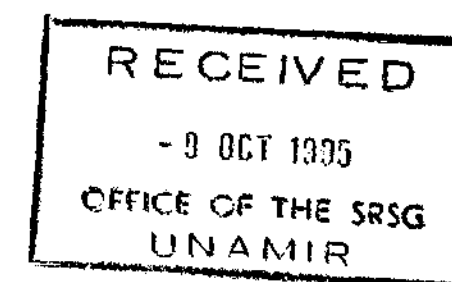

SITREP FOR 06 OCT 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES AT REDUCED SCALE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 425. 61 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE , 07 FROM UGANDA AND 357 FROM BURUNDI.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 20,001. OUTFLOW 22.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/ GENDARMERIE. MILOBS SECTOR 1B WERE INFORMED BY AUTHORITIES OF KABGAYI HOSPITAL OF AN INCIDENT WHEREIN A PRISONER WAS SHOT DEAD WHILE ATTEMPTING TO ESCAPE ON 04 OCT 95. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS. HUMAN RIGHT INFORMED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

5. HUMANITARIAN.

A. INDBATT PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO RUNDA COMMUNE FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FIREWOOD.

B. GHANBATT PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO THE NGO GOAL TO TRANSPORT CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS FOR REFUGEE CAMP AT BYUMBA.

C. MALICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCKS EACH TO PREFECT OF BUTARE RPA AND PAM TO TRANSPORT VARIOUS ITEMS.

D. FORCE SIGNAL COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO LOCAL ORGANISATION ARDEC.

E. A TOTAL OF 182 MED AND 03 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY UNAMIR MED STAFF.

F. A TOTAL OF 52 RETURNEES ARRIVED NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND GISENYI. 110 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI AND KIBUNGO. 692 STILL AWAITING EVACUATION.

G. FORCE ENGINEER COY CONTINUED WORK ON CANAL DIGGING IN GIKONGORO AND REHABILITATION SCHOOL IN BUTARE.

H. IN SECTOR 2B THE TEAM OF 12 REPS WITH UNHCR OFFICIALS FROM BENACO REFUGEE CAMP IN TANZANIA VISITING RWANDA TO ASSESS THE SUITABILITY OF CONDITIONS FOR SAFE RETURN OF REFUGEES RETURNED TO TANZANIA ON 07 OCT 95. THE TEAM IS REPORTED TO BE SATISFIED WITH THE PREVAILING CONDITIONS.

I. MILOBS REPORTED THE COMPLETION OF SURVEY BY A NEW NGO "CONCERN WORLDWIDE" AT BUGARAMA REFUGEES TRANSIT CAMP (THEY HAD ARRIVED ON 02 OCT 95). AND SAID TO BE READY TO TAKE OVER SOME SERVICES NOW BEING PROVIDED BY UNHCR.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. MILOBS SECTOR 5B WERE INFORMED BY MSF THAT 5 CHILDREN WERE INJURED IN A MINE BLAST ON 5 OCT AT KABYAZA (GR 8343) IN BUTARO COMMUNE AND BROUGHT TO RUHENGERI HOSPITAL.

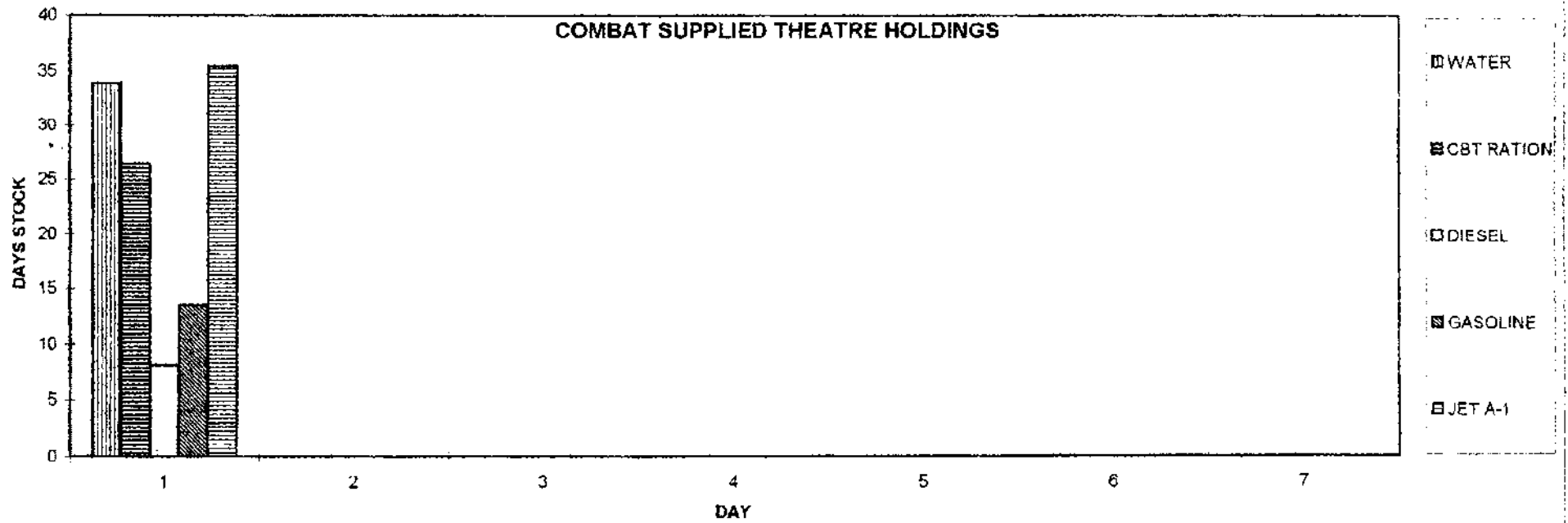

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 367. 354 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE , AND 13 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW:

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 19, 576. OUTFLOW 22.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR URASA, DELEGATE OF THE UNHCR, ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE TRIPARTITE COMMISSION COMPRISING RWANDA, ZAIRE AND UNHCR AND DISCUSSED MEANS TO FACILITATE THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF REFUGEES, THE SITUATION IN THE CAMPS AND THE REHABILITATION OF RETURNEES TO RWANDA.

B. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE SRSG MET WITH THE PRISONS ADVISER MR RANDOLF KENT AND HIS COLLEAGUES TO DISCUSS THE PRISON SITUATION, PLANS FOR FURTHER IMPROVEMENTS AND FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THEIR IMPLEMENTATION.

C. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE REPRESENTATIVE OF IRELAND, MS BARBARA JONES, TO DISCUSS THE FORTHCOMING VISIT TO RWANDA BY THE PRESIDENT OF IRELAND.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/ GENDARMERIE. IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) THE LOCAL RPA MEMBERS WERE LAST PAID IN AUGUST AND IT WAS THEIR DECEMBER 94 PAY. A SGT AND A PRIVATE GET APPROXIMATELY 18,600 RWF AND 7,000 RWF RESPECTIVELY.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

5. HUMANITARIAN.

A. IN SECTOR 1A INDBATT TRANSPORTED 08 TONS OF SEEDS AND TRUCK LOAD OF HOES FROM KIGALI TO BUTAMWA COMMUNE.

B. INDBATT RMO AND MEDICAL TEAM VISITED BUTAMWA COMMUNE WHERE THEY TREATED 50 LOCALS AND DISTRIBUTED MEDICINES. 10 PACKETS OF ESSENTIAL LIFE SAVING DRUGS WERE HANDED OVER TO

THE DISPENSARY IN THE COMMUNE.

C. GHANBATT PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO THE NGO GOAL TO TRANSPORT CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS FOR REFUGEE CAMP AT BYUMBA.

D. MALICOY PROVIDED 06 TRUCKS TO DIFFERENT NGO'S TO TRANSPORT VARIOUS ITEMS.

E. MALAWICOY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO RPA TO TRANSPORT FOOD.

F. 167 RETURNEES ARR NDERA CAMP. 45 WERE DESPATCHED TO THEIR COMMUNES AND 750 ARE STILL AWAITING EVAC.

G. A TOTAL OF 182 MED AND 03 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY UNAMIR MED STAFF.

H. IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) MILOB TEAM AT BUTAMWA COMMUNE HANDED OVER A BOX OF MEDICINES TO THE MEDICAL CENTRE OF THE COMMUNE WHICH MAY LAST SIX MONTHS AND SEEDS FOR 1,000 FAMILIES. THE SEEDS WERE SUPPLIED BY THE EEC.

I. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) A TEAM OF 12 REPRESENTATIVES ALONG WITH UNHCR OFFICIALS FROM BENACO REFUGEE CAMP IN TANZANIA VISITED NYARABUYE GS 8459 AND KANKOBWA GS 8960 TO ASSESS THE GROUND REALITIES. THE TEAM IS ON A FACT FINDING MISSION ABOUT THE SUITABILITY OF CONDITIONS FOR THE SAFE RETURN OF REFUGEES.

