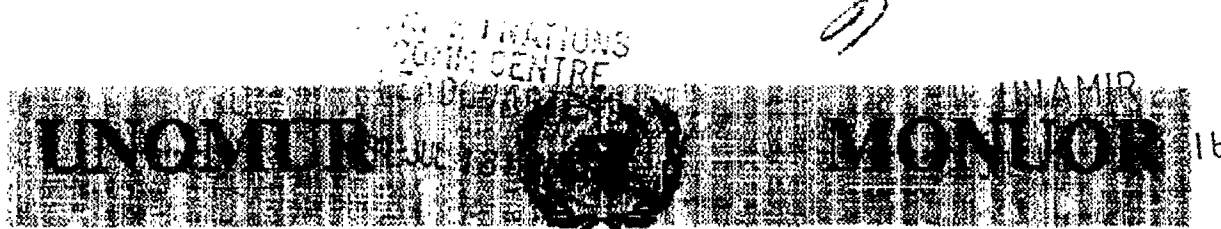

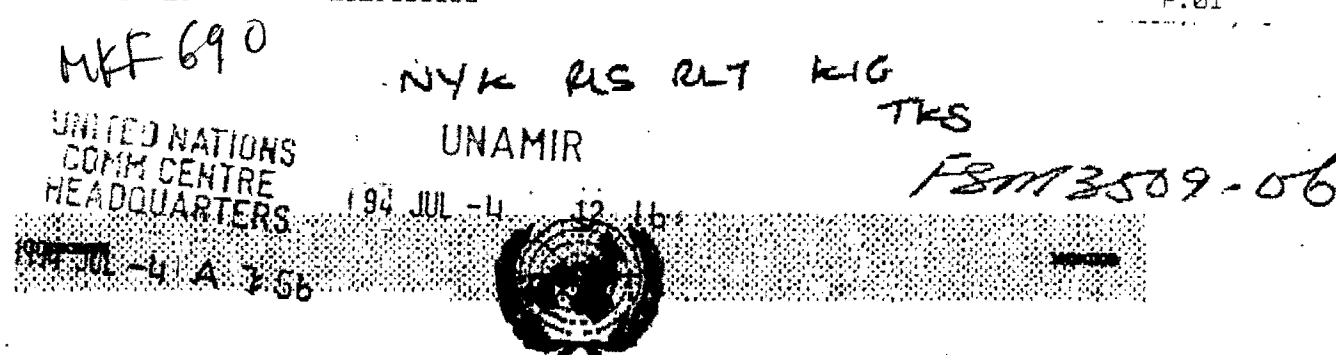

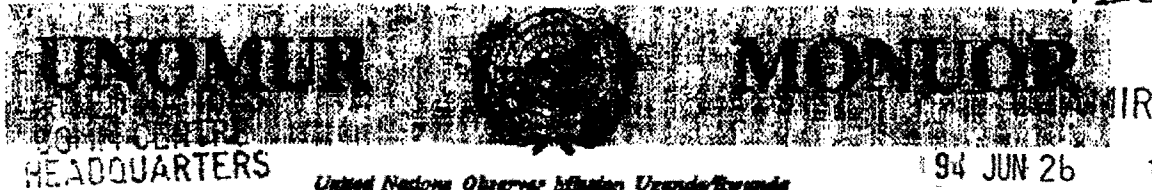

D'où viennent les armes au Rwanda ?

Responsables de l'ONU semblent incapables de mettre fin aux trafics qui rendent possibles les massacres

En marge du sommet de l'Organisation de l'unité africaine (OUA), mardi 14 juin à Tunis, les rebelles du Front patriotique rwandais (FPR) et les forces gouvernementales, le cessez-le-feu a été rompu vendredi 17 juin. Le FPR a lancé une offensive au centre de Kigali, prenant l'église de la cathédrale, qui abritait des réfugiés.

ONIS UNIES. Le secrétaire général de l'ONU, Boutros Boutros-Ghali, a favorablement accueilli la proposition de Paris de déployer des troupes au Rwanda, faisant entendre que l'ONU pourrait être placée sous un commandement français.

Le Quai d'Orsay et le ministère de la coopération ont communiqué des informations du président du conseil de sécurité de l'ONU du président de la commission militaire française (4).

