

1. Certain Jewish records, as listed below, are being evacuated, at the request of the Combined Displaced Persons Executive (CDPE), G-5 Div USFET, to the Tracing, Records and Communications Unit, Exposition Building, HOCHST near Frankfurt.
2. The records are approximately as follows:-
 - (a) Card Index (15 boxes) recording natural and unnatural deaths for Jews in GERMANY between 1939 and 1944.
 - (b) One Card Index showing record of Jewish emigrants from Berlin to foreign countries.
 - (c) One Card Index, BERLIN Jewish death records 1943.
 - (d) One Card Index showing influx from other towns to BERLIN.
 - (e) One Card Index, foreign citizenship in GERMANY.
 - (f) 14 boxes of various Card Indices, showing Jewish schoolchildren in BERLIN.
 - (g) 14 Steel Cabinets containing complete records of Jews in HOLLAND.
3. It is suggested that DP and PW Division, and perhaps War Crimes Commission, should be informed of the new location of the above documents.

Extract of these statements has been made in his own words by the Netherlands Representative on the United Nations War Crimes Commission.

S t a t e m e n t

submitted by Jan Schoonmaker, Sergeant Major of State police Deputy Head of the Political Investigation Department at Assen.

Witness G. Bloemendaal states that from 23rd September 1944 till 29th October 1944 he was a prisoner of the S.D. at Groningen. With him were a large number of other prisoners; he knew most of them.

On 25th September 12 people were taken off; on 12th October 17 and on 28th October 1944 another 3. As this usually happened very early in the morning they were sure that these people were going to be shot. Witness knows that on 12th October the S.D. man STÜWZAND went with the prisoners.

Witness C.H.J. Stavenuiter confirms.

George HAASE, German, now in custody in Holland states that he was chief of the Sicherheitsdienst at Groningen. He remembers that during September and October 1944 a large number of persons were shot. They had partly been condemned to death and partly shot as reprisal for the shooting of two members of the S.D. at Dokkum. Dr. SCHÜNGART (already condemned to death) signed the order for these shootings. Witness informed Major WASCHKE, Commandant of the Ordnungspolizei at Groningen. Major WASCHKE told Oberleutnant SCHMID of the Ordnungspolizei to execute the order. Kriminal-Kommissar ANDERS, Head of Group IV of the Sicherheitsdienst Groningen was told to arrange transport of the victims to Westerbork where the shooting was to take place, searching of articles on the victims etc. Witness thinks he remembers STÜWZAND telling him that he had been present at the execution and that someone of the Befehlshaber der Sicherheitspolizei at the Westerbork-camp, probably DEPPNER had also been present.

It is possible that witness once received a list with names of the victims and that the executions were done on two different dates. This list had been passed on to ANDERS. Witness never suggested to execute certain people; he did however suggest to transport prisoners to another place this in connection with the many raids on prisons and police stations. He did not feel safe to keep these prisoners in the prison any longer. He does not know whether these prisoners were later shot in order to make room in the prison in this way. Possibly the interrogation report of the first batch was sent to the "Befehlshaber of the S.D." and witness then received the orders to shoot.

Witness BELLMER states that he was the "Vertreter" of the Commandant of the S.D. HAASE at Groningen. He generally arranged assistance, after he received order to this effect from HAASE, between the Ordnungspolizei and the S.D. He gave orders to Oberleutnant SCHMID, Commandant of the Ordnungspolizei, Stützpunkt Groningen. Witness states that he arranged the relations between the Ordnungspolizei and the S.D. in order to prevent that the Sachbearbeiter KNORR and LEHNHOFF would give orders to the Ordnungspolizei directly. However, this seems to have happened several times. He does not remember ever to have given Oberleutnant SCHMID order to execute people in Westerbork-camp. This was usually done by HAASE personally. As far as witness knows the executions in Westerbork were ordered by the Befehlshaber der Sicherheitsdienst at Zwolle and SS-Obersturmführer and Kriminal-Kommissar ANDERS executed the order by HAASE. Witness did know of the executions in Westerbork and even thinks that they were once interrupted for lack of coal to work the crematorium. STÜWZAND was present for the Sicherheitsdienst. Witness states that ANDERS and KNORR have since died.

Witness Hans OTT, German, now detained in Holland, states that he was liaison-officer with Major WASCHKE. A request for assistance

for the S.D. came only from HAUSE. He submitted the request to Major WASCHKE who ordered Oberleutnant SCHMID or his deputy Hauptwachmeister PARUSEL to give the required assistance. It was never stated what the assistance was wanted for, but on further thought witness sometimes got the impression that Major WASCHKE knew the reason especially when it concerned a "big case". He heard about executions at Westerbork under Oberleutnant SCHMID, who told him one evening that he had to execute death sentences next morning.

Witness Robert Wilhelm LEHNHOFF, German, now in custody, states that he knew of the execution in the Westerbork-camp. He was "Sachbearbeiter" for several of the victims. The interrogation reports were sent to the "Befehlshaber" who then sentenced them to death. The shooting was done by a commando of the Ordnungspolizei at Groningen. He has never been present at executions. The request for assistance from the Ordnungspolizei was always made by BELMER.

Witness Albert Konrad GEMMEKER, German, now in custody in Holland, states that he was commandant of the Westerbork-camp. He remembers having seen Oberleutnant SCHMID some 5-7 times in the camp with prisoners who had been condemned to death and who had to be shot. At the orders of SCHÖNGART witness had to see to the cordoning-off of the place of execution. Once he was ordered to shoot people but he refused on several grounds. Once also he was present and this time Oberleutnant SCHMID commanded the firing-squad too. The corpses were always cremated in the camp-crematorium.

