SUBJECT : Jewish Infiltrates  
TO : Colonel Roffe  
FROM : Pearl Morris

1. Mr. Dodge, UNRRA District No. 5 Office, Munich, and Mr. Catlin, UNRRA Hdq. U. S. Zone, have both reported today on the arrival of additional Jewish Infiltrates ~~from Salzburg~~.

2. ~~160 children~~ arrived this morning from Salzburg, and are now in the Funk Infiltrate Centre. *100 of which are children*

3. Miss Leggion at the Funk Infiltrate Centre has been advised by the Central Jewish Committee that 200 adults are expected this afternoon - also from Salzburg.

4. Funk Infiltrate Centre has a capacity of 500 and the present population, exclusive of the 200 expected, is 492 as reported by Mr. Catlin. (Mr. Dodge has given a figure of 442.) If and when the additional 200 arrive the over-population will be 192. When the 100 children are moved to Aschau this figure will be reduced to 92 and for a temporary period the permanent D. P. Camp at Funk Kaserne can look after these people.

5. In respect of Transient Camps receiving Infiltrates, Mr. Catlin has enquired whether, in the event of a camp being able to accommodate Infiltrates who have arrived without authorization the Infiltrates are denied admittance, as in the case of Ainring (150 arrived from Salzburg at Ainring and then proceeded to Funk Infiltrate Centre when Ainring refused to take them), this procedure would not encourage unauthorized moves. Mr. Catlin understands that Displaced Persons are not to be given authorization to travel from Salzburg to Bavaria but feels that when a camp which has space for them denies them admittance they will travel in any case and present themselves at one or another D.P. Centre.

If people arrive without clearance, we can't keep them out of transient centers. However, Ainring seems to in the past to have had no problem from Salzburg, but has said it would send them. Maybe this has changed.

SUBJECT: Move of Yugoslavs to Danube Camp, Passau

1. Mr. Catlin advises that 80 Yugoslavs arrived from Landsberg at the Danube Camp on Saturday without prior notice.
2. I checked with Col. Dupree's office, and Lt. Wise advised me that the group from Gieblestadt are leaving now to go to the Danube Camp at Passau, and the balance of 663 Yugoslavs will be following very shortly.
3. Lt. Wise further stated that the procedure of screening these people has been altered somewhat. What will now happen is that the Yugoslav Liaison Officers will go to the Danube Camp and interview these people there instead of at the points of departure. I am advising Mr. Catlin of this.

SUBJECT: Move of 100 Jewish Infiltrate Children  
(Kibbutz Group) from Funk Kaserne to  
Aschau.

TO : Colonel Roffe

1. Mr. Dodge, UNRRA District No. <sup>5</sup>2 Office, Munich, advises that there are one hundred children, part of a group of 150 persons who arrived without authorization from Salzburg, ready to be moved to the Camp at Aschau.

2. Aschau has a population of 383 persons and a capacity of 550 and can, therefore, accommodate this group. 43 of the population have recently come on their own from Austria having had no authorization to travel.

3. The 150 persons, of which group the 100 Kibbutz children form a part, arrived in the Funk Kaserne today having travelled from Salzburg to Ainring where admittance to the UNRRA Camp was denied them. Mr. Dodge expects to receive more information about these people but thus far has only had a very disconnected story given him by a member of the Central Committee.

4. UNRRA and <sup>38th AAA</sup>~~British Division~~ concur in the proposed move of the 100 children from Funk Kaserne to Aschau.

5. If approval is given for this move to take place <sup>Infiltrate Centre</sup> may this office be informed so that our District Office and Camps may be informed.

# PROPOSED MOVE FROM SONTHOFFEN TO MURNAU

Move as proposed by Mr. Zismann (1 Feb. 46)

Group 1 Feb. 2nd	30 persons including UNRRA personnel and DP Camp workers, policemen, messing stewards, billeting officers - to travel by UNRRA transport.

Mr. Zisman proposes to use two buses which will accommodate twenty-five persons each for the aged or infirm. The buses he says belong to a German outfit but he has arranged for their use. He also proposed to use five ambulances for 119 children under four years of age.

They also have at the camp 5 Diesel trucks which they wish to use for moving equipment and supplies but will require Diesel Oil which G-4 xx Corps says is available.

Mr. Zismann has arranged for a coffee stop about half way along the trip - at Fussen.

300 beds will be required to take care of the first group arriving. If nothing better can be arranged these can be procured at Augsburg but will have to be replaced. The beds left behind at Sonthofen can be moved as each group leaves.

