3. Several personnel, including Maj Johnson as noted in Ref, have received training as lay helpers in the event of requirement for peer assistance in critical incident debriefs. They normally function under medical supervision.

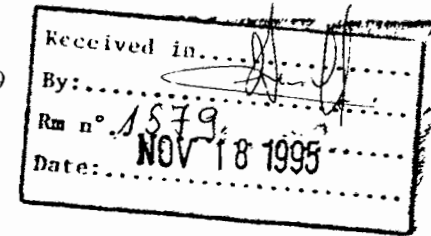

Subject: SECURITY CHECKS - TRAFIPRO AND AMAHORO HOTEL

Reference: Discussion COS/CAO/DCOS SP 15 Nov 95

1. As the possible closure of UNAMIR looms in the near term, it is highly probable that the incidents of theft and attempted theft of UNAMIR equipment will increase. While our current security access to UNAMIR HQ and Trafipro is well established it is considered that it would be appropriate to step up the personal identification and vehicle spot checks as a preventive and deterrent measure.

3. Notwithstanding the focus of this direction on the Amahoro and Trafipro locations all addressees are requested to recognize their responsibilities in this regard and to take preventative measures to increase the security awareness of all personnel and to safeguard personal, contingent and UN owned equipment and valuable items.

2. CO INDBATT is requested to implement appropriate measures to increase the level of identity checks within current guidelines and to implement spot checks of vehicles entering and exiting the above locations. It is not intended to create a bottleneck at the entrances, however, personnel should be advised that vehicle inspections at random will be carried out by the gate guards particularly on vehicles exiting these compounds. Accordingly the understanding and cooperation of all addressees is requested.

Subject: CARRIAGE OF CUSTOMS PAYABLE ITEMS INTO RWANDA

1. It has been noticed that pers from some Contingents while returning from Nairobi had been bringing in electronic items far in excess of their personal requirement, thus leading to avoidable embarrassment at Kigali International Airport. 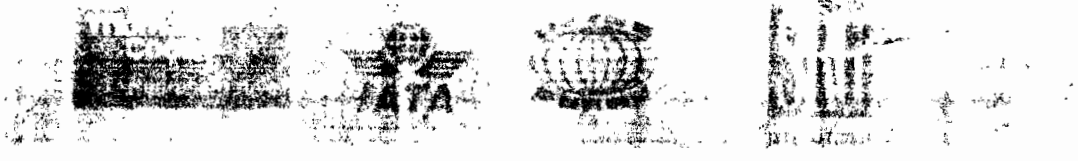

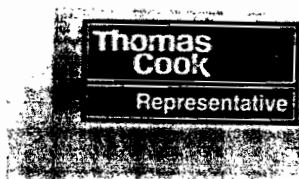

**DIRECTIVE ON THE LEGAL JURISDICTION APPLICABLE TO UNAMIR AND
RWANDAN AUTHORITIES**

The aim of this directive is to out-line the procedures for handing over individuals or group of people to the Rwandan authorities.

By this directive the SRSG, FC and the CIVPOL Commissioner have been accorded Diplomatic Immunity and privilege under International Law, this implies that they are not to be handed over to Rwandan authority under any circumstance.

CIVPOL

Under these procedures all members of CIVPOL are immune from :

- Legal process for all acts performed by them in their official capacity.
- Arrest, detention and seizure of their personal baggage. This implies that none of UN *personnel* can be handed-over to the Rwandan authority without the concurrence of the FC or the SRSG.
- If authority has been given then a report detailing the following is to be sub-mitted to UNAMIR HQ attention - G1 Personnel, G3 Ops and Force Provost Marshal.
 - a) Name of the person handed-over,
 - b) Location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
 - c) Crime person accused of,
 - d) Name of UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
 - e) Date, time and place the person was handed to the prosecutor,
 - f) Whether ICRC and UNHFOR Representative was present during the handing over and if not why ?

Also all UN Civilian Officials assigned to the Civilian Component consultants or Military are immune from legal process for all acts performed by them in their official capacity but the international personnel of NGO's, International personnel of UNAMIR contractors and visitors have no immunity unless they have entered into a bilateral arrangement with the Rwandan Government in the absence of that they can be handed over on demand of proper legal authority.



