Dear Mr. Rock:

This is in reply to your letter of 10 July 1947, in which you request information regarding the completeness of UNRRA's program for flood control and irrigation in Greece, with a view to reinstating two contracts which have been cancelled because of inability of the manufacturer to deliver within the UNRRA deadline.

I presume you are referring to Contract TFS-5309, UA-2287, calling for 40 7-9 H.P. Diesel Engines, and 240 4" Pumps with Engines on TFS-5342, UA-2626.

For your general information, we submit the following data:

The irrigation and flood control program in Greece, against which procurement was initiated, called for 3,210 pumps, of which 1,650 were centrifugal and 1,560 deep well. A total of 3,576 pumps was requisitioned, and against these requisitions 3,010 have either been shipped or are about to be shipped. There will, therefore, be a deficit, in terms of the procurement program, of approximately 566 pumps. Against 1,160 pumps delivered without engines, we have been able to supply 1,080 engines, leaving a deficit of 80.

The Greek program originally included 350 electric motor driven pumps. Due to procurement difficulties, we were unable to supply any in this category. We are attaching a table showing procurement and deliveries.

SUBJECT: Comments on Cable No. 898, dated 26
April regarding Mining Engineer for Greece

The proposed sending of a competent mining engineer to Greece is to be considered as a general mission to the Balkans. It is very important that such a mining engineer should collect data in the field about the real needs of the various coal mines; especially in Yugoslavia and in the light of our programs provide us with basic requirements.

x I would propose that the suggested mining engineer Mr. Hugh Woodend Smith should come for a short visit to Headquarters in order to get first hand information about our mining and fuel programs as to the supply position in this country.

On the occasion of Mr. Lloyd's visit to Washington, certain discussions took place between him, Mr. Polak and myself on the monetary situation in Greece and the measures that might be needed for a monetary reconstruction in that country. As a result of these discussions, the attached memorandum was drafted by Mr. Polak; Mr. Lloyd and I agree with its conclusions.

It is, of course, understood that monetary policy and monetary reconstruction in the countries in which UNRRA is operating are not the responsibility of the Administration, either at the Mission or at the Headquarters level. The attached note is therefore being sent to you purely for your information and for such comments as you might feel inclined to make.

I am sending a copy of this memorandum to the Greek Mission.
