SUBJECT: DAILY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 201800 - 211800 AUG 95

1. SITUATION

a. GENERAL

The general situation was calm.

b. BORDER

RUSUMO: The border post was open to normal traffic.

2. a. POLITICAL: NTR

b. MILITARY

(a) With reference to the three Sitreps dated 14, 15 and 19 August 95, it was reported that there had been some cases of infiltration by the armed elements of the former government into RUKARA 5601 and MUHAZI 4590 communes with the aim of taking their relatives to TANZANIA.

(b) The group of four (04) locals of Rukara commune who tried to migrate on 25 July 95 and were stated to have been caught, have still not been released. According to Human Rights staff at KIBUNGO, who have so far been mediating for their release, these four are still in custody. They have however pledged to continue mediating for their release.

(c) It was also reported to our team today by the assistant bourgemestre of KAYONZA 5784 commune that three (03) soldiers of the former government forces infiltrated into the commune area with arms from Tanzania on 15 August 95. They however escaped arrest.



3. a. SECTOR HQ:  
The new sector commander Lt Col R Manzl, who took over from Lt Col H Kante on the 19 of August, has started to liaise with local authorities and NGOs today.
- b. TEAMS  
(1) One team patrolled route BIRENGA 5959, KANSANA 5461, SOVU 4877, RWAMAGANA 4884 and KAYONZA 5784. The situation in the area was reported calm.
- (2) One team patrolled route CYUNUZI 6247, MUSAZA 6845, NYAMUYAGE 7744, RWANTERU 7948, BUKOBA 8737 and RUSUMO 7549. The situation in the area was reported calm.
- (3) One team patrolled route BIRENGA, BARE 5448, GAHARA 5442 and back to KIBUNGO. Situation in the area was reported calm.
4. a. It was reported that there were 52 returnees from TANZANIA in BIRENGA UNHCR Transit camp. UNHCR officials stated that they are expecting some more this week, however an exact number could not be obtained. It was further reported that at RWINKWAVU sector that there are over 6,000 IDP/returnees having accomodation problems.
- b. At MUSAZA, an MSF Health Centre official reported to the team that the number of patients visiting the centre is increasing and that they are anticipating an accomadation problem. It was also reported to a team that there are many cases of malaria and dysentery in GAHARA sector. The Gahara Health Centre is supplied by IMC. There were no cases of tuberculosis and measles recently.
5. Road repairs have been observed carried out by commune workers around BARE and GAHARA.
6. Vehicle 1089, 632, 1091 are in the workshop for maintenance.
