DAILY SITREP FOR 05 MAY 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH CERTAIN AREAS REMAIN TENSE, ESPECIALLY IN KIBEHO CAMP, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFUX OF IDPs.

B. MILOBS IN SECTOR 3 REPORTED THAT THOUGH THERE HAS BEEN NO OVERT ACTIVITY IN THIS SECTOR DURING THE PAST FEW DAYS, THERE ARE CLEAR SIGNS OF TROUBLE AHEAD. THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE HAVE STOPPED ARRESTS FOR THE TIME BEING BUT MAKE NO SECRET OF THEIR INTENTION TO CARRY ON WITH ARRESTS AS SOON AS THEY THINK THEY CAN DO SO WITHOUT STARTING TROUBLE. EXHUMATION AND REBURIAL CEREMONIES CONTINUE TO FAN THE SPIRIT OF VENGEANCE AMONG THE POPULATION. RUMOURS OF THE DEPARTURE OF UNAMIR ARE BEING CIRCULATED FREELY. WITH THIS, THE SLIGHT IMPROVEMENT IN WORKING RELATIONS WITH BOTH THE RPA AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE IS DIFFICULT TO INTERPRET. PAST EXPERIENCE HAS RENDERED MILOBS WEARY OF GESTURES OF FRIENDSHIP FROM EITHER SIDE.

C. IN SECTOR 4B, ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF MUGANZA COMMUNE WAS REPORTED BY CIVPOL OBSERVERS TO HAVE DIRECTED THAT ALL UNAMIR VEHICLES MUST PRODUCE A PERMIT FROM THE PREFECT OF BUTARE BEFORE THEY WOULD BE ALLOWED FREEDOM OF MOVEMENT IN THE AREA. NEGOTIATION IN PROGRESS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, MET WITH DR. JILLIAN WONG AND A DELEGATION FROM ODA TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, ISSUES RELATED TO THE COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON KIBEHO. HE THEN HELD SEVERAL INTERNAL MEETINGS IN PREPARATION FOR MONDAY'S OPENING SESSION OF THE COMMISSION.

B. THE FOLLOWING NEWS ITEMS WERE REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) ON THURSDAY, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT, MR. SETH SENDASHONGA, SAID THAT 400 IDPS LEFT KIBEHO CAMP ON THURSDAY FOR THEIR HOME COMMUNES, SOME OF THEM ON FOOT. MR. SENDASHONGA POINTED OUT THAT EPIDEMICS OF TYPHOID AND DYSENTERY HAD ERUPTED IN THE CAMP. HE TOLD RADIO RWANDA THAT 49 TRUCKS, PROVIDED IN PART BY UNAMIR, WERE AVAILABLE AT KIBEHO FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF RETURNEES. HE ADDED THAT THE RED CROSS AND WFP WOULD PROVIDE FOOD SUPPLIES AND JERRY CANS TO THE RETURNING IDPS.

(2) THE MEMBERS OF THE RWANDESE PARLIAMENT ON THURSDAY INITIATED DISCUSSIONS ON THE DRAFTING OF A NEW RWANDESE CONSTITUTION BASED ON ELEMENTS OF THE 1992 RWANDESE CONSTITUTION, THE 1994 ARUSHA PEACE AGREEMENTS, THE AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE RPF AND RWANDESE POLITICAL PARTIES NOT INVOLVED IN THE GENOCIDE SIGNED ON 17 JULY 1994, AND THE AGREEMENTS REACHED BETWEEN THE POLITICAL PARTIES IN THE GOVERNMENT OF NATIONAL UNITY SIGNED ON 24 NOVEMBER 1994.

(3) ON THURSDAY, THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU VISITED CYANGUGU PENITENTIARY TOGETHER WITH A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE RED CROSS AND MEMBERS OF CYANGUGU SECURITY COUNCIL. THEY LEARNED THAT 1,813 DETAINEES ARE CURRENTLY BEING HELD IN THE PRISON, WHICH HAS A MAXIMUM CAPACITY OF 500 PEOPLE. THE REPRESENTATIVES FOUND THIRTY-SIX CHILDREN, INCLUDING ONE BABY AND TWENTY-SIX DETAINEES SUFFERING FROM DYSENTERY. NINETY

PER CENT OF THE DETAINEES ARE ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE, AND THE PRISON IS RECEIVING AN AVERAGE OF EIGHT NEW DETAINEES PER DAY.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) ZAMBATT AND MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUED TO CORDON THE MSF BUILDING COMPLEX IN KIBEHO. THE RPA BN DEPLOYED ON ROAD KIBEHO - BUTARE AT GR 532081, IS STILL IN POSITION.

(2) IN SECTOR 4A ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAVE ABDUCTED A LOCAL MALE AND HIS FAMILY, AFTER ASSAULTING HIM AND HIS FAMILY AND ROBBING 400,000 FRANCE. THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE ENTIRE FAMILY IS NOT KNOWN. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 2 MILOBS REPORTED OF A NEW RPA BN POST AT KIGARAMA GR 7844.

B. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

B. SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) THE CO AND MILOB SECTOR COMD MET THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA TO DISCUSS THE WELFARE OF IDPs.

(3) THERE WERE REPORTS OF MOVEMENTS OF PEOPLE IN AND OUT OF RWANDA THROUGH THE KAGITUMBA AND BUZIBA BORDERS. INFLOW 2,160 AND OUTFLOW 1,800. REPORTS ALSO INDICATED THAT 107 PEOPLE ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH BUZIBA BORDER.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 86 LOCALS IN AOR.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) 50 IDPs AT SAKE ORC WERE REGISTERED AND ESCORTED TO THEIR VARIOUS COMMUNES BY GHANBATT TPS.

(3) FOUR REPS OF REFUGEES' POLICY GROUP (NGO) AND GHANBATT TPS TALKED TO IDPs AT SAKE ON RESETTLEMENT.

(4) A TOTAL OF 11 DPs FROM BURUNDI AND ZAIRE WHO WERE

RECEIVED BY OWN TPS AT SAKE ORC WERE REGISTERED AND EVAC TO THEIR VARIOUS HOMES.

(5) GHANBATT DCO ON BEHALF OF OFFRS AND MEN PRESENTED TEN SCHOOL DESKS TO THE KIBUNGO PRIMARY SCHOOL. THE ITEMS WERE RECEIVED ON BEHALF OF THE SCHOOL BY THE SOUS PREFECT OF KIBUNGO AND THE INSP OF SCHOOLS FOR THE PREFECTURE.

(6) TWO GHANBATT LOCAL WORKERS EMPLOYED BY BROWN AND ROOT WERE HANDED OVER TO THE PROSECUTOR OF KIBUNGO IN THE PRESENCE OF HR, ICRC AND MILOBS. THEY WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE DURING THE WAR.

D. SECTOR 3A (MALAWICOY)

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PTL TO MURANGARA GR 2266 REPORTED THAT LOCAL MALES, ESPECIALLY HUTUS, IN THE COMMUNE WERE BEING ARRESTED AND JAILED BY THE RPA FOR NO APPARENT REASONS. THE PTL ALSO OBSERVED THAT THE PRIMARY SCHOOL IN THE AREA LACKED LEARNING MATERIALS.

(3) ASSISTED IN THE TRANSPORTATION OF FOOD FOR CIVIL SERVANTS WITHIN THE GITESI COMMUNE.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED ONE LOCAL IN AOR.

E. SECTOR 3B (MALICOY) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NSTR.

F. SECTOR 4A (ZAMBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PROVIDED TPS TO GUARD UNAMTR VEH NO 1123 DETAINED BY RPA IN GIKONGORO. THE MENTIONED WAS INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT.

(3) UNICEF DELIVERED 50 BOXES OF BISCUITS FOR DISTRIBUTION TO IDPs LEAVING IN MSF BUILDING AT KIBEHO.

(4) A TOTAL OF 126 IDPs LEFT KIBEHO TODAY.

(5) LOCALS IN RURAMBA GR 4712 WERE REPORTED NOT TO BE SLEEPING IN THEIR HOUSES FOR FEAR OF BEING ATTACKED BY RPA SOLDIERS. ZAMBATT PTLs INTENSIFIED IN THE MENTIONED AREA.

G. SECTOR 4B (SENBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) THE A/FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO SENBATT LOC.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 107 LOCALS IN AOR.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR. NSTR.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NSTR.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) DEPLOYED RRF AT 050320 HRS UPON INFORMATION OF BANDITRY ACTIVITY AT GOAL (NGO), OFFICE/RESIDENCE, NEAR KIGALI NIGHT CLUB. ON ARRIVAL, THE RRF WAS INFORMED THAT THE BANDITS HAD ROBBED TWO WATCHMEN OF MONEY, WATCH AND CLOTHING AT APPROX 050130 HRS. THE BANDITS COULD NOT ENTER THE HOUSE BECAUSE AN RPA PATROL WAS NEARBY. ONE BANDIT WAS REPORTED WOUNDED IN AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND THE BANDITS. THE BANDITS HOWEVER ESCAPED. THE RRF CONTINUED TO PROVIDE PROTECTION TO THE GOAL COMPOUND TILL 050445 HRS.

(3) PROVIDED THREE TCVs TO THE RWANDAN MINISTRY OF EDUCATION FOR TRANSPORTATION OF EDUCATION MATERIALS TO BUTARE. TCVs RETURNED ON COMPLETION OF TASK.

(4) 131 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM KIBUNGO AND RUHENGARI AND 40 EVAC BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO AND OTHER COMMUNES. A TOTAL OF 250 IDPs STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 10 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE.

K. MILOB GP. THE GENERAL SITUATION REMAINED CALM. MILOBS IN ALL SECTORS CONTINUED TO MONITOR OPERATIONS TO RETURN IDPS TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES AND THEIR PROGRESS ON ARRIVAL.

(1) POLITICAL. NTR.

(2) BORDERS.

(A) FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC.

I. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

II. RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA).

(B) GISENYI BORDER POST WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

(C) ALL BORDERS TO BURUNDI WERE REPORTED TO BE CLOSED TO ALL RWANDAN CITIZENS WISHING TO LEAVE THE COUNTRY.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE MILOB SECTOR COMMANDER MET THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA TO DISCUSS MODALITIES OF MONITORING OF IDPs' WELFARE AND RESETTLEMENT.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE SECTOR COMMANDER MET THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO AND DISCUSSED THE PROBLEM OF THE MUGESERA CHECKPOINT AND THE REFUSAL OF THE AUTHORITIES TO ALLOW PASSAGE OF MILOB TEAMS INTO THE NYAKIRAMBI RWINKWAVU TRANSIT CAMPS AND THE BUKOBA BORDER CHECKPOINT. THE PREFECT INSISTED THAT DETAILS ON FIGURES AT THE TRANSIT CAMPS AND THE BORDER CHECKPOINT SHOULD BE COLLECTED DAILY FROM THE PREFECTURE OFFICES. ON PATROLS BEYOND THE MUGESERA CHECK POINT, HE INSISTED THAT MILOBS MUST ALWAYS CONTACT THE BOURGEMESTRE FOR ACCESS BEYOND THE CHECK POINT. THIS HAS NOW PUT IMPEDIMENTS ON UNAMIR ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTOR. BORDER OFFICIALS AT THE RUSUMO BORDER, HAVE ALSO REFUSED TO GIVE DETAILS OF CROSSINGS AT THE BORDER. THEY ARE INSISTING THAT MILOBS BROUGHT A NOTE FROM THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS FROM KIBUNGO AND RILIMA WERE AGAIN DENIED ACCESS BEYOND THE MUGESERA CHECKPOINT.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR REMAINED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. HOWEVER, RPA HAVE MADE KNOWN THEIR INTENTION OF CARRYING OUT FURTHER ARRESTS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. THERE HAD BEEN AN ORDER FOR CESSATION OF ARRESTS IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE, PROBABLY DUE TO LACK OF SPACE IN THE PRISONS OF GITARAMA AND KIBUYE. GITARAMA PRISON NOW HOLDS OVER 7,000 INMATES AND THAT OF KIBUYE, WHICH WAS ORIGINALLY MEANT FOR 250 PEOPLE, IS NOW HOLDING 1,068. LOCAL AUTHORITIES ARE INDIFFERENT TO THE SITUATION IN THE PRISONS.

(C) MILOBS IN KIBUYE REPORTED THAT THE RPA CONTINUED THEIR ARRESTS OF LOCALS IN THE AREA. LOCALS HOWEVER REFUSED TO GIVE DETAILS FOR FEAR OF REPRISAL FROM RPA.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED MURAMBI GR 3538 AND KIBEHO CAMPS. SITUATION IN MURAMBI WAS CALM. AT KIBEHO, MILOBS OBSERVED RPA TROOPS LEADING SOME TUTSI LOCALS TO RETRIEVE ITEMS FROM THE GARBAGE IN THE CAMP.

(C) MILOBS CARRIED OUT AN AERIAL RECCE ALONG RIVERS IN THE VICINITY OF KIBEHO IN AN EFFORT TO SEARCH FOR DEAD BODIES ALONG THE BANKS. NONE WERE OBSERVED, DUE TO BAD WEATHER.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS ESCORTED THE AFC/CMO ON HIS TOUR OF SENBATT.

(C) PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED TO RUNYIYNA GR 6012, KIBAYI GR 8490, RUSATIRA GR 6097, KANYARU BAS GR 6890, KANYARU HAUTE GR 6390 AND KIBEHO CAMP GR 5007. SIT WAS REPORTED CALM IN AREAS PATROLLED.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS WITNESSED A MEETING BY THE PREFECT OF RUHENGERI WITH IDPS IN NDUSU GR 6212. THE CROWD OF ABOUT 3,000 INCLUDING LOCALS, WAS ADDRESSED BY THE PREFECT, THE BOURGMESTRES OF NDUSU AND GATONDE AND AN RPA OFFICER. THE IDPS WERE GIVEN ONE WEEK TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. MILOBS WILL CONTINUE TO MONITOR FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

L. FORCE ENGR COY.

(1) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(2) DIGGING WORK FOR DISPOSAL OF REFUSE IN GISENYI IN PROGRESS.

(3) CONTINUED CONSTRUCTION OF BRIDGE AT NYAMATA.

(4) PROVIDED FIVE TRUCKS TO TAC HQ BUTARE FOR TRANSPORTING OF IDPs.

(5) TRANSPORTED 86 IDPs FROM KIBEHO TO BUTARE.

M. AUSMED.

(1) PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 65 OUT-PATIENTS AND 8 DENTAL PATIENTS. CHK CURRENTLY HOLDING 12 IN-PATIENTS.

(3) AUSMED MSF CCP RE-ESTB AT KIBEHO TREATED 2 CAS.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE KIA DURING THE PERIOD. TOTAL OF 19 FLIGHTS DEPARTED AND ARRIVED KIA.

O. UN MP COY.

(1) UNAMIR MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDESE LOCAL AND TO THE NIBATT SOLDIER SUSPECTED OF MURDER.