J. UNHCR ASSISTED BY AEF DISTRIBUTED HOES, BLANKETS AND SEEDS TO THE OLD CASE LOADS IN RUSHUNGA GS 9359.

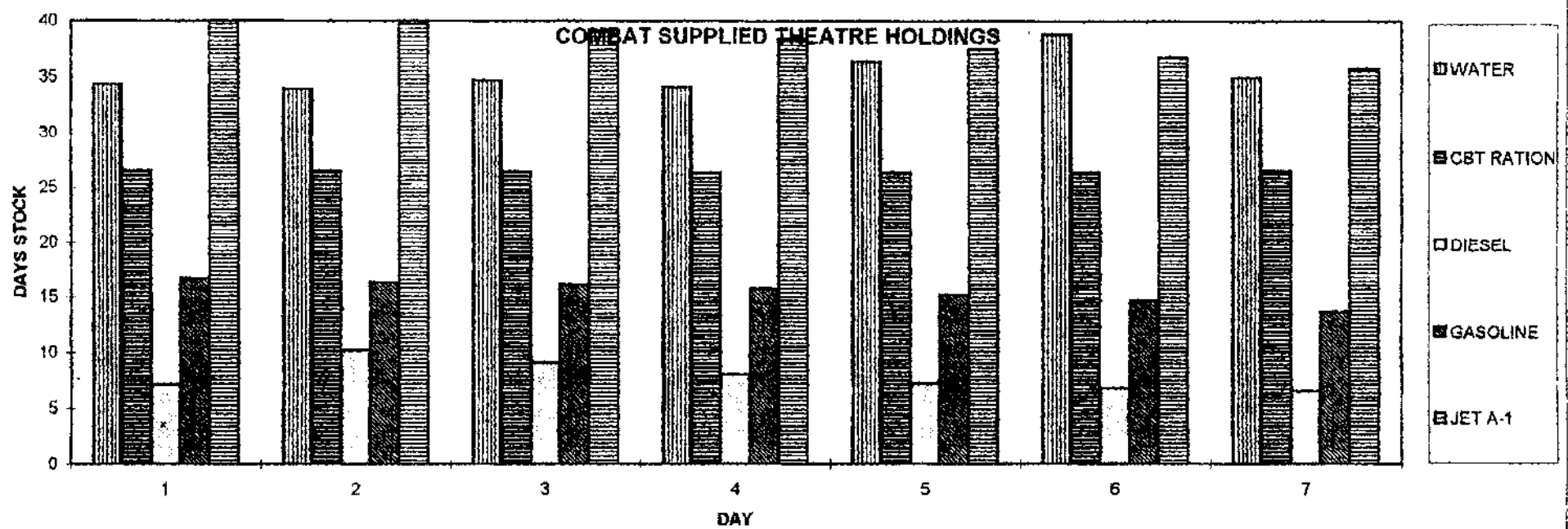

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 367. 354 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE , AND 13 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW:

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 19, 576. OUTFLOW 22.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR URASA, DELEGATE OF THE UNHCR, ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE TRIPARTITE COMMISSION COMPRISING RWANDA, ZAIRE AND UNHCR AND DISCUSSED MEANS TO FACILITATE THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF REFUGEES, THE SITUATION IN THE CAMPS AND THE REHABILITATION OF RETURNEES TO RWANDA.

B. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE SRSG MET WITH THE PRISONS ADVISER MR RANDOLF KENT AND HIS COLLEAGUES TO DISCUSS THE PRISON SITUATION, PLANS FOR FURTHER IMPROVEMENTS AND FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR THEIR IMPLEMENTATION.

C. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE REPRESENTATIVE OF IRELAND, MS BARBARA JONES, TO DISCUSS THE FORTHCOMING VISIT TO RWANDA BY THE PRESIDENT OF IRELAND.

A. RPA/ GENDARMERIE. IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) THE LOCAL RPA MEMBERS WERE LAST PAID IN AUGUST AND IT WAS THEIR DECEMBER 94 PAY. A SGT AND A PRIVATE GET APPROXIMATELY 18,600 RWF AND 7,000 RWF RESPECTIVELY.

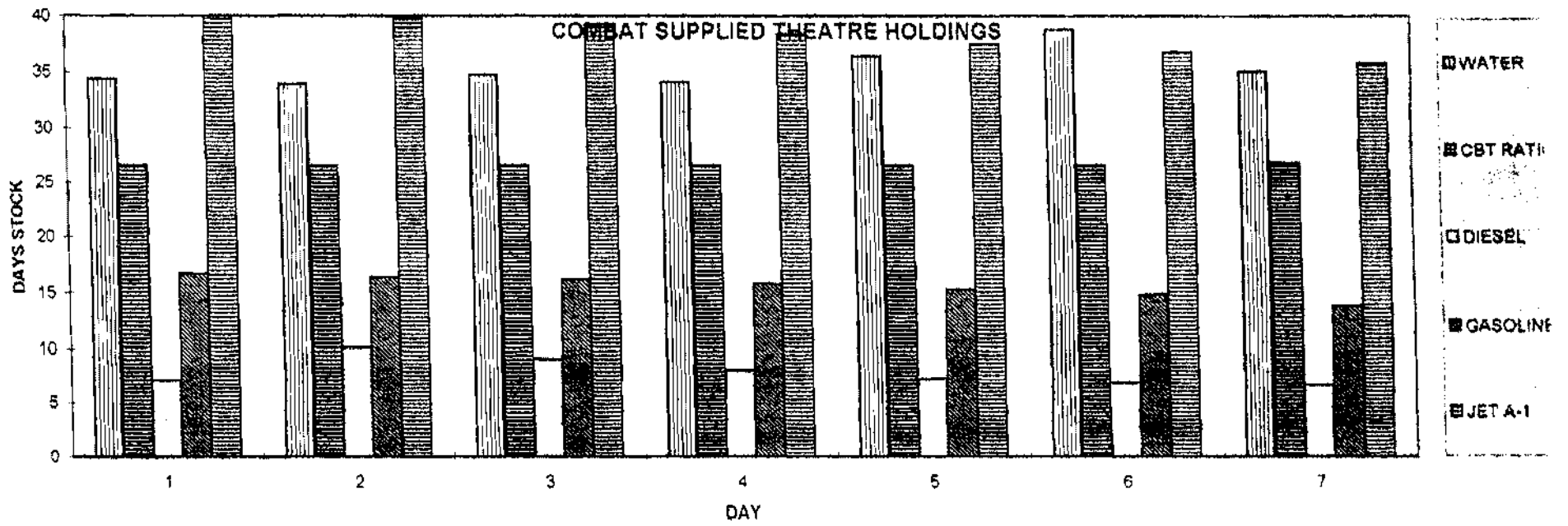

SITREP FOR 04 OCT 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES AT A VERY REDUCED SCALE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 157. 139 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE , AND 18 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW: NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 19, 209. OUTFLOW 22.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE OPENING OF NSINDA PRISON, INAUGURATION TODAY. H.E.THE PRESIDENT, MR PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, IN THE PRESENCE OF OTHER DIGNITARIES INCLUDING THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, VARIOUS HEADS OF UN AGENCIES AND THE MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS ATTENDED AS WELL.

B. WHILE REITERATING INTERNATIONAL CONCERN OVER PRISONS CONDITIONS IN RWANDA, THE SRSG EXPRESSED HIS APPRECIATION FOR THE IMPORTANCE THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT ATTACHES TO FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS IN GENERAL AND IMPROVEMENTS OF PRISON CONDITIONS IN PARTICULAR. THE SRSG STATED THAT WITH THE APPOINTMENT OF A PRISON COMMISSION BY THE PRESIDENT, A CRASH PROGRAMME IS IN HAND FOR EXTENDING EXISTING FACILITIES AND BUILDING ADDITIONAL DETENTION CENTRES THROUGH COOPERATION BETWEEN GOVERNMENT, THE UN AND THE DONOR COMMUNITY.

C. THE OPENING OF NSINDA FACILITY, AS WELL AS THE FORTHCOMING ADDITIONS TO THE SYSTEM OF THE NYANZA AND ONATRACOM FACILITY, WILL MAKE IT POSSIBLE TO ABSORB 13,000 PRISONERS FROM THE EXISTING, OVER-CROWDED PRISON SYSTEM.

D. IN PARALLEL, THE SRSG RECALLED THE URGENCY OF THE NEED TO REVIEW THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM BECAUSE ALL EFFORTS TO IMPROVE PRISON CONDITIONS WILL NOT YIELD MUCH UNLESS THE JUDICIAL PROCESS, INCLUDING THE TRIAGE COMMISSION, BEGINS TO FUNCTION EFFECTIVELY.

E. ON HIS PART, H.E.PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU EXPRESSED HIS GRATITUDE TO THE SRSG AND UNAMIR FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTION IN THE OPERATION TO IMPROVE PRISON CONDITIONS IN RWANDA. IN ADDITION, THE PRESIDENT REQUESTED FURTHER ASSISTANCE FROM UNAMIR IN THE PROVISION OF PRISON SECURITY.

F. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH A VISITING

US DELEGATION AND DISCUSSED MATTERS CONCERNING POLICE TRAINING AND REFORMS.

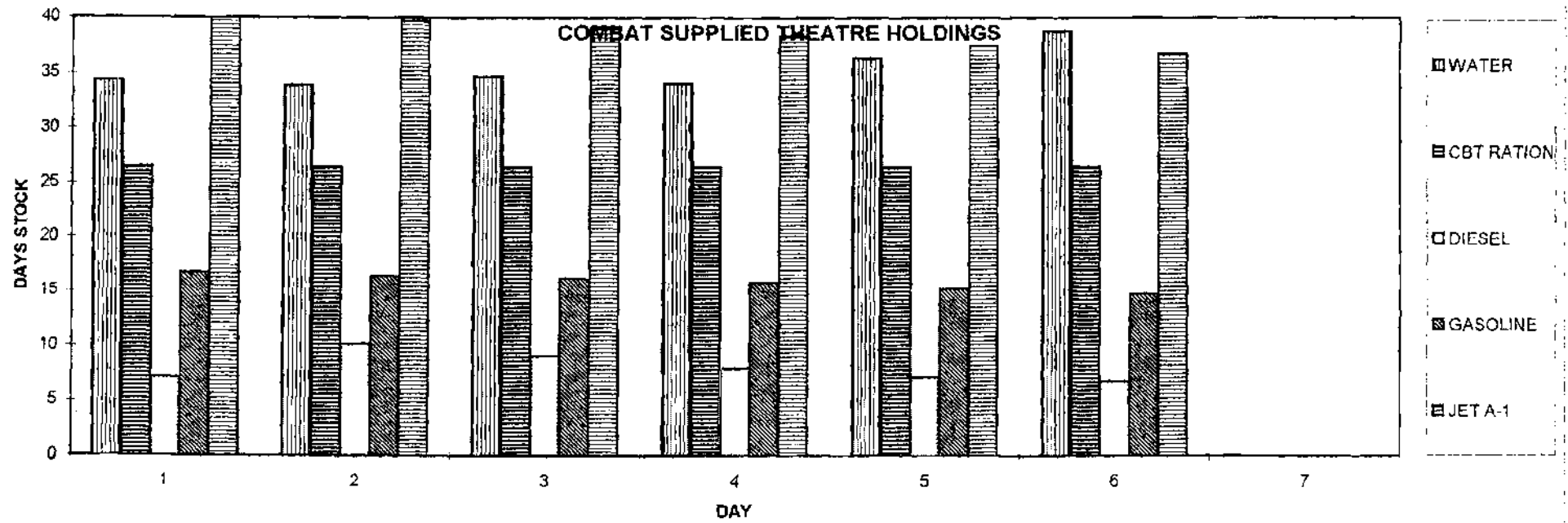

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES AT A VERY REDUCED SCALE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 157. 139 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE , AND 18 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW: NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 19, 209. OUTFLOW 22.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE OPENING OF NSINDA PRISON, INAUGURATION TODAY. H.E. THE PRESIDENT, MR PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, IN THE PRESENCE OF OTHER DIGNITARIES INCLUDING THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, VARIOUS HEADS OF UN AGENCIES AND THE MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS ATTENDED AS WELL.

