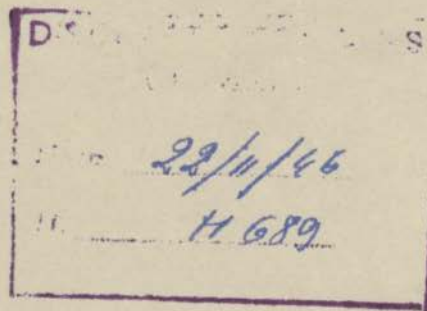

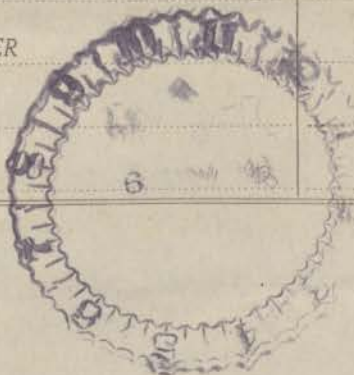

1. As the result of my call to Caserta, and copy of a letter which we sent to Caserta relative to the Greeks, Colonel Richardson, G.5. AFHQ, called me today, and the following conversation was the result of the call.
2. Colonel Richardson stated that AFHQ is somewhat stalled on the entire matter of the Greeks, because it involves possibly, firstly some political cases, and secondly, a second approach which they wish to make to the Greek Authorities to have them authorise the return of these Greeks.
3. He said that AFHQ is not opposed to a plan of forcible repatriation of these Greeks if it comes to that point.
4. He mentioned that AFHQ would not like to turn these Greeks over to the Italian Government just at this time without further information on them, because of certain political implications that would very likely follow.
5. He mentioned that the group of Greeks which we have in the Camp are the dregs of a former number of approximately 5,000, and that this remaining 400 now constitutes what we may call "the hard core".
6. Colonel Richardson said that he has told Major Hartman to forge ahead on determining individual cases of Roumanians, Armenians and so forth. among this group, as well as to follow through with the Greek Government relative to having them rescind their decision concerning Nazi wives. Again Colonel Richardson mentioned that they would be willing to have forcible repatriation if absolutely necessary.
7. I mentioned to Colonel Richardson that we are very anxious to keep these Greeks out of our Camp, that they are not our responsibility as they were given to us by AFHQ, and that we could no longer keep them there. He said well we could, if you force us, move them to the Camp at Trani, near Bari.

All of the persons listed are being discontinued from UNRRA assistance, as a result of this representation by the Yugoslav representative.

1. Bandovic Milan, collaborator of ill-famed governor and war criminal in Monte Negro, Pirzio Biroli, who escaped in August 1945, to Italy, before the advancing Yugoslav Army.
2. Lazarevic Ivo, well known collaborator from Hercegnovi and Montenegro, war criminal.
3. Kochansky Drago, is a deserter of Yugoslav Army.
4. Popovic Todor, notorious collaborator of war criminal, general Nedic, who was recently handed over to Yugoslav authorities, and well known collaborator of Italian occupation forces in Yugoslavia.
5. Rakocovic Milo, Montenegrin leader and best known collaborator of war criminal, Italian governor of Montenegro during the occupation, Pirzio Biroli.
6. Zebot Ciril, war criminal.
7. Vukelic Gjuro, priest, organizer and ill-famed leader of quisling formations in Lika (Yugoslavia)
8. Vujesovic Nikola collaborator who went to Italy 1945, flying before the advancing Yugoslav Army.



1. Paragraph 2(b) of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 6 is rescinded effective 1 July 1946.

2. The effect of this will be that employees of UNRRA in Italy, other than members of the Armed Forces, will cease to be subject to Military Law and will be regarded as civilians. Criminal proceedings against such persons should be taken to Italian civilian courts according to Italian Law. Where offences are committed in territory administered by the Military Government, proceedings should be taken in Military Government Courts, provided the offences are those which are dealt with by Military Government Courts. If not, proceedings should be taken in the appropriate Civilian Courts.

