DAILY SITREP FOR 07 JAN 95

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. REF PARA 1B DAILY SITREP OF 06 JAN 95, REPORTS INDICATE THAT 12 PEOPLE, INCL WOMEN AND CHILDREN WERE KILLED AND 36 INJURED DURING THE SHOOTING INCIDENT PROBABLY INVOLVING RPA SOLDIERS AT BUZANZE DP CAMP GR 4491. RPA INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT.

B. IN SECTOR 4A ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT FOUR ARMED MEN WHO ALLEGEDLY KILLED A WOMAN AND HER NEPHEW WITH MATCHETE AND GRENS AND MADE AWAY WITH PERSONAL EFFECTS AND SOME MONEY AT NYANZA VILLAGE GR 556295 WERE APPREHENDED IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DISTRICT POLICE INSPECTOR. THE SUSPECT HAVE BEEN HANDED OVER TO THE OFFICE OF THE PROSECUTOR AT GIKONGORO FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATION.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NTR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA. RPA INTENSIFIED DAY AND NI FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS IN MAJOR TOWNS AND VILLAGES DURING THE PERIOD. THEY REINFORCED SOME OF THEIR POSNS AND INTENSIFIED SEARCHES AT THEIR VARIOUS ROAD BLOCKS.

(1) REFERENCE OUR DAILY SITREP OF 06 JAN 95, PARA 3A, INVESTIGATIONS INTO THE ARREST OF MR BONIFACE MURUMRANEZA BY RPA SOLDIERS HAS REVEALED THAT THE VICTIM WAS ABDUCTED BY RPA SOLDIERS AND PRESENTLY UNDER GENDARMERIE CUSTODY. IT IS ALLEGED HE HAD MISAPPROPRIATED FUNDS AT AICF GIKONGORO. FURTHER DETAILS TO FOLLOW.

(2) IN SECTOR 5, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA BDE COMD IN GISENYI, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH UNHCR REPS ALLOWED RETURNEES AT THE GISENYI/GOMA BORDER POST TO ENTER RWANDA. THEY WERE HOWEVER KEPT IN A HOLDING AREA TO PREVENT THEM FROM SMUGGLING IN OLD CURRENCIES.

(3) IN SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED THAT CONCERN OFFICIALS TRAVELLING ON THE GITARAMA-KIBUYE ROAD WERE DETAINED AND HARASSED BY RPA TROOPS AFTER THEY HAD REFUSED TO GIVE THE RPA TROOPS A LIFT. THE LOCAL RPA BDE COMD INFORMED BY MILOBS.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) NDAGO - 100.

TOTAL NUMBER OF DPs MOVED SINCE THE BEGINNING OF OP RETOUR IS 6,915.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). PATROL TEAM CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT PATROLS AND MAINTAIN SECURITY IN OWN AOR.

(1) GATUNA BORDER STILL REMAIN CLOSED. ALL UNAMIR PERSONNEL WHO WERE REFUSED ENTRY THROUGH GATUNA BORDER DUE TO THE BORDER CLOSURE HAVE NOW BEEN ALLOWED INTO THE COUNTRY.

(2) 62 LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN MEDICAL CENTRE.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) MALAWICOY PATROL SENT TO MUYIRA GR 8639, BUHORO GR 5710 AND KIBUNGO GR 6313 REPORTED THAT THE GEN SITUATION WAS CALM AND THE NUMBER OF RETURNEES IS INCREASING STEADILY.

(2) ASSISTED IN TRANSPORTING FOOD STUFFS TO TEACHERS IN NDOLA COMMUNE.

(3) TREATED A TOTAL OF 30 PATIENTS AT BOTH KIGEMBE AND RUNYINYA CLINICS.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTL AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) PATROL BASE AT KIBEHO PROVIDED SY FOR THE EVAC OF 100 REFUGEES FROM NDAGO DP CAMP TO BUTARE BY UNHCR.

(3) THE RMO, ACCOMPANIED BY A HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM, WAS ESCORTED TO MUHAZI COMMUNE PRISON GR 458905 TO PROVIDE MED ASSISTANCE TO THE PRISONERS.

(4) 20 IDPs ARRIVED RILIMA ORC AND WERE CONVEYED TO GASHORA GR 2757 AFTER REGISTRATION. GHANBATT TPS PROVIDED SY FOR REMAINING IDPs AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE IN RILIMA WITH MED STAFF ATTENDING TO 43 OF THE IDPs.

(5) ONE SUSPECT HAS BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH BANDIT ATTACKS AT NYARUSHISHI GR 503043 ON 06 JAN 95. SUSPECT TO BE HANDED OVER TO THE OFFICE OF THE PROSECUTOR ON MON 09 JAN 95 FOR INVESTIGATIONS.

F. SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAMBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) PROVIDED SECURITY TO CARE INTERNATIONAL AT NGARA GR 5532 FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD AND FOR OP RETOUR AT CYANIKA DURING REPATRIATION OF 90 IDPs.

(2) TROOPS AT KARAMA CAMP OBSERVED A NUMBER OF IDPs LEAVING CYANIKA DP CAMP THROUGH THE BUSH PATH TOWARDS RUKONDO DP CAMP.

(3) A TOTAL OF 83 LOCALS PATIENTS RECEIVED MEDICAL AID FROM MED TEAMS AT MUKO AND KADUHA.

G. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR AND NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT. A NUMBER OF PEOPLE RECEIVED MEDICAL CARE AT FRAFBATT.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT. CELEBRATED ETHIOPIAN CHRISTMAS ON 07 JAN 95. FC AND LOCALLY INVITED GUESTS WERE PRESENT.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) A LOCAL FROM RWANYAKAYAGA CELLULE GR 3025 REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT A GROUP OF BANDITS, TEN IN NUMBER ATTACKED AND KILLED HIS UNCLE ON 06 DEC 95. TUNBATT INVESTIGATING.

(2) ABOUT 500 REFUGEES ARE AWAITING TO CROSS TO RWANDA FROM GOMA DUE TO THE BORDER CLOSURE

(3) MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 202 LOCALS PATIENTS.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) 370 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP. 637 HAVE BEEN DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO ORCs AND HOME COMMUNES. 709 IDPs ARE STILL IN NDERA CAMP.

(2) RMO TREATED 201 LOCALS.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. THE EXCHANGE OF CURRENCY EXERCISE HAS ENDED IN MOST SECTORS. IT HOWEVER APPEARS THAT MANY PEOPLE WERE UNABLE TO EXCHANGE THEIR OLD NOTES FOR THE NEW ONES. THIS WAS MAINLY DUE TO SHORTAGES OF THE NEW CURRENCY.

(2) BORDERS.

(A) GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA BORDERS REMAINED CLOSED TO ALL TRAFFIC ENTERING RWANDA. TRAFFIC LEAVING RWANDA WAS HOWEVER ALLOWED TO PROCEED.

(B) RUTETE BORDER (SECTOR 2) OPENED TO RETURNEES ON 05 JAN 95. RUSUMO BORDER POST WAS CLOSED TO ALL TRAFFIC THROUGHOUT THE PERIOD.

(C) GISENYI/ GOMA BORDER POST WAS OPEN TO ALL TRAFFIC BETWEEN 1200 HRS AND 1700 HRS.

(D) BURUNDI BORDER AT KANYARU-HAUTE (SECTOR 3)
RE-OPENED TO ALL TRAFFIC.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND
MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN
AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN VARIOUS
PARTS OF THE SECTOR. FARMING AND COMMERCIAL
ACTIVITIES WERE OBSERVED TO BE ON THE INCREASE IN
BICUMBI (GR 3876) AND KANENGE (GR 3470).

