SUBJECT: MODIFICATION NO. 1 TO OPERATION ORDER NO. 16

Reference:

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- A. Operation Order No. 16 dated 25 July 94.
- 1. The following amendments have been made to OPO 16.
 - a. **EXECUTION**. Para 6b must now read "UNAMIR Forces engaged in the Relief in Place Operations will work under Chapter VI during all Phases".
 - b. Para 6c must now read "Four Infantry battalions (three mechanized and one motorized)"
 - c. Para 7b. Phase II must now read as follow:
 - (1) Relief in Place Operation. Relief in Place operation with a view to replace FCF in Sector 4 by UNAMIR troops. In that, GHANBATT (Bn+) will deploy in Sector 4A, One Mechanized Inf Battalion (Bn (+)) in Sector 4B, One Motorized Inf Battalion (Bn(+)) in Sector 4C.
 - (2) At the same time, deployment of one motorized battalion in Sector 5, one Engineer Company in Sector 1 and two Independent Infantry Companies in Sectors 2 and 3 will continue, accompanied by the deployment of supporting elements, UNMOs and UNCIVPOL.
 - d. Para 8a. Delete second sentence. Para will now read: "Grouping. Full strength of 800 personnel and 50 APCs.
 - e. Para 9a. Delete the second sentence. Para will now read as follows:

BRITCON COMMUNICATIONS

Reference:

A. Communications Electronic Instruction 001 dated 15 Jug 94.

INTRODUCTION

1. Further to Ref A, radio and telephone communications within both UNAMIR and BRITCON have developed. This loose minute outlines the latest developments and aims to inform sub units of the various means of communications available to them.

ORADIO NETS

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- 2. All radio nets listed below, less the Humanitarian net and RATT link, are remoted to the Watchkeeper. Net callsigns are given in Annexes A-D and also displayed on the Watchkeepers desk.
- 3. UN HF Force Guard.
 - a. This net is provided by the Force Signal Squadron and covers the UN Force HQ, contingent HQs and UN assets deployed away from HQ UNAMIR. It will be replaced by a secure VHF Comd net once RRBs are deployed.
 - b. This net is the primary means of communications to the UN Force elements and between contingent sub units via their HQs. Net callsigns are at Annex A. The following BRITCON elements have authorised callsigns on this net:
 - (1) COMBRITCON
 - (2) BRITCON HQ
 - (3) 23 PFA
- 4. UN Motorola Force Comd.
 - a. This net is provided by the Force Signal Squadron on Motorola channel 7 and covers UN Force Staff Officers and contingent HQs.
 - b. The following BRITCON elements have authorised callsigns on this net:
 - (1) COMBRITCON
 - (2) BRITCON HQ

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c. To tighten control on this net authorised callsigns will be issued with reprogrammed sets wef 22 Aug 94. Net callsigns are as for the UN HF Force Guard net.

5. <u>UN Motorola Log</u>.

- a. This net is provided by the Force Signal Squadron on Motorola channel 9. Net callsigns are at Annex B. The following BRITCON elements have authorised callsigns on this net:
 - (1) OPS BRITCEN
 - (2) MAINT BRICON
 - (3) TPT BRITCON
- b. The FSO will collect and distribute the sets for the above callsigns.
- 6. <u>Humanitarian Motorola Net</u>.
- a. This net is on Motorola channel 9 with control based at UNDP. There is no structure to this net and callsign lists are not available.
 - b. The following are on this net:
 - (1) Humanitarian HQ MPO
 - (2) Chief Humanitarian Offr MP9
 - (3) Major McNeil

MP1

- c. Any set can access this net and callsigns from the UN Comd net can be used.
- 7. BRITCON HF RATT. Secure RATT links are provided to 23 PFA and 9 Sqn RE, Byumba. Messages are transmitted and received via the COMMCEN in the usual signal message format.
- 8. BRITCON HF Comd.
 - a. This is an insecure HF voice net using the same frequency as the RATT net. One callsign matrix encompasses all BRITCON sub units as given at Annex C. All callsigns are issued by Y Of S BRITCON SIG TP and only authorised callsigns are to be used.
 - b. Callsigns deploying away from BRITCON HQ should report in and out to the Watchkeeper and ensure they receive a net update brief from OC/Y Of S BRITCON SIG TP prior to deployment.
- 9. <u>Diplomatic Net</u>. It is proposed that BRITCON HQ will be on this net. Equipment and callsign to be issued by the Diplomatic Signals Officer.