3. It is requested that you inform the UNRRA Mission to Italy accordingly.

- (1) In discussions with the representatives of AFHQ the question has arisen whether UNRRA Italian Mission on behalf of the Italian Government would look after non-Italian Displaced Persons ineligible for UNRRA assistance in Italy.
- (2) We have been advised by UNRRA (London) that UNRRA cannot provide personnel to assist the Italian Government in caring for non-Italian Displaced Persons ineligible for UNRRA assistance. However, UNRRA (London) has instructed us that the Italian Government may assist such ineligible persons with imported UNRRA supplies. In the opinion of UNRRA (London) the maintenance of such displaced persons forms part of the supply programme of the recipient country and the Italian Government may devote to that purpose the UNRRA supplies which are imported to assist it in maintaining the general population of the country.

Attached you will find copy of cable No. 1149 from our London office to this Mission and repeated to Washington, together with our cable of 11 May 1946. These two cables are self-explanatory. You will recall that at our meeting on 10 May, I showed you and Col. Findley the cable from London and we discussed the contents of it.

You will be interested to know that on Sunday, 12 May, Col. Findley and members of his staff, together with Mr. Varrichione, Mr. Hunter and I, discussed specifically the steps to be taken with respect to carrying out the plan generally reviewed on 10 May.

We appreciate that your important problem is the matter of staff and you will note that we have so indicated in our cable to London. Mr. Keeny took the liberty of pointing out to Sir Humphrey Gale that our London office might be of assistance in urging the War Office to take necessary action in providing personnel for the camps for ineligibles.



Subject: Visits to PW Camps.

It is reported that a press-photographer travelling in an UNRRA vehicle arrived at 'U' Overseas PW Camp (Eboli) and took photographs without being in possession of the necessary pass.

The following extract from the report submitted by the Camp Adjutant is given for your information and necessary action.

"The other man present who spoke English stated that he was a 'Royal Yugoslav' and was once an S.E.P. in this Camp, and therefore knew some of the present inmates. I examined his documents and from them obtained the following information. His name is MAI S. LOLITCH of UNRRA ROME. He was in possession of a movement order and 2 work tickets, one for the driver and one for himself, both were made out for the same vehicle a Jeep marked UNRRA No. 231. The Work Tickets were made out for the 17th March 1946: area NAPLES DIVISION, and signed by this same man. The Drivers name is CAMPOINI LUCIANO. He was not with the vehicle. LOLITCH stated that he had come to this Camp to see some of his friends and named General DUKIC as one of them. The press photographer was picked up on the road and they had not been previously acquainted.

The vehicle had very little petrol in the tank and therefore 2 galls were issued to take them to the nearest petrol point. A receipt was obtained".

The G.O.C. 3 District in his covering letter to the report says "It appears that the employee of UNRRA was merely 'joy-riding' and it is requested that this matter may be passed ..... to UNRRA .....".

It is felt that you will wish to ensure that UNRRA employees do not lend themselves to irregularities giving rise to complaint.

We have received your letter of 19 March in which you ask us to send you a strength report of displaced persons by nationality each month.

Owing to the amount of time involved in receiving mail from the various camps, we regret it will not be possible for us to submit a report showing displaced persons by nationality in the camps as at the first Saturday of each month, until later than the 15th of each month.

We could, however, let you have a report on that date showing the most recent figures received from the various camps, and in some instances these might be as at the first Saturday of the month, but in most cases they would probably be as at approximately the end of the previous month.

Also, as our records are based upon nationality and not upon religion it will be difficult for us to give you any accurate return showing the number of Jewish persons included in these figures.

We shall be pleased to know what action you would like us to take in this matter.



1. This HQ letter 6752/Q(Maint) dated 25 Aug 45 is cancelled and with effect from the receipt of this letter, the attached instructions will apply to the disposal of fixed assets, except as detailed in para 2 below.