(B) AS PART OF OP RETOUR, MILOBS MONITORED THE
ARRIVAL OF 244 DPS TO THE ORC AT THE KIBUNGO
RECEPTION CENTRE.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA.

(A) SECTOR COMD ACCOMPANIED MILOB TEAMS TO VISIT
ORCS IN NYAKIZU AND GISHAMVU COMMUNES. THE ORCS
HAVE THE CAPACITY OF HOLDING A TOTAL OF 4300
RETURNEES. PLASTIC SHEETS SO FAR PROVIDED FOR
ACCOMMODATION.

(C) MILOBS MET WITH BOURGEMESTRE OF MUGINA
COMMUNE TO DISCUSS THE ALLEGED HARASSMENT OF 700
RETURNEES BY RPA. IT WAS DECIDED THAT MILOBS
SHOULD BE PRESENT AT A CONFERENCE OF ALL RPA
SECTOR HEADS ON 10 JAN 95 TO INVESTIGATE AND
DISCUSS THE ALLEGATION.

(D) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN THE KIGEMBE
COMMUNE AND LIAISED WITH FORMED TROOPS DEPLOYED
IN THE AREA.

(7) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. CONDUCTED PTLs WITHIN AOR.
SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED INVESTIGATION INTO RPA ATTACK
ON BUSANZE DPC (4491). PRELIMINARY REPORT SUBMITTED.
INVESTIGATIONS STILL IN PROGRESS.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. SECTOR MILOBS ESCORTED
HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM TO MASS GRAVE SITES IN KIBUYE.
ROUTINE PATROLS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED IN BIRAMBO (GR
4763). SITUATION WAS REPORTED NORMAL.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN
CYANGUGU, NYAMASHEKE, AND BUGARAMA AREAS.

(B) MR PHILLIPE, THE JOURNALIST WHO WAS REPORTED MISSING, WAS SEEN BY ONE MILOB AT 1500 HRS AND 1830 HRS BETWEEN THE ICRC OFFICE AND LOC OF ETHIOBATT TROOPS AT RUZIZI IN THE COMPANY OF ABOUT 20 RPA SOLDIERS. HE WAS DRIVING HIS OWN VEHICLE. EVEN THOUGH EYE CONTACT WAS MADE WITH THE JOURNALIST, HE DID NOT INDICATE THAT ANYTHING WAS WRONG. HE HAS OFTEN BEEN SEEN WITH LARGE CROWDS NEAR HIM DUE TO HIS LIVE BROADCASTS.

(C) A TOTAL OF 84 RETURNEES WERE EVACUATED FROM CYANGUGU BY UNHCR VEHICLES DURING THE PERIOD.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. PTLs TO KINIGI HAVE REPORTED THAT LOCALS CLAIMED 8 COWS HAVE BEEN STOLEN FROM THE AREA BY BANDITS WEARING MILITARY UNIFORMS.

(B) REF SITREP OF 5 JAN 95 ON KILLINGS IN MUTURA, . MILOBS WERE INFORMED THAT ONE OTHER LOCAL WAS SHOT WHEN HE TRIED TO PREVENT A GROUP OF UNIFORMED PERSONS FROM STEALING HIS CATTLE.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. CONDUCTED PTL IN AOR. THE CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE IS REPORTED TO BE OVER. LOCAL AUTHORITIES REPORTED TO MILOBS THAT ONLY 20 PERSONS COULD NOT EXCHANGE ALL OF THEIR OLD CURRENCY. RPA PRESENCE IN THE BUTAMWA COMMUNE WAS OBSERVED TO HAVE BEEN REDUCED. ALSO ONLY ONE CHECK POINT IS CURRENTLY BEING MANNED BY THE RPA IN THE AREA.

(1) AUSMED CONTINUED TO PROVIDE MEDICAL SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT TO PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 46 PATIENTS AND 3 DENTAL PATIENTS. CHK IS HOLDING 22 IN-PATIENTS.

(3) RIFLE COY ELM PROVIDED SECURITY AT THE MIL BKS AND CHK.

(4) CONDUCTED AME FOR 6 RWANDA CIVILIANS WHO RECEIVED BLASTS AND GUNSHOT WOUNDS FROM AN ATTACK BY THE RPA AT BUSANZE GR 435920. SIX SERIOUSLY WOUNDED PATIENTS ADMITTED TO OUR FAC. IN ADDITION WE EVAC 4 OTHER PERS TO BN HOSP.

(5) MED SCREENING TEAM AND PROTECTIVE ELEMENT VISITED CYANIKA CAMP IN SPT OF OP RETOUR. PROVIDED MEDICAL SCREENING DURING THE PERIOD.

M. 1 CDHSR. THE DCO AND PARTY WERE RELEASED FROM THE

UGANDA/
RWANDA BORDER AT 1730 HRS TODAY AND ARRIVED IN KIGALI AT 1900 HRS. AN INTRUDER WAS CAPTURED AT THE AMAHORO STADIUM AND HANDED OVER UN MIL POLICE.

(1) SIGNALS SQN. CONDUCTED A HF LINK TEST BETWEEN SECTOR HQs AND KIGALI TODAY. TEST WAS SUCCESSFUL. THE V-SAT TERMINAL AT SECTOR 3, GITARAMA WAS HIT BY AN ELECTRICAL STORM TODAY AND DAMAGED THE PSCI BOARD.

(2) 3 CSG. THE LOWBEDS AND SEA CONTAINERS WHICH WERE EXPECTED FOR THE REDEPLOYMENT TO CANADA WHICH WERE STUCK AT THE UGANDA/RWANDA BORDER HAVE SINCE BEEN RELEASED.

(3) MEDICAL. NTR.

(4) HUMANITARIAN. A TOTAL OF 190 DPS WERE MOVED ON 07 JAN 95. CANADIAN VEHS MOVED 90 DPS.

