DAILY SITREP FOR 15 APR 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B. AT ABOUT 151045B APR 95, A SENBATT VEH WITH REG NUMBER UNAMIR 4428 WAS INVOLVED IN A SINGLE VEH ACCIDENT NEAR KAMANYA GR 8928 ON ROAD KIGALI - GITARAMA. AS A RESULT, PTE 1ST CLASS FAYE RENE FREDRICK, UNIM M8754, DIED IN HOSPITAL AT 1145 HRS. SIX OTHER SENBATT SOLDIERS IN THE SAME VEH SUSTAINED VARIOUS INJURIES.

C. AN ANTI-UNAMIR DEMONSTRATION WAS HELD BY ABOUT 100 LOCAL CITIZENS IN RUHengeri. ROAD BLOCK PREVENT NORMAL FLOW OF UN VEHs. NORMAL OPS SUSPENDED IN THE VICINITY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, ALONG WITH HIS STAFF AND OTHER UNAMIR COLLEAGUES, BADE FAREWELL TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, DR. ABDUL HAMID KABIA, WHO DEPARTED THE UNAMIR MISSION TO TAKE UP ANOTHER ASSIGNMENT.

B. THE FOLLOWING WAS REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA:

(1) THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, MET REPRESENTATIVES OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS AND UN AGENCIES IN KIGALI TO EXPLAIN WHY THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT HAS NOT ALLOWED 24 WFP (WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME) TRUCKS CARRYING FOOD AID TO REFUGEE CAMPS IN ZAIRE TO CROSS THE ZAIREAN BORDER.

(2) PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU EXPLAINED THAT MILITARY TRAINING WAS TAKING PLACE IN RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMPS IN ZAIRE WHERE FORMER RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FORCES AND INTERAHAMWE WERE PREPARING TO LAUNCH AN ATTACK ON RWANDA. HE ADDED THAT THE RWANDESE POPULATION WAS BECOMING INCREASINGLY ANGRY THAT RWANDESE ROADS WERE BEING USED TO BRING FOOD AID TO THOSE CRIMINALS.

(3) IN A DECLARATION READ BY THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ASKED THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO DISARM THE CRIMINALS IN THE CAMPS, TO SEPARATE THEM FROM INNOCENT PEOPLE AND TO STRIP THE FORMER EXILED RWANDESE LEADERS OF THEIR POWER OVER THE CAMPS.

(4) THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ALSO ASKED ZAIRE TO ABIDE BY THE AGREEMENTS REACHED WITH RWANDA ON THE QUESTION OF REFUGEES AND TO FACILITATE THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES BY PREVENTING ACTS OF INTIMIDATION AGAINST REFUGEES WISHING TO RETURN HOME. IN ADDITION, THE GOVERNMENT ASKED ZAIRE TO MOVE THOSE REFUGEES NOT WISHING TO RETURN TO RWANDA AWAY FROM THE BORDER.

(5) THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT, FOR ITS PART, PLEDGES TO ENSURE THE SECURITY OF RETURNEES AND TO PROVIDE FACILITIES FOR THEIR RESETTLEMENT.

C. THE UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-GENERAL, MR. BOUTROS BOUTROS-GHALI HAS DEPLORED THE CONTENT OF THE SPEECHES DELIVERED DURING THE ANTI-UNAMIR DEMONSTRATIONS OUTSIDE THE UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS IN KIGALI ON APRIL 11.

D. A PARTY WAS HELD ON FRIDAY NIGHT AT THE FRENCH

CULTURAL CENTRE IN KIGALI TO CLOSE THE MOURNING WEEK FOR THE VICTIMS OF GENOCIDE. IN HIS CLOSING SPEECH, PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU SAID THAT THE GENOCIDE OF LAST YEAR WAS THE CONSEQUENCE OF A SERIES OF POLITICAL MISTAKES CARRIED OUT SINCE THE COLONIAL PERIOD AND FOR WHICH FOREIGNERS AS WELL AS RWANDESE WERE RESPONSIBLE. HE SAID THAT RECONCILIATION WAS NECESSARY BUT THAT IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE IF THE SURVIVORS OF GENOCIDE DID NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR THEIR LOSS OF RELATIVES AND PROPERTY. HE ANNOUNCED THE CREATION OF A FUND IN FAVOUR OF GENOCIDE SURVIVORS.