2. Pending clarification of certain outstanding issues between the War Office and the U.S. War Dept., the procedure detailed in respect of assets containing a US lend lease element will not apply. Should therefore any asset be found to contain stores of US lend lease origin, the details will be reported to this HQ for further instructions.

PROCEDURE FOR THE DISPOSAL OF FIXED ASSETS IN REAL ESTATE IN  
ITALIAN TERRITORY, WHICH IS TO BE DEREQUISITIONED OR OTHERWISE  
PASS OUT OF BRITISH OCCUPATION

---

DEFINITION

1. The term "fixed asset" will be assumed to cover:-

- (a) Any installation constructed by the British Armed Forces, either directly or by the employment of a contractor.
- (b) Any appreciable quantity of stores which have been incorporated in a building either for the rehabilitation or for the adaptation of the building, in order that it might be used by the British for war purposes.
- (c) Plant and tools installed therein.

NOTE: Throughout this instruction the term "Real Estate" covers both land and buildings.

2. Fixed assets in real estate which is surplus to theatre requirements will be regarded as globally surplus and disposed of in accordance with these instructions, except that:-

- (a) Items which have been reported through Service channels as in short supply may be removed under Area/Service arrangements, unless in the opinion of the Area Command removal would materially reduce the overall importance of the property to the Italian economy. In these circumstances he may, at his discretion, arrange for such items to be left in situ.
- (b) The stores listed at Appendix 'A' have been reported by the War Office as in global short supply. In no circumstances will any item on this list be disposed of without reference to this HQ.
- (c) Hutting and other constructional stores may still be removed for the improvement of military accommodation.

DECLARATION OF SURPLUS REAL ESTATE

3. Corps and District HQ are authorised to proceed with the disposal of all fixed assets in accommodation sites and camps with a capacity of less than 400. Larger camps and storage or workshop space used by GHQ installations or by the RN or RAF will be referred to this HQ before disposal action is taken.

4. Real estate incorporating fixed assets required by British official organisations will be regarded as occupations on a tenant basis. British requisitions will continue in force and where appropriate, charges will be made for the occupation.

DISPOSAL

5. Fixed assets of a type likely to be of use to UNRRA will first be offered to that Organisation either for use in ITALY or elsewhere, as they see fit.



6. The Corps or District HQ concerned will notify the UNRRA Mission attached to AFHQ as and when suitable assets become available, asking UNRRA to indicate within 14 days whether they wish to take them over.

7. If UNRRA wish to acquire an asset they will be required to designate an agent authorised to complete the transaction on their behalf.

8. All other fixed assets (including those refused by UNRRA) will be handed over to the Italian Government, without any negotiation of price or immediate financial settlement.

9. With the exception of UNRRA, no disposals of fixed assets will be made to any individuals, local authorities or corporations, and the Italian Government will be expected to accept all such assets made available, whatever their nature or condition.

METHOD OF HANDING OVER TO UNRRA

10. As soon as UNRRA have indicated that they are desirous of taking over a fixed asset, the transfer will be completed as follows:-

- (a) The property will be inspected and an inventory made of all fixed assets. Special note will be taken of any items of US Lend lease origin.
- (b) If it is established that the assets contain items of US Lend Lease origin, the inventory will be priced and the value of the asset assessed on a basis of cost less physical depreciation. In this assessment account will be taken of:-
  - (i) Both military and local labour charges.
  - (ii) The value of all imported and locally produced stores.
- (c) The designated UNRRA agent will be required to sign an interim receipt for the property in accordance with the certificate at Appendix 'B'.
- (d) The priced inventory together with the estimated value of the asset and interim receipt will be forwarded to the Director of Hirings GHQ CMF.
- (e) On receipt of priced inventory and estimated value of the asset the D of Hirings GHQ will approach the US Army Navy Liquidation Commission and agree what proportion of the estimated value is due to the US.
- (f) As soon as the US ANLC have agreed the portion of the estimated value which is due to the US the D of Hirings GHQ will approach the designated UNRRA agent and obtain a final receipt in accordance with Appendix 'C'.
- (g) It will be made clear to UNRRA that the US portion of the estimated value will be subject to normal US disposal procedure and the US may require immediate reimbursement.
- (h) The British portion of the estimated value will be agreed with the designated UNRRA agent. If the UNRRA agent is unwilling to accept the British estimated value he will be required to complete Part II of the receipt at Appendix 'C'.