Mr. Zismann reports that the only way in which to keep the camp at Murnau heated will be to follow the arrangement presently existing. As a RAMP Camp the place was supplied with three tons of coal per day. Mr. Zismann would like this continued for 30 days. Cooking facilities will not exist otherwise.





1. Sonthofen. Re our memo of January 17th

(a) Major Martin states you can now have the Arty Kaserne at Murnau to move 1277 Poles. This place has a capacity of 2000.

(b) Klein Kotz has a capacity of 1500; there are 979 in there at present, so 495 can be taken there.

(c) All other moves indicated in memo of January 17th can be made.

(d) In addition, the 3 hotels will have to be vacated of the DP's. Mr. Wielecynsky is aware of this and inferred that he knew of accommodation in the vicinity that would take care of the 300 DP's involved in this move.

(e) Major Martin is finding out from Colonel McGiffert, Industry Branch, M. G., whether or not we can have the Immenstadt factory which does have a capacity of 2500. He doubts very much whether this will be possible.

2. Wolfratshausen. The 784 excess population will be moved to Pocking on or about the 28th of January. This date will be confirmed. We are advised that on 26th of January capacity of Pocking will be 1500. There are 517 DP's in that camp at present.

3. Funk Kaserne. 300 Infiltrates in there at present will be moved to Leipheim. Leipheim as of 21st January has a capacity of 3800.

Information has just come to this office from Major Scanlon, Troop Movements, that as of today population at Funk Kaserne is reported through 38th AAA to be 350 persons. Arrangements are, therefore, being made to move 350 persons from Funk Kaserne to Leipheim, by truck, on Wednesday, January 23rd at 10 a.m.

4. Feldafing. The 50 patients from the hospital will be shipped to whatever camp Mr. Zisman determines. They are permanent DP's and therefore are not to be sent to Leipheim. We suggested Siedlung but Mr. Zisman did not approve. Please advise us immediately where these DP's should be moved to.



5. Danube Camp. Conveyed to Major Martin information re necessity for fixing the heating apparatus and that when this is done the camp will be used to its full capacity of 1500. Major Martin has agreed not to put in ex-enemy Hungarians with DP's. Danube Camp will not be taken over, therefore.

6. Aschau - 600 capacity and Messerschmidt Factory near Augsburg - capacity 1000. Aschau - You advised that it would be o.k. to set up this place as Infiltrate Camp. Messerschmidt Factory - You advised that final plans for this camp would be given us on Wednesday; these being worked out with 71st Division.

Please let us know definitely about these two places by Wednesday so that we can give the go-ahead to Major Martin, G-3.

7. Hammerau. Assembly Centre 95-349, Team 78 Laufen

(a) G-3 wishes to use this place as a reception centre for incoming German refugees.

(b) Colonel Roffe does not wish to move the 596 DP's from Hammerau as you suggested, to the following:-

200 to Grasenachau  
100 to Muhldorf  
100 to Berchtesgaden

The XX Corps does not approve of this move either.

(c) G-3 proposed that these DP's be moved to Kriegs Lazarett at Traunstein. However, Mr. Zisman said that he was keeping the Kriegs Lazarett as a centre in which to consolidate small camps in the Traunstein Kreis. He had got that Lazarett on that basis. He stated he would check with his Field Supervisor, Mr. Cagle, on Monday, January 21st, and let us know whether this move from Hammerau to Traunstein would be satisfactory. Will you please follow through and let us know immediately, AS THIS MOVE IS SCHEDULED TO TAKE PLACE ABOUT THE 24th.

8. Rosenheim Team 188, (A.C. 95-275) Capacity 2500.

(a) Rosenheim has been selected as an outshipment point for ex-enemy PW's and DP's from Third Army Zone.

(b) Army would like, therefore, to move the 237 Poles in this Assembly Centre to Chieming Camp, Team 159, (A.C. 95-348) in which camp there are now 115 Yugoslavs. The capacity of Chieming is 400. Col. Roffe is aware of the fact that nationalities should be kept separate as much as possible and will keep this in mind when the smaller camps are consolidated into larger camps. However, this particular centre is needed immediately for the above purpose and therefore approval for this move has been requested.

(c) However, Major Martin is agreeable to moving these 237 Poles to any place Mr. Zisman may suggest. This move has to be taken care of immediately and therefore your prompt advice is awaited.