TELEPHONES

- 10. $\underline{\text{Euromux}}$. Euromux provides exchange facilities within BRITCON HQ and access to Whitehall exchange via mentor. A directory is at Annex D.
- 11. $\underline{\text{Matel}}$. A BRITCON HQ internal network is provided as at Annex D. This includes the guardroom and BRITCON staff working in the HQ UNAMIR.
- 12. <u>Canadian/UN Network</u>. Extensions and directories for this network are located in the Ops Room and COMBRITCONs office. This network covers the Canadian contingent, including the stadium main gate and Military Police, in addition to selected offices in the HO UNAMIR. A consolidated directory is at Annex E.
- 13. <u>UN Inmarsat</u>. Inmarsat comms are deployed to various UN locations. These can be accessed via Whitehall exchange on the mentor. A directory is given in the Canadian telephone directory as at para 12.

CONCLUSION

14. The communication networks are frequently changing and where consible affected departments will be informed. The Watchkeeper is updated of all net changes.



Subject: SECURITY MEASURES IN CONNECTION WITH THE INSTALLATION OF BROAD BASED TRANSITIONAL GOVERNMENT (BBTG)

Ref:

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- A. Our letter No 3000/1/ops dated 26 Dec 93.
- 3. Our letter No 3000/1/ops dated 08 Jan 94.
- 1. <u>General</u>. It is expected that the installation of BBTG at CND Building may take place on 14 Feb 94 in the midst of internal conflicts among the political parties/factions. There is an apprehension of law and order situation/violence and as such it calls for adequate security measures and administrative arrangements.
- 2. Aim. The aim of this instruction is to lay the guidelines on security for the day of the ceremony.
- 3. <u>Responsibility</u>. Kigali Sector will be overall responsible to ensure security measures in addition to the existing security arrangement vide ref A.
- 4. <u>Security Arrangement</u>. The security arrangement will be ensured based on the following guidelines:
 - a. <u>Invitation</u>
 - (1) <u>Invitees</u>. The invitees will include ministers, diplomats, members of the parliament, senior civil/military personnel, leaders of political parties and elite from both govt and RPF. It will also include the following VVIPs:
 - (a) President.
 - (b) Prime Minister.
 - (c) Prime Minister Designate.
 - (d) Speaker of the Parliament.
 - (e) Chairman of the RPF.
 - (f) Chairman of RPA.
 - (g) SRSG.

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- (2) <u>Invitation Card</u>. Will be issued by both Govt and RPF as per list forwarded to this HQ. The cards will bear UNAMIR, Govt Protocol Stamp on it and the signature of the undersigned. COO will coordinate. One invitation card permits only the guest (with or without spouse) and the driver to enter.
- (3) <u>Distribution of Cards</u>. Distribution of cards to the Ministers and Deputies by protocol representative will be supervised by MIO.

b. Gate of Entry(Sketch at Annex 'A')

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- (1) Western Gate. For Govt invitees only:
 - (a) $\underline{\text{VVIPs}}$. VVIPs will enter through gate 'A' and drive upto the porch (position 'E').
 - (b) <u>VIPs</u>. Will enter through Gate 'B', get down from the transport at the position 'F' and will walk upto the porch.
- (2) <u>Eastern Gate (Gate 'D')</u>. All RPF invitees will enter through this gate. The VVIP will drive down upto the porch. The VIPs will get down at Gate 'C' and will walk upto the porch.
- c. <u>Check/Security Points at CND Complex</u>. Following check/security points each of which will be manned jointly by 2 X UNAMIR personnels and 1 X Protocol representative at a time except for sub para (8) below:
 - (1) Gate 'A' 1 X officer
 - (2) Gate 'B'
 - (3) Gate 'C' 1 X Officer
 - (4) Gate 'D' 1 X Officer
 - (5) Position 'E' 1 X officer
 - (6) Position 'F'
 - (7) Position 'G' 1 X officer
 - (8) Position 'K' 1 X Section
 - (9) Position 'L'
- d. <u>Check Points (CP) Outside CND Complex</u>. There should be atleast 9 CPs (along each road leading to city and

- UNAMIR HQ) to be manned by Gendarmerie for crowd and traffic control. Each CP will also have one UNMO team and one CIVPOL to oversee the duties of Gendarmerie. Kigali Sector HQ to furnish to MILOB Gp HQ exact number of places where Gendarmerie will be deployed. MILOB Gp HQ to please liaise with CIVPOL and coordinate.
- e. <u>Entry of Escorts/Body Guards</u>. Both the President of the Republic and RPF Chairman can have the following personnel inside the CND complex:
 - (1) 6 X Body Guards each with a pistol in uniform may provide security of their VVIPs from porch upto/inside Assy/CND building.
 - (2) 9 X Escorts each with small arms may enter with the VVIPs' convoy and stay in the VVIP car parking area with weapon slung.
- f. <u>Stand By</u>. Kigali Sec to provide following to remain stand by at K hour at FHQ:
 - (1) Armed escort with 2 X vehicles.
 - (2) UNMOs with 2 X vehicles.
- g. <u>Scanning Machine</u>. A security Scanning Machine will be placed at the entrance of the Assembly Hall under the arrangement of the govt protocol representative. RPF representative may remain in civies but will not do any checking.
- h. <u>Procession/Crowd Control</u>. Procession and crowd control will be ensured by Gendarmerie. No procession in between western and eastern gates of CND complex is allowed.

j. <u>Helicopters</u>

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- (a) 2 X Helicopters to remain stand by at H-2 hours for deployment.
- (b) Helicopters to monitor and surveile any undesirable movement of Presidential Guards and Para Battalion.