11. If no items of US Lend Lease origin can be identified in the fixed assets, the inventory will be priced and the estimated value assessed in accordance with para 10(b) above and the designated UNRRA agent will be required to complete the receipt at Appendix 'C' Parts I and II as necessary. Completed receipts, supported by priced inventories and estimated values will be forwarded to the Director of Hirings GHQ CMF.

12. Fixed assets required by UNRRA will be transferred to their designated agent as quickly as possible. In no circumstances will transfers be delayed on account of negotiations with OANLO or failure on the part of UNRRA to accept the estimated value of the asset.

METHOD OF HANDING OVER TO THE ITALIAN GOVERNMENT

13. The Italian Government have nominated the AZIENDA RILIEVO ALIENAZIONE RESIDERATE as their agent for all disposals.

14. Representatives of the Italian state organisation responsible for disposals are located at various places throughout ITALY. Details are given in Appendix 'D'.

15. Transfers will be completed as follows:-

- (a) The property will be inspected and an inventory made of all fixed assets. Special note will be made of any items of US Lend Lease origin.
- (b) The inventory will be priced and the value of the asset assessed on a basis of cost less physical depreciation. In this assessment account will be taken of:-
  - (i) Military Labour
  - (ii) Local labour
  - (iii) Military stores of British origin.
  - (iv) Military stores of US Lend Lease origin.
  - (v) Stores which have been procured locally.
- (c) There will be no negotiation with Italian representatives on the question of price and any inventory handed to them will be unpriced.
- (d) The Italian representative will be required to complete a receipt in accordance with Appendix 'E'. If the Italian representative makes a claim that any part of the value of the asset represents materials or labour supplied by the Italian Government, the extent of this claim in terms of money will be noted on the receipt.
- (e) On completion of the transaction the signed receipt together with priced inventory and estimated value under the five sub-headings in para 15(b) above will be forwarded to the Director of Hirings GHQ CMF.

16. On receipt of records as in 15(e) above the Director of Hirings will examine them and ascertain whether any US Lend Lease stores are involved. Where Lend Lease stores are involved he will forward one copy of the receipt, signed by the Italian Government representative, to the office of the Army Navy Liquidation Commission accompanied by a detailed list of the US stores involved, for any action necessary.



#### FIXED ASSETS INSTALLED FOR CIVIL AFFAIRS PURPOSES

17. Fixed assets created purely for Civil Affairs Purposes are excluded from the above instructions, as they will form the subject of a separate charge against the Italian Government.

#### PERMANENT WAY AND OTHER RAILWAY FIXED ASSETS

18. Permanent way and Railway fixed assets are divided into two parts:-

- (a) Fixed assets incorporated in the Italian State Railway system.
- (b) Fixed assets forming part of a military depot or installation.

19. Fixed assets incorporated in the Italian State Railway System have already been recorded as a charge against the Italian Government and no further disposal action is necessary.

20. Fixed assets incorporated in military depots and installations will be disposed of in accordance with these instructions, as part of the depot or installation.

#### SIGNALS FIXED ASSETS

21. Separate action has already been initiated by this HQ for the disposal of Signals Fixed Assets incorporated in the Italian Telecommunications network. These instructions will therefore only apply to Signals fixed Assets installed in requisitioned property.

#### DISPOSALS RECORDS AND REPORTS

22. In accordance with the above instructions the full records of all completed disposals will be forwarded to the Director of Hirings GHQ who will be responsible for maintaining these and such other records as are necessary.

23. The Director of Hirings will render monthly reports in triplicate to 'Q' Branch GHQ based on the records received from Corps and Districts. The reports will be in two parts:-

- (a) Disposals to UNRRA using proforma at Appendix 'F'.
- (b) Disposals to Italian Government using proforma at Appendix 'G'.