HOWEVER RPA CONTINUE TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF ARMED SOLDIERS AND SECURITY PERSONNEL AT THE AIRPORT DUE TWO VIP FLIGHTS WITH RWANDESE GOVERNMENT DELEGATION ON BOARD. 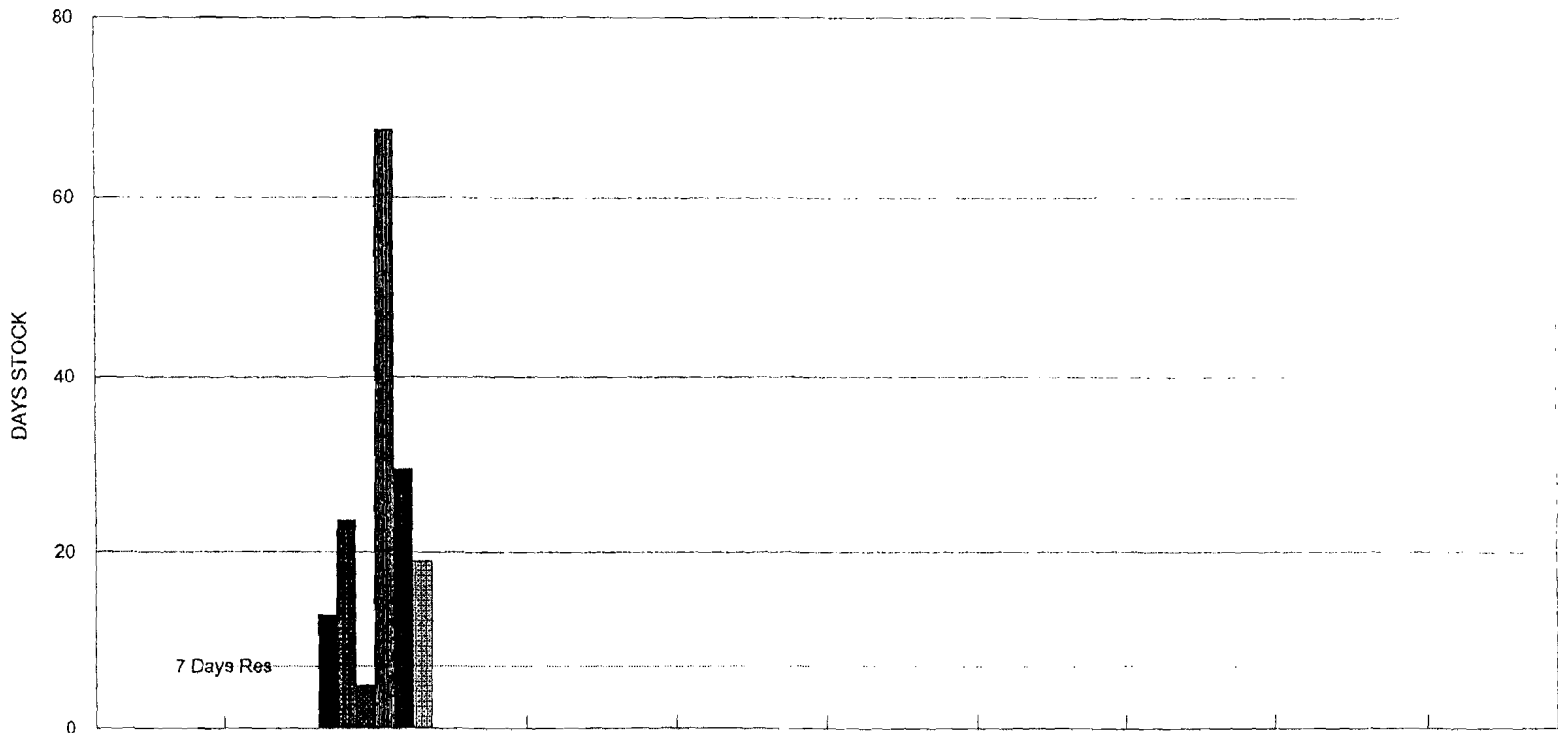

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. TUNBATT REPORTED THAT A MASS GRAVE WITH ABOUT 300 CORPSES HAS BEEN LOCATED AT MUHANGA GR 4500. THE GRAVE DATES BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

B. GHANBATT REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 06/07 JAN 95 RPA TROOPS ENTERED BUSANZE IDP CAMP GR 4491 AND OPENED FIRE RESULTING IN FEW DEATHS AND INJURIES TO MANY. EARLIER, RPA HAD WARNED THE IDPs TO VACATE THE CAMP AS THEY SUSPECTED PRESENCE OF RGF/MILITIA AND BURUNDI NATIONALS IN CAMP. PARA 1A OF OUR SITREP AT 31 DEC 94 REFERS. HUMAN RIGHTS AND A MED TEAM HAVE BEEN DESPATCHED TO THE MENTIONED LOC TO INVESTIGATE THE INCIDENT AND TO GIVE FIRST AID TO THE WOUNDED RESPECTIVELY. FURTHER DETAILS FOLLOW.

SECTOR MILOBS MONITORED HELI EVACUATION OF 11 SICK ORPHANS FROM KIBUYE TO GISENYI.

(A) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED GENERALLY UNSTABLE DURING THE PERIOD. THIS WAS DUE TO THREATS OF ROBBERY RECEIVED FROM BANDITS. THERE IS A SEVERE SHORTAGE OF NEW CURRENCY IN THE SECTOR. THIS IMPLIES THAT MANY PEOPLE WERE UNABLE TO EXCHANGE THEIR OLD CURRENCY. THERE IS HOWEVER A REAL THREAT OF ROBBERY FOR THOSE WHO MANAGED TO EXCHANGE THEIR OLD CURRENCY, ESPECIALLY FOR THE NGOS AT BUSHENGE HOSPITAL. IT IS ALSO THOUGHT THAT THE ATTEMPTED INCURSIONS BY BOAT INTO THE SECTOR MAY HAVE BEEN FOR THE PURPOSES OF INSERTING OLD CURRENCY AND NOT TO ACHIEVE MILITARY ENDS.

(B) MILOBS PROVIDED TRANSPORTATION FOR THE EVACUATION OF SICK PERSONS IN BUGARAMA TO THE HOSPITAL.

(C) MILOBS COORDINATED AND HOSTED THE D/DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RIGHTS TO RWANDA AND SPECIAL INVESTIGATION TEAM. SOME MILOBS WERE INTERVIEWED BY THE HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM FOR INFORMATION ON TRIBUNAL DOCUMENTATION.

(E) MILOBS INVESTIGATED REPORTS THAT 100 OUT 700 RETURNEES TO KIBUYE FROM CYANGUGU WERE DETAINED BY RPA TROOPS. AS AT 061500B JAN 95, NO PERSONS OUT OF THE MENTIONED GROUP HAD BEEN DETAINED.

(F) MILOBS HAVE COMPLETED THEIR INVESTIGATIONS INTO THE ALLEGED RPA KILLING OF MSF EMPLOYEE MR NARCISSE NGENDAHIMANA. IT HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED THROUGH A TESTIMONY BY THE REMAINING VICTIM, MR PASCAL NYAMISHABA THAT THE TWO EMPLOYEES WERE ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS ON PATROL AND ACCUSED OF VIOLATING A CURFEW. THEY WERE THEN TAKEN TO A RESIDENCE WHERE THEY WERE SEVERELY BEATEN WITH RIFLE BUTTS AND STONES, FOR APPROX 30 MINUTES. THEY WERE LATER TAKEN TO AN RPA CAMP LOCATED 500M FROM MSF CAMP. ON THE WAY, ONE VICTIM FAILED TO WALK AND THEY SHOT HIM DEAD. THE REMAINING VICTIM WAS HELD OVERNIGHT IN A ROOM AND LATER RELEASED THAT FOLLOWING DAY AFTER INTERVENTION BY ONE RPA OFFICER.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTL WITHIN AOR.

(A) LOCALS OF CIFUMBA GR 5243, NYABITSINDE GR 5042, BANNISIGU GR 4638 AND BISATE GR 4640 HAVE COMPLAINED OF FREQUENT CATTLE RUSTLING BY BANDITS.

(B) INVESTIGATION WERE ALSO CONDUCTED*IN MUTURA GR 3323, MOTOVU GR 2929 WHERE ALLEGED KILLINGS WERE EARLIER REPORTED. INVESTIGATION IS STILL IN PROGRESS. RPA IS REPORTED TO BE CARRYING OUT A SEPARATE INVESTIGATION ON THE KILLINGS.

