

DAILY SITREP FOR 29 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 175 ALL FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 27,158 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 1B REPORTED SITUATION IN KAYENZI COMMUNE TO BE TENSE DUE TO ARBITRARY ARRESTS. THE NUMBER OF DETAINEES IN THE CACHOT HAVE INCREASED FROM 194 ON 23 NOV 95 TO 223 AS AT DATE. MOST OF THE ARRESTS TOOK PLACE LAST WEEKEND WHEN THE IPJ WAS NOT AVAILABLE. THE IPJ REQUESTED A MEETING WITH SECTOR COMMANDER WHICH HAS BEEN SCHEDULED TO BE HELD IN THE PRESENCE OF HR REPS.

(2) MILOB SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT RPA HAS ARRESTED UNKNOWN NUMBER OF LOCALS FROM BAYI (GR 4694) AND SOVU (GR 5188) FOR ALLEGEDLY HAVING LINKS WITH THE FRGF. THE LOCALS REPORTED THAT A PRISONER MR. JOSEPH HABYARIMANA WHO WAS ARRESTED THREE MONTHS AGO, WAS BEING TORTURED DAILY.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5C REPORTED THE TRANSFER OF 21 PRISONERS FROM CYANYANZA (GR 5465) TO KIBUYE PRISON. THE SOUS- PREFECT WAS RELUCTANT TO CONFIRM WHETHER MALE VISITORS WERE ALLOWED INSIDE THE SOUS-PREFECTURE CACHOT OR NOT. ALSO IN MUHORORO (GR 5062), LOCALS REPORTED THE ARREST OF FIVE PERSONS ON 24 NOV 95 BY THE BWAKIRA COMMUNAL POLICE ON CHARGES OF PARTICIPATING IN THE GENOCIDE. ALL ARE BEING HELD IN BWAKIRA COMMUNE CACHOT.

(4) IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA), MILOBS REPORTED THE ARREST OF SIX WOMEN IN NGARAMA COMMUNE FOR HAVING KILLED UNKNOWN NUMBER OF PEOPLE BY POISONING. ANOTHER WOMAN WAS ARRESTED FOR A MINOR OFFENCE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 1B REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 05/06 NOV 95, IN MPANGA SECTOR, A MAN WAS ROBBED OF 164,000 RWF BY A GROUP OF NINE MEN, TWO OF WHOM WERE ARMED AND IN UNIFORM. THE SAME GANG ROBBED ANOTHER BUSINESSMAN OF 75,000 RWF ON THE SAME NIGHT.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5C WERE INFORMED BY AN RPA SOLDIER OF ARMED ROBBERIES AND BREAK-INS BY FOUR UNIFORMED ARMED MEN IN MUGUBA (GR 2463) ON THE NIGHT OF 27 NOV 95. A TOTAL OF 150,000 RWF WAS STOLEN IN THE THEFTS. INVESTIGATION BY THE RPA IS IN PROGRESS.

(3) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT AT APPROX 1300 HRS ON 29 NOV 95, A UNHCR WATER TRUCK HIT A MINE NEAR KIBUMBA CAMP IN GOMA. DETAILS LATER.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. ON 29 NOV 95, THE FC VISITED MALAWICOY AND MILOBS SUB SECTOR AT BUGARAMA. HE RECEIVED AN UPDATE ON THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 51 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM KIBUNGO. 22 RETURNEES WAS EVAC. A TOTAL OF 153 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED 20 TONS OF SAND FOR MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE (MOTHER TERESA GP) FROM RUNDA TO KIGALI.

C. GHANBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO THE RPA TO CONVEY FOODSTUFF FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE AND COMMENCED WORK ON FENCING OF WFP WAREHOUSE AT BIRENGA.

D. MALICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD STUFF FROM GIKONGORO TO BUTARE AND TWO TRUCKS TO MILOB GP HQ BUTARE FOR TRANSPORTING BUILDING MATERIAL.

E. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO GISUMA COMMUNE TO TRANSPORT GRAVEL FOR ROAD MAINTENANCE.

F. NICOY PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING SOLDIERS. ALSO TRANSPORTED THE DEAD BODY OF A RPA SOLDIER FROM MUKAMIRA TO KANOMBE GENERAL HOSPITAL.

G. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED THREE DUMPERS FOR DESTRUCTION OF

EXPIRED RATIONS, ONE DOZER FOR REHABILITATION CENTRE IN KIGALI, A EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER FOR LAYING OF LINE IN TRANSIT CAMP AND RECOVERED A GRENADE IN KIGALI. ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

H. FORCE SIGNAL COY PROVIDED ASSISTANCE TO RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES. ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO LOCAL NGO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

I. UNAMIR MEDICS TREATED TOTAL OF 234 MEDICAL AND 37 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. MILOBS IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) REPORTED THE UNUSUAL SIGHTING OF A HELI/SMALL FIXED WING AIRCRAFT FLYING AT AN ALTITUDE OF APPROX 1500 FEET FROM SOUTH TO NORTH, PARALLEL TO THE ZAIRIAN COAST AND ON THE WESTERN COAST OF IJWI ISLAND. THIS SIGHTING WAS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND AND IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT THE DESTINATION OF THE AIRCRAFT WAS POSSIBLY GOMA.

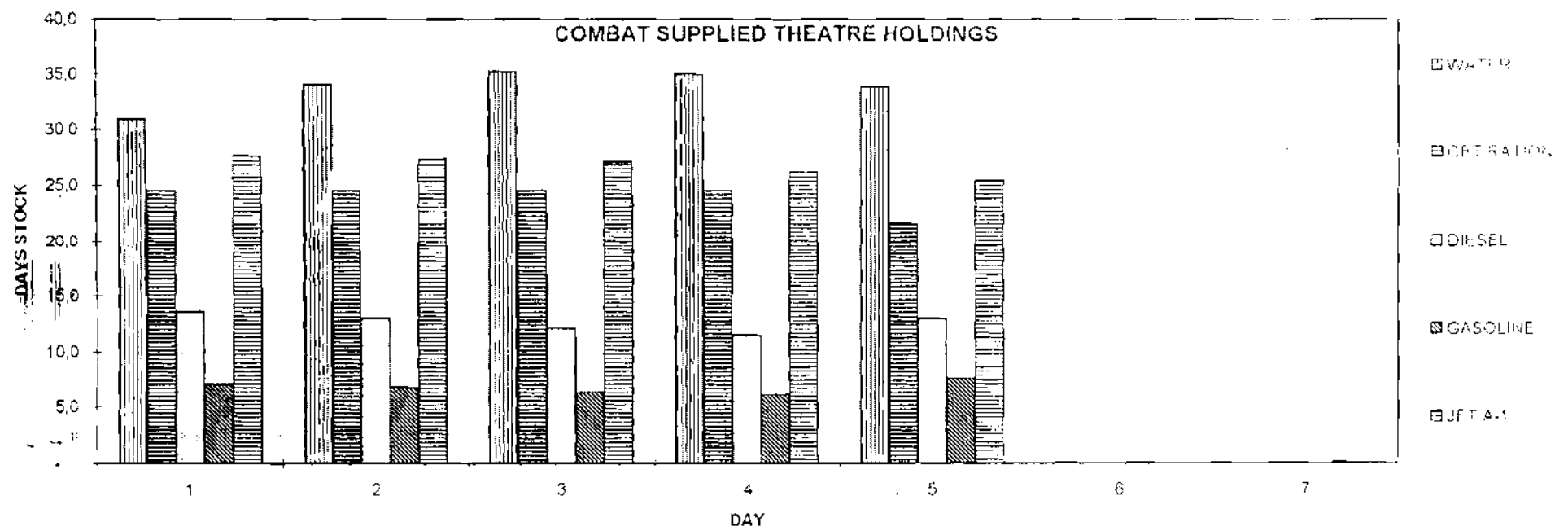

MOST OF THE ARRESTS TOOK PLACE LAST WEEKEND WHEN THE IPJ WAS NOT AVAILABLE. THE IPJ REQUESTED A MEETING WITH SECTOR COMMANDER WHICH HAS BEEN SCHEDULED TO BE HELD IN THE PRESENCE OF HR REPS.

(2) MILOB SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT RPA HAS ARRESTED UNKNOWN NUMBER OF LOCALS FROM BAYI (GR 4694) AND SOVU (GR 5188) FOR ALLEGEDLY HAVING LINKS WITH THE FRGF. THE LOCALS REPORTED THAT A PRISONER MR. JOSEPH HABYARIMANA WHO WAS ARRESTED THREE MONTHS AGO, WAS BEING TORTURED DAILY.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5C REPORTED THE TRANSFER OF 21 PRISONERS FROM CYANYANZA (GR 5465) TO KIBUYE PRISON. THE SOUS- PREFECT WAS RELUCTANT TO CONFIRM WHETHER MALE VISITORS WERE ALLOWED INSIDE THE SOUS-PREFECTURE CACHOT OR NOT. ALSO IN MUHORORO (GR 5062), LOCALS REPORTED THE ARREST OF FIVE PERSONS ON 24 NOV 95 BY THE BWAKIRA COMMUNAL POLICE ON CHARGES OF PARTICIPATING IN THE GENOCIDE. ALL ARE BEING HELD IN BWAKIRA COMMUNE CACHOT.

(4) IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA), MILOBS REPORTED THE ARREST OF SIX WOMEN IN NGARAMA COMMUNE FOR HAVING KILLED UNKNOWN NUMBER OF PEOPLE BY POISONING. ANOTHER WOMAN WAS ARRESTED FOR A MINOR OFFENCE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 1B REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 05/06 NOV 95, IN MPANGA SECTOR, A MAN WAS ROBBED OF 164,000 RWF BY A GROUP OF NINE MEN, TWO OF WHOM WERE ARMED AND IN UNIFORM. THE SAME GANG ROBBED ANOTHER BUSINESSMAN OF 75,000 RWF ON THE SAME NIGHT.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5C WERE INFORMED BY AN RPA SOLDIER OF ARMED ROBBERIES AND BREAK-INS BY FOUR UNIFORMED ARMED MEN IN MUGUBA (GR 2463) ON THE NIGHT OF 27 NOV 95. A TOTAL OF 150,000 RWF WAS STOLEN IN THE THEFTS. INVESTIGATION BY THE RPA IS IN PROGRESS.

(3) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT AT APPROX 1300 HRS ON 29 NOV 95, A UNHCR WATER TRUCK HIT A MINE NEAR KIBUMBA CAMP IN GOMA. DETAILS LATER.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. ON 29 NOV 95, THE FC VISITED MALAWICOY AND MILOBS SUB SECTOR AT BUGARAMA. HE RECEIVED AN UPDATE ON THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 51 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM KIBUNGO. 22 RETURNEES WAS EVAC. A TOTAL OF 153 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED 20 TONS OF SAND FOR MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE (MOTHER TERESA GP) FROM RUNDA TO KIGALI.

C. GHANBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO THE RPA TO CONVEY FOODSTUFF FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE AND COMMENCED WORK ON FENCING OF WFP WAREHOUSE AT BIRENGA.

D. MALICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD STUFF FROM GIKONGORO TO BUTARE AND TWO TRUCKS TO MILOB GP HQ BUTARE FOR TRANSPORTING BUILDING MATERIAL.

E. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO GISUMA COMMUNE TO TRANSPORT GRAVEL FOR ROAD MAINTENANCE.

F. NICOY PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING SOLDIERS. ALSO TRANSPORTED THE DEAD BODY OF A RPA SOLDIER FROM MUKAMIRA TO KANOMBE GENERAL HOSPITAL.

G. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED THREE DUMPERS FOR DESTRUCTION OF

EXPIRED RATIONS, ONE DOZER FOR REHABILITATION CENTRE IN KIGALI, A EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER FOR LAYING OF LINE IN TRANSIT CAMP AND RECOVERED A GRENADE IN KIGALI. ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

H. FORCE SIGNAL COY PROVIDED ASSISTANCE TO RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES. ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO LOCAL NGO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

I. UNAMIR MEDICS TREATED TOTAL OF 234 MEDICAL AND 37 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. MILOBS IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) REPORTED THE UNUSUAL SIGHTING OF A HELI/SMALL FIXED WING AIRCRAFT FLYING AT AN ALTITUDE OF APPROX 1500 FEET FROM SOUTH TO NORTH, PARALLEL TO THE ZAIRIAN COAST AND ON THE WESTERN COAST OF IJWI ISLAND. THIS SIGHTING WAS THE FIRST OF ITS KIND AND IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT THE DESTINATION OF THE AIRCRAFT WAS POSSIBLY GOMA.

