Upon my return to United Nations Headquarters, I wish to reiterate my appreciation for the very useful and constructive discussions we had on the occasion of my official visit to your country, from 3 to 7 February 1985. You may be sure that I have benefitted from your penetrating analysis of the situation in South-East Asia and I am especially grateful for your continuing support for the efforts I have undertaken with a view to encouraging a negotiated settlement of the question of Kampuchea.

This support is but one aspect of the consistent co-operation extended by your Government to the various activities of the United Nations. It is therefore with great pleasure that I invite you to attend the commemoration of the fortieth anniversary of the foundation of our Organization, which will be held later this year, culminating on 24 October 1985. I do hope that you will find it possible to come to New York on this occasion.

The main purpose of the commemoration of the fortieth anniversary of the United Nations is to help further the cause of international understanding, to

SECRETARY-GENERAL CONCLUDES VISIT TO INDONESIA

(Received from the Spokesman for the Secretary-General.)

SINGAPORE, 7 February -- Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar ended his five-day official visit to Indonesia today, flying back from the island of Bali to Jakarta in the company of Indonesian Foreign Minister Mochtar Kusumaatmadja.

At a press conference at Jakarta airport, the Secretary-General answered questions on the results of his visit to South-East Asia and on the East Timor question.

The Secretary-General then flew to Singapore, where he had talks lasting 50 minutes with Foreign Minister S. Dhanabalan. The talks, which continued over a dinner hosted by the Foreign Minister, concentrated on the Kampuchea situation and the Secretary-General's assessment following his visits to Bangkok, Vientiane, Hanoi, Kuala Lumpur and Jakarta.

The Secretary-General left Singapore at 9 p.m. local time, on his way to Sydney, Australia, where he will spend Friday, before starting an official visit to New Zealand on Saturday, 9 February.

SECRETARY-GENERAL ARRIVES IN BALI

(Received from the Spokesman for the Secretary-General.)

BALI, Indonesia, 5 February -- Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar today paid a farewell call on Vice-President and Mrs. Umar Wirahadikusumah at the end of his stay in Jakarta.

The Secretary-General first flew to Yogyakarta, where he visited Borobudur Temple, which has been restored over the past years with the assistance of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). The Secretary-General then visited a multi-media training centre, which was set up in co-operation between the Governments of Indonesia and Japan, and is used to train broadcasters and television personnel from developing countries.

In the late afternoon, the Secretary-General flew to Bali, where tomorrow he will visit a number of cultural and artistic sites, and will be guest for dinner of the Governor of Bali, Bagus Mantra.

SECRETARY-GENERAL CONTINUES VISIT TO INDONESIA

Holds Separate Talks with President, Foreign Minister

(Received from the Spokesman for the Secretary-General.)

JAKARTA, 4 February -- Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar began the second day of his official visit to Indonesia today by driving to the National Heroes' Cemetery of Kalibata, where he was received by the Commander of the Jakarta Garrison, Major-General Try Soetrisno, and where he placed a wreath.

Following this ceremony, the Secretary-General called on the President of Indonesia, General Soeharto, and Mrs. Soeharto, at Istana Merdeka. President Soeharto and the Secretary-General then had talks lasting one hour. The discussions were mostly devoted to the question of Kampuchea, but also touched on some regional issues. The Secretary-General informed President Soeharto of the results of his exploratory visit to the region, and of his talks with the leaders of Thailand, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Viet Nam and Malaysia.

The Secretary-General later held talks at the Department of Foreign Affairs with Foreign Minister Mochtar Kusumaatmadja. The Secretary-General briefed the Foreign Minister on his visits to the countries of the region, stressing that his aim was to assess the situation in the area and contribute to the search for common ground and common denominators among the parties. The Secretary-General reaffirmed his determination to continue his efforts in this regard.

The Foreign Minister gave the Secretary-General his Government's evaluation of the situation in the region, and there was a general exchange of views on the Kampuchean problem in its international context and possible approaches to a negotiated solution. Other regional issues were also raised by the Secretary-General.

The Foreign Minister then briefed the Secretary-General on the problem of Indochinese "boat people" in Indonesia. He informed the Secretary-General that 10,000 refugees were now living on Galang Island, 4,000 in transit camps

and 6,000 in first-asylum camps. The Secretary-General thanked the Indonesian Government for its efforts to deal with this humanitarian question.