E. THE HEAD OF THE UN HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION FOR RWANDA, MR. WILLIAM CLARANCE, ON FRIDAY ANNOUNCED THAT INCURSIONS INTO GISENYI PREFECTURE FROM ACROSS THE ZAIRIAN BORDER HAD INCREASED RECENTLY. HE ANNOUNCED THAT 12 PEOPLE HAD BEEN KILLED IN GISENYI DURING THE PREVIOUS DAYS AND THAT HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS WERE CARRYING OUT INVESTIGATIONS ON THE INCIDENTS IN THE AREA. HE ANNOUNCED THAT THREE MOTIVATIONS HAD BEEN IDENTIFIED FOR THE ATTACKS:

(1) POLITICAL, TO PUNISH PEOPLE WHO LEAVE THE REFUGEE CAMPS AND COLLABORATE WITH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT.

(2) TO KILL EYE WITNESSES TO MASSACRES.

(3) ECONOMIC, TO STEAL CATTLE, CLOTHES AND MONEY.

(2) ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT GENDARMERIE IN BUTARE HAVE INDICATED THAT THEY WOULD IMPOUND THE ZAMBATT DAF TRUCK WHICH WAS INVOLVED IN A ROAD ACCIDENT NEAR BUTARE ON 14 APR 95. NEGOTIATION IN PROGRESS.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) SENBATT VEH WAS INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT NEAR KAMANYA GR 8979 ON ROAD KIGALI-GITARAMA. SEE PARA 1B.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT) CONDUCTED PATROLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) SITUATION IN THE SECTOR IS STILL TENSE. DEMONSTRATION AGAINST UNAMIR PRESENCE WAS CARRIED OUT BY LOCALS AT RUHENGARI WHO MOUNTED A ROAD BLOCK AT THE EAST ENTRANCE OF RUHENGARI. DUE TO SITUATION AT RUHENGARI, TUNBATT SUPPLY VEHS WERE OBLIGED TO RETURN TO COY LOC AT NEMBA.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 162 LOCALS IN AOR.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) FIVE TROOP CARRYING VEHS PROVIDED TO 95 FLSC FOR ETHIOBATT ROTATION. THE VEHS LEFT UNIT LOC AT 0800 HRS FOR CYANGUGU.

(3) ONE HUTU LOCAL, CHASED BY TWO OTHERS, TOOK SHELTER IN INDBATT SOALTEE POST AT 1100 HRS. THE LOCAL WAS BEING ACCUSED OF HAVING KILLED THE ENTIRE FAMILY OF ONE OF THE PERSONS CHASING HIM. HE HAS BEEN HANDED OVER TO UN MP COY.

(4) AT APPROX 1130 HRS, A CHILD AGED 12 YRS WITH SEVERE HEAD INJURY WAS FOUND AT GR 144836. THE CHILD WAS GIVEN FIRST AID AT SOALTEE AND NOW ADMITTED TO

CENTRAL HOSPITAL KIGALI. CAUSE OF INJURY NOT KNOWN.
INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(5) 20 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE. 104
IDPs WERE EVAC BY UNHCR TO RUHENGERI, KANSENZE AND
NGENDA.

(6) MED STAFF TREATED 6 LOCALS IN AOR.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY STABLE DURING
THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. NTR.

(A) FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC.

(B) GISENYI BORDER POST WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR
PERS.

(C) THE ZAIREAN BORDER POST WAS CLOSED TO ALL
COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC DUE TO THE BAN ON ALL
COMMERCIAL VEHS ACROSS THE BORDER BY THE RWANDESE
GOVERNMENT.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND
MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS REPORTED A CHANGE IN THE ATTITUDE OF
LOCALS IN THE HINTERLAND TOWARDS MILOBS PROBABLY
DUE TO LOCAL RADIO BROADCASTS. PATROLS REPORTED
LOCALS FEIGNING IGNORANCE ABOUT ANY ISSUE THEY
WERE INTERVIEWED ON AND PRETENDING IN SEVERAL
CASES NOT TO SPEAK ENGLISH OR FRENCH. PATROLS
ATTEMPTING TO INTERVIEW LOCALS OFTEN FIND
THEMSELVES SURROUNDED BY A LARGE CROWD WHO JUST
WATCH OR LAUGH AT THE PATROLS.