« A ma connaissance, aucune arme n'est passée d'Ouganda au Rwanda depuis la mise en place de la mission d'observation des Nations unies en Ouganda en août 1993 », déclare le colonel Asrar, officier bangladais, responsable militaire de la MONUOR (Mission d'observation des Nations unies en Ouganda et au Rwanda). Il ajoute : « Nous avons des postes de contrôle sur toutes les voies d'accès au Rwanda et nos patrouilles à pied y établissent aussi des barrages itinérants. De plus, les opérations au sol sont appuyées par une surveillance aérienne par hélicoptères. »

Quatre-vingts observateurs pour surveiller 170 kilomètres d'une frontière qui traverse collines, bois et marécages, est-ce suffisant ? En privé, les officiels de l'ONU reconnaissent vite qu'avec un contingent aussi réduit, même bien équipé, le dispositif ne peut pas être hermétique. En outre, les observateurs de l'ONU se heurtent de temps à autre à des contretemps qui les laissent perplexes. Par exemple, le fait qu'il leur arrive de patienter plusieurs jours avant d'obtenir l'aval des forces ougandaises, l'Ar-

mée de résistance nationale (ARN), pour inspecter une nouvelle zone ; ce que le colonel Asrar appelle joliment « délais de procédure ».

Ainsi, en 1993, les hommes de la MONUOR ont dû attendre pendant deux semaines avant de pouvoir contrôler les environs du poste frontière de Kakitumba par où passerait, dit une rumeur jamais vérifiée, tout l'approvisionnement du Front patriotique rwandais et aucun convoi humanitaire n'a pu emprunter avant le 16 juin cette route asphaltée qui descend de Kakitumba, bien qu'il s'agisse de la voie la plus directe pour acheminer des secours en zone FPR. Autant de questions qui restent sans réponse et donnent l'impression que ni le FPR ni les autorités ougandaises ne jouent la transparence.

Certes, le président Museveni explique à qui veut l'entendre que, dans la région, il n'est pas difficile de convoier des armes clandestinement. Son propre exemple, qu'il ne manque pas de citer, est éloquent : lorsqu'il était chef d'une petite rébellion au centre de l'Ouganda, au début des années 80, ces hommes sont allés récupérer des armes libyennes au Centre culturel islamique de Bujumbura, qu'ils ont ramenées par camion à travers le Rwanda et l'Ouganda de Milton Obote, présentant à chaque contrôle de faux certificats mentionnant une cargaison de thé burundais.

Réseaux clandestins

Pour les diplomates en poste à Kampala, il est évident que l'armée ougandaise pourrait cadenasser la frontière « avec vingt hommes au kilomètre », s'il y avait une volonté politique. L'Ouganda paraît, en effet, la seule voie d'approvisionnement des rebelles, le nerf de la guerre pour le FPR, celui par lequel il peut détourner aisément l'embargo décrété par le Conseil de sécurité des Nations unies, même si certains n'excluent pas que le trafic puisse, aussi, passer par la frontière zaïroise.

La provenance des armes suscite aussi quelques interrogations. Difficile de savoir, par exemple, ce qu'il est advenu du chargement d'un appareil nigérian, bloqué quelques jours à Chypre après une escale en Israël le mois dernier, et qui a finalement atterri à Entebbe. Mais il est possible qu'une partie des armes, destinées aux rebelles du Sud Soudan, aient été détournées au profit du FPR.