Mr. Mochtar informed the Secretary-General of Indonesia's plans for commemorating the thirtieth anniversary of the Bandung Conference on 24-25 April, and the Secretary-General briefed him on the celebration of International Youth Year (1985) and the preparations for the fortieth anniversary of the United Nations, also to be observed this year.

The Foreign Minister welcomed the opening of a United Nations Information Centre due to open in Jakarta in the next few months, and the talks ended with an exchange on the situation in Lebanon in which the Secretary-General stressed his concern about the situation, in particular in the Sidon area.

Following the talks, the Secretary-General was guest at a luncheon given in his honour at the Pancasila Building by Foreign Minister Mochtar.

In the afternoon, the Secretary-General visited the offices of the United Nations representatives in Indonesia, accompanied by their co-ordinator, Gamil Hamdy, Resident Representative of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in Indonesia. The Secretary-General heard briefings from the representatives of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), the United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA), the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), the World Health Organization (WHO), the World Food Programme (WFP), the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) about their activities in Indonesia, and met with the United Nations staff.

In the evening, the Secretary-General was guest at a dinner given in his honour by Vice-President Umar Wirahadikusumah at Istana Negara.

Tomorrow, 5 February, the Secretary-General will travel to Yogyakarta and will visit the Temple of Borobudur, which was restored with the assistance of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). On Wednesday, 6 February, the Secretary-General will visit Bali, returning to Jakarta on Thursday. He will give a press conference at the airport before leaving for Singapore in the afternoon.

SECRETARY-GENERAL BEGINS OFFICIAL VISIT TO INDONESIA

(Received from the Spokesman for the Secretary-General.)

JAKARTA, 3 February -- Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar arrived here in the late afternoon today at the start of a five-day official visit to Indonesia, the fifth stop of his present tour of South-East Asia.

The Secretary-General was met at Jakarta Airport by the Vice-President of Indonesia, Umar Wirahadikusumah, and Foreign Minister Mochtar Kusumaatmadja, as well as Indonesia's Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York, Ali Alatas, and other high Indonesian officials and members of the diplomatic corps.

Later in the evening, the Secretary-General and his party paid a courtesy call on Vice-President and Mrs. Wirahadikusumah, before a private dinner.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I WISH TO THANK YOU MOST SINCERELY FOR YOUR KIND WORDS AND FOR THE GENEROUS HOSPITALITY WHICH BOTH MY WIFE AND I HAVE ENJOYED SINCE OUR ARRIVAL IN YOUR GREAT COUNTRY. THE WARM WELCOME ACCORDED TO US DURING THIS VISIT IS ONE MORE EXPRESSION OF THE SUPPORT THAT YOUR GOVERNMENT HAS EXTENDED TO ME, AS SECRETARY-GENERAL, IN THE SEARCH FOR SOLUTIONS TO THE PROBLEMS CONFRONTING THIS REGION AND THE WORLD.

I AM ENCOURAGED BY THIS SUPPORT. IT IS MY CONFIDENT HOPE THAT YOU WILL CONTINUE TO EVINCE THE SAME DYNAMIC AND CONSTANT INTEREST THAT YOUR COUNTRY HAS SHOWN IN THE PAST IN LOOKING FOR WAYS AND MEANS OF PROMOTING A PEACEFUL SETTLEMENT OF THE COMPLEX ISSUES THAT CONFRONT THE WORLD ORGANIZATION.

THE YEAR 1985 IS AS SIGNIFICANT FOR INDONESIA AS IT IS FOR THE UNITED NATIONS. FOR IT MARKS THE FORTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE SIGNING OF THE UNITED NATIONS CHARTER, AS WELL AS THE PROCLAMATION OF AN INDEPENDENT REPUBLIC IN INDONESIA. IT IS ALSO THE THIRTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE HISTORIC BANDUNG CONFERENCE. THESE EVENTS HERALDED THE ERA OF DECOLONIZATION, WHICH HAS BROUGHT FREEDOM TO MORE THAN A BILLION PEOPLE AROUND THE WORLD.

INDONESIA WAS ALSO AMONG THE FIRST PLACES WHERE THE UNITED NATIONS WAS INVOLVED, IN 1946, IN SUPPORT OF ITS INDEPENDENCE STRUGGLE.

