1. GNU, OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:

PMT- BUTARE PREFECTURE

Reported that there was a re-burial of the remains of genocide victims of RUNYINYA Commune at RUNYINYA on 28/7/95. The ceremony was attended by the Minister for Rehabilitation and some NGOS.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and have facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer's goods in the prefectures.

4. ECONOMIC:

The domestic economic situation is making subsistence living very hard and out of reach of many in the prefectures.

5. HUMANITARIAN:

Visited NDERA IDPs Camp on 30/7/95, and reported that there were 151 IDPs in the Camp awaiting evacuation to their respective home communes. 91 out of this number had arrived from BUTARE the same day.

Reported that majority of locals in the prefecture have expressed dissatisfaction about the withdrawal of UNAMIR troops from the area. That some of them have expressed their intentions to flee the area as soon as ZAMBATT leaves the location claiming that their lives would be in danger after the pull-out of UNAMIR.



The same team visited Busogo health center where the Assistant Medical Officer disclosed that the centre is in dire need of beds and mattresses. He also appeared for sufficient drugs as the commune is infested with the Maralia disease.

PMT - BYUMBA PREFECTURE

Disclosed that CIVPOL MONITORS IN THE PREFECTURE WERE LED BY THE Prefect of Byumba to inspect a new building in Byumba intended to be used by International Committee of Red Cross to transfer some of the inmates in Kigali Central Prison to solve that problem of over crowding in Kigali Prison.

The graduated UNAMIR trained gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School have been deployed in the various Prefectures. Meanwhile, the school is preparing grounds for the opening programme. In view of this, 518 students from various prefectures including 5 females have arrived at the school to commence training.

Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

3. COMMERCIAL:

Went on patrols to MUSEBEYA Commune and reported that the Bourgmestre complained of lack of electricity in the area. He also requested for establishment of agricultural projects in the Commune with the view of providing employment to the locals.

The same team patrolled KIVU Commune and reported that the locals complained of lack of potable drinking water and electricity.

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

The team patrolled MASANGO Commune and met Bourgmestre who reported that cases of stealing and other violent crimes are on the rise. That on 3/7/95 at RUKIRA Cellule, a male local was beaten to death by bandits.

Also in GITANDA Sector, 13 locals were arrested on 10/7/95 for an alleged banditry activities, but were later released on 23/7/95 after intensive interrogation.

Again, in the same Sector, on 23/7/95 an old local woman was seriously injured by unidentified bandits. She is now on admission at the commune hospital. Investigation in progress.

b. PMT-GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

CIVPOL Team patrolled KARAMBO Commune and was informed by locals that acts of banditry activities have been on the increase in recent times. Investigation in progress.

c. PMT- BYUMBA PREFECTURE

Visited the Bourgmestre of KINYAMI Commune who briefed the team that the situation is quiet in the area in respect of security and crime.

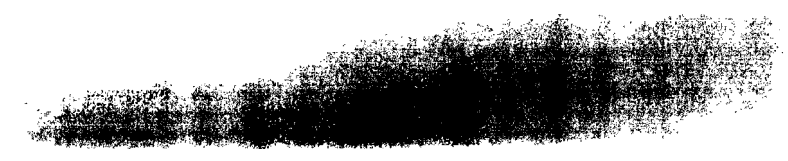

OPENING REMARKS.

The meeting was called to order by the chairman, Col. C.O. Diarra CIVPOL Commissioner at 09:40hrs. He welcomed all present and informed the meeting that the security council has reviewed our mandate in RWANDA under resolution number 996 of 9th June, 1995.

He further explained that the revised mandate focuses on assisting in the rationalisation and stabilisation of the country. Thus our role will be mainly monitoring and training of Gendarmes and communal police.

In conclusion he mentioned that at the moment the recognised strength of CIVPOL is the present manpower on the ground and not the establishment figure of 120 officers.

REVIEW OF PREVIOUS MEETING

After making several amendments, the chairman observed that there were so many mistakes in the minutes. He therefore, directed that henceforth written reports be reproduced as presented by each head of division/CPMT to minimize errors.

CONTROL OF TASKS

- 1. The Administrative Assistant has been directed to appoint a clerk to be responsible for immediate typing of minutes;*
- 2. The secretary to ensure minutes are compiled promptly;*
- 3. Welfare Committee to hold meeting and submit proposals to the commissioner of police;*
- 4. CPMTs must ensure that daily sitreps are sent on time through their duty officers;*
- 5. All hand and mobile sets to be reprogrammed, starting from today.*

REPORTS FROM CPMTs AND HEADS OF DIVISIONS

CPMT - KIGALI PREFECTURE

The CPMT reported that the general situation in the area remains calm. Though armed robbery and other acts of banditry continued unabated with the international

community having the highest number of victims. Thus, the local security agencies have increased patrols and cordon and search exercises as part of internal security measure aimed at regulating the activities of undesirable elements.

He reported a noticeable increase in commercial activities. As a result of this healthy development, the central bank of Rwanda gave approval for the re-opening of two commercial banks, namely A.C.B. and Rwandese Bank for Development, Commerce and Industries.

Also during the period under review, the team monitored the return and re-settlement of 28,681 refugees/IDPs in the prefecture. Most of the refugees were from UGANDA, KENYA, TANZANIA, BURUNDI and ZAIRE.

A visit was also paid to Kigali Prison and discovered about 10,000 inmates mostly male adults, women and children suspected of participating in genocide, yet the prison has a capacity of accommodating 2000 detainees. Their present situation has been most pathetic and degrading.