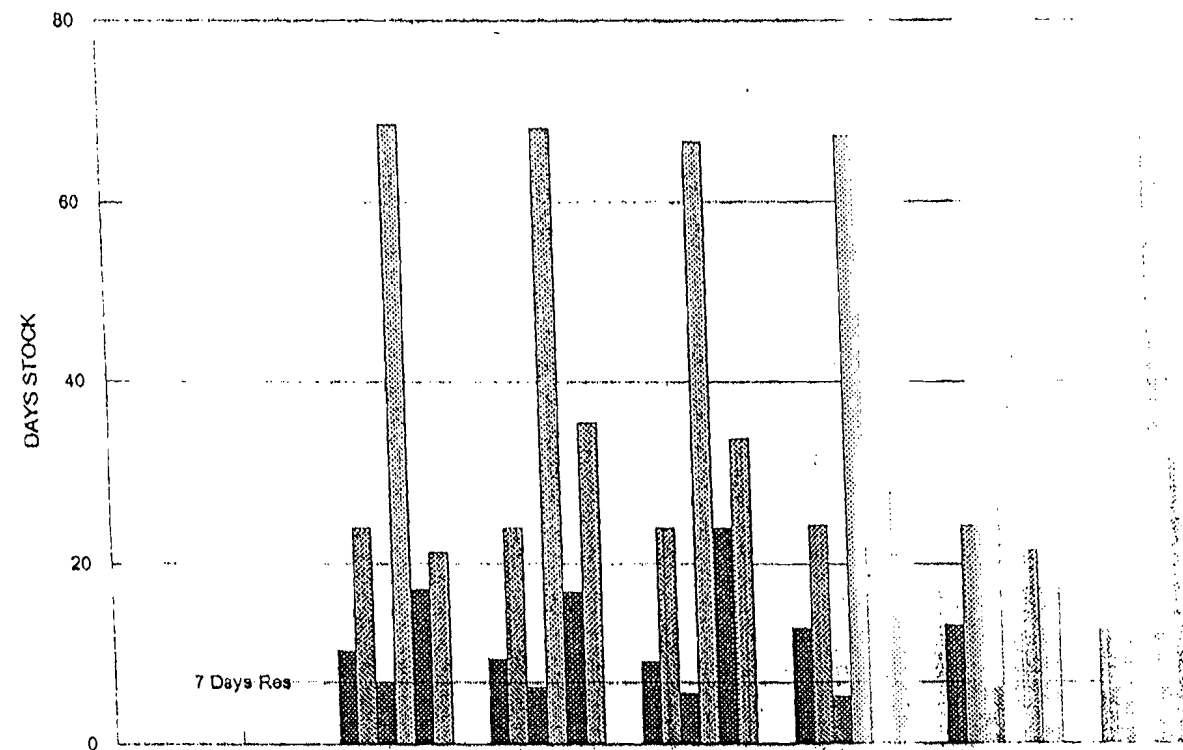

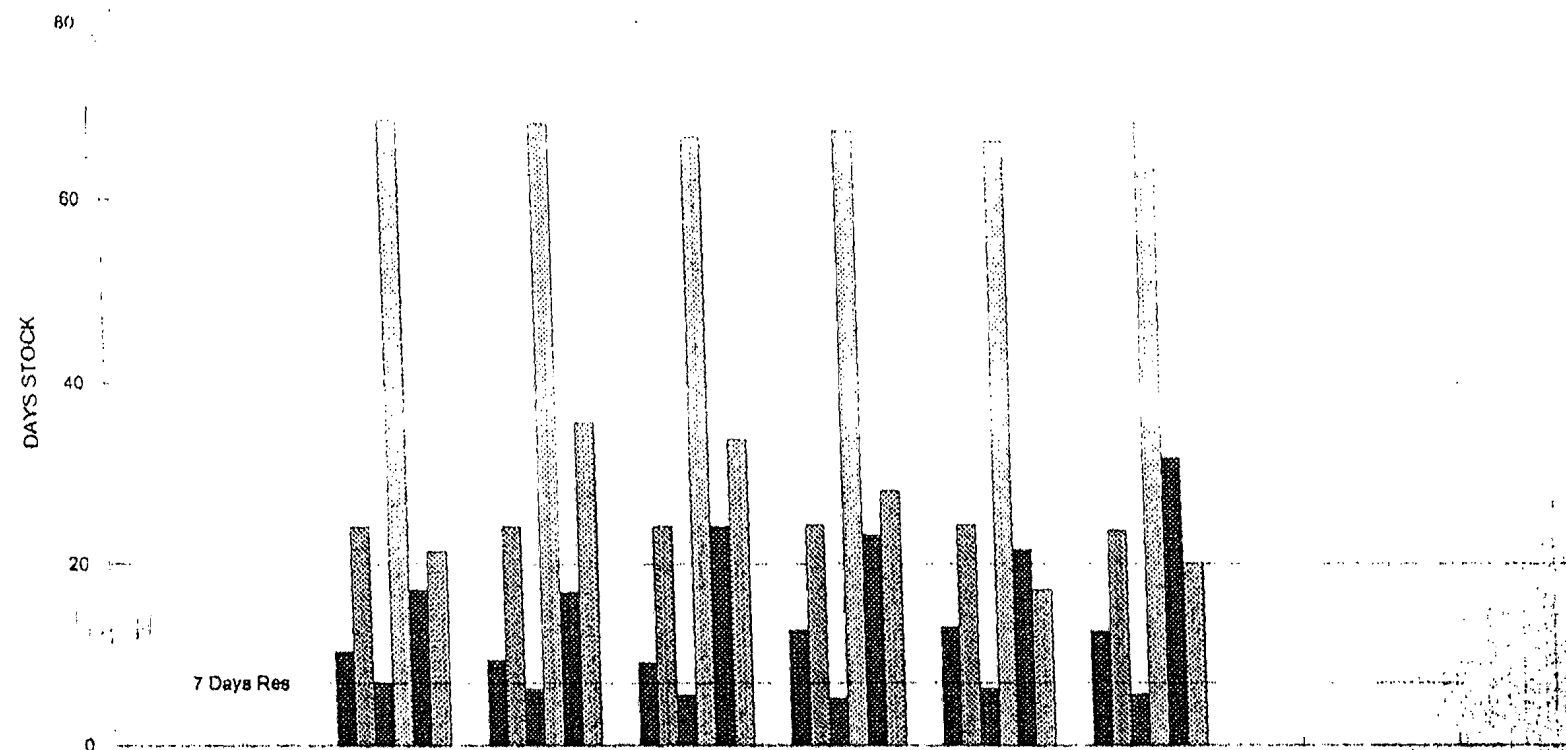

FRGF AT 0130 HRS ON 04 JAN 95, A GP OF BANDITS SUSPECTED TO BE FORMER RGF TROOPS ATTEMPTED TO STEAL LIVESTOCK FROM VILLAGERS IN MUKINJA GR 0141 IN SECTOR 4C, RPA TROOPS IN THE AREA RESPONDED TO AN ALARM RAISED BY THE VILLAGERS AND FIRED INTO THE AREA. THE BANDITS ABANDONED THE LIVESTOCK AND ESCAPED BY SWIMMING TO A WAITING BOAT ON THE LAKE. THEY HEADED FOR THE IJWI ISLE. LOCALS WERE REPORTEDLY SATISFIED WITH THE RPA RESPONSE TO THE INCIDENT.

C. MILITIA. A SHOOTING INCIDENT TOOK PLACE AT THE KAMEMBE ORPHANAGE SECTOR 4C AROUND 2330 HRS ON THE NIGHT 03/04 JAN 95. ASSAULT RIFLES AND HAND GRENADES WERE USED. 1 CHILD WAS KILLED AND 3 OTHERS WERE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED. 21 OTHERS WERE INJURED IN THE INCIDENT. IT IS UNKNOWN WHO CARRIED OUT THE ATTACK BUT SECTOR 4C MILOBS COULD FIND NO EVIDENCE LINKING IT WITH FORMER RGF TROOPS. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). PATROL TEAM CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT PATROLS AND MAINTAIN SECURITY IN OWN AOR. PATROL VISITED BUYOGA GR 022145, TUMBA GR 964131 AND KINIGIRA GR 003187. SY SIT IN THESE COMMUNES REPORTED CALM. MOST OF THE RETURNEES WERE FACING ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL PROBLEMS SUCH AS HOUSING AND FOOD. LOCALS IN ALL THE COMMUNES OBSERVED QUEUING UP AT THE COMMUNE SECRETARIAT FOR THE CURRENCY EXCHANGE. 114 LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN MEDICAL CENTRE.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY)

(1) CONDUCTED PTL AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR. PTLs TO NYAKIZU GR 5797 THE NUMBER OF RETURNEES HAS NOW INCREASED TO AN AVERAGE OF ABOUT 50 PERSONS PER DAY. THERE ARE ALSO 97 TENTS ALREADY BUILT AT NYAKIZU COMMUNE FOR THE IDPs AND SOME MORE TENTS ARE BEING CONSTRUCTED. THERE IS PROPER COOPERATION BETWEEN RPA AND LOCALS. (B) SECTOR HQ HOSTED CONFERENCE OF 15 NGOS OPERATING IN THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE. CONFERENCE WAS TO DISCUSS OPERATIONAL PROBLEMS OF NGOS. SOME NGOS COMPLAINED ABOUT OCCASIONAL HARASSMENT BY RPA TROOPS.

