DAILY SITREP FOR 22 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 184, 175 FROM ZAIRE AND 09 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,362 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES ON 21 NOV 95, AT THE HOTEL DES MILLE COLLINES IN KIGALI, THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER, MR PIERRE CELESTIN RWIGEMA, OPENED A THREE-DAY THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS ON REPATRIATION, REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL REINTEGRATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. THE PARTICIPANTS INCLUDED SEVERAL SENIOR RWANDAN GOVERNMENT FIGURES AS WELL AS ALL AMBASSADORS TO RWANDA AND OTHER PROMINENT MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS. THE SRSG WHO WAS INVITED TO MAKE AN OPENING ADDRESS, CONVEYED TO THE MEETING THE SECRETARY- GENERAL MR BOUTROS BOUTROS-GHALI'S SUPPORT AND WISHES FOR SUCCESS IN ACHIEVING ITS OBJECTIVES. THE SRSG ALSO EMPHASIZED THE NEED FOR AN IMPROVEMENT IN REGIONAL RELATIONSHIPS IN ORDER TO ENCOURAGE THE RETURN OF THE REFUGEES. HE CALLED FOR THE PURSUIT OF SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT THROUGH EFFECTIVE COOPERATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT, THE UN AGENCIES AND THE DONOR COMMUNITY, AS THE BEST WAY TO ACHIEVE NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND RECOVERY.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), RPA CARRIED OUT CORDON AND SEARCH OP IN GIKONGORO THIS MORNING. LOCALS WERE SCREENED AND THEIR HOUSES WERE SEARCHED. THE PREFECT SAID EFFORTS WERE BEING MADE TO IDENTIFY A GROUP OF PEOPLE INVOLVED IN BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD. RPA LATER REPORTED HAVING RECOVERED SOME ITEMS BUT GAVE NO FURTHER DETAILS.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI). MILOBS WERE INFORMED THAT ON 18 NOV 95 AT BUSUMBA SECTEUR (GR 2727), INFILTRATORS ABDUCTED ONE PERSON WHOSE WHEREABOUTS IS STILL UNKNOWN. RPA WERE LATER INFO BY LOCALS AT NYAMIRANGO SECTEUR (GR 3218), ABOUT MOV OF LARGE NUMBER OF INFILTRATORS (ABOUT 50) SOME OF WHOM WERE IN UNIFORM AND WERE REPORTEDLY CARRYING WEAPONS. FIVE INFILTRATORS WERE APPREHENDED BY RPA AND RIFLES, GRENADES AND MINES WERE RECOVERED FROM THEM.

(2) SECTOR 3A - GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN THE AREA. BANDITRY ACTIVITIES ARE SAID TO BE ON THE INCREASE IN RWAMIKO COMMUNE. THE BANDITS ARMED WITH CUTLASSES AND WOODEN HAMMERS ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE COME FROM MUDASOMWA AND BUTARE. SOME TWAs FROM BUHORO SECTOR ARE ALSO SAID TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THESE ACTIVITIES.

(3) SECTOR 4 - ON 17 NOV 95 IN KIGABIRO CELL GR 8416 OF NYAKABUYE COMMUNE, SIX BANDITS ATTACKED THE HOUSE OF A LOCAL WHO WAS ON A PATROL WITH THE RPA AND SERIOUSLY INJURED HIS WIFE. MOTIVE FOR THE ATTACK IS NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATION BY THE RPA IS IN PROGRESS.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 34 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM NKAMIRA. 79 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO AND KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 140 ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. GHANCOY I AND II PROVIDED SIX TRUCKS AND TWO TRUCKS RESPECTIVELY TO THE RPA TO CONVEY PRISONERS FROM BYUMBA TO NSINDA AND FOOD FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE.

C. MALICoy PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO KIBEHO, ONE TRUCK TO PARQUET FOR TRANSPORTING PRISONERS FROM GIKONGORO TO RWAMIKO, ONE TRUCK TO CARE INTERNATIONAL FOR TRANSPORTING WOODEN PLANKS FROM KARAMBO TO GIKONGORO AND TWO TRUCKS TO TROCAIRE TO TRANSPORT CEMENT FROM BUKARAMA TO GIKONGORO RESPECTIVELY.

D. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO RPA TO TRANSPORT RATION.

E. FORCE ENGINEER COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO SECTOR 1A FOR TRANSPORTING CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL FOR A MOSQUE IN KIGALI AND ALSO A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD.

F. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG CARRIED OUT THE FOLLOWING TASKS:

(1) TRANSPORTED SCHOOL MATERIAL TO A SCHOOL IN KIRAMBO.

(2) TRANSPORTED 6 TONS OF GRAIN TO BUTAMWA.

G. UNITS AND NORMED MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 118 MEDICAL AND 9 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 1B ( GITARAMA), THE PREFECT ADMITTED THE URGENCY IN HAVING A BOURGMESTRE IN TABA COMMUNE WHERE TENSIONS ARE ON THE RISE. HE ALSO WANTS TO MEET WITH THE BOURGMESTRE OF NTONGWE COMMUNE TO DISCUSS RECENT WAVES OF ARRESTS WHICH HAVE BEEN LINKED TO HIS ARRIVAL.

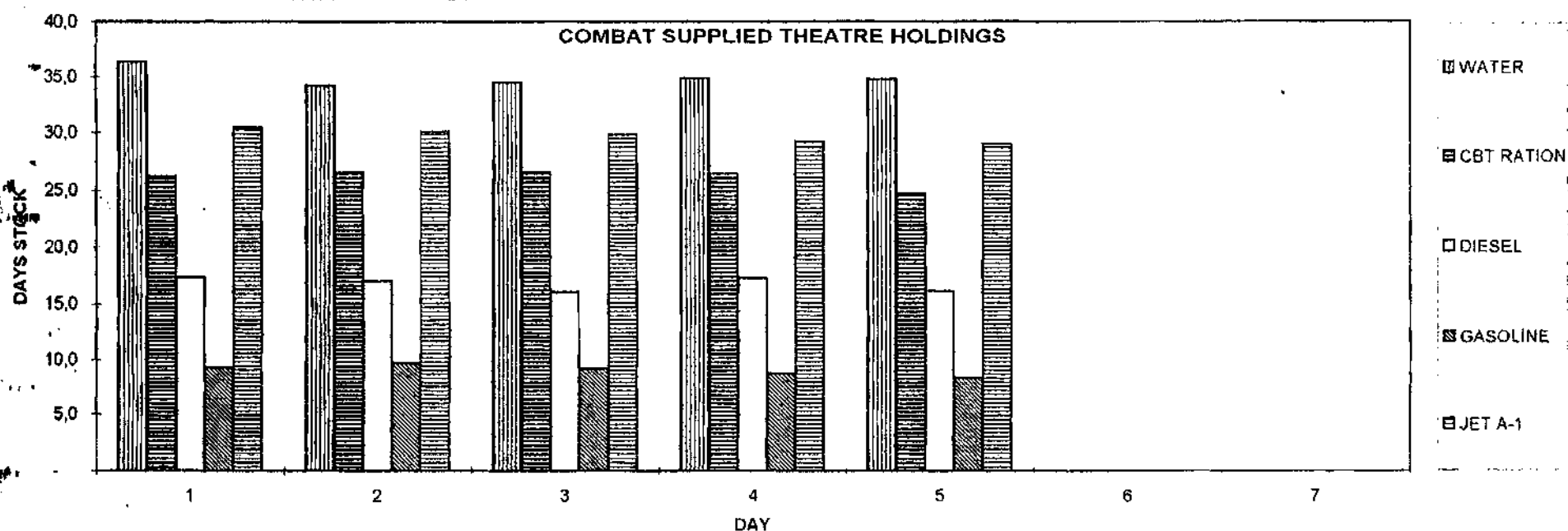



**DAILY SITREP FOR 22 NOV 95**

**1. HIGHLIGHTS**

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

**B. BORDER CROSSING:**

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS **184**, 175 FROM ZAIRE AND **09** FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS **NIL**.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS **26,362** AND OUTFLOW IS **63**.

**2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES** ON 21 NOV 95, AT THE HOTEL DES MILLE COLLINES IN KIGALI, THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER, MR PIERRE CELESTIN RWIGEMA, OPENED A THREE-DAY THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS ON REPATRIATION, REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL REINTEGRATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. THE PARTICIPANTS INCLUDED SEVERAL SENIOR RWANDAN GOVERNMENT FIGURES AS WELL AS ALL AMBASSADORS TO RWANDA AND OTHER PROMINENT MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS. THE SRSG WHO WAS INVITED TO MAKE AN OPENING ADDRESS, CONVEYED TO THE MEETING THE SECRETARY- GENERAL MR BOUTROS BOUTROS-GHALI'S SUPPORT AND WISHES FOR SUCCESS IN ACHIEVING ITS OBJECTIVES. THE SRSG ALSO EMPHASIZED THE NEED FOR AN IMPROVEMENT IN REGIONAL RELATIONSHIPS IN ORDER TO ENCOURAGE THE RETURN OF THE REFUGEES. HE CALLED FOR THE PURSUIT OF SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT THROUGH EFFECTIVE COOPERATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT, THE UN AGENCIES AND THE DONOR COMMUNITY, AS THE BEST WAY TO ACHIEVE NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND RECOVERY.

**3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES**

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE** IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), RPA CARRIED OUT CORDON AND SEARCH OP IN GIKONGORO THIS MORNING. LOCALS WERE SCREENED AND THEIR HOUSES WERE SEARCHED. THE PREFECT SAID EFFORTS WERE BEING MADE TO IDENTIFY A GROUP OF PEOPLE INVOLVED IN BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD. RPA LATER REPORTED HAVING RECOVERED SOME ITEMS BUT GAVE NO FURTHER DETAILS.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI). MILOBS WERE INFORMED THAT ON 18 NOV 95 AT BUSUMBA SECTEUR (GR 2727), INFILTRATORS ABDUCTED ONE PERSON WHOSE WHEREABOUTS IS STILL UNKNOWN. RPA WERE LATER INFO BY LOCALS AT NYAMIRANGO SECTEUR (GR 3218), ABOUT MOV OF LARGE NUMBER OF INFILTRATORS (ABOUT 50) SOME OF WHOM WERE IN UNIFORM AND WERE REPORTEDLY CARRYING WEAPONS. FIVE INFILTRATORS WERE APPREHENDED BY RPA AND RIFLES, GRENADES AND MINES WERE RECOVERED FROM THEM.

(2) SECTOR 3A - GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN THE AREA. BANDITRY ACTIVITIES ARE SAID TO BE ON THE INCREASE IN RWAMIKO COMMUNE. THE BANDITS ARMED WITH CUTLASSES AND WOODEN HAMMERS ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE COME FROM MUDASOMWA AND BUTARE. SOME TWAS FROM BUHORO SECTOR ARE ALSO SAID TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THESE ACTIVITIES.

(3) SECTOR 4 - ON 17 NOV 95 IN KIGABIRO CELL GR 8416 OF NYAKABUYE COMMUNE, SIX BANDITS ATTACKED THE HOUSE OF A LOCAL WHO WAS ON A PATROL WITH THE RPA AND SERIOUSLY INJURED HIS WIFE. MOTIVE FOR THE ATTACK IS NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATION BY THE RPA IS IN PROGRESS.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 34 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM NKAMIRA. 79 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO AND KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 140 ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. GHANCOY I AND II PROVIDED SIX TRUCKS AND TWO TRUCKS RESPECTIVELY TO THE RPA TO CONVEY PRISONERS FROM BYUMBA TO NSINDA AND FOOD FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE.

C. MALICOY PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO KIBEHO, ONE TRUCK TO PARQUET FOR TRANSPORTING PRISONERS FROM GIKONGORO TO RWAMIKO, ONE TRUCK TO CARE INTERNATIONAL FOR TRANSPORTING WOODEN PLANKS FROM KARAMBO TO GIKONGORO AND TWO TRUCKS TO TROCAIRE TO TRANSPORT CEMENT FROM BUKARAMA TO GIKONGORO RESPECTIVELY.

D. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO RPA TO TRANSPORT RATION.

E. FORCE ENGINEER COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO SECTOR 1A FOR TRANSPORTING CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL FOR A MOSQUE IN KIGALI AND ALSO A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD.

F. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG CARRIED OUT THE FOLLOWING TASKS:

(1) TRANSPORTED SCHOOL MATERIAL TO A SCHOOL IN KIRAMBO.

(2) TRANSPORTED 6 TONS OF GRAIN TO BUTAMWA.

G. UNITS AND NORMED MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 118 MEDICAL AND 9 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 1B ( GITARAMA), THE PREFECT ADMITTED THE URGENCY IN HAVING A BOURGMESTRE IN TABA COMMUNE WHERE TENSIONS ARE ON THE RISE. HE ALSO WANTS TO MEET WITH THE BOURGMESTRE OF NTONGWE COMMUNE TO DISCUSS RECENT WAVES OF ARRESTS WHICH HAVE BEEN LINKED TO HIS ARRIVAL.