#### RESPONSIBILITY

24. Except where stated otherwise, the responsibility for carrying out all the above instructions rests with the local Area Commander acting through the local Hirings Officer and/or Town Major and advised where necessary by his CRE or other RE officer attached to his HQ.

25. Where the fixed assets have been installed or used by the RN, RAF, RE Transportation or Signals, or includes stores peculiar to those services, disposal action will be carried out in conjunction with a rep of the interested service.

26. In so far as the RN is concerned disposal of such assets will be executed in conjunction with the Flag Officer, Italy and Liaison ROME.

27. D.W. GHQ CMF will issue from time to time directives for estimating the value of RE stores included in fixed assets.

3. It is emphasised that the action taken by Comdt Tricase Centre is quite irregular and could result in much embarrassment.

4. You are requested, therefore, to issue the necessary instructions to all Comdts of Camps housing Yugoslav DPs, that will obviate the embarrassment for which complaint is made.

1. Reference is made to your letter to Col. FINDLAY, N. SM/206, 14 January 1946, on the above subject, which has been forwarded to this Headquarters.
2. Wherever the expression " Soviet Citizens " is used here - in, it is intended to mean Soviet Citizens as understood by the United States and British Governments.
3. This communication pertains to normal Displaced Persons and Prisoners of War, as distinguished from certain special cases in which forcible repatriation may be permitted. As you are no doubt aware, except in these special cases, the use of force is not at present permitted under the policies of the United States and British Governments.
4. The Supreme Allied Commander assumes the position that he alone is responsible for screening the various prisoners and displaced persons who have come into his hands and for determining their nationality. Moreover, as explained to Major General Basilov on 18 August 1945, he is unable to agree to Russian officers being allowed access to nationals of other Allied States who are accommodated in Displaced Persons or Prisoner of War Camps.
5. It is regretted that permission to visit all Displaced Persons and Prisoner of War Camps cannot be given. Visits in accordance with the normal procedure will be allowed to any specific camp where Soviet citizens have been collected. It is pointed out that none of the Displaced Persons camps under the control of the Allied Commission or of UNRRA at present come within this category. The only applicable camp is the British Prisoner of War Camp at RIMINI to which a visit has already been arranged for the near future.
6. In regard to the question of nominal rolls and interviews, pertaining to Displaced Persons Camps, the following is the present policy:

a. Nominal rolls will be furnished you by Allied commission of all displaced persons of Russian nationality who were physically within the 1 September 1939 geographically boundaries of Russia on that date.

b. After your perusal of the nominal rolls, and on your request, an interview with any displaced person so listed will be arranged, subject to the conditions stated below:

1. The interview mentioned above will take place outside the camp in question and will be in the presence of an Anglo-American representative.

2. No force or intimidation will be allowed, either in requiring an unwilling person to be interviewed, or during the course of an interview.

3. Arrangements including the issue of travel orders will be made by Allied Commission for this purpose.

7. If at any time persons of Russian nationality as defined in paragraph 6a above are found in Prisoner of War camps, these individuals will be moved to RIMINI (British) or to Camp 399, PISA (US). Subsequently nominal rolls will be furnished you, and on your request, interviews will be arranged.

8. Compilation of nominal rolls will be expedited as far as possible.

3. It has been ruled that the overall accommodation of DP & R S-C and UNRRA camps is to be reduced to a scale sufficient to handle a maximum commitment of 33,000 as outlined in para 2 above.

4. No large scale re-classification of other categories (i.e. PW SEP - CHETNIKS) will be made. Repatriation arrangements for the large number of Italian PW and civilians still to return will be made by MMIA and Italian Government.

5. Please submit as soon as possible a statement showing what reduction in accommodation, personnel and stores you recommend. Some of the accommodation thus freed may be required for other purposes and no executive action should be taken to close down any camp or dispose of stores without approval from this Headquarters.