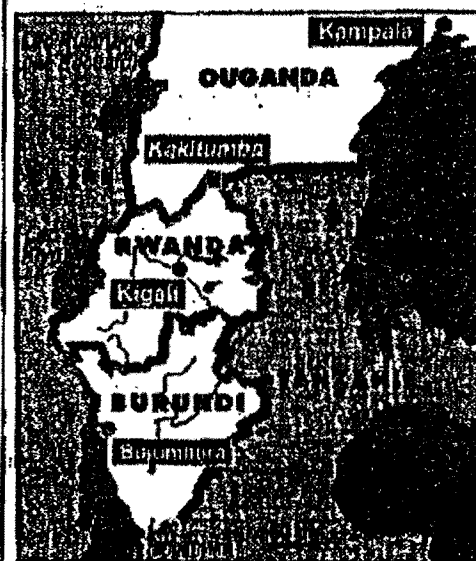

Dans la capitale ougandaise, les débats portent sur le degré d'implication de Joweri Museveni dans le soutien ougandais au FPR, un soutien qui s'explique logiquement quand on sait que de nombreux soldats rwandais se sont engagés dans la guérilla de Museveni et ont aidé à prendre le pouvoir en 1986. Pour ceux qui le mettent hors de cause, c'est surtout les membres de son entourage (dans les services militaires et politiques) qui collaborent étroitement avec l'assu du président, avec les agents du FPR, soit parce qu'ils sont d'origine tutsi ou hima, soit parce qu'ils sont ougandais proches des dirigeants (dont est issu le président), soit parce qu'ils ont des années de service dans l'armée ougandaise. Personne, ici, ne conteste l'implication de leurs années de service dans la guérilla rwandaise, selon laquelle les rebelles ont lancé leurs premières attaques en octobre 1990 dans le Rwanda, équipés de matériel ougandais, mais ce matériel a-t-il été subtilisé ou leur a-t-il été fourni?

Les responsables de l'armée ougandaise, on estime qu'un tiers des armements (discrets) d'Ouganda ont été livrés entre octobre 1990 et octobre 1990. Le FPR aurait ainsi bénéficié des «surplus» d'armement qui est en train de disparaître d'un tiers de ses stocks mondiaux, et dont les fournisseurs pourraient d'ailleurs fournir un nouveau recrutement.

pays. Enfin, il ne faut pas non plus exclure un possible soutien de l'armée burundaise, à majorité tutsi, qui ferme les yeux sur les récents recrutements opérés quasi ouvertement par le FPR dans les camps de réfugiés rwandais ou burundais. Un soutien qui s'explique, mais qui n'en permet pas moins au FPR de poursuivre son offensive. «Le FPR a de longue date établi ses réseaux



clandestins d'armement, dit un diplomate rwandais, alors que nous-mêmes devons trouver d'urgence d'autres sources d'approvisionnement. Nos fournisseurs officiels, comme l'Afrique du Sud, ont reçu ordre de respecter l'embargo.»

Est-ce que cet appui, au moins tacite, de l'Ouganda au FPR n'est destiné qu'à payer la dette contractée par M. Museveni envers les réfugiés rwandais? Ou bien cherche-t-il, comme le clame le gouvernement intérimaire du Rwanda, à «créer un empire tutsi dans la région»? «Le président a d'autres soucis, explique un diplomate occidental, à commencer par le problème du Sud Soudan.»

L'arrivée imminente de l'armée soudanaise sur la frontière nord du

pays, jusque-là aux mains des rebelles sudistes (soutenus par Kampala), risque fort d'accroître la déstabilisation du Nord par Khar-toum, qui y arme déjà une petite guérilla plus proche du banditisme. Le président chercherait plutôt à se «débarrasser» des exilés rwandais en les renvoyant chez eux. «Dès 1988, j'ai dit à Habyarimana (le président rwandais tué le 6 avril

dernier et dont la mort a déclenché la reprise de la guerre civile) qu'il devrait laisser rentrer les réfugiés», affirme M. Museveni, sans doute inquiet de ce que la xénophobie anti-rwandaise devient un argument électoral de l'opposition assez prisé par la population. En effet, les réfugiés rwandais (dont les premiers sont arrivés en 1959) ont bien réussi en Ouganda et ont souvent servi de bouc émissaire, notamment en 1982 lorsqu'ils ont été littéralement expulsés par le président Obote

vers le Rwanda, qui s'est obstinément refusé à les accueillir. Les «banjarwandais» se sont alors tournés vers M. Museveni, qui lançait sa rébellion. Mais, après la prise de Kampala par l'ARN, le sentiment anti-tutsi a exacerbé l'émergence d'une véritable «mafia rwandaise», mal supportée par les Ougandais.

Depuis le début du conflit, Joweri Museveni s'est efforcé d'expliquer que la guérilla tutsie était un problème interne au Rwanda, se montrant peu critique à l'égard du FPR, mais le ton a changé depuis

quelques jours. Il adressa de sévères critiques au FPR, à la suite du massacre des évêques à Kab-gayi, au moment où la presse ougandaise rapportait des témoignages de rescapés des tueries attribuées au FPR.