In another development the team reported the visit of former Tanzania President Dr. Julius NYERERE and the discussions held with Rwandese authorities in connection with Arusha Peace-Agreement and possible reopening of diplomatic relations between the two countries.

The team also reported the circulation of counterfeit notes of 5000 Fr denomination which was alleged to have originated from Zaire.

In conclusion, the team reported that the general situation has continued to be quiet.

CPMT - GISENYI PREFECTURE

The CPMT revealed that the general situation is calm but tense in view of the constant infiltration of the INTERAHAMWE, incident of shooting and mine explosion in the area. He reported that on 8/06/95 in Rwerere Commune (very close to the Zairian border) a man was shot by RPA on patrol.

Also on 08/06/95 at about 15:30 Hrs there was mine explosion near TUNBATT HQ at Mutura. No injury to humans or damage to property was recorded.

He also reported that on the night of 7th June, 1995 armed bandits suspected to be INTERAHAMWE numbering between fifteen and thirty attacked Buzuta Cellule in Rubavu commune where they killed one local and injured several others after robbing them of their valuables.

Again, on the night of 8th June 1995 at Kinyanga Sector in Rwerere Commune

there was an exchange of fire between suspected INTERAHAMWE and RPA. One RPA soldier was killed and another wounded by grenade splinters. The following morning of 9/6/95 a woman suspected to be an accomplice was arrested and when she attempted to escape, she was shot by the RPA. A local who was in the house was injured by stray bullets in the stomach and back.

Furthermore, on 24/6/95 locals of KINUNU Sector, KAYOVE Commune reported to the RPA platoon in the commune the discovering at the commune shore of the KIVU lake a boat with hand-grenades and mine. On the receipt of the information, the RPA cordoned and searched the area. Ten men suspected to be INTERAHAMWE were found in the forest. Two of the suspects were killed, others escaped, but were later arrested at MUTURA.

In another instance, on 01/7/95 at about 2:30hrs there was an explosion at Gisenyi Electrogaz and two night watch men were met macheted to death by unknown person or persons. By some conjectures, the authors of the barbaric act were alleged to have unsuccessfully attempted to destroy the Power station.

PMT-GITARAMA PREFECTURE

The CPMT reported that the general security situation is calm, compared against the previous month, especially in connection with safety of UNAMIR Property. That between the 1st June and 13th June, 1995, the sector lost 3 UNAMIR vehicles to armed bandits suspected to be RPA. The vehicles were assigned to MILOBS, MALICOY and Human Rights respectively.

It was further mentioned that the communes are witnessing increase in banditry activities especially at Masango and Murama where armed bandits suspected to be elements of FRGF cross the river Mwogo and perpetrate their nefarious activities. However, RPA soldiers have intensified patrols of the area.

Also the team revealed that at KAYENZI Commune dispensary about 500 children are suffering from malnutrition and they need serious care and attention urgently.

Also on 26/6/95 the team in conjunction with human rights assisted in the delivery and distribution of relief materials to orphans at Rugalika Sector in Runda Commune.

Furthermore, on 29/6/95 at about 01:00hrs 4 prisoners who were alleged to have attempted to escape from custody were shot dead by RPA soldiers on guard. Three other inmates sustained injuries and are presently on admission at Kabgavi hospital.

PMT-GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

The Ag CPMT reported that the situation in the prefecture has been very calm, except in some communes where acts of banditry are on the increase. The ugly acts are committed by men in military uniform suspected to be RPA. Thus, the victims of the offence are afraid of reporting the happenings to the gendarmerie brigade.

Again, about two weeks ago, in MATA Sector, some armed bandits suspected to be RPA in both military uniforms and civil dress raided the area and robbed locals of their cows, money and motor bikes. During the horrible exercise, one local called HABIMANA tried to run away and was shot dead and his corpse has not been recovered.

He also mentioned that ZAMBATT is pulling out to be replaced by MALICOY.

Finally, the CPMT requested for a computer to alleviate the cumbersome exercise of sending handwritten correspondences.

PMT- BUTARE PREFECTURE

The CPMT reported that during the period under review, the team in conjunction with MILOBS escorted relief materials to Nyabisindu, Nyakizu, Muganza, Ntyazo Communes.

The team also conducted recce along the communes bordering BURUNDI with a view to monitoring the movement of refugees.

He observed an increase in cases of car snatching and robberies targeted mainly at NGOS.

The team also monitored the visit of former Tanzanian President Dr. Julius Nyerere to the prefecture.

He concluded by saying that the situation remains calm.

CPMT-KIBUYE PREFECTURE

The CPMT reported that the general situation in the area remains calm and banditry activities along the coast have decreased considerably.

However during the period under review, the team monitored the return and resettlement of 344 IDPS from KIBEHO Camp. It also undertook series of joint patrols with MILOBS, and discovered in one of the exercises that at KINANIRA primary school in Kibumu commune a teacher and seven pupils were arrested in connection with genocide.

He reported that on 17/6/95 at about 23:30hrs, two members of personnel of SWISS Disaster Relief were robbed a few meters from their residence by two armed men in military uniform suspected to be RPA. During the brief encounter a two door Toyota, Red in colour n° IT.6464, the sum of 160,000 Fr and a German International Passport were snatched. Though the vehicle was later found and brought to the relief organisation, the recovery was not unconnected with the fact that the coordinator of the Swiss Disaster met the Prefect and threatened to withdraw all their services if the vehicle was not found.

The team further monitored the distribution of food in the Prefecture by World Food Programme.