(2) THREE THEFT CASES WERE REPORTED AS FOLLOWS:

(A) UNKNOWN ARMED MEN ROBBED THE WATCHMEN AT GOAL OFFICE/RESIDENCE IN KIGALI OF THEIR PERSONAL EFFECTS INCLUDING MONEY AT 0130 HRS.

(B) THE MAGNETIC ROOF-TOP RADIO ANTENNA OF UNAMIR 1067 WAS REPORTED STOLEN WHILE IT WAS PARKED DOWN TOWN.

(3) A TFC ACCIDENT WAS REPORTED AT GIKONGORO INVOLVING UNAMIR 1120. THE VEH WAS ALLEGED TO HAVE HIT A LOCAL PEDESTRIAN. ALL OTHER DETAILS NOT KNOWN. HOWEVER MPs FROM TFC SECTION DISPATCHED TO THE SCENE.

(4) LOSS OF UN ID NO. T037 BELONGING TO AN EMPLOYEE OF BROWN & ROOT WAS REPORTED.

P. 95 FLSG.

(1) RECOVERIES WERE CARRIED OUT IN SECTORS 3 AND SECTOR 6.

(2) ONE OUT OF THE 6 TCVs DEPLOYED AT KIBEHO FOR MOV OF IDPs RETURNED TO KIGALI DUE TO MECH PROBLEM.

(3) TWO WATER TANKERS WERE SENT TO BUTARE.

(4) LUMBER WAS DELIVERED TO BUTARE.

6. CIVPOL.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. CIVPOL MONITORS IN KIGALI PREFECTURE VISITED THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION WHO INFORMED THEM THAT THE RECENT DEMONSTRATIONS AGAINST UNAMIR DID NOT REPRESENT THE VIEWS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA BUT THOSE OF A SMALL PART OF THE POPULATION WHO PRESENTED THEIR OWN VIEWS IN THEIR OWN INTERESTS.

C. IN GISENYI PREFECTURE CIVPOL PTL REPORTED THAT 26 VEHICLES BELONGING TO 3 TANZANIAN NATIONALS WERE IMPOUNDED BY RPA AT GISENYI AIRPORT SINCE 8 APR 95. THE VEHICLES WHICH INCLUDED TRUCKS AND TANKERS WERE FROM TANZANIA AND WERE PASSING THROUGH THE COUNTRY TO ZAIRE VIA THE GISENYI BORDER POST. NO REASONS WERE GIVEN BY THE RPA. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

D. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHengeri GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL CONTINUES.

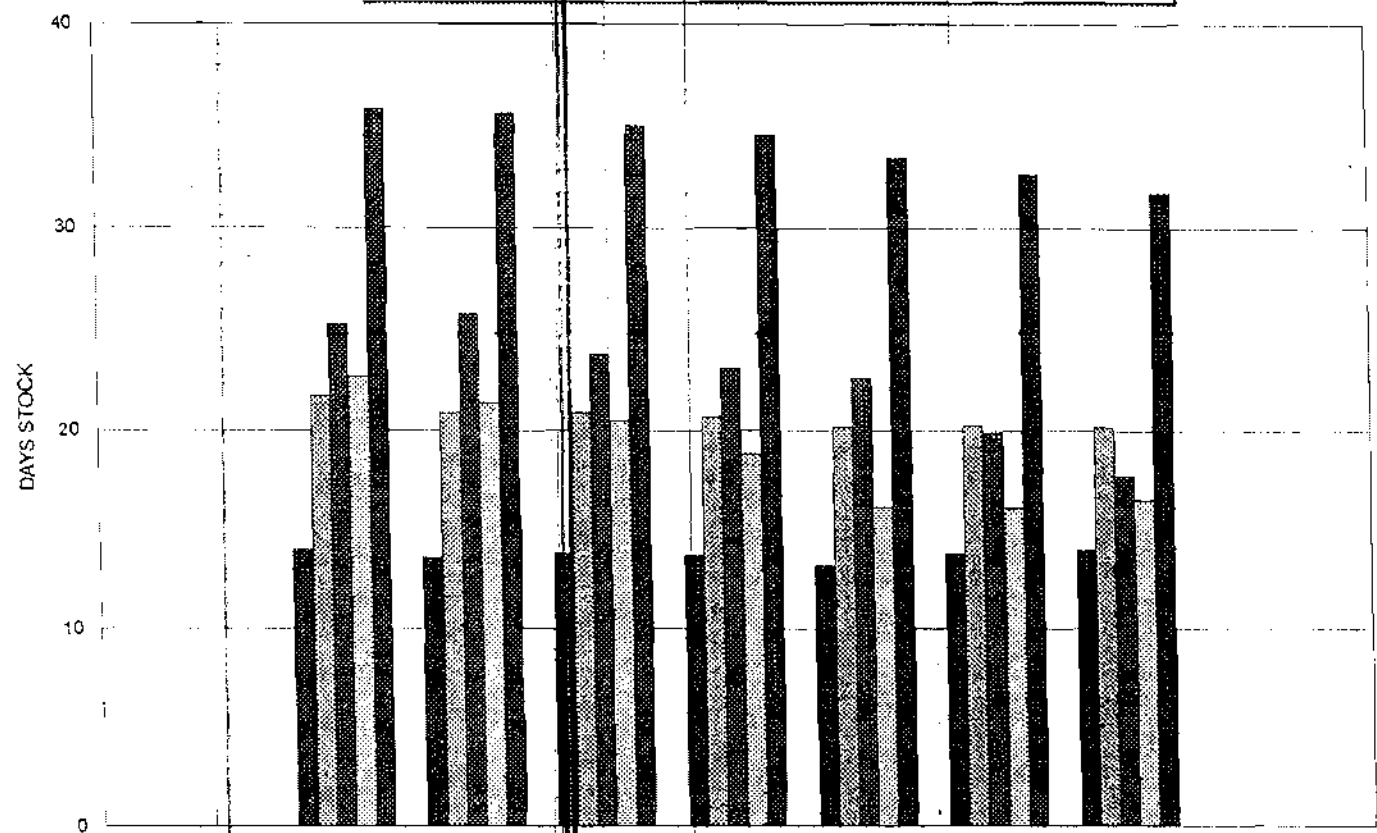

SECTOR 1: RPA AND GENDARMERIE CLAIM THAT UNAMIR VEH ARE BEING SEARCHED BECAUSE IN KIBUNGO, KIBUYE, GIKONGORO, AND BUTARE, UNAMIR VEH WERE FOUND TO BE CARRYING DANGEROUS DRUGS, SUCH AS QUOTE INDIAN HEMP UNQUOTE. COMMENT: WHETHER FABRICATION OR NOT, UNAMIR NOW HAS A REPORT OF POSSIBLE UNLAWFUL ACTIVITY. AN INVESTIGATION INTO THIS MATTER SHOULD BE SEEN BY THE RPA AND GENDARMERIE FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

(1) IT WILL SHOW THAT WE TAKE THEIR INSTITUTIONS SERIOUSLY.

(2) WILL SHOW THAT WE DO NOT HOLD OURSELVES ABOVE THEIR LAWS.

GRADER OR TIPPER TRUCK TO RESURFACE 12 KM ROAD WHICH IS IN A VERY BAD CONDITION DUE TO HEAVY RAINS. 70 PRISONERS FROM THE COMMUNE PRISON HAVE BEEN RELEASED BECAUSE OF LACK OF EVIDENCE. THERE ARE 617 IDPS STILL AT SAKA ORC GR 4354. PLANS UNDER WAY FOR THEIR EVAC TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES IN THE NEXT 3 DAYS BY UNHCR.

AT KAGARAME GR 9041 LOCALS ALLEGED THAT THE RPA WERE IMPRISONING MEN OF THE AREA AT THEIR THREE DETENTION CENTRES AT GAHABWA GR 9142, BUGESA GR 9245 AND KAZIBO

GR 9340. IT WAS FURTHER ALLEGED THAT THE PRISONERS WERE BEING TORTURED. HR INFORMED.

(3) ONE MILOB TEAM CONDUCTED HELI RECCE OF LANDING ZONES IN BUGARAMA SUB-SECTOR. FIVE LANDING ZONES WERE SPOTTED.

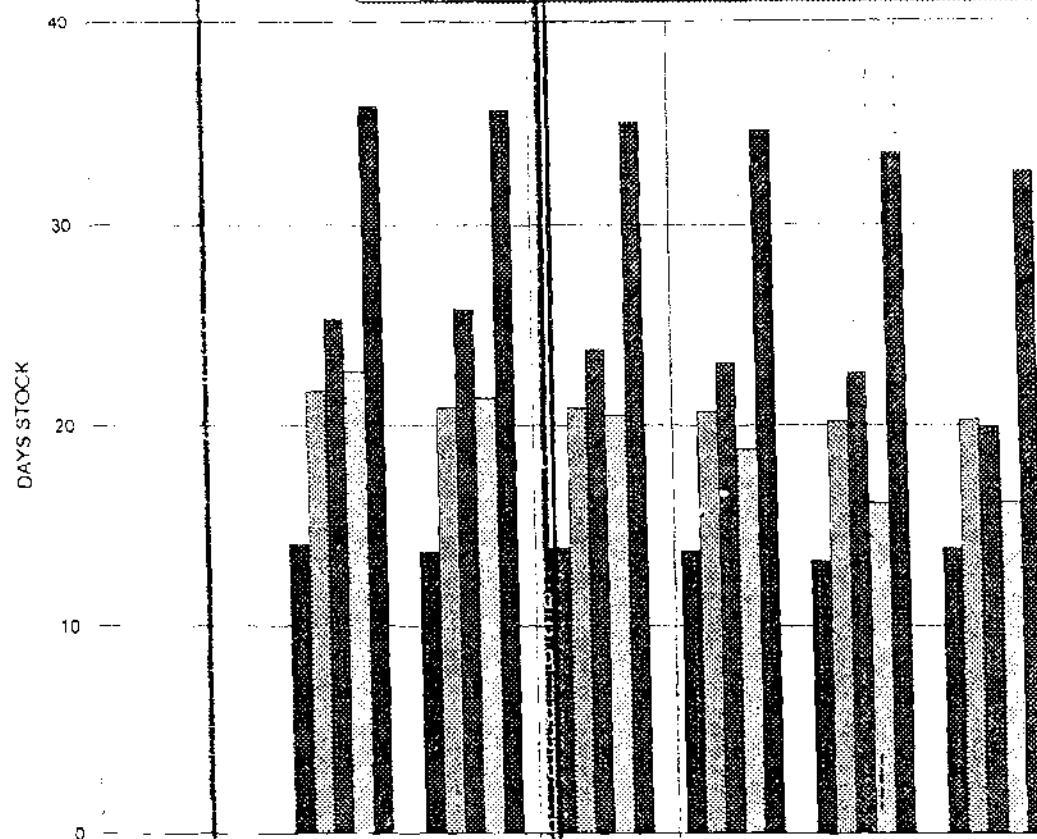

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, HELD HIS REGULAR MEETING

WITH HEADS OF UN AGENCIES DURING WHICH, AMONG OTHERS, THE STATUS OF DISPLACED PERSONS FORMERLY IN SECTOR 4A AND THE PROGRESS OF THE INDEPENDENT INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON KIBEHO WERE DISCUSSED.

B. HE ATTENDED A MEETING ON THE REHABILITATION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM HELD AT UNDP.

C. HE CONCLUDED BY ATTENDING THE OPENING SESSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL INDEPENDENT COMMISSION ON KIBEHO WHICH BEGAN AT 1900 HOURS AND ENDED AT 1950 HOURS AND TOOK PLACE AT THE OFFICE OF PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU. THE OPENING SESSION WAS CHAIRED BY THE PRIME MINISTER, ACCOMPANIED BY MINISTER OF THE INTERIOR SENDASHONGA AND MINISTER OF JUSTICE NKUBITO. ALSO IN ATTENDANCE WERE SRSG KHAN AND THE AMBASSADORS OF BELGIUM, CANADA, FRANCE, GERMANY AND THE UNITED STATES, AND REPRESENTATIVES FROM CANADA, GREAT BRITAIN, THE NETHERLANDS AND THE OAU. EACH GOVERNMENT AND ORGANIZATION ANNOUNCED THE STATUS OF ITS REPRESENTATION ON THE COMMISSION, AND MOST INFORMED THE PRIME MINISTER THAT THEIR REPRESENTATIVES WILL ARRIVE IN KIGALI THE WEEKEND OF 6-7 MAY. THE PRIME MINISTER ASKED THE PARTICIPANTS IF THEY AGREED THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT BE REPRESENTED ON THE COMMISSION. HE FURTHER ANNOUNCED THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT WISHED TO BE REPRESENTED BY NINE MEMBERS FROM THE FOLLOWING MINISTRIES; DEFENCE, FOREIGN AFFAIRS, HEALTH, INTERIOR, JUSTICE, REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL AFFAIRS AND REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE OFFICE OF BOTH THE PRESIDENT AND THE PRIME MINISTER. THE PARTICIPANTS AGREED THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA WILL BE REPRESENTED ON THE COMMISSION, HOWEVER, IT WAS DECIDED THAT THE QUESTION OF THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS FROM THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND ALL OTHER PROCEDURAL MATTERS WILL BE RESOLVED DURING THE FIRST OFFICIAL WORKING SESSION OF THE COMMISSION WHICH IS SCHEDULED TO TAKE PLACE ON MONDAY, 8 MAY. THE PRIME MINISTER THEN ADJOURNED THE MEETING UNTIL THE FIRST WORKING SESSION ON 8 MAY.

D. THE FOLLOWING NEWS ITEMS WERE REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) ON TUESDAY, UNAMIR ISSUED A COMMUNIQUE DENYING THE RUMOURS CARRIED BY FOREIGN MEDIA ALLEGING THAT RPA TROOPS WERE EXHUMING DEAD BODIES IN KIBEHO CAMP TO HIDE THE TRUTH ABOUT THE DEATH TOLL. THE COMMUNIQUE INDICATES THAT UNAMIR IS NOT THE SOURCE OF THE REPORTS. THE RPA SPOKESMAN, COLONEL FRANK MUGAMBAGE, CONTACTED HIGH LEVEL OFFICIALS OF UNAMIR WHO DENIED BEING THE SOURCE OF THE RUMOURS, THUS CONFIRMING THAT FOREIGN MEDIA WERE SPREADING UNFOUNDED LIES. COLONEL MUGAMBAGE SAID HE WAS TRYING TO CONTACT THE RFI JOURNALISTS WHO HAD CITED UNAMIR AS THE SOURCE TO INQUIRE ABOUT THE SOURCE OF THEIR REPORTS. **NOTE:** UNAMIR'S PRESS RELEASE ONLY DENIED BEING THE SOURCE OF THE ALLEGED PRESS REPORT AND DID NOT COMMENT ON ITS VALIDITY.

(2) PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA RECEIVED CREDENTIALS FROM THE NEW AMBASSADOR OF FRANCE TO RWANDA, MR. JACQUES COURBIN AND THE NEW AMBASSADOR OF BURUNDI TO RWANDA, MR. SALVATOR NTIHABOSE.