Reserves

(1) Adequate reserves both mobile and static to be catered.

- (2) Possibility of deploying APCs as Rapid Reaction Force to be also considered.
- (3) Reserves will be used at following places/circumstances on clearance of FC:
 - (a) Around CND complex and RPF areas.

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- (b) CPs outside CND complex supervised by UNMO teams.
- (c) To rescue deputies/invitees if faced with interference/obstruction by crowd.
- (d) Reinforcement at key points (if goes out of control of Gendarmerie).
- (e) To deal with any uncalled/undesirable movement of Presidential Guards and Para Battalion.
- (4) Location of reserves to be intimated to FHQ.
- 1. Rules of Engagement. Will be governed by existing SOP on "Rules on Engagement".
- m. <u>Drivers</u>. Drivers to remain in the car in the parking area. Security personnels at position 'K' to ensure surveillance.
- n. <u>Entry of CND Building Staffs</u>. Entry of essential staff of the Assembly Building will be done as per existing arrangement and in coordination with CND authority.
- p. <u>Security during Lunch Break</u>. Invitees are expected to go out of the CND Building for lunch. Fresh security checks will be done when re-entering.
- q. Right of Entry. Any invitee having a pass with the signature of COO and UNAMIR stamp will be allowed to enter the gate.
- r. <u>UNMOs</u>. Adequate number of English/French speaking UNMOs to be deployed to assist in the security checking.
- s. Search. No physical search will be done.
- t. <u>Extra Passes</u>. As an unforeseen, extra passes bearing UNAMIR stamp and signature of COO will be issued on the spot.
- u. <u>Security of FHQ</u>. Existing security of FHQ be reinforced by 1 X additional platoon.

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v. <u>Security of UNAMIR Field Hospital</u>. Force Log Coy will provide 2 X Sec for the security of the hospital at K hour.

w. <u>Civil Affairs</u>. 2 X Civil Affairs team each consisting of 1 X UNMO from Kigali Sector and 1 X CIVPOL will remain stand by at FHQ at K hour on vehicles. Teams will be deployed on requirement. **DCOO** to coordinate.

x. <u>Security at DMZ Sector</u>

- (1) Troops deployed at NGONDORE to be strengthen.
- (2) RUHINGERI area to be closely monitored by UNMOs to guard against any movement of undesired troops.
- (3) To provide one UNMO team at the disposal of CMO.

y. Timings

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- (1) <u>D Day</u>. The day of the ceremony. Will be confirmed over radio.
- (2) <u>H Hour</u>. Time of the ceremony. Will be confirmed over radio.
- (3) $\underline{K \text{ Hour}}$. Time (H-4) by which all to be in position on the day of ceremony.

5. Administrative Arrangement

- a. <u>Car Parking</u>. Parking of transports to be done as under. OC MP Sec to coordinate:
 - (1) VVIP's car: Position 'M'.
 - (2) Govt VIP's car: Position 'N'.
 - (3) RPF VIP's car: Position 'O'.
 - (4) Additional space at position 'P' may also be used if need be.

b. <u>UNAMIR Civil Personnel</u>

- (1) Unless otherwise informed through civil duty officer, all civilian staffs will attend office as per normal office timings.
- (2) In case civilian staffs are to stay at home, only personnel in charge of the following facilities to be available at FHQ:

- (a) Communication.
- (b) Transports including drivers.
- (c) Stand by Generator.
- (d) Canteen.
- c. <u>Medical Cover</u>. UNAMIR Field Hospital to provide 1 X medical team with an ambulance under a medical officer at FHQ at K hour.
- d. <u>Additional Transports</u>. CTO is requested to provide 12 X Jeep/Pick up, 2 X Minibus and 1 X Ambulance for distribution as under:
 - (1) MILOB Gp HQ: 10
 - (2) Civil Affairs Team: 02
 - (3) Force Med Pl: 01(Amb)
 - (4) FHQ: 02(Minibus)

 - (1) <u>Kigali Sector Comd</u>. Will be located at CND complex at Gate No 2 and will remain in charge of the overall security.