CIVPOL COMMISSIONER'S CONFERENCE OPENING REMARKS

The meeting which started to assemble as early as 08:00 of 9-9-95 was called to order and aborted by the chairman as it could not form Quorum. However the Chairman thanked those present and expressed his dismay over the absentees and those who proceeded on CTO without his approval. The dispersed nature of CIVPOL deployment notwithstanding the Chairman reiterated was not sufficient for the poor attendance and there after directed Ag. CPOO to provide evidence of the meeting notice for further action.

Commenting further on CIVPOL reorganization, the Chairman said there were very important issues before CIVPOL high command that require clarification and far-reaching decisions. As a result, he directed the in definite adjournment of the instant meeting. Expatiating further, the chairman, also directed that W.e.f date all Administrative meetings must be scheduled for working days and no more weekends, as most participants use the meeting for idleness and unofficial engagements.


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In his contribution to the Leave/CTO matter, CPMT Gikongoro requested the Chairman to strengthen his team when posting the new CIVPOL Observers, but before he concluded the Chairman interjected and queried why the CPMT recommended the only member of his team for CTO, knowing well that the subject has been suspended in the penultimate month. The Chairman however reiterated that all those who proceeded without his approval are ABSENT FROM DUTY as far as he was concerned.

In a similar development, CPMT Cyangu, having regards to the Chairman's remarks about Leave/CTO recommendation, tried to explain the circumstances that warranted his recommending ASP Mwengwe Chuuma's Leave/CTO's application, which according to him, was in view of the officer's failing health.

The Deputy Commissioner, CIVPOL in his capacity as Zambian contingent Leader, commenting on the subject said he was yet to brief the commissioner, details of Chuuma's case, as a result the matter was put in the Limbo. Still on Chuuma's case, the Chairman clarified his position, that Leave/CTO approval is his prerogative and that officers with compassionate cases will have their request treated with dispatch, while those who proceeded on Leave/CTO without approval are regarded as absentees stressing that ignorance of Leave/CTO policy and procedures is no excuse. He once again thanked those present and regret any inconveniences the adjournment right cause them.

The aborted meeting dispersed at exactly 09:50 Hrs, adjourning indefinitely.

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

SUBJECT: **PX PRICES**

1. As you are aware, we have put a lot of pressure on Angelica to review, amongst other things, their pricing policy in order that their prices be in line with the price list in the contract they signed with us.
2. Angelica did indeed take the steps to modify the prices for the items listed in the contract. However, I am still receiving many complaints of UNAMIR personnel saying that several items are too expensive compared to the prices they can find on the local market. One complaint which I received quite often also is that the prices of some items were changing many times.
3. This issue was discussed with your predecessor, Mr J. Parnell, on several occasions and I asked him to investigate. So far, Mr Parnell did not have the time to take actions as he had many other urgent issues to address. However, this problem can not wait any longer to be examined.
4. Therefore, the PX Committee must be formed ASAP in order to examine this matter. This Committee should have a representative of every UNAMIR Components and will act as the Chairman. This Committee should be similar to the one for the Catering contract and in fact could be composed of the same members.
5. The Committee will need to: survey the local market in order to see the prices of the items sold there, open Angelica books to examine their cost prices, see what are their profit margins, etc. Angelica Director, Mr A. Raykundalia, should also be invited by the Committee to explain his pricing policy. The Committee will then have to examine the whole issue and to formulate their recommendations to me. I will then sent my recommendations to the CAO for his approval.
6. The Committee report should be completed and forwarded to my attention by 16 Sept 95. I would like to meet with you before you start this project to give you the details of the different complaints which were made to me in the past few weeks.

Subject: R & R Policy

1. In view of the conditions under which UNAMIR personnel are currently working, a R&R policy has been developed to allow all personnel the opportunity to take some time for rest and recreation to compensate for long hours of work and difficult living conditions.

2. The amount of work currently involved in the mission, requires that all international staff work the hours necessary to ensure tasks are completed. This is interpreted to mean that the staff member will have worked hours in excess of what may be published as official working hours. The work week is considered as six full days, Monday to Saturday.

3. R&R entitlement consists of a full three working days off at the end of the qualifying period. This is not cumulative and must be taken at the time it is earned. If R&R time is not taken within two weeks of having been earned, the time is forfeit. Accumulation of credit toward the next period of R&R does not commence until return from the previous R&R. R&R may be combined with annual leave, provided the exigencies of service permit a pro-longed absence. This latter is a decision for section heads on a case-by-case basis. It may not be combined with family visit or home leave travel.

4. Entitlement to R&R is based on:

- a. First period - following completion of 36 full working days in the mission - in Rwanda.
- b. Subsequent periods - following completion of 24 full working days in the mission - in Rwanda.