(C) PATROL TO TUMBA COMMUNE REPORTED A MINE
INCIDENT IN BUGERERA (GR 9111) IN WHICH A LOCAL
MALE ADULT HAD BOTH HIS LEGS BLOWN OFF ON 12 APR
95. HIS WIFE ALSO SUSTAINED INJURIES. THE PTL
ALSO OBSERVED LOCALS PROSPECTING FOR GOLD ALONG

THE RIVER BED NEAR MUKONO (GR 1326).

(D) A HELI PATROL WAS CONDUCTED OVER THE BORDER AREAS WITH UGANDA. NO UNUSUAL MOVEMENTS WERE OBSERVED.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) NO UNUSUAL MOVEMENTS OF THE POPULATION ACROSS THE TANZANIAN OR BURUNDI BORDERS.

(C) MILOBS INVESTIGATIONS INTO REPORTS OF A DEMONSTRATION IN NYAMATA ON THE NIGHT OF 14 APR 95 REVEALED THAT ABOUT 1,000 LOCALS HELD A PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION AT ABOUT 1400 HRS ON THAT DATE. LATER ON IN THE EVENING A GROUP ATTEMPTED TO STONE THE GHANBATT LOCATION BUT WERE CHASED OUT BY GHANBATT TROOPS.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) LOCALS WHO TOOK REFUGE WITH MALICOY AT NTONGWE HAVE RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES.

(C) MILOBS OBSERVED THE EXHUMATION OF BODIES FROM MASS GRAVES FOR REBURIAL IN BITARE (GR 8384) AND MYAMIREMBE (GR 8287). THE CEREMONY WAS ATTENDED BY THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA AND THE BOURGEMESTRE OF THE KAYENZI COMMUNE. TOTAL OF 340 BODIES WERE EXHUMED. IN HIS ADDRESS TO THE LOCALS, THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA SPOKE ON THE NEED FOR RECONCILIATION.

(D) PATROLS TO GISHYITA AND GISOVU COMMUNES REPORTED THAT LOCALS WERE RELUCTANT TO PROVIDE INFORMATION. TWO PRISONERS FROM THE BIRAMBO PRISON IN THE KIBUYE PREFECTURE WERE ADMITTED TO THE HOSPITAL. THEY WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN BEATEN FOR ALLEGEDLY RAPING TWO FEMALE PRISONERS.

(E) MILOBS ASSISTED IN THE MEDICAL EVACUATION OF A FEMALE EMPLOYEE OF MEDICOS EN CATASTROPHE FROM MBUYE (GR 8363) TO KIGALI AROUND 2130 HRS ON 14 APR 95. THE RPA LO WAS VERY COOPERATIVE AND PERSONALLY ACCOMPANIED THE MILOBS TO GITARAMA AND ISSUED A LETTER OF AUTHORIZATION TO ENSURE SAFE PASSAGE THROUGH RPA CHECK POINTS EN ROUTE TO KIGALI.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PATROLLED NSHILI COMMUNE (GR 3996). THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE WHO WAS IN DETENTION HAS RESUMED DUTIES ON 14 APR 95. LIFE IN THE KAMANA CAMP WAS REPORTED TO BE NORMAL DESPITE THE WELL-KNOWN NEWS OF ITS IMMINENT CLOSURE ON 16 APR 95. MANY HOUSES IN THE COMMUNE WERE OBSERVED TO BE VACANT.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED HELI RECCE ALONG THE BURUNDI BORDER, KIBEHO (GR 5010), NDAGO (GR 5310), KIBAYI (GR 8497) AND MUGANZA (GR 8407) WITH SHORT LANDINGS AT KIBAYI AND NYAKIZU (GR 5696). NORMAL MOVEMENTS WERE OBSERVED ALONG THE BORDER, HOWEVER MANY VILLAGES APPEARED DESERTED.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) AT ABOUT 1900 HRS, 3 MEN AND A WOMAN SOUGHT PROTECTION FROM MILOBS IN BUGARAMA. THEY WERE AFRAID OF BEING KILLED DURING THE NIGHT BY THE GENDARMERIE. THEY CLAIMED THAT ON 141500B APR 95, 11 LOCALS WERE KILLED BY GENDARMES IN THE AREA FOR NO APPARENT REASONS. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) A DEMONSTRATION WAS HELD AGAINST UNAMIR BY LOCALS AT RUHENGRI. THE PROTESTERS DEMONSTRATED OUTSIDE THE RESIDENCE OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL IN THE TOWN AND ESTABLISHED A ROAD BLOCK ON THE RUHENGRI-GISENYI ROAD UP TO 1500 HRS. THERE WERE 75-100 DEMONSTRATORS IN ALL. RPA AND GENDARMES CONTROLLED THE CROWD AND PROTECTED UNAMIR PROPERTY. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PATROLS COMPLAINED OF HOSTILE ATTITUDE OF THE CIVIL POPULATION TOWARDS UNAMIR PERS. THE SECTOR OPS OFFICER WAS STONED IN HIS VEHICLE EVEN THOUGH HE WAS ALONE AT THE TIME. CHILDREN WERE ALSO REPORTED TO BE SPITTING AT UNAMIR VEHICLES.