B. WHILE REITERATING INTERNATIONAL CONCERN OVER PRISONS CONDITIONS IN RWANDA, THE SRSG EXPRESSED HIS APPRECIATION FOR THE IMPORTANCE THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT ATTACHES TO FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS IN GENERAL AND IMPROVEMENTS OF PRISON CONDITIONS IN PARTICULAR. THE SRSG STATED THAT WITH THE APPOINTMENT OF A PRISON COMMISSION BY THE PRESIDENT, A CRASH PROGRAMME IS IN HAND FOR EXTENDING EXISTING FACILITIES AND BUILDING ADDITIONAL DETENTION CENTRES THROUGH COOPERATION BETWEEN GOVERNMENT, THE UN AND THE DONOR COMMUNITY.

C. THE OPENING OF NSINDA FACILITY, AS WELL AS THE FORTHCOMING ADDITIONS TO THE SYSTEM OF THE NYANZA AND ONATRACOM FACILITY, WILL MAKE IT POSSIBLE TO ABSORB 13,000 PRISONERS FROM THE EXISTING, OVER-CROWDED PRISON SYSTEM.

D. IN PARALLEL, THE SRSG RECALLED THE URGENCY OF THE NEED TO REVIEW THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM BECAUSE ALL EFFORTS TO IMPROVE PRISON CONDITIONS WILL NOT YIELD MUCH UNLESS THE JUDICIAL PROCESS, INCLUDING THE TRIAGE COMMISSION, BEGINS TO FUNCTION EFFECTIVELY.

E. ON HIS PART, H.E. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU EXPRESSED HIS GRATITUDE TO THE SRSG AND UNAMIR FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTION IN THE OPERATION TO IMPROVE PRISON CONDITIONS IN RWANDA. IN ADDITION, THE PRESIDENT REQUESTED FURTHER ASSISTANCE FROM UNAMIR IN THE PROVISION OF PRISON SECURITY.

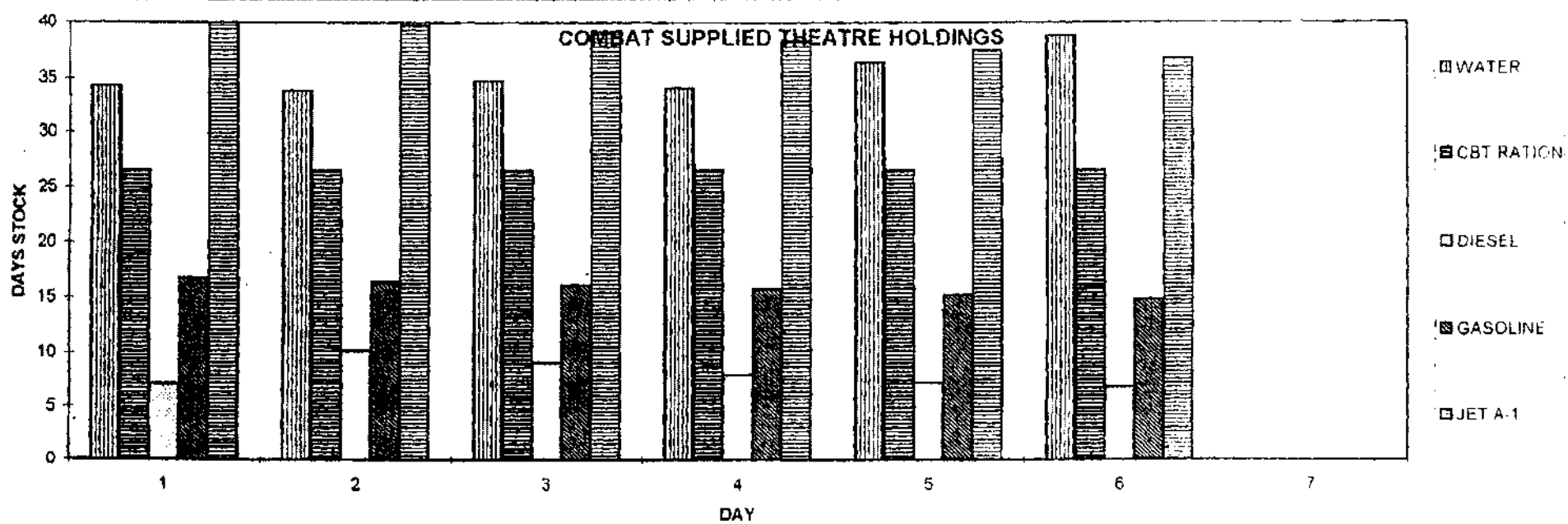

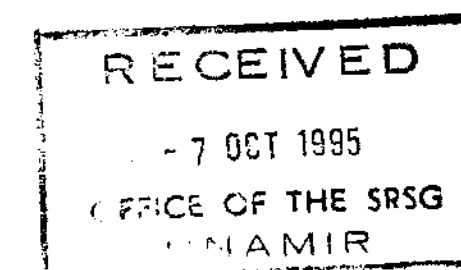
In conveying the above confirmation, I should like to explain that payment is being made on an exceptional basis, since the expenditures have already been incurred. However, I would like to take the opportunity to express two concerns that I have in respect to official hospitality: first, after processing the present claims the hospitality funds available for this mandate will be exhausted; secondly, in accordance with UN Administrative Instruction ST/AI/192/Rev.2 officials who are in receipt of representation allowance may be reimbursed from Hospitality Funds only in the following situation:

When a department or office extends hospitality to participants in an official meeting - normally by way of a reception - where the head of the department or office serves as host on behalf of the Organization, the expenses incurred may be reimbursed, provided that:

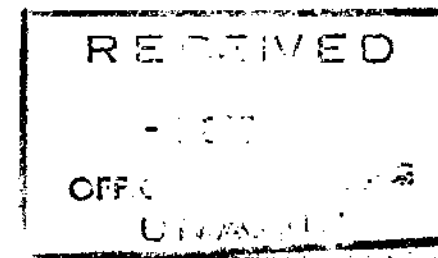
- (a) *The hospitality pertains to meetings which had been planned in advanced;*
- (b) *The estimated costs of the hospitality had been specifically requested, approved and allocated in the relevant budget procedure.*

While it is acknowledged that exceptional circumstances pertain at UNAMIR, I would nonetheless suggest that the foregoing should be borne in mind when planning future hospitality.

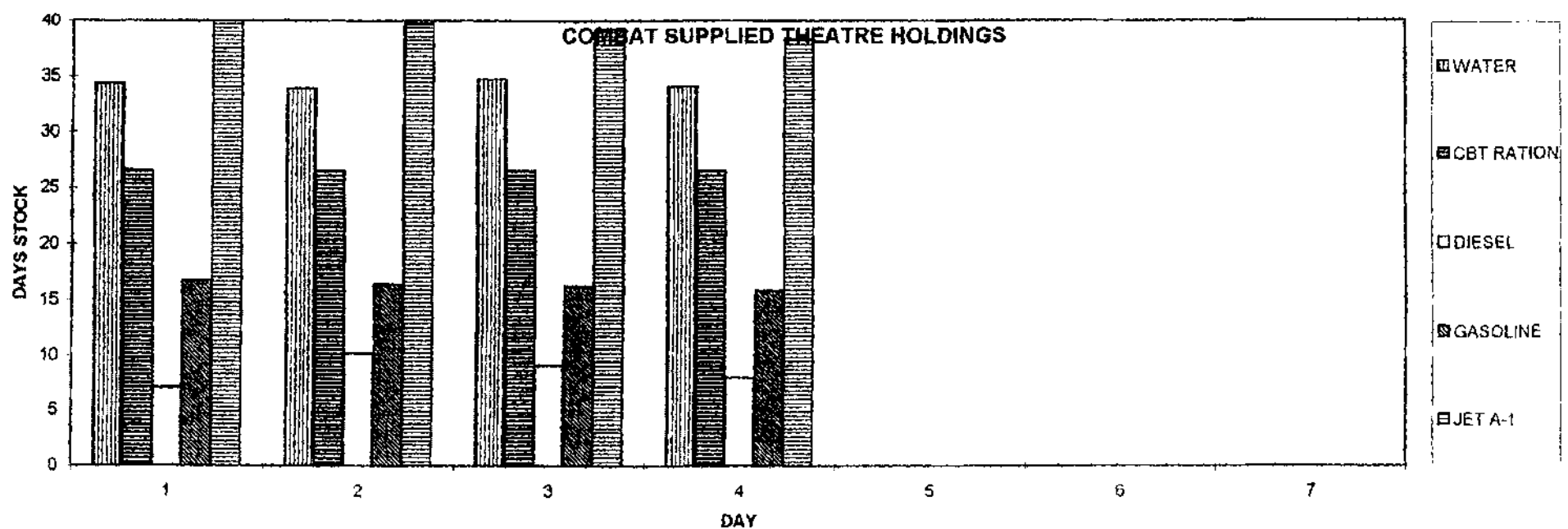

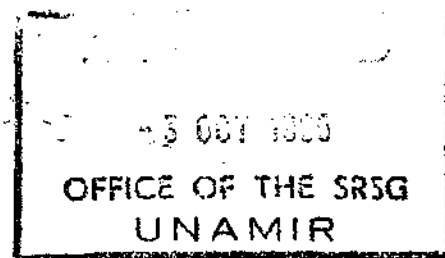

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING.