Le chef de l'Etat ougandais semble prendre quelque distance et appelle publiquement le FPR à accepter un cessez-le-feu puisqu'il n'a pas les moyens de gagner la guerre rapidement. Il insiste, d'autre part, sur la nécessité du passage du pouvoir, sur le modèle des accords d'Arusha, s'ils sont modifiés pour écarter les responsables des massacres. On rapporte que M. Museveni ne s'est pas attardé au sommet de l'Organisation de l'unité africaine à Tunis, irrité par les reproches de ses pairs sur son soutien aux rebelles, alors qu'il n'a pas ménagé ses efforts, convoquant régulièrement à Kampala un «comité de crise» composé des ambassadeurs des pays voisins et des représentants américains, français et britanniques.

Si, à Kampala, il ne fait guère de doute que des relations cordiales se sont établies entre la MONUOR et le FPR, il n'en va pas de même avec les organisations humanitaires qui se pressent dans la zone rebelle. Le FPR entend contrôler étroitement l'organisation des secours aux «six cent mille déplacés des camps de la zone libérée», d'où la grogne des organisations humanitaires, qui s'insurgent contre ces contraintes. D'autres malaises se font jour, comme l'interdiction temporaire d'accès à certains camps, toujours gérés conjointement par deux responsables, l'un politique et l'autre militaire. Pour des «raisons de sécurité», il est difficile, voire impossible, de sortir de ces camps où les observateurs s'interrogent sur ces séances d'éducation qui rappellent, à tort ou à raison, «un certain Cambodge»...

L'ONU accueille favorablement la proposition française d'envoyer des troupes

Le secrétaire général des Nations unies a bien accueilli la proposition française d'un envoi de troupes au Rwanda (*le Monde* du 17 juin) telle qu'elle lui a été exposée, jeudi 16 juin, par l'ambassadeur de France, Jean-Bernard Mérimée. Boutros Boutros-Ghali, indiquant-on des sources diplomatiques à l'ONU, s'est montré « très coopératif » à ce sujet, dans la mesure où lui-même a déjà manifesté à plusieurs reprises son souci de tout tenter pour arrêter les massacres au Rwanda.

Le secrétaire général et son équipe, a souligné à l'AFP le porte-parole adjoint de M. Boutros-Ghali, « ont travaillé dur ces dernières semaines pour mobiliser des troupes et des équipements, et cela n'a pas été facile. C'est pourquoi, si vous recevez une offre de troupes prêtes, entraînées et équipées, elle doit être examinée sérieusement ». Dans ce contexte, toute offre est donc bonne à prendre pour le secrétariat général, même aux conditions que poserait la France : Paris souhaite pouvoir, pour une telle opération, concilier un cadre multilatéral et une conduite militaire et politique nationale. Autrement dit, l'intervention, tout en s'inscrivant dans le cadre d'une opération de maintien de la paix de l'ONU, serait conduite par les

Français, dont les militaires estiment être en terrain suffisamment connu au Rwanda pour ne pas avoir à être placés sous une autorité multilatérale.

Ce procédé est à peu près celui auquel les Américains avaient eu recours en Somalie fin 1992. Mais, s'il venait à être accepté pour la France au Rwanda, il serait évidemment difficile de le refuser par la suite aux Russes en Géorgie ou dans d'autres Républiques de l'ex-URSS, ou encore aux Américains en Haïti. La France doit cependant s'assurer, avant de s'engager, d'une participation européenne et de la coopération africaine. Il lui reste également à obtenir le soutien des autres membres du Conseil de sécurité, qui n'ont guère, jusqu'ici, manifesté un grand enthousiasme à l'égard de la proposition française.

De son côté, l'administration américaine, soucieuse de ne pas prêter le flanc aux critiques qui l'accusent d'avoir réagi trop mollement aux massacres au Rwanda, a accéléré l'envoi de transports de troupes blindés demandés par l'ONU pour les « casques bleus ». La semaine dernière, le secrétaire d'Etat, Warren Christopher, avait accepté l'emploi du terme « génocide », que son administration avait jusque-là demandé à ses représentants d'éviter à propos du Rwanda.