(3) ASKED BY RADIO RWANDA TO COMMENT ON THE ANTI-FRANCE DEMONSTRATIONS THAT WERE HELD ON MONDAY IN FRONT OF THE EMBASSY OF FRANCE IN KIGALI, MR. COURBIN SAID THAT PEOPLE HAD THE RIGHT TO DEMONSTRATE AND TO EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS.

(4) MR. COURBIN DECLINED TO COMMENT ON THE KIBEHO EVENTS PENDING THE PUBLICATION OF THE CONCLUSIONS OF THE INQUIRY BY AN APPOINTED INDEPENDENT COMMISSION. HE INDICATED THAT FRANCE HAD SUSPENDED ONLY ITS DEVELOPMENT AID TO RWANDA FOLLOWING THE KIBEHO EVENTS BUT THAT IT WOULD CONTINUE ITS HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO THE COUNTRY.

(5) ASKED TO COMMENT ON THE KIBEHO EVENTS, THE NEW AMBASSADOR OF BURUNDI TO RWANDA, MR. NTIHABOSE, SAID THAT EVEN THE DEATH OF ONE PERSON WAS REGRETTABLE, BUT THAT HE THOUGHT THE REPORTS CARRIED ON KIBEHO CAMP BY FOREIGN MEDIA WERE EXAGGERATED AND THAT THE KIBEHO INCIDENTS SHOULD NOT BE A PRETEXT TO BREAK OFF RELATIONS WITH RWANDA.

(6) THE RWANDESE FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, ON TUESDAY RECEIVED TWO BELGIAN LAWYERS, MR. DAMIEN VAN DERMESCH AND MR. LUC VELLE, WHO CAME TO RWANDA FOR A TWO-WEEK STAY TO CARRY OUT INVESTIGATIONS IN PREPARATION FOR THE PROSECUTION OF RWANDESE NATIONALS RESIDING IN BELGIUM AND INVOLVED IN GENOCIDE. THE TWO LAWYERS WERE APPOINTED BY THE BELGIAN GOVERNMENT. MR. GASANA CALLED ON ALL PEOPLE WHO POSSESS EVIDENCE INCRIMINATING RWANDESE NATIONALS LIVING IN BELGIUM TO BRING THE EVIDENCE TO THE BELGIAN LAWYERS.

(7) THE KENYAN FOREIGN MINISTER ON TUESDAY ANNOUNCED THAT HIS GOVERNMENT WOULD CONSIDER THE RWANDESE NATIONALS WHO FOUND REFUGE IN KENYA TO BE INNOCENT UNTIL SUFFICIENT EVIDENCE IS PROVIDED ON THEIR INVOLVEMENT IN GENOCIDE.

MILOBS INDICATED THE RPA BDE COMD RECOMMENDED THAT ALL AERIAL RECCE OF THE AREA SHOULD BE SUSPENDED AND CLEARED WITH RPA HIGH COMMAND IN KIGALI AS WELL AS WITH HIS HQ.

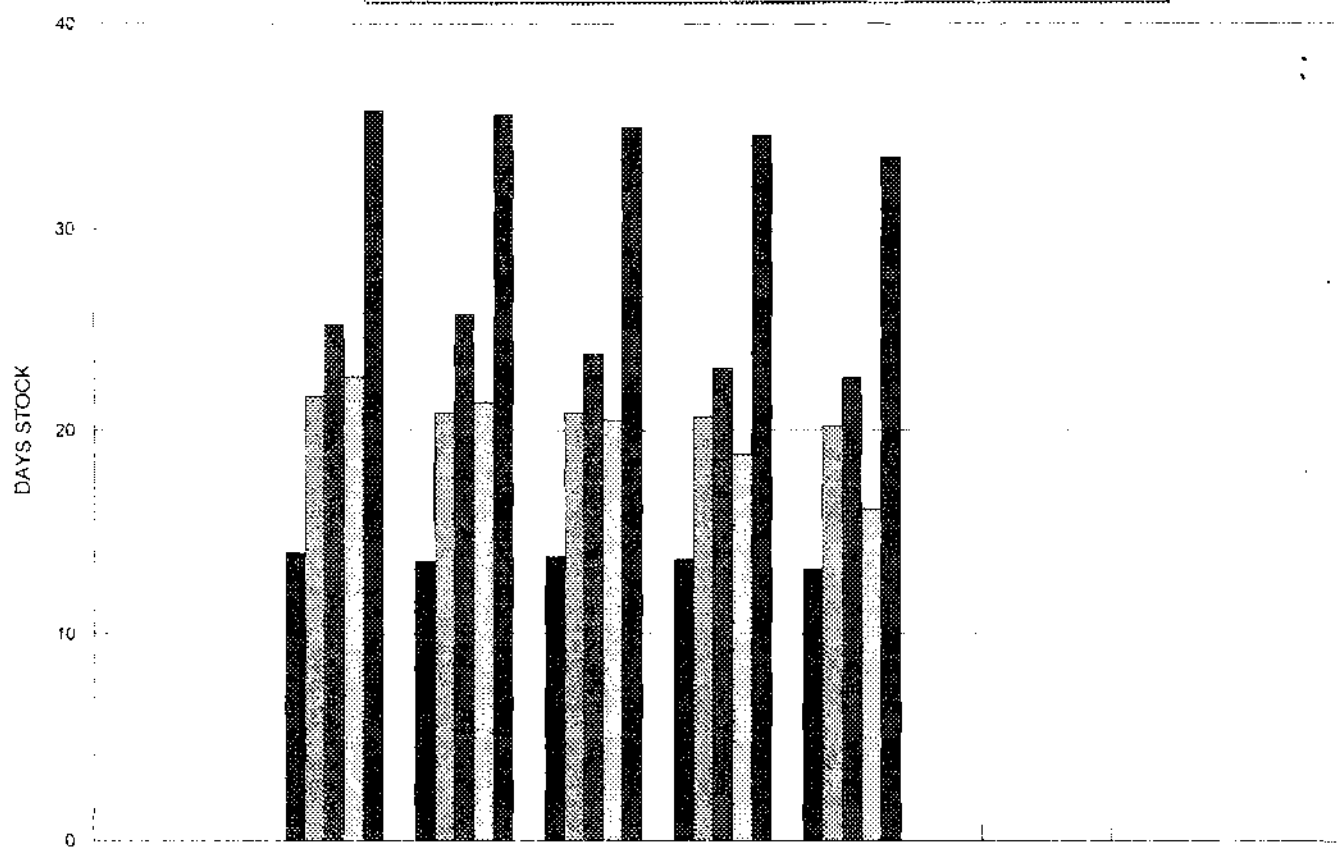

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, ATTENDED THE SECOND JOINT COMMISSION MEETING ON THE UNAMIR MANDATE DURING WHICH THE PARTICIPANTS DISCUSSED ISSUES RELATED TO THE MANDATE, TO BILATERAL RELATIONS AND TO COMMUNICATIONS.

B. HE MET WITH AMBASSADOR RAWSON OF THE UNITED STATES TO COORDINATE PREPARATIONS FOR THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION. HE CONCLUDED BY HOLDING CONSULTATIONS WITH THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS ON THE SUBJECTS OF THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION AND THE IMPROVEMENT OF BILATERAL RELATIONS.

THE FOLLOWING NEWS ITEMS WERE REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA, TOGETHER WITH VICE-PRESIDENT PAUL KAGAME, PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU AND GOVERNMENT MINISTERS MARKED MAY DAY BY PARTICIPATING IN A GATHERING OF WORKERS AT NYAMIRAMBO STADIUM, IN KIGALI, WHERE SPEECHES WERE DELIVERED IN COMMEMORATION OF THE DAY.

(2) THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE WORKERS ASKED THE GOVERNMENT TO FIND A WAY TO RAISE THE SALARIES OF RWANDESE WORKERS WHOSE SALARIES HAVE NOT CHANGED SINCE THE EARLY 1980'S DESPITE A SERIES OF DEVALUATIONS OF THE RWANDESE CURRENCY AND THE TRIPLING OF PRICES OF FOOD COMMODITIES AT THE MARKET SINCE THEN. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU SAID THAT THE PROBLEM OF SALARIES WAS NOT UNIQUE TO CIVIL SERVANTS AND THAT IT WAS THE CONSEQUENCE OF A GENERALLY DECADENT ECONOMY AS A RESULT OF THE WAR. HE ADDED THAT THE PROBLEM OF MILLIONS OF JOBLESS CITIZENS IN THE COUNTRYSIDE WAS MORE PREOCCUPYING FOR THE GOVERNMENT. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU URGED ECONOMIC OPERATORS TO FINANCE PROJECTS THAT WOULD PROVIDE JOBS IN THE COUNTRYSIDE TO RESOLVE THE PROBLEM OF PREVALENT UNEMPLOYMENT IN RURAL AREAS.

(3) THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF CIVIL SERVICE, COLONEL ALEXIS KANYARENGWE EXPLAINED THAT THE WORLD BANK AND THE INTERNATIONAL MONETARY FUND HAD ASKED THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF CIVIL SERVANTS EMPLOYED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA BEFORE APRIL 1994 BY 50%. THE WORLD BANK FURTHER SUGGESTED THAT THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD URGE PEOPLE TO FIND WORK WITH PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS AND ENTERPRISES.

(4) FOUR RWANDESE HUMAN RIGHTS ORGANISATIONS, NAMELY ASRG, AVP, AVEGA, PAGE-RWANDA, ON MONDAY STAGED A DEMONSTRATION IN KIGALI TO PROTEST THE INTERNATIONAL MISINFORMATION CAMPAIGN FOLLOWING KIBEHO INCIDENTS. THE DEMONSTRATORS WENT TO THE EMBASSY OF BELGIUM AND THE EMBASSY OF FRANCE TO PROTEST THE DECISION BY THOSE COUNTRIES TO SUSPEND THEIR AID TO RWANDA. THE DEMONSTRATORS ALSO WENT TO THE UNAMIR COMPOUND IN KIYOVU AND TO THE HEADQUARTERS OF NGOS TO PROTEST

THEIR INTERNATIONAL CAMPAIGN TO SPREAD RUMOURS
DRAMATISING KIBEHO EVENTS.

(4) THE DEMONSTRATORS PRAISED THE UNITED STATES FOR
NOT HEEDING RUMOURS ABOUT KIBEHO EVENTS AND
MAINTAINING ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

(1) IN SECTOR 1, NIBATT REPORTED THAT AT NGARAMA GR 2629 RPA MOUNTED ROAD BLOCK DISALLOWING CIVILIAN WORKERS EMPLOYED BY BROWN AND ROOTS ACCESS TO PL POST. THIS WAS AFTER THE PL COMD REFUSED TO RELEASE THE CIVILIAN WORKERS FOR INTERROGATION BY RPA LOCAL COMD. THE ISSUE WAS RESOLVED THROUGH THE INTERVENTION OF THE ACTING FC WHO PROMISED TO HANDOVER THE INDIVIDUALS TO THE PROPER AUTHORITIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH WELL ESTABLISHED AND DEFINED PROCEDURES.

(2) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS CHALLENGED BY ZAMBATT TROOPS AT KIBEHO AT ABOUT 010350B MAY 95 WHEN HE SNEAKED INTO THEIR CAMP TO STEAL COMBAT UNIFORMS. MATTER REPORTED TO THE LOCAL RPA COMMANDER FOR FURTHER ACTION.

(3) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA AT KIBEHO ARRESTED ONE IDP WHO HAD COME OUT OF THE MSF BUILDING COMPLEX, WHICH IS STILL CORDONED BY THE RPA AND ACCUSED HIM OF PREVENTING OTHER IDPs FROM LEAVING THE BUILDING COMPLEX. ZAMBATT CO AND ONE HRFO INTERVENED. AFTER INTERROGATIONS, THE IDP WAS FOUND INNOCENT AND SET FREE.

(4) SECTOR 5 MILOB REPORTED THAT GENERAL AREA OF RWERERE GR 2722 AND MUTOVU GR 2829 WAS TENSE DUE TO FREQUENT SMALL SCALE PROBING ATTACKS AND INFILTRATION ATTEMPTS BY ARMED ELEMENTS FROM ZAIRE. RPA IS CARRYING OUT INTENSIVE PATROLLING IN THIS GENERAL AREA ALONG THE BORDER.

(5) IN SECTOR 1, TROOPS AND GENDARMES AT THE COMBINED RPA AND GENDARMERIE CHECK POST AT RUKOMO GR 1120 CONTINUED TO INSIST ON SEARCHING UNAMIR VEHS BEFORE THEY ARE ALLOWED PASSAGE THROUGH THE CHECK POINT. STILL IN SECTOR 1 THE RPA CHECKPOST AT NGARAMA GR 2628 STOPPED A MILOB PATROL AND ALLOWED THE PATROL ACCESS ONLY AFTER A LONG NEGOTIATION.

(6) A NEW RPA PLATOON IS DEPLOYED TO GR 532081, ABOUT 2 KMS FROM KIBEHO. RPA ROUTINE PATROLS WERE OBSERVED AT NDAGO GR 5202, MUNINI GR 4899, KAMANA GR 5196, REMERA GR 5542 AND AKABUGA GR 4988. THERE WERE REPORTS OF SOME DEAD BODIES THROWN INTO THE AGATEROVE RIVER. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(9) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C REPORTED THAT RPA WAS CONDUCTING BOTH DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS ALONG THE RWANDA - BURUNDI BORDER.

B. MILITIA/FRGF. IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 01/02 MAY 95, AT NSHILI COMMUNE IN SECTOR MASUNZU, BANDITS ATTACKED AND MACHETED A WOMAN AND KILLED HER 4 YR OLD SON. A 29 YR OLD LOCAL WAS SHOT IN THE CHEST AND ANOTHER LOCAL WOMAN AGED 42 YRS WAS SEVERELY MACHETED IN THE HEAD. ALL VICTIMS HAVE BEEN TAKEN TO BUTARE HOSPITAL.

MATTER BEING INVESTIGATED.