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 746 RETURNEES. 69 CAME FROM UGANDA AND 677 FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW: NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 865. OUTFLOW: NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR NORALOAS, DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF SIDA FOR EAST AND WEST AFRICA, TO DISCUSS CERTAIN ASPECTS OF RWANDAN JUDICIARY AND THE PROCESS OF REHABILITATION AS A WHOLE. SITUATION REGARDING THE PRISONS WAS ALSO DISCUSSED. LATER A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE IRISH REPUBLIC CALLED ON THE SRSG AND BRIEFED HIM ON THE PLANNED VISIT BY THE PRESIDENT OF IRELAND TO RWANDA EARLY NEXT WEEK.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT PRESIDENT MOBUTU OF ZAIRE, ON HOLIDAY IN PORTUGAL, PROMISED EX -PRESIDENT CARTER OF USA TO IDENTIFY AND HAND OVER TO THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL THE PERPETRATORS OF THE GENOCIDE IN RWANDA NOW IN ZAIRE.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/ GENDARMERIE SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - THE LOCAL RPA BATTALION CDR HAS INDICATED THAT LT-COL KAYONGA WILL LIKELY REMAIN IN GITARAMA EVEN THOUGH HIS SOLE RESPONSIBILITY IS NOW THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE WAR COUNCIL. HE HINTED THAT LT-COL KAYONGA WILL BE APPOINTED AS ASSISTANT TO COL NDEGEYINKA. THIS COULD BE A SERIOUS SETBACK IF THE OFFICER FROM THE FORMER REGIME BECOMES MORE OF A "FACADE" AT THE COMMAND OF THE BRIGADE. INFORMATION BEING VERIFIED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) THE RUTOBWE (7781) BOURGMESTRE CONTENTS THAT THE "TEMPERAST" RELIGIOUS SECT OPERATING IN THE PREFECTURE IS CLEARLY A DISGUISE FOR FRGF OPERATION. TO SUPPORT HIS POINT, HE RELATED A SUCCESSFUL ARREST CASE IN RUHENGERI WHERE A FORMER FRGF WAS IDENTIFIED IN A "PREACHING" GROUP.

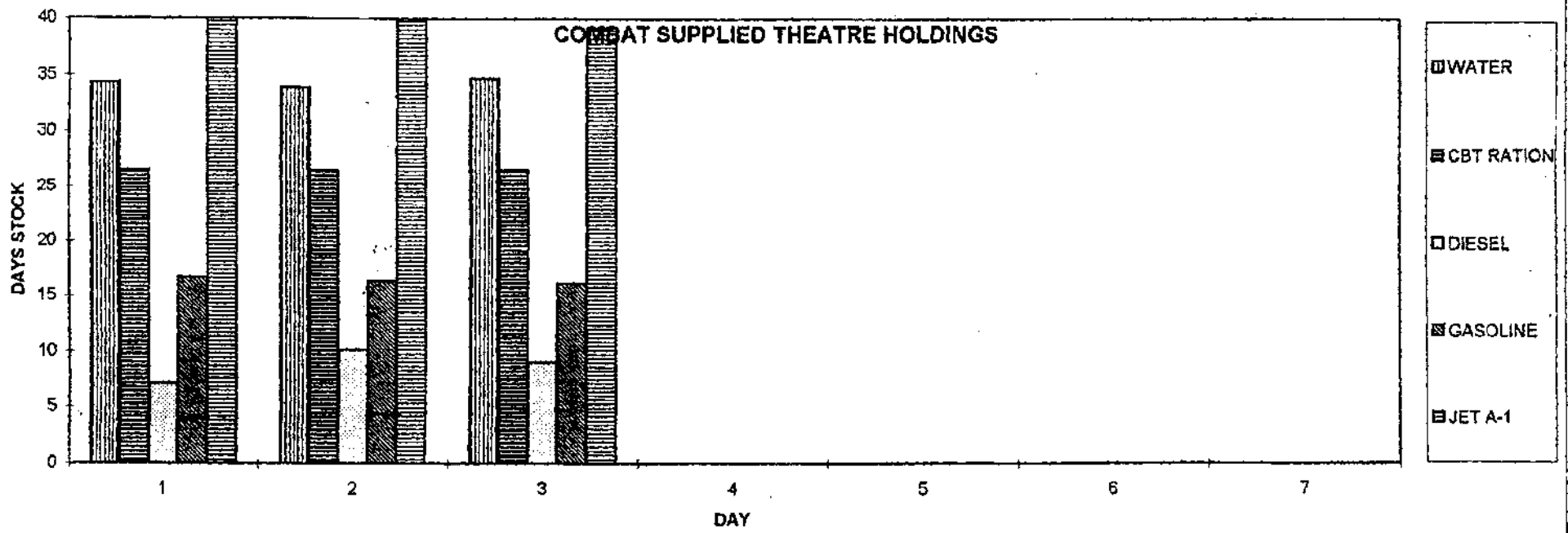

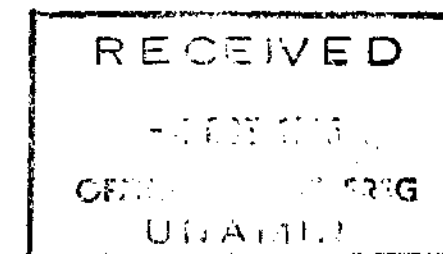

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINED TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. REBURIAL CEREMONY OF LATE MAJ GEN FRED RWIGEMA TOOK PLACE ON 01 OCT 95 IN KIGALI.

C. THE BOURGMESTRE OF KAYOVE GR 2792 WAS MURDERED ON 27 SEP 95.

D. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 4853, OUT OF WHICH 3373 CAME FROM ZAIRE, 1352 FROM BURUNDI AND 128 FROM UGANDA. TOTAL OUTFLOW 39.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ON SEP 95, THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING TO THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND THE USA ON THE MEETING HELD BY THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR THE GREAT LAKES REGION WITH THE RWANDAN PRESIDENT H.E. MR PASTEUR BIZIMUGU AND THE VICE- PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE MAJ GEN PAUL KAGAME, IN REGARD TO THE HOLDING OF THE CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT IN THE REGION.

B. THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION MR. CLAUDE DUSAIDI MET WITH THE SRSG ON SEP 26 TO DISCUSS THE FUTURE MANDATE, EQUIPMENT AND A REVISED SOMA. THE OPENING OF THE DETENTION CENTRE IN THE FIRST WEEK OF OCT AS WELL AS OTHER RELATED PROJECT WERE ALSO DISCUSSED.

C. THE SRSG ATTEND HEAD OF AGENCIES' MEETING AT THE UNDP OFFICE ON 27 SEP AND DISCUSSED A PAPER CONCERNING THE EXPECTED RETURN OF REFUGEES. LATER THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH UNHCR AND IOM ON THE TRANSPORT SITUATION AND POSSIBLE COOPERATION BETWEEN UNAMIR, UNHCR AND IOM IN THIS REGARD. IN THE AFTERNOON, MR WILLIAM CLARENCE, CHIEF OF HRFOR, CALLED ON THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED THE WORKING OF THE TRIAGE COMMISSION. AN AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL REPORT WAS ALSO DISCUSSED.

D. THE SRSG AND THE UNDP RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE HELD A MEETING ON 28 SEP WITH THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE TO DISCUSS THE MEANS TO RECONSTRUCT THE NATIONAL JUDICIAL PROCESS AND WAYS TO

COORDINATE WITH FOREIGN TECHNICAL EXPERTS DUE TO ARRIVE SHORTLY. THE MINISTER REVIEWED THE PLAN FOR THE NATIONAL JUDICIAL SYSTEM AND EXPLAINED THE REASON FOR POSTPONEMENT OF THE INTEGRATION OF EXPERTS. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE DEPUTY PROSECUTOR, JUDGE RAKOTOMANANA, AND DISCUSSED WITH HIM MODALITIES RELATED TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL IN ARUSHA AS WELL AS TO THE SETTING UP OF THE PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE.

E. ON SEP 29, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE AMBASSADORS OF GERMANY, FRANCE AND THE USA AND DISCUSSED THE SITUATIONS REGARDING THE PRISONS, THE JUDICIARY AND THE FUTURE MANDATE.

F. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE COORDINATION FOR HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS OF THE EUROPEAN UNION, MARIA SPAAK, MET WITH THE RWANDAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND ASSURED HIM THAT HER DEPARTMENT WOULD CONTINUE GIVING FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO UNHCR. IT ALSO QUOTED THAT THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA HAS MADE A GRANT OF ONE MILLION DOLLARS TO THE MINISTRY OF FAMILY WELFARE AND WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROMOTING WOMEN'S EDUCATION AND REVISION OF LAWS IN REGARD TO THE STATUS AND WELFARE OF WOMEN.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), ON 25 SEP 95, A CIVILIAN TRUCK APPARENTLY WENT OUT OF CONTROL NEAR A RPA CHECK POINT AND RAMMED INTO TWO STATIONARY VEHs WHICH IN TURN, RAN OVER TWO RPA SOLDIERS AND TWO CIVILIANS, KILLING ALL FOUR ON THE SPOT.

(2) IN SECTOR 4, THE BOURGEMESTRE OF NYAKABUYE COMMUNE GR 9116 INFORMED MILOBS OF TWO SEPARATE INCIDENTS IN NHUNGU SECTOR GR 8918 ON 15 SEP 95 AND ON 19 SEP 95 IN WHICH, TWO LOCALS WERE SHOT DEAD BY THE RPA WHILE THE DECEASED TRIED TO RUN AWAY WHEN CHALLENGED.

(3) IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI), THE REBURIAL CEREMONY OF THE LATE MAJ GEN FRED RWIGMA, EX RPA COMDR, TOOK PLACE ON 01 OCT 95 IN KIGALI. THE CEREMONY WAS ATTENDED BY THE PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA, BURUNDI AND UGANDA.

(4) IN SECTOR 3A, RPA INCREASED THEIR PRESENCE IN NISHILI COMMUNE GR 3996 DUE TO AN ENCOUNTER WITH ARMED PERSONS BELONGING TO A GUERRILLA ORG CALLED "FRODEBU FRONT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF BURUNDI" HEADED BY A MR NYANGOMA. THESE ELEMENTS ARE SAID TO HAVE COME FROM BUKINAMYANA COMMUNE IN BURUNDI AND HAD CROSSED INTO NISHILI COMMUNE FROM THE NYUNGWE FOREST, TO STEAL CATTLE.

(5) IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), MILOBS WERE INFORMED THAT THE RPA IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE LOCAL CIVIL AUTHORITIES,

CARRIED OUT A CORDON AND SEARCH OP IN KIGOMA SECTOR GR 5050 OF MUSANGE COMMUNE GR 5347 AS FRGF SOLDIERS WERE SUSPECTED TO HAVE ENTERED THE AREA. A NUMBER OF MINES FUSES, GRENS, UNIFORMS AND BOOTS WERE RECOVERED DURING THE OP.