AFTER ITS INDEPENDENCE, INDONESIA HAS REMAINED IN THE FOREFRONT OF THE EFFORTS TO STRENGTHEN INTERNATIONAL UNDERSTANDING AND CO-OPERATION. IT MADE A SINGULAR CONTRIBUTION TO THE ADVANCEMENT OF THE CONCEPT OF AFRO/ASIAN SOLIDARITY, WHICH FOUND EXPRESSION IN THE BANDUNG PRINCIPLES OF PEACEFUL CO-EXISTENCE, NON-INTERFERENCE AND GOOD-NEIGHBOURLINESS.

AND, AT A TIME WHEN THE WORLD WAS TORN BY THE DANGEROUSLY-DEVELOPING STRUGGLE BETWEEN EAST AND WEST, INDONESIA WAS AMONG THE PIONEERS WHO VISUALIZED AND GAVE SHAPE TO NON-ALIGNMENT AS AN ALTERNATIVE TO POWER BLOCS AND AS A WAY OF PROMOTING GLOBAL PEACE AND STABILITY. NEEDLESS TO SAY, THE NON-ALIGNED MOVEMENT, OF WHICH INDONESIA HAS REMAINED AN IMPORTANT MEMBER, HAS EVER SINCE BEEN AT THE CENTRE OF THE EFFORTS TO ACHIEVE EQUITY AND JUSTICE IN INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS.

EXCELLENCIES,

AS I STAND HERE, I CANNOT FAIL TO RECALL THAT THESE ISLANDS CRADLED ONE OF THE FIRST EMBODIMENTS OF HUMAN INTELLIGENCE AND THE HUMAN SPIRIT - THE JAVA MAN. SINCE THOSE TIMES, INDONESIA HAS BEEN THE CROSS-ROADS FOR MANY CULTURES, CIVILIZATIONS AND EMPIRES, EACH ENRICHING THE GENIUS AND UNDERSTANDING OF ITS PEOPLE. I AM EQUALLY STRUCK BY THE MODERNISTIC OUTLOOK AND TRENDS IN INDONESIAN SOCIETY : EVEN AS EARLY AS THE TURN OF THIS CENTURY PRINCESS KARTARI, WHOM WE HAVE COME TO ADMIRE THROUGH HER PUBLISHED LETTERS, LAUNCHED A MOVEMENT FOR THE EDUCATION AND EMANCIPATION OF WOMEN.

TODAY, UNDER THE SAGACIOUS AND DYNAMIC LEADERSHIP OF HIS EXCELLENCY, PRESIDENT SOEHARTO, THE PEOPLE OF INDONESIA ARE ENGAGED IN A VAST AND COMPLEX EXPERIMENT IN NATION-BUILDING. THE PHILOSOPHY OF PANCASILA, WHICH EMPHASIZES DIVERSITY AND UNITY, FAITH AND HUMANITARIANISM, DEMOCRACY AND SOCIAL JUSTICE, IS EMINENTLY SUITED TO YOUR CIRCUMSTANCES AS THE GUIDING PRINCIPLE OF THIS ENDEAVOUR. AS AN ANCIENT COUNTRY WITH THE FIFTH LARGEST POPULATION IN THE WORLD, SPREAD OVER THIRTEEN THOUSAND ISLANDS WHICH STRADDLE A VAST OCEAN SPACE, INDONESIA CANNOT BUT BE A MELTING POT OF DIVERSE ETHNIC, CULTURAL AND LINGUISTIC GROUPS. THE PRINCIPLES OF PANCASILA CAN BE THE SIGN-POSTS FOR GUIDING, HARNESSING AND ACCELERATING THIS PROCESS.