Finally the return of 1824 refugees of 1959/60 was monitored in the prefecture.

PMT - CYANGUGU

The CPMT reported that the situation remains relatively calm compared against previous month. And that banditry activities have remarkably decreased.

He also mentioned that during the period under review, a total of two hundred and sixty one refugees were registered by UNHCR crossing to Rwanda from the neighbouring countries bordering Cyangugu Prefecture, 254 refugees came from Zaire while only 07 came from Burundi.

The team also visited the prison and found about 2000 detainees. The ICRC is giving tremendous assistance in the feeding and sanitary well being of the inmates.

Also during the period, the prefecture witnessed the visit of the US Ambassador and President of the Republic of Rwanda. The President after addressing the locals in Kamembe Stadium, answered questions from the audience bordering on indefinite and indiscriminate arrest of persons by RPA.

Lastly, he reported that workers of CIMERWA at Bugarama embarked on an industrial action agitating for salary increase. However after a negotiated settlement, the action was called-off.

PMT - RUHENGARI

The CPMT revealed that during the period under review, the security situation was relatively calm. And that numerous combined patrols with MILOBS and Human Rights were carried out. During the exercises, it was discovered that NDUSU, BUTARO and GATONDE communes were faced with the problem of scarcity of land for returnees' settlement.

He mentioned that on 1st July, 1995, the CIVPOL Commissioner and three UNDP officials visited Ruhengeri Training School with a view to assessing the volume of repairs and redecoration required in the area/building.

He reported a serious increase in both commercial and social activities in the area, and that according to immigration records the number of returnees crossing Cyanika border have reduced.

FHQ LIAISON OFFICER

He reported that relations with other UNAMIR components have been most cordial. However there were series of complaints that CIVPOL requests are not forwarded well in advance to give room for proper preparations. It is advised that requests be submitted in good time to avoid unnecessary pit falls.

Also UNAMIR has renewed its contract with Kigali Sportif and Sporting facilities are now available for use but bookings have to be done in advance. Also, included in the recreation centre is Saturday night club for all interested UNAMIR staff.

CP PERSONNEL

The CPPO informed the meeting that there has been an improvement in the completion and forwarding of personnel forms and other official UNAMIR documents. But some officers are yet to submit their completed forms. It is imperative that attendance forms are forwarded promptly.

He also informed the meeting that the Medal Parade of the German CIVPOL contingent was coming up tomorrow 4/7/95 at the German Ambassadors' residence, Kigali. Thus the Germans will wait to undertake and complete necessary formalities towards their repatriation on 17/7/95 thereafter.

CPLOGO

He informed the gathering that he attended a meeting on relocation of CIVPOL HQ, to TRAFIPRO and thereafter submitted CIVPOL agenda and a brief after the meeting.

He reported that the entire administrative block requested for has been allocated to us and it will conveniently accommodate all the CIVPOL components. He informed the meeting that a CHECK-OUT procedure proforma has been sent to all head of divisions/CPMTs for the guidance of all personnel. He pointed that the procedure became necessary to ensure that nobody leaves the country without properly handing over all UN equipments issued to him/her. He gave a case of Maj. Diakite as an example, who after completing his tour of duty left with hand motorola and its charger.

He also said that a civilian driver has been redeployed here to help minimize our problems of running around.

He mentioned that vehicles for transportation of recruits to Ruhengeri TS have been secured and the exercise was commencing today 3rd July, 1995.

CPOO

He reported that during the period under review, there has been a great improvement in the sending of daily sitreps by all CPMTs, but however reiterated the need to send sitreps on time.


He informed the meeting that it has been directed that all radio sets are to be re-programmed by the communication department and the exercise has commenced today 3/7/95 with Kigali. Therefore all personnel must ensure immediate compliance.

Furthermore, with regards to manning our base station, all duty officers are further reminded to be conscious of their responsibilities. Leaving the duty post will no longer be tolerated. Also voice procedure on the use of VHF radio must be observed.

CPIO

He reported that during the period under review the unit did not have many cases, but however they were still working very hard on pending investigation.

The Commissioner, in his comment observed that there had been a lot of areas requiring police investigation, but it was rather unfortunate that their performance has left much to be desired.



CLOSING REMARKS

At this juncture, the chairman informed the gathering that new redeployment of personnel was in the offing and that closed down PMTs, that is, Byumba and Kibungo will be re-opened in the ongoing dispensation. Therefore, he advised all CPMTs to remain behind for the collection of the new order tomorrow 4/7/95.

Furthermore, he mentioned that the number of personnel in each PMT and divisions will be trimmed down in view of the fact that all french speaking officers will be posted as instructors to National Gendarmerie Training School, Ruhengeri. That the training of about 500 recruits will commence soonest and the cost of the whole project is being borne by the UNDP.

In another instance, he highlighted the need of having an efficient welfare committee. He charged the present committee with a shortcoming in terms of inactivity. And as a result of this, their impact has not been felt. He charged them to hold a meeting and submit proposals without delay.

OTHER MATTERS

The issue of the Training School sending their own independent sitrep or otherwise was discussed intensively and it was resolved that all information be given to PMT Ruhengeri who would in turn include same in his daily sitrep.

Again, CPLOGO pointed out that since there are English Speaking recruits and the use of interpreters in imparting knowledge has not been without serious intricacies, he suggested re-deploying English Speaking Officers as trainers with a view to solving the problem. The suggestion was unanimously applauded. The chairman welcomed the idea and instantly showed good intention to employ the opinion to accomplish best result.