(7) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. CONDUCTED PTLs WITHIN AOR.

(A) PTLs TO REMERA BORDER POST, BUSANZE KAMANA SHURORO AND NSHILI HAVE REPORTED THAT BOTH BURUNDI AND RWANDESE NATIONALS IN BURUNDI WERE PREVENTED FROM CROSSING THE BORDER INTO RWANDA DUE TO THE MONEY CHANGING EXERCISE.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO KIBEHO REPORTED THAT SOME OF THE DPs HAVE STARTED LEAVING THE CAMP ON THEIR OWN. SOME ARE ALSO WAITING FOR FOOD DISTRIBUTION BEFORE THEY LEAVE. DPs FROM BUHORO WERE HOWEVER

RELUCTANT TO BE EVACUATED DUE TO ALLEGED HARASSMENT AND ATROCITIES BY BOTH RPA TROOPS AND TUTSI DPS.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. CONDUCTED PATROLS WITHIN KIBUYE AND SURROUNDING AREAS. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(A) SECTOR MILOBS ESCORTED TWO BROWN AND ROOT CONVOYS FROM GITARAMA TO GISENYI.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT ONE STAFF OF CARE INTERNATIONAL FELL OUT OF THEIR BOAT ON THE LAKE AROUND 1650 HRS. MESSAGE HAS BEEN PASSED TO FHQ FOR AIR SEARCH AND RESCUE. INDIVIDUAL COULD NOT BE LOCATED SO FAR.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. SECTOR MILOBS WERE DESPATCHED TO GATHER INFORMATION ABOUT NGOS' ACTIVITIES IN KIGALI SECTOR. INFORMATION GATHERED INDICATES THAT MOST NGOS' OPERATIONS ARE CONDUCTED OUTSIDE KIGALI. MILOBS WERE ALSO REQUESTED BY UNHCR REPS TO ASSIST THEM TO GET APPROVAL FOR FORMED TROOPS TO PROVIDE SECURITY FOR THE NDERA CAMP. THIS CAMP IS NOW REGULARLY PATROLLED BY UNAMIR TROOPS BOTH BY DAY AND NIGHT.

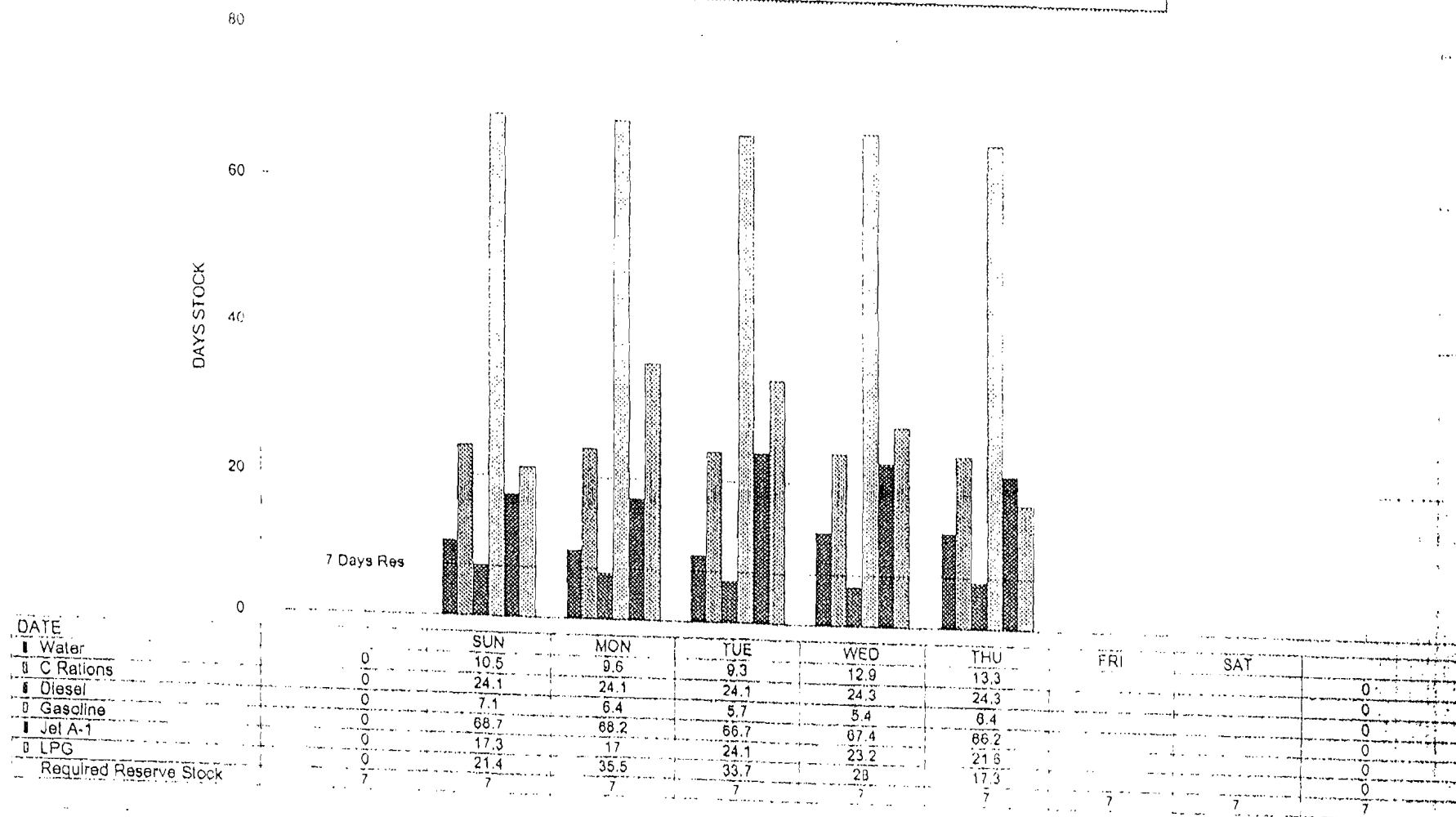

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. GHANBATT TPS RETRIEVED AT ABOUT 031128B JAN 95 QTY 152 PCS OF MK 4 RIFLES AT KIGEME GR 474258. WPNS LOCATED IN SAME PREMISES OF UNICEF WARE HOUSE IN TERRE DES HOMMES. WPNS SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN ABANDONED BY RGF WHO LIVED THERE BEFORE. THEY WERE HANDED OVER TO LOCAL AUTH GIKONGORO PREFECTURE AT 1105HRS ON 04 JAN 95. PRESENT WERE GHANBATT OPS OFFR, PREFECT OF GIKONGORO AND RPA BN 2IC IN GIKONGORO.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NTR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA. RPA INTENSIFIED DAY AND NI FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS IN MAJOR TOWNS AND VILLAGES DURING THE PERIOD. THEY REINFORCED SOME OF THEIR POSNS AND INTENSIFIED SEARCHES AT THEIR VARIOUS ROAD BLOCKS.