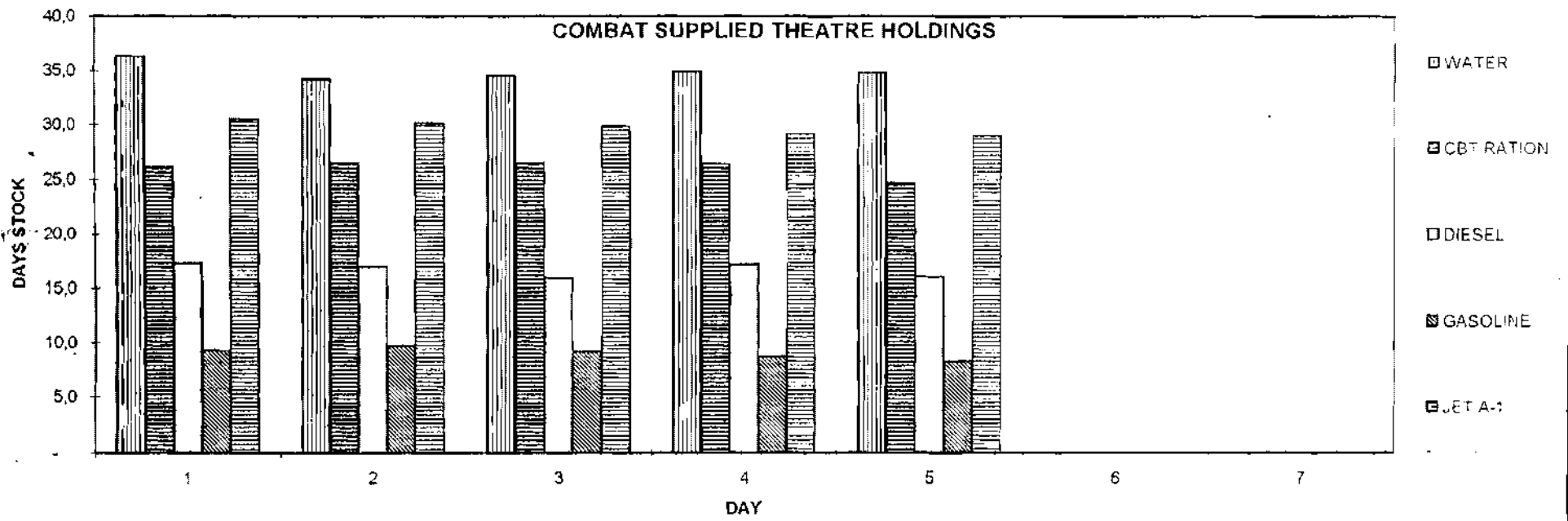

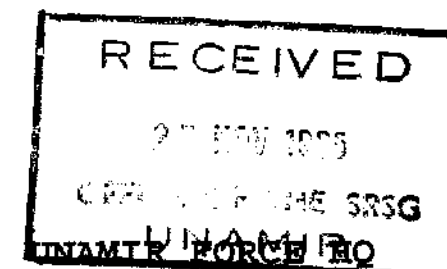

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES A JOURNALIST FROM QUEBEC INTERVIEWED THE PC. ISSUES DISCUSSED INCLUDED UNAMIR'S ACTIVITIES OVER THE PAST ONE YEAR AND THE REFUGEE SITUATION.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA). MILOBS RECEIVED AN UNCONFIRMED REPORT AT A VACCINATION CENTRE THAT A SECRET DETENTION FACILITY EXISTED IN NYAKABANDA COMMUNE (6597) IN NGARU SECTOR (6303). THE REPORT FURTHER STATED THAT THE CENTRE HAS 80 INMATES WHO ARE BEING MALTREATED. INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT THE CENTRE IS NEAR A BRIDGE CALLED MOUFOUMBA (660084) LINKING GITARAMA PREFECTURE TO RUHENGERI PREFECTURE. THE LOCALS ARE AFRAID TO SPEAK TO MILOBS. THE COUNCILLOR OF THE AREA CONFIRMED THE PRESENCE OF THE PRISON BUT SAID IT CONTAINS ONLY FOUR INMATES. MILOB TEAM WERE DENIED INFORMATION BY RPA GUARDS AT THE PRISON. A JOINT MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS PATROL WILL FURTHER INVESTIGATE THE REPORT.

(2) SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO). LAST WEEK, 20 OUT OF THE 47 PRISONERS IN THE MUSENGE COMMUNE CACHOT WERE RELEASED AFTER INVESTIGATIONS PROVED THAT THEY WERE NOT GUILTY. SECTOR MILOBS HAVE REPORTED THAT BODIES OF VICTIMS OF THE GENOCIDE ARE BEING RECOVERED AT A SITE NEAR THE MURAMBI SECONDARY SCHOOL WHICH WAS ALSO THE LOCATION OF A TUTSI CAMP. APPROXIMATELY 7000 BODIES HAVE BEEN RECOVERED AND IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THERE MAY BE UP TO 30,000 BODIES IN THAT LOCATION.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI). MILOBS WERE INFORMED IN RAMBURA SECTOR (4514) THAT FOUR BOYS WERE ARRESTED AND DETAINED IN CONNECTION WITH THE ANTI PERS MINE BLAST ON THE 12 AND 15 NOV 95.

(2) LOCALS INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 18 NOV 95, IN NDORA (4717), FIVE PERS IN MILITARY UNIFORM RANSACKED A SHOPKEEPER'S HOUSE AND STOLE AN AMOUNT OF 70,000 RWF. ON THE SAME DAY, ANOTHER GROUP OF THREE PERS IN UNIFORM STOLE 30,000 RWF AT BIREMBO (GR 5713).

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA). THE SECTOR COMDR VISITED THE GITARAMA PRISON WITH DR KRITIENSEN, HEAD OF NORMED, AND REPS OF UNAMIR HQ G2 CELL. APPROXIMATELY 2000 INMATES HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO THE NEW PART OF THE PRISON.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 94 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP AND 71 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI TOWN AND KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 185 ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. GHANCOY 1 AND 2 PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS EACH TO THE RPA TO CONVEY FOOD FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO AND FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE RESPECTIVELY.

C. MEDICAL PERSONNEL FROM MALAWICOY HAVE MOVED TO BWEYEYE AND NYUNGWE TO ASSIST LOCALS IN NATIONAL ANTI-POLIO VACCINE CAMPAIGN.

D. NICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO TRANSPORT STATIONARY ITEMS FROM GISENYI TO VARIOUS SCHOOLS IN KARAGO COMMUNE (4516).

E. FORCE ENGINEER COY DEPLOYED A DOZER EACH FOR A REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI AND FOR MAKING A PLAY GROUND IN COMMUNAL POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL NEAR RWAMAGANA. FORCE ENGINEER COY ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO SECTOR 1A FOR TRANSPORTING CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL FOR A MOSQUE IN KIGALI.

F. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG CARRIED OUT THE FOLLOWING TASKS:

(1) TRANSPORTED A DOZER FROM KIBUNGO TO BIRENGA.

(2) TRANSPORTED LUMBER IN KIGALI FOR ARDEC.

(3) RECOVERED A LAND CRUISER FOR TROCAIRE IN GIKONGORO.

G. UNITS AND NORMED MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 136 MEDICAL AND 14 DENTAL PATIENTS.



6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 5A, MILOB TEAM THAT PATROLLED GAHUNGA SECTOR (6440) ON 20 NOV 95 WERE INFORMED THAT FOUR CHILDREN DETONATED AN ANTI-PERSONNEL RIFLE GRENADE IN A GARDEN WHILE PLAYING WITH IT. ONE OF THE CHILDREN LOST TWO FINGERS WHILE THE OTHER THREE SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. THEY HAVE ALL BEEN ADMITTED AT THE RUHENGRI HOSPITAL. MILOBS LATER DISCOVERED 2 X GRENADES AND 1 X ANTI PERS RIFLE GRENADE IN THE SAME AREA. LOCAL RPA COMD AND ENGINEERS HAVE PROMISED TO DESTROY THE DEVICES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

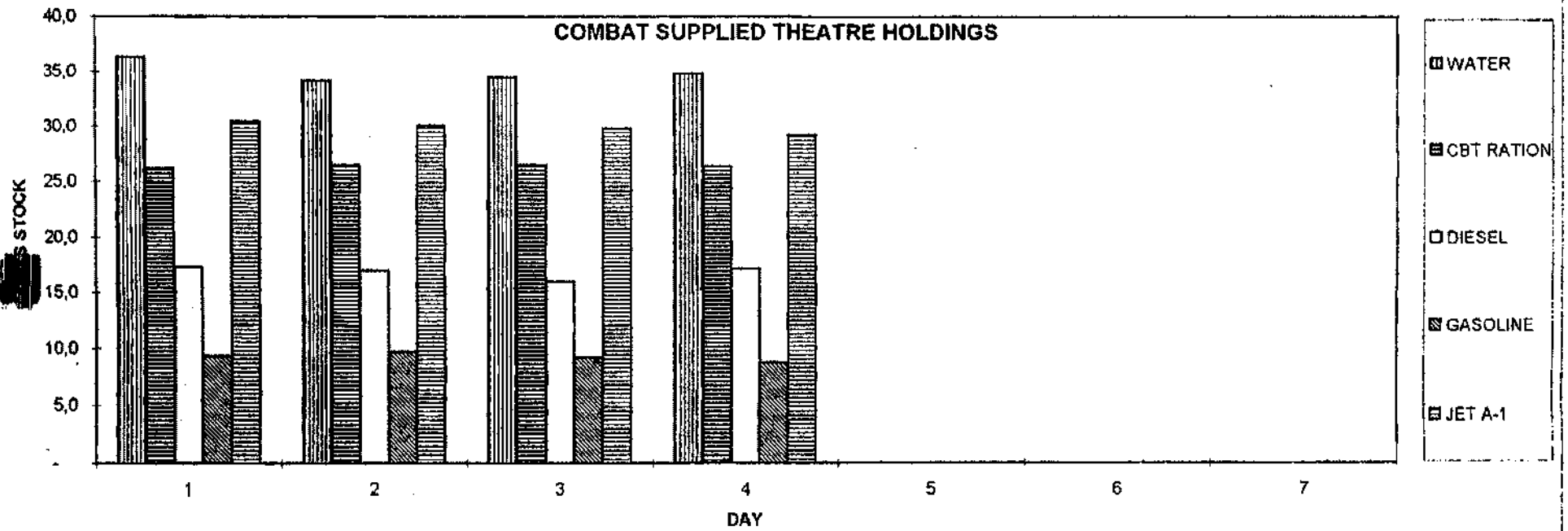

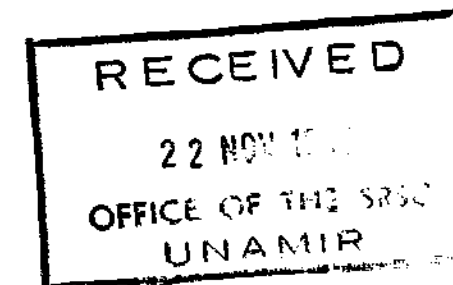

SECTOR MILOBS HAVE REPORTED THAT BODIES OF VICTIMS OF THE GENOCIDE ARE BEING RECOVERED AT A SITE NEAR THE MURAMBI SECONDARY SCHOOL WHICH WAS ALSO THE LOCATION OF A TUTSI CAMP. APPROXIMATELY 7000 BODIES HAVE BEEN RECOVERED AND IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THERE MAY BE UP TO 30,000 BODIES IN THAT LOCATION.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI). MILOBS WERE INFORMED IN RAMBURA SECTOR (4514) THAT FOUR BOYS WERE ARRESTED AND DETAINED IN CONNECTION WITH THE ANTI PERS MINE BLAST ON THE 12 AND 15 NOV 95.

(2) LOCALS INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 18 NOV 95, IN NDORA (4717), FIVE PERS IN MILITARY UNIFORM RANSACKED A SHOPKEEPER'S HOUSE AND STOLE AN AMOUNT OF 70,000 RWF. ON THE SAME DAY, ANOTHER GROUP OF THREE PERS IN UNIFORM STOLE 30,000 RWF AT BIREMBO (GR 5713).

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA). THE SECTOR COMDR VISITED THE GITARAMA PRISON WITH DR KRITIANSSEN, HEAD OF NORMED, AND REPS OF UNAMIR HQ G2 CELL. APPROXIMATELY 2000 INMATES HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO THE NEW PART OF THE PRISON.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 94 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP AND 71 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI TOWN AND KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 185 ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. GHANCOY 1 AND 2 PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS EACH TO THE RPA TO CONVEY FOOD FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO AND FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE RESPECTIVELY.

C. MEDICAL PERSONNEL FROM MALAWICOY HAVE MOVED TO BWEYEYE AND NYUNGWE TO ASSIST LOCALS IN NATIONAL ANTI-POLIO VACCINE CAMPAIGN.

D. NICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO TRANSPORT STATIONARY ITEMS FROM GISENYI TO VARIOUS SCHOOLS IN KARAGO COMMUNE (4516).

E. FORCE ENGINEER COY DEPLOYED A DOZER EACH FOR A REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI AND FOR MAKING A PLAY GROUND IN COMMUNAL POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL NEAR RWAMAGANA. FORCE ENGINEER COY ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO SECTOR 1A FOR TRANSPORTING CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL FOR A MOSQUE IN KIGALI.

F. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG CARRIED OUT THE FOLLOWING TASKS:

(1) TRANSPORTED A DOZER FROM KIBUNGO TO BIRENGA.

(2) TRANSPORTED LUMBER IN KIGALI FOR ARDEC.

(3) RECOVERED A LAND CRUISER FOR TROCAIRE IN GIKONGORO.

G. UNITS AND NORMED MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 136 MEDICAL AND 14 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 5A, MILOB TEAM THAT PATROLLED GAHUNGA SECTOR (6440) ON 20 NOV 95 WERE INFORMED THAT FOUR CHILDREN DETONATED AN ANTI-PERSONNEL RIFLE GRENADE IN A GARDEN WHILE PLAYING WITH IT. ONE OF THE CHILDREN LOST TWO FINGERS WHILE THE OTHER THREE SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. THEY HAVE ALL BEEN ADMITTED AT THE RUHENGRI HOSPITAL. MILOBS LATER DISCOVERED 2 X GRENADES AND 1 X ANTI PERS RIFLE GRENADE IN THE SAME AREA. LOCAL RPA COMD AND ENGINEERS HAVE PROMISED TO DESTROY THE DEVICES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

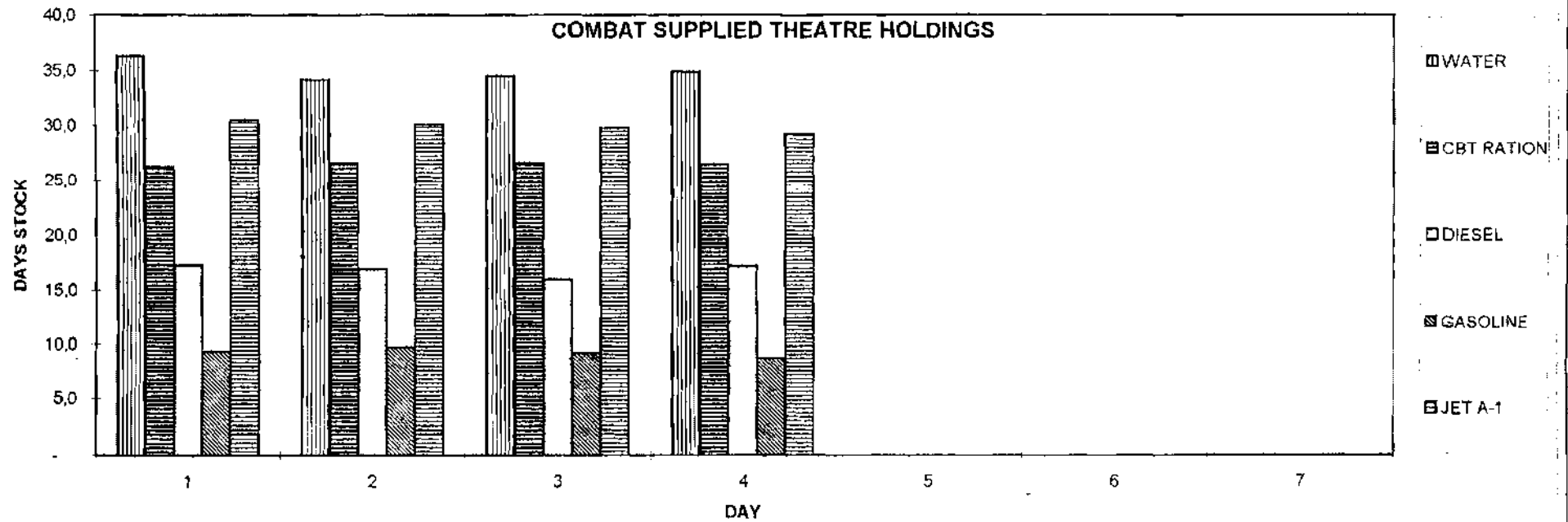

RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

THE TEAM ALSO REPORTED ARREST OF A FRGF CORPORAL IN BWIRA SECTOR (GR 4981) OF KIVUMU COMMUNE (GR 5573). FIVE WOMEN WERE ALSO ARRESTED FOR CONCEALING THE WEAPONS BROUGHT BY THE ABOVE INDIVIDUAL.

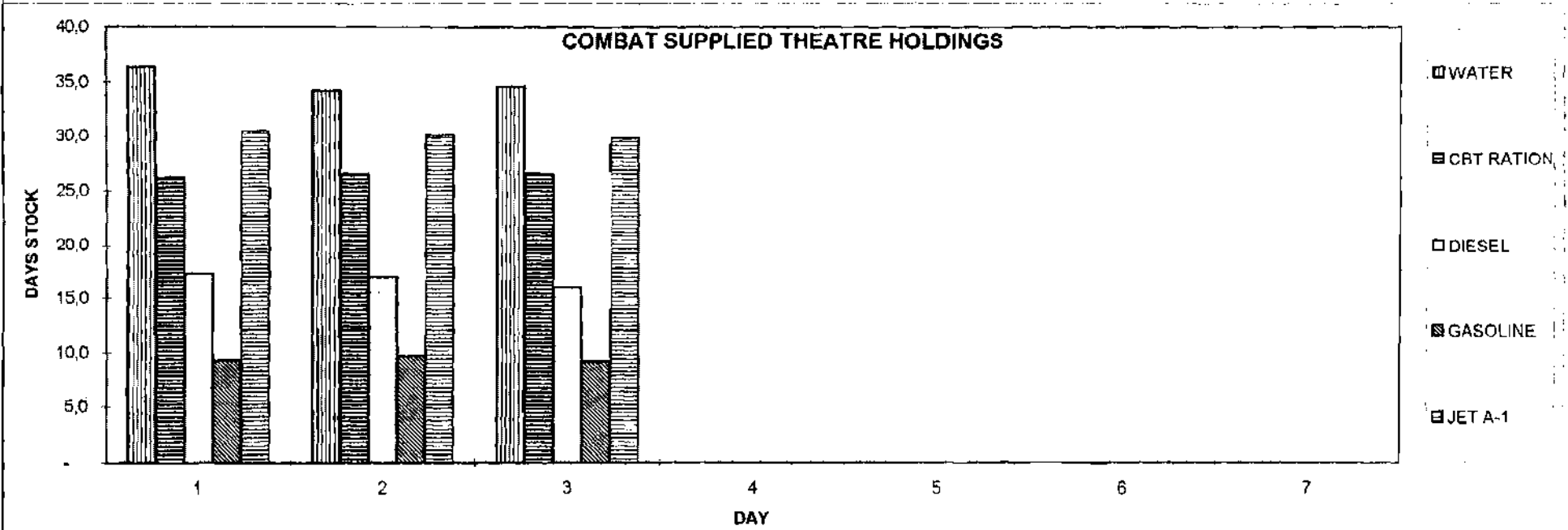

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 13 NOV TO 20 NOV 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINED TENSE. THE RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST, REMAIN CLOSED TO ALL COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND FOR REFUGEES ON FOOT WHO RE WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 1142. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG MET WITH THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, ON 13 NOVEMBER, AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR AS WELL AS THE HOLDING OF THE GREAT LAKES' REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT.

B. ON 14 NOVEMBER, THE SRSG WENT TO SEE THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA, MR. PIERRE- CÉLESTIN RWIGEMA, TO DISCUSS THE FORTHCOMING THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS SCHEDULED FOR 21-22 NOVEMBER. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH OTHER OFFICIALS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA TO DISCUSS ISSUES RELATED TO UNAMIR'S MANDATE.

C. AT THE END OF HER VISIT TO RWANDA, MRS. ELIZABETH LINDENMAYER, PRINCIPAL DESK OFFICER FOR RWANDA IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PEACE-KEEPING OPERATIONS, CALLED ON THE SRSG ON 14 NOVEMBER, FOR A CONCLUDING SESSION WITH HIM. FINALLY, THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING ON UNAMIR'S MANDATE TO MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS AND HEADS OF VARIOUS AGENCIES AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS.

D. THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING ON PRISONS AT THE UNDP ON 15 NOVEMBER AND REVIEWED GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE DETENTION CENTRES AS WELL AS DISCUSSED WAYS AND MEANS TO RAPIDLY EXPAND THE DETENTION CAPACITY OF THE PRISONS IN RWANDA. THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PRISONS COMMISSION, MR. CLAUDE DUSAIDI, WAS ALSO PRESENT IN THE MEETING.

E. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE MEMBERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS ASSISTANCE ADVISORY GROUP AND REVIEWED PROGRESS

ACHIEVED IN CONNECTION WITH TASKS ACCOMPLISHED BY UAAG AND FUTURE REQUESTS TO BE CONSIDERED IN THIS REGARD.

F. THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN THE OPENING CEREMONY OF A POLICE SCHOOL AT GISHARI IN KIBUNGO PREFECTURE, INAUGURATED BY THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME ON 19 NOVEMBER 1995. THE SCHOOL WAS BUILT WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF IRELAND, HOLLAND, GREAT-BRITAIN, GERMANY, UGANDA AND UNAMIR.

G. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, DR. ANASTASE GASANA, STRONGLY CONDEMNED ALL THOSE WHO WOULD USE THE PROBLEM OF RWANDESE REFUGEES TO STRAIN RELATIONS WITH COUNTRIES OF THE SUB-REGION. HE SAID THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT HAD NO INTEREST IN PREVENTING RWANDESE REFUGEES FROM RETURNING TO THEIR MOTHER-LAND.

H. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE FORMER AMERICAN PRESIDENT JIMMY CARTER ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 19 NOVEMBER, ACCOMPANIED BY THE ATLANTA BASED CARTER FOUNDATION. HE WENT TO VISIT NTARAMA WHERE MANY PEOPLE LOST THEIR LIVES IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE. HE WAS SHOCKED BY WHAT HE SAW, AND SAID THAT PERPETRATORS OF THE GENOCIDE SHOULD BE BROUGHT TO JUSTICE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) -REFERENCE THE REPORTED CASE OF MASKED SOLDIERS WHO FORCED THEIR WAY INTO THE CATHOLIC COMPOUND IN TABA COMMUNE ON 12 NOV 95, MILOBS CONFIRMED THAT THE SOLDIERS WERE LOOKING FOR A SPANISH FATHER WHO WAS OUT ATTENDING A FUNCTION AT THE TIME OF THE INCIDENT. HE WAS INTERVIEWED BY MILOBS AND HE SPOKE HIS MIND ON THE INCIDENT. HE SAID HE BELIEVES THE ATTACK WAS A FOLLOW-UP FROM COMMENTS MADE ON RADIO RWANDA BY THE GITARAMA REPORTER WHO CRITICIZED HIM BY NAME AS AN INTERAHAMWE WHO HAD TO BE KILLED. THE BROADCASTING ALSO INCLUDED DEROGATORY COMMENTS AGAINST ALL SPANISH PRIESTS AS PRO-HUTU RACISTS. SEVEN FRANCISCAN SISTERS WERE BEATEN. THREE OF THEM WERE INTERVIEWED AND WERE STILL SHAKEN AND HAVE MOVED OUT OF THEIR HOUSES. ONE LOCAL WAS SHOT IN THE ARM AS HE ATTEMPTED TO YELL FOR HELP. THE RPA AUTHORITIES ARE AWARE OF THE SITUATION AND HAVE INTERVIEWED THE FATHER IN THE PRESENCE OF THE A/BOURGEMESTRE.

(2) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), AT APPROX 1000 HRS ON 15 NOV 95, RPA FIRED SEVEN RIFLE SHOTS IN GITONGO SECTOR GR 0445 OF KIRAMBO COMMUNE. REASONS FOR THE FIRING ARE NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

(3) MILOB TEAM TO NYABIKENKE GR 7292 WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT ON 09 NOV 95, FIVE PERSONS IN RPA UNIFORM, STOLE TWO RADIOS, RWF 13,000 AND OTHER HOUSEHOLD GOODS FROM THREE HOUSES IN MUGUNGA SECTOR GR 7096. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(4) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - MILOB PATROLS FROM GITAHIGHA (GR2426) REPORTED THAT ON THE 14 NOV 95 THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF INSURGENTS. ONE INSURGENT WAS REPORTEDLY KILLED. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 15\16 NOV 95 THERE WAS AGAIN ANOTHER EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND INSURGENTS AT RWAZEKUMA (GR2620). THERE WERE NO REPORTED CASUALTIES.