(C) MILOBS INVESTIGATED AN INCIDENT OF ARMED ROBBERY BY 5 MEN, 2 OF WHOM WERE IN MILITARY UNIFORM, AT THE RESIDENCE OF COL HOLLAND OF THE SALVATION ARMY IN KICUKIRO (GR 121817). THE INVESTIGATION WAS HANDED OVER TO UN MPS WHEN THEY ARRIVED ON THE SCENE.

L. FORCE ENGR COY. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

M. AUSMED.

(1) PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 58 OUT-PATIENTS AND CURRENTLY HOLDING 20 IN-PATIENTS.

(3) AUSMED RECEIVED EIGHT CASUALTIES FROM A SINGLE VEH ACCIDENT INVOLVING SENBATT. ONE SOLDIER SUBSEQUENTLY DIED OF INJURIES SUSTAINED.

(4) RIFLE COY ELM PROVIDED SECURITY AT THE MIL BKS AND CHK.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE KIA DURING THE PERIOD. A TOTAL OF 12 DEPARTED AND ARRIVED KIA.

O. UN MP COY.

(1) UNAMIR MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO THE RWANDESE LOCAL AND TO THE NIBATT SOLDIER SUSPECTED OF MURDER.

(2) INVESTIGATED THE FOLLOWING INCIDENTS:

(A) AN ATTEMPTED THEFT OF UNAMIR VEH NO 1464 AT KIMUHURURA. RADIO AND OTHER ITEMS IN THE VEH WERE DAMAGED.

(B) TRAFFIC ACCIDENT INVOLVING SENBATT VEH ONROAD KIGALI - GITARAMA.

(C) ARMED ROBBERY AT KICUKIRU AT THE RESIDENCE OF COL HOLLAND VOGEL LISEIOHE OF SALVATION ARMY (NGO). MONEY AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS WERE STOLEN. IT WAS ALLEGED THAT TWO RPA SOLDIERS ARMED WITH SMG AND FOUR OTHERS, ONE WITH A PISTOL WERE SEEN IN THE RESIDENCE OF THE VICTIMS.

(3) STARTED SEWAGE TASKING FOR TUNBATT.

(4) DELIVERED FURNITURE TO UNAMIR HQ FROM KIA.

6. CIVPOL.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN BUTARE PATROLLED NYABISINDU COMMUNE. THE BOURGMESTRE DISCLOSED THAT ACTS OF BANDITRY COMMITTED IN THE COMMUNE BY BANDITS FROM IDP CAMPS IN SECTOR 4A IS ON THE INCREASE. THE CIVPOL OBSERVERS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE RPA WAS CONDUCTING INTENSIVE SEARCHES ON ALL STUDENTS AND VEHICLES ENTERING BUTARE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS. SOME OF THE STUDENTS HAVE EXPRESSED DISSATISFACTION ABOUT THE DEPLOYMENT OF RPA SOLDIERS TO THE CAMPUS.