(1) RPA TROOPS WERE REPORTED DEPLOYED AT MOST COMMUNE CENTRES IN ALL SECTORS TO PROVIDE SECURITY AND CROWD CONTROL FOR THE CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE.

(2) A RWANDAN EMPLOYEE OF MSF IS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED IN CYANGUGU WHILE IN THE CUSTODY OF THE RPA IN THE AREA. DETAILED REPORT TO BE SUBMITTED BY HQ SECTOR 4C.

(3) RPA HAS REINFORCED NYAMASHEKE AREA WITH MORE EXPERIENCED AND MATURE SOLDIERS. THE FULL STR OF THE REINFORCEMENT IS UNKNOWN.

(4) RPA TROOPS IN GISENYI FIRED SEVERAL VOLLEYS OF ARTY INTO THE LAKE AIMED AT WARDING OFF ANY BOATS BEING USED BY PEOPLE TRYING TO CROSS THE LAKE INTO RWANDA WITH OLD RWANDESE CURRENCY.

(5) AT ABOUT 041815B JAN 95 GHANBATT REPORTED THAT WIFE OF CHEF DE CAMP KAMANA DP CAMP GR 511969 REPORTED THAT HER HUSBAND WAS ABDUCTED BY RPA SOLDIERS FROM NDAGO BETWEEN 041200B JAN 95 TO 041400B JAN 95. REASONS FOR ABDUCTION NOT KNOWN. WIFE HOWEVER BELIEVES THE HUSBAND HAD TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND RWANDESE CURRENCY ON HIM WHICH MIGHT BE THE CAUSE. INVESTIGATION CONTINUES IN COLLABORATION WITH GENDAMERIE COMD GIKONGORO.

B. FRGE AT 0130 HRS ON 04 JAN 95, A GP OF BANDITS SUSPECTED TO BE FORMER RGF TROOPS ATTEMPTED TO STEAL LIVESTOCK FROM VILLAGERS IN MUKINJA GR 0141 IN SECTOR 4C, RPA TROOPS IN THE AREA RESPONDED TO AN ALARM RAISED BY THE VILLAGERS AND FIRED INTO THE AREA. THE BANDITS ABANDONED THE LIVESTOCK AND ESCAPED BY SWIMMING TO A WAITING BOAT ON THE LAKE. THEY HEADED FOR THE IJWI ISLE. LOCALS WERE REPORTEDLY SATISFIED WITH THE RPA RESPONSE TO THE INCIDENT.

C. MILITIA. A SHOOTING INCIDENT TOOK PLACE AT THE KAMEMBE ORPHANAGE SECTOR 4C AROUND 2330 HRS ON THE NIGHT 03/04 JAN 95. ASSAULT RIFLES AND HAND GRENADES WERE USED. 1 CHILD WAS KILLED AND 3 OTHERS WERE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED. 21 OTHERS WERE INJURED IN THE INCIDENT. IT IS UNKNOWN WHO CARRIED OUT THE ATTACK BUT SECTOR 4C MILOBS COULD FIND NO EVIDENCE LINKING IT WITH FORMER RGF TROOPS. SECTOR MILOBS TO SUBMIT A FULL REPORT ON COMPLETION OF INVESTIGATIONS.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD.

(2) TODAY THE FC CHAIRED A COORDINATION BETWEEN UNREO REPRESENTATIVE AND MILITARY STAFF TO HELP PLAN OPERATION RETOUR. THE MEETING WAS DEEMED SUCCESSFUL AND REAL PROGRESS WAS MADE. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED JOINT OPERATION WITH THE UNAMIR RPA LO AND HELD FURTHER TALKS WITH BETTY STANIC OF UNREO.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICROY). PATROL TEAM CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT PATROLS AND MAINTAIN SECURITY IN OWN AOR. PATROL VISITED BUYOGA GR 022145, TUMBA GR 964131 AND KINIGIRA GR 003187. SY SIT IN THESE COMMUNES REPORTED CALM. MOST OF THE RETURNEES WERE FACING ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL PROBLEMS SUCH AS HOUSING AND FOOD. LOCALS IN ALL THE COMMUNES OBSERVED QUEUING UP AT THE COMMUNE SECRETARIAT FOR THE CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE. 114 LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN MEDICAL CENTRE.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY)

(1) PTL WAS SENT TO NYAKIZU GR 5797 REPORTED THAT THE GENERAL SITUATION IN THE AREA WAS CALM. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT TAC HQ BUTARE.

(2) THE NUMBER OF RETURNEES HAS NOW INCREASED TO AN AVERAGE OF ABOUT 50 PERSON PER DAY. THERE ARE ALSO 37 TENTS ALREADY BUILT AT NYAKIZU COMMUNE FOR THE IDPs AND SOME MORE TENTS ARE BEING CONSTRUCTED. THERE IS PROPER COOPERATION BETWEEN RPA AND LOCALS. LOCALS ARE BUSY WITH FARMING ACTIVITIES.

(3) 1742 DPs MOVED FROM CYANIKA TO KIGALI. 607 DPs MOVED FROM NDAGO TO BUTARE, KIBUNGO AND KIGALI AREAS.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED SECURITY AND PATROL DUTIES IN SOME AOR

AND ALL PTLs REPORTED AREAS TO BE CALM.

(2) CONTINUE TO DEPLOY 2 X MECH SECTIONS EACH AT MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES. CONTINUED TO MAN CHECK POINTS AT GIKONGORO, KIBEHO, RURAMBA, RWAMIKO AND KITABI.

(2) A TOTAL OF 131 LOCALS WERE ATTENDED TO BY MED TEAM IN MUKO AND KADUHA. LOCALS CONTINUED CHANGING THEIR OLD CURRENCY.

G. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT).

(1) AN ESCORT WAS PROVIDED BY FRAFBATT TO CONVEY ORPHANS OF MUBUGA TO GISENYI VIA GITARAMA.

(2) MANNED CHECK POINTS AT MUBUGA AND N'DABA. PATROLLED KAROMGI - BISESERO - GITWAS - KIBUYE - MABAMZA - GISAHARA. 21 PEOPLE RECEIVED MEDICAL ARE AT FRAFBATT.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) MANNED PERMANENT CHECK POINTS AT PINDURA GR 1326, GISHOMA GR 8211, GAKWIST, KIBUNGO GR 2532, MURURU GR 7521 AND NYAGATARE.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) PROVIDED ESCORT OF ORPHANAGE CHILDREN CONVOY FROM GITARAMA TO GISENYI.

(2) TODAY AT 1445 HRS THE CARE LOCATED NEAR TUNBATT HQ WAS CLOSED. THE ORGANISATION STOPPED TO DISTRIBUTE AID DUE TO ATTITUDE OF RETURNEES WHO LEFT RWANDA IN 1959. THEY WANT TO TAKE AID EVERY DAY. THEY THREATENED TO TAKE FOOD BY FORCE. THE SECURITY IS NOW BEING ENSURED BY TUNBATT SOLDIERS.

(3) MEDICAL STAFF ASSISTED 223 RWANDESE PATIENTS.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) VEHICLE PATROLS CARRIED OUT IN KIGALI AND HINTERLAND BY DAY. OWS AT NDERA CAMP PATROLLED BY DAY AND NIGHT. SITUATION FOUND TO BE NORMAL.

(2) RMO TREATED 212 LOCAL CIV PATIENTS AT CLINIC. 696 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP 1800 HRS TODAY. 410 IDPs DESPATCHED BY IOM AND UNHCR TO ORCs AND HOME COMMUNES. BALANCE 752 IDPs REMAINING IN NDERA CAMP.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. SUB-PREFECT AT RUHANGO SECTOR 3 ALLEGEDLY URGED LOCALS AT A PUBLIC MEETING NOT TO CO-OPERATE WITH UNAMIR. THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA HAS ARRANGED TO SUMMON THE SUB-PREFECT ON 06 JAN 95 IN THE PRESENCE OF COMD SECTOR 3 TO DEMAND AN EXPLANATION.

