In submitting these charges and any other charges in the future, His Majesty's Government reserve the right at any time to withdraw any charges, should it appear on review at a later date that the evidence expected to be available is in their view insufficient to support the charge with reasonable expectation of securing conviction, or if it should appear to His Majesty's Government that, for reasons of policy, it is desirable that any case or class of case should not be proceeded with.

The statement of each charge on the Commission's form is accompanied by one carbon copy. I regret that the present demands on the staff of this Department make it difficult to supply more copies. For the same reason I regret that I am unable to send more than one copy of the papers attached to, and referred to in, the statement of each case on the Commission's form.

With regard to paragraph 5 of the first Report of Committee I (Facts and Evidence) dated the 18th February 1944, I have thought it convenient to divide war crimes charged against nationals of the several enemy powers into three categories -

- A. Crimes committed in the course of operations
- B. Crimes committed against prisoners of war
- C. Crimes committed against civilians.

As will be seen from the serial reference on each of the cases submitted herewith, those serial numbers indicate by the letters U.K. that the charge is a charge preferred by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, by the letter G that the charge is against a German (indications in respect of Italians and Japanese will be by the letters I and J respectively), and the letter B indicates that the charge falls within the second category above mentioned, namely against a prisoner of war. In addition there is a serial number given to each of the cases. It is hoped that this method of identification will sufficiently comply with the request contained in paragraph 5 of the first Report above referred to.

The various other suggestions contained in first Report have been noted and have, it is thought, been substantially met in the cases now submitted. With reference, however, to paragraph 2 of the Report, the nature of the charges themselves indicates in the twelve cases now submitted that they constitute offences against English law, apart from the fact that they are breaches of the usages and laws of war and of specific provisions of the Geneva Convention 1929 relating to the treatment of prisoners of war. The point will, however, be specifically dealt with in subsequent cases submitted to the Commission. Similarly, the information regarding prisoners of war camps will be given when available.

I take this opportunity of confirming officially in pursuance of Article 18 of the Report of the Sub-Committee of your Commission that I have been charged with the responsibility for the preparation of charges to be submitted by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and that any communication in respect of any such charge should be made to me at the above address.
