4. DEPUTY OF HOSPITAL STATED THAT TWO WEEKS THE PREFECT SAID THAT UNAMIR HAD PROMISED TO PROVIDE DIESEL TO POWER GENERATOR. THERE HAS BEEN NO WORD SINCE. THE HOSPITAL HAS LITTLE TO NO DIESEL AND IS NOT GENERATING POWER. THE DEPUTY GUESSES THAT THEY NEED 1000-2000 LITERS PER WEEK.

1. The situation of this sector continued to remain calm for the period under review. There has been some RPA infiltration in to the HPZ. Total of 257 displaced persons were evacuated from sector 4 to government held areas today.

3. Some elements of the RPA have been seen in the general area of KABELEZI grid 5935. They were observed to have moved away when GHANBATT patrols approached. This infiltrations have been making the inhabitants of the area scared.

4. A total of 5 hand grenades and 407 rounds 7.62 ammunition have been retrieved by GHANBATT from GABUGA and NDAGO.

5. About 80 RGF soldiers have crossed to KIGALI today one of them was disarmed of his pistol that he was holding. Please liaise with government and advise procedure to evacuate soldiers.

MILOB ACTIVITIESSECTOR HQ

6. Assisted the government representative for agricultural projects in the sector to locate some of the agriculture project workers and the retrieval of one of the ministry of agriculture vehicles.

7. The acting sector commander liaised with the BRITISH Field Ambulance company for accommodation at KITABI in order to have three MILOB Teams stationed there when vehicles are provided. These Teams will be responsible for areas South of GIKONGORO.

TEAMS 1 AND 2

8. Teams went to GITARAMA to pick up 10 MILOBs posted to the sector.



TEAMS 3 AND 4

9. One Team left for KIGALI with the 2 vehicles for servicing and repairs and to pick up the officers for that Sector tomorrow.

HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS

10. There was evacuation of 257 displaced persons from CYANGUGU to KIGALI and BUTARE. The camp at MBUGO has a medical problem and the death rate in the camp for the past 2 days was 7 per day. EQUILIBRE who has been trying to stabilize the situation is also sending its volunteers back because they are students. TROCAIRE who was to be responsible appears to be having problems at the moment. Liaison was made with the BRITISH field ambulance and they have agreed to take over the responsibility until the NGOs responsible are ready.

CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

11. An official of the ministry of Agriculture arrived at this HQ today with a letter from KIGALI in the company of the UNREO representative requesting for security when he should start mobilizing the farmers for the season. He was assisted to retrieve one of the project vehicles from GIKONGORO.

LOGISTIC

12. The Teams ration and water were collected today by the logistics officer for the sector.



1. 380 refugees returned from Zaire through two different points. Making total of 1302 returnees so far. One refugee reported that he was robbed of 104 dollars by Zairian soldier.
2. A recce group was sent to Bishoma area, and were told by local population that because of the presence of our troops, large numbers of refugees are intending to return from Zaire.
3. On 27 Aug 94 around 1600 hrs at gr 9835 car accident between UN patrolling car and civilian car resulting in minor injuries on the side of civilians. The matter is under investigation and the result will follow.
4. In Kamibi city at a place called Guranch two local militia, one armed by French and one former soldier disturb the security of the people by R4 gun fire. Recce team will be sent to the site.
5. During night, 5 ordinary thieves who were caught at two different places, after giving them advise not to repeat they were let go due to administrative and logistical difficulties.
6. Around Narushishi at displaced persons camp 2000 people were seen at the market place because of the presence of our troops, and at gr 0444 there are 4500 displaced persons located a force of one platoon is deployed.



GENERAL SITUATION

1. The situation of this sector continued to remain calm for the period under review. The DFC visited the sector today. Total of 657 displaced persons were evacuated from sector 4 to government held areas today.

POLITICAL

2. Mr. NSENGIMANA EVASE from the Minister of Interior departed GIKONGORO for KIGALI today after conference in GIKONGORO.

MILITARY

3. Some elements of the RPA have moved their position from RWANIRO grid 67/28 to the bridge at grid 66/30 and as a result the villagers and the displaced persons at KARAMBO are scared.

4. RCF gendarmerie has been assisting the ETHIOBATT at the 2 crossing points at the ZAIRE/RWANDA border at CYANGUGU. However it has been observed that the number of the gendarmerie is increasing day after day and thereby causing movement of arms in and out of RWANDA.

5. About 10 RGP soldiers have registered at GIKONGORO to be evacuated to KIGALI. Please liaise with government and advise procedure.