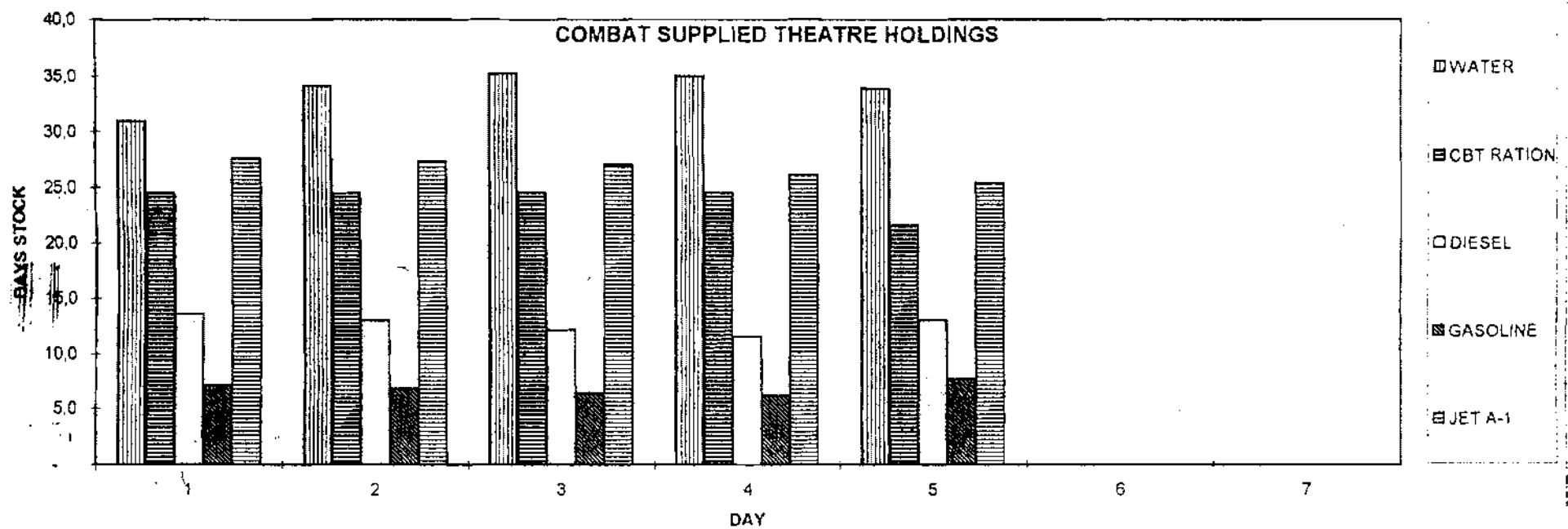



DAILY SITREP FOR 28 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 89. 88 ARE FROM ZAIRE AND 01 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,983 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA)-RPA CONDUCTED A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN RUNDA COMMUNE (GR 9882) IN AN AREA WHERE A LOT OF NGOS, MOSTLY RELIGIOUS ONES, ARE OPERATING. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT ANOTHER CATHOLIC FATHER/BROTHER IS ON THE WANTED LIST OF THE RPA.

(2) SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE)- MILOBS REPORTED THAT IN MUGANDA CELLULE, LOCALS COMPLAINED OVER THEIR INABILITY TO VISIT ARRESTED RELATIVES IN THE BIRAMBO (GR 4368) SOUS-PREFECTURE CACHOT AND THE KIBUYE PRISON. THE LOCALS CLAIMED MALES WHO WENT TO THOSE PLACES WERE ARRESTED. THESE DEVELOPMENTS HAVE PROMPTED INCREASED SUSPICION AMONG THE LOCALS THAT THEIR RELATIVES MIGHT HAVE BEEN KILLED.

(3) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 27 NOV 95, RPA FIRED AT SUSPECTED BANDITS MOVING IN A CANOE ON LAKE KIVU IN THE AREA OF MURWA PENINSULA (GR 973415). NO CAS WERE REPORTED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(4) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA WAS APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE SITING OF A UN MARKED BEECHCRAFT WHICH CROSSED OVER THE BORDER INTO GOMA ON 28 NOV 95. THIS INCIDENT TOOK PLACE POSSIBLY BECAUSE OF A LACK OF COORDINATION BETWEEN THE AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL AT KIGALI AND THE RPA.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 23 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM KIBUNGO. NO RETURNEE WAS EVAC. A TOTAL NO OF 124 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

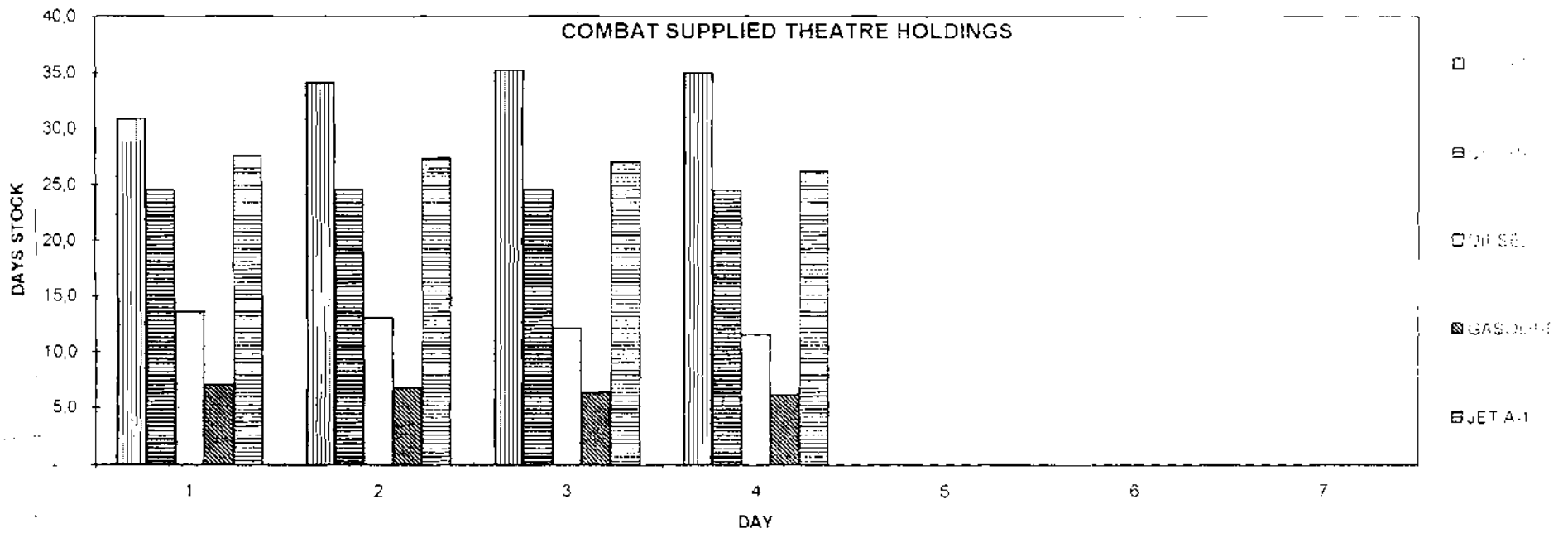

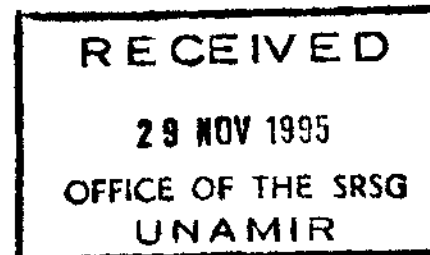

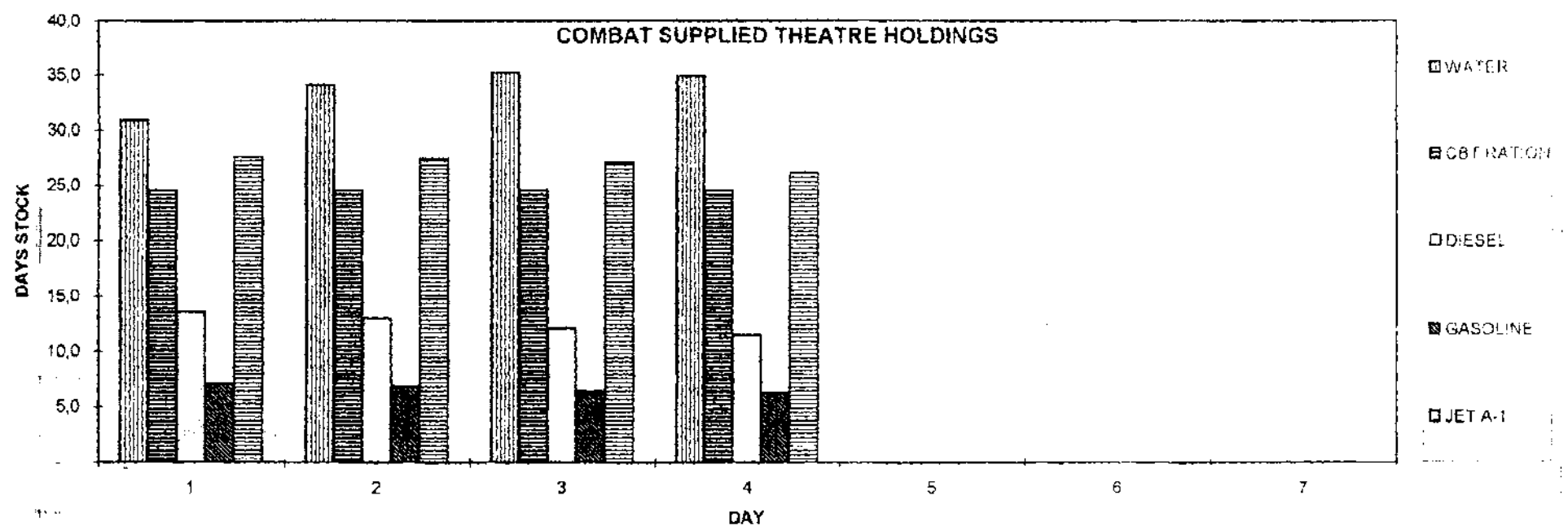

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 20 NOV TO 27 NOV 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 779. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON 21 NOVEMBER AT THE HOTEL DES MILLE COLLINES IN KIGALI, THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER, MR. PIERRE CÉLESTIN RWIGEMA, OPENED A THREE-DAY THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS ON REPATRIATION, REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL REINTEGRATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. THE PARTICIPANTS INCLUDED SEVERAL SENIOR RWANDAN GOVERNMENT FIGURES AS WELL AS ALL AMBASSADORS TO RWANDA AND OTHER PROMINENT MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS. THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN THE CONSULTATIONS, AT WHICH HE WAS INVITED TO MAKE AN OPENING ADDRESS WHERE HE CONVEYED TO THE MEETING THE SECRETARY-GENERAL MR. BOUTROS BOUTROS-GHALI'S SUPPORT AND WISHES FOR SUCCESS IN ACHIEVING ITS OBJECTIVES. THE SRSG ALSO EMPHASIZED THE NEED FOR AN IMPROVEMENT IN REGIONAL RELATIONSHIPS IN ORDER TO ENCOURAGE THE RETURN OF THE REFUGEES. HE CALLED FOR THE PURSUIT OF SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT THROUGH EFFECTIVE COOPERATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT, THE UN AGENCIES AND THE DONOR COMMUNITY, AS THE BEST WAY TO ACHIEVE NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND RECOVERY.

B. THE CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 23 NOV 95. THE SRSG WELCOMED HIM AT THE AIRPORT AND THEN ACCOMPANIED HIM TO A MEETING WITH H.E. THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME AND THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MR. ANASTASE GASANA. THE SRSG LATER HELD A MEETING WITH MR. IAN MARTIN, CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION FOR RWANDA, WITH WHOM HE DISCUSSED MATTERS OF MUTUAL CONCERN.

C. THE SRSG HELD A PRESS BRIEFING ON 24 NOV 95 AT WHICH HE STATED THAT THE VISIT OF THE PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA (ICTR), JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, PROVED HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL, AS HE HAD BEEN ABLE TO ANNOUNCE THAT THE FIRST INDICTMENTS WOULD BE ISSUED AROUND 12 DEC 95. THE SRSG INDICATED THAT THE ICTR HAD THE FULL BACKING OF THE RWANDA GOVERNMENT AND THAT EVEN KENYA NOW FAVOURS THE TRIALS.

D. ON THE PRISONS ISSUE, THE SRSG OBSERVED THAT TO DATE, 4,307 PRISONERS HAD BEEN TRANSFERRED TO THE NSINDA DETENTION CENTRE. HE INDICATED THAT THE REASON FOR THE DELAY IN THIS REGARD IS NOT A QUESTION OF POLITICAL WILL. THE PRISONERS THEMSELVES OFTEN DO NOT WANT TO LEAVE THEIR HOME PREFECTURES. NEVERTHELESS, IN THE COMING WEEK, ABOUT 5,000 WOULD HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED FROM OVER-CROWDED PRISONS TO THE NEW DETENTION CENTRES. ON THE SUBJECT OF UNAMIR'S MANDATE, THE SRSG STATED THAT UNAMIR'S PHASING OUT SCHEDULE WILL START FROM 08 DEC 95.

E. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 22 NOV 95 THAT PARTICIPANTS IN THE THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS HAD AGREED THAT RWANDA NEEDS US \$ 120 MILLION TO REHABILITATE RETURNEES. THE CONSULTATIONS WERE OFFICIALLY CLOSED BY THE DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER OF THE INTERIOR, COLONEL ALEXIS KANYARENGWE. THE RADIO ALSO REPORTED THAT SINCE LAST FRIDAY, THE ICRC HAD ASSISTED THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IN TRANSFERRING MORE THAN 3,000 DETAINEES FROM THE OVER-CROWDED PRISON AT KIBUNGO TO NSINDA DETENTION CENTRE.

F. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA REPORT OF 24 NOV 95, THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND COOPERATION, DR. ANASTASE GASANA, HAS INFORMED THE SECURITY COUNCIL THAT UNAMIR MANDATE EXPIRES ON 08 DEC 95. HE SAID THAT THE SECURITY OF RWANDA IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT AND UNAMIR PLAYS NO ROLE IN IT. HE FURTHER SAID THAT THE COUNTRY NEEDS FUNDS, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERS, DOCTORS, AGRICULTURE EXPERTS WHO CAN HELP IN BUILDING THE NATION PRACTICALLY. THEREFORE UNAMIR IS UNABLE TO HELP THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IN ITS PROGRAMME PRIORITIES.

G. THE RWANDESE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJ GEN PAUL KAGAME VISITED THE NYAKINAMA UNIVERSITY GR 597289 IN SECTOR 5A ON 25 NOV 95. THE PURPOSE OF THE VISIT IS NOT KNOWN.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA). MILOBS RECEIVED AN UNCONFIRMED REPORT AT A VACCINATION CENTRE THAT A SECRET DETENTION FACILITY EXISTED IN NYAKABANDA COMMUNE (6597) IN NGARU SECTOR (6303). THE REPORT FURTHER STATED THAT THE CENTRE HAS 80 INMATES WHO ARE BEING MALTREATED. INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT THE CENTRE IS NEAR A BRIDGE CALLED

MOUFOUMBA (660084) LINKING GITARAMA PREFECTURE TO RUHENGERI PREFECTURE. THE LOCALS ARE AFRAID TO SPEAK TO MILOBS. THE COUNCILLOR OF THE AREA CONFIRMED THE PRESENCE OF THE PRISON BUT SAID IT CONTAINS ONLY FOUR INMATES. MILOB TEAM WERE DENIED INFORMATION BY RPA GUARDS AT THE PRISON. A JOINT MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS PATROL WILL FURTHER INVESTIGATE THE REPORT.

(2) SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO). LAST WEEK, 20 OUT OF THE 47 PRISONERS IN MUSENGE COMMUNE CACHOT WERE RELEASED AFTER INVESTIGATIONS PROVED THAT THEY WERE NOT GUILTY. SECTOR MILOBS HAVE REPORTED THAT BODIES OF VICTIMS OF THE GENOCIDE ARE BEING RECOVERED AT A SITE NEAR THE MURAMBI SECONDARY SCHOOL WHICH WAS ALSO THE LOCATION OF A TUTSI CAMP. APPROXIMATELY 7000 BODIES HAVE BEEN RECOVERED AND IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THERE MAY BE UP TO 30,000 BODIES IN THAT LOCATION.

(3) IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), RPA CARRIED OUT CORDON AND SEARCH OP IN GIKONGORO ON 24 NOV 95. LOCALS WERE SCREENED AND THEIR HOUSES WERE SEARCHED. THE PREFECT SAID EFFORTS WERE BEING MADE TO IDENTIFY A GROUP OF PEOPLE INVOLVED IN BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD. RPA LATER REPORTED HAVING RECOVERED SOME ITEMS BUT GAVE NO FURTHER DETAILS.

(4) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 23 NOV 95 FROM 0600-0630 HRS, AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE TOOK PLACE BETWEEN TWO RPA PATROLS AT GITONGO SECTOR (GR 0445). THE PATROLS WHICH WERE DEPLOYED ON 22 NOV 95, TOOK EACH OTHER FOR FRGF/INTERHAMWE AFTER FAILING TO IDENTIFY THEMSELVES. DETAILS OF CASUALTIES IS NOT KNOWN.

(5) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 1507 ON 23 NOV 95, RPA SOLDIERS OPENED FIRE ON LOCALS FISHING IN LAKE KIVU WHERE FISHING IS BANNED. THE FIRING TOOK PLACE AT KABEKERA CELL (GR 019415). NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED BUT LOCALS WERE ANGERED BY THE SHOOTING AND ARE SEEKING RECOURSE THROUGH LOCAL AUTHORITIES. RPA EXPLAINED THAT THIS MEASURE IS NECESSARY AS FRGF RETURN TO IJWI ISLAND BY DAY USING STOLEN BOATS AND INFILTRATE AT NIGHT MIXED WITH THE LOCAL FISHERMEN.

(6) SECTOR 4 - MILOBS REPORTED A SHOOTING INCIDENT BETWEEN 0643-0648 HRS IN MURURU SECTOR (GR 7521). SEMI AUTOMATIC FIRE WAS HEARD FOLLOWED BY AUTOMATIC FIRE. RPA DENIES THAT THE INCIDENT TOOK PLACE. FIRING WAS REPEATED THREE TIMES AFTER 0648 HRS BETWEEN RUSUZI I AND RUSUZI II. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(7) SECTOR 5C- MILOBS REPORTED THE ARREST OF 04 PERSONS

BY RPA ON 17 NOV 95 IN MURAMBO SECTOR OF GISEBEYO COMMUNE (GR 2150) DURING A WEDDING. THE ARRESTED PERSONS ARE BEING DETAINED IN GAKINA (GR 2952) MILITARY CACHOT. THE RPA REPORTEDLY ALSO KILLED ONE LOCAL DURING THE INCIDENT.

(8) IN SECTOR 1A, MILOBS REPORTED THE OUTBREAK OF A FIRE AT YAMAHA SPARE PARTS CENTRE IN KIGALI CITY ON 24 NOV 95 AT 0400 HRS. A JOINT TEAM FROM UNAMIR AND RWANDA FIRE BRIGADE BROUGHT THE FIRE UNDER CONTROL BY 1000 HRS. GOODS WORTH MILLIONS OF RWF WERE DESTROYED IN THE FIRE.

(9) MILOBS SECTOR 5B REPORTED AN ENCOUNTER BETWEEN RPA AND INSURGENTS IN BYAHI SECTOR (GR 1917) ON THE NIGHT OF 14 NOV 95. THE RPA HAS REPORTEDLY IMPOSED NIGHT CURFEW IN THE AREA FOLLOWING THE INCIDENT. DETAILED REPORT WILL FOLLOW.

(10) SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) - LOCALS INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 23 NOVEMBER 1995, RPA BEAT UP A LOCAL AND SUBSEQUENTLY TOOK HIM FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT TO MUHIMA HOSPITAL WHERE HE DIED THE FOLLOWING DAY AT 0100 HRS. THE DECEASED WAS BURIED BEHIND THE HOSPITAL AT 1000 HRS ON 25 NOV 1995.

(11) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - THE COUNSELLOR OF TENYO SECTOR (GR 7459), A HUTU, WAS ROBBED OF MONEY AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AT NIGHT BY 10 RPA SOLDIERS. THE SAME RPA SOLDIERS ALSO BEAT UP THREE LDF MEMBERS WHO HAD RUSHED TO THE COUNSELLORS HOUSE ON HEARING 04 SHOTS FIRED BY THE RPA SOLDIERS.

(12) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - RPA IMPOSED A CURFEW FROM 1900 HRS TO 0500 HRS IN NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR FOR AN UNSPECIFIED PERIOD. THIS CURFEW FOLLOWS THE IMPOSITION OF A BAN ON FISHING ON LAKE KIVU FROM 22 NOV 1995 TO DETER FRGF INFILTRATIONS FROM IJWI ISLAND.

(13) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT A LOCAL WAS ARRESTED BY THE RPA ON 26 NOV 95 AND TAKEN TO AN UNKNOWN PLACE. THE INDIVIDUAL FROM WHOM THE DETAINEE HAD BOUGHT A PIECE OF LAND RECENTLY, HAD REPORTEDLY ACCOMPANIED THE RPA TO THE HOUSE FOR THE ARREST.

(14) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5B WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS OF KIVUMU SECTOR GR 2303 THAT A MAN, WHO WAS A PART OF A EIGHT MAN INFILTRATION TEAM WHICH HAD ENTERED RWANDA FROM ZAIRE, WAS CAUGHT BY THE RPA ON 25 NOV 95. A NUMBER OF MINES AND GRENS WERE RECOVERED FROM THE INFILTRATOR.

(15) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) MILOBS WERE INFORMED BY A SOURCE

THAT RPA IS PLANNING/ HAS COMMENCED LAYING MINES ALONG SHORES OF LAKE KIVU BETWEEN NYAMASHEKE AND GISENYI. THIS IS PROBABLY AIMED AT PREVENTING FRGF/INTERHAMWE INFILTRATION. INFORMATION IS YET TO BE CONFIRMED.

(16) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - MILOB TEAM TO TABWE COMMUNE REPORTED THAT A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION WAS CARRIED OUT BY RPA ON 21 NOV 95 TO APPREHEND LOCALS WHO DID NOT BELONG TO THE COMMUNE BUT WERE STAYING THERE AS A RESULT OF THEIR PROBABLE INVOLVEMENT IN CERTAIN OFFENSES DURING THE WAR. 26 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED AND LATER SENT TO THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES. IN MOST COMMUNES THESE PEOPLE ARE SAID TO BE TREATED AS PRISONERS AND ON ARRIVAL, ARE IMMEDIATELY DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

B. **MILITIA/FRGF**

(1) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI). MILOBS WERE INFORMED IN RAMBURA SECTOR (4514) THAT FOUR BOYS WERE ARRESTED AND DETAINED IN CONNECTION WITH THE ANTI PERS MINE BLAST ON THE 12 AND 15 NOV 95.

(2) LOCALS INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 18 NOV 95, IN NDORA (4717), FIVE PERS IN MILITARY UNIFORM RANSACKED A SHOPKEEPER'S HOUSE AND STOLE AN AMOUNT OF 70,000 RWF. ON THE SAME DAY, ANOTHER GROUP OF THREE PERS IN UNIFORM STOLE 30,000 RWF AT BIREMBO (GR 5713).

(3) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI). MILOBS WERE INFORMED THAT ON 18 NOV 95 AT BUSUMBA SECTEUR (GR 2727), INFILTRATORS ABDUCTED ONE PERSON WHOSE WHEREABOUTS IS STILL UNKNOWN. RPA WERE LATER INFO BY LOCALS AT NYAMIRANGO SECTEUR (GR 3218), ABOUT MOV OF LARGE NUMBER OF INFILTRATORS (ABOUT 50) SOME OF WHOM WERE IN UNIFORM AND WERE REPORTEDLY CARRYING WEAPONS. FIVE INFILTRATORS WERE APPREHENDED BY RPA AND RIFLES, GRENADES AND MINES WERE RECOVERED FROM THEM.

(4) SECTOR 3A - GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN THE AREA. BANDITRY ACTIVITIES ARE SAID TO BE ON THE INCREASE IN RWAMIKO COMMUNE. THE BANDITS ARMED WITH CUTLASSES AND WOODEN HAMMERS ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE COME FROM MUDASOMWA AND BUTARE. SOME TWAS FROM BUHORO SECTOR ARE ALSO SAID TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THESE ACTIVITIES.

(5) SECTOR 4 - ON 17 NOV 95 IN KIGABIRO CELL GR 8416 OF NYAKABUYE COMMUNE, SIX BANDITS ATTACKED THE HOUSE OF A LOCAL WHO WAS ON A PATROL WITH THE RPA AND SERIOUSLY INJURED HIS WIFE. MOTIVE FOR THE ATTACK IS NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATION BY THE RPA IS IN PROGRESS.

(6) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 22 NOV

95 AT ABOUT 2240 HRS, AN ELECTRIC PYLON WAS BLOWN UP AT MUDUMDANO SECTOR, RWENGERO CELL (GR 006413). THE BLAST ONLY BENT THE PYLON AND POWER SUPPLY WAS NOT CUT. FRGF/INTERHAMWE OR THEIR SYMPATHIZERS ARE BEING SUSPECTED. THE TYPE OF EXPLOSIVE USED REMAINS UNKNOWN AND NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED.

(7) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), UNSUBSTANTIATED REPORTS RECEIVED BY MILOBS INDICATE THAT A TRUCK LOADED WITH LEAFLETS CARRYING NAMES OF PEOPLE IN RWANDA WHOM THE INTERHAMWE INTENDS TO ASSASSINATE, WAS SEEN IN NYAMASHEKE SECTOR. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA). THE SECTOR COMDR VISITED THE GITARAMA PRISON WITH DR KRITIANSEN, HEAD OF NORMED, AND REPS OF UNAMIR HQ G2 CELL ON 21 NOV 95. APPROXIMATELY 2000 INMATES HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO THE NEW PART OF THE PRISON.

(3) THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR AND A REP FROM THE CANADIAN EMBASSY CALLED ON THE FC ON 24 NOV 95, TO DISCUSS ISSUES OF MUTUAL CONCERN. LATER IN THE DAY, THE FC VISITED THE INDBATT COY LOC AT TRAFIPRO AND THE MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

(4) A PATROL LED BY THE SECTOR COMMANDER OF SECTOR 2B, VISITED AKEGERA NATIONAL PARK TO ASCERTAIN REPORTS OF FRGF INFILTRATION IN THE AREA. THE TEAM COULD NOT FIND ANY EVIDENCE OF INFILTRATION. HOWEVER THERE IS A LARGE SCALE PRESENCE OF RPA IN THE AREA.

(5) FORCE ENGINEER COY ORGANISED A MINE AWARENESS LECTURE IN NICOY LOCATION ON 25 NOV 95, WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY NICOY TROOPS AND NGOS.

D. OTHER SECTORS NTR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 62 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. MEDICAL PERSONNEL FROM MALAWICOY HAVE MOVED TO BWEYEYE AND NYUNGWE TO ASSIST LOCALS IN NATIONAL ANTI-POLIO VACCINE CAMPAIGN.