(5) SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) - ON 16 NOV 95 AT 1200 HRS, THE COUNCILLOR OF KARENGERA (GR1350) IN THE RWAMATAMU COMMUNE, TOLD MILOB PATROL THAT TWO PERS WERE ARRESTED ON 12 NOV 95 BY THE RPA AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE FOR ALLEGEDLY TAKING PART IN THE GENOCIDE. THEY ARE SAID TO BE IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT. JUST AFTER TALKING TO THE COUNCILLOR THREE RPA SOLDIERS ARMED WITH AK 47 RIFLES CAME RUNNING TO MEET THE PATROLS DEMANDING THEIR MISSION. THEY WERE TOLD MILOBS WERE THERE TO VISIT THE HEALTH POST. THE RPA SOLDIERS ESCORTED THE MILOBS TO THE POST AND WERE WITH THEM THROUGHOUT THEIR STAY AT THE POST. AS THE PATROLS MOVED TOWARDS THE HELI THEY MET SOMEONE WHO CLAIMED TO BE THE LOCAL RPA COMD AND SEVEN OTHERS. HE INSISTED THAT MILOBS SHOULD HAVE INFORMED HIM BEFORE THE VISIT. MILOBS EXPLAINED THAT WOULD HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE IF THEY HAD COME BY ROAD. ON ARRIVAL AT THE LANDING POINT THE PATROL MET FOUR OTHER SOLDIERS ARMED WITH 2 RPGs AND 2 AK 47 RIFLES SURROUNDING THE HELI. THE RPA COMD INSISTED THE HELI SHOULD NOT TAKE OFF AND INSTRUCTED THE SOLDIERS TO SHOOT DOWN THE HELI IF IT ATTEMPTED TO TAKE OFF. THE SOLDIERS THEN COCKED THEIR WEAPONS. THE PATROL WAITED AROUND THE HELI FOR ABOUT 45 MINS WHEN THE RPA COMD IN RWAMATAMU AND THE BOUGEMESTRE WITH FIVE OTHER ARMED SOLDIERS CAME IN. THIS MADE THE TOTAL NUMBER OF RPA SOLDIERS 20 WITH 16 OF THEM ARMED. THE COUNCILLOR WAS BROUGHT IN AND UPON QUESTIONING BY THE BOUGEMESTRE ADMITTED MILOBS ASKED HIM WHETHER ARRESTS ARE GOING ON IN THE AREA AND WHO MAKES SUCH ARRESTS AND WHETHER THOSE ARRESTED ARE BEATEN. THE PATROL DENIED THIS AND INSISTED THE COUNCILLOR SAID THOSE THINGS OUT OF FEAR. THE BOUGEMESTRE FINALLY ADVISED THAT IN FUTURE THE PATROL SHOULD HOLD A WRITTEN PERMIT FROM THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE BEFORE COMING TO THE COMMUNE. THE PATROL WAS THEN RELEASED TO DEPART AFTER ABOUT 70 MINS DETENTION.

(6) SECTOR 5C - KIBUYE. ON 18 NOV 95, A MAN IN CIVIL CLOTHING WHO CLAIMED TO BE AN RPA SOLDIER, ATTEMPTED TO ARREST A LADY INTERPRETER WORKING WITH THE MILOBS AT KIBUYE. HE WAS HOWEVER PREVENTED FROM DOING SO WHEN HE WAS CHALLENGED BY MILOBS TO PRODUCE PROOF OF HIS ID AND ORDER FOR ARREST.

(7) SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) - ON 09 NOVEMBER 1995 AT ABOUT 2300 HRS, AT RUVUNE SECTEUR (GR 188199) IN KINYAMI COMMUNE, A GROUP OF ARMED MEN IN UNIFORM ATTACKED A LOCAL AT HIS RESIDENCE INJURING HIM IN THE HEAD, HAND AND LEG WITH BULLET WOUNDS. ALL HIS BELONGINGS WERE LOOTED. LOCALS BLAME FRGF. HOWEVER, CONSIDERING RPA DEPLOYMENT SUCH ALLEGATIONS SEEM UNLIKELY. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(8) SECTOR 1A - KIGALI. MILOB TEAM PATROL IN KIGALI REPORTED THAT RPA WERE FOUND INTERROGATING AROUND 50 PEOPLE AT THEIR CAMP OPPOSITE KIGALI CENTRAL PRISON. REASON OF THE INTERROGATION NOT KNOWN. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(9) SECTOR 3B - A CABINET MINISTER NAMED JEAN MARIE WAS ALMOST ATTACKED BY THE CROWD ATTENDING THE REBURIAL CEREMONY OF THE GENOCIDE VICTIMS AT RUHASHYA (GR 7206) ON 19 NOV 95, FOR HIS ALLEGED INVOLVEMENT IN THE GENOCIDE. HE WAS IMMEDIATELY ARRESTED BY THE RPA.

(10) SECTOR 5A - MILOBS SECTOR 5A REPORTED THAT A MAN, MR. RUKARA WAS SHOT DEAD BY THE RPA ON 190100 NOV 95 AT RUKEREZA (GR 6034) WHEN HE TRIED TO RUN AWAY. MILOBS FURTHER REPORTED THAT THREE WOMEN WERE ARRESTED FOR ALLEGEDLY COLLABORATING WITH FRGF IN ATTEMPTING TO BLOW AN ELECTRICITY PYLON ON 09 NOV 95.

(11) MILOBS SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT ON 17 NOV 95 IN MABUYE SECTOR (GR 4587) SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE KILLED A LOCAL AND STOLE 11 COWS. THE TEAM ALSO REPORTED ARREST OF A FRGF CORPORAL IN BWIRA SECTOR (GR 4981) OF KIVUMU COMMUNE (GR 5573). FIVE WOMEN WERE ALSO ARRESTED FOR CONCEALING THE WEAPONS BROUGHT BY THE ABOVE INDIVIDUAL.

B. MILITIA/FRGF

(1) ON THE NIGHT OF 13/14 NOV 95, SOME FRGF PERSONNEL CROSSED OVER TO IJWI ISLAND (GR 9350) FROM GIKUYU (GR 9841) USING LOCAL BOATS. THESE MEN ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM BUTUMBARA (GR 9837). WHEN INTERCEPTED BY RPA AT GIKUYU AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE ENSUED. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED ON EITHER SIDE.



(2) SECTOR 5A(RUHENGARI) - ON THE 14 NOVEMBER 1995,AT 2100 HRS SOME FRGFs SOLDIERS STARTED FIRING ON AN RPA LOCATION AT NYABIREHE SECTOR 4629 IN MUKINGO COMMUNE. IN THE EXCHANGE OF FIRE, ONE FRFG SOLDIER WAS SHOT DEAD. RPA RECOVERED ONE ANTI- PERSONNEL MINE FROM THE DEAD SOLDIER AND TWO ANTI- PERSONNEL MINES FROM THE AREA. MILOBS FOUND THE BOURGEMESTRE AND THE LOCAL RPA COMPANY COMMANDER AT THE SCENE OF INCIDENT WHO EXPRESSED THE FEELING THAT THE FRFG SOLDIERS MUST HAVE COME FROM ZAIRE AND LATER FLED BACK. FURTHER THE LOCAL RPA COMMANDER SAID THAT THERE ARE MANY INFILTRATORS IN THE AREA WHO ARE LIKELY TO LAY MINES ANYWHERE IN THE AREA.THEY PARTICULARLY SUSPECT THE ROAD COMING FROM MUKINGO COMMUNE AND PASSING THROUGH NYABIREHI (4629) SECTOR. FOR SECURITY REASONS RPA HAVE STOPPED ALLOWING ANYONE TO USE THE ROAD FROM GR 470290 TO 420254.

(3) SECTOR 5A - RUHENGARI. MILOB TEAM PATROL TO MUKINGO COMMUNE REPORTED THAT ONE CIVILIAN STEPPED ON AN ANTI PERS MINE ( AT GR 515310 ) ON 181200B NOV 95 AND LOST ONE LEG. IT WAS THE SAME PLACE WERE ON 08\09 NOV 95 A PYLON WAS BLOWN OFF BY FRGF.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) ON 15 NOV 95, THE FC HELD SEPARATE MEETINGS WITH THE BELGIUM AMBASSADOR AND MR IAN MARTIN (UNHRFOR). HE LATER MET THE SRSG TO DISCUSS THE FUTURE OF THE MANDATE.

(2) THE FORCE COMMANDERS CONFERENCE WHICH WAS HELD AT GIKONGORO ON 15 NOVEMBER 95, WAS ATTENDED BY UNAMIR HQs STAFF AND SECTOR COMMANDERS.

(3) ON 15 NOV 95, THE FC RECEIVED THE CANADIAN DEPUTY CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF WHO ARRIVED IN KIGALI AT 1715 HRS ON A OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA. ON 16 NOV 95, THE VISITING CANADIAN DEPUTY CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF PAID A WORKING VISIT TO GITARAMA IN SECTOR 1B. HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE STATE OF AFFAIRS IN THE SECTOR.

(4) SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) - MILOB PATROLLED CYERU COMMUNE TO CONFIRM THE ARREST OF 06 PEOPLE ALLEGED TO HAVE HELD A MEETING IN THE NIGHT. THE BOUGEMESTRE OF THE COMMUNE REFERRED MILOB TO THE IPJ WHO SAID ANY ARREST IN THE COMMUNE IS NOT UNAMIR PROBLEM. THE IPJ DENIED MILOB ASSESS TO ANY INFORMATION. LOCALS INFORMED MILOB THAT AT LEAST 10 TO 15 PERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BECAUSE THEY DID NOT ENTER RWANDA THROUGH THE OFFICIAL BORDER POST.

(5) ON 16 NOV 95, THE FORCE COMMANDER ATTENDED THE MEDAL PRESENTATION CEREMONY OF 95 CMSG, AT WHICH, THE CANADIAN DCDS, LT GEN ROY WAS CHIEF GUEST. LATER, HE ATTENDED DINNER HOSTED IN HONOUR OF THE VISITING DIGNITARY. THE DCDS DEPARTED FROM THE MISSION AREA ON 17 NOV 95.

(6) THE SRSG RECEIVED THE FORMER US PRESIDENT MR JIMMY CARTER WHO IS ON A OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA, ON 19 NOV 95 AT KIA.

D. OTHER SECTORS NTR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 91 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED TWO DUMPERS FOR TRANSPORTING EARTH FOR NAKAMERA TRANSIT CAMP IN GISENYI. FORCE ENGR COY ALSO DEPLOYED A DOZER FOR A REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI AND FOR MAKING A PLAY GROUND AT COMMUNAL POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL IN RWAMAGANA.

C. MALAWICOY MEDICS ASSISTING RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IN THE NATIONAL ANTI POLIO VACCINATION CAMPAIGN.

D. A TOTAL OF 162 IDPs ARE AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

E. A TOTAL OF 969 MEDICAL AND 79 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY MEDICAL STAFF IN RWANDA DURING THE WEEK.

F. MILOBS SECTOR 2B REPORTED THAT THE RWINKWAVU HOSPITAL (GR 6782) HAS BEEN FULLY CONVERTED INTO A MILITARY HOSPITAL AND THAT NO CIVILIANS ARE BEING TREATED THERE.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. IN SECTOR 1A, CIVPOL REPORTED A MEETING WITH THE CHIEF OF PRISONS ADMINISTRATION IN RWANDA WITH A VIEW TO RESOLVING THE IMPASSE ON PRISON VISITS BY UNAMIR OBSERVERS. THE MEETING WAS HELD FOLLOWING THE SPATE OF DENIAL OF ACCESS TO PRISON FACILITIES NATIONWIDE.

B. CIVPOL TEAM REPORTED THAT THE BOURGMESTRE OF RUNYINYA COMMUNE ADDRESSED A COMMUNAL GATHERING ON 15 NOV 95 IN RURANZIGE SECTOR, WHERE HE WARNED LOCALS TO DESIST FROM ARRESTING PEOPLE WITHOUT VALID REASONS OR ON MERE SUSPICION OF HAVING TAKEN PART IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE. THE BOURGMESTRE WARNED OF STIFF PENALTY FOR ANYONE TAKING THE LAW INTO OWN HANDS.

C. IN BATAMA CELLULE GR 6780, SIX BODIES WERE RECOVERED FROM A SMALL GRAVE. THE BODIES WERE IDENTIFIED AND ARE BEING REBURIED AFTER PERFORMING THE LAST RITES.

D. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) - 09 INMATES OF BYUMBA PRISON, ESCAPED ON NIGHT 18 NOV 95 THROUGH A HOLE THEY DUG. THREE OF THE ESCAPEES HAD BEEN CHARGED FOR GENOCIDE, FOUR FOR ARMED ROBBERY AND TWO FOR RAPE.

E. SECTOR 1A - THE EX US PRESIDENT MR JIMMY CARTER ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 19 NOV 95 FOR DISCUSSIONS WITH THE GOVT ON THE ISSUE OF SUMMIT OF LEADERS OF THE GREAT LAKE REGION, WHICH IS SCHEDULED TO BE HELD IN CAIRO ON 27 NOV 95.