MILOB ACTIVITIESSECTOR HQ

5. Assisted UNHCR in registering the names of displaced persons who want to be evacuated and assisted in the evacuation of 90 displaced persons from GIKONGORO to GITARAMA. The sector HQ was unable to bring the new MILOBS at GITARAMA to GIKONGORO today because the logistics arrangements for their reception was not completed they will be picked tomorrow.

TEAMS 1 AND 2

6. Teams patrolled along the River MUGO and visited the refugee

camps. The Teams arranged for food deliveries to KANWAMBI camp to prevent future banditry of MBUGO camp.

#### TEAMS 3 AND 4

7. The Team organized evacuation of displaced persons today and attended a meeting with the NGOs of the area.

#### TEAMS 5 AND 6

8. One team went to KIGALI with a message from prefecture of GITARAMA for government and representative of UNHCR. Team organized refugee evacuation and evacuated a Russian woman with two children from KESONGI to KIBUYE.

#### HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS

9. There was arrangements with SOLIDARITAIRE an NGO to support the refugee camp at KANWAMBI. A three man committee was formed to manage the affairs of the camp. Food deliveries to this camp will commence on wed 01 sep.

10. Ref sitrep of 26 Aug the displaced persons from CYANGUGU who spent the night at KIZI left for their destinations today.

11. From CYANGUGU 67 displaced persons were evacuated to KIGALI and GITARAMA by UN British convoy.

12. The displaced persons at the ZAIRE/RWANDA border are desperately in need of relief assistance.

13. About 500 refugees in 9 trucks have been repatriated to GITARAMA and KIGALI from KIBUYE.

GENERAL SITUATION

1. The situation of this sector continued to remain calm. Some displaced persons are returning to Kibuye from Kirambo and Cyangugu areas into camps around Gikongoro to register for evacuation. Some acts of banditry have been reported in some camps around Gikongoro.

POLITICAL

2. Mr. Nsengimana Evasse who has been authorized by the Minister of Interior arrived this evening in Gikongoro to hold a conference at 1000 hrs tomorrow. The security as requested will be provided by Ghanbatt.

MILITARY

3. Ethiohatt at Cyangugu continue to control border at the two exit point, petrol and other routine activities. Gendarmerie elements at Cyangugu continue to assist Ethiohatt at the two border crossings.

4. Contingent/Battalion Comd met RPA sector comd of Sitarana at adaba check point at 1100 hrs. Chief of UNAMTR medical service and representative of UNAMTR administration visited Kibuye today.

MILOB ACTIVITIESSECTOR HQ

5. Assisted UNHCR in registering the names of displaced persons who went to be evacuated and assisted in the evacuation of displaced persons from Gikongoro. A liaison has been made with the teams at Butare and the RPA authorities to open another exit point at the South around Kibeho to speed up the evacuation of displaced persons in those areas to their homes across the River Mugo instead of transporting them through Gikongoro.

TEAMS 1 AND 2

6. Team went to patrol and confirm the strength, care and state of the various refugee camps within the Gikongoro sector. The Teams

observed that more people are returning into the camps wishing to be evacuated to the government held areas. The Teams also observed that dysentery is a very common disease at almost all camps, especially Musebeya grid village where about 1000 out of the 8000 living in the area has the sickness.

#### TEAMS 3 AND 4

7. Team received 10 immigration worker from International Organization of Migration (IOM). Team attended meeting with HQCs for coordinating humanitarian efforts.

#### TEAMS 5 AND 6

8. Team organized evacuation of refugee and escorted the convoy up to RPA check point. Team also met local authority to discuss the improvement of refugee evacuation procedure.

#### HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS

9. About 350 displaced persons from Mabanza, Nyamishaba, Gisenyi and Kibuye have been repatriated by 8 British Trucks. Around 300 displaced persons from Gikongoro have been repatriated to Gitarama and Nyabisindu. The rate of repatriation by UNHCR was remarkably slow as against the number of people desirous to be repatriated because the UNHCR had only 4 Trucks available for the exercise. However for today evacuation Ghanbatt has provided 2 Trucks for repatriation.

10. The IOM at Cyangugu promised to provide 13 vehicles for repatriation of displaced persons to commence tomorrow 26 Aug. Ghanbatt will meet and take over the escort from Ethiohatt at Kitabi.

#### CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

11. There was a report of a grenade explosion in the displaced persons camp at the Cyanika camp. Two persons have been reported to be injured. On Saturday 20 Aug a group of bandits from Kamwambi camp a near by camp attacked Mbugo camp holding grenades and cutlasses. The bandits are reported to have gone away with 14 tons of food. It was also reported that there was fighting amongst the bandits during the sharing of their gains at the Kamwambi camp resulting in the death of 3 of the bandits. Ghanbatt has been informed to step up security around the mentioned areas.

#### LOGISTIC

12. FOR 10 IMMIGRATION WORKERS OF IOM AT CYANGUGU URGENTLY NEED WATER AND FOOD.

13. The Kamembe (around Cyangugu) water purification station has left only 2 days fuel which was left by FF. UNAMIR Battalion at Cyangugu are requested urgently to provide fuel.







GENERAL SITUATION

1. Calm, it seems that in the Gikongoro and Kibuye area the movement of population has considerably reduced. In Cyangugu there is about 25,000 peoples that want to go to Zaire but border was closed to them, at 1600 the Ruzizi 2 bridge was opened only to the vehicles.

2. The population remaining in Gikongoro area still express some fears about the so called RPF infiltrations and the crimes that are committed by armed groups.

POLITICAL

3. The appointment of a Prefect in Gikongoro still remains a main concern for the local authorities.

MILITARY

4. At the border in Cyangugu, Gendarmerie are working with Ethiobat to control access to the bridges.

OWN ACTIVITIESSECTOR HQ

5. Chaired meeting with Bourgmestre and Camp Chief to discuss the issue of the return of peoples in their Communes.

6. Organize in coordination with UNHCR the first coordinated move of displaced from Gikongoro to Butare scheduled for tomorrow, this move will allow us to evaluate RPF and our system.

7. Send one vehicle in Kigali for maintenance.

TEAMS 1 AND 2

8. Went and waited to escort convoy that left Kigali at 0930 in the Bridge area at the HPZ limit. No convoy did stop looking for escort. This is the second time in three days it occurred, it is

9. Sent one vehicle to Kigali for maintenance.

10. Received visit of DFC.

13. Went to Kigali for vehicle servicing and collecting of equipment.

14. Received visit of DFC.

#### Humanitarian Affairs

15. Meeting was held with local authorities concerning return of refugees. The group was very receptive and willing to assist in that manner.

16. 70 people were ~~escorted~~ moved toward Kigali with British convoy from CYANGUHU.

17. Displaced people at RWANDA/ZAIRE border do not have food or water.

18. Displaced camp of 2,500 people has been established at MUHURU GR 75/22.

19. It was observed from CYANGUGU that the arrival of population from KIBUYE and GIKONGORO has declined with 2,300 people today.
20. Population that will be moved are worried about the humanitarian assistance they will receive once at destination knowing that their fields will not provide them ~~more~~ much.
21. To reassure them, it will be required that UNAMIR personnel operating at their destination be present when they arrive to welcome them and brief them if needed.

#### Civilian Affairs

22. There is an increase of reports regarding banditry. Action that requires proper investigation and subsequently arrestation. ~~in~~ some cases the necessity of a police force that could handle that subject is of great importance. It is reminded for your attention that local authorities in place do not have the facilities or expertise to handle prisoners accordingly or to feed them. Actually the communal personnel like policemen, nurses and doctors, bourgmestres and other administrators are not being feed themselves and have to line-up to get their share.
23. Businessmen in the Sector would like to re-establish contact with those from BUTARE and Kigali.

24. The re-establishment of service stations would solve lots of difficulties.

### LOGISTICS

25. The sector had 3 vehicles for servicing on a fleet of 8, which brought back the point that we need a system to replace vehicles or to accelerate/prioritize the servicing in order not to affect the operation in each sector.
26. The requirement for gasoline (not diesel fuel) is important. ~~without~~ without it, it will be impossible to assist local authorities in their duties and this will have an adverse effect. The return in their communes of displaced with cars will also be affected because of that lack of gasoline. NGOs operating in the area are facing the same needs due to resupply problems.

### MISC

27. Rain has caused lots of damages to roads and bridges, specially in the KADUNA area. A local in charge of public works would have the personnel (apparently 500) if it would be possible for the government to pay them. The requirements for an implication of UNAMIR engineers is necessary if we considered that this sector is the home of 100 thousand of people. NGOs do not have that capacity and are expecting a lot from UNAMIR. The impact of not being able to ~~for~~ reach/feed the population is difficult to ~~could~~ evaluate.



28. Sector Commander is leaving on leave on Wed afternoon 24 Aug 94. Advise Maj AWADEY, actually in Kigali, of that modification so that he can report the latest in mid-morning 24<sup>th</sup> Aug.