THE UNITED NATIONS IS FACED WITH AN EQUALLY CHALLENGING TASK OF BRINGING HARMONY INTO A VASTLY COMPLEX AND DIVERSE WORLD AND TO BUILDING A GLOBAL ORDER BASED ON FREEDOM, EQUALITY AND JUSTICE, SO THAT HUMANKIND CAN STRIVE FOR A BETTER FUTURE FREE FROM THE SCOURGE OF WAR. AS I HAVE SAID SO OFTEN BEFORE, THIS TASK CANNOT BE ACCOMPLISHED WITHOUT A REAL DETERMINATION BY THE MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO ABIDE BY THE PRINCIPLES OF THE UNITED NATIONS CHARTER. IT ALSO CALLS FOR THE STRENGTHENING OF MULTILATERAL CO-OPERATION IN ORDER TO RESPOND TO THE MANY TASKS OF DEVELOPMENT, OF BRINGING SUCCOUR TO THOSE WHO SUFFER FROM HUNGER OR DISEASE, OF PROMOTING HUMAN RIGHTS AND OF CONTROLLING THE ARMS RACE.

AND, IN ORDER TO SUCCEED, WE MUST RELY ON ALL OUR MEMBER STATES FOR THEIR SUPPORT. IN THIS CONTEXT, I WISH TO SAY HOW MUCH WE VALUE THE ROLE PLAYED BY INDONESIA IN MANY FACETS OF THESE UNITED NATIONS ACTIVITIES. IN PARTICULAR, YOUR CONTRIBUTION TO THE DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES OF THE UNITED NATIONS, DESPITE YOUR OWN PRESSING NEEDS, HAS EARNED OUR APPRECIATION.

IN THE SOUTH EAST ASIAN REGION AS WELL, INDONESIA HAS PLAYED A KEY PART IN BUILDING A STRUCTURE OF MEANINGFUL REGIONAL CO-OPERATION, WHICH HAS TRANSCENDED THE NARROW DIFFERENCES OF THE PAST IN THE INTEREST OF A BETTER AND PEACEFUL FUTURE FOR ALL.

AS THE LARGEST MEMBER OF THE ASSOCIATION OF SOUTH EAST ASIAN NATIONS, AND AS THE SEAT OF THAT ORGANIZATION, INDONESIA HAS SERVED AS A GREAT PILLAR OF REGIONAL CO-OPERATION. THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY HAS WATCHED WITH ADMIRATION THE GROWTH OF ASEAN AS A BODY OF GREAT PROMISE AND POTENTIAL. WITH A PRAGMATIC APPROACH AND THE SHARED DETERMINATION OF ITS MEMBERS, ASEAN HAS MADE IMPORTANT STRIDES IN BUILDING A CLIMATE OF TRUST AND UNDERSTANDING AMONG ITS MEMBERS AND IN STRENGTHENING THEIR MUTUAL ECONOMIC AND COMMERCIAL TIES. THIS HAS, NO DOUBT, BEEN ONE OF THE KEY ELEMENTS IN THE DYNAMISM OF THE ECONOMIES OF THIS REGION AT A TIME WHEN MANY DEVELOPING COUNTRIES ARE FACING ACUTE ECONOMIC DIFFICULTIES. THE UNITED NATIONS HAS ALWAYS SUPPORTED REGIONAL CO-OPERATION, AS IT IS FULLY IN CONSONANCE WITH THE AIMS AND PURPOSES OF ITS CHARTER.

IT IS MY CONVICTION THAT, BE IT AT THE REGIONAL OR AT THE INTERNATIONAL LEVEL, PEACEFUL CO-OPERATION IN THE LARGER INTEREST IS THE ONLY ANSWER TO THE PROBLEMS OF OUR TROUBLED WORLD.

EXCELLENCIES, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

Additional Note for the Secretary-General

Special issues relating to UNDP operations in Indonesia

The Secretary-General may wish to note that the UNDP Resident Representative/Resident Coordinator (Mr. Gamil Hamdy) has taken special pride in a decision of the Government to cost-share with the UNDP so as to expand the resources for the technical cooperation in Indonesia. This was formalized in the Memorandum of Understanding on the Joint Programme Funding which was signed in Jakarta on 4 October 1982. Under this arrangement, the Government has so far committed \$33.5 million to UNDP. This financing arrangement is unique to UNDP and reflects Government's particular interest in UNDP technical cooperation activities.

In the light of the above, should the Secretary-General so desire, he may wish to express his gratitude to the Government for its special contribution (Joint Programme Funding) to the Country Programme and the trust it has shown in the ability of the UN and UNDP system to assist Indonesia in carrying out various development activities assuring them that UNDP will do its best to ensure that the quality of its inputs will be at a level commensurate with the expectations of the Government.