(6) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), THE FOLLOWING NEW LOCAL RPA COMDRS WERE POSTED:

(A) BDE COMD 301 BDE, BUTARE - LT COL CEASER KAISER.

(B) BN COMD 89 BN, BUTARE - LT COL GADDAFI.

(C) BN COMD 1 BN, GIKONGORO - LT COL TURAGARA.

B. MILITIA/FRGF

(1) REF PARA 3B (1) OF OUR SITREP FOR 23 SEP 95. SECTOR 4 (MILOBS) CONFIRMED THE ALLEGED INFILTRATION OF FRGF TROOPS INTO BIREMBO SECTOR FROM GATARE COMMUNE. MILOBS FURTHER REPORTED THAT FOUR BOATS WERE FOUND AT THE SITE OF THE INCIDENT. A LOCAL SOURCE INFORMED THAT THE INFILTRATORS HAD COLLECTED APPROX 680,000 RWF AS VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS FROM THE LOCALS IN TWO PLACES. THE SAME SOURCE ALSO INFORMED OF ANOTHER INFILTRATION ON NIGHT 24/25 SEP 95. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(2) REF PARA 3B OF OUR SITREP FOR 24 SEP 95. THE EXPLOSION IN SECTOR 4 WAS DUE TO THE BLOWING UP OF AN ELECTRIC PYLON IN GIKUNGWE CELLULE IN CYETE SECTOR OF CYIMBOGO COMMUNE GR 771206 ON 24 SEP 95. THE PYLON HOWEVER, IS STILL FUNCTIONAL AND WILL BE REPLACED BY ELECTROGAZ AT THE EARLIEST.

(3) IN SECTOR 4, A REP OF CONCERN (NGO), REPORTED THAT ARMED MEN IN UNIFORM ROBBED TENTAGE ITEMS AND PLASTIC SHEETING FROM THE NYARUSHISHI REFUGEE CAMP ON 15 SEP 95 AND ON 23 SEP 95. IN THE SAME SECTOR, ICRC REPORTED THE THEFT OF 60 BLANKETS FROM THEIR WAREHOUSE ON NIGHT 17/18 SEP 95.

(4) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), AN RPA PATROL OF SIX SOLDIERS WAS FIRED UPON BY A GROUP OF INFILTRATORS IN KANYENTAMBI CELLULE GR 2219 OF KINYANZOVU SECTOR ON NIGHT 24/25 SEP 95. ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS KILLED ON THE SPOT. LOCAL VILLAGERS WHO WERE ASSISTING IN TAKING THE BODY OF THE SOLDIER TO THE RPA CAMP, WERE ALSO FIRED UPON BY THE INFILTRATORS BELIEVED TO BE INTERHAMWE. ONE LOCAL WAS KILLED AND TWO OTHERS INJURED.

(5) IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KAYOVE GR 2792 AND ANOTHER LOCAL WERE MURDERED ON 27 SEP 95 BY UNKNOWN PERSONS. THE DECEASED WERE AMBUSHED AND SHOT DEAD

AT GIHUMA GR 2493, WHEN THEY WERE RETURNING AFTER HAVING ATTENDED A MEETING AT VUMBI GR 2294.

(6) IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO), INFILTRATORS ATTACKED HOUSES IN KARABARE GR 7171 AND IN RUBUMBA GR 7471 ON THE NIGHT OF 25 SEP 95. ONE LOCAL WAS KILLED AND TWO OTHERS INJURED IN THE INCIDENT. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(7) IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), MILOBS WERE INFORMED OF AN INCIDENT ON 30 SEP 95 AT 0600 HRS, IN WHICH, THREE UNIDENTIFIED ARMED MEN OPENED FIRE AND THREW GRENS ON A CIVIL CAR CARRYING THREE CIVILIANS AND AN RPA SOLDIER. THE INCIDENT OCCURRED 6 KMS FROM KITABI ON THE GIKONGORO-CYANGUGU ROAD. TWO OF THE CIVILIANS WERE KILLED AND THE THIRD SERIOUSLY INJURED WHILE THE RPA SOLDIER ESCAPED UNHURT. THE ASSAILANTS HAD ESTABLISHED A ROAD BLOCK FURTHER DOWN THE ROAD.

(8) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGIERI), UNKNOWN NUMBER OF BANDITS SUSPECTED TO BE MEMBERS OF THE FRGF, STOLE CATTLE FROM GR 4736 ON NIGHT 29/30 SEP 95. RPA IN THE AREA, PURSUED THE BANDITS AND THERE WAS A HEAVY EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN THE TWO SIDES. IT IS NOT KNOWN IF ANY OF THE CATTLE WERE RECOVERED OR IF ANY CAS OCCURRED IN THE FIREFIGHT. BANDITS HAD REPORTEDLY STOLEN CATTLE FROM THE SAME AREA ON 26 SEP 95. RPA HAS INCREASED PRESENCE IN THE AREA.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

A. ALL UNITS/SECTORS CONTINUED PROVIDING HUMANITARIAN AND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

B. A TOTAL OF 730 RETURNEES ARE AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 995 MEDICAL AND 61 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF DURING THE WEEK.

D. FORCE ENGR COY COMMENCED LEVELLING WORK AT THE NEW TRANSMITTER SITE ON MT KARONGI. ENGR COY ALSO COMPLETED ELECTRIFICATION WORK OF LIVING AREA OF GHANCOY II AT MAGERWA POST.

E. ENGR COY CARRIED OUT RECCE FOR DOZER WORK FOR ASSISTING THE DIGGING OF A CANAL IN GIKONGORO.

F. 95 CMSG AND NORMED PERS VISITED AN ORPHANAGE IN GITARAMA AND TREATED 300 ORPHANS FOR SCABIES. A LARGE QUANTITY OF BLANKETS AND CUTLERY SETS WERE DONATED TO THE ORPHANAGE.

G. 95 CMSG VISITED REFUGEE TRUST ORPHANAGE IN MURAMBI AND DELIVERED 40 MATTRESSES AND COTS, AND A WHEELBARROW. THEY

RETRIEVED A HAND PUMP TO REPAIR. THEY ALSO VISITED AN ORPHANAGE IN GIKONI TO REPAIR A WATER PUMP.

H. NICOY PRESENTED 50 MATTRESSES TO MSF FOR THEIR ORPHANAGES ON BEHALF OF NIGERIA AND UNAMIR.

I. NICOY DONATED 50 MATTRESSES TO THE PREFECT OF GISENYI AS ASSISTANCE TO REFUGEES ON BEHALF OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF NIGERIA AND UNAMIR.

J. A TOTAL OF TWENTY NINE VEHICLES WERE DESPATCHED TO TRANSPORT FOOD ITEMS, SEEDS, MEDICINES AND CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS IN VARIOUS PLACES IN THE AOR.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), MILOBS WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS OF MUNGUNDA SECTOR GR 4368 IN BWAKIRA COMMUNE, THAT THE COUNCILLOR OF THE SECTOR WAS ARRESTED BY THE RPA ON CHARGES OF HAVING ALLEGEDLY PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE. HE IS PRESENTLY HELD IN BIRAMBO PRISON. IT IS ALLEGED THAT THE COUNCILLOR'S OWN RELATIVES TURNED HIM IN SO AS TO AVOID SHARING OF LAND WITH THE DETAINEE.

B. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO), THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO HELD A MEETING WITH OFFICIALS AND BOURGEMESTRES OF THE VARIOUS PREFECTURES, TO DECIDE ON A PLAN TO RESETTLE REFUGEES IN THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

C. ON 27 SEP 95, 48 PERSONS INCLUDING THREE WOMEN AND FIVE CHILDREN WERE ESCORTED BY SOLDIERS OF THE TANZANIAN ARMY TO BUKOBA BORDER POST IN SECTOR 2B, AND WERE HANDED OVER TO THE RPA. TWO OF THE REFUGEES ARE CONFIRMED TO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE.

D. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO), ON 27 SEP 95, THREE OFFERS AND TEN SOLDIERS OF THE TANZANIAN ARMY, ESCORTED 28 MEN, THREE WOMEN AND FIVE CHILDREN TO THE RPA POST AT RUSOMO STATING THAT THEY HAD COMMITTED CRIMES IN TANZANIA. UNCONFIRMED SOURCES HOWEVER STATED THAT THE REFUGEES HAD CONTACT WITH OR ARE MEMBERS OF THE FRGF. THE REFUGEES HAVE BEEN DETAINED AT THE RUSOMO POST FOR INTERROGATION.

E. IN RUTETE OF SECTOR 1A (KIGALI), TWO RETURNEES WHO ARE SUSPECTED TO BE CRIMINALS WERE ESCORTED INTO RWANDA BY BURUNDI SOLDIERS, AND HANDED OVER TO THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KANZENZE COMMUNE BY UNHCR.

F. IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) THE POPULATION IN THE COMMUNES IS RAPIDLY GROWING AT THE RATE OF APPROX 100 PER WEEK.

8. CASUALTIES

A. CIVPOL OBSERVER CAPT FADIALA SEKOU TOURE FROM MALI DIED IN RUHENGARI ON 27 SEP 95. THE BODY OF THE DECEASED WAS SENT TO MALI ON 29 SEP 95 AFTER A CEREMONY ATTENDED BY THE SRSG, FC, DFC AND OTHER SENIOR MILITARY OFFICERS.

B. TWO MILOBS FROM SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO) WERE INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT ON 29 SEP 95 WHILE ON THEIR WAY TO KIGALI FROM GITARAMA. MAJ NTIM DARKWAH (GHANA) DIED ON THE SPOT WHILE CAPT KOYENTA ALFRED VICTOR (MALAWI) WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED AND WAS ADMITTED TO NORMED HOSPITAL WHERE HE IS RESPONDING TO MEDICAL TREATMENT. THE BODY OF MAJ DARKWA WAS SENT TO GHANA ON 02 OCT 95.

9. COMMENTS

A. THE SITUATION IN UNAMIR AOR REMAINS CALM EXCEPT FOR SECTORS 4 AND 5 WHERE IT IS TENSE DUE TO THE RECENT INCIDENTS FROM WITHIN AND OUTSIDE THE COUNTRY. THIS IS HAVING ITS IMPACT ON THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES FROM ZAIRE.

B. THE ASSASSINATION OF THE BOURGMESTRE OF KAYOVE WAS PROBABLY UNDERTAKEN BY INSURGENTS OF THE FRGF, POSSIBLY IN RETALIATION FOR THE KANAMA INCIDENT.