C. FORCE ENGINEER COY DEPLOYED A DOZER EACH FOR A REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI AND FOR MAKING A PLAY GROUND IN COMMUNAL POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL NEAR RWAMAGANA.

D. A TOTAL OF 101 IDPs ARE AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

E. A TOTAL OF 987 MEDICAL AND 90 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY MEDICAL STAFF IN RWANDA DURING THE WEEK.

F. INDBATT TRANSPORTED BRIDGING MATERIAL FOR SALVATION ARMY FROM KIGALI TO KAYENZI (GR 8091) COMMUNE. RMO CARRIED OUT MEDICAL CHECK OF 121 ORPHANS AT MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

G. FORCE ENGR COY DESPATCHED THREE DUMPERS WITH CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL TO MT KARONGI SITE FOR THE NEW TRANSMITTER AND PROVIDED ONE SECTION FOR SECURITY DUTY IN KIGALI WHERE RATION DESTRUCTION WAS BEING CARRIED OUT.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. IN SECTOR 5A, MILOB TEAM THAT PATROLLED GAHUNGA SECTOR (6440) ON 20 NOV 95 WERE INFORMED THAT FOUR CHILDREN DETONATED AN ANTI-PERSONNEL RIFLE GRENADE IN A GARDEN WHILE PLAYING WITH IT. ONE OF THE CHILDREN LOST TWO FINGERS WHILE THE OTHER THREE SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. THEY HAVE ALL BEEN ADMITTED AT THE RUHENGERRI HOSPITAL. MILOBS LATER DISCOVERED 2 X GRENADES AND 1 X ANTI PERS RIFLE GRENADE IN THE SAME AREA. LOCAL RPA COMDR AND ENGINEERS HAVE PROMISED TO DESTROY THE DEVICES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

B. IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), THE PREFECT ADMITTED THE URGENCY IN HAVING A BOURGMESTRE IN TABA COMMUNE WHERE TENSIONS ARE ON THE RISE. HE ALSO WANTS TO MEET WITH THE BOURGMESTRE OF NTONGWE COMMUNE TO DISCUSS RECENT WAVES OF ARRESTS WHICH HAVE BEEN LINKED TO HIS ARRIVAL.

C. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) - THERE IS A REPORT OF AN ACCOUNTANT IN KIGERAMA WHO HAS BEEN MISSING SINCE 18 NOV 95. ALL ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE HIM BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES HAVE BEEN FUTILE. MILOBS ARE INVESTIGATING.

D. IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), MILOBS REPORTED THAT LOCALS ARE NERVOUS REGARDING THE IMMINENT WITHDRAWAL OF UNAMIR.

E. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT A DELEGATION OF FIVE REFUGEES ARRIVED IN THE SECTOR FROM ZAIRE ON A VISIT AIMED AT CONFIDENCE BUILDING. THEY WERE WARMLY RECEIVED BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES ON ARRIVAL. THE DELEGATION VISITED MURURU (GR 7521), MUTONGO (GR 7430) AND CYETE (GR 7618) SECTORS OF CYIMBOGO COMMUNE. THEY ALSO MET WITH OTHER RETURNEES. THE VISIT WHICH WAS ARRANGED BY UNHCR, WAS REPORTEDLY SUCCESSFUL.

F. IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), MILOBS REPORTED THAT AN AGREEMENT WAS SIGNED BETWEEN THE GERMAN AMBASSADOR, MR AUGUST HAMMEL, AND THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU ON 26 NOV 95 FOR A GRANT OF 500 MILLION RWANDAN FRANCS AS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE PREFECTURE.

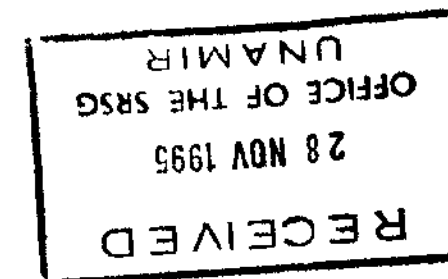

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 144, ALL FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,894 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE SRSG ATTENDED A MILITARY BRIEFING AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS. LATER, HE HELD A MEETING WITH MR. HASEGAWA, RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE OF UNDP, ON POST CONFLICT PEACE BUILDING SUPPORT FOR RWANDA. FINALLY, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR. BRUNO NPONDA, THE UNESCO REPRESENTATIVE AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING UNAMIR RADIO.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) MILOBS WERE INFORMED BY A SOURCE THAT RPA IS PLANNING/ HAS COMMENCED LAYING MINES ALONG SHORES OF LAKE KIVU BETWEEN NYAMASHEKE AND GISENYI. THIS IS PROBABLY AIMED AT PREVENTING FRGF/INTERAMWE INFILTRATION. INFORMATION IS YET TO BE CONFIRMED.

(2) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - MILOB TEAM TO TABWE COMMUNE REPORTED THAT A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION WAS CARRIED OUT BY RPA ON 21 NOV 95 TO APPREHEND LOCALS WHO DID NOT BELONG TO THE COMMUNE BUT WERE STAYING THERE AS A RESULT OF THEIR PROBABLE INVOLVEMENT IN CERTAIN OFFENSES DURING THE WAR. 26 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED AND LATER SENT TO THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES. IN MOST COMMUNES THESE PEOPLE ARE SAID TO BE TREATED AS PRISONERS AND ON ARRIVAL, ARE IMMEDIATELY DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), UNSUBSTANTIATED REPORTS RECEIVED BY MILOBS INDICATE THAT A TRUCK LOADED WITH LEAFLETS CARRYING NAMES OF PEOPLE IN RWANDA WHOM THE INTERHAMWE INTENDS TO ASSASSINATE, WAS SEEN IN NYAMASHEKE SECTOR. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. NO RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP. 88 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KANZENZE, KIBUNGO, GISENYI AND KIGALI. A TOTAL NO OF 101 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

B. INDBATT PROVIDED TRANSPORT FOR MOVING OF FURNITURE FROM GITARAMA TO GIKOMERO.

C. GHANBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO THE RPA TO CONVEY FOODSTUFF FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO.

D. MALICOY PROVIDED AMBULANCE FOR TRANSPORTING TWO INJURED PERSONS FROM GIKONGORO TO KIGEME HOSPITAL, TWO TRUCKS TO MILOBS HQ IN BUTARE FOR TRANSPORTING PRISONERS, TWO TRUCKS TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO BUTARE AND ONE TRUCK TO TROCAIRE FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD FROM GIKONGORO TO VARIOUS COMMUNES.

E. NICOY TRANSPORTED FIVE TONS OF STATIONERY TO KARAGO COMMUNE.

F. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING FIRE WOOD, DESPATCHED THREE DUMPERS WITH CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL TO MT KARONGI SITE FOR THE NEW TRANSMITTER AND PROVIDED ONE SECTION FOR SECURITY DUTY IN KIGALI WHERE RATION DESTRUCTION WAS BEING CARRIED OUT.

G. FORCE SIGNAL COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUGALIKA TO NYAMAHURU.

H. SECTOR 2A BYUMBA MILOB PATROLS TO TUMBA GR 9912 AND MURAMBI GR 2908 COMMUNES, DISTRIBUTED EIGHT CARTONS OF ORAL REHYDRATION SALT TO THE HEALTH CENTRES IN EACH COMMUNE.

I. UNAMIR MEDICS TREATED A TOTAL OF 186 MEDICAL AND 20 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT A DELEGATION

OF FIVE REFUGEES ARRIVED IN THE SECTOR FROM ZAIRE ON A VISIT AIMED AT CONFIDENCE BUILDING. THEY WERE WARMLY RECEIVED BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES ON ARRIVAL. 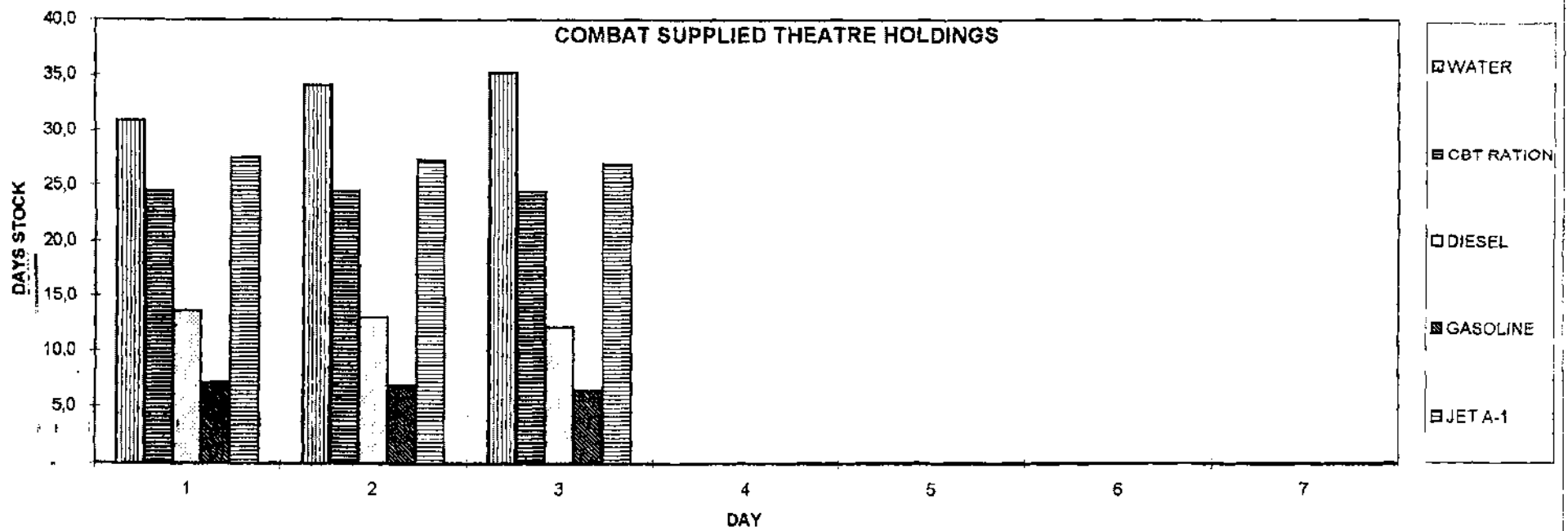

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POST'S AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 144, ALL FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,894 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE SRSG ATTENDED A MILITARY BRIEFING AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS. LATER, HE HELD A MEETING WITH MR. HASEGAWA, RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE OF UNDP, ON POST CONFLICT PEACE BUILDING SUPPORT FOR RWANDA. FINALLY, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR BRUNO NPONDA, THE UNESCO REPRESENTATIVE AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING UNAMIR RADIO.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) MILOBS WERE INFORMED BY A SOURCE THAT RPA IS PLANNING/ HAS COMMENCED LAYING MINES ALONG SHORES OF LAKE KIVU BETWEEN NYAMASHEKE AND GISENYI. THIS IS PROBABLY AIMED AT PREVENTING FRGF/INTERAMWE INFILTRATION. INFORMATION IS YET TO BE CONFIRMED.

(2) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - MILOB TEAM TO TABWE COMMUNE REPORTED THAT A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION WAS CARRIED OUT BY RPA ON 21 NOV 95 TO APPREHEND LOCALS WHO DID NOT BELONG TO THE COMMUNE BUT WERE STAYING THERE AS A RESULT OF THEIR PROBABLE INVOLVEMENT IN CERTAIN OFFENSES DURING THE WAR. 26 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED AND LATER SENT TO THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES. IN MOST COMMUNES THESE PEOPLE ARE SAID TO BE TREATED AS PRISONERS AND ON ARRIVAL, ARE IMMEDIATELY DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), UNSUBSTANTIATED REPORTS RECEIVED BY MILOBS INDICATE THAT A TRUCK LOADED WITH LEAFLETS CARRYING NAMES OF PEOPLE IN RWANDA WHOM THE INTERHAMWE INTENDS TO ASSASSINATE, WAS SEEN IN NYAMASHEKE SECTOR. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

