I have the honour to refer to my recent trip to Egypt, on 14 April 2011, to co-chair with you the Cairo Conference on Libya which brought together regional and international organizations to discuss coordination on Libya.

This conference, which came on the heels of the first Contact Group meeting on Libya in Doha, was a concrete demonstration of the international community working together for a common cause and in a common voice for the people of Libya. The conference allowed us to outline the next steps, including an agreement to adopt a unified approach to finding a lasting solution to the crisis in Libya.