C. THE POLITICAL SCENE HAS ALSO BEEN ACTIVE WITH THE SRSG MEETING WITH MANY HEADS OF COMMISSIONS AND ORGANIZATIONS THAT VISITED OR ARE WORKING IN RWANDA AND VARIOUS DISCUSSIONS TOOK PLACE AND SOME DECISIONS MADE.



A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 125. 124 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 01 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW: 22.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 16,472. OUTFLOW 39.

THE LOCAL RPA BDE COMDR VISITED THE INCIDENT SITE TO INVESTIGATE THE AMBUSH.

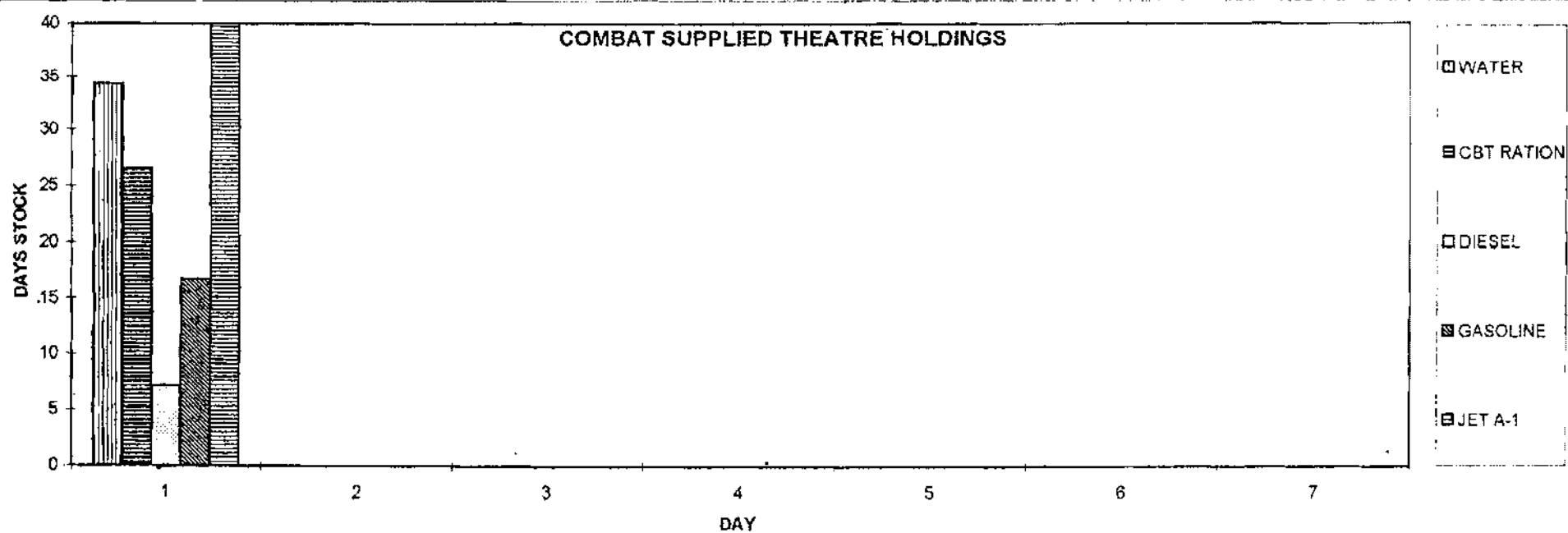

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 543. 517 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 26 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW: NIL

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 16,347. OUTFLOW 17.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE AMBASSADORS OF GERMANY, FRANCE AND USA AND DISCUSSED THE SITUATION REGARDING PRISONS, THE JUDICIARY AND THE FUTURE MANDATE. THE MEETING PROVIDED AN OPPORTUNITY FOR CANDID EXCHANGE OF VIEWS, INCLUDING A COMPREHENSIVE BRIEFING BY THE SRSG ON UNAMIR'S CURRENT ACTIVITIES.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA HAS MADE A GRANT OF ONE MILLION DOLLARS TO THE MINISTRY OF FAMILY WELFARE AND WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROMOTING WOMEN'S EDUCATION AND REVISION OF LAWS WITH REGARD TO THE STATUS AND WELFARE OF WOMEN.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/ GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) - REBURIAL CEREMONY OF LATE MAJ GEN FRED RWIGEMA, EX RPA COMD WILL TAKE PLACE ON SUN 01 OCT 95 IN KIGALI. FLAGS THROUGHOUT RWANDA HAVE BEEN FLYING AT HALF MAST WEF 28 SEP 95. A JOINT RPA AND BURUNDI TPS PROVIDED PROTECTION TO THE BURUNDI CHIEF OF ARMY STAFF WHO CROSSED INTO RWANDA THROUGH BUTARE SECTOR UNDER HEAVY ESCORT TO ATTEND THE CEREMONY.

(2) IN SECTOR 3A MILOBS REPORTED AN INCREASED PRESENCE OF RPA IN NSHILI COMMUNE (GR 3996) DUE TO THEIR ENCOUNTER WITH ARMED PERS FROM THE GUERILLA ORGANISATION CALLED "FRODEBU" FRONT FOR DEVELOPMENT OF BURUNDI AND HEADED BY MR. NYANGOMA. THESE ELEMENTS ARE SAID TO COME FROM BUKINAMYANA COMMUNE IN BURUNDI AND CROSSED INTO NSHILI COMMUNE VIA NYUNGWE FOREST TO STEAL CATTLE.

B. FRGE/MILITIA/BANDITRY. IN SECTOR 2B KIBUNGO A CASE OF ASSAULT BY A GROUP OF INFILTRATORS FROM ACROSS THE BORDER HAS COME TO LIGHT. THE ATTACK TOOK PLACE ON NIGHT 25/26 SEP 95 IN A HOUSE EACH IN KARABARE 2 GR 7171 AND RUBUMBA GR 7471. THREE PEOPLE WERE INJURED OUT OF WHICH ONE DIED IN RWINKWAWU HOSPITAL. INVESTIGATIONS ARE STILL GOING ON. HAC INFORMED.

COMBAT SUPPLIES USAGE AND STOCK CHARTS

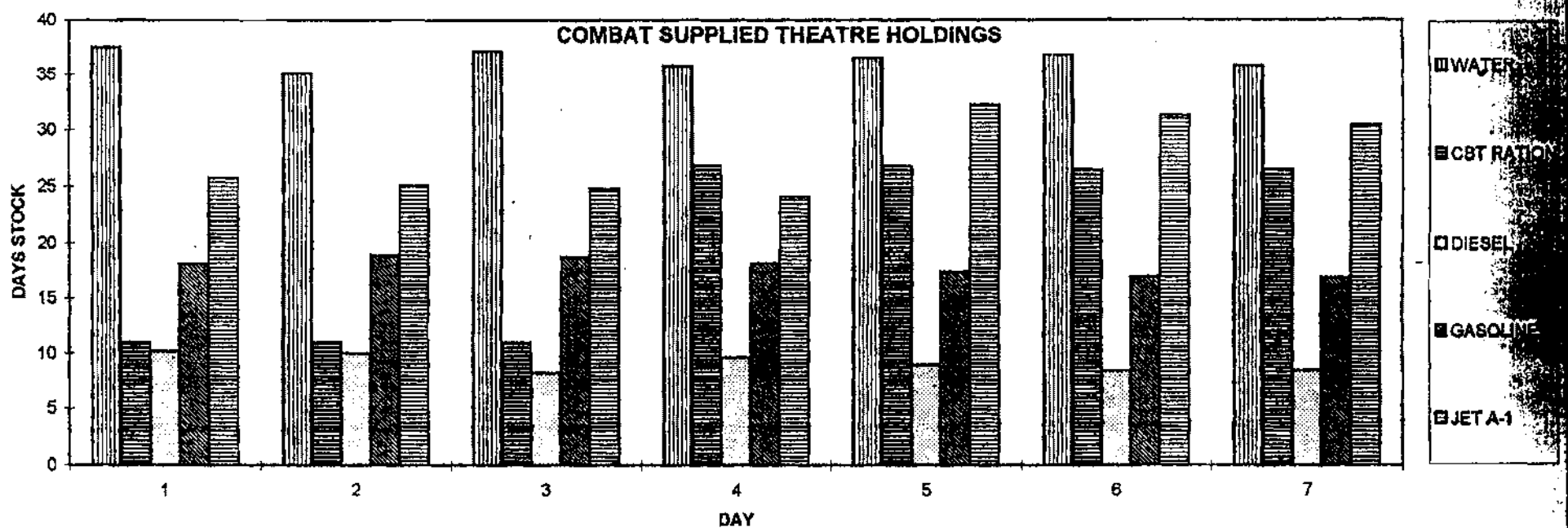

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 1315. 125 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE 09 FROM UGANDA AND 1181 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW NIL