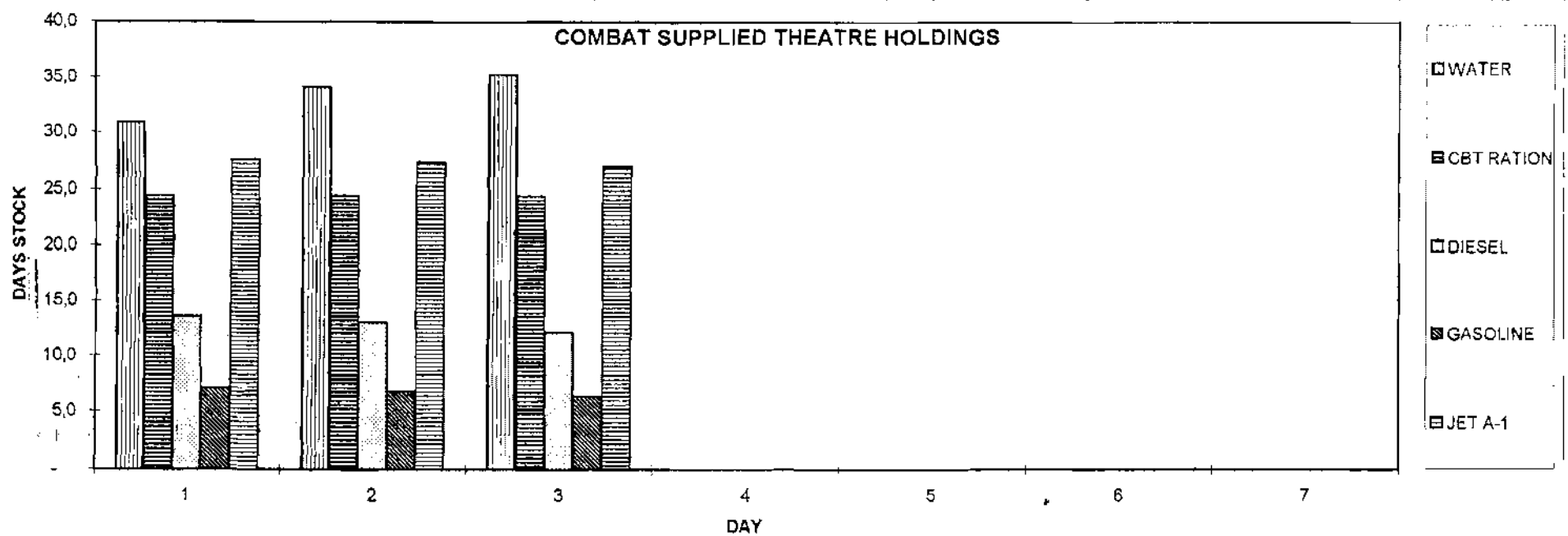

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 20 NOV TO 27 NOV 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 779. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON 21 NOVEMBER AT THE HOTEL DES MILLE COLLINES IN KIGALI, THE RWANDAN PRIME MINISTER, MR. PIERRE CÉLESTIN RWIGEMA, OPENED A THREE-DAY THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS ON REPATRIATION, REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL REINTEGRATION OF RWANDAN REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. THE PARTICIPANTS INCLUDED SEVERAL SENIOR RWANDAN GOVERNMENT FIGURES AS WELL AS ALL AMBASSADORS TO RWANDA AND OTHER PROMINENT MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS. THE SRSG PARTICIPATED IN THE CONSULTATIONS, AT WHICH HE WAS INVITED TO MAKE AN OPENING ADDRESS WHERE HE CONVEYED TO THE MEETING THE SECRETARY-GENERAL MR. BOUTROS BOUTROS-GHALI'S SUPPORT AND WISHES FOR SUCCESS IN ACHIEVING ITS OBJECTIVES. THE SRSG ALSO EMPHASIZED THE NEED FOR AN IMPROVEMENT IN REGIONAL RELATIONSHIPS IN ORDER TO ENCOURAGE THE RETURN OF THE REFUGEES. HE CALLED FOR THE PURSUIT OF SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT THROUGH EFFECTIVE COOPERATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT, THE UN AGENCIES AND THE DONOR COMMUNITY, AS THE BEST WAY TO ACHIEVE NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND RECOVERY.

B. THE CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 23 NOV 95. THE SRSG WELCOMED HIM AT THE AIRPORT AND THEN ACCOMPANIED HIM TO A MEETING WITH H.E. THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME AND THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MR. ANASTASE GASANA. THE SRSG LATER HELD A MEETING WITH MR. IAN MARTIN, CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION FOR RWANDA, WITH WHOM HE DISCUSSED MATTERS OF MUTUAL CONCERN.

C. THE SRSG HELD A PRESS BRIEFING ON 24 NOV 95 AT WHICH HE STATED THAT THE VISIT OF THE PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA (ICTR), JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, PROVED HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL, AS HE HAD BEEN ABLE TO ANNOUNCE THAT THE FIRST INDICTMENTS WOULD BE ISSUED AROUND 12 DEC 95. THE SRSG INDICATED THAT THE ICTR HAD THE FULL BACKING OF THE RWANDA GOVERNMENT AND THAT EVEN KENYA NOW FAVOURS THE TRIALS.

D. ON THE PRISONS ISSUE, THE SRSG OBSERVED THAT TO DATE, 4,307 PRISONERS HAD BEEN TRANSFERRED TO THE NSINDA DETENTION CENTRE. HE INDICATED THAT THE REASON FOR THE DELAY IN THIS REGARD IS NOT A QUESTION OF POLITICAL WILL. THE PRISONERS THEMSELVES OFTEN DO NOT WANT TO LEAVE THEIR HOME PREFECTURES. NEVERTHELESS, IN THE COMING WEEK, ABOUT 5,000 WOULD HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED FROM OVER-CROWDED PRISONS TO THE NEW DETENTION CENTRES. ON THE SUBJECT OF UNAMIR'S MANDATE, THE SRSG STATED THAT UNAMIR'S PHASING OUT SCHEDULE WILL START FROM 08 DEC 95.

E. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 22 NOV 95 THAT PARTICIPANTS IN THE THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS HAD AGREED THAT RWANDA NEEDS US \$ 120 MILLION TO REHABILITATE RETURNEES. THE CONSULTATIONS WERE OFFICIALLY CLOSED BY THE DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER OF THE INTERIOR, COLONEL ALEXIS KANYARENGWE. THE RADIO ALSO REPORTED THAT SINCE LAST FRIDAY, THE ICRC HAD ASSISTED THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IN TRANSFERRING MORE THAN 3,000 DETAINEES FROM THE OVER-CROWDED PRISON AT KIBUNGO TO NSINDA DETENTION CENTRE.

F. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA REPORT OF 24 NOV 95, THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND COOPERATION, DR. ANASTASE GASANA, HAS INFORMED THE SECURITY COUNCIL THAT UNAMIR MANDATE EXPIRES ON 08 DEC 95. HE SAID THAT THE SECURITY OF RWANDA IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT AND UNAMIR PLAYS NO ROLE IN IT. HE FURTHER SAID THAT THE COUNTRY NEEDS FUNDS, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERS, DOCTORS, AGRICULTURE EXPERTS WHO CAN HELP IN BUILDING THE NATION PRACTICALLY. THEREFORE UNAMIR IS UNABLE TO HELP THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IN ITS PROGRAMME PRIORITIES.

G. THE RWANDESE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJ GEN PAUL KAGAME VISITED THE NYAKINAMA UNIVERSITY GR 597289 IN SECTOR 5A ON 25 NOV 95. THE PURPOSE OF THE VISIT IS NOT KNOWN.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA). MILOBS RECEIVED AN UNCONFIRMED REPORT AT A VACCINATION CENTRE THAT A SECRET DETENTION FACILITY EXISTED IN NYAKABANDA COMMUNE (6597) IN NGARU SECTOR (6303). THE REPORT FURTHER STATED THAT THE CENTRE HAS 80 INMATES WHO ARE BEING MALTREATED. INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT THE CENTRE IS NEAR A BRIDGE CALLED

MOUFOUMBA (660084) LINKING GITARAMA PREFECTURE TO RUHengeri PREFECTURE. THE LOCALS ARE AFRAID TO SPEAK TO MILOBS. THE COUNCILLOR OF THE AREA CONFIRMED THE PRESENCE OF THE PRISON BUT SAID IT CONTAINS ONLY FOUR INMATES. MILOB TEAM WERE DENIED INFORMATION BY RPA GUARDS AT THE PRISON. A JOINT MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS PATROL WILL FURTHER INVESTIGATE THE REPORT.

(2) SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO). LAST WEEK, 20 OUT OF THE 47 PRISONERS IN MUSENGE COMMUNE CACHOT WERE RELEASED AFTER INVESTIGATIONS PROVED THAT THEY WERE NOT GUILTY. SECTOR MILOBS HAVE REPORTED THAT BODIES OF VICTIMS OF THE GENOCIDE ARE BEING RECOVERED AT A SITE NEAR THE MURAMBI SECONDARY SCHOOL WHICH WAS ALSO THE LOCATION OF A TUTSI CAMP. APPROXIMATELY 7000 BODIES HAVE BEEN RECOVERED AND IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THERE MAY BE UP TO 30,000 BODIES IN THAT LOCATION.

(3) IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), RPA CARRIED OUT CORDON AND SEARCH OP IN GIKONGORO ON 24 NOV 95. LOCALS WERE SCREENED AND THEIR HOUSES WERE SEARCHED. THE PREFECT SAID EFFORTS WERE BEING MADE TO IDENTIFY A GROUP OF PEOPLE INVOLVED IN BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD. RPA LATER REPORTED HAVING RECOVERED SOME ITEMS BUT GAVE NO FURTHER DETAILS.

(4) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 23 NOV 95 FROM 0600-0630 HRS, AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE TOOK PLACE BETWEEN TWO RPA PATROLS AT GITONGO SECTOR (GR 0445). THE PATROLS WHICH WERE DEPLOYED ON 22 NOV 95, TOOK EACH OTHER FOR FRGF/INTERHAMWE AFTER FAILING TO IDENTIFY THEMSELVES. DETAILS OF CASUALTIES IS NOT KNOWN.

(5) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 1507 ON 23 NOV 95, RPA SOLDIERS OPENED FIRE ON LOCALS FISHING IN LAKE KIVU WHERE FISHING IS BANNED. THE FIRING TOOK PLACE AT KABEKERA CELL (GR 019415). NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED BUT LOCALS WERE ANGERED BY THE SHOOTING AND ARE SEEKING RECOURSE THROUGH LOCAL AUTHORITIES. RPA EXPLAINED THAT THIS MEASURE IS NECESSARY AS FRGF RETURN TO IJWI ISLAND BY DAY USING STOLEN BOATS AND INFILTRATE AT NIGHT MIXED WITH THE LOCAL FISHERMEN.

(6) SECTOR 4 - MILOBS REPORTED A SHOOTING INCIDENT BETWEEN 0643-0648 HRS IN MURURU SECTOR (GR 7521). SEMI AUTOMATIC FIRE WAS HEARD FOLLOWED BY AUTOMATIC FIRE. RPA DENIES THAT THE INCIDENT TOOK PLACE. FIRING WAS REPEATED THREE TIMES AFTER 0648 HRS BETWEEN RUSUZI I AND RUSUZI II. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(7) SECTOR 5C- MILOBS REPORTED THE ARREST OF 04 PERSONS

BY RPA ON 17 NOV 95 IN MURAMBO SECTOR OF GISEBEYO COMMUNE (GR 2150) DURING A WEDDING. THE ARRESTED PERSONS ARE BEING DETAINED IN GAKINA (GR 2952) MILITARY CACHOT. THE RPA REPORTEDLY ALSO KILLED ONE LOCAL DURING THE INCIDENT.

(8) IN SECTOR 1A, MILOBS REPORTED THE OUTBREAK OF A FIRE AT YAMAHA SPARE PARTS CENTRE IN KIGALI CITY ON 24 NOV 95 AT 0400 HRS. A JOINT TEAM FROM UNAMIR AND RWANDA FIRE BRIGADE BROUGHT THE FIRE UNDER CONTROL BY 1000 HRS. GOODS WORTH MILLIONS OF RWF WERE DESTROYED IN THE FIRE.

(9) MILOBS SECTOR 5B REPORTED AN ENCOUNTER BETWEEN RPA AND INSURGENTS IN BYAHI SECTOR (GR 1917) ON THE NIGHT OF 14 NOV 95. THE RPA HAS REPORTEDLY IMPOSED NIGHT CURFEW IN THE AREA FOLLOWING THE INCIDENT. DETAILED REPORT WILL FOLLOW.

(10) SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) - LOCALS INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 23 NOVEMBER 1995, RPA BEAT UP A LOCAL AND SUBSEQUENTLY TOOK HIM FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT TO MUHIMA HOSPITAL WHERE HE DIED THE FOLLOWING DAY AT 0100 HRS. THE DECEASED WAS BURIED BEHIND THE HOSPITAL AT 1000 HRS ON 25 NOV 1995.

(11) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - THE COUNSELLOR OF TENYO SECTOR (GR 7459), A HUTU, WAS ROBBED OF MONEY AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AT NIGHT BY 10 RPA SOLDIERS. THE SAME RPA SOLDIERS ALSO BEAT UP THREE LDF MEMBERS WHO HAD RUSHED TO THE COUNSELLORS HOUSE ON HEARING 04 SHOTS FIRED BY THE RPA SOLDIERS.

(12) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - RPA IMPOSED A CURFEW FROM 1900 HRS TO 0500 HRS IN NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR FOR AN UNSPECIFIED PERIOD. THIS CURFEW FOLLOWS THE IMPOSITION OF A BAN ON FISHING ON LAKE KIVU FROM 22 NOV 1995 TO DETER FRGF INFILTRATIONS FROM IJWI ISLAND.

(13) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5B REPORTED THAT A LOCAL WAS ARRESTED BY THE RPA ON 26 NOV 95 AND TAKEN TO AN UNKNOWN PLACE. THE INDIVIDUAL FROM WHOM THE DETAINEE HAD BOUGHT A PIECE OF LAND RECENTLY, HAD REPORTEDLY ACCOMPANIED THE RPA TO THE HOUSE FOR THE ARREST.

(14) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5B WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS OF KIVUMU SECTOR GR 2303 THAT A MAN, WHO WAS A PART OF A EIGHT MAN INFILTRATION TEAM WHICH HAD ENTERED RWANDA FROM ZAIRE, WAS CAUGHT BY THE RPA ON 25 NOV 95. A NUMBER OF MINES AND GRENS WERE RECOVERED FROM THE INFILTRATOR.

(15) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) MILOBS WERE INFORMED BY A SOURCE

THAT RPA IS PLANNING/ HAS COMMENCED LAYING MINES ALONG SHORES OF LAKE KIVU BETWEEN NYAMASHEKE AND GISENYI. THIS IS PROBABLY AIMED AT PREVENTING FRGF/INTERHAMWE INFILTRATION. INFORMATION IS YET TO BE CONFIRMED.