(2) BORDERS. SOME BORDERS WERE CLOSED DUE TO THE CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE GOING ON WITHIN THE COUNTRY.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA.

(A) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PTLs IN BYUMBA, KISARO, NYOVE AND CYONDO COMMUNES. SITUATION WAS REPORTED NORMAL IN ALL AREAS AND BRISK FARMING AND COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES WERE REPORTED IN THE AREAS PATROLLED.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) THE SECTOR WAS CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN GASHORA, SASA GR 4759, NYAMAKA GR 0963, KIGARAMA GR 6070, RUTETE GR 2242 AND NGENDA GR 0644. SITUATION WAS REPORTED NORMAL. LOCALS WERE OBSERVED TRYING TO CHANGE THEIR OLD CURRENCY FOR THE NEW NOTES. THE PROCEDURE AS OBSERVED AT ONE COMMUNE OFFICE IN SECTOR 2 WAS VERY SLOW. IT WAS UNCERTAIN WHETHER THE EXERCISE WOULD BE COMPLETED BY NIGHTFALL.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA.

(A) THE SIT IN THE SECTOR WAS RELATIVELY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED INDUCTED INITIAL RECCE IN NYABISINDU IN PREPARATION FOR OP RETOUR. LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN THE COMMUNE WERE REPORTED TO BE UNAWARE OF THE OPERATION.

(C) SECTOR HQ HOSTED CONFERENCE OF 15 NGOS OPERATING IN THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE. CONFERENCE WAS TO DISCUSS OPERATIONAL PROBLEMS OF NGOS. SOME NGOS COMPLAINED ABOUT OCCASIONAL HARASSMENT BY RPA TROOPS.

(7) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS AROUND THE REMERA BORDER POST, BUSANZE KAMANA SHURORO AND NSHILI. BOTH BURUNDI AND RWANDESE NATIONALS IN BURUNDI WERE PREVENTED FROM CROSSING THE BORDER INTO RWANDA DUE TO THE MONEY CHANGING EXERCISE.

(C) MILOBS PATROLLED KIBEHO AND BUHORO AND CYANIKA. SOME DPs ARE REPORTED TO HAVE LEFT THE KIBEHO CAMP ON THEIR OWN. SOME ARE ALSO WAITING FOR FOOD DISTRIBUTION BEFORE THEY LEAVE. DPs FROM BUHORO WERE HOWEVER RELUCTANT TO BE EVACUATED TO BUSORO DUE TO ALLEGED HARASSMENT AND ATROCITIES BY BOTH RPA TROOPS AND TUTSI DPs.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS WITHIN KIBUYE AND SURROUNDING AREAS. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS REPORTED NORMAL.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. POPULATION WAS HOWEVER REPORTED TO BE VERY UNEASY DUE TO SHOOTING INCIDENT AT KAMEMBE ORPHANAGE ON NIGHT 03/04 JAN 95.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS AROUND THE

COMMUNE CENTRES TO MONITOR THE EXCHANGE OF CURRENCY. SITUATION WAS REPORTED TO BE RELATIVELY CALM.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS ESCORTED TWO BROWN AND ROOT CONVOYS FROM GITARAMA TO GISENYI.

(C) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT SOME STAFF OF CARE INTERNATIONAL FELL OUT OF THEIR BOAT ON THE LAKE AROUND 1650 HRS. MESSAGE HAS BEEN PASSED TO FHA FOR AIR SEARCH AND RESCUE.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) THE SITUATION IN KIGALI CITY AND SUBURBS REMAINED CALM.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS WERE DESPATCHED TO GATHER INFORMATION ABOUT NGOS' ACTIVITIES IN KIGALI SECTOR. INFORMATION GATHERED INDICATES THAT MOST NGOS' OPERATIONS ARE CONDUCTED OUTSIDE KIGALI, MILOBS WERE REQUESTED BY UNHCR REPS TO ASSIST THEM TO GET APPROVAL FOR FORMED TROOPS TO PROVIDE SECURITY FOR THE NDERA CAMP.