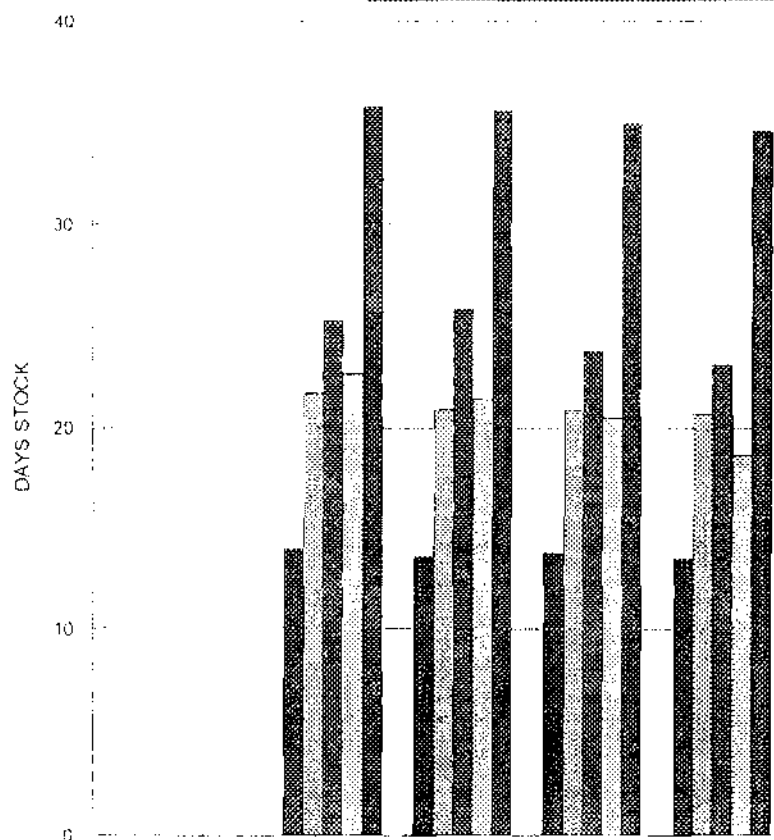

1. OVERVIEW. THEFTS BY RPA SOLDIERS INCREASING.

2. RPA.

A. REPORTS OF INCREASED INSTANCES OF THEFT BY RPA.
COMMENT: THIS MAY BE INDICATION OF DETERIORATING WELFARE SITUATION OF RPA SOLDIERS WHO MAY BE ATTEMPTING TO MAKE ENDS MEET. HOWEVER, AS EACH THEFT IS SUCCESSFUL OR PERPETRATORS ARE NOT HELD ACCOUNTABLE, IT WILL EMBOLDEN OTHERS TO DO THE SAME.

B. INDICATIONS THAT RPA WILL BE BANNING SATELLITE TELEPHONE COMMUNICATIONS USED BY NGOS, AS WELL AS ESTABLISHING FIXED FREQUENCIES THESE ORGANIZATIONS MAY OPERATE ON. NGOS WERE TOLD THAT VISAS WILL NO LONGER BE ISSUED AT THE AIRPORT. COMMENT: THE ESTABLISHMENT OF ALLOCATED FREQUENCIES AND THE REQUIREMENT TO USE RWANDA-TEL ASSETS COULD POSSIBLY BE AN ATTEMPT TO ORGANIZE AND IMPROVE RWANDAN EW INTERCEPT CAPABILITIES. HOWEVER IT IS MORE LIKELY AN ATTEMPT TO ORGANIZE AND REGULATE THE COMMUNICATIONS BRANCH OF THE GOVERNMENT WHILE PROHIBITION OF SATELLITE COMMS WOULD HAVE THE ADDITIONAL BENEFIT OF BOOSTING RWANDA-TEL REVENUES. AS FOR VISA REQUIREMENTS, MORE INFORMATION WILL BE REQUIRED.

C. SECTOR 1: AT NGARAMA (SQ 2628), RPA SURROUNDED A NIBATT PLATOON POSITION. A SHOT WAS FIRED AT BROWN AND ROOT WORKERS COMING TO THE PLATOON POSITION. COMMENT: THE RPA ACTION WAS PROBABLY IN RESPONSE TO NIBATT PLATOON COMMANDER'S REFUSAL TO RELEASE CIVILIAN WORKERS FOR INTERROGATION BY THE RPA. SITUATION WAS RESOLVED AMICABLY AFTER DFC INTERVENED, STATING THAT WORKERS WOULD BE RELEASED ONLY AFTER FORMAL PROCEDURES WERE FOLLOWED.

MATTER HAS BEEN REPORTED TO HIS SUPERIORS. REPORTS OF BODIES TURNING UP IN AGATEROVE RIVER DUE TO MACHETE ATTACKS BY LOCALS AGAINST RETURNING IDPS AT THE BRIDGE (GR 532081)

E. SECTOR 4B: HUYE (6714) MILOBS CONFIRM THAT NO IDP WAS KILLED IN AREA AS HAD BEEN REPORTED BY SOME INTERNATIONAL RADIO MEDIA.

3. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. SECTOR 4A: SHILI COMMUNE, MASUNZU SECTOR, ON 01 MAY BANDITS ATTACKED FIVE PEOPLE. A MOTHER AND SON SUFFERED A MACHETE ATTACK, SON WAS KILLED. A MAN AND WOMAN SHOT. ANOTHER WOMAN SUSTAINING MACHETE ATTACK TO THE HEAD.

4. REFUGEES/IDPS. SECTOR 4A: ON 02 MAY, PRIOR TO 1100B, 62 IDPS LEFT THE CAMP. AFTER 1100B, ANOTHER 86 DEPARTED. THE SECOND FIGURE IS MISLEADING ASRPA HAD ALLOWED FAMILY REPRESENTATIVES FROM IDP HOME COMMUNES TO ENTER AND ENCOURAGE

OTHERS TO DEPART, THEREFORE THE 86 FIGURE PROBABLY INCLUDES MANY OF THESE.

6. REGIONAL. KENYA. NAIROBI HAS SHRUGGED OFF CRITICISM BY RWANDA THAT IT IS HARBOURING THE FORMER GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, STATING THAT THESE PEOPLE HAVE BROKEN NO LAWS.

(3) A TOTAL OF 49 IDPs FROM ZAIRE AND GIKONGORO CAMPS ARRIVED AT BYUMBA PREFECTURE. EFFORTS UNDERWAY TO EVAC THEM TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES.

(4) NIBATT MED STAFF TREATED 136 LOCALS IN AOR.

(5) CMO/ACTING FC VISITED MILOB AND NIBATT LOC IN BYUMBA, NGARAMA AND NYAGATARE. NGOS BRIEFED THE A/FC AT NYAGATARE.

(6) MILOBS ACCOMPANIED NIBATT EOD TEAM TO DEMARCATe MINEFIELDS AT NYAGATARE, NGARAMA, NYARUBARE GR 3467 AND RWEMPASHA GR 3366 COMMUNES.

B. SECTOR 2.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) REF DAILY INFOSUM OF 01 MAY 95, PARA B (4) MIL POLICE INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT IT WAS THE CYCLIST WHO KNOCKED THE SIDE OF THE VEH. THE VICTIM HAS SINCE BEEN EVAC TO UNAMIR HOSP KIGALI.

(3) 50 IDPs FROM GIKONGORO ARRIVED AT SAKE ORC. GHANBATT CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SY TO 305 IDPs AT SAKE ORC PENDING REGISTRATION AND EVACUATION TO THEIR HOMES.

(4) GHANBATT HELD A MEETING WITH UNHCR, HUMAN RIGHTS AND MILOBS AT 'B' COY HQ RILIMA ON THE EFFECTIVE MONITORING OF IDPs RETURNING TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. THE IDEA OF ORGANISING A WORKSHOP ON JUSTICE INVOLVING THE LOCAL AUTH, MILOBS, RPA AND NGOS IN THE NEAR FUTURE WAS DISCUSSED AT THE MEETING.

(8) MILOBS MONITORED ACTIVITIES IN THE ASPEK AND NYAKIRAMBA TRANSIT CAMPS. AT THE NYAKIRAMBI TRANSIT CAMP THE OFFICIALS REFUSED TO GIVE INFORMATION TO THE TEAM. THEY DEMANDED AUTHORITY NOTE SIGNED BY THE PREFECT. THE CAMPS WERE HOWEVER REPORTED CALM.

C. SECTOR 3 (KIBUYE AND GITARAMA)

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) MALAWICOY SENT A PTL TO GASHARU GR 1355 REPORTED SY SIT CALM BUT LOCALS REQUESTED THAT PRISONERS BE TRANSFERRED OUT OF THE COMMUNE CELL TO KIBUYE PRISON. LOCALS MENTIONED THAT PRISONERS WERE BEING ILL-TREATED IN THE LOCAL FACILITY AND WERE NOT BEING VISITED BY ICRC.

(4) MALAWICOY MED STAFF TREATED 7 LOCALS IN AOR.

(5) MALICOY PTL TO KANYETTE GR 8355, NGOMA GR 5268 AND MASANGO OBSERVED MANY RECENTLY RETURNED IDPS IN URGENT NEED OF FOOD, SHELTER, CLOTHING, COOKING UTENSILS AND FARM IMPLEMENTS. LWF AND MALICOY ARRANGING TO DELIVER NON-FOOD ITEMS TO THE NTONGWE AREA 03 MAY 95 BUT THERE WAS NO HELP IN SIGHT FOR MASANGO AREA. HAC INFORMED.

(5) MILOB PATROL TO RUTOBWE GR 7781 LEARNED THAT A TOTAL OF 15 FAMILIES HAD COME BACK FROM ZAIRE AND UGANDA. THEY HAVE BEEN ABSORBED BY THEIR RELATIVES. THE COMMUNE CELL CURRENTLY HOLDS 15 MEN. THEY LOOKED WELL FED. THE LOCALLY EMPLOYED INTERPRETER WHO WAS ARRESTED LAST WEEK BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES, HAS BEEN RELEASED.

(6) MILOB PATROL TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE GR 8273 REPORTED THAT APPROX 30 IDPS HAD RETURNED FROM THE KIBEHO AREA BUT NO FURTHER INFORMATION WAS AVAILABLE BECAUSE OF THE ABSENCE OF THE LOCAL OFFICIALS.

(7) MILOB IN KIBUYE REPORTED THAT TWO LOCALS WHO HAD BEEN ARRESTED IN BUYE SECTOR GR 3964 BY THE COUNSELLOR, HIS ASSISTANT AND TWO POLICEMEN, ESCAPED FROM CUSTODY AND ATTACKED THE ASSISTANT COUNSELLOR IN HIS RESIDENCE WITH A MACHETE.

(8) ANOTHER MILOB TEAM FROM KIBUYE FOLLOWED UP A

REPORT FROM MALAWICOY ALLEGING THAT 40 PEOPLE HAD BEEN SHOT IN MUSENYI SECTOR GR 5663. THE INCIDENT OCCURRED ON 28 APR 95 AT AROUND 1900 HRS NEAR RWARAMBA GR 5363. 8 BODIES HAD BEEN RECOVERED AND BURIED SO FAR BUT NO OTHER DETAILS WERE AVAILABLE.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) ZAMBATT PROVIDED SY ESCORT TO SOLIDARITIES DURING THE EVAC 09 ACCOMPANIED CHILDREN AND ONE WOUNDED IDP FROM MATA TO BUTARE. SUB-UNIT IN RURAMBA HANDED OVER 10 UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN AND ONE WOUNDED IDP TO SOLIDARITIES ASSOCIATION HUMANITAIRE.

(3) ZAMBATT TRANSPORTED 20 UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN AND ONE IDP FROM KIBEHO TO BUTARE WITH OWN VEH.

(5) ZAMBATT ALSO PROVIDED ONE TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF 08 CHILDREN AND 05 IDPs FROM KIBEHO TO GOMA.

(6) MSF PROVIDED MED ASSISTANCE TO CASUALTIES AT KIBEHO CAMP.

(7) 148 IDPs LEFT KIBEHO CAMP ON FOOT FOR THEIR HOME COMMUNES. THE NUMBER OF IDPs LEFT IN THE COMPLEX AFTER A DETAILED HEAD COUNT WAS 1,783. (BREAKDOWN: MEN 311, WOMEN 518 AND CHILDREN 954).

(8) MILOBS TEAM PATROLLED MURSAMBI GR 3538 A TUTSI CAMP AND THE BURUNDI REFUGEE CAMP AT KIGEME GR 475257. AT MURAMBI, TUTSIS WERE REPORTEDLY HARASSING THE LOCAL HUTUS, WHO ARE LIVING NEAR THE CAMP.

(9) MILOB TEAM PATROLLED KARAMBO GR 4634 COMMUNE CARE INTERNATIONAL IS PROVIDING FOOD TO THE ORPHANS AND THE WIDOWS IN THIS COMMUNE. 1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS RETURNING TO A MORE STABLE AND CALM ATMOSPHERE ALTHOUGH CERTAIN AREAS REMAIN TENSE, ESPECIALLY IN KIBEHO CAMP, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs.

B. AT 012035HRS IN SECTOR 4C, A PISTOL ACCIDENTALLY DISCHARGED INTO THE ABDOMEN OF AN ETHIOPIAN SOLDIER, CPL ARAYA MEBRAHTU, HE WAS EVAC TO THE NORWEGIAN HOSPITAL IN CYANGUGU FOR SURGERY AND WILL BE HELI MEDIVAC TO KIGALI 02 MAY 95 FOR FURTHER MED ATTENTION. UN MP INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT.

C. IN KIGALI AUSMED REPORTED THAT AT 1540 HRS AN ANTI UNAMIR DEMONSTRATION INVOLVING ABOUT 200 - 400 LOCALS WAS HELD OUTSIDE THE AUSMED HQ. THE DEMONSTRATION WAS PEACEFUL WITH PARTICIPANT'S WAVING PLACARDS AND CHANTING ANTI UNAMIR SLOGANS. A VEHICLE CARRYING A LOUD SPEAKER WAS USED TO RALLY THE CROWD. THE DEMONSTRATION WAS WELL ORGANISED. MEDIA COVERAGE APPEARED TO BE PRE-PLANNED AND BUSES WERE ARRANGED FOR TRANSPORTATION AFTER THE COMPLETION OF THE EVENT. THE DEMONSTRATION LASTED FOR APPROX 20 MINUTES. ABOUT 30 RPA MAINTAINED A PRESENCE AT THE REAR OF THE CROWD. SEVERAL GENDARMES WERE IN ATTENDANCE TO KEEP THE PROTESTERS FROM GETTING TOO CLOSE TO UN TROOPS AND INTERVENED SEVERAL TIMES. THE FOLLOWING WRITTEN MATERIALS WERE THROWN THROUGH THE FENCE.

(2) RPA STOPPED GENOCIDE, WHERE WAS UNAMIR.

(3) INNOCENT PEOPLE WERE KILLED IN KIGALI IN APR, MAY, JUN 94, WHERE WAS UNAMIR.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 24 APR TO 30 APR 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL ALTHOUGH SITUATION IN KIBEHO CAMP, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs, REMAIN TENSE.

A. IN ALL THE SECTORS, THERE WERE REPORTS OF HEAVY INFLUX OF RETURNING IDPs INTO VARIOUS HOME COMMUNES DUE TO THE FORCED CLOSURE OF THE DP CAMPS. IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE SITUATION REMAINED CHAOTIC AND TENSE AS THE MOVEMENT OF IDPs WAS SLOWED DOWN DUE TO SHORTAGE OF VEHICLES.

B. UNHCR AND CIVPOL AT BUTARE REPORTED THAT 28 DEAD PRISONERS WERE FOUND IN RUSATIRA PRISON GR 7431 AND TEN OTHERS WERE TOO WEAK TO STAND ON THEIR OWN WHEN THE TEAM VISITED THE PRISON. THE DECEASED PRISONERS DIED EITHER FROM STARVATION OR SUFFOCATION.

C. IN SECTOR 4A, MILOBS AND ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS IN KIBEHO CAMP ON THE NIGHTS OF 28, 29 AND 30 APRIL 95, EXHUMED UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF BODIES AND TRANSPORTED THEM OUT OF THE CAMP. IT WAS BELIEVED THE EXERCISE WOULD CONTINUE SO AS TO CONCEAL THE ACTUAL NUMBER OF IDPs MASSACRED SHOULD THERE BE AN INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY.

