPA BDE COMD AGREED WITH THE BISHOP THAT THE VEHICLE SHOULD NOT BE RELEASED UNTIL UNAMIR HAD RESOLVED THE ISSUE OF PAYMENT FOR USE OF THE FACILITIES. A FOUR MAN DET WAS LEFT IN PLACE TO PROVIDE OWN SECURITY OF THE VEHICLE AND THE RPA MAINTAINED A THREE MAN SECURITY GUARD ON THE COMPOUND THROUGHOUT THE NIGHT. NEGOTIATIONS WILL CONTINUE ON 20 JAN TO RELEASE THE VEHICLE. CAO HAS DIRECTED MEMBERS OF HER STAFF TO COMPILE



THE RELEVANT DOCUMENTATION WITH RESPECT TO AGREEMENTS WITH AND SUPPORT GIVEN TO THE DIOCESE IN ORDER TO FACILITATE FURTHER NEGOTIATION AND TO GIVE ASSURANCES THAT ANY AGREEMENTS ENTERED INTO BY UNAMIR FOR THE USE OF THE KABGAYI DIOCESE WILL BE HONOURED AND PAYMENT EFFECTED AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. MILOBS SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT FOOT MARKS OF INFILTRATORS, SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF BY RPA, WERE IDENTIFIED IN RWANZEKUMA SECTOR (GR 2620) OF RWERERE COMMUNE (GR 2722). THE RPA AND IPJ ARE REPORTEDLY SEARCHING FOR THEM.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE A/FC PAID A VISIT TO GHANCOY 1 PRIOR TO THEIR DEINDUCTION AND MILOBS SECTOR 1 HQ TO DISCUSS THEIR PRESENT ROLE. HE ALSO BRIEFED TWO FOREIGN JOURNALISTS FROM AFP AND DIE ZEIT ON THE CURRENT UNAMIR MANDATE AND REFUGEE REPATRIATION.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 272 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT RUYENZI OWS FROM NKAMIRA AND KIBUNGO. 93 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO RUHengeri, KANOMBE, BYUMBA, KIBUYE AND KIGALI. A TOTAL OF 249 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM RUYENZI CAMP.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED 7 TONS OF FOOD STUFF FOR KING COLLEGE (CHRIST ROI) ORPHAN HOSTEL FROM KIGALI TO NYANZA IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE.

C. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED A DOZER EACH AT REHABILITATION CENTRE KIGALI AND ALTERNATE TRANSIT CAMP AT BUTARE. THEY ALSO PROVIDED ONE VEH EACH TO ARDEC AND ESKO AND DEPLOYED A TEAM FOR FENCING OF AMAHORO STADIUM IN KIGALI.

D. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC AND CONTINUED ACTIVATING LOCAL LINES OF RWANDATEL.

E. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 169 MEDICAL AND 16 DENTAL PATIENTS.