The meeting closed at 1300 hrs.

In sector 1 A, CIVPOL visited Kigali central prison on 20.11.1995 and reported that the planned decongestion exercise of the prison is now scheduled to commence on 25.11.1995. The

institution built to accommodate 2,500 inmates as at today has 10,578 inmates most of whom are suspected of genocide and living under very critical conditions. On the issue of access to prison facilities nation wide, the team reported that it was now advised to resolve the impasse with the state Ministry of Justice. It will be recalled that KIGALI CIVPOL team, following spate of denial of access into Rwandan prisons nationwide last week, reported that it secured an appointment to hold talks centred on UNAMIR observers unimpeded access into Rwandan prisons with the chief of prison administration in Rwanda for 20.11.1995.

ii: PMT - KIBUNGO-BYUMBA PREFECTURES

In Sector 2 B, CIVPOL reported, that the decongestion exercise of KIBUNGO prison, which began on the 17. November 1995 is in progress.

On the 18.11.1995, a total of 1,550 prisoners were transferred to NSINDA detention centre, while 1,224 inmates are expected to be moved on 20.11.1995.

At the close of the exercise, the NSINDA's strength is expected to be 4,141 including the 941 prisoners in the facility before the commencement of the decongestion exercise. In a related case the team also visited KABARARONDO Commune prison and reported that a spokesperson for the 80 genocide detainees, complained of very irregular feeding and therefore appeals for assistance.

ICRC informed.

In another development, CIVPOL reported that the Bourgmestre of KIGARAMA Commune has requested UNAMIR on behalf of the over 17,000 returnees from UGANDA, TANZANIA and BURUNDI, some agricultural implements and seedlings to enable the returnees start some form of subsistence farming.

The appeal to UNAMIR according to the Bourgmestre became necessary, following the inaction on the part of some unnamed NGO's. The report further stated that majority of the returnees who benefited from the state farmland allocation, blamed their inability to start farming on lack of farming implements and seedlings.

At the close of the exercise, the NSINDA detention centre has 4,145 inmates including the 940 prisoners in the facility before the commencement of the exercise.

Continuing, the report further stated that 9 genocide suspects were left at KIBUNGO , following gendarmerie's refusal to allow their transfer.

The director of KIBUNGO prison could not give reasons for the gendarmerie's action, but only informed the team that a protest over the incident has been lodged with the Ministry of Defence. In a related case, 42 military prisoners were also left in KIBUNGO prison.

The military detainees, according to the report will be transferred to BYUMBA prison at a later date.

Details of what informed the decision to transfer the military detainees to BYUMBA instead of NSINDA was not given. Concluding, the team reported that food for prisoners at NSINDA poses no problem as ICRC is on the ground to ensure that.

The Communal police, is the second component of the Rwanda Police Forces aside the National Gendarmerie.

The team reported that locals in RUBAZO Sector of MABANZA Commune, alleged occasional summary deprivation of life of locals suspected of genocide by survivors. Continuing, the report further stated that not less than five locals have been seriously assaulted in the public and taken away since the past two months and their where about not determined to date. Human Rights officials who have waded into the matter, are quoted to have stated that the victims are not detained in any known detention centre. Investigation is however continuing. In a related development, locals in GIHARA Commune, intimated CIVPOL that they are now living in a state of fear, following incidence of arbitrary arrests of locals in the area by RPA. The last arrest according to the report, was conducted on 03.11.1995. Human Rights informed.

In sector 5 C, CIVPOL reported that its team, accompanied NICOY medical team to MUKURA Sector of MABANZA Commune, to ascertain the claim of Malaria and Diarrhoea epidemic in the sector.

Continuing, the report further stated that there was no outbreak of the epidemic, but that three children died in the area between September and October, 1995.

In another development, CIVPOL reported that a communal police officer on 11.11.1995 allegedly committed suicide at MWENDO Commune. Continuing the report further stated that the cop who was armed with grenade, released its pin in a drinking bar, killing himself and a woman instantly and wounding several others including an RPA soldier.

Motive behind the incident is yet to be ascertained. RPA and Gendarmerie are conducting own investigations.

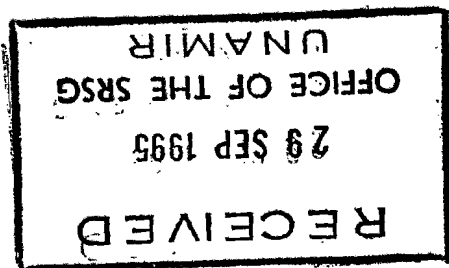

Thanks for your letter CIV/POL/LETTER/35/95 in which you submit the information I required about UNAMIR Instructors for the Communal Police training.

I however have a few comments to bring to your attention so that the necessary arrangements be made early enough to effect the changes.

- (1) The bulk of the cadets are neither fluent French or English speakers. It therefore follows that the team of Instructors has to be balanced and more especially because they (cadets) are composed of a big fraction of French speakers/listeners and another big fraction of English speakers/listeners.
- (2) Instructors N° 1,2 and 3 on your list shall not be really necessary as intelligence lessons shall be conducted by our own Instructors. Your CPTO is working out this arrangement with the commandant of the training school.
- (3) The table for the English speaking Instructors is not complete. Their lessons are not indicated against their names. I suggest that a complete table be made.

Therefore, it necessarily follows that these guidelines below be of use in our planning.

- (a) there should be an equal number of both English and French speaking Instructors.