D. IN SECTOR 3A, MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT ABOUT 40 PEOPLE SUSPECTED TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE, WERE KILLED ON 28 APR 95 AT SERIRECHIKA SECTOR. THEY WERE FLEEING TO ZAIRE TO JOIN THEIR FAMILIES. REPORTS INDICATE THAT RPA SOLDIERS WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEATHS. THE RPA HAVE A CAMP AT RWARAMBA GR 2063 ALONG THE SHORES OF LAKE KIVU WHICH IS NEAR THE SCENE OF THE INCIDENT. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF THE AREA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE ORDERED THAT NO LOCAL SHOULD GO TO THE SCENE OF THE INCIDENT. THE DEAD BODIES HAVE BEEN BURIED.

(A) IN SECTOR 4B, TAC HQ REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUED TO MAINTAIN INCREASED SURVEILLANCE IN THE WHOLE SECTOR. IN KIBEHO CAMP, UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF IDPs STILL HOLED UP INSIDE THE MSF BUILDING. THE AREA HAS BEEN CORDONED BY THE RPA. NO FOOD OR WATER IS ALLOWED TO BE DISTRIBUTED.

(B) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS EXCHANGED FIRE WITH FRGF SOLDIERS WHO HAD INFILTRATED FROM ZAIRE, AT KABATWA GR 3327 ON 26 APRIL 95. ONE FRGF SOLDIER WAS KILLED. THE REST ESCAPED BACK TO ZAIRE.

(C) IN SECTOR 1, AN RPA AND GENDARMERIE CHECK POINT AT GR 1120, STOPPED UNAMIR VEHS AND SUBJECTED THEM TO A DETAILED SEARCH BEFORE ALLOWING THEM TO PROCEED. ANOTHER MILOB TEAM WAS STOPPED AT THE SAME CHECK POINT AND THE MILOBS WERE ASKED TO PRODUCE THEIR PASSPORTS.

(D) MILOBS IN SECTORS 4B REPORTED OF CONTINUED RPA ARRESTS OF SUSPECTED PERSONS. RPA TROOPS, DEPLOYED

IN HUYE COMMUNE GR 6711, WERE REPORTED TO BE HOSTILE TOWARDS UNAMIR PERSONNEL AND WERE NOT ALLOWING IDPs WHO HAD HOMES IN THE AREA TO RESETTLE THERE.

(E) IN SECTORS 3 AND 4B, RPA TROOPS REPORTEDLY STOLE VEHICLES BELONGING TO SWISS DISASTER RELIEF AND CARE AUSTRALIA AT GUNPOINT ON 26 AND 29 APR 95 AT KIBUYE AND BUTARE RESPECTIVELY.

(F) IN SECTOR 4C, MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA INDICATED THAT THEY WILL COMMENCE NIGHT BOAT PATROLS ON LAKE KIVU TO PREVENT AND CURTAIL BANDITRY ACTIVITIES FROM ACROSS THE LAKE.

(G) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA EXCHANGED FIRE WITH BANDITS FROM ZAIRE IN THE AREA OF NYAMASHEKE GR 9841 BY BOATS ON 27 APR 95. THE BANDITS MANAGED TO ESCAPE BACK TO ZAIRE LEAVING THEIR BOATS.

(H) IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS EXCHANGED FIRE WITH FRGF SOLDIERS WHO INFILTRATED FROM THE ZAIRIAN BORDER AT KABATWA GR 3327 ON 26 APR 95. ONE FRGF SOLDIERS WAS KILLED. THE REST ESCAPED BACK TO ZAIRE.

(I) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ON 292200B APR 95, ARMED ELEMENTS FROM ZAIRE EXCHANGED FIRE WITH RPA AT ISHARA PENINSULA. ONE BOAT WAS CAPTURED BY THE RPA. NO CAS REPORTED.

(J) IN SECTOR 5, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 26 APR 95 THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN INFILTRATORS AND THE RPA AT THE AREA OF RWERERE BORDER POST. ONE OF THE INFILTRATORS WAS KILLED AND UNKNOWN NUMBER INJURED. (F) MED STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 47 LOCALS DURING

THE WEEK.

(7) SECTOR 4B (SENBATT).

(A) A VEH TRANSPORTING REFUGEES WAS INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT AT KIGEMBE. 03 RPA ESCORTS DIED IN THE ACCIDENT.

(B) RPA BDE COMD AT RUHENGARI VISITED TUNBATT HQ AND HELD DISCUSSIONS ON THE SY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR. HE LATER EXPRESSED HIS APPRECIATION TO THE GOOD WORK BEEN DONE BY UNAMIR TROOPS.

(C) MEDICAL STAFF PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 701 RWANDESE PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(10) SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

DISCUSSIONS CENTRED ON TRANSPORTATION OF IDPs TO HOME COMMUNES, ADMISSION OF UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN TO COMMUNES ORPHANAGES, DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD AND CLOTHING ITEMS AND PROVISION OF MEDICAL FACILITIES AT THE CAMP.

(A) POLITICAL.

I. ON 30 APR 95, A RELIABLE SOURCE REPORTED THAT LOCALS HAVE BEEN URGED BY RADIO BROADCASTS TO DISPLAY THEIR DISPLEASURE ABOUT UNAMIR'S REPORT ON CASUALTY FIGURES IN THE KIBEHO MASSACRE. IT IS POSSIBLE THAT SUCH RHETORIC BROADCASTS COULD TRIGGER OFF A SERIES OF INCIDENTS.

II. THE PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA VISITED THE KIBEHO CAMP. THE SRSG AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS WERE ALSO AT THE CAMP. THE PRESIDENT REQUESTED THE COOPERATION OF UNAMIR AND ALL OTHER AGENCIES PRESENT DURING THE RECENT MASSACRE. HE ORDERED THE RPA TO EXHUME ALL CORPSES FROM THE MASS GRAVES SO THAT THEY COULD BE COUNTED AND RECORDED. THE SRSG ASSURED THE PRESIDENT THAT ALL ASSISTANCE WOULD BE GIVEN BY UNAMIR TO ESTABLISH THE TRUTH OF HOW IDPS WERE KILLED. THE PRESIDENT ALSO TRIED TO PERSUADE THE IDPS HOLED UP IN THE MSF BUILDING COMPLEX TO LEAVE. 10 OF THE IDPS HOWEVER AGREED TO LEAVE THE CAMP AROUND 1800 HRS.

II. IN SECTOR 4B, IN HUYE COMMUNE GR 6711 MILOBS SAW POSTERS IN KINYARWANDA WHICH TRANSLATED THAT THE BURGEMESTRE WAS CALLING A MEETING IN WHICH THE FOLLOWING WERE TO BE DISCUSSED: RENEWAL OF POPULATION REGISTER; GOVT OBJECTIVES; ORGANIZATION OF RECEPTION OF

IDP RETURNEES; DISTRIBUTION OF AID BY UNAMIR AND NGOS.

(B) BORDERS. ALL THE BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC EXCEPT GISENYI BORDER POST WHICH WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

(C) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(D) IN SECTOR 1 - BYUMBA. NIBATT AND SECTOR MILOBS INFORMED BOURGEMESTRES AND OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN THE VARIOUS COMMUNES OF THE IMMINENT ARRIVAL OF RETURNEES TO THEIR COMMUNES DURING THE FORCIBLE CLOSURE OF CAMPS IN SECTOR 4A.

(E) IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO.

I. MILOBS PATROLS TO GAHARA GR 5442 WERE INFORMED OF THE ARREST OF ALL MALE RETURNEES FROM KIBEHO CAMP ABOVE THE AGE OF 15 YRS. SECTOR HR INFORMED AND INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

II. MILOB PATROLS TO NYABITIRE GR 8754 OBSERVED ABOUT 40 LOCALS ARMED WITH BOWS, SPEARS AND ARROWS PATROLLING THE ROADS IN THE AREA. THEY CLAIMED THEY WERE BEING HARASSED BY BANDITS FROM TANZANIA WHO WERE MOSTLY INVOLVED IN CATTLE-RUSTLING.

III. 212 SUSPECTS WERE RELEASED FROM THE GASHORA PRISON TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES PENDING FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS INTO THEIR CHARGES OF ALLEGED PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE.

(F) IN SECTOR 3 - GITARAMA/KIBUYE.

I. PROVIDED ESCORT TO HR TEAM TO CONDUCT JUDICIAL REHABILITATION WORK IN MUSAMBIRA AND MURAMA COMMUNES ON 25 APR 95.

II. MILOBS/CIVPOL CONDUCTED PATROLS IN MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE 8273 AND FOUND MANY SMALL VILLAGES RECENTLY DESERTED. THE COMMUNE SECURITY OFFICER SUDDENLY PRETENDED HE COULD NEITHER SPEAK FRENCH NOR ENGLISH WHEN MILOBS REQUESTED TO VISIT THE COMMUNE PRISON.

III. MILOBS PATROLS TO THE RUTSIRO COMMUNE (GR 3183) REPORTED THAT TEACHERS IN THE COMMUNE WERE UNEASY DUE TO THE RECENT ARREST OF 5 OF

THEIR COLLEAGUES FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. ONE TEACHER WAS REPORTED TO BE HELD IN MWENDO COMMUNE.

(G) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO. THE DFC VISITED KIBEHO ON 24 APRIL 95. EFFORTS WERE MADE BY SEVERAL UNAMIR OFFICIALS TO PERSUADE IDPs HOLED UP INSIDE THE MSF BUILDING COMPLEX TO COME OUT. SEVERAL IDPs HAVE LEFT THE BUILDING. THERE ARE HOWEVER HUNDREDS OF IDPs SUSPECTED TO BE HARD CORE STILL IN THE BUILDING. KAMANA CAMP WAS OFFICIALLY CLOSED AT 1400 HRS ON 24 APRIL 95.

(H) IN SECTOR 4B - BUTARE.

I. BUTARE STADIUM WAS REPORTED TO BE CLEAR OF IDPs ON 25 APRIL 95.

II. IN SECTOR 4B, ON 28 APRIL 95, MILOBS MONITORING THE RESETTLEMENT OF IDPs, REPORTED THAT A NUMBER OF THEM WERE BEING KILLED OR INJURED BY HOSTILE LOCALS. RPA WERE ALSO REPORTED TO BE MAKING NUMEROUS ARRESTS ON CHARGES OF ALLEGED PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE.

III. ON 29 APR 95, MILOBS REPORTED THAT A TOTAL OF 48,485 RETURNEES WERE REGISTERED AND 962 WERE ARRESTED WITHIN THE SECTOR BY THE RPA FOR HAVING ALLEGEDLY PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE.

(I) IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU.

I. THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR REMAINED UNSTABLE. ABOUT 30 LOCALS, FOR SY REASONS ARE STILL SLEEPING NEAR MILOBS LOCATION AT NIGHT IN NYAMASHEKE.

II. ON 25 APRIL 95, A GROUP OF BANDITS ROBBED 7 HOUSES IN KININI GR 9535. A SIMILAR ATTEMPT WAS MADE ON 26 APRIL 95, BUT RPA ENGAGED THEM WITH SMALL ARMS AND GRENS. 2 BANDITS WERE CAPTURED ALIVE BY THE LOCALS AND HANDED OVER TO THE RPA. BOTH THE BANDITS ARE CURRENTLY DETAINED IN KIRAMBO PRISON GR 0444.

(J) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.

I. A JOINT MILOB/HR/CIVPOL TEAM INVESTIGATED

THE KILLING OF THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF MUTURA COMMUNE ON 23 APRIL 95. THE DECEASED WAS A HUTU AND HAD RECENTLY RETURNED TO THE AREA. THE KILLING IS SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN CARRIED OUT BY INTERHAMWE.

II. MILOBS PATROLS TO KINIGI GR 5243 OBSERVED A LARGE DEPLOYMENT OF RPA IN THE AREA. RUMOURS OF IMMINENT ATTACK PERSIST IN THE AREA.

III. PATROLS TO MURUNDA ON 25 APR 95 RECEIVED REPORTS OF RPA ARRESTS AND TORTURE IN THE AREA.

IV. MILOBS ATTENDED A COORDINATING CONFERENCE TO PLAN HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE IN THE SECTOR. THE CONFERENCE WAS ATTENDED BY REPS FROM UNHCR, NGOS AND THE PREFECT OF GISENYI.

(K) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI. IN THE NYARUGENGE COMMUNE IT WAS REPORTED THAT HUTUS WERE REPORTED TO BE AFRAID TO CLAIM THEIR PROPERTY DUE TO FEAR OF THE RPA. HUTUS WHO OWN CATTLE ARE USUALLY SUSPECTED OF HAVING STOLEN THEM FROM TUTSIS. MOST HUTU FAMILIES ARE ALSO REPORTED TO BE TRYING TO GET AT LEAST ONE MEMBER INTO THE RPA AS A MEANS OF PROTECTING THEMSELVES.

(12) FORCE ENGR COY.

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(B) PROVIDED FIVE TRUCKS FOR CARRIAGE OF HUMANITARIAN STORES FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE.

(C) PLACED TRENCH DIGGER AT BUTARE FOR DIGGING TASK AT KIBEHO ON 24 APR 95.

(D) COMPLETED REPAIR OF FOUR BRIDGES IN SECTOR 4B.

(E) DEPLOYED DEMINING TEAM IN NDERA CAMP AND CLEARED THE AREA FOR CAMPING OF IDPs.

(F) CONDUCTED LECTURE AND DEMONSTRATION FOR MINE AWARENESS FOR HUMAN RIGHTS ON 26 APR 95. 25 PEOPLE ATTENDED.

(G) PROVIDED TRENCH DIGGER TO CONSTRUCT SANITARY FACILITIES IN NDERA CAMP.

(A) UNAMIR MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDESE LOCAL AND ALSO TO A NIBATT SOLDIER SUSPECTED OF MURDER.

(B) INVESTIGATED 3 FORCED ENTRY CASES AND 6 TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS DURING THE PERIOD.

(16) 95 FLSC

(A) CARRIED OUT NORMAL RESUPPLY RUNS TO ALL THE SECTORS.

(B) PROVIDED TRANSPORT AND RATION ASSISTANCE TO ZAMBATT ROTATION.

4. UNCIVPOL

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN SECTORS.

B. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN BUTARE REPORTED THAT THE RPA HAVE STARTED ARRESTING SOME OF THE RETURNEES AND SENDING THEM TO THEIR BARRACKS FOR UNKNOWN REASONS. LOCALS OF NGOMA COMMUNE WERE ALSO REPORTED TO BE REFUSING TO ACCEPT THE RETURNEES BACK INTO THE COMMUNE.

C. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGERI NATIONAL TRAINING

SCHOOL IS STILL IN PROGRESS.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES

A. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO IDPs FORCIBLY REMOVED FROM DPCs IN SECTOR 4A. 57,420 IDPs WERE EVACUATED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES USING UNAMIR AND IOM TPT RESOURCES.

