Combat in the city of Kigali and environs was less intense than the preceding days. It took place mainly in four sectors:

1. Kacyru Gendarmerie Camp
Exchange of fire, heavy-arms, starting very early in the morning; then sporadic, light-arms fire.
2. Kyovu - Gikondo
Fighting took place here the whole day. Heavy and light arms fire from the RGF side struck RPF positions. The RPF has made little progress in its advance on the Red Cross Hospital at least until this afternoon.
3. Rugenge - market area
RPF mortars pounded this area hard from positions along the hills to the east of Mount Kigali.
During these bombardments, the Pentecote Cathedral and part of the market area were hit by three mortar shells causing many deaths among civilians with three soldiers killed near the Church.
4. Nyamirambo
Subjected to light arms and mortar fire between the RPF, which controls the south and south-west sectors of the paved road crossing the neighborhood (Nyabarongo Avenue), and the RGF, positioned on the other side and controlling all the sector adjacent to the Gendarmerie Brigade.
The front has been stable for a month although some say it is moving, house by house, as the RPF closes in on the Gendarmerie Brigade which is subjected to heavy fire.
5. The front of the Meridien hotel has for some time now been constantly subjected to light-arms fire at the same time of day and same target: the balconies. According to reliable information, the shooting which harasses the occupants of the hotel comes from the building of the Ministry of the Family, situated some 150 - 200 meters away on the left side of Kacyru road (Blvd of Umuganda).
6. Generally speaking, a more friendly attitude is shown by militiamen and Kigali residents (government side) to UNAMIR personnel; the people wave and one can see signs reading "long live France, long live the United Nations."

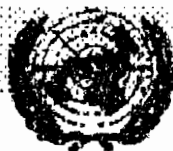
