MEMO: For All Teams, Bremen.

SUBJECT: Plans for Movement of Poles.  
27 October, 1945.

1. One car will be reserved for sick, infirm, pregnant women and nursing mothers. This car will be fitted up by Team 510, with mattresses, benches, wash-basins and such other comforts as are practicable. Please canvass those going and try to find anyone with medical or nursing helper experience, or, failing that, volunteers to assist in this car. Report number of persons assigned to this car as soon as possible. Try to limit the number of family members accompanying the occupants. If the total is large an extra special car may be assigned.
2. 20 cars have been assigned. 19 will be spotted on track 4 at the Bahnhof in Bremen, for loading, at 1100 on October 27th. The other one (hospital) will be on the ramp with the Command Post coach and food car. The train is due to leave at 12-10.
3. Each camp will group its travellers in car-groups of 25 or less, and give each traveller a ticket showing the car number assigned. Tickets will be about 2 x 4 inches and will show only the car number and the UNRRA team stamp to prove validity. Car numbers are assigned as follows:

BLUMENTHAL: B1. B2. . . . . B12.

HAMBURGER STRASSE: H1. H2 . . . . . H5.

TIRPITZ, GRAMBKE MUHLE: T1. T2.

SPECIAL CAR (Hospital): "SPECIAL".

Any overflow from Hambureger Strasse will be assigned to cars B-12 and T.2. These cars should not be filled up by their own camps in order to decrease the number in other cars, but should have places kept to accommodate the overflow from H. T. & B. should advise H. as soon as possible of the number of places available in these cars in order that car assignments may be made.

4. Team 510 will, prior to arrival of the travellers at the Bahnhof:
  - a. Mark the numbers on the cars conspicuously with chalk or cards.
  - b. Provide sign-boards indicating the direction to the different car sections.
  - c. Provide volunteer Polish guides to assist the travellers to find their cars.
5. Each car will have a leader appointed by the Center Administration, who will be responsible for:
  - a. Checking up on the persons in his car, and the correctness of their tickets.
  - b. Supervising the drawing and distributing of rations for his car.
  - c. Act as inter-mediary between the persons in his car and the train commandant.
  - d. Maintain order in his car.
  - e. Wear a distinctive arm-band, marked with his car number.

6. Each Camp will have a leader appointed who will report to the U.S. Army train commandant, Major Gailer, at the station. They should come to the station in the first truck to leave. From them the train commandant will choose one to act as Polish train commandant, who will carry out the functions prescribed in 7th Army circular No.39 of 17 October. The other three will act as his assistants.

All camp leaders will be given a copy of the duties of the Polish Train Commandant, translated into Polish, at their respective camps.


Camp leaders will wear an armband marked with the camp letter B. H. T. or G.

7. Nominal rolls of those going will be prepared in triplicate, corrected up to the latest practicable time. Two copies will be taken to the train and delivered to the U.S. Army train commandant. The third will be given to me.
8. Each camp leader will have a list of his car-leaders.
9. Each camp will organise a squad of volunteers to help handle the baggage of the old or inform. They should arrive at the station with, or before, the first truck-load.
10. Trucks will arrive at all camps at 1000 hours, as follows:-

Hamburger Strasse	-	4 (to shuttle)
Tirpitz & Grambke Muhle	-	1 or 2 (to shuttle)
Blumenthal:	-	enoughto lift all in one lift.

11. Part II, sec.12. "Organised movement" in the SHAEF Guide to care of D.P.'s will be followed insofar as conditions permit, but modified in accordance with existing conditions.

Travellers may each take a straw mattress. The provisions of circular No.39, 7th Army, of 17 October will also be followed.

Subject: General Instructions.

1. In order to accomplish the mission of UNRRA under the changed conditions now existing, it is most important that the greatest care be exercised in the proper dissemination and study of directives, as prescribed in Team Bulletin No. 1. Directors are responsible for ensuring that complete files are available, and that all team members are familiar with them and follow them. The prompt and correct submission of Reports and answering of correspondence must be the personal concern of the director. Memos from me requiring an answer should be answered within 24 hours, if possible.  
  
An index of all Team Bulletins and other directives should be kept on hand, telling briefly the contents of each, and listing reports called for by it, to enable any desired directive to be located promptly.
2. All team members must understand the proper procedure for requisitioning supplies and must use foresight in anticipating all needs and in submitting requisitions. Spot checks of a few d.p.'s selected at random must be made to ensure the correctness of the needs claimed.
3. All contacts with the Military Authorities should be made through the Field Supervisor, except for normal routine relations.
4. Working hours 0830 to 1730 with an hour for lunch, with Saturday afternoon off, must be observed. There have been complaints from the Army of visits to Centers without finding any UNRRA personnel. On Saturday afternoon and Sunday some member of the team must be on duty.
5. Leave: When any member of a team goes on leave he must turn over all his duties to other members, and give them all files, records and information necessary to carry on his work.
6. Accounting for supplies. The system prescribed for accounting for supplies in the warehouse must be followed scrupulously. A system must be set up for checking and accounting for all petrol drawn, as prescribed in Team Bulletin 20. This system must include the checking of the miles per gallon on each vehicle, in order to control pilfering of petrol.
7. All military buttons and insignia must be removed from German uniforms worn by d.p.'s. Any U.S. Army uniforms in possession of d.p.'s must be dyed blue.



To: All Team Directors.

General Instructions (contd).

