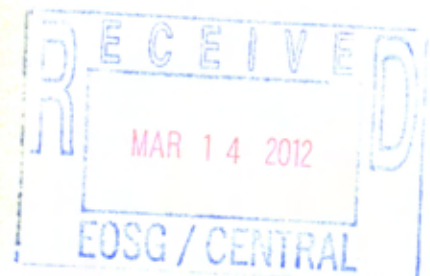

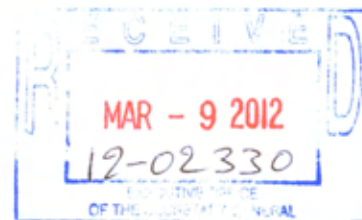

NOTE TO MR. NAMBIAR

**Holocaust Remembrance: 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Adolf Eichmann trial**

*#11-09685* Further to the activities that my Department organised for the International Day of Commemoration in memory of the victims of the Holocaust in January 2012, I am pleased to inform you that we will now partner with the Government of Israel to observe the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the trial of the Nazi criminal Adolf Eichmann. The trial is considered to be a milestone in Holocaust history and is of deep significance to Israel, which captured and successfully prosecuted the individual who was largely responsible for the deportation and mass murder of Jews during the Holocaust.

One of the planned activities on the occasion of the anniversary is a round-table discussion entitled, "The Trial of Adolf Eichmann: 50 Years Later." It will include a panel of experts to discuss the trial's impact from social, psychological and legal vantage points and the implications it has had for justice and accountability in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Speakers include: Minister Yossi Peled, Holocaust survivor; Elie Wiesel, who covered the trial as a journalist; Mark Ellis, Executive Director of the International Bar Association; Amos Hausner, son of the Chief Prosecutor; and Deborah E. Lipstadt, Professor at Emory University and author of *The Eichmann Trial*. The event will be held in ECOSOC at 6:30 p.m. on 23 April 2012.

We would be honoured by the presence of the Secretary-General to deliver opening remarks at the round table. The event will reach a large audience - some 300 guests are expected from among delegations, the NGO community and the general public - and it will be webcast live.

I should also like to inform you that a second event will be the opening of "With Me Here Are Six Million Accusers: An Exhibition Commemorating the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Eichmann Trial," mounted by Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Martyrs' and Heroes' Remembrance Authority in Israel. Speakers include Minister Yossi Peled; Tami Reveh, daughter of the Chief Prosecutor; and Micky Goldman, a member of Police Unit 6 which conducted historical research to support the prosecution. The exhibition will open in the UN Visitors' Lobby at 6:15 p.m. on 19 April 2012.
