In his report on inspection trip to Albertville, dated 31 March 1964 Mr. Pichler recommended at paragraph A-VII that a thorough audit be carried out by reconstructing the distribution elements.

2. Mr. Soussou, the auditor who accompanied Mr. Pichler on his visit of field offices, has made the following remarks concerning the food distribution.

When units of the ONUC military force were withdrawn from Albertville the Property Survey Board on 2 December 1963 recommended that the surplus of military rations valued at \$132,346.25 be distributed by Civilian Operations to hospitals and other non-profit charitable institutions. This surplus food was turned over to Mr. Lejeune on 13 December 1963. During the auditor's inspection at Albertville Mr. Lejeune the Community Development expert was approached and asked to produce his records concerning distribution of the surplus food.

Documentation was quite incomplete and records were not available to indicate to whom the surplus food had been distributed. Mr. Lejeune claimed that there were no specific instructions to maintain such records. On return to Leopoldville it was ascertained that detailed instructions were issued by Mr. Gilpin in his memo No. ADM/520/1 of 26 October 1963 to Mr. Boitsam and further to Mr. Lejeune on 22 February 1964.

3. I agree with Mr. Pichler that reconstruction of the details of the food distribution is necessary but I consider this a function to be carried out by the Administration and not by an auditor.

4. It is understood that you propose to transfer an Administrative Assistant to Albertville within a few days. It is therefore recommended that this staff member be directed

- a) To take stock of the items of food remaining for distribution.
- b) That Mr. Lejeune be told to reconstruct the details of food distribution together with necessary verification in accordance with instructions which have been issued.

- c) That Mr. Lejeune be asked to account for his actions if it is ascertained that surplus food has been distributed to other than authorized agencies.
- d) That any additional food distribution be carried out only with prior approval by the Administrative Assistant or if you so consider, authority from Leopoldville.
- e) That stock taking be carried out in future at the end of each month with report to be made by the Administrative Assistant regarding any deficiencies.

5. I would be grateful for your comments regarding the recommendations made in paragraph 4 above.

Monsieur le Chef Adjoint,

Revenant à l'aimable entretien que vous avez bien voulu m'accorder au sujet de la mise à la disposition de notre Croix-Rouge de matériel usagé provenant de l'ONUC, et dont je vous remercie, j'ai l'honneur de vous préciser ci-après l'utilisation ainsi que la quantité de matériel qui pourrait nous être utile dans la première phase de nos opérations.

Comme j'ai eu l'honneur de vous le signaler, nous disposons, à travers le pays, de plusieurs milliers de jeunes gens, membres bénévoles de la Croix-Rouge, et nous voudrions, en plus de la formation typiquement Croix-Rouge que nous leur donnons, les occuper à des travaux utiles et pouvant en même temps servir à créer des stocks de matériels pour nos activités.

Parmi le matériel déclassé de l'ONUC, existant actuellement au dépôt Pakistanais de Lineté, nous pourrions utilement disposer des objets suivants :

- 1° Matériel de literie : couvertures 3.000 - lits de camp 100 - matelas 100 - oreillers 100 - toiles moustiquaires 300 - etc...
- 2° Matériel de cuisine : gamelles 500 - marmites 200 - réchauds 100 - bidons divers 100, etc...
- 3° Matériel Electrique : vieux postes de radio et accessoires - tous appareillages quelconque dont les pièces détachées pourront nous permettre de restaurer nos postes et autre matériel en mauvais état dont nous disposons déjà.

- 4° Matériel de secours : civières 50 - coffres divers destinés à être transformés en trousse de secours - caisses - valises métalliques 100, etc...
- 5° Matériel de campement : bâches 100 - tentes 100 - piquets - mâts,
- 6° Outillage : pelles 200 - pioches 200 - machettes 200 - haches 200 marteaux et en général tout outillage déparvaillés.
- 7° Equipement : anciens pièces d'équipement tels que : chemises 500 - salopettes 500 - pantalons 500 - bottes 500 etc...