F. MILOBS SECTOR 2A REPORTED 18 DEATHS DUE TO MENINGITIS IN GAKENKE HEALTH CENTRE (GR 463012) OF MURAMBI COMMUNE. AN AWARENESS PROGRAMME AGAINST MENINGITIS IS BEING RUN AT NYABISINDU PRIMARY SCHOOL.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL IN SECTOR 3B, CIVPOL REPORTED THAT KILLING OF LOCALS AND HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES ARE ON THE INCREASE ESPECIALLY IN RUNYINYA COMMUNE. INVESTIGATIONS ARE ON BY HR MONITORS.

9. COMMENTS THE RPA HAS INCREASED THEIR DENIAL OF ACCESS TO PRISONS TO CIVPOL AND MILOB AND HAVE ALSO STARTED INSTRUCTING THE POPULATION NOT TO DIVULGE ANY INFO TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL. THE INCIDENT OF THE MILOB HELIBORNE PATROL BEING DETAINED FOR 70 MINS BY THE RPA, IS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND IN A LONG TIME AND MAY BE A PRELUDE TO IMPENDING HARASSMENT OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL BY THE RPA, AS THE MISSION COMES TO A CLOSE. THE SITUATION IS BEING MONITORED CLOSELY.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINED TENSE. THE RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST, REMAIN CLOSED TO ALL COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND FOR REFUGEES ON FOOT WHO RE WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 1142. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG MET WITH THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, ON 13 NOVEMBER, AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING THE FUTURE MANDATE OF UNAMIR AS WELL AS THE HOLDING OF THE GREAT LAKES' REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT.

B. ON 14 NOVEMBER, THE SRSG WENT TO SEE THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA, MR. PIERRE- CÉLESTIN RWIGEMA, TO DISCUSS THE FORTHCOMING THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS SCHEDULED FOR 21-22 NOVEMBER. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH OTHER OFFICIALS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA TO DISCUSS ISSUES RELATED TO UNAMIR'S MANDATE.

C. AT THE END OF HER VISIT TO RWANDA, MRS. ELIZABETH LINDENMAYER, PRINCIPAL DESK OFFICER FOR RWANDA IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PEACE-KEEPING OPERATIONS, CALLED ON THE SRSG ON 14 NOVEMBER, FOR A CONCLUDING SESSION WITH HIM. FINALLY, THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING ON UNAMIR'S MANDATE TO MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS AND HEADS OF VARIOUS AGENCIES AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS.

D. THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING ON PRISONS AT THE UNDP ON 15 NOVEMBER AND REVIEWED GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE DETENTION CENTRES AS WELL AS DISCUSSED WAYS AND MEANS TO RAPIDLY EXPAND THE DETENTION CAPACITY OF THE PRISONS IN RWANDA. THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PRISONS COMMISSION, MR. CLAUDE DUSAIDI, WAS ALSO PRESENT IN THE MEETING.

E. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE MEMBERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS ASSISTANCE ADVISORY GROUP AND REVIEWED PROGRESS

F. THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN THE OPENING CEREMONY OF A POLICE SCHOOL AT GISHARI IN KIBUNGO PREFECTURE, INAUGURATED BY THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME ON 19 NOVEMBER 1995. THE SCHOOL WAS BUILT WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF IRELAND, HOLLAND, GREAT-BRITAIN, GERMANY, UGANDA AND UNAMIR.

G. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, DR. ANASTASE GASANA, STRONGLY CONDEMNED ALL THOSE WHO WOULD USE THE PROBLEM OF RWANDESE REFUGEES TO STRAIN RELATIONS WITH COUNTRIES OF THE SUB-REGION. HE SAID THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT HAD NO INTEREST IN PREVENTING RWANDESE REFUGEES FROM RETURNING TO THEIR MOTHER-LAND.

H. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE FORMER AMERICAN PRESIDENT JIMMY CARTER ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 19 NOVEMBER, ACCOMPANIED BY THE ATLANTA BASED CARTER FOUNDATION. HE WENT TO VISIT NTARAMA WHERE MANY PEOPLE LOST THEIR LIVES IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE. HE WAS SHOCKED BY WHAT HE SAW, AND SAID THAT PERPETRATORS OF THE GENOCIDE SHOULD BE BROUGHT TO JUSTICE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

### 3. MILITARY

#### A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA)-REFERENCE THE REPORTED CASE OF MASKED SOLDIERS WHO FORCED THEIR WAY INTO THE CATHOLIC COMPOUND IN TABA COMMUNE ON 12 NOV 95, MILOBS CONFIRMED THAT THE SOLDIERS WERE LOOKING FOR A SPANISH FATHER WHO WAS OUT ATTENDING A FUNCTION AT THE TIME OF THE INCIDENT. HE WAS INTERVIEWED BY MILOBS AND HE SPOKE HIS MIND ON THE INCIDENT. HE SAID HE BELIEVES THE ATTACK WAS A FOLLOW-UP FROM COMMENTS MADE ON RADIO RWANDA BY THE GITARAMA REPORTER WHO CRITICIZED HIM BY NAME AS AN INTERAHAMWE WHO HAD TO BE KILLED. THE BROADCASTING ALSO INCLUDED DEROGATORY COMMENTS AGAINST ALL SPANISH PRIESTS AS PRO-HUTU RACISTS. SEVEN FRANCISCAN SISTERS WERE BEATEN. THREE OF THEM WERE INTERVIEWED AND WERE STILL SHAKEN AND HAVE MOVED OUT OF THEIR HOUSES. ONE LOCAL WAS SHOT IN THE ARM AS HE ATTEMPTED TO YELL FOR HELP. THE RPA AUTHORITIES ARE AWARE OF THE SITUATION AND HAVE INTERVIEWED THE FATHER IN THE PRESENCE OF THE A/BOURGEMESTRE.

(2) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), AT APPROX 1000 HRS ON 15 NOV 95, RPA FIRED SEVEN RIFLE SHOTS IN GITONGO SECTOR GR 0445 OF KIRAMBO COMMUNE. REASONS FOR THE FIRING ARE NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

(3) MILOB TEAM TO NYABIKENKE GR 7292 WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT ON 09 NOV 95, FIVE PERSONS IN RPA UNIFORM, STOLE TWO RADIOS, RWF 13,000 AND OTHER HOUSEHOLD GOODS FROM THREE HOUSES IN MUGUNGA SECTOR GR 7096. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(4) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - MILOB PATROLS FROM GITAHIGHA (GR2426) REPORTED THAT ON THE 14 NOV 95 THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF INSURGENTS. ONE INSURGENT WAS REPORTEDLY KILLED. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 15/16 NOV 95 THERE WAS AGAIN ANOTHER EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND INSURGENTS AT RWAZEKUMA (GR2620). THERE WERE NO REPORTED CASUALTIES.

(5) SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) - ON 16 NOV 95 AT 1200 HRS, THE COUNCILLOR OF KARENGERA (GR1350) IN THE RWAMATAMU COMMUNE, TOLD MILOB PATROL THAT TWO PERS WERE ARRESTED ON 12 NOV 95 BY THE RPA AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE FOR ALLEGEDLY TAKING PART IN THE GENOCIDE. THEY ARE SAID TO BE IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT. JUST AFTER TALKING TO THE COUNCILLOR THREE RPA SOLDIERS ARMED WITH AK 47 RIFLES CAME RUNNING TO MEET THE PATROLS DEMANDING THEIR MISSION. THEY WERE TOLD MILOBS WERE THERE TO VISIT THE HEALTH POST. THE RPA SOLDIERS ESCORTED THE MILOBS TO THE POST AND WERE WITH THEM THROUGHOUT THEIR STAY AT THE POST. AS THE PATROLS MOVED TOWARDS THE HELI THEY MET SOMEONE WHO CLAIMED TO BE THE LOCAL RPA COMD AND SEVEN OTHERS. HE INSISTED THAT MILOBS SHOULD HAVE INFORMED HIM BEFORE THE VISIT. MILOBS EXPLAINED THAT WOULD HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE IF THEY HAD COME BY ROAD. ON ARRIVAL AT THE LANDING POINT THE PATROL MET FOUR OTHER SOLDIERS ARMED WITH 2 RPGs AND 2 AK 47 RIFLES SURROUNDING THE HELI. THE RPA COMD INSISTED THE HELI SHOULD NOT TAKE OFF AND INSTRUCTED THE SOLDIERS TO SHOOT DOWN THE HELI IF IT ATTEMPTED TO TAKE OFF. THE SOLDIERS THEN COCKED THEIR WEAPONS. THE PATROL WAITED AROUND THE HELI FOR ABOUT 45 MINS WHEN THE RPA COMD IN RWAMATAMU AND THE BOUGEMESTRE WITH FIVE OTHER ARMED SOLDIERS CAME IN. THIS MADE THE TOTAL NUMBER OF RPA SOLDIERS 20 WITH 16 OF THEM ARMED. THE COUNCILLOR WAS BROUGHT IN AND UPON QUESTIONING BY THE BOUGEMESTRE ADMITTED MILOBS ASKED HIM WHETHER ARRESTS ARE GOING ON IN THE AREA AND WHO MAKES SUCH ARRESTS AND WHETHER THOSE ARRESTED ARE BEATEN. THE PATROL DENIED THIS AND INSISTED THE COUNCILLOR SAID THOSE THINGS OUT OF FEAR. THE BOUGEMESTRE FINALLY ADVISED THAT IN FUTURE THE PATROL SHOULD HOLD A WRITTEN PERMIT FROM THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE BEFORE COMING TO THE COMMUNE. THE PATROL WAS THEN RELEASED TO DEPART AFTER ABOUT 70 MINS DETENTION.

(6) SECTOR 5C - KIBUYE. ON 18 NOV 95, A MAN IN CIVIL CLOTHING WHO CLAIMED TO BE AN RPA SOLDIER, ATTEMPTED TO ARREST A LADY INTERPRETER WORKING WITH THE MILOBS AT KIBUYE. HE WAS HOWEVER PREVENTED FROM DOING SO WHEN HE WAS CHALLENGED BY MILOBS TO PRODUCE PROOF OF HIS ID AND ORDER FOR ARREST.

(7) SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) - ON 09 NOVEMBER 1995 AT ABOUT 2300 HRS, AT RUVUNE SECTEUR (GR 188199) IN KINYAMI COMMUNE, A GROUP OF ARMED MEN IN UNIFORM ATTACKED A LOCAL AT HIS RESIDENCE INJURING HIM IN THE HEAD, HAND AND LEG WITH BULLET WOUNDS. ALL HIS BELONGINGS WERE LOOTED. LOCALS BLAME FRGF. HOWEVER, CONSIDERING RPA DEPLOYMENT SUCH ALLEGATIONS SEEM UNLIKELY. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(8) SECTOR 1A - KIGALI. MILOB TEAM PATROL IN KIGALI REPORTED THAT RPA WERE FOUND INTERROGATING AROUND 50 PEOPLE AT THEIR CAMP OPPOSITE KIGALI CENTRAL PRISON. REASON OF THE INTERROGATION NOT KNOWN. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(9) SECTOR 3B - A CABINET MINISTER NAMED JEAN MARIE WAS ALMOST ATTACKED BY THE CROWD ATTENDING THE REBURIAL CEREMONY OF THE GENOCIDE VICTIMS AT RUHASHYA (GR 7206) ON 19 NOV 95, FOR HIS ALLEGED INVOLVEMENT IN THE GENOCIDE. HE WAS IMMEDIATELY ARRESTED BY THE RPA.

(10) SECTOR 5A - MILOBS SECTOR 5A REPORTED THAT A MAN, MR. RUKARA WAS SHOT DEAD BY THE RPA ON 190100 NOV 95 AT RUKEREZA (GR 6034) WHEN HE TRIED TO RUN AWAY. MILOBS FURTHER REPORTED THAT THREE WOMEN WERE ARRESTED FOR ALLEGEDLY COLLABORATING WITH FRGF IN ATTEMPTING TO BLOW AN ELECTRICITY PYLON ON 09 NOV 95.

(11) MILOBS SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT ON 17 NOV 95 IN MABUYE SECTOR (GR 4587) SUSPECTED INTERHAMWE KILLED A LOCAL AND STOLE 11 COWS. THE TEAM ALSO REPORTED ARREST OF A FRGF CORPORAL IN BWIRA SECTOR (GR 4981) OF KIVUMU COMMUNE (GR 5573). FIVE WOMEN WERE ALSO ARRESTED FOR CONCEALING THE WEAPONS BROUGHT BY THE ABOVE INDIVIDUAL.