(16) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - MILOB TEAM TO TABWE COMMUNE REPORTED THAT A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION WAS CARRIED OUT BY RPA ON 21 NOV 95 TO APPREHEND LOCALS WHO DID NOT BELONG TO THE COMMUNE BUT WERE STAYING THERE AS A RESULT OF THEIR PROBABLE INVOLVEMENT IN CERTAIN OFFENSES DURING THE WAR. 26 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED AND LATER SENT TO THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES. IN MOST COMMUNES THESE PEOPLE ARE SAID TO BE TREATED AS PRISONERS AND ON ARRIVAL, ARE IMMEDIATELY DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT.

B. - MILITIA/FRGF

(1) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI). MILOBS WERE INFORMED IN RAMBURA SECTOR (4514) THAT FOUR BOYS WERE ARRESTED AND DETAINED IN CONNECTION WITH THE ANTI PERS MINE BLAST ON THE 12 AND 15 NOV 95.

(2) LOCALS INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 18 NOV 95, IN NDORA (4717), FIVE PERS IN MILITARY UNIFORM RANSACKED A SHOPKEEPER'S HOUSE AND STOLE AN AMOUNT OF 70,000 RWF. ON THE SAME DAY, ANOTHER GROUP OF THREE PERS IN UNIFORM STOLE 30,000 RWF AT BIREMBO (GR 5713).

(3) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI). MILOBS WERE INFORMED THAT ON 18 NOV 95 AT BUSUMBA SECTEUR (GR 2727), INFILTRATORS ABDUCTED ONE PERSON WHOSE WHEREABOUTS IS STILL UNKNOWN. RPA WERE LATER INFO BY LOCALS AT NYAMIRANGO SECTEUR (GR 3218), ABOUT MOV OF LARGE NUMBER OF INFILTRATORS (ABOUT 50) SOME OF WHOM WERE IN UNIFORM AND WERE REPORTEDLY CARRYING WEAPONS. FIVE INFILTRATORS WERE APPREHENDED BY RPA AND RIFLES, GRENADES AND MINES WERE RECOVERED FROM THEM.

(4) SECTOR 3A - GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN THE AREA. BANDITRY ACTIVITIES ARE SAID TO BE ON THE INCREASE IN RWAMIKO COMMUNE. THE BANDITS ARMED WITH CUTLASSES AND WOODEN HAMMERS ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE COME FROM MUDASOMWA AND BUTARE. SOME TWAs FROM BUHORO SECTOR ARE ALSO SAID TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THESE ACTIVITIES.

(5) SECTOR 4 - ON 17 NOV 95 IN KIGABIRO CELL GR 8416 OF NYAKABUYE COMMUNE, SIX BANDITS ATTACKED THE HOUSE OF A LOCAL WHO WAS ON A PATROL WITH THE RPA AND SERIOUSLY INJURED HIS WIFE. MOTIVE FOR THE ATTACK IS NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATION BY THE RPA IS IN PROGRESS.

(6) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 22 NOV

95 AT ABOUT 2240 HRS, AN ELECTRIC PYLON WAS BLOWN UP AT MUDUMDANO SECTOR, RWENGERO CELL (GR 006413). THE BLAST ONLY BENT THE PYLON AND POWER SUPPLY WAS NOT CUT. FRGF/INTERHAMWE OR THEIR SYMPATHIZERS ARE BEING SUSPECTED. THE TYPE OF EXPLOSIVE USED REMAINS UNKNOWN AND NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED.

(7) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), UNSUBSTANTIATED REPORTS RECEIVED BY MILOBS INDICATE THAT A TRUCK LOADED WITH LEAFLETS CARRYING NAMES OF PEOPLE IN RWANDA WHOM THE INTERHAMWE INTENDS TO ASSASSINATE, WAS SEEN IN NYAMASHEKE SECTOR. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA). THE SECTOR COMDR VISITED THE GITARAMA PRISON WITH DR KRITIANSEN, HEAD OF NORMED, AND REPS OF UNAMIR HQ G2 CELL ON 21 NOV 95. APPROXIMATELY 2000 INMATES HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO THE NEW PART OF THE PRISON.

(3) THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR AND A REP FROM THE CANADIAN EMBASSY CALLED ON THE FC ON 24 NOV 95, TO DISCUSS ISSUES OF MUTUAL CONCERN. LATER IN THE DAY, THE FC VISITED THE INDBATT COY LOC AT TRAFIPRO AND THE MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

(4) A PATROL LED BY THE SECTOR COMMANDER OF SECTOR 2B, VISITED AKEGERA NATIONAL PARK TO ASCERTAIN REPORTS OF FRGF INFILTRATION IN THE AREA. THE TEAM COULD NOT FIND ANY EVIDENCE OF INFILTRATION. HOWEVER THERE IS A LARGE SCALE PRESENCE OF RPA IN THE AREA.

(5) FORCE ENGINEER COY ORGANISED A MINE AWARENESS LECTURE IN NICOY LOCATION ON 25 NOV 95, WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY NICOY TROOPS AND NGOS.

D. OTHER SECTORS NTR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 62 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR VARIOUS HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. MEDICAL PERSONNEL FROM MALAWICOY HAVE MOVED TO BWEYEYE AND NYUNGWE TO ASSIST LOCALS IN NATIONAL ANTI-POLIO VACCINE CAMPAIGN.

C. FORCE ENGINEER COY DEPLOYED A DOZER EACH FOR A REHABILITATION PROJECT IN KIGALI AND FOR MAKING A PLAY GROUND IN COMMUNAL POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL NEAR RWAMAGANA.

D. A TOTAL OF 101 IDPs ARE AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

E. A TOTAL OF 987 MEDICAL AND 90 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY MEDICAL STAFF IN RWANDA DURING THE WEEK.

F. INDBATT TRANSPORTED BRIDGING MATERIAL FOR SALVATION ARMY FROM KIGALI TO KAYENZI (GR 8091) COMMUNE. RMO CARRIED OUT MEDICAL CHECK OF 121 ORPHANS AT MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

G. FORCE ENGR COY DESPATCHED THREE DUMPERS WITH CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL TO MT KARONGI SITE FOR THE NEW TRANSMITTER AND PROVIDED ONE SECTION FOR SECURITY DUTY IN KIGALI WHERE RATION DESTRUCTION WAS BEING CARRIED OUT.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. IN SECTOR 5A, MILOB TEAM THAT PATROLLED GAHUNGA SECTOR (6440) ON 20 NOV 95 WERE INFORMED THAT FOUR CHILDREN DETONATED AN ANTI-PERSONNEL RIFLE GRENADE IN A GARDEN WHILE PLAYING WITH IT. ONE OF THE CHILDREN LOST TWO FINGERS WHILE THE OTHER THREE SUSTAINED MINOR INJURIES. THEY HAVE ALL BEEN ADMITTED AT THE RUHENGERRI HOSPITAL. MILOBS LATER DISCOVERED 2 X GRENADES AND 1 X ANTI PERS RIFLE GRENADE IN THE SAME AREA. LOCAL RPA COMDR AND ENGINEERS HAVE PROMISED TO DESTROY THE DEVICES AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

B. IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), THE PREFECT ADMITTED THE URGENCY IN HAVING A BOURGMESTRE IN TABA COMMUNE WHERE TENSIONS ARE ON THE RISE. HE ALSO WANTS TO MEET WITH THE BOURGMESTRE OF NTONGWE COMMUNE TO DISCUSS RECENT WAVES OF ARRESTS WHICH HAVE BEEN LINKED TO HIS ARRIVAL.

C. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) - THERE IS A REPORT OF AN ACCOUNTANT IN KIGERAMA WHO HAS BEEN MISSING SINCE 18 NOV 95. ALL ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE HIM BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES HAVE BEEN FUTILE. MILOBS ARE INVESTIGATING.

D. IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), MILOBS REPORTED THAT LOCALS ARE NERVOUS REGARDING THE IMMINENT WITHDRAWAL OF UNAMIR.

E. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT A DELEGATION OF FIVE REFUGEES ARRIVED IN THE SECTOR FROM ZAIRE ON A VISIT AIMED AT CONFIDENCE BUILDING. THEY WERE WARMLY RECEIVED BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES ON ARRIVAL. THE DELEGATION VISITED MURURU (GR 7521), MUTONGO (GR 7430) AND CYETE (GR 7618) SECTORS OF CYIMBOGO COMMUNE. THEY ALSO MET WITH OTHER RETURNEES. THE VISIT WHICH WAS ARRANGED BY UNHCR, WAS REPORTEDLY SUCCESSFUL.

F. IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), MILOBS REPORTED THAT AN AGREEMENT WAS SIGNED BETWEEN THE GERMAN AMBASSADOR, MR AUGUST HAMMEL, AND THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU ON 26 NOV 95 FOR A GRANT OF 500 MILLION RWANDAN FRANCS AS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE PREFECTURE.

RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 02, ALL FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,771 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

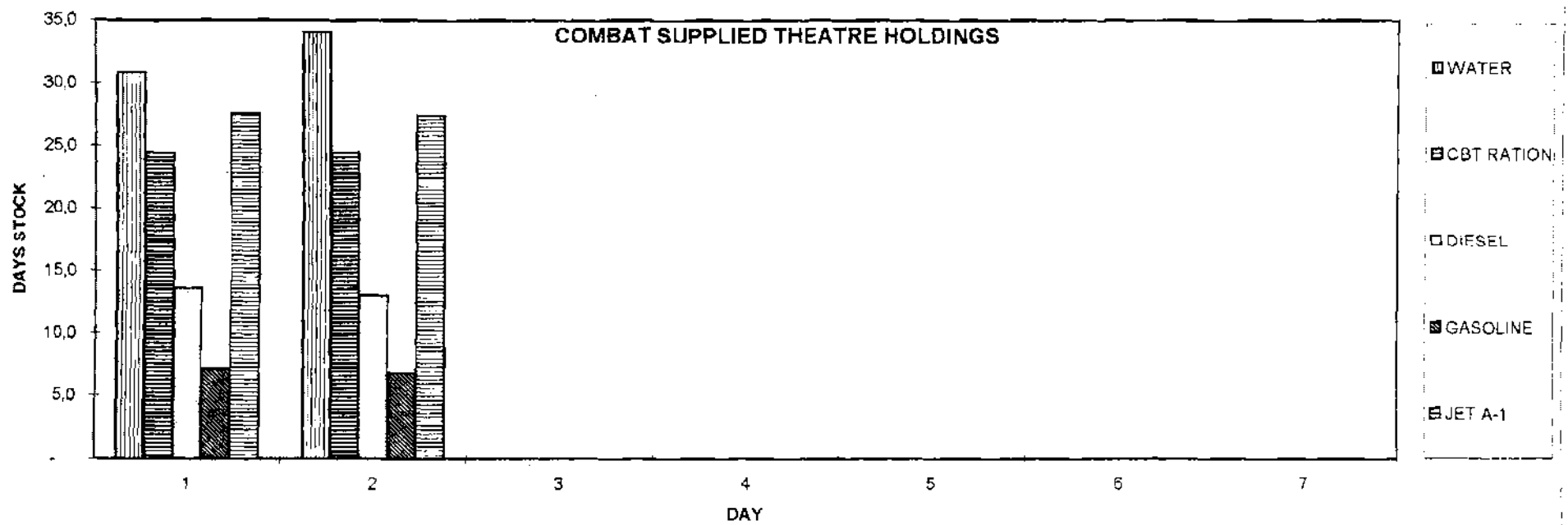

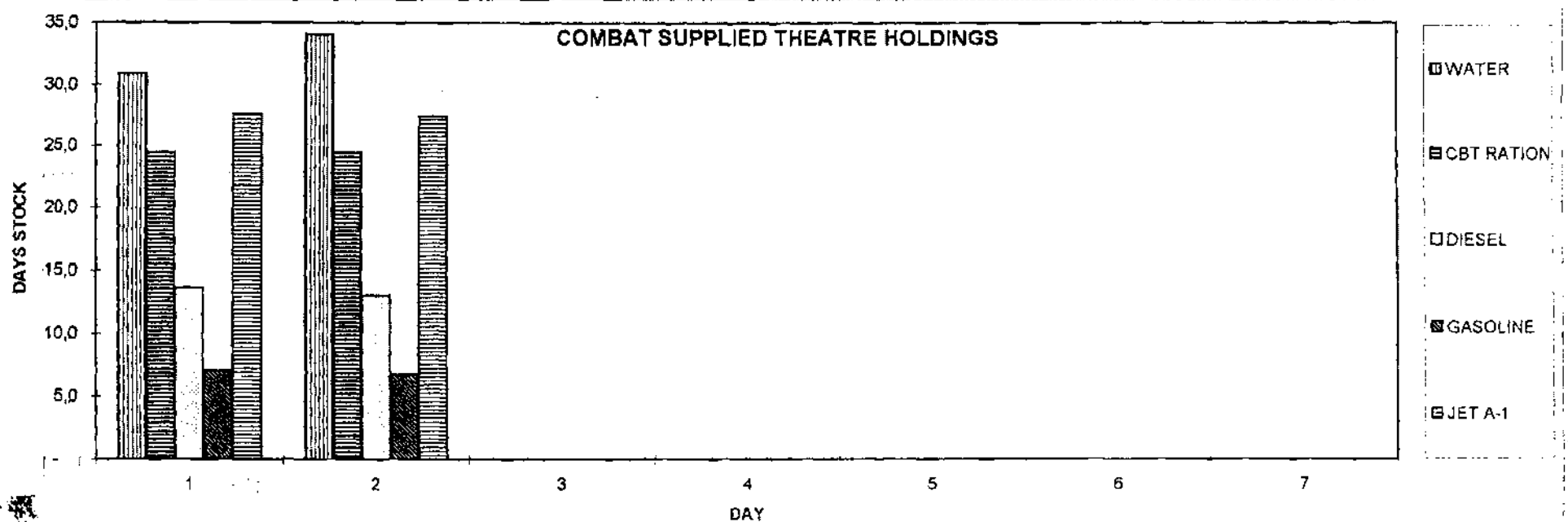

DAILY SITREP FOR 25 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 47. 28 ARRIVED FROM ZAIRE AND 19 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,769 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG HELD A PRESS BRIEFING TODAY AT WHICH HE STATED THAT THE VISIT OF THE PROSECUTOR GENERAL OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA (ICTR), JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, PROVED HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL, AS HE HAD BEEN ABLE TO ANNOUNCE THAT THE FIRST INDICTMENTS WOULD BE ISSUED AROUND 03 DECEMBER, 1995. THE SRSG INDICATED THAT THE ICTR HAD THE FULL BACKING OF THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND THAT EVEN KENYA NOW FAVOURS THE TRIALS.