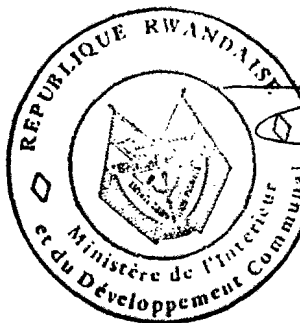

- (b) Our project document specifies that we shall be facilitated by 20 qualified instructors from UNAMIR. Your letter talks of 23 and it's my view that the extra 3 not provided for in our planning are not necessary. I am instead looking around for 2 or 3 Swahili speaking qualified Instructors to conduct the lessons in Swahili for the benefit of cadets who don't speak either French or English.
- (c) Each lesson shall necessarily have two Instructors, thus taught in both French and English. I hope to succeed in getting the Swahili Instructors.

It's my hope also that these guidelines will help you re-organise your team.

NOTE ON CIVPOL MANPOWER REDUCTION

I. INTRODUCTION:

United Nations HQs has some financial difficulties in subsidising UNAMIR and hence a directive to reduce the strength of the mission including CIVPOL. The directive to phase out all CIVPOL observers not involved in training was given leaving a small administrative staff at CIVPOL HQs by 31/10/95 and subsequently phasing out the remainders by 8/12/95.

II. CIVPOL CURRENT ACTIVITIES

The current CIVPOL activities in accordance with Security Council Resolution 997 (1995) are:

A. To assist in the Training of National Police and serve as adviser in carrying out the following activities:

- ✓ - Develop crash training programme for new gendarmes;
 - ✓ - Conduct an intensive training for new gendarmes;
 - ✓ - Train the instructors of gendarmes;
 - ✓ - Prepare training manuals for national gendarme school;
 - ✓ - Develop a training programme for new communal police officers;
 - ✓ - Prepare training manuals for the Communal Police Training Centre;
-

- Assist the Chief of Staff of the National Gendarmerie and the Director of the Communal Police in the establishment of a New National Police.

- B. Monitor the process of voluntary and safe return of Rwandan refugees/displaced persons and their resettlement in their home communes.
- C. Assist the Human Rights Field Operation Observers in their monitoring and investigation activities.
- D. Monitor the security situation in the country.
- E. Assist Military Observers and formed troops in police matters.

Due to the latest directive of reducing CIVPOL Manpower, CIVPOL task will be Training exclusively. Monitoring activities will therefore be cancelled altogether.

The number of instructors needed has been defined on the basis of a ratio of 12 hrs per week per instructor (i.e. 3 hrs per day).

According to the above organisation the total strength needed/required will be fifty five Police Observers for the training exclusively.