A NUMBER OF EXCHANGE POINTS HAVE BEEN OPENED THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY AND THE WHOLE

PROCESS IS PROCEEDING SMOOTHLY WITH NO UNTOWARD INCIDENT SO FAR REPORTED. 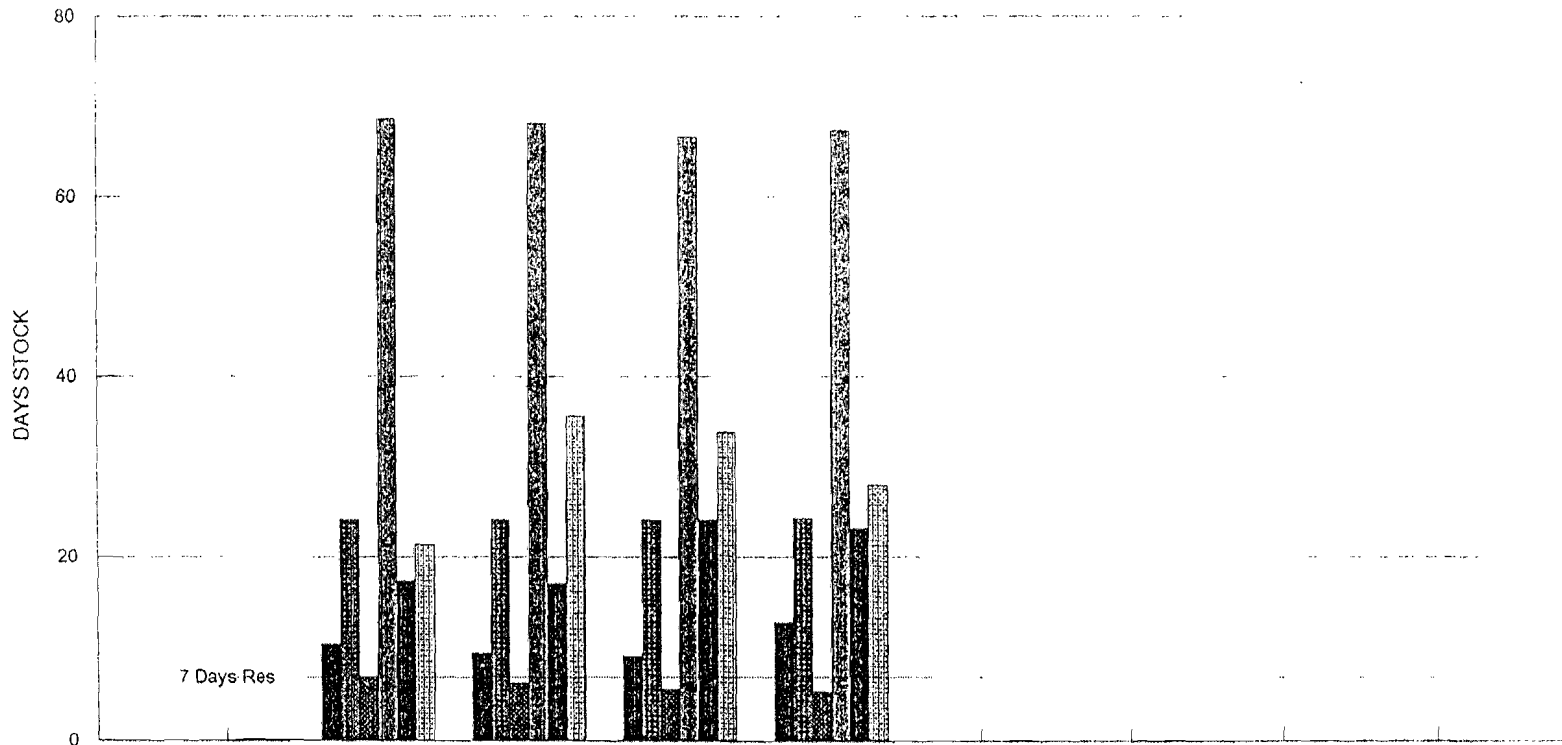

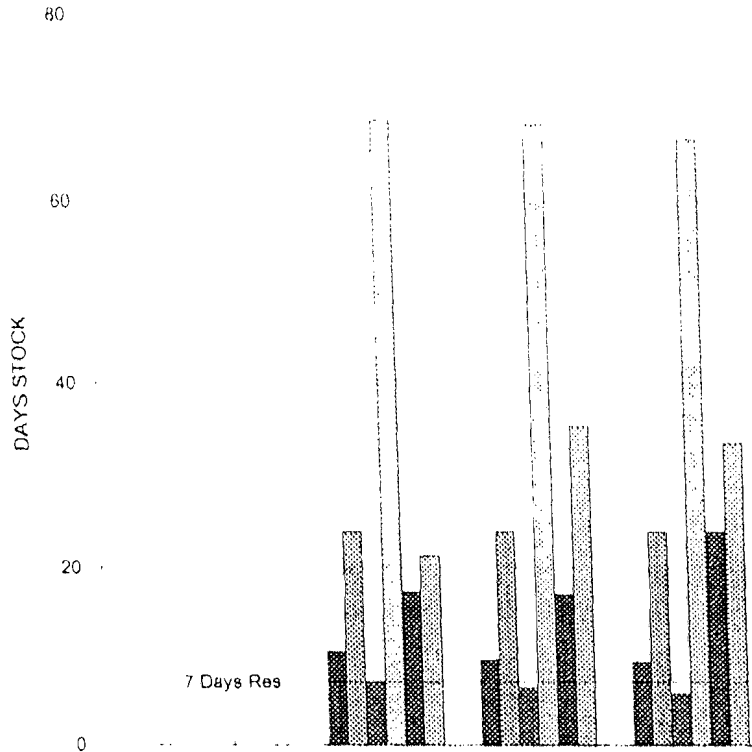

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. GHANBATT PATROL BASED IN RUNYOMBI REPORTED THAT DPs AT BUSANZE CAMP HAVE BEEN ASKED BY THE LOCAL AUTH AND RPA TO ABANDON CAMP FOR SECURITY REASONS. SAME PATROL ALSO REPORTED THE PRESENCE OF ABOUT 602 BURUNDI NATIONALS IN THE CAMP.

B. ZAMBATT HAS REPORTED THAT RPA HAS DEPLOYED ITS TROOPS IN MUSEBEYA GR 3933, RUKONDO GR 5538, MUSANGE GR 5247 AND AT CYANIKA GR 562203 AND HAS SET UP A ROAD BLOCK ON THE ROAD TO RUKONDO. AS A RESULT OF THE UNWILLINGNESS OF IDPs TO GO BACK TO THEIR HOMES, AN RPA MAJOR ORDERED THE CLOSURE OF THE CYANIKA DISTRIBUTION CENTRE AND STOPPED THE AICF FROM GIVING OUT ANY FOOD TO THE IDPs. THE ISSUE WAS RESOLVED AFTER A PROTRACTED NEGOTIATION BETWEEN ZAMBATT CONTINGENT COMMANDER AND RPA AND AICF. THE RPA COMMANDER HAS GIVEN THE NGOS TWO DAYS IN WHICH THEY MUST FINISH THE DISTRIBUTION EXERCISE AND THERE AFTER THE DPs MUST MOVE.

ATTACKERS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE STOLEN COWS AND FOOD SUPPLIES.

C. MILITIA. TWO PERS ATTACKED A WOMAN AT RUKOGULI GR 8514 IN SECT 4C ON 30 DEC 94. THE VICTIM WAS TAKEN TO CYANGUGU HOSP AND CLAIMS SHE RECOGNIZED ATTACKERS AS NEIGHBOURS FROM HER VILLAGE. 1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY STABLE.

A. IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT SITUATION REMAINS UNSTABLE AND TENSE IN AREA OF NYAMASHEKE GR 9841 DUE TO THE RAIDS BY INSURGENTS GROUPS AND THREAT OF FURTHER RAIDS AGAINST LOCAL BUSINESSMEN.

B. REPORTS REACHING MILOBS IN SECTOR 2 INDICATED THAT ON 28 DEC 94, A TOTAL OF 62 LOCALS WERE MURDERED AT KABARE (7170), CANVETONGA AND RUBUMBA (7473). SECTOR MILOBS IN CONJUNCTION WITH UNHCR AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES ARE INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT. THE VICTIMS WERE ALLEDGEDLY KILLED WITH MACHETES. SECTOR MILOBS WAS ALSO INFORMED THAT THERE WAS ONE SURVIVOR BUT EFFORTS TO LOCATE HIM WERE FUTILE. 5 PERS ARE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THE RPA IN CONNECTION WITH THE MURDERS BUT UNHCR OFFICIALS WERE NOT AVAL TO CONFIRM.

C. IN SECTOR 5, TUNBATT DISCOVERED FOUR MASS GRAVES AT MWIYANIKE GR 4518. THE GRAVES CONTAINED A TOTAL OF 19 BODIES.

D. SUB-PREFECT OF KIGARAMA INFORMED SECTOR 2 MILOBS THAT 8 CIVILIANS HAD BEEN KILLED AND 2 OTHERS INJURED AT KIGARAMA ON THE NIGHT OF 28/29 DEC 94 WITH KNIVES AND ARROWS. THE VICTIMS WERE TAKEN TO RWITRWABU HOSP. HUMAN RIGHTS AND MILOBS INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 4C MILOBS INDICATED THAT RPA HAD MOVED AN 8-BARREL MULTIPLE ROCKET LAUNCHER TO KAMEMBE COMMUNE (CYANGUGU) DURING THE PERIOD. EXACT LOC OF WPN NOT KNOWN BUT SUSPECTED TO BE IN KAMEMBE NEAR ETHIOBATT HQ FOR FUTURE DEPLOYMENT. LOCALS IN KAMEMBE, NYAMASHEKE AND KAGANO COMMUNES ARE BECOMING DISSATISFIED WITH RPA AUTH AND ABILITY.

(1) IN SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RAIDS IN NYAMASHEKE THAT WERE REPORTED IN 30 DEC 94 SITREP WERE CARRIED OUT BY ELEMENTS OF FORMER RGF AND INTERAHAMWE.

(3) AUTHORITY TO APPROVE OVERFLIGHTS OF RWANDAN AIRSPACE HAS BEEN TRANSFERRED FROM THE RPA AT THE AIRPORT TO THE RWANDAN MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT IN KIGALI CITY. IN GRANTING LANDING CLEARANCES, THE MINISTRY IS NOW FAVOURING THE REGULAR KIGALI AIRLINES (SABENA, ETHIOPIAN, LUFTHANSA AND AIR EAST AFRICA) BECAUSE THEY GENERATE REVENUE THROUGH THE USE OF AIRPORT SERVICES. THE MINISTRY IS INCREASINGLY NOT APPROVING FLIGHTS FOR OTHER EXTERNAL CHARITABLE CHARTER AIRLINES (MASS AND ECHO FLIGHT) BECAUSE THEY DO NOT USE AIRPORT SERVICES AND COMPETE FOR PASSENGERS WITH THE REGULAR CARRIERS.