- c. If, during a qualifying period, an individual spends time outside Rwanda on official duty, the qualifying time for R & R is extended by one week for each 48 hrs spent outside Rwanda.
 - d. After return from Home Leave, Family Visit Travel or Annual Leave of two weeks or longer, staff must meet the initial 36 days working day requirement before qualifying for the next R & R period.
5. In order to obtain the full three days, staff may depart the mission on the last flight of the day immediately prior to the R & R period and return on the first flight of the day immediately following the period.
6. This R & R period may be combined with Sunday, effectively giving a four day weekend. In this case, return to the mission must be on the last flight on the fourth day.
7. Please note that MSA will continue to be paid during R & R provided that the staff concerned spend their R & R within the mission area. As it currently stands, the designated mission area for UNAMIR is defined as Rwanda and Uganda which would preclude payment of MSA for R & R taken in Nairobi. However, the question of inclusion of Nairobi in mission area for R & R purposes is being reviewed by the Office of Human Resources Management (OHRM) in New York and you will be advised as soon as a decision has been taken.
8. Pending the decision of OHRM to include Nairobi in the mission area, staff member who wish to take R & R in Nairobi may do so and subsequently submit a claim for retroactive payment of MSA.
9. All staff are to note, this R&R is a privilege, not an entitlement or a right. Simple physical presence in Rwanda is not sufficient to earn this privilege. Staff must demonstrate that they have worked extra hours and days over the qualifying period. This matter is to be controlled by section chiefs.
10. For purposes of calculation of this R&R, the effective date of commencement is as of 1 August 1994.

Subject: Accrued Annual Leave

This circular issued in early 1994 is being reissued in order to draw the attention of all civilian staff members on the following procedure governing the accrual of annual leave while on assignment to UNAMIR.

Annual Leave

Staff member shall accrue annual leave while in full pay status at the rate of two and one half (2 1/2) days per month broken down as follows:

One and one half (1 1/2) days paid MSA leave for each completed month of mission assignment.

One (1) day annual leave with no payment of MSA.

Example 1

Staff member has been on assignment to UNAMIR for four months. During this period he/she will accrue following leave:

1.5 x 4 = 6 days with payment of MSA

1 X 4 = 4 days annual leave with no payment of MSA

Example 2

Staff member wishes to proceed on leave (outside mission area) for the period 1 - 15 December 1994 (15 calendar days): His/her leave balance is 6 days paid MSA and 4 days annual leave with no payment of MSA.

In this case:

For MSA payment purpose

1 - 15 December 1994 (i.e. 15 calendar days) MSA will be discontinued for 15 days, including week-ends and official holidays, if any, and staff member will receive MSA payment only for the 6 days he has accrued.

For Leave Purpose

1 - 15 December 1994 only working days (5 days/week) will be counted and deducted from the staff member's leave balance.

Accrued Annual Leave

For mission appointees, i.e. those staff members holding appointment limited to service with UNAMIR, any unused accrued annual leave balance remaining at the expiry of the appointment (up to a maximum of 60 days) will be commuted to cash and included by Headquarters in the final salary payment. It follows therefore that annual leave may not be taken in conjunction with your repatriation. Should you wish to avail of any accrued annual leave, you should therefore do so prior to the last day of duty.

Other staff members (those on assignment from other duty stations) carry any accrued annual leave with them back to their official duty stations. Staff Rule 105.1(c) provides that annual leave may be accumulated, provided not more than twelve weeks (60 days) shall be carried forward beyond 1 January of any year. However, upon completion of a mission, any accumulation of annual leave which otherwise would have become subject to forfeiture during mission service may be utilized to cover all or part of an authorized period of post-mission leave. Any such leave not utilized within four months following departure from the mission area shall be forfeited.

Please also note that NO MSA PAYMENT could be effected for leave taken following completion of mission assignment and prior to your return to your official duty station or place of repatriation. For annual leave taken during the mission assignment, MSA is payable at the rate of one and one-half (1 1/2) days of MSA for each completed month of service with the mission.

1. Further to the Administrative Instructions No. 006/94 and 006/94 Amdt. 1, I am pleased to inform you that the Office of Human Resources Management has now approved the inclusion of Nairobi in UNAMIR mission area for R & R purposes.