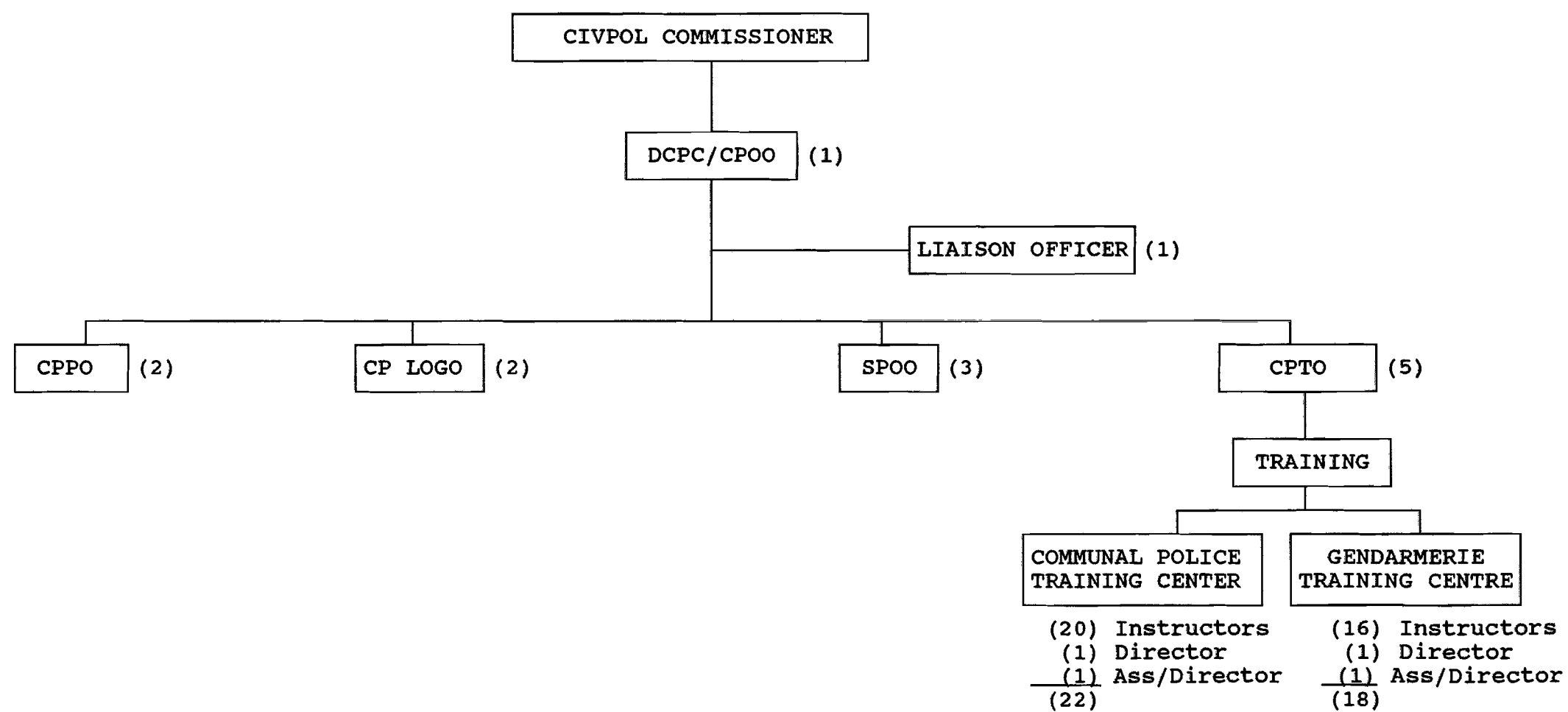

VISIT TO THE NEW TRAINING CENTRE AT GISHARI FOR COMMUNAL POLICE

A joint mission of high level authorities from UNAMIR, the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Community development visited the Construction site of the new Training Centre at Gishari for Communal Police.

The UNAMIR Members comprised of:

- CIVPOL Commissioner
- Special Tasks Officer
- Chief Logistics Officer

The Rwandese Government entourage consisted of:

- Director of Cabinet in the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Community Development
- Director of the Communal Police.

On arrival at the site, the entourage was met by the Commander of the Training Centre and CIVPOL Monitoring Team of Rwamagana.

It should be stated here that the rehabilitation of the Training Centre is being financed by the UN TRUST FUND for an amount of U\$ 400,000.00. The project includes UNDP, UNAMIR, WHO, WFP and the Rwandese Government.

The rehabilitation of the Centre involves the construction of fifteen(15) dormitories, Ten (10) class rooms, Recreation rooms, Toilets Medical Unit and renovation of existing old buildings in order to accommodate Seven Hundred fifty (750) students and about thirty(30) Instructors.

As at today, out of U\$ 100,000.00 budget, 75% of the construction work has been completed while a total of U\$ 125,733.00(Budget Line) was budgeted. The work is progressing satisfactorily.

During the visit the following constructions were noted to have been accomplished:

- 10 Dormitories out of 15.
- 80 showers out of 83
- All Toilets, 2 recreation rooms and the Kitchen.
- 10 projected class room project are about to be completed.

Most of the needed bedding, food items and medicines have already been provided. However, it is necessary to note that despite efforts made for a maximum achievement by spending less money it is still necessary to execute some additional essential work which was initially not approved in the budget. It will be thus necessary to allocate an additional budget

to cover the cost related to the above mentioned work. The Rwandese are to make a request for that purpose.

As for the commitment accepted by UNAMIR in the project, the following provisions have already been done:

- Training curricula have already been worked out.
- Instructors have been chosen and deployed at the site.
- One truck and a pick up have been released to the centre to solve various transportation problems encountered by the Training Centre.

On water and Electricity supply, appropriate UNAMIR services have been contacted and proposals have been made in conjunction with the Rwandese.

In addition the Training period provided for the Police Agents is to last for a maximum of 12 weeks. A question arises here as to whether the Training will be entirely covered before the UNAMIR Mandate expires on 8/12/95, not to mention the training of the second contingent of 750 students. This question requires special attention from the UNAMIR authorities and should be discussed with the appropriate Rwandan authorities.

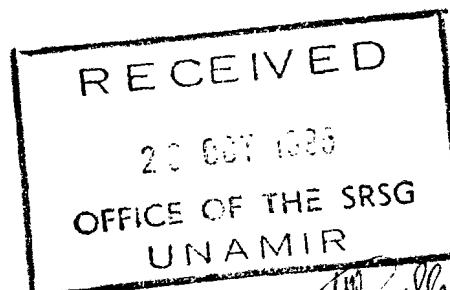
Finally the entourage realized the viability of the Rehabilitation of the Training Centre which offers to the Rwandese Government facilities which will enable them solve important requirement for Trained Police Agents in solving matters related to Public Security in Communes.

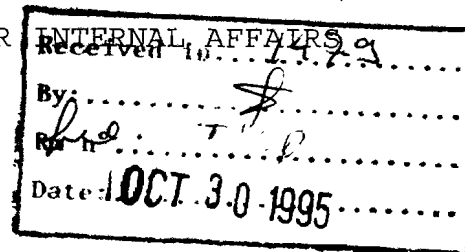

As you are aware, efforts and all other possible resources in our means towards a proper establishment of the Communal Police training centre are currently being put together as the school is nearing the start, expected to be at the end of this month.

Your support for this programme has been remarkable. The requirements however are numerous and the funding from donors which you are aware of limits us to only the key items that will permit a start.

Your excellency, the importance we are attaching to this programme entails me to make a few other requests from UNAMIR, through you, with the hope that your usual co-operation will be of great use:

1. TRANSPORT

Apart from the two vehicles lent to us for the training centre, the Communal Police Headquarters at the Ministry seriously needs transport to be able to monitor activities at the school and subsequent operations in the field. In this regard, I am requesting you to assist the department with another four vehicles;

One Four wheel driver station wagon and 3 other double cabin pick-ups.

2. COMMUNICATION

Communication for any security organisation is a vital aspect. It will similarly be a necessity for our Policemen.

The Departing troops of UNAMIR have these gargets. If a few were left behind for use by the Communal Police force. 200 Radios with their accessories and small generators would suffice.

3. FUEL

Our Ministry faced with a heavy load of activities in the countryside, with a strained budget finds it difficult to purchase enough fuel to run all our activities.