B. MILITIA/FRGF

(1) ON THE NIGHT OF 13/14 NOV 95, SOME FRGF PERSONNEL CROSSED OVER TO IJWI ISLAND (GR 9350) FROM GIKUYU (GR 9841) USING LOCAL BOATS. THESE MEN ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM BUTUMBARA (GR 9837). WHEN INTERCEPTED BY RPA AT GIKUYU AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE ENSUED. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED ON EITHER SIDE.

(2) SECTOR 5A(RUHENGARI) - ON THE 14 NOVEMBER 1995, AT 2100 HRS SOME FRGFs SOLDIERS STARTED FIRING ON AN RPA LOCATION AT NYABIREHE SECTOR 4629 IN MUKINGO COMMUNE. IN THE EXCHANGE OF FIRE, ONE FRFG SOLDIER WAS SHOT DEAD. RPA RECOVERED ONE ANTI- PERSONNEL MINE FROM THE DEAD SOLDIER AND TWO ANTI- PERSONNEL MINES FROM THE AREA. MILOBS FOUND THE BOURGEMESTRE AND THE LOCAL RPA COMPANY COMMANDER AT THE SCENE OF INCIDENT WHO EXPRESSED THE FEELING THAT THE FRFG SOLDIERS MUST HAVE COME FROM ZAIRE AND LATER FLED BACK. FURTHER THE LOCAL RPA COMMANDER SAID THAT THERE ARE MANY INFILTRATORS IN THE AREA WHO ARE LIKELY TO LAY MINES ANYWHERE IN THE AREA. THEY PARTICULARLY SUSPECT THE ROAD COMING FROM MUKINGO COMMUNE AND PASSING THROUGH NYABIREHI (4629) SECTOR. FOR SECURITY REASONS RPA HAVE STOPPED ALLOWING ANYONE TO USE THE ROAD FROM GR 470290 TO 420254.

(3) SECTOR 5A - RUHENGARI. MILOB TEAM PATROL TO MUKINGO COMMUNE REPORTED THAT ONE CIVILIAN STEPPED ON AN ANTI PERS MINE ( AT GR 515310 ) ON 181200B NOV 95 AND LOST ONE LEG. IT WAS THE SAME PLACE WHERE ON 08\09 NOV 95 A PYLON WAS BLOWN OFF BY FRGF.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) ON 15 NOV 95, THE FC HELD SEPARATE MEETINGS WITH THE BELGIUM AMBASSADOR AND MR IAN MARTIN (UNHRFOR). HE LATER MET THE SRSG TO DISCUSS THE FUTURE OF THE MANDATE.

(2) THE FORCE COMMANDERS CONFERENCE WHICH WAS HELD AT GIKONGORO ON 15 NOVEMBER 95, WAS ATTENDED BY UNAMIR HQs STAFF AND SECTOR COMMANDERS.

(3) ON 15 NOV 95, THE FC RECEIVED THE CANADIAN DEPUTY CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF WHO ARRIVED IN KIGALI AT 1715 HRS ON A OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA. ON 16 NOV 95, THE VISITING CANADIAN DEPUTY CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF PAID A WORKING VISIT TO GITARAMA IN SECTOR 1B. HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE STATE OF AFFAIRS IN THE SECTOR.

(4) SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) - MILOB PATROLLED CYERU COMMUNE TO CONFIRM THE ARREST OF 06 PEOPLE ALLEGED TO HAVE HELD A MEETING IN THE NIGHT. THE BOUGEMESTRE OF THE COMMUNE REFERRED MILOB TO THE IPJ WHO SAID ANY ARREST IN THE COMMUNE IS NOT UNAMIR PROBLEM. THE IPJ DENIED MILOB ASSESS TO ANY INFORMATION. LOCALS INFORMED MILOB THAT AT LEAST 10 TO 15 PERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BECAUSE THEY DID NOT ENTER RWANDA THROUGH THE OFFICIAL BORDER POST.

THE BOURGMESTRE WARNED OF STIFF PENALTY FOR ANYONE TAKING THE LAW INTO OWN HANDS.

F. MILOBS SECTOR 2A REPORTED 18 DEATHS DUE TO MENINGITIS IN GAKENKE HEALTH CENTRE (GR 463012) OF MURAMBI COMMUNE. AN AWARENESS PROGRAMME AGAINST MENINGITIS IS BEING RUN AT NYABISINDU PRIMARY SCHOOL.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL IN SECTOR 3B, CIVPOL REPORTED THAT KILLING OF LOCALS AND HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES ARE ON THE INCREASE ESPECIALLY IN RUNYINYA COMMUNE. INVESTIGATIONS ARE ON BY HR MONITORS.

THE INCIDENT OF THE MILOB HELIBORNE PATROL BEING DETAINED FOR 70 MINS BY THE RPA, IS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND IN A LONG TIME AND MAY BE A PRELUDE TO IMPENDING HARASSMENT OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL BY THE RPA, AS THE MISSION COMES TO A CLOSE. THE SITUATION IS BEING MONITORED CLOSELY.

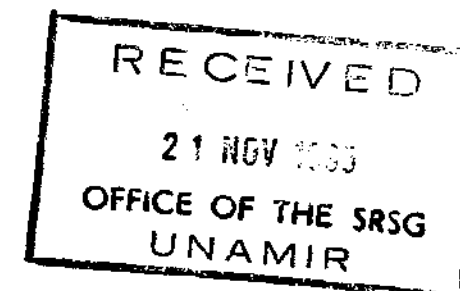

F. UNITS AND NORMED MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 36 MEDICAL AND 15 DENTAL PATIENTS.

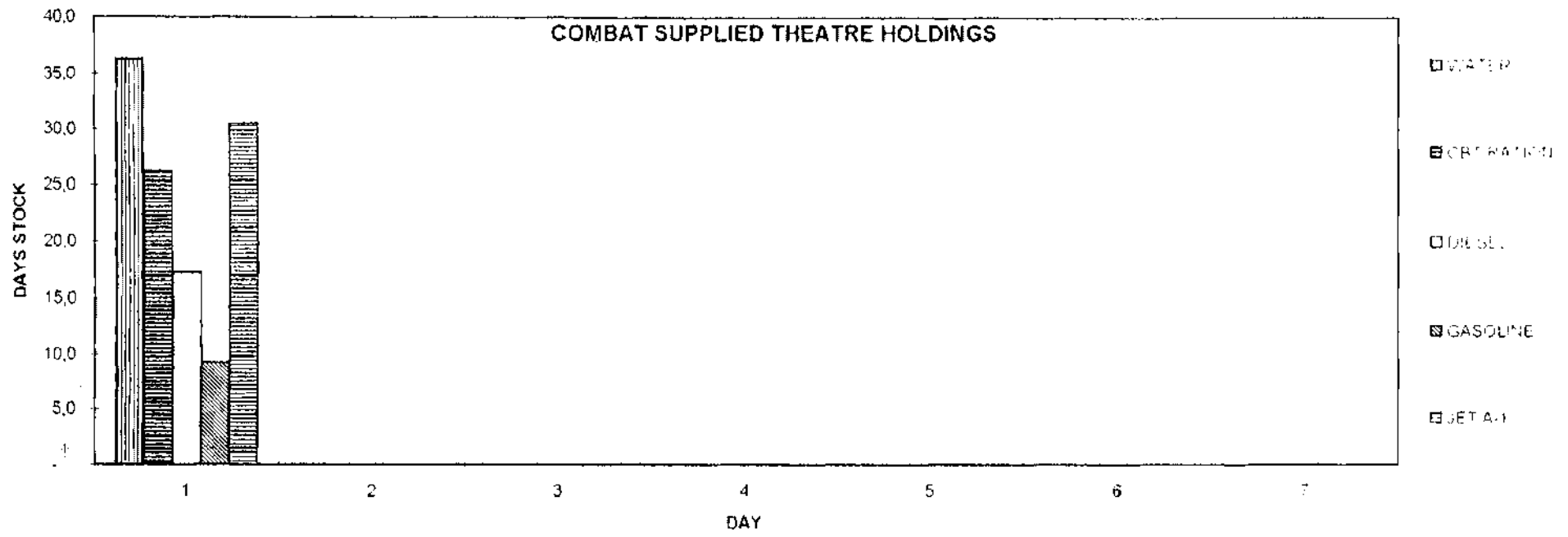

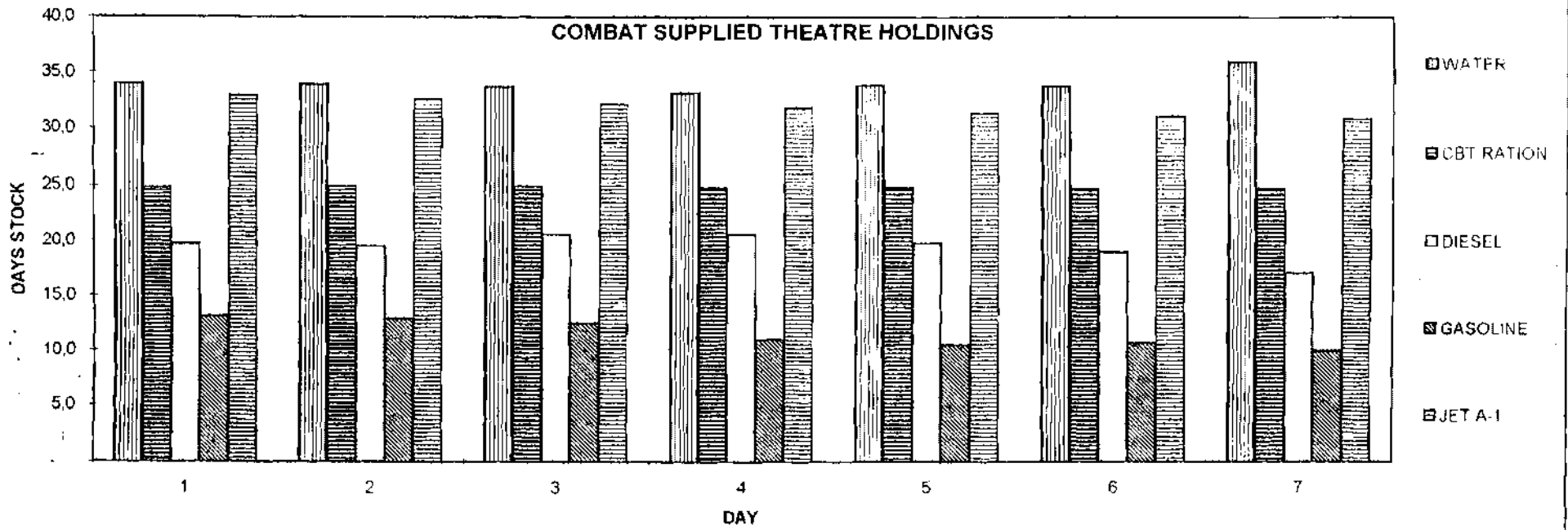

DAILY SITREP FOR 16 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 214. 212 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 02 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 25,645 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES TO BE INTIMATED LATER.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - MILOB PATROLS FROM GITAHIGHA (GR 2426) REPORTED THAT ON THE 14 NOV 95 THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF INSURGENTS. ONE INSURGENT WAS REPORTEDLY KILLED. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 15\16 NOV 95 THERE WAS AGAIN ANOTHER EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND INSURGENTS AT RWAZEKUMA (GR 2620). THERE WERE NO REPORTED CASUALTIES.

(2) SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) - ON 161200 MILOBS HELI PATROL MET THE COUNCILLOR OF KARENGERA (GR1350) IN THE RWAMATAMU COMMUNE WAS TOLD MILOB PATROL THAT TWO PERS WERE ARRESTED ON 12 NOV 95 BY THE RPA AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE FOR ALLEGEDLY TAKING PART IN THE GENOCIDE. THEY ARE SAID TO BE IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT. JUST AFTER TALKING TO THE COUNCILLOR THREE RPA SOLDIERS ARMED WITH AK 47 RIFLES CAME RUNNING TO MEET THE PATROLS DEMANDING THEIR MISSION. THEY WERE TOLD MILOBS WERE THERE TO VISIT THE HEALTH POST. THE RPA SOLDIERS ESCORTED THE MILOBS TO THE POST AND WERE WITH THEM THROUGHOUT THEIR STAY AT THE POST. AS THE PATROLS MOVED TOWARDS THE HELI THEY MET SOMEONE WHO CLAIMED TO BE THE LOCAL RPA COMD AND SEVEN OTHERS. HE INSISTED THAT MILOBS SHOULD HAVE INFORMED HIM BEFORE THE VISIT. MILOBS EXPLAINED THAT WOULD HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE IF THEY HAD COME BY ROAD. ON ARRIVAL AT THE LANDING POINT THE PATROL MET FOUR OTHER SOLDIERS ARMED WITH 2 RPGs AND 2 AK 47 RIFLES SURROUNDING THE HELI. THE RPA COMD INSISTED THE HELI SHOULD NOT TAKE OFF AND INSTRUCTED THE SOLDIERS TO SHOOT DOWN THE HELI IF IT ATTEMPTED TO TAKE

*The helicopter  
was shot*

OFF. THE SOLDIERS THEN COCKED THEIR WEAPONS. THE PATROL WAITED AROUND THE HELI FOR ABOUT 45 MINS WHEN THE RPA COMD IN RWAMATAMU AND THE BOURGEMESTRE WITH FIVE OTHER ARMED SOLDIERS CAME IN. THIS MADE THE TOTAL NUMBER OF RPA SOLDIERS 20 WITH 16 OF THEM ARMED. THE COUNCILLOR WAS BROUGHT IN AND UPON QUESTIONING BY THE BOURGEMESTRE ADMITTED MILOBS ASKED HIM WHETHER ARRESTS ARE GOING ON IN THE AREA AND WHO MAKES SUCH ARRESTS AND WHETHER THOSE ARRESTED ARE BEATEN. THE PATROL DENIED THIS AND INSISTED THE COUNCILLOR SAID THOSE THINGS OUT OF FEAR. THE BOURGEMESTRE FINALLY ADVISED THAT IN FUTURE THE PATROL SHOULD HOLD A WRITTEN PERMIT FROM THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE BEFORE COMING TO THE COMMUNE. THE PATROL WAS THEN RELEASED TO DEPART AFTER ABOUT 70 MINS DETENTION.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. THE VISITING CANADIAN DEPUTY CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF PAID A WORKING VISIT TO GITARAMA IN SECTOR 1B. HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE STATE OF AFFAIRS IN THE SECTOR.