B. MEDICAL. FORCE MEDICAL STAFF TREATED THOUSANDS OF IDPs AND LOCALS DURING THE WEEK THROUGH RWANDA BY PROVIDING PRIMARY AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL AID.

9. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. A TOTAL OF 06 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHICLES WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD.

10. CONCLUSION

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINS TENSE THROUGHOUT, ESPECIALLY IN KIBEHO CAMP. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO IDPs FORCIBLY REMOVED FROM FROM DPCs IN SECTOR 4A.

B. THE EXHUMATION OF BODIES BY THE RPA AT KIBEHO CAMP FOR REBURIAL ELSEWHERE IS AN INDICATION THAT THE RPA HAS NO INTENTION TO DISASSOCIATE ITSELF FROM THE MASSACRE AND TO PUNISH THOSE WHO PERPETRATED IT. IT ALSO SMACKS OF AN ATTEMPT TO MANIPULATE EVIDENCE TO GIVE CREDENCE TO THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT'S CLAIM THAT ONLY A FEW IDPs DIED DURING THE KIBEHO INCIDENT, SHOULD THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY REQUEST THE EXHUMATION AND A RECOUNT OF BODIES BURIED IN THE CAMP AFTER THE MASSACRE.

C. WITH THE EXCEPTION OF A FEW COMMUNES WHICH DID NOT WANT THE IDPs BACK TO THEIR HOMES, THE LOCAL POPULATION WAS GENERALLY ENTHUSIASTIC ABOUT THE RETURN OF THE IDPs TO THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES. ARRESTS BY THE RPA OF SO CALLED PERPETRATORS OF THE GENOCIDE HOWEVER CONTINUED DURING THE PERIOD.

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINS TENSE THROUGHOUT, ESPECIALLY IN KIBEHO CAMP, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs.

B. ZAMBATT IN SECTOR 4A REPORTED THAT ITS PATROL TEAM MANAGED TO COUNT NINE BODIES BEING LOADED INTO A VEHICLE BY RPA SOLDIERS AT 300400B APR 95 AND THEREAFTER DROVE TOWARDS BUTARE. IT WAS ALSO OBSERVED THAT THERE WAS A CONTINUOUS MOVEMENT OF TRAFFIC DURING THE NIGHT.

C. AUSMED REPORTED THAT AT APPROX 301730B APR 95 A VEH WITH 3 PERS SUSPECTED TO BE RPA SOLDIERS DROVE PAST CENTRAL HOSP KIGALI (CHK) MILITARY WING. THE VEH WAS BROADCASTING A MSG. AN UNCONFIRMED TRANSLATION OF THE MSG SAID "UNAMIR IS ON THE SIDE OF FRGF AND THE INTERAHAMWE" AND "UNAMIR PERS ARE NOT WANTED IN THIS COUNTRY."

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. SEE SRSG WEEKLY POLITICAL UPDATE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 4A MILOB DEPLOYED AT KIBEHO REPORTED RPA PRESENCE IN THE AREA OF THE CAMP. BETWEEN 292000 AND 300500 HRS, RPA TPS WERE OBSERVED IN THE VALLEYS NEAR THE CAMP. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE BACKGROUND NOISE HEARD WAS THE SOUND OF DIGGING TO EXHUME BODIES FROM GRAVES. IT WAS IMPOSSIBLE TO ESTABLISH THE NUMBER OF BODIES EXHUMED DUE TO DARKNESS. RPA TROOPS HAS DENIED THE TEAM ACCESS TO THE LOCATIONS OF FRESHLY DISTURBED TOP SOIL WHERE CORPSES WERE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN REMOVED. MILOBS STILL OBSERVING RPA ACTIVITIES IN THE CAMP.

(2) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOB REPORTED THAT UNIFORMED MEN, BELIEVED TO BE RPA TPS, SEIZED A VEHICLE BELONGING TO CARE AUSTRALIA AT GUN POINT. THE INCIDENT OCCURRED AT THE PREFECT'S OFFICE IN BUTARE ON THE NIGHT OF 29/30 APR 95. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) IN SECTOR 3 MILOB REPORTED THE THEFT OF A SWISS DISASTER AGENCY VEHICLE BY ARMED RPA TPS ON 26 APR 95. THE VEHICLE WAS LAST SEEN IN KIBUYE ON 29 APR 95 BUT HAD NOT BEEN SEEN SINCE.

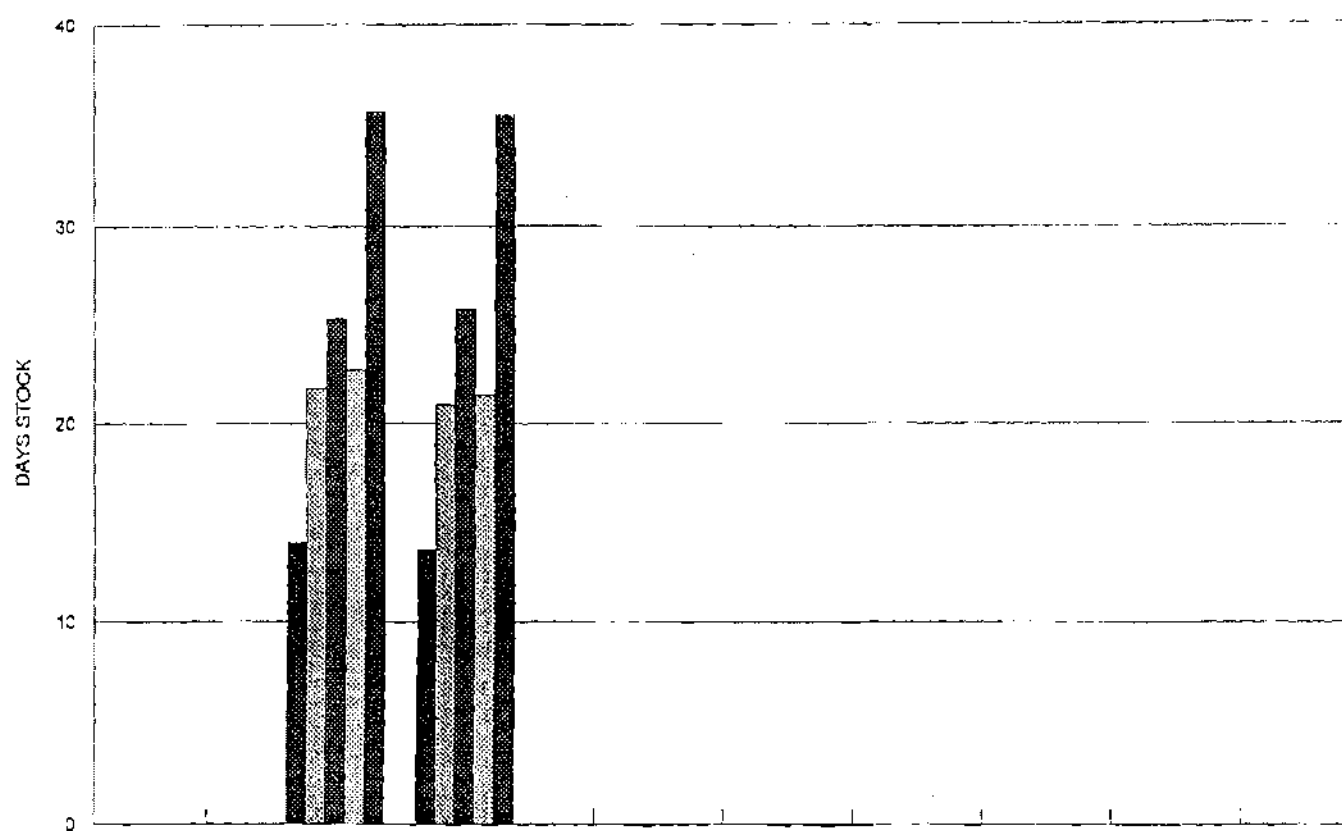

B. ZAMBATT IN SECTOR 4A REPORTED THAT ITS PATROL TEAM MANAGED TO COUNT NINE BODIES BEING LOADED INTO A VEHICLE BY RPA SOLDIERS AT 300400B APR 95 AND THEREAFTER DROVE TOWARDS BUTARE. IT WAS ALSO OBSERVED THAT THERE WAS A CONTINUOUS MOVEMENT OF TRAFFIC DURING THE NIGHT.

C. AUSMED REPORTED THAT AT APPROX 301730B APR 95 A VEH WITH 3 PERS SUSPECTED TO BE RPA SOLDIERS DROVE PAST CENTRAL HOSP KIGALI (CHK) MILITARY WING. THE VEH WAS BROADCASTING A MSG. AN UNCONFIRMED TRANSLATION OF THE MSG SAID "UNAMIR IS ON THE SIDE OF FRGF AND THE INTERAHAMWE" AND "UNAMIR PERS ARE NOT WANTED IN THIS COUNTRY."

IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE BACKGROUND NOISE HEARD WAS THE SOUND OF DIGGING TO EXHUME BODIES FROM GRAVES. IT WAS IMPOSSIBLE TO ESTABLISH THE NUMBER OF BODIES EXHUMED DUE TO DARKNESS. RPA TROOPS HAS DENIED THE TEAM ACCESS TO THE LOCATIONS OF FRESHLY DISTURBED TOP SOIL WHERE CORPSES WERE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN REMOVED. MILOBS STILL OBSERVING RPA ACTIVITIES IN THE CAMP.

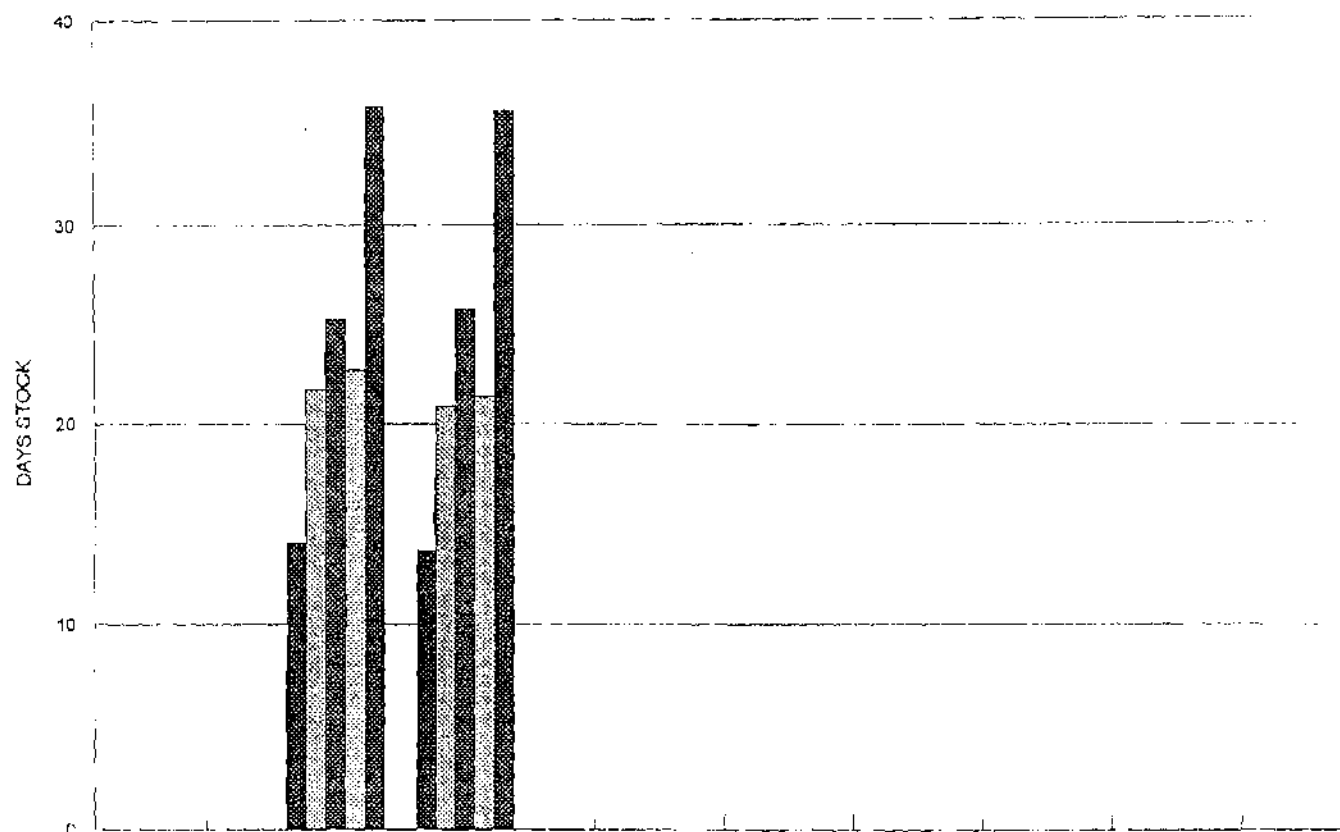



1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINS TENSE THROUGHOUT, ESPECIALLY IN KIBEHO CAMP, AT THE BORDER AREAS AND IN SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs.

B. IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUED TO EXHUME BODIES IN KIBEHO UNDER COVER OF DARKNESS AND TRANSPORTING THEM OUT OF KIBEHO. NO UNAMIR PERSONNEL WERE ALLOWED NEAR THE AREA OF THE EXHUMATIONS.

C. IN SECTOR 3A, MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT ABOUT 40 PEOPLE WERE KILLED ON 28 APR 95 AT SERIRECHIKA SECTOR. THEY WERE FLEEING TO ZAIRE TO JOIN THEIR FAMILIES AND SOME ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE. REPORTS INDICATE THAT RPA SOLDIERS WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEATHS. THE RPA HAVE A CAMP AT RWARAMBA GR 2063 ALONG THE SHORES OF LAKE KIVU WHICH IS NEAR THE SCENE OF THE INCIDENT. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF THE AREA HAS ORDERED THAT NO LOCAL SHOULD GO TO THE SCENE OF THE INCIDENT. THE DEAD BODIES HAVE BEEN BURIED. MILOB INFORMED.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, ACCOMPANIED BY THE FORCE COMMANDER, GENERAL TOUSIGNANT, THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL, MR. AJELO, AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE AFRICA BUREAU, DPKO, MR. ANNABI, HELD MEETINGS WITH PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU, VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENSE, GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, AND PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU, TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, ISSUES RELATED TO UNAMIR'S MANDATE, THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON KIBEHO AND SECURITY.

B. SRSG THEN MET WITH MR. PAUL GROSRIELER, ICRC DIRECTOR, GENEVA, TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON KIBEHO, AS WELL AS RELATED HUMAN RIGHTS CONCERNS.

C. ON FRIDAY, THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER FOR DEFENSE, MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, OFFICIATED AT THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF A TWO-DAY SEMINAR HELD AT HOTEL DES MILLE COLLINES IN KIGALI TO DISCUSS WAYS FOR THE NGOS OPERATING IN RWANDA TO ENSURE THE TRANSITION FROM EMERGENCY AID TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AID IN RWANDA. IN HIS SPEECH ON THE OCCASION, GENERAL KAGAME EXPRESSED HIS SATISFACTION OVER THE ASSISTANCE CONTRIBUTED BY HUMANITARIAN ORGANISATIONS IN RWANDA, BUT CRITICISED SOME ORGANISATIONS WHICH DID NOT BRING SUBSTANTIAL ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA AND WERE IN THE COUNTRY FOR THEIR OWN UNSPECIFIED INTERESTS.