I am therefore requesting that UNAMIR assists the Communal Police project with fuel, 5000 Lts of diesel and 1000 Lts of petrol per month.

4. OFFICE MACHINERY

Only two computers, two photocopiers and two type-writers have been purchased with the support from UNDP. These will certainly not be sufficient especially given the fact that the users are not very experienced.

UNAMIR support in this respect would also be vital with 4 more computers with thier accessories, 2 photocopiers, 4 type-writers.

5. HOUSING

Accomadation for policemen in the town of Kigali will not be easy as the communes of the town do not have enough land and construction costs are rather high. The mobile houses currently used by UNIMAR personnel near Amahoro stadium would suit our purpose if left behind.

Expatriating further the Bourgmestre disclosed that the problem which has been brought to the attention of the state ministry of Social integration and Rehabilitation appears to be in the limbo.

ii: PMT - GYANGUGU PREFECTURE

The team conducted patrols of GISHOMA Commune and reported that four locals were killed while another was seriously injured on 25.10.1995 at about 2000 hours, some 22 km from Cyangugu. The report further stated that the victims include the IPJ of GISHOMA and one, who was to be wedded on 26.10.1995. Continuing, a 10 year old eyewitness intimated CIVPOL team that the assassins now at large were in military

uniforms, one of which visited the IPJ a day before the incident on account of the marriage and that he will be able to identify subject if seen. The victims who received gun shots in the head, chest and back are all Hutus. Gendarmerie and Human Rights assisted by CIVPOL have commenced scrupulous investigations the report concluded.

Continuing the team further reported that 35 of the 96 genocide suspects in the Commune prison were transferred between 22 and 25 th october 1995 to NYARZA prison facility with the assistance of UNAMIR.

This observation according to the director is in view of UNAMIR nexuses to the issue of Rwanda prisons.

The team conducted patrols of Nyakabanda Commune and reported that the forty two genocide suspects detained in the Commune are in dire need of food, despite World Food Programme consignment of flour and beans received by the Commune last week. Some locals in the commune, averred that most Humanitarian Aid to communes and sectors do not get to the supposed beneficiaries but are utilized by those not intended. The locals therefore appealed to UNAMIR and other humanitarian aid agencies to fashion out a system of taking part in the disposition of reliefs, otherwise the whole essence of the aid would have been defeated. ICRC informed.

3.2 PMT - BUTARE PREFECTURE : Theme : Arrest

The team conducted patrols of Rusatira Commune and reported the arrest of the Commune Bourgmestre for misappropriation of public funds. He is presently undergoing interrogations at Ngoma Gendarmerie Brigade in Butare.

3.3 PMT - RUHENGARI PREFECTURE. Theme : Gendarmerie and Subversive activities

The team reported that the Ruhengeri Public Prosecutor has appealed to UNAMIR authorities to consider the inclusion of a Refresher Course for gendarmes in its training programme. This according to the prosecutor will increase professionalism and equip gendarmes to deal appropriately with the contemporary demands of their duties.

The team conducted patrols of Kinigi commune and reported that EXFAR elements who infiltrated into the commune distributed leaflets, in which they accused the incumbent Government of systematic ethnic cleansing of the Hutu community, politics of exclusion and that Human Rights is also being violated in the most atrocious manner since its inception. The team further stated that the leaflet advised all Hutus to join forces here and elsewhere to effect a change of the present statusquo in Rwanda.

3.4 PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE : Theme : Human Rights Abuses

The team reported that locals in Gisovu Commune are the latest victims of what some of them call deliberate ethnic cleansing of the Hutu community in Kibuye Prefecture, by RPA. Most men in the commune according to the report, have been arrested while a number of them are taken into the forest and tortured until they seize breath.

On 17/10/95, the latest victim was a local who disagreed with claims that UNAMIR is merely hanging on in Rwanda to avoid an embarrassing admission of failure as in the cases of Somalia and Bosnia was arrested and publicly shot in the leg after which he was brutally beaten to death. Continuing, the team reported that most male adults are now in the forest while their women and children who keep their homes during the day join them in the night to avoid being beaten during arrest.

Aside these arrests and killings, properties of locals not found when effecting the arrest are confiscated while their families are subjected to painful ordeals for screening the alleged genocide offenders.

The locals have therefore appealed to UNAMIR authorities for quick intervention and save them the trauma of having to live a horrible life indefinitely. Human Rights informed.

3.5 PMT - GISENYI : Theme : Kidnapping and Insurgent Activities

The team conducted patrols of Rwerere Commune and reported that the counsellor of Busumba sector and two other locals have been kidnapped since 7/10/95 by some persons suspected to be Interahamwe, following the former's inability to meet the latter's demand of 500,000 FRW.

The whereabouts of the victims is still not known, but unconfirmed sources said they were sighted in Kimumba refugees camp in Zaire.

The RPA Commander and the Gendarmerie in Gisenyi have in this connection solicited the assistance of UNHCR and UNAMIR authorities, regards their possible repatriation.

The team reported the arrest of a local, who admitted being an insurgent on 19/10/95 by RPA. The local, the report further stated first entered the country from Zaire in company of 60 other insurgents on 04/10/95 and returned to Zaire on 5/10/95. On 18/10/95 the local and 30 other insurgents made another entry into Rwanda through Gishwati forest with the sole aim of destabilizing the country and effect a change. Continuing, the arrested insurgent also revealed that they were responsible for the killing of Kayove commune Bourgmestre sometime ago and that an intensive military training is going on in Zaire refugees camps in preparation for a major offensive on Rwanda.