B. ON THE PRISONS ISSUE, THE SRSG OBSERVED THAT TO DATE, 4,307 PRISONERS HAD BEEN TRANSFERRED TO THE NSINDA DETENTION CENTRE. HE INDICATED THAT THE REASON FOR THE DELAY IN THIS REGARD WAS NOT A QUESTION OF POLITICAL WILL. THE PRISONERS THEMSELVES OFTEN DID NOT WANT TO LEAVE THEIR HOME PREFECTURES. NEVERTHELESS, IN THE FORTHCOMING WEEK ABOUT 5,000 WOULD HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED FROM OVER-CROWDED PRISONS TO THE NEW DETENTION CENTRES.

C. ON THE SUBJECT OF UNAMIR MANDATE, THE SRSG STATED THAT UNAMIR PHASING OUT SCHEDULE WILL START TAKING EFFECT ON THE 08 DEC 1995.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) - LOCALS INFORMED MILOBS THAT ON 23 NOVEMBER 1995, RPA BEAT UP A LOCAL AND SUBSEQUENTLY TOOK HIM FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT TO MUHIMA HOSPITAL WHERE HE DIED THE FOLLOWING DAY AT 0100 HRS. THE DECEASED WAS BURIED BEHIND THE HOSPITAL AT 1000 HRS ON 25 NOV 1995.

(2) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - THE COUNSELLOR OF TENYO SECTOR (GR 7459), A HUTU, WAS ROBBED OF MONEY AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AT NIGHT BY 10 RPA SOLDIERS. THE SAME RPA SOLDIERS ALSO BEAT UP THREE LDF MEMBERS WHO HAD RUSHED TO THE COUNSELLORS HOUSE ON HEARING 04 SHOTS FIRED BY THE RPA SOLDIERS.

(3) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - RPA IMPOSED A CURFEW FROM 1900 HRS TO 0500 HRS IN NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR FOR AN UNSPECIFIED PERIOD. THIS CURFEW FOLLOWS THE IMPOSITION OF A BAN ON FISHING ON LAKE KIVU FROM 22 NOV 1995 TO DETER FRGFS INFILTRATIONS FROM IJWI ISLAND.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY SECTOR 5C - A SOLAR PANEL SYSTEM TO POWER THE BASE STATION WAS STOLEN FROM UNHCR OFFICES BY UNKNOWN PEOPLE.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. FORCE ENGINEER COY ORGANISED A MINE AWARENESS LECTURE IN NICOY LOCATION ATTENDED BY NICOY TROOPS AND NGOS.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 156 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND GISENYI. 64 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI. A TOTAL OF 189 ARE STILL AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED FURNITURE FOR GITARAMA PREFECTURE FROM GITARAMA TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE.

C. GHANBATT PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO RPA TO CONVEY FOODSTUFF FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE.

D. MALICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO GIKONGORO PREFECTURE TO TRANSPORT A FOOTBALL TEAM FROM GIKONGORO TO SHANIGA.

E. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO RPA FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FIREWOOD IN BUGARAMA.

F. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING FUEL WOOD.

G. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ASSISTING RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES AND ALSO PROVIDED IT A VEHICLE.

H. CMSG PROVIDED A RECOVERY WRECKER TO MILOBS IN GITARAMA TO ASSIST IN REPAIRING A BRIDGE AND DELIVERED 450 BOXES OF DEHYDRATION SALT TO SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO VARIOUS HEALTH CENTRES AND ORPHANAGES IN THE PREFECTURE.

I. UNAMIR MEDICS TREATED A TOTAL OF 86 MEDICAL AND 17 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) - A TOTAL OF 19 REFUGEES WERE RECEIVED IN THE TRANSIT CAMP AND ARE AWAITING REPATRIATION TO THEIR COMMUNES.

B. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - A TOTAL OF 28 REFUGEES CROSSED INTO RWANDA FROM ZAIRE THROUGH UVIRA. 41 REFUGEES ARE LEFT IN BUGARAMA TRANSIT CAMP AND 17 ARE REMAINING AT NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP. NO REFUGEES LEFT FOR THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

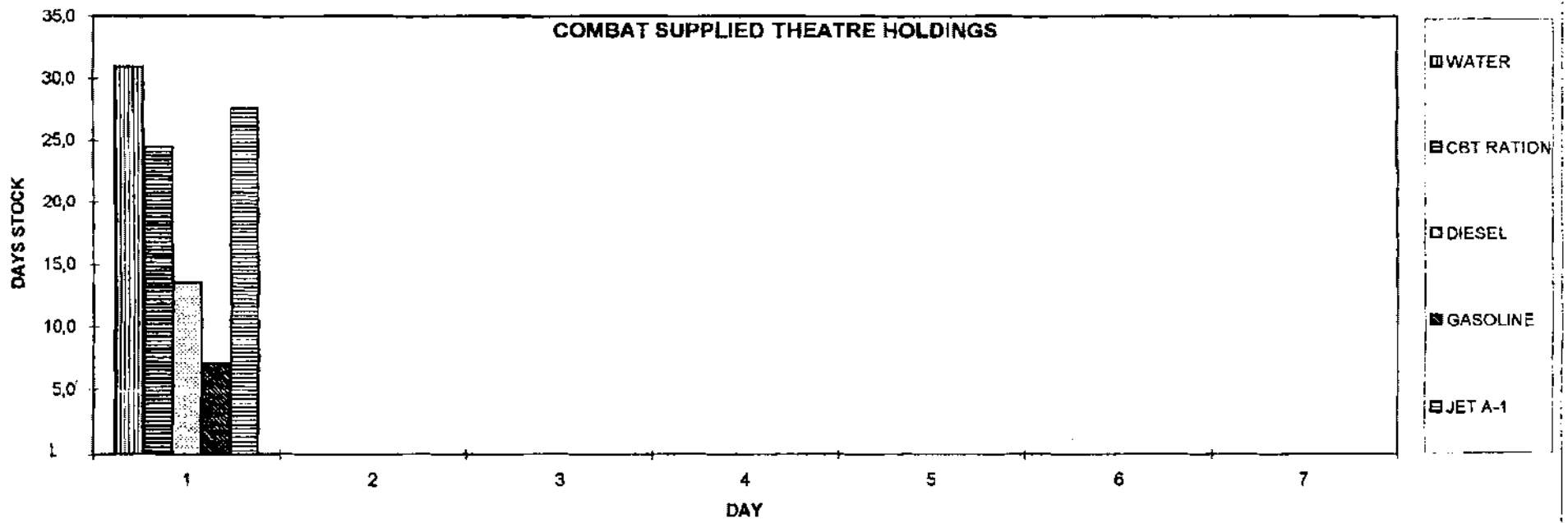

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 09, ALL FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,722 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 4 - MILOBS SECTOR 4 REPORTED A SHOOTING INCIDENT BETWEEN 0643-0648 HRS IN MURURU SECTOR (GR 7521). SEMIAUTOMATIC FIRE WAS HEARD FOLLOWED BY AUTOMATIC FIRE. RPA DENIES THAT THE INCIDENT TOOK PLACE. FIRING WAS REPEATED THREE TIMES AFTER 0648 HRS BETWEEN RUSUZI I AND RUSUZI II. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) SECTOR 5C- MILOBS SECTOR 5C REPORTED THE ARREST OF 04 PERSONS BY RPA ON 17 NOV 95 IN MURAMBO SECTOR OF GISEBEYO COMMUNE (GR 2150) DURING A WEDDING. THE ARRESTED PERSONS ARE BEING DETAINED IN GAKINA (GR 2952) MILITARY CACHOT. THE RPA REPORTEDLY ALSO KILLED ONE LOCAL DURING THE INCIDENT.

(3) IN SECTOR 1A, MILOBS REPORTED THE OUTBREAK OF A FIRE AT YAMAHA SPARE PARTS CENTRE IN KIGALI CITY ON 24 NOV 95 AT 0400 HRS. A JOINT TEAM FROM UNAMIR AND RWANDA FIRE BRIGADE BROUGHT THE FIRE UNDER CONTROL BY 1000 HRS. GOODS WORTH MILLIONS OF RWF WERE DESTROYED IN THE FIRE.

(4) MILOBS SECTOR 5B REPORTED AN ENCOUNTER BETWEEN RPA AND INSURGENTS IN BYAHI SECTOR (GR 1917) ON THE NIGHT OF 14 NOV 95. THE RPA HAS REPORTEDLY IMPOSED NIGHT CURFEW IN THE AREA FOLLOWING THE INCIDENT. DETAILED REPORT WILL FOLLOW.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR AND A REP FROM THE CANADIAN EMBASSY CALLED ON THE FC TO DISCUSS ISSUES OF MUTUAL CONCERN. LATER IN THE DAY, THE FC VISITED A COY LOC OF INDBATT AND THE MOTHER THERESA ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

B. A PATROL LED BY THE SECTOR COMMANDER OF SECTOR 2B, VISITED AKEGERA NATIONAL PARK TO ASCERTAIN REPORTS OF FRGF INFILTRATION IN THE AREA. THE TEAM COULD NOT FIND ANY EVIDENCE OF INFILTRATION. HOWEVER THERE IS A LARGE SCALE PRESENCE OF RPA IN THE AREA.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED BRIDGING MATERIAL FOR SALVATION ARMY FROM KIGALI TO KAYENZI (GR 8091) COMMUNE. RMO CARRIED OUT MEDICAL CHECK OF 121 ORPHANS AT MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

C. GHANBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO FOUNDATION BARAKHABA FOR CONVEYING FOOD ITEMS FROM KIGALI TO KAYONZA (GR 5584) AND TWO TRUCKS TO BUTARE PREFECTURE FOR TRANSPORTING CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL TO KIYOMBE (GR 0941) AND MUKARANGE (GR 1034) COMMUNES. GHANBATT ALSO PROVIDED A DOZER FOR REPAIRS AND WIDENING OF ROAD BETWEEN BIRENGA AND KIBUNGO WATER POINTS.

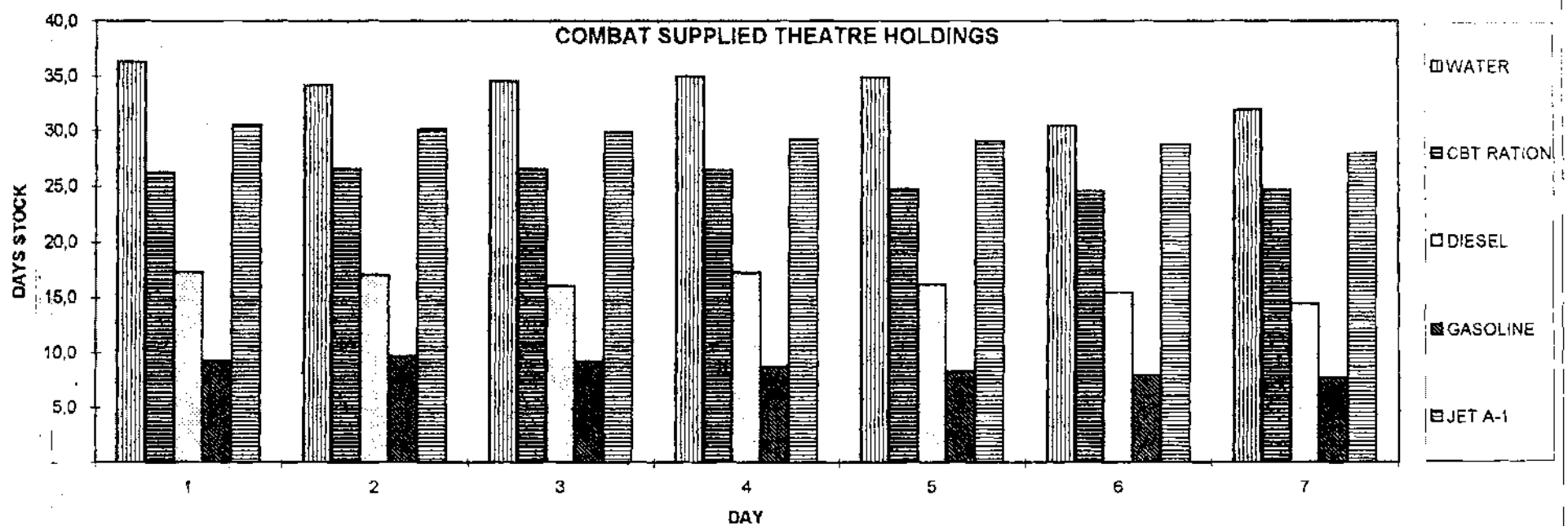

DAILY SITREP FOR 24 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 09, ALL FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,722 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) SECTOR 4 - MILOBS SECTOR 4 REPORTED A SHOOTING INCIDENT BETWEEN 0643-0648 HRS IN MURURU SECTOR (GR 7521). SEMIAUTOMATIC FIRE WAS HEARD FOLLOWED BY AUTOMATIC FIRE. RPA DENIES THAT THE INCIDENT TOOK PLACE. FIRING WAS REPEATED THREE TIMES AFTER 0648 HRS BETWEEN RUSUZI I AND RUSUZI II. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) SECTOR 5C- MILOBS SECTOR 5C REPORTED THE ARREST OF 04 PERSONS BY RPA ON 17 NOV 95 IN MURAMBO SECTOR OF GISEBEYO COMMUNE (GR 2150) DURING A WEDDING. THE ARRESTED PERSONS ARE BEING DETAINED IN GAKINA (GR 2952) MILITARY CACHOT. THE RPA REPORTEDLY ALSO KILLED ONE LOCAL DURING THE INCIDENT.