B. SECTOR 5A (RUHENGIRI) - MILOB PATROLLED CYERU COMMUNE TO CONFIRM THE ARREST OF 06 PEOPLE ALLEGED TO HAVE HELD A MEETING IN THE NIGHT. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF THE COMMUNE REFERRED MILOB TO THE IPJ WHO SAID ANY ARREST IN THE COMMUNE IS NOT UNAMIR PROBLEM. THE IPJ DENIED MILOB ASSESS TO ANY INFORMATION. LOCALS INFORMED MILOB THAT AT LEAST 10 TO 15 PERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BECAUSE THEY DID NOT ENTER RWANDA THROUGH THE OFFICIAL BORDER POST.

C. ON 16 NOV 95, THE FORCE COMMANDER ATTENDED THE MEDAL PRESENTATION CEREMONY OF 95 CMSG, AT WHICH, THE CANADIAN DCDS, LT GEN ROY WAS CHIEF GUEST. LATER, HE ATTENDED DINNER HOSTED IN HONOUR OF THE VISITING DIGNITARY.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 19 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM KIBUNGO. 24 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI VILLAGE AND KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 161 ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED 18 TONNES OF SAND FOR ARDEC WITHIN RUNDA COMMUNE FOR CONSTRUCTION OF HOUSES.

C. MALICOY PROVIDED ESCORTS FOR WATER AND FUEL TANKERS FROM GIKONGORO TO CYANGUGU. THEY ALSO PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING SOLDIERS FROM GIKONGORO TO KIVU AND NSHILI, AND A TRUCK TO TROCAIRE TO TRANSPORT BRICKS.

D. MALAWICOY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO RPA FOR FOOD DISTRIBUTION

AROUND KAGANO AREA.

E. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED VEH ASSISTANCE TO RWANDATEL. ALSO PROVIDED A PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM TO 95 CMSG FOR THEIR MEDAL DAY PARADE.

F. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO SECTOR 1B FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD STOCK FROM KIGALI TO RUHANGO IN TAMBUKE COMMUNE. FORCE ENGR COY ALSO DEPLOYED A DOZER FOR A REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI AND PROVIDED TWO DUMPERS FOR TRANSPORTING EARTH FOR NAKAMERA TRANSIT CAMP IN GISENYI.

K. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG REPAIRED A REEFER IN GIKONGORO FOR MALICOY.

L. UNITS AND NORMED MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 227 MEDICAL AND 11 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. NSTR.

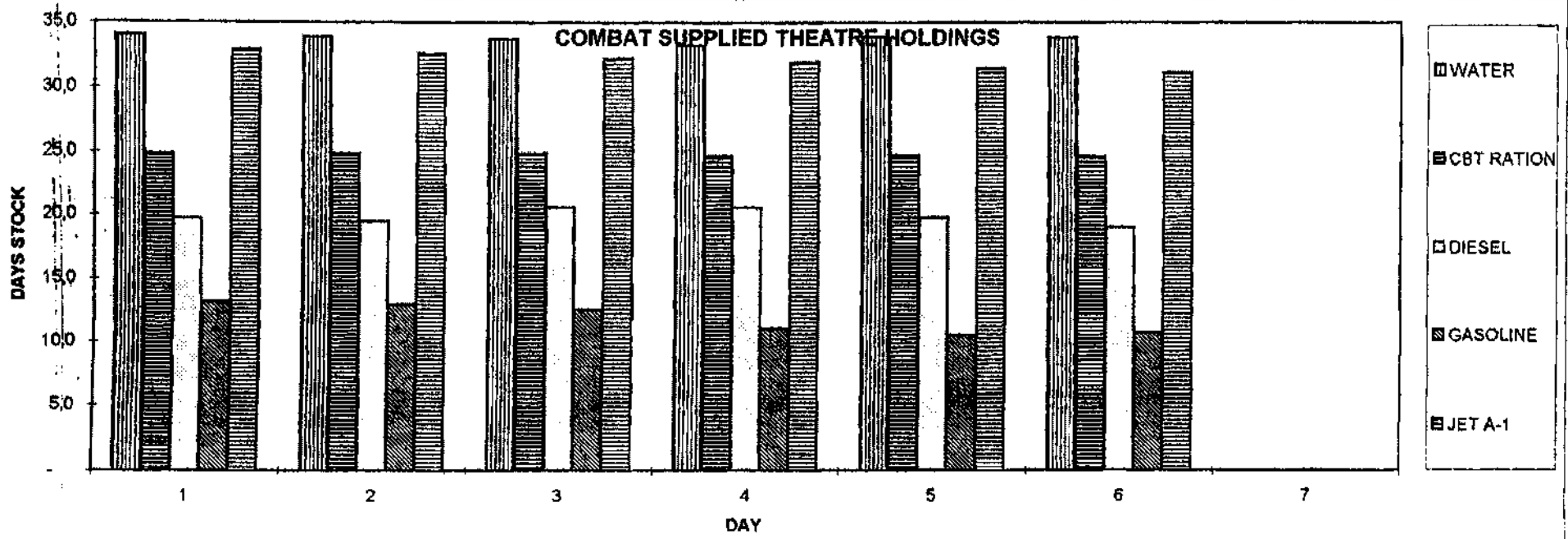

DAILY SITREP FOR 16 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 214. 212 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 02 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 25,645 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES TO BE INTIMATED LATER.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - MILOB PATROLS FROM GITAHIGHA (GR 2426) REPORTED THAT ON THE 14 NOV 95 THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF INSURGENTS. ONE INSURGENT WAS REPORTEDLY KILLED. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 15\16 NOV 95 THERE WAS AGAIN ANOTHER EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE RPA AND INSURGENTS AT RWAZEKUMA (GR 2620). THERE WERE NO REPORTED CASUALTIES.

(2) SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) - ON 161200 MILOBS HELI PATROL MET THE COUNCILLOR OF KARENGERA (GR1350) IN THE RWAMATAMU COMMUNE WAS TOLD MILOB PATROL THAT TWO PERS WERE ARRESTED ON 12 NOV 95 BY THE RPA AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE FOR ALLEGEDLY TAKING PART IN THE GENOCIDE. THEY ARE SAID TO BE IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT. JUST AFTER TALKING TO THE COUNCILLOR THREE RPA SOLDIERS ARMED WITH AK 47 RIFLES CAME RUNNING TO MEET THE PATROLS DEMANDING THEIR MISSION. THEY WERE TOLD MILOBS WERE THERE TO VISIT THE HEALTH POST. THE RPA SOLDIERS ESCORTED THE MILOBS TO THE POST AND WERE WITH THEM THROUGHOUT THEIR STAY AT THE POST. AS THE PATROLS MOVED TOWARDS THE HELI THEY MET SOMEONE WHO CLAIMED TO BE THE LOCAL RPA COMD AND SEVEN OTHERS. HE INSISTED THAT MILOBS SHOULD HAVE INFORMED HIM BEFORE THE VISIT. MILOBS EXPLAINED THAT WOULD HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE IF THEY HAD COME BY ROAD. ON ARRIVAL AT THE LANDING POINT THE PATROL MET FOUR OTHER SOLDIERS ARMED WITH 2 RPGs AND 2 AK 47 RIFLES SURROUNDING THE HELI. THE RPA COMD INSISTED THE HELI SHOULD NOT TAKE OFF AND INSTRUCTED THE SOLDIERS TO SHOOT DOWN THE HELI IF IT ATTEMPTED TO TAKE

OFF. THE SOLDIERS THEN COCKED THEIR WEAPONS. THE PATROL WAITED AROUND THE HELI FOR ABOUT 45 MINS WHEN THE RPA COMD IN RWAMATAMU AND THE BOURGEMESTRE WITH FIVE OTHER ARMED SOLDIERS CAME IN. THIS MADE THE TOTAL NUMBER OF RPA SOLDIERS 20 WITH 16 OF THEM ARMED. THE COUNCILLOR WAS BROUGHT IN AND UPON QUESTIONING BY THE BOURGEMESTRE ADMITTED MILOBS ASKED HIM WHETHER ARRESTS ARE GOING ON IN THE AREA AND WHO MAKES SUCH ARRESTS AND WHETHER THOSE ARRESTED ARE BEATEN. THE PATROL DENIED THIS AND INSISTED THE COUNCILLOR SAID THOSE THINGS OUT OF FEAR. THE BOURGEMESTRE FINALLY ADVISED THAT IN FUTURE THE PATROL SHOULD HOLD A WRITTEN PERMIT FROM THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE BEFORE COMING TO THE COMMUNE. THE PATROL WAS THEN RELEASED TO DEPART AFTER ABOUT 70 MINS DETENTION.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. THE VISITING CANADIAN DEPUTY CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF PAID A WORKING VISIT TO GITARAMA IN SECTOR 1B. HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE STATE OF AFFAIRS IN THE SECTOR.

B. SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) - MILOB PATROLLED CYERU COMMUNE TO CONFIRM THE ARREST OF 06 PEOPLE ALLEGED TO HAVE HELD A MEETING IN THE NIGHT. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF THE COMMUNE REFERRED MILOB TO THE IPJ WHO SAID ANY ARREST IN THE COMMUNE IS NOT UNAMIR PROBLEM. THE IPJ DENIED MILOB ASSESS TO ANY INFORMATION. LOCALS INFORMED MILOB THAT AT LEAST 10 TO 15 PERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BECAUSE THEY DID NOT ENTER RWANDA THROUGH THE OFFICIAL BORDER POST.

C. ON 16 NOV 95, THE FORCE COMMANDER ATTENDED THE MEDAL PRESENTATION CEREMONY OF 95 CMSG, AT WHICH, THE CANADIAN DCDS, LT GEN ROY WAS CHIEF GUEST. LATER, HE ATTENDED DINNER HOSTED IN HONOUR OF THE VISITING DIGNITARY.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 19 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM KIBUNGO. 24 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI VILLAGE AND KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 161 ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED 18 TONNES OF SAND FOR ARDEC WITHIN RUNDA COMMUNE FOR CONSTRUCTION OF HOUSES.

C. MALICOY PROVIDED ESCORTS FOR WATER AND FUEL TANKERS FROM GIKONGORO TO CYANGUGU. THEY ALSO PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING SOLDIERS FROM GIKONGORO TO KIVU AND NSHILI, AND A TRUCK TO TROCAIRE TO TRANSPORT BRICKS.

D. MALAWICOY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO RPA FOR FOOD DISTRIBUTION



AROUND KAGANO AREA.

E. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED VEH ASSISTANCE TO RWANDATEL. ALSO PROVIDED A PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM TO 95 CMSG FOR THEIR MEDAL DAY PARADE.