3.6 PMT - GIKONGORO PREFECTURE : Theme : Prison and Human Rights abuses

The team visited Gikongoro prison and reported that apart from the appalling living conditions of the prison inmates which call for urgent attention, almost all the 1,191 detainees are now infested with gangrene. The detainees the report further stated, remain in standing position all day and night and at times sleep in turns on bare floor for 60 minutes or less. Continuing, the team stated that the condition of the genocide suspects is very pathetic and close to euthanasia.

The team therefore appeals to UNAMIR authorities to give Gikongoro prison most immediate priority in the next decongestion of Rwanda prisons exercise.

3.1 PMT - GIKONGORO PREFECTURE Theme: Human Rights Abuses.

The team conducted patrols of KARAMA Commune and reported instances of torture of genocide inmates detained in the Commune makeshift prison by RPA personnel. In a related development the team further reported that, fourteen genocide suspects in Rukondo Commune are Crammed into a one room makeshift prison without windows for ventilation, while their counterparts in MUSEBEYA Commune are fed once, every other day. This situation which has reduced most of the inmates to moving corpses, is attributed to RPA habit of confiscating food items met for the inmates. Human Rights and ICRC informed.

3.2 PMT - CYANGUGU PREFECTURE

Theme: Human Rights abuses and identification Parade.

The team reported that three Local genocide suspects who bagged death sentences following the determination of their cases by Tribunal de Premiere Instance sitting in Cyangugu were not given any legal defence services or fair trial. Continuing the team further stated that the tribunal is having a number of such penal cases in its calender and therefore call on UNAMIR authorities to impress on Rwanda judiciary, of the need to respect the rule of law and ensure expedient criminal jurisprudence in the administration of Criminal Justice in Rwanda.

In a related development, the team reported that local Police authorities in CYANGUGU have concluded plans to parade genocide suspects before an orchestrated Communal gathering, with a view to identifying or assembling more evidence against the suspects. The first phase of the exercise is scheduled to take place in Kimbogo , Gishoma, Nyakabuye and Gisuma Communes, while the second phase will be in Karengera and Kamembe Communes.

This development the team further reported is informed by the need to compile dossiers of detainees in Rwanda Prisons and detention centers in preparation for the dispensation of Justice of those fingered in last year's genocide. The issue of those who committed genocide though far-fetched should be handled with utmost caution and finesse when they emanate so that innocent Rwandans are not implicated against the backdrop of other dimensions of the Rwanda conflict, the team concluded. Human Rights informed.

3.3 PMT KIBUYE PREFECTURE. Theme : Funeral

The team conducted patrols of GITESI Commune and reported that a government party led by an army Colonel arrived KIBUYE from KIGALI on 17/10/95 to convey the remains of the five RPA soldiers who lost their lives in the skirmish that took place between RPA and EXFAR elements at BWIZA sector of RUTSIRO Commune on 13/10/95 for burial in REBERO burial ground in Kigali on 20/10/95 after a requiem mass.

The Colonel was quoted as saying during the handing over of the bodies, that more RPA personnel will soon be deployed to the area in view of the incessant probing attacks by EXFAR insurgents. A dusk to dawn curfew has also been imposed on the Commune.

However, the spare tyre and tools were missing from the vehicle at the time of its release. Investigation in progress.

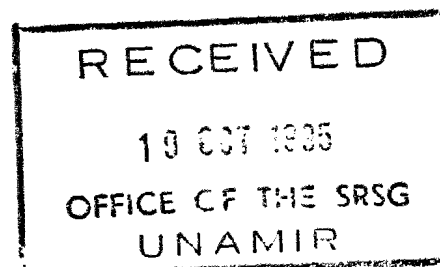
SUBJECT: Meeting of Heads of Agencies- 18 October 1995

This special occasion was transformed into a meeting of the Rwanda Local Operational Support Group which, by definition, included ambassadors and representatives of the donor community in Rwanda. Under Sec-Gen & UNDP Associate Director, Mr. Rafeeuddin Ahmed, was in attendance. Present also was Ms. Edith Gassana, Chef du Cabinet of MINIPLAN.

The Provisional Agenda, herewith attached, was approved and discussed. Herebelow are some salient observations:

1. On the Round Table: The Rwandese government's view is that the ideal time for the next Round Table on Rwanda is March-April 1996. *Agree.*
2. On the Repatriation and Reintegration of refugees: The S-G's proposed Special Appeal for Humanitarian Assistance for the Sub-Region, which is being piloted/coordinated by DHA, does not enjoy the support, let alone approval, of the Rwandese government. The latter emphasized that distinctive needs of Rwanda would be highlighted during Thematic Consultations scheduled to take place in Kigali on 21-22 November 1995. Many donor reps, UNHCR and UNDP appear to endorse this government viewpoint as expressed by Ms. Gassana; even though UNREO sought to explain the importance, in particular, of the regional dimension and efficacy of the Special Appeal. Infact, the Rwandes PM, Minister of Planning and Minister of Rehabilitation articulated the above government viewpoint during seperate discussions with Under Secretary-General Rafeeuddin Ahmed of UNDP yesterday, October 17.

Donors underscored the importance of the February 1995 Bujumbura Conference which emphasised three clear levels of responsibility in addressing the refugee crisis in the sub-region thus: a) countries of assylum, b) countries of origin and c) the international community. Rwanda, on its part, was exhorted to continue creating the conditions necessary for the facilitation of the repatriation of Rwandese refugees in Zaire and Tanzania.