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 15,804. OUTFLOW 17.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG AND THE UNDP RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE ON 28 SEP 95 ATTENDED A MEETING WITH THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE TO DISCUSS THE MEANS TO RECONSTRUCT THE NATIONAL JUDICIAL PROCESS AND WAYS TO COORDINATE WITH FOREIGN TECHNICAL EXPERTS DUE TO ARRIVE SHORTLY. 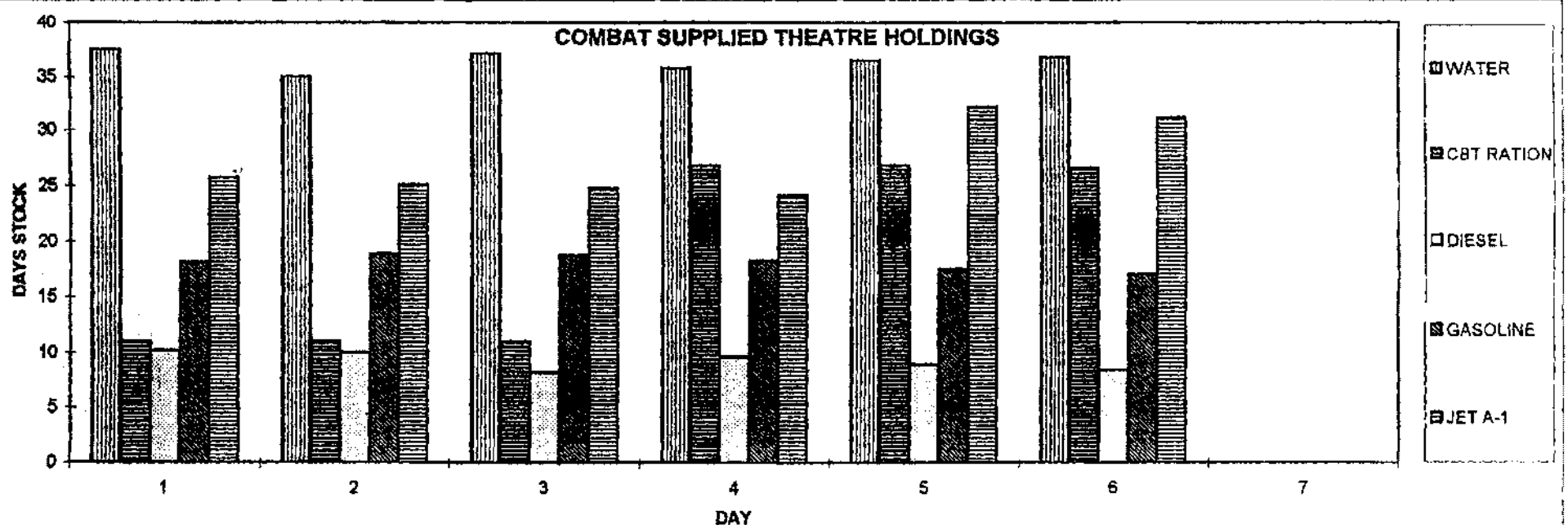

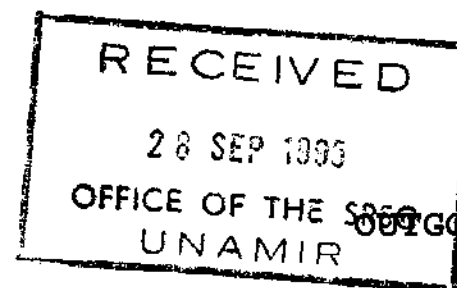

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED A HEAD OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP OFFICE AND DISCUSSED A PAPER CONCERNING THE EXPECTED RETURN OF REFUGEES. THE VISIT OF THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR THE GREAT LAKES REGION, MR JOSE' LUIS JESUS WAS ALSO DISCUSSED AT THE MEETING.

B. LATER, THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH UNHCR AND IOM ON THE TRANSPORT SITUATION AND POSSIBLE COOPERATION BETWEEN UNAMIR, UNHCR AND IOM IN THIS REGARD.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/ GENDARMERIE THE TEAM REPORTED GENERAL FEELINGS OF INSECURITY AMONG LOCAL POPULATION IN ALMOST ALL THE COMMUNES OF THE PREFECTURE. THEY ARE ALLEGED TO HAVE COMMITTED CRIMES IN TANZANIA HOWEVER UNCONFIRMED SOURCES STATED THAT THESE PEOPLE HAVE CONTACTS OR ARE MEMBERS OF THE FRGF. THE PEOPLE WERE KEPT AT THE RUSUMO BORDER FOR INTERROGATION

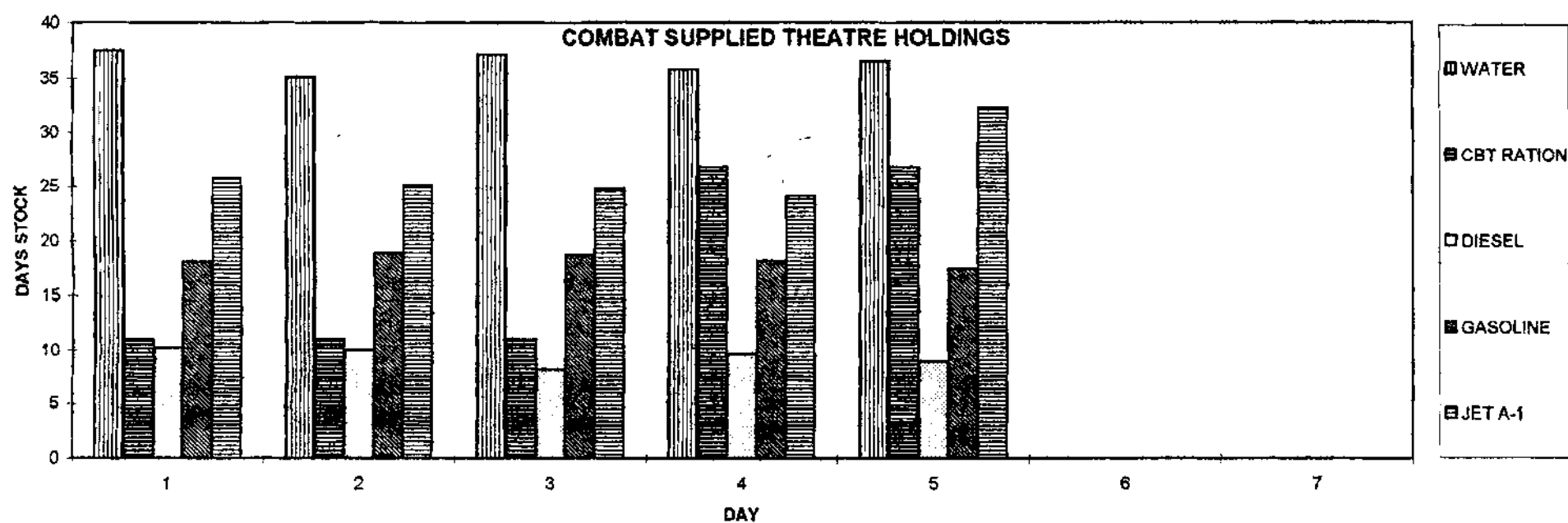

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 91. 63 RETURNEES CAME FROM ZAIRE, 18 FROM UGANDA AND 10 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW: NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 13,506. OUTFLOW 17.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH THE SPECIAL COMMISSION CHARGED WITH DISCUSSING THE MANDATE UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF MR. CLAUDE DUSAIDI. THE MEETING WAS HELD IN A CORDIAL ATMOSPHERE AND DELIBERATIONS COVERED THE FUTURE MANDATE, EQUIPMENT AND A REVISED SOMA. IT WAS ALSO AGREED THAT FURTHER MEETINGS WOULD BE HELD ON A WEEKLY BASIS TO DISCUSS THE AFOREMENTIONED AGENDA.

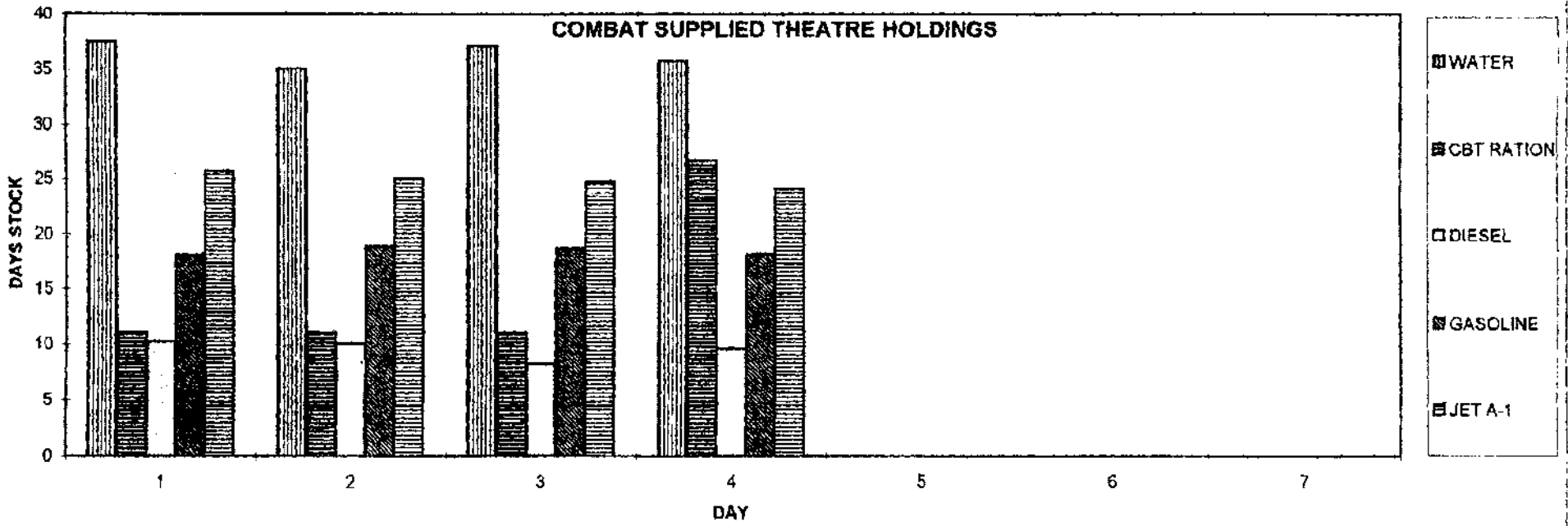

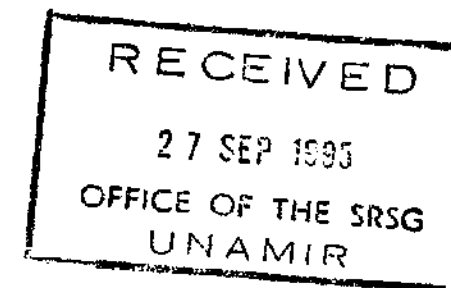

SITREP FOR 25 SEP 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINS TENSE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES FROM ZAIRE CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

1. TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY WAS 1675 OUT OF WHICH, 1671 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 04 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW NIL.

2. TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 13,415. OUTFLOW 17.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING ON 25 SEP 95 ON THE PRISON SITUATION IN RWANDA, WITH THE SPECIAL ADVISER ON PRISONS, MR RANDOLPH KENT. HE ALSO GAVE A BRIEFING TO THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND THE USA, ON THE RECENT MEETINGS HELD BY THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR THE GREAT LAKES REGION, WITH THE RWANDAN PRESIDENT H.E. MR PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU AND THE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, IN REGARD TO THE HOLDING OF THE CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, STABILITY AND DEVELOPMENT IN THE REGION.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

I. SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) MILOBS REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 0630 HRS ON 25 SEP 95, A CIVILIAN TRUCK WENT OUT OF CONTROL AT AN RPA CHECK POINT AND HIT TWO STATIONARY VEHICLES WHICH IN TURN, RAN OVER TWO RPA SOLDIERS AND TWO CIVILIANS, KILLING THEM ON THE SPOT.