8. It is necessary to maintain close relations with the national leaders, and to encourage them to bring all complaints to the Director. Every effort must be made to act on all valid complaints, and to explain the reasons when any complaints cannot be acted upon.
9. D.P.'s in hospital will continue to be carried on the rolls, and included in the listing by nationalities on report CA/d4. These patients should be visited in hospital, occasionally, by the Medical Officer, to check up on their treatment.
10. Timely requests should be made for necessary blank forms, cards, field post-cards, etc., as it takes some time to obtain these.
11. All members must be familiar with their duties as laid down in Mr. Kennedy's letter of 21 May 1945 "UNRRA Organisation and Administration in 12th Army Group", (pages 5 & 10).
12. Close liaison must be maintained with the Polish Liaison Officer. He may be asked to visit your center whenever necessary. (Tel: 2879. Office 107/13, Osterdeich). Liaison should be also maintained with the representative of the Polish Red Cross at the same address, and full use made of the tracing post-cards and any other services which he has to offer.

Area Team Director's Narrative Report.

A. Programs in Area Team Reorganization during past period.

1. Number and Location of administrative units.

There is only one camp, A.C. No.951, located in Bremen.

2. Number of Class I personnel at Camp level, at Sub-Area level, and at Area Team Headquarters respectively.

All Class I personnel in Bremen is at the Camp level in administrative supervision.

3. Progress in replacement of Class I and Class II personnel with DP's.

This Team has gradually been reduced from 18 Class I personnel to 7 Class I personnel, 2 Class II and 1 Class III. Replacement with DP's is impossible due to transient status of DP's.

4. Number of Class I and II personnel needed in addition to present allocation.

No additional personnel is needed in addition to present allocation at this time nor a reduction ~~can~~ be recommended.

# G. Comment on Supply, Transport, Health and Employment Reports.

In spite of telephone calls to Zone Transport EUCOM Bremen Port of Embarkation Authorities 7730th Emigrant Staging Detachment 7749th Overseas Movement Detachment, we have as yet received no license tags on our Army loaned vehicles. It should be the duty of Zone Transport to either get these license tags or force the Army to take the vehicles and give the Area Director a receipt for the same. Until this date I have been unable to get either.

# H. Other problems you wish to call to the attention of Zone H.Q.

This is no particular problem but effective 1 June 1947 we have consolidated the 2 Camps into one. This was done for a variety of reasons namely; emigration quotas have not been high enough to keep both camps filled. The closed camp is located 8 Km from the railroad siding where emigrants are staged. Lack of transportation due to inability to get license tags for trucks, and to conserve indigenous labor, we considered it practical to consolidate. However, the Army took the initiative by requisitioning the Assembly Center which was the German school to be returned to the German economy. Due to reasons stated above I concurred in this decision but pointed out to Military Authorities that the camp as it is closed was important to us because of the good heating facilities. The large camp we now occupy did not have sufficient coal in the past winter. I served notice to the Army that since they were taking the initiative in closing the camp that we expect the camp to be better supplied with coal in the following winter or we will not be able to operate.

BremenArea Team Director's Narrative Report.A. Progress in Area Team Reorganization during past period.

Team was not cut materially in Bremen as our work consists entirely of staging emigrants to the States.

1. Number and Location of administrative units.

There are 2 camps located in Bremen.

2. Number of Class I personnel at Camp level, at Sub-Area level, and at Area Team Headquarters respectively.

All Class I personnel in Bremen is at the Camp level in administrative supervision.

3. Progress in replacement of Class I and Class II personnel with DPs.

This team has gradually been reduced from 18 Class I personnel to 7 Class I personnel and 2 Class II. Replacement with DPs is impossible due to transient status of DPs.

4. Number of Class I and II personnel needed in addition to present allocation.

No additional personnel is needed at this time nor a reduction can be recommended.

5. Specific problems.

None.

B. Relationship with Military Post Commander.

A statement of clarification is needed here, because DPs were officially cleared from Bremen in February 1946. The American immigration program was set up especially to carry out President Truman's directive for the reopening of immigration. Since it was stated that the emigrants should be Displaced Persons and Persecutees, hence UNRRA was delegated to aid. Other participants were the U.S. State Dept., U.S. Army, C.I.C. and Voluntary Agencies. Hence the Emigrant Assembly and Staging Areas were set up in Bremen. The 17<sup>th</sup> Port of Embarkation set up an army unit, the Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 7730th Emigration Station (former Bremen Emigrant Station Det.-Prov.) to handle the army's part of the program. So it is the belief of local military authorities that all matters pertaining to our work should be routed through this unit, rather than the Military Post Commander.

1. Are your needs understood and supported?

Our needs are understood and supported.

2. How are you implementing the UNRRA-USFET Agreement?



Mutual aid and cooperation in functions is affected.

3. Special Problems.

Our one special problem is a lack of a clear understanding, by the army and UNRRA, whether or not these two centers shall be considered on the same basis as other DP camps in the U.S. Zone or as a special set-up. Nothing definite has ever been written in any directive.

C. Repatriation.

Does not apply.

D. Voluntary Agencies.

No special problems. Relations are very good, and agency personnel are doing a good job here with their respective emigrants.

E. Care and Housing.

Housing is good. Lack of engineering supplies, glass and paint namely, prevent better care.

F. Security and Fire Control.

Adequate security is furnished by a Polish Guard unit (employed by the U.S. Army). Fire fighting equipment is not completely satisfactory, due to shortage of fire extinguishers and hose.

A high percentage of old, aged and infirmed presents many problems in handling emigrants. Much special care is needed for this group in billeting, transportation, health, and recreation.

7. Security and fire control.

Adequate security is furnished by a Polish Guard unit. Fire fighting equipment is not completely satisfactory, due to shortages of fire extinguishers and hose.

8. Other problems and miscellaneous observations.

a) Uncertainty of coal supply has caused great hardship.

b) Lack of light bulbs, glass, and paint make maintenance of the camp difficult.