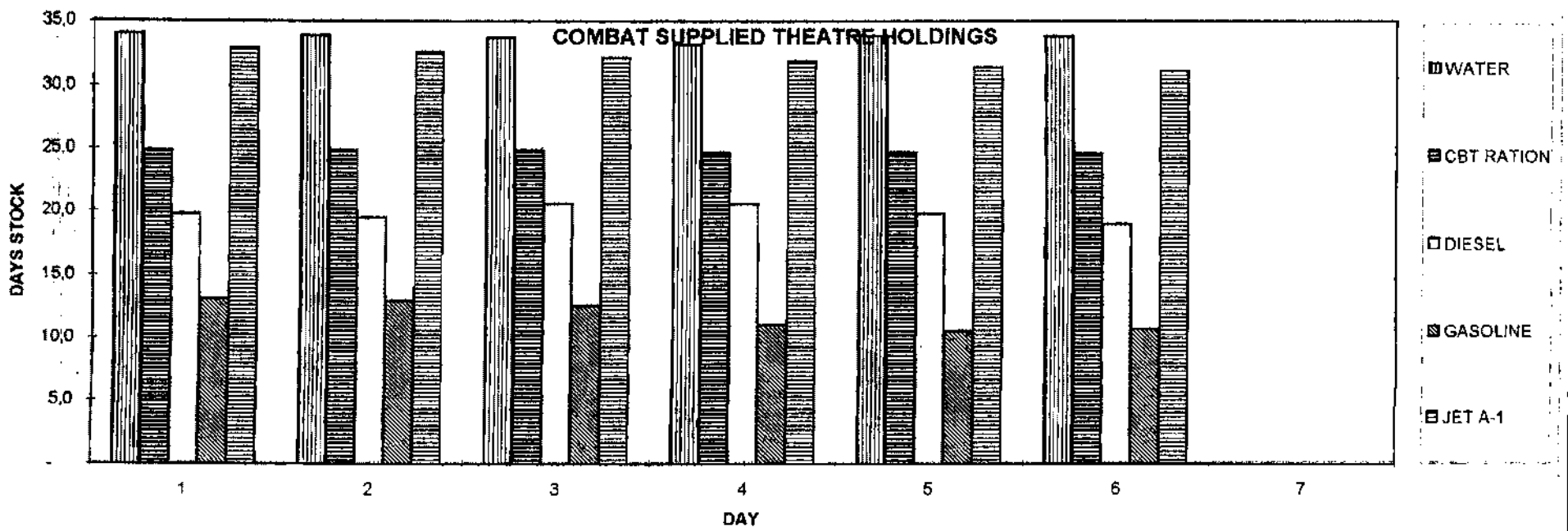



DAILY SITREP FOR 15 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 330. THEY ALL CAME FROM ZAIRE, AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 25,431 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING ON PRISONS AT THE UNDP AND REVIEWED GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE DETENTION CENTRES AS WELL AS DISCUSSED WAYS AND MEANS TO RAPIDLY EXPAND THE DETENTION CAPACITY OF THE PRISONS IN RWANDA. THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PRISONS COMMISSION, MR CLAUDE DUSAIDI WAS ALSO PRESENT AT THE MEETING.

B. LATER THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE MEMBERS OF THE UNITED NATIONS ADVISORY GROUP AND REVIEWED PROGRESS ACHIEVED IN CONNECTION WITH TASKS ACCOMPLISHED BY UNAAG AND FUTURE REQUESTS TO BE CONSIDERED IN THIS REGARD.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT RWANDESE CITIZENS BASED IN GOMA, ZAIRE AND RWANDAN REFUGEES WHO WERE RETURNING HOME WERE SERIOUSLY BEATEN, SOME IMPRISONED, WHILE OTHERS HAD THEIR PROPERTY LOOTED BY ZAIRIANS.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), AT APPROX 1000 HRS ON 15 NOV 95, RPA FIRED SEVEN RIFLE SHOTS IN GITONGO SECTOR GR 0445 OF KIRAMBO COMMUNE. REASONS FOR THE FIRING ARE NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

(2) MILOB TEAM TO NYABIKENKE GR 7292 WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT ON 09 NOV 95, FIVE PERSONS IN RPA UNIFORM, STOLE TWO RADIOS, RWF 13,000 AND OTHER HOUSEHOLD GOODS FROM THREE HOUSES IN MUGUNGA SECTOR GR 7096. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY SECTOR 5A (RUHENGIERI) - ON THE 14 NOVEMBER 1995, AT 2100 HRS SOME FRGFs SOLDIERS STARTED FIRING

ON AN RPA LOCATION AT NYABIREHE SECTOR 4629 IN MUKINGO COMMUNE. IN THE EXCHANGE OF FIRE, ONE FRFG SOLDIER WAS SHOT DEAD. RPA RECOVERED ONE ANTI- PERSONNEL MINE FROM THE DEAD SOLDIER AND TWO ANTI- PERSONNEL MINES FROM THE AREA. MILOBS FOUND THE BOURGEMESTRE AND THE LOCAL RPA COMPANY COMMANDER AT THE SCENE OF INCIDENT WHO EXPRESSED THE FEELING THAT THE FRFG SOLDIERS MUST HAVE COME FROM ZAIRE AND LATER FLED BACK. FURTHER THE LOCAL RPA COMMANDER SAID THAT THERE ARE MANY INFILTRATORS IN THE AREA WHO ARE LIKELY TO LAY MINES ANYWHERE IN THE AREA. THEY PARTICULARLY SUSPECT THE ROAD COMING FROM MUKINGO COMMUNE AND PASSING THROUGH NYABIREHI (4629) SECTOR. FOR SECURITY REASONS RPA HAVE STOPPED ALLOWING ANYONE TO USE THE ROAD FROM GR 470290 TO 420254.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. THE FORCE COMMANDERS CONFERENCE WHICH WAS HELD AT GIKONGORO ON 15 NOVEMBER 95, WAS ATTENDED BY UNAMIR HQs STAFF AND SECTOR COMMANDERS.

B. ON 15 NOV 95, THE FC RECEIVED THE CANADIAN DEPUTY CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF ARRIVED IN KIGALI AT 1715 HRS ON A OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 111 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND GISENYI. 38 WERE DESPATCHED TO KIBUNGO, BUTARE, KIGALI VILLAGE AND KIGALI RURAL. 166 ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED 15 TONNES OF RATION FOR RPA FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE AND 20 TONNES OF SEEDS FROM BUGARAMA TO KIGALI FOR THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE.

C. FORCE SIG COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO ARDEC TO TRANSPORT WOOD FROM RUGALIKA TO NYAMAHURU AND RUNDA.

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED 2 DUMPERS FOR TRANSPORTING EARTH FOR NAKAMERA TRANSIT CAMP IN GESENYI.

E. NORMED AND UNITS MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 183 MEDICAL AND 04 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

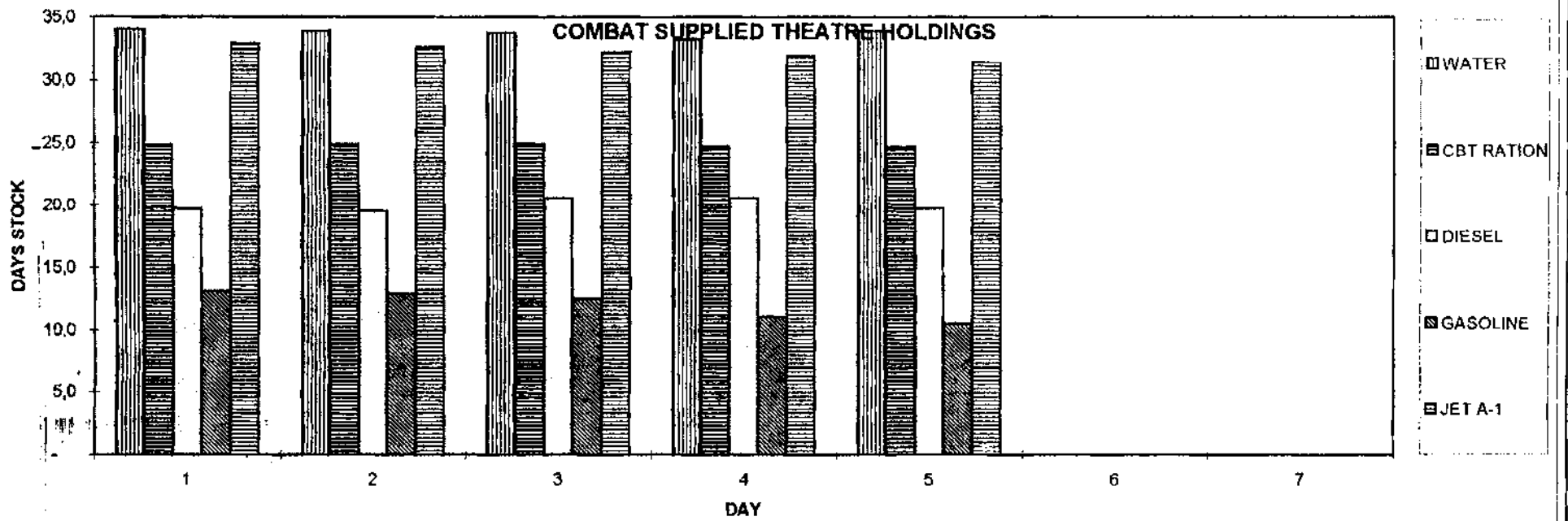

DAILY SITREP FOR 15 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 330. THEY ALL CAME FROM ZAIRE, AND OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 25,431 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED A MEETING ON PRISONS AT THE UNDP AND REVIEWED GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE DETENTION CENTRES AS WELL AS DISCUSSED WAYS AND MEANS TO RAPIDLY EXPAND THE DETENTION CAPACITY OF THE PRISONS IN RWANDA. THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PRISONS COMMISSION, MR CLAUDE DUSAIDI WAS ALSO PRESENT AT THE MEETING.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) - ON THE 14 NOVEMBER 1995, AT 2100 HRS SOME FRGFs SOLDIERS STARTED FIRING

ON AN RPA LOCATION AT NYABIREHE SECTOR 4629 IN MUKINGO COMMUNE. IN THE EXCHANGE OF FIRE, ONE FRFG SOLDIER WAS SHOT DEAD. RPA RECOVERED ONE ANTI- PERSONNEL MINE FROM THE DEAD SOLDIER AND TWO ANTI- PERSONNEL MINES FROM THE AREA. MILOBS FOUND THE BOURGEMESTRE AND THE LOCAL RPA COMPANY COMMANDER AT THE SCENE OF INCIDENT WHO EXPRESSED THE FEELING THAT THE FRFG SOLDIERS MUST HAVE COME FROM ZAIRE AND LATER FLED BACK. FURTHER THE LOCAL RPA COMMANDER SAID THAT THERE ARE MANY INFILTRATORS IN THE AREA WHO ARE LIKELY TO LAY MINES ANYWHERE IN THE AREA. THEY PARTICULARLY SUSPECT THE ROAD COMING FROM MUKINGO COMMUNE AND PASSING THROUGH NYABIREHI (4629) SECTOR. FOR SECURITY REASONS RPA HAVE STOPPED ALLOWING ANYONE TO USE THE ROAD FROM GR 470290 TO 420254.

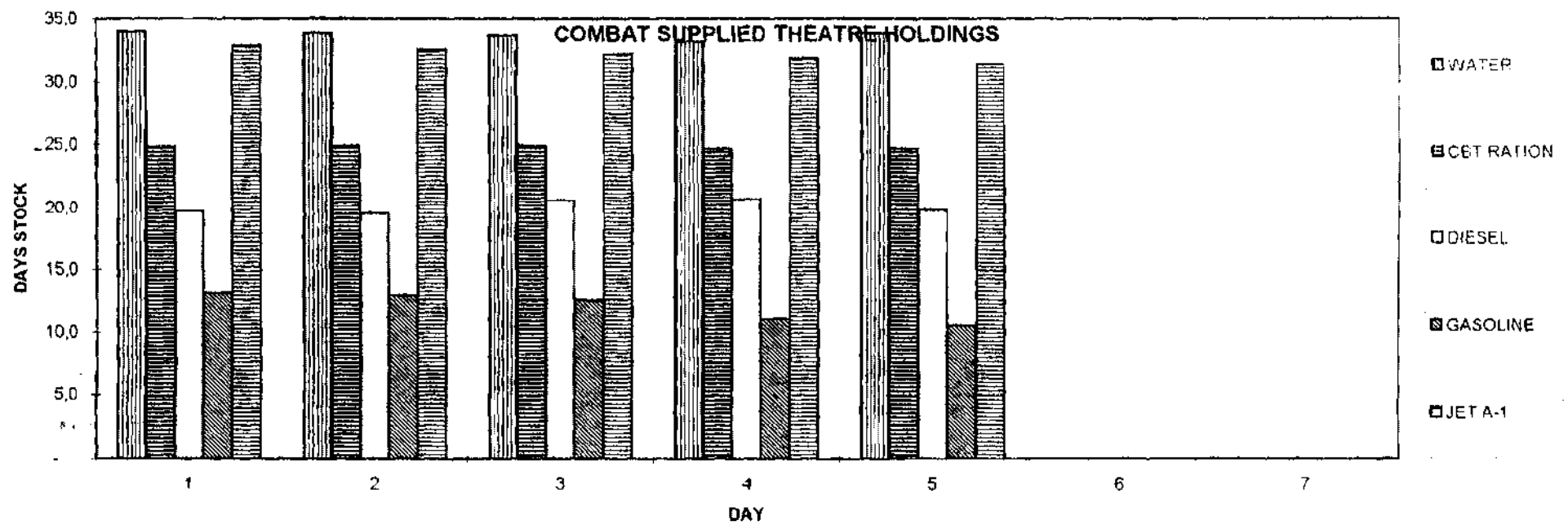