II. IN SECTOR 4, THE BOURGMESTRE OF NYAKABUYE COMMUNE (GR 9116), INFO MILOBS THAT A LOCAL WHO WAS CHALLENGED BY AN RPA PATROL IN NHUNGU SECTEUR (GR 8918) AT ABOUT 0200 HRS ON 19 SEP 95, WAS SHOT AND KILLED WHEN HE TRIED TO RUN AWAY. IN THE SAME SECTOR, ON 15 SEP 95, AN RPA PATROL SHOT AND KILLED A LOCAL AT ABOUT 2000 HRS, AS HE TRIED TO RUN AWAY WHEN CHALLENGED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) REF PARA 3B (1) OF OUR SITREP FOR 23 SEP 95. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) MILOBS CONFIRMED THE ALLEGED INFILTRATION OF FRGF TROOPS INTO BIREMBO SECTEUR FROM THE GATARE COMMUNE OFFICE. MILOBS WERE FURTHER INFO THAT FOUR BOATS WERE RECOVERED FROM THE SITE ON 23 SEP 95. THE SOURCE SAID THAT THE INFILTRATORS COLLECTED A TOTAL OF RF 680,000

FROM LOCALS AT TWO PLACES IN THE SECTEUR AND ADDED THAT THERE WAS ANOTHER INCIDENT OF INFILTRATION ON NIGHT OF 24/25 SEP 95. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(2) REF PARA 3B OF OUR SITREP FOR 24 SEP 95. THE EXPLOSION IN SECTOR 4, WAS DUE TO THE BLOWING UP OF AN ELECTRIC PYLON IN GIKUNGWE CELLULE IN CYETE SECTOR OF CYIMBOGO COMMUNE GR 771206 ON 24 SEP 95 AT 0230 HRS BY UNIDENTIFIED PERSONS. THE PYLON IS STILL FUNCTIONAL. REPS OF ELECTROGAZ CONFIRMED THAT THE PYLON WOULD BE REPLACED AT THE EARLIEST.

(3) IN SECTOR 4, A REP OF CONCERN(NGO), REPORTED THAT A GROUP OF ARMED MEN IN UNIFORM ROBBED TENTAGE AND PLASTIC SHEETING FROM NYARUSHISHI REFUGEE CAMP GR 845238 ON 15 SEP 95 AND 23 SEP 95. IN THE SAME SECTOR, ICRC REPORTED THAT 60 BLANKETS WERE STOLEN FROM THEIR WAREHOUSE ON NIGHT 17/18 SEP 95.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED. NSTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. IN SECTOR 1A (KIGALI), MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE BOURGMESTRE OF BICUMBI COMMUNE REQUESTED FOR SOME FOOTBALLS AND BATTERIES FOR MEGAPHONES. HE ALSO COMPLAINED THAT ALTHOUGH PATROLS ALWAYS ASK AS REGARDS HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE IN THE COMMUNE, NOTHING IS DONE ABOUT THE REQUESTS.

B. IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA), THE AUTHORITIES OF NGARAMA CHILDREN'S HOME, REPEATED AN EARLIER REQUEST TO MILOBS FOR ASSISTANCE FOR TRANSPORT ASSISTANCE TO LIFT SUGAR AND RICE FOR THE ORPHANS FROM SOS STOREROOM IN KIGALI. THERE ARE A TOTAL OF 168 ORPHANS AT THE CENTRE. HAC INFORMED.

C. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO), IN KIRWA (GR 5270) PRIMARY SCHOOL, MANY PARENTS HAVE REPORTEDLY BEEN FORCED TO WITHDRAW THEIR WARDS FROM THE SCHOOL DUE TO THEIR INABILITY TO PAY SCHOOL FEES. A TOTAL OF 100 PUPILS HAVE BEEN WITHDRAWN IN THE LAST 3 MONTHS.

D. ON 23 SEP 95, A 10 YEAR OLD SCHOOLBOY OF RWAHI SECTEUR (GR 7930) IN KAMEMBE COMMUNE WAS KILLED WHILST TRYING TO OPEN A GRENADE HE HAD FOUND. LOCALS IN KAMEMBE COMMUNE HAVE REQUESTED SECTOR 4 (CYANGUCU) MILOBS FOR A TEAM FROM UNAMIR TO EDUCATE SCHOOL CHILDREN ABOUT GRENADES AND MINES. ENGRS INFORMED.

E. 623 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI, NAGUMIRA AND BUTARE. 754 IDPs WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, NGENDA AND KIGALI. A TOTAL OF 1126 IDPs STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

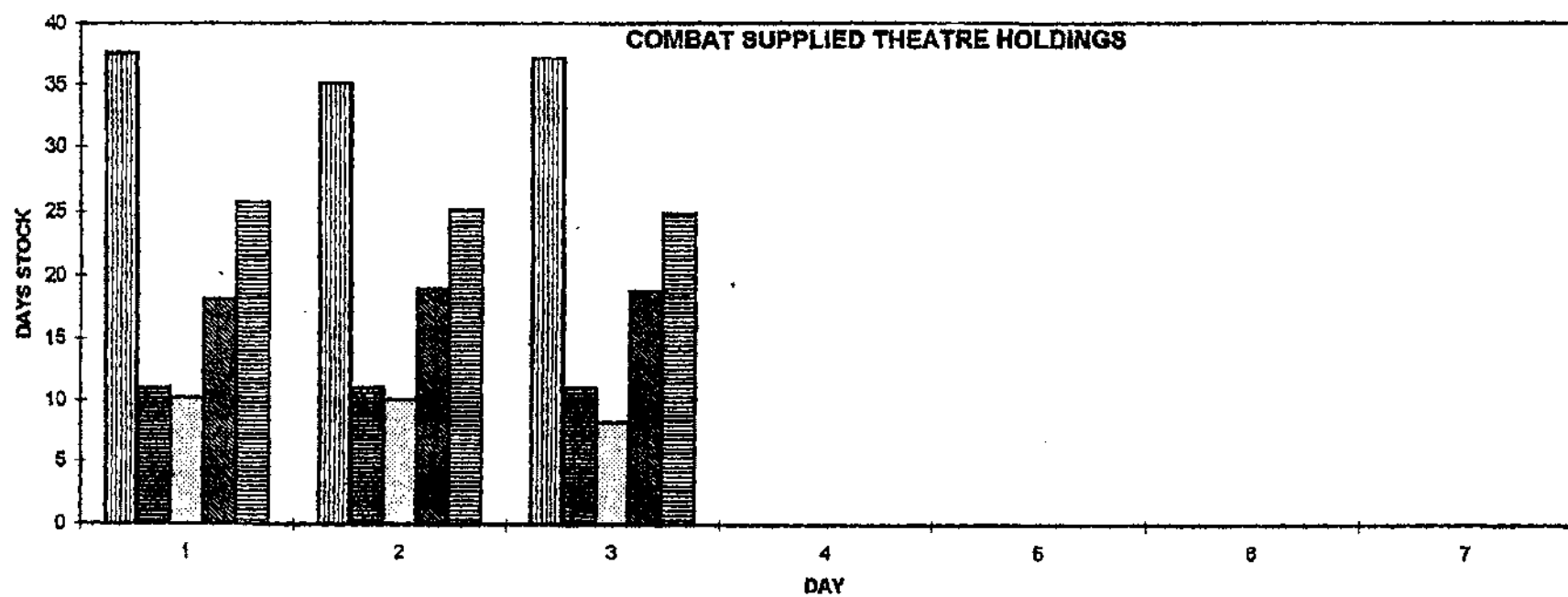

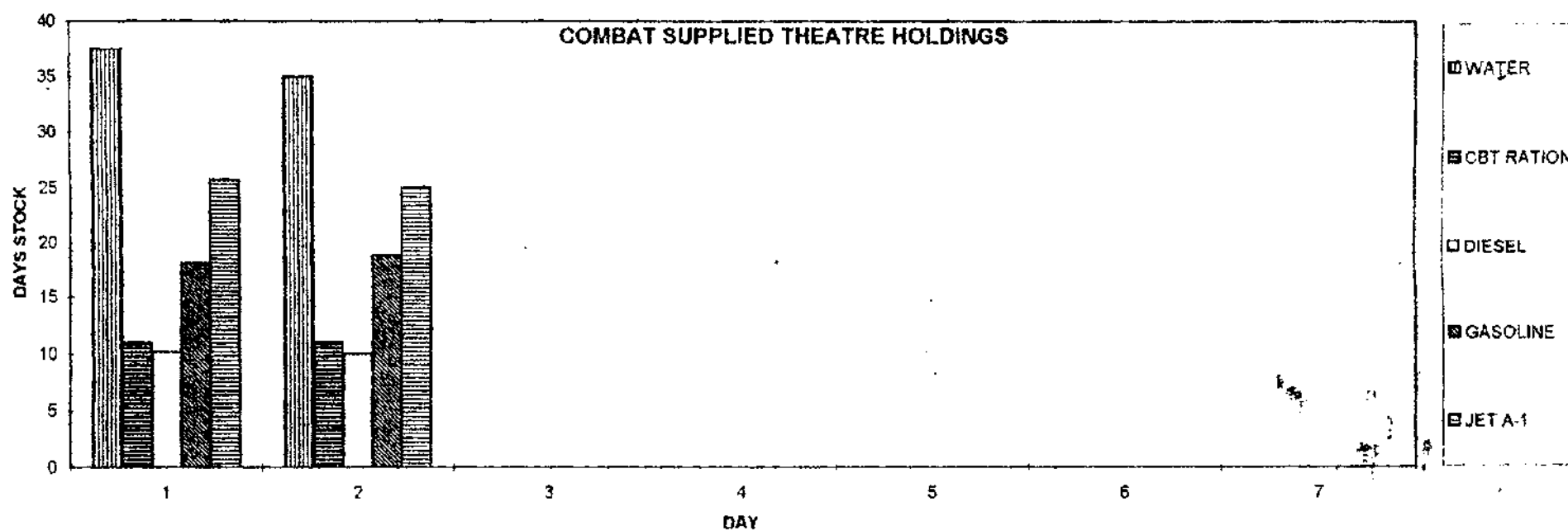