(3) IN SECTOR 1A, MILOBS REPORTED THE OUTBREAK OF A FIRE AT YAMAHA SPARE PARTS CENTRE IN KIGALI CITY ON 24 NOV 95 AT 0400 HRS. A JOINT TEAM FROM UNAMIR AND RWANDA FIRE BRIGADE BROUGHT THE FIRE UNDER CONTROL BY 1000 HRS. GOODS WORTH MILLIONS OF RWF WERE DESTROYED IN THE FIRE.

(4) MILOBS SECTOR 5B REPORTED AN ENCOUNTER BETWEEN RPA AND INSURGENTS IN BYAHI SECTOR (GR 1917) ON THE NIGHT OF 14 NOV 95. THE RPA HAS REPORTEDLY IMPOSED NIGHT CURFEW IN THE AREA FOLLOWING THE INCIDENT. DETAILED REPORT WILL FOLLOW.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR AND A REP FROM THE CANADIAN EMBASSY CALLED ON THE FC TO DISCUSS ISSUES OF MUTUAL CONCERN. LATER IN THE DAY, THE FC VISITED A COY LOC OF INDBATT AND THE MOTHER THERESA ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

B.. A PATROL LED BY THE SECTOR COMMANDER OF SECTOR 2B, VISITED AKEGERA NATIONAL PARK TO ASCERTAIN REPORTS OF FRGF INFILTRATION IN THE AREA. THE TEAM COULD NOT FIND ANY EVIDENCE OF INFILTRATION. HOWEVER THERE IS A LARGE SCALE PRESENCE OF RPA IN THE AREA.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. NO RETURNEES ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP TODAY. 50 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, GISENYI, GITARAMA, BUTARE AND KIGALI TOWN. A TOTAL OF 97 ARE STILL AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. INDBATT TRANSPORTED BRIDGING MATERIAL FOR SALVATION ARMY FROM KIGALI TO KAYENZI (GR 8091) COMMUNE. RMO CARRIED OUT MEDICAL CHECK OF 121 ORPHANS AT MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

C. GHANBATT PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO FOUNDATION BARAKHABA FOR CONVEYING FOOD ITEMS FROM KIGALI TO KAYONZA (GR 5584) AND TWO TRUCKS TO BUTARE PREFECTURE FOR TRANSPORTING CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL TO KIYOMBE (GR 0941) AND MUKARANGE (GR 1034) COMMUNES. GHANBATT ALSO PROVIDED A DOZER FOR REPAIRS AND WIDENING OF ROAD BETWEEN BIRENGA AND KIBUNGO WATER POINTS.

D. MALICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO TROCAIRE FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD ITEMS, AND ONE TRUCK TO PARQUET FOR TRANSPORTING PRISONERS.

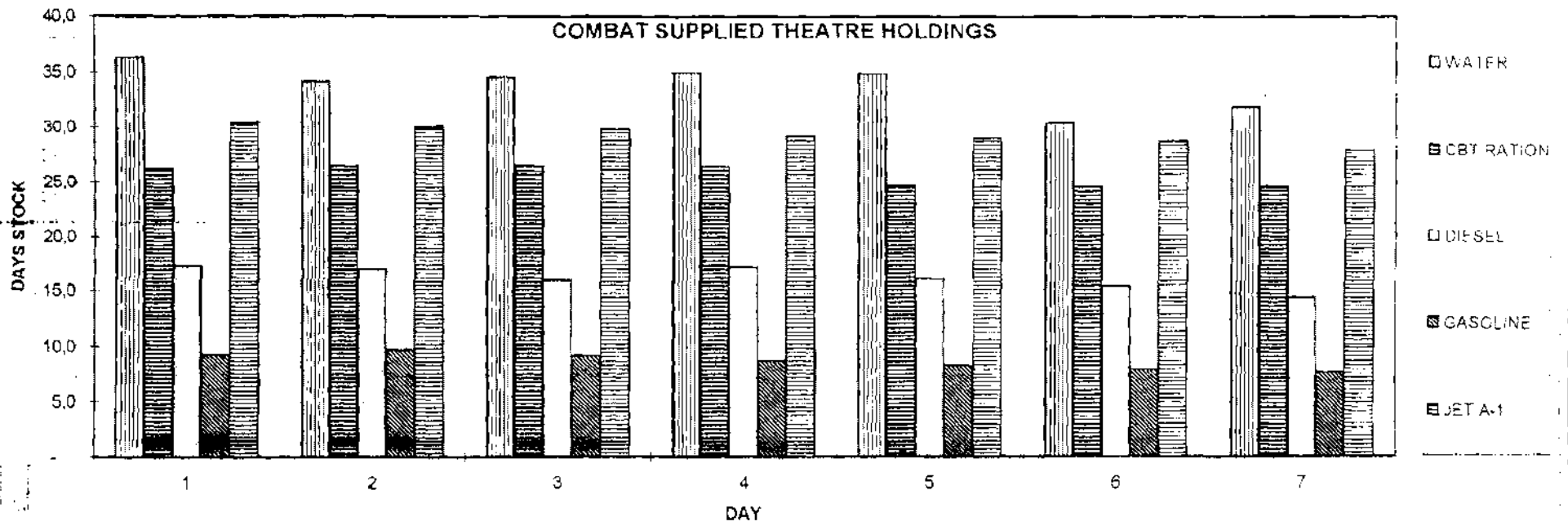

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, ARRIVED KIGALI TODAY. HE WAS MET AT AIRPORT BY SRSG WHO ACCOMPANIED HIM TO A MEETING WITH H.E. THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, AND THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MR ANASTASE GASANA.

B. THE SRSG LATER HELD A MEETING WITH MR IAN MARTIN, CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION FOR RWANDA.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT PARTICIPANTS IN THE THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS HAD AGREED THAT RWANDA NEEDS US\$ 120 MILLION TO REHABILITATE RETURNEES. THE CONSULTATIONS WERE OFFICIALLY CLOSED BY THE DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF INTERIOR, COL ALEXIS KANYARENGWE. THE RADIO ALSO REPORTED THAT SINCE LAST FRIDAY, THE ICRC AND UNAMIR HAD ASSISTED THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IN TRANSFERRING MORE THAN 3000 DETAINEES FROM THE OVER-CROWDED PRISON AT KIBUNGO TO NSINDA DETENTION CENTRE.

(1) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 23 NOV 95 FROM 0600-0630 HRS, AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE TOOK PLACE BETWEEN TWO RPA PATROLS AT GITONGO SECTOR (GR 0445). THE PATROLS DEPLOYED ON 22 NOV 95 TOOK EACH OTHER FOR FRGF/INTERHAMWE AFTER FAILING TO IDENTIFY THEMSELVES.

DETAILS OF CASUALTIES IS NOT KNOWN.

(2) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 1507 ON 23 NOV 95, RPA SOLDIERS OPENED FIRE ON LOCALS FISHING IN LAKE KIVU WHERE FISHING IS REPORTED BANNED. THE FIRING TOOK PLACE AT KABEKERA CELL (GR 019415). NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED BUT LOCALS WERE ANGERED BY THE SHOOTING AND ARE SEEKING RECOURSE THROUGH LOCAL AUTHORITIES. RPA EXPLAIN THAT THIS MEASURE IS NECESSARY AS FRGF RETURN TO IJWI ISLAND BY DAY USING STOLEN BOATS AND INFILTRATE AT NIGHT MIXED WITH THE LOCAL FISHERMEN.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 22 NOV 95 AT ABOUT 2240 HRS, AN ELECTRIC PYLON WAS BLOWN UP AT MUDUMDANO SECTOR, RWENGERO CELL (GR 006413). BLAST ONLY BENT THE PYLON AND POWER SUPPLY WAS NOT CUT. FRGF/ INTERHAMWE OR SYMPATHIZERS ARE BEING SUSPECTED. THE TYPE OF EXPLOSIVE USED REMAINS UNKNOWN AND NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED.

E. FORCE ENGINEER COY PROVIDED ESCORT TO ESKO VEHICLES FROM KIGALI TO NYUNDO, PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD, AND DEPLOYED ONE DOZER FOR MAKING PLAY GROUND IN COMMUNE POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL NEAR RWAMAGANA.

F. IN ADDITION TO THEIR NORMAL RE-SUPPLY DUTIES, 95 CMSG RECOVERED A 7 TON VEHICLE FROM NGARAMA FOR WORLD FOOD ORGANIZATION AND REPAIRED A WATER BLADDER AT KIA PRESIDENTIAL HANGAR.

G. UNITS AND NORMED MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 205 MEDICAL AND 11 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) - THERE IS A REPORT OF AN ACCOUNTANT IN KIGERAMA WHO HAS BEEN MISSING SINCE 18 NOV 95. ALL ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE HIM BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES HAVE BEEN FUTILE. MILOBS ARE INVESTIGATING.

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 351, 239 FROM ZAIRE 100 FROM UGANDA AND 12 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,713 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, ARRIVED KIGALI TODAY. HE WAS MET AT AIRPORT BY SRSG WHO ACCOMPANIED HIM TO A MEETING WITH H.E. 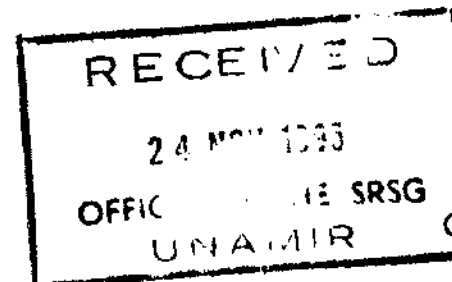

DAILY SITREP FOR 23 NOV 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 351, 239 FROM ZAIRE 100 FROM UGANDA AND 12 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH TO DATE IS 26,713 AND OUTFLOW IS 63.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE CHIEF PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUDGE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, ARRIVED KIGALI TODAY. HE WAS MET AT AIRPORT BY SRSG WHO ACCOMPANIED HIM TO A MEETING WITH H.E. THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, AND THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MR ANASTASE GASANA.

B. THE SRSG LATER HELD A MEETING WITH MR IAN MARTIN, CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION FOR RWANDA.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT PARTICIPANTS IN THE THEMATIC CONSULTATIONS HAD AGREED THAT RWANDA NEEDS US\$ 120 MILLION TO REHABILITATE RETURNEES. THE CONSULTATIONS WERE OFFICIALLY CLOSED BY THE DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF INTERIOR, COL ALEXIS KANYARENGWE. THE RADIO ALSO REPORTED THAT SINCE LAST FRIDAY, THE ICRC AND UNAMIR HAD ASSISTED THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT IN TRANSFERRING MORE THAN 3000 DETAINEES FROM THE OVER-CROWDED PRISON AT KIBUNGO TO NSINDA DETENTION CENTRE.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 23 NOV 95 FROM 0600-0630 HRS, AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE TOOK PLACE BETWEEN TWO RPA PATROLS AT GITONGO SECTOR (GR 0445). THE PATROLS DEPLOYED ON 22 NOV 95 TOOK EACH OTHER FOR FRGF/INTERHAMWE AFTER FAILING TO IDENTIFY THEMSELVES.

DETAILS OF CASUALTIES IS NOT KNOWN.

(2) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 1507 ON 23 NOV 95, RPA SOLDIERS OPENED FIRE ON LOCALS FISHING IN LAKE KIVU WHERE FISHING IS REPORTED BANNED. THE FIRING TOOK PLACE AT KABEKERA CELL (GR 019415). NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED BUT LOCALS WERE ANGERED BY THE SHOOTING AND ARE SEEKING RECOURSE THROUGH LOCAL AUTHORITIES. RPA EXPLAIN THAT THIS MEASURE IS NECESSARY AS FRGF RETURN TO IJWI ISLAND BY DAY USING STOLEN BOATS AND INFILTRATE AT NIGHT MIXED WITH THE LOCAL FISHERMEN.