2. Staff members are also advised that para 3 of AI 006/94 is hereby amended:

"3. R & R entitlement consists of a full three working days off at the end of the qualifying period. This is not cumulative and may be taken after the entitlement has been established as per para 4 below. Accumulation of credit toward the next period of R&R does not commence until return from the previous R&R. R&R may be combined with annual leave, provided the exigencies of service permit a pro-longed absence. This latter is a decision for section heads on a case-by-case basis. It may not be combined with family visit or home leave travel."

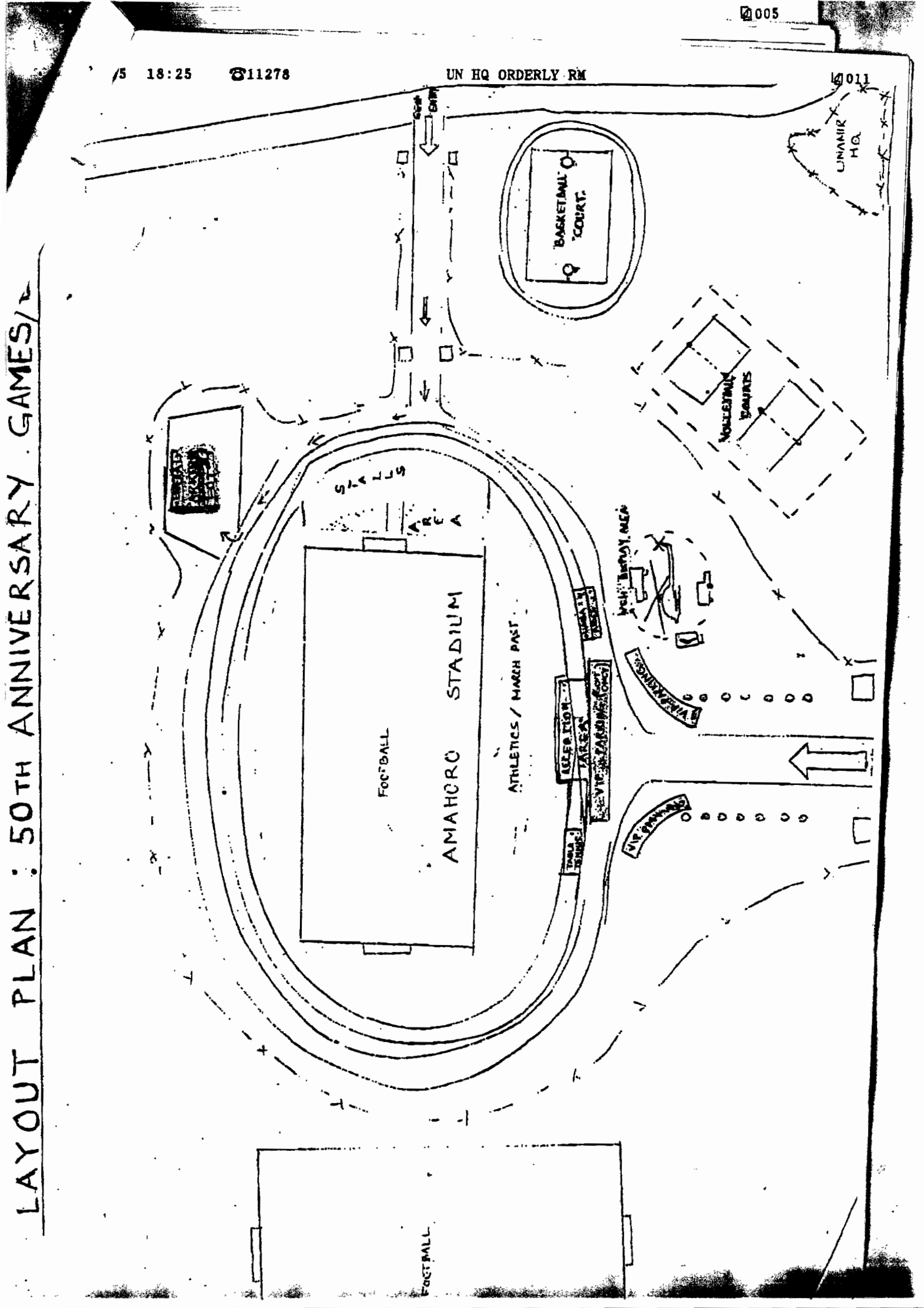

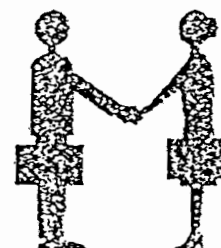