Witness estimates the number of victims at the Westerbork camp shot during the time that he was the commandant at some 52-56. All victims came from Assen and Groningen. He thinks that 3 times people from Assen were shot and once Sturmscharführer HOFFMAN was present. He remembers that HOFFMAN reported the executions, this must have been in October 1944.

Witness Johann Thomas PARUSEL, German, now detained in Holland, states that his commandant was Oberleutnant SCHMID, who received his orders from the Commandant of the Ordnungspolizei Major WASCHKE. KNORR sometimes dealt directly with SCHMID.

Witness does not know anything about executions in the Westerbork camp. He did receive several times orders from SCHMID to have 10-15 people ready next morning but did not know what they were supposed to do. His deputies were Zugwachmeister THOMA, ADAM and DROSTE.

Witness Simon KLÖTZ, German, now detained in Holland, denies ever having been present at shootings.

Witness Joseph ADAM, German, now detained in Holland, states that twice he was a member of a firing-squad at Westerbork camp. He further states how the shootings took place at the camp and that they were commanded by Oberleutnant SCHMID. In April 1945 he also had to go but in view of the fact that he had had too much alcohol the previous evening Oberwachmeister SCHAMBERGER had to go in his stead. Oberleutnant SCHMID was also present.

Witness knows of three shootings and the following members of the Ordnungspolizei took part: Oberleutnant SCHMID three times, Zugwachmeister THOMA, Oberwachmeister LAGERT, Oberwachmeister Willy MÜLLER, Revieroberwachmeister BARAUNING, all twice; Revieroberwachmeister STÖLZLE, twice at Westerbork; Oberwachmeister KLÖTZ twice at Westerbork; Oberwachmeister NACHBAUER, twice at Westerbork; Oberwachmeister ESTENMEYER, once at Westerbork and once at Norg; Oberwachmeister SCHLUBERGER, once at Norg; Oberwachmeister STUDE twice at Norg; Oberwachmeister GAUGER and Oberwachmeister BLETTNER twice at Westerbork, insofar as witness can remember. He is not sure that Hauptwachmeister PARUSEL took part in one of the executions. Revieroberwachmeister DROSTE and the Oberwachmeister Hugo AMBERG however certainly never took part.

Witness Johann STÖLZLE, German, now detained in Holland, states that in October 1944 he took part in the shooting of 17 persons at Westerbork-camp. He received orders from Oberleutnant SCHMID to be present next morning but was not told what for. Next morning they drove to Westerbork. Oberleutnant SCHMID and his colleagues ADAM and THOMA also being in the

car. SCHMID gave the execution order. ADAM and THOMA and witness himself were members of the execution squad.

Julius NACHBAUER, German, now detained in Holland admits once having taken part in the shooting of 17 prisoners at Westerbork. Another day he took part in the shooting of five persons but he does not remember where this took place. Oberleutnant SCHMID & KNORR of the Sicherheitsdienst at Groningen were in command.

Witness Carel Faber, Dutch, now detained in Holland, states that in the autumn of 1944 he took part in a shooting at Westerbork-camp. He and his brother were present and the German S.D. men JENKENS and APFELBACH.

Witness P.J. FABER, brother of the above, also detained states that at the end of October 1944 he got orders from KNORR to go to Westerbork where a number (7 or 8) of prisoners, who were condemned to death by the Befehlshaber der S.D., were to be shot. SCHMID was in command of the firing squad who executed the prisoners. On 8th April 1945 he took part in the shooting of about 10 persons at Norg. This execution took place with a so-called neck-shot. Present were KNORR and SCHMID of the S.D. and Oberleutnant SCHMID of the Ordnungspolizei. KNORR was in command.

Witness STOWZAND, German, now in custody in Holland admits having been present at the shooting of 17 people at Westerbork. He received the valuables and handed them to ANDERS after the execution. Also present were JENKENS and BACKLER of the S.D. He got a list with 17 names from ANDERS, who ordered him to go with these prisoners to Westerbork, where they were to be shot by the Ordnungspolizei. He further states that he has been another time at Norg in April 1945 with 8 prisoners of the S.D. who were shot.

Witness Martin SCHMID, German, now in custody in Holland. About the shooting in October 1944 he does not remember which persons took part in the firing squad but while in prison ADAM, STOLZLE and NACHBAUER told him that they had been there.

He admits having been present and in command of several other shootings.

In October 1944 WASCHKE told him that the next day a number of prisoners of the S.D. had to be shot. He got further detailed instruction from Hauptsturmführer BELLER of the S.D.

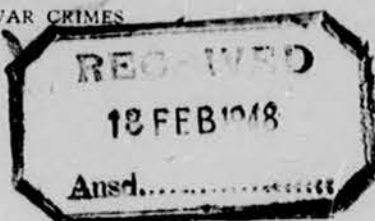

Fallschirmjäger der Hermann Göring Truppe, now believed to be in British custody at No. 2 War Criminals Holding Centre, Fischbeck, on a charge of criminal responsibility for a war crime, namely, murder, committed at Soest, near Amersfoort, at the end of April, 1945, and has found there to be a prima facie case against him in respect of this charge and accordingly has placed his name upon its Lists of persons accused of war crimes who ought to be brought to trial.

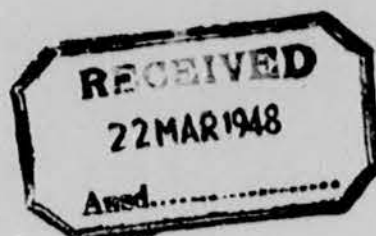

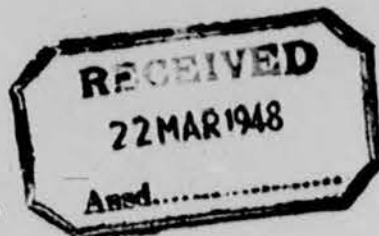