D. THE HUMANITARIAN ORGANISATIONS ASSOCIATED WITH THE EUROPEAN UNION HAVE PROTESTED AGAINST THE DECISION BY THE EU TO SUSPEND ITS ASSISTANCE TO RWANDA FOLLOWING THE KIBEHO EVENTS. THE HUMANITARIAN ORGANISATIONS ANNOUNCED THAT THE MEMBER STATES OF THE EU SHOULD INSTEAD ASSIST RWANDA IN ITS REHABILITATION EFFORTS AND IN THE REINFORCEMENT OF THE RULE OF LAW IN THE COUNTRY.

E. THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL HAS CONDEMNED THE KILLINGS AT KIBEHO, BUT EXPRESSED ITS SATISFACTION OVER THE DECISION MADE BY THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT TO SET UP A COMMISSION OF INQUIRY TO INVESTIGATE THE EVENTS OF KIBEHO.

F. MR. BERNARD KOUCHNER, THE FORMER FRENCH MINISTER OF HEALTH, AND FOUNDER OF MSF, HAS BEEN IN RWANDA SINCE FRIDAY

AND WILL VISIT AN ORPHANAGE ON SATURDAY IN GITARAMA WHICH IS BEING RUN BY ANOTHER ORGANISATION ESTABLISHED BY HIM. IN HIS INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA, MR. KOUCHNER REFUSED TO COMMENT ON THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE KILLINGS IN KIBEHO AND ON THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE KILLED PENDING THE PUBLICATION OF CONCLUSIONS BY AN APPOINTED COMMISSION OF INQUIRY. HE INDICATED, HOWEVER, THAT IT WAS THE DUTY OF EVERYBODY TO CONDEMN WHAT HE CALLED THE HORRIBLE MASSACRE IN KIBEHO.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

(2) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THE THEFT OF THE WFP VEHICLE AT KIBUYE HAS NOW BEEN CONFIRMED AS AN RPA ACTION. THE NAME OF ONE OF THE SOLDIERS INVOLVED IN THE CRIME HAS BEEN PASSED TO HIS BN COMD FOR THE NECESSARY ACTION. THE RPA BDE LO IN LOCATION EXPLAINED THAT THE VEH HAD BEEN TAKEN TO CARRY A SICK SOLDIER TO KABGAYI MILITARY HOSPITAL. SINCE THE VEH DID NOT RETURN THE RPA ARE NOW SEARCHING FOR BOTH THE VEH AND THE SOLDIER.

(3) MILOB IN SECTOR 3B REPORTED THAT LAST NIGHT THE RESIDENCE OF A SWISS DISASTER RELIEF WORKER WAS ROBBED IN KIBUYE. HE ALLEGES THAT THE PERPETRATORS WERE RPA SOLDIERS.

(4) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUED TO CORDON THE KIBEHO MSF BUILDING BEING OCCUPIED BY IDPs.

(5) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ON 292200B APR 95, ARMED ELEMENTS FROM ZAIRE EXCHANGED FIRE WITH RPA AT ISHARA PENINSULA. ONE BOAT WAS CAPTURED BY THE RPA. NO CAS REPORTED.

B. MILITIA/FRGF. IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ON 291145B APR 95, UNKNOWN NUMBER OF ARMED ELEMENTS WHO CROSSED INTO RWANDA FROM ZAIRE IN THE AREA OF GAFUNZO IN A BOAT EXCHANGED FIRE WITH RPA. 4 OF THE ARMED ELEMENTS WERE KILLED AND 1 AK 47 CONFISCATED BY THE RPA.

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

B. SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

ONE OF THE INFILTRATORS WAS KILLED AND UNKNOWN NUMBER INJURED. WHILE WITHDRAWING THE INFILTRATORS REPORTEDLY THREW GRENADES INTO THE TENTS OF THE LEOPARD BATTALION, A ZAIRIAN FORCE EMPLOYED BY UNHCR IN THE VICINITY OF THE KIBUMBA CAMP ON RWANDESE SIDE. THE INCIDENT WAS DISCUSSED BY THE RPA AND REPRESENTATIVES OF ZAIRIAN ARMY ON 27 APRIL.

(B) SECTOR 4B, MILOB REPORTED THAT RWANDESE MINISTER OF INTERNAL AFFAIRS VISITED KIBEHO CAMP WITH THE PRESS.

(D) 2900 IDPS WERE REGISTERED TODAY AT THE NGENDA TRANSIT CAMP AND 250 SUSPECTS WERE DETAINED.

(C) PRISON AUTHORITIES IN GITARAMA ARE STILL ANXIOUS TO CARRY ON THE PREVIOUS PLAN TO MOVE PRISONERS. THEY NOW CLAIM TO HAVE RECEIVED DIRECTION FROM THE MINISTRY OF JUSTICE TO BEGIN THE MOVE AS SOON AS TRANSPORT ARE AVAILABLE.

(D) IN SECTOR 3B, MILOB PATROL TO MABANZA GR 3473 FOUND THE SITUATION TENSE DUE TO THE RECENT ARREST OF A SECONDARY SCHOOL INSPECTOR, AN AGRONOMIST, THE PRESIDENT OF THE FARMERS ASSOCIATION OF RWANDA AND A NURSE WORKING FOR MSF.

(E) MILOB SECTOR HQ HELD A MEETING WITH ALL NGOS TO DISCUSS SECURITY AND TO WORK OUT EMERGENCY MEASURES TO DEAL WITH THEFT AND THREAT.

(A) THE MINISTER OF INTERIOR VISITED KIBEHO CAMP. IT WAS REPORTED THAT AT 1245 HRS A TOTAL OF 68 IDPS DECIDED TO LEAVE THE CAMP FOR THEIR HOME COMMUNE. THE IDPS WERE SEEN ON FOOT, GOING IN THE GENERAL DIRECTION OF RWAMIKO GR 4914. TEAMS ALSO REPORTED THAT RPA DENIED THEM ACCESS AT THEIR CHECKPOINT NEAR THE CAMP. THEY WERE ALLOWED ACCESS THROUGH THE CHECK POINT ONLY WHEN THE LOCAL RPA CO DETAILED AN RPA CAPT TO ESCORT THEM THROUGH THE CHECKPOINT.

(B) PATROLLED KINYAMAKABA GR 6026 AND KARAMA GR 6327. THE BOURGEMESTRES OF BOTH THE COMMUNES CONFIRMED THAT THEY ARE READY TO RECEIVE IDPS. THEY ALSO MENTIONED THAT THERE WILL BE NO PROBLEMS OF ACCOMMODATION FOR THE IDPS. BOURGEMASTRE AT KARAMA CONFIRMED OFFICIALLY THAT NO RETURNEES HAVE ARRIVED IN HIS COMMUNE.

III. AT NYAKIZU GR 5696, THE SITUATION WAS REPORTED NORMAL WITH 18,691 IDPS REGISTERED ON 29 APR 95 AND 106 HELD PRISONER. 65 SUSPECTS WERE ACQUITTED BY THE BOURGMASTER 28 CONVICTED AND 10 PENDING.

IV. AT SHYANDA GR 7718, TEAM WAS INFORMED BY THE LOCALS THAT SEVERAL ARRESTS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE RPA OUT OF WHICH ONLY 03 IDPS WERE RELEASED.

V. AT MUYANGA GR 9026 THE ASSISTANT BOURGMASTER TOLD THE TEAM THAT 349 IDPS HAVE SO FAR BEEN REGISTERED IN THE COMMUNE. SOME OF THE IDPS GO STRAIGHT TO THEIR HOMES WITHOUT REGISTRATION. THERE WERE NO PRISONERS IN THE COMMUNE PRISON. FOOD AID REQUIRED IN THE COMMUNE. HAC INFORMED.

VI. AT MUGUSA GR 8425, 1684 IDPS ARRIVED AT THE COMMUNE. 100 ARRIVED ON FOOT AND 150 ARE DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE PRISON.

VII. AT RUHASHYA GR 6926, 1347 IDPS WERE REGISTERED TODAY. 53 WERE ARRESTED. THERE ARE 223 PRISONERS HELD AT COMMUNE PRISON. LOCALS ARE REPORTED VERY HOSTILE TOWARDS IDPS ACCUSING THEM OF BEING CRIMINALS. ONE IDPS WAS KILLED BY LOCAL AND NO ARREST HAS BEEN MADE BY THE AUTHORITIES.

VIII. AT MUGUSA (GR 8426) 1500 RETURNEES WERE REGISTERED. THE COMMUNE PRISON HAD 170 PRISONERS OUT OF WHICH 30 WERE RETURNEES.

IX. AT MUYAGA COMMUNE (GR 9026) 500 IDPS WERE REGISTERED. 10 IDPS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THE RPA. THE TEAM COULD NOT GET INFO ABOUT BORDER CROSSINGS AT KABUMWE SECTOR (GR 9326) ON ILLEGAL BORDER CROSSINGS DUE TO THE PRESENCE OF RPA TROOPS.

X. AT MUGANZA (GR 8407). THE BOURGMASTER HAS ASKED UNAMIR TO ASSIST WITH VEHICLE TO TOUR THE SECTOR ON 01 MAY 95. MILOBS ALSO REPORTED WARM RECEPTION OF IDPS TO THE AREA. FOOD, CLOTHING, AGRICULTURAL TOOLS AND SEEDS

WERE REQUESTED. HAC INFORMED.

XI. AT NDORA (GR 8112), 339 IDPS WERE REGISTERED AND COMMUNE AUTHORITIES REQUESTED FOOD AID. HAC INFO.

XII. AT NGOMA (GR 9637), 1146 IDPS WERE REGISTERED. IDPS HAVE REQUESTED ITEMS SUCH AS CLOTHING, FARMING TOOLS, SEEDS AND MEDICINE. HAC INFORMED.

XIII. AT NTYAZO (GR 8631) 2048 IDPS WERE REGISTERED WITH 89 IDPS DETAINED BY RPA INCLUDING 7 WOMEN AND A 13 YEAR OLD BOY.

XIV. AT MUYIRA (GR 8639), 2137 IDPS WERE REGISTERED, WITH 154 ARRESTED BY RPA. 22 OF THOSE DETAINED ARE TO BE EVAC TO KIGALI. URGENT REQUIREMENTS OF IDPS WERE FOOD, WATER, ACCOMMODATION, MEDICINE, TOOLS AND SEEDS. HAC INFORMED.

XV. AT GISHAMVU COMMUNE (GR 6505), NYAKIZU (GR 5696) AND RUNYINYA (GR 6012) MILOBS REPORTED A CLIMATE OF INSECURITY IN THE AREA DUE TO ARBITRARY ARRESTS OF RETURNEES BY THE RPA. AT RUNYINYA IT WAS REPORTED THAT BURGOMASTER HAS STARTED TRIALS OF DETAINED IDPS.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) CARRIED OUT PATROLS TO BUGARAMA AND RUSAYO GR 8212. AT RUSAYO ORPHANAGE A REQUEST FOR A GENERATOR WAS MADE THROUGH MILOB TEAM. ALSO PATROLLED THE BURUNDI AND ZAIRE BORDERS.

THE ATTEMPT TO COLLECT CAS TODAY WAS UNSUCCESSFUL DESPITE NEGOTIATIONS.

WHEN GUARD SOUGHT CLARIFICATION AND IDENTIFICATION, A UNIFORMED PERS ENTERED VEH AGAIN AND THE CAR DROVE OFF. AS CAR DROVE OFF, OCCUPANTS APPEARED TO BE STUDYING COMPOUND WITH HEAD OUT OF WINDOW.
- (6) RIFLE COY ELM PROVIDED SECURITY AT THE MIL BKS

AND CHK.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE KIA DURING THE PERIOD. TOTAL OF 22 FLIGHTS DEPARTED AND ARRIVED KIA.

O. UN MP COY.

(1) UNAMIR MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDESE LOCAL AND TO THE NIBATT SOLDIER SUSPECTED OF MURDER.

(2) ONE MINOR TFC ACCIDENT INVOLVING UNAMIR 1050 WAS REPORTED. NO CAS WAS REPORTED.

P. 95 FLSG.

(1) DELIVERED 3,000L OF GASOLINE TO MALICOY.

(2) PROVIDED TPT AND RATION SP DURING ZAMBATT ROTATION.

(3) A WATER BLADDER WAS REPAIRED IN KIBUNGO.

6. CIVPOL.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. CIVPOL MONITORS IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE PATROLLED MASANGO COMMUNE AND REPORTED THAT 943 WERE REGISTERED AT THE COMMUNE. IT WAS OBSERVED THAT MANY OF THE IDPs HAD INJURIES AND LACKED FOOD AND MEDICAL CARE. THE COMMUNE AUTHORITIES INFORMED THE TEAM THAT NONE OF THE IDPs WAS UNDER ARREST SINCE INVESTIGATIONS INTO THEIR ACTIVITIES DURING LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE HAD NOT COMMENCED. THE TEAM FURTHER PATROLLED MURAMA COMMUNE AND WAS INFORMED THAT 2,830 IDPs AND 8 LOCALS HAD ARRIVED AT THE COMMUNE. SOME OF THE IDPs INTERVIEWED SAID THEY WERE IN DIRE NEED OF FOOD, WATER AND MEDICINE. HAC INFORMED.

C. A PATROL TEAM TO NTONGWE COMMUNE IN SECTOR 3 WAS INFORMED BY OFFICIALS OF CARITAS THAT 805 IDPs HAD SO FAR RETURNED TO THE COMMUNE. MOST OF THE IDPs HAD SO FAR RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES.

D. IN RUHENGERI PREFECTURE, A JOINT CIVPOL/MILOBS PATROL TO KINIGI COMMUNE ON 28 APR 95 WAS INFORMED BY THE BOURGMESTRE THAT LOCALS IN KABWENDE, BISATE AND NYARUGIRE SECTORS LIVE IN FEAR AS A RESULT OF RUMOURS OF EMINENT ATTACK BY FRGF. THE TEAM FURTHER REPORTED THAT A JOINT CIVPOL, MILOBS, HUMAN RIGHTS, AND RED CROSS TEAM VISITED TUNBATT ON 28 APR 95 TO INVESTIGATE AN INCIDENT IN WHICH A LOCAL SUSPECTED OF HAVING PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE HAD SOUGHT REFUGE WITH TUNBATT. THE LOCAL WAS HANDED OVER TO THE INSPECTOR OF POLICE IN THE AREA WHEN IT WAS CLEAR THAT

A WARRANT HAD BEEN ISSUED FOR HIS ARREST BY THE JUDICIAL OFFICE FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS. HUMAN RIGHTS TO FOLLOW UP.

E. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL CONTINUES.