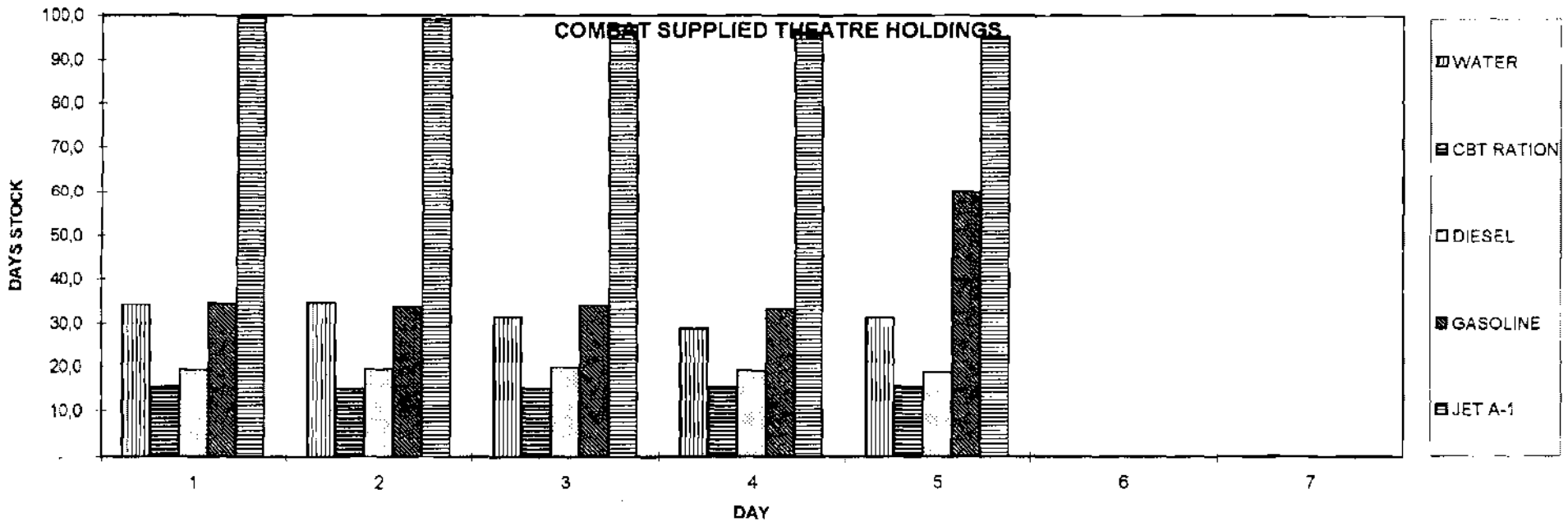

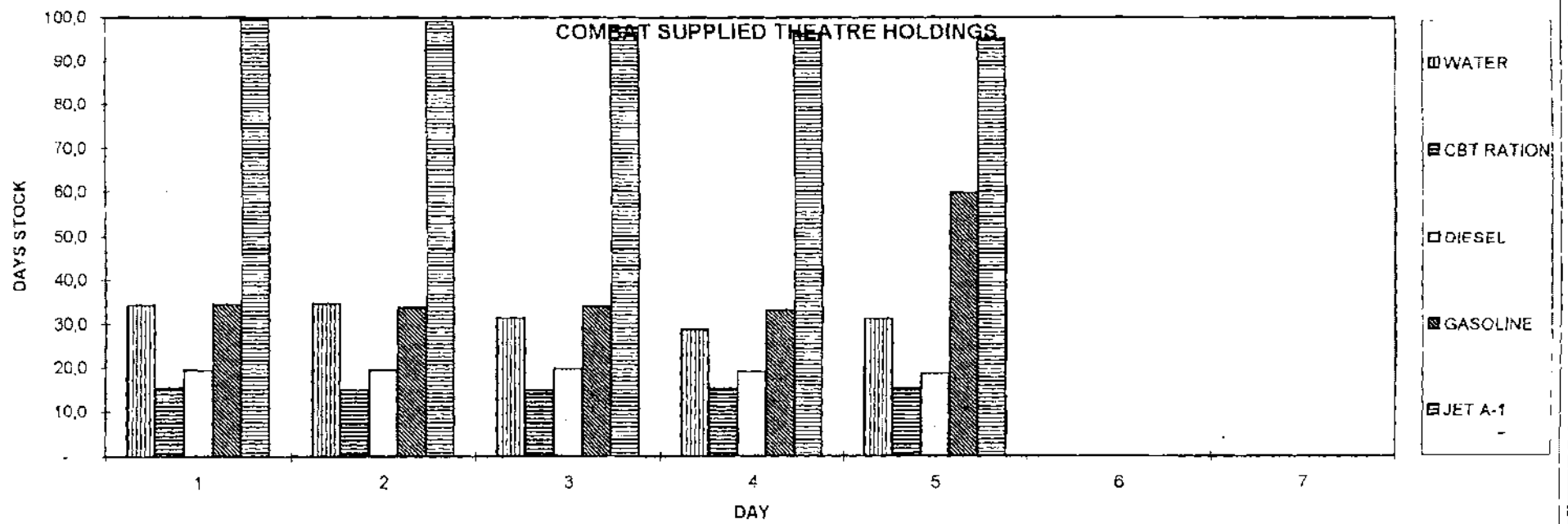