Col. Strickler, G-3, Third Army Hqts. said move doesn't have to be completed before 14 February; Army will move in on 15 February. Col. Roffe had Capt. Murray and Polish L.O. (Captain Murray from D.P. Team, Munich) to see him; they objected to move. Col. Roffe told them to see Mr. Zisman and get his recommendation. Mr. Zisman was in your (Todd Catlin's) office and said he did not approve move. Said he had only rec'd notice yesterday when at meeting with Corps. G-3 of XX Corps had never checked with G-5 of Corps. Zisman had recommended that ~~XXXX~~ UNRRA take Burg installation (Burg Schule) ~~but~~ which has capacity of 6,000 and which would permit consolidation of number of smaller installation, but was informed that Army was going to use Burg too for 1500 students. (Burg Schule is at Sonthofen). Zisman still going to work on submitting alternative arrangements with XX Corps as he does not approve this move. Told Major Martin.

2. Danube Camp - AC-93-359 - Team 143 - Passau

\* This camp has only 183 Baltics and camp has capacity for 1500. A.C. 93-365, Stamaried, 170 population, is being abandoned as D.P. Camp. These DPs will be absorbed with other D.P.s in the other Assembly Centers at Cham. Miss McDonald will let you know when move will take place. Please advise Becky Taft and Team re this:

6. Feldafing

Mr. Atkins and Major Hyatt (L.O. between XX Corps and Mr. Atkins) were in to see Col. Roffe. Mr. Atkins said things were going fine at Feldafing Camp. That new Committee members had been elected and that their official appointment would take place this Saturday. He said Gen. White of XX Corps would be present and wondered if Gen. T. could be there, or Col. Roffe. Col. Roffe said he would not be able to come and advised that we go in to see Gen. Carlton if Gen. T. could come. Gen. Carlton said Gen. T. would be away then but that he would see that someone did attend Sat. at 8 p.m. Also called the P.R.O. and asked them to have someone present from their office so that a favorable report could be made.

Mr. Atkins said he was requisitioning three more houses which would take care of population. Said that although capacity was 3700 and pop. 3700, in actuality the cap. figure of 3700 was not accurate but when he got the 3 other houses the capacity would still be 3700. Said he was not taking in any infiltrates, only in exceptional cases where husband was coming to join wife, etc. Said expected quite a few babies there soon. Said Mrs. Esenberg had miscalculated, they did not wish to move any excess population from Feldafing - that it was only a matter of getting these three more houses, reshifting DPs and all would be well. The only ones to be moved from Feldafing would be the 50 patients from Hospital, woo, Major Martin said are moving to Leipheim.

You say Leipheim is full, capacity only 2400; Zisman says same thing. However, Major Martin says capacity is up to 2700 now. Please advise if this is definite, so that contemplated moves there can be cancelled for time being, until capacity increased, which you say won't be for two weeks yet.

1. Mr. Dodge called to say that a new requisition is being submitted on Kohlgrube (there are three places included in requisition).
2. Of the original group intended for Oberammergau, 210 are at Oberammergau cleaning the place up. The balance, with the permission of the military, remained in Kohlgrube and will go to Oberammergau in due course.
3. The 140 persons from Immenstadt Infirmary, (Balance of Gonthofen to Murnau move), were moved by Mr. Wilicynski and are at Kohlgrube. Mr. Dodge says he moved them with UNRRA transportation and the military agreed to allow this additional group into Kohlgrube. The Army also agrees that UNRRA may have Kohlgrube, so there should be no difficulty about the requisition. Immenstadt is now empty.
4. When the persons who are to go to Oberammergau eventually move to that camp, Kohlgrube will have in it only 140 persons. Mr. Dodge does not know the capacity of Kohlgrube, but there will be space available there to take additional L P's. The requisition will show what the total capacity of the three places is.

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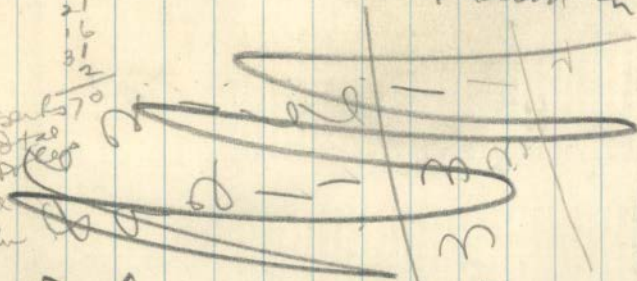