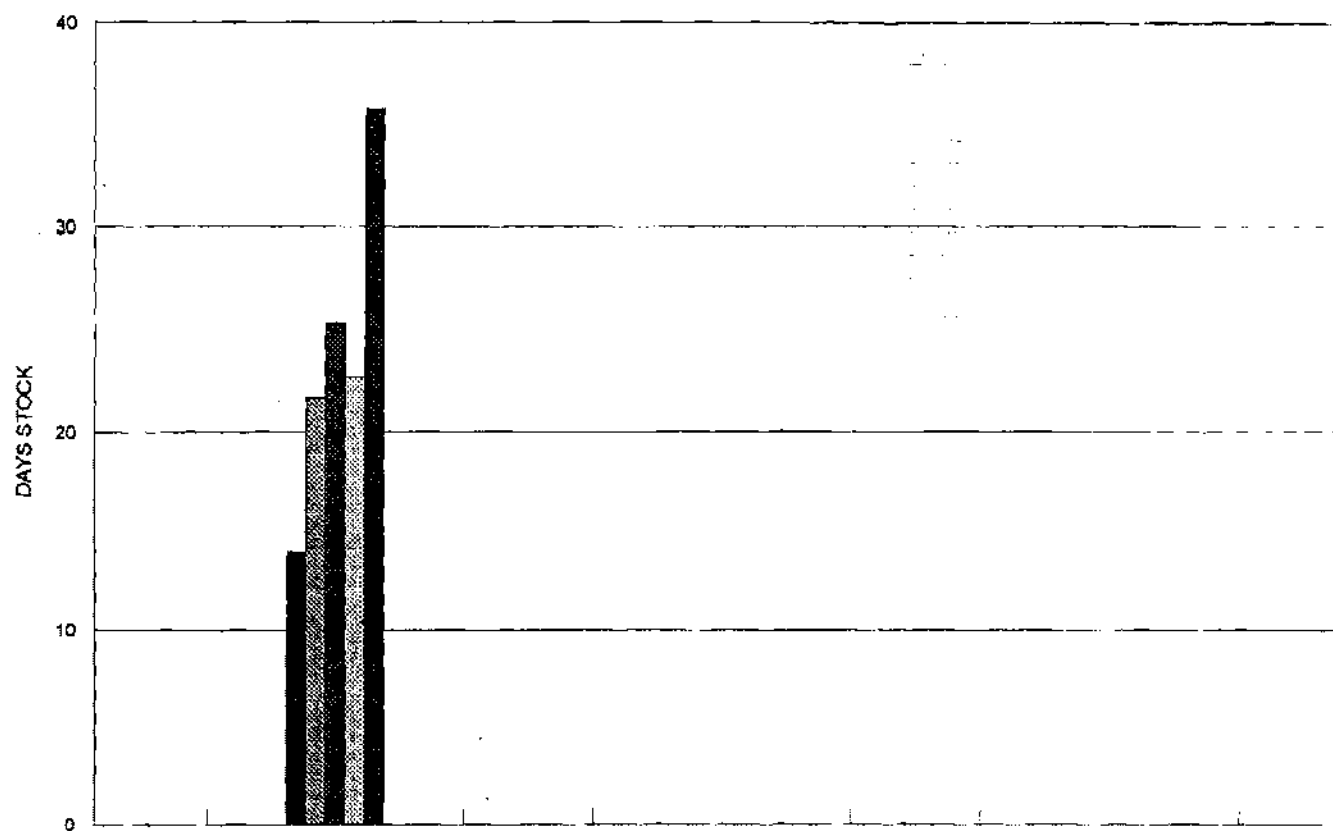

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINS TENSE THROUGHOUT, ESPECIALLY AT THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED "TARGET" COMMUNES WHICH ARE RECEIVING THE INFLUX OF IDPs.

B. IN SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS AT KIBEHO IDP CAMP LAST NIGHT EXHUMED APPROXIMATELY 16 IDP BODIES FROM KIBEHO. THE REPORT FURTHER SAID THE EXERCISE COULD HAVE BEEN GOING ON FOR SOME TIME AND COULD CONTINUE SO THAT ONLY VERY FEW BODIES WOULD BE FOUND AT KIBEHO BY THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, AND THE FORCE COMMANDER, GENERAL TOUSIGNANT, GAVE A FULL BRIEFING TO MR. ALDO AJELO, THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL. AMBASSADOR KHAN SPENT MOST OF THE DAY IN DISCUSSIONS WITH MR. AJELO, INCLUDING DISCUSSIONS RELATING TO THE INDEPENDENT COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ON KIBEHO.

B. THE FOLLOWING NEWS ITEMS WERE REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU OF RWANDA, WHO WAS ACCOMPANIED BY VICE-PRESIDENT PAUL KAGAME, PRIME MINISTER FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU AND OTHER GOVERNMENT MINISTERS, ON THURSDAY WENT TO KIBEHO CAMP WITH THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UN SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR RWANDA, AMBASSADOR SHAHARYAR KHAN AND THE FOREIGN DIPLOMATS ACCREDITED TO KIGALI, TO FIND THE TRUTH ABOUT THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE KILLED IN KIBEHO CAMP ON SATURDAY.

(2) PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU, AMBASSADOR SHAHARYAR KHAN, AND THE OTHER FOREIGN DIPLOMATS EYE- WITNESSED THE EXHUMATION OF DEAD BODIES FROM MASS GRAVES AND THE COUNTING OF THOSE BODIES WHOSE TOTAL NUMBER WAS 338. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU SAID THAT THE KILLINGS HAD BEEN A RESULT OF ATTACKS BY MILITIA MEN ON SOLDIERS AND CHALLENGED UNAMIR TROOPS AND ANYBODY ELSE TO SHOW OTHER MASS GRAVES IN KIBEHO. THEY DID NOT FIND ANY. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU STRONGLY CASTIGATED THE ATTITUDE OF MEMBERS OF FOREIGN MEDIA AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS WHO SPREAD EXAGGERATED FIGURES THAT GO UP TO 4 THOUSAND AND 8 THOUSAND.

(3) PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU ALSO ANNOUNCED THE SETTING UP OF AN INDEPENDENT COMMISSION COMPOSED OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND FOREIGN COUNTRIES, AMONG THEM CANADA, FRANCE, GERMANY, GREAT BRITAIN, THE OAU, THE UNITED STATES AND UNAMIR.

(4) THE COMMISSION IS IN CHARGE OF INVESTIGATING THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE KILLED, THE MANNER IN WHICH THEY WERE KILLED, THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE KILLINGS, WHETHER THE GOVERNMENT TROOPS WERE PROVOKED BY THE MILITIA AMONG THE DISPLACED PEOPLE, WHETHER THERE WERE CONSULTATIONS BEFORE THE MAKING OF THE DECISION TO CLOSE THE CAMP AND WHETHER THERE WAS AN ETHNIC BASIS BEHIND THE KILLINGS, ETC.

3. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.**

(1) RPA STOPPED A NIBATT PATROL TEAM AT RUKOMO JUNCTION GR 1121 AND INSISTED ON SEARCHING THE VEH.

ISSUE WAS RESOLVED. STILL IN SECTOR 1, MILOBS REPORTED THAT A COMBINED RPA AND GENDARMERIE CHECK POST (GR 1120) STOPPED MILOBS, NIBATT EOD AND FORCE ENGR TEAM AND INSISTED ON CHECKING THEIR VEHICLES AND DOCUMENTS. THE MILOBS INFORMED THEM THAT THE PATROL WAS ON ITS WAY TO RECCE THE ROAD TO MUGAMBAZI AND TO REMOVE SOME MINES. THEY WERE ALLOWED PASSAGE ONLY AFTER THEY HAD SUBMITTED TO A SEARCH. ANOTHER MILOB TEAM WAS STOPPED AND ASKED TO SHOW THEIR PASSPORTS AT THE SAME CHECK POST.

(2) MILOBS IN SECTOR 2 REPORTED RPA HAD CLOSED ITS TRAINING CAMP AT NYARUBUYE. HOWEVER ABOUT TWO PLATOONS OF TROOPS ARE STILL IN THE CAMP.

(3) MILOBS REPORTED THAT IN SECTOR 4B RPA CONTINUED ARRESTS OF SUSPECTED PERSONS. RPA TROOPS DEPLOYED TO MUSANGE SECTOR (GR 690095) OF HUYE COMMUNE (GR 6711) WERE REPORTED HOSTILE TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL AND DID NOT ALLOW IDPS WHO HAD HOMES IN THE AREA TO RESETTLE.

IV. AT HUYE COMMUNE (GR 6711), 3046 RETURNEES WERE REGISTERED AND REQUIRE FOOD FROM HUMANITARIAN ORGANIZATIONS. HAC INFORMED.

V. AT MARABA COMMUNE (GR 8631), COMMUNE AUTHORITIES COMPLAINED OF LACK OF HUMANITARIAN AID TO ASSIST TO RESETTLE 818 IDPS. 244 RETURNEES HAD BEEN DETAINED BY RPA INCLUDING 8 WOMEN AND 8 CHILDREN. HAC AND HR INFORMED.

FOOD, CLOTHES, AGRICULTURAL TOOLS AND SEEDS. HAC INFORMED.

XI. AT NDORA (GR 8112), 339 IDPS REGISTERED AND COMMUNE AUTHORITIES REQUESTED FOOD AS PRIORITY ASSISTANCE. HAC INFORMED.

XII. AT NGOMA (GR 9637), 1146 IDPS WERE REGISTERED AND THEY REQUESTED FOR CLOTHES, TOOLS, SEEDS AND MEDICINE. HAC INFORMED.

B. CIVPOL MONITORS IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE PATROLLED RUNDA COMMUNE ON 26 APR 95 WITH THE PROSECUTOR TO INVESTIGATE ALLEGATIONS AGAINST A SPANISH ROMAN CATHOLIC PRIEST AT

KABUGA THAT HUTUS IN TABA COMMUNE WERE BEING ADVISED BY THE PRIEST TO FLEE THE AREA SINCE THERE WERE PLANS FOR TUTSIS TO ATTACK THEM. THE PRIEST WHEN CONTACTED BY THE CIVPOL TEAM AND THE PROSECUTOR DENIED THE ALLEGATIONS AGAINST HIM AND EXPLAINED THAT COUNSELLOR OF THE SECTOR MADE THE FALSE ALLEGATIONS TO DISCREDIT HIM BECAUSE HE HAD MADE IT DIFFICULT FOR THE COUNSELLOR TO EXTORT MONEY FROM LOCALS HE HAD THREATENED TO IMPLICATE IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE IF THEY DID NOT BRIBE HIM WITH MONEY. THE TEAM THEREAFTER INTERVIEWED 14 LOCALS INCLUDING THE COUNSELLOR'S MOTHER. THEY ALL EXPLAINED THAT THE ALLEGATIONS AGAINST THE PRIEST WERE UNFOUNDED.

C. CIVPOL MONITORS IN KIGALI PREFECTURE VISITED THE MINISTRY OF PRIMARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION. THE DIRECTOR OF CABINET DISCLOSED THAT TEACHERS WHO EMBARKED ON STRIKE ACTION FOR NON-PAYMENT OF SALARIES HAD CALLED OFF THEIR STRIKE FOLLOWING A MEETING INVOLVING THE MINISTER AND REPRESENTATIVES OF THE TEACHERS.

D. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL CONTINUES.

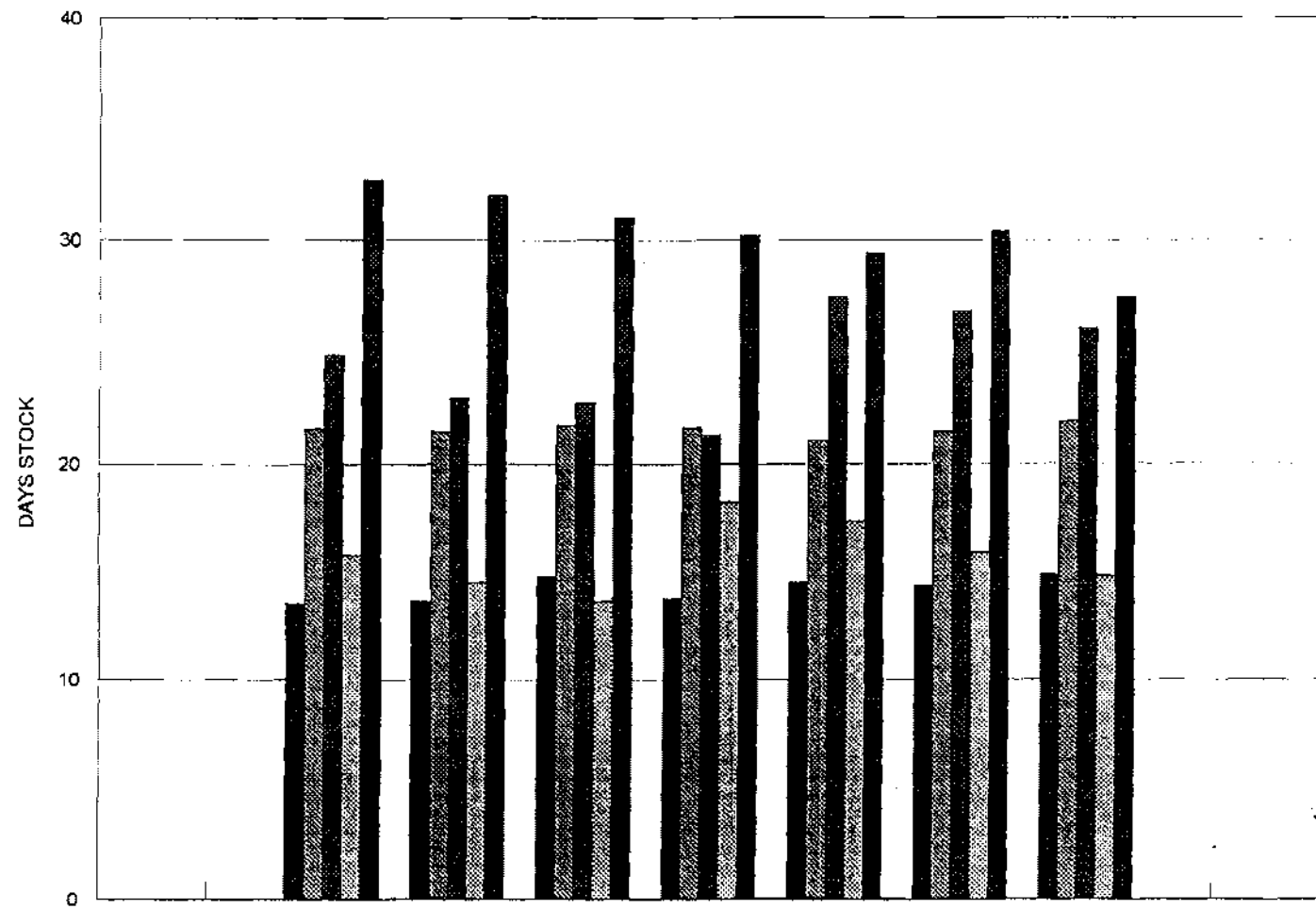