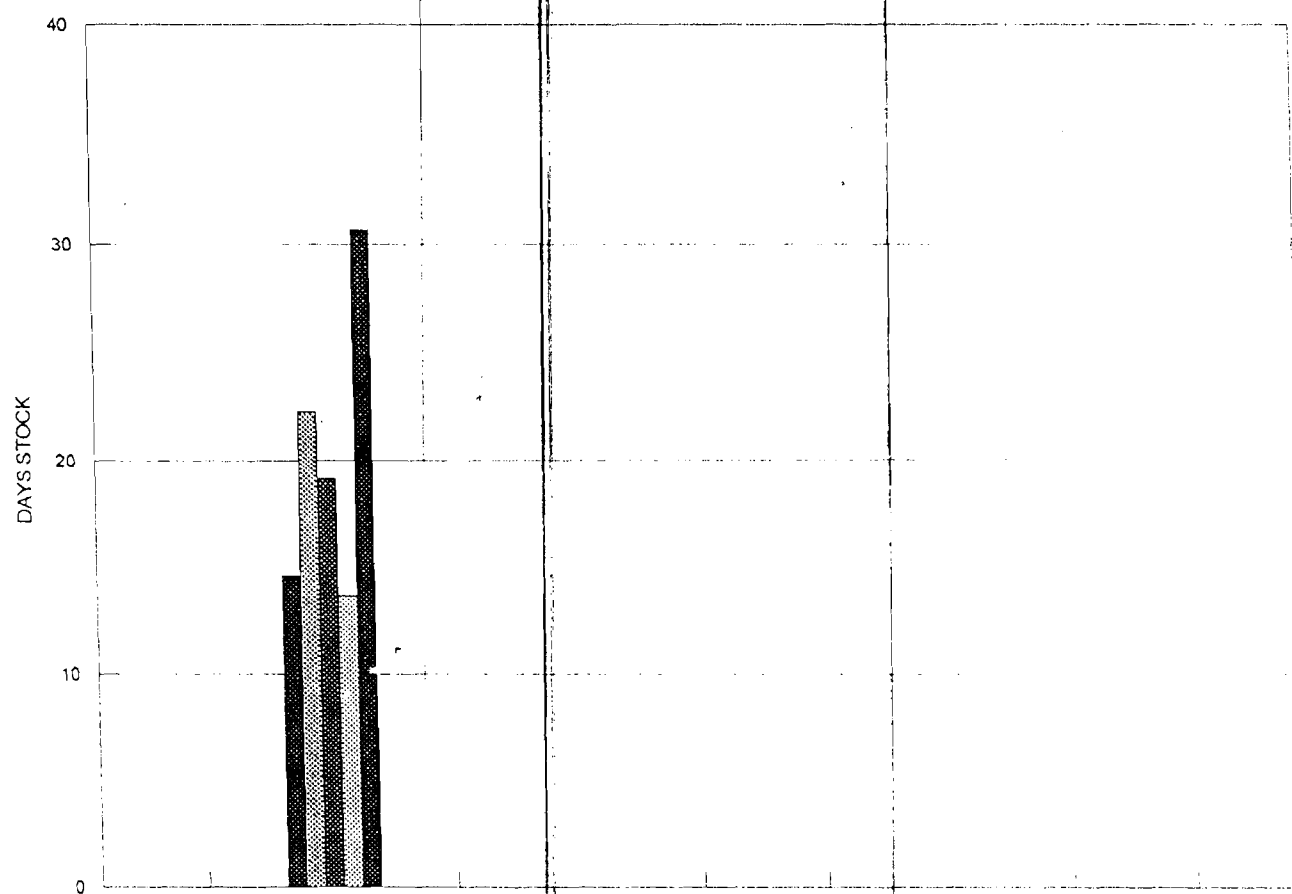



(2) ON 13 APR 95, AT AN RPA CHECK POINT IN BUTARE A BROWN AND ROOT WATER DRIVER (LOCAL EMPLOYEE) WAS ASSAULTED BY SOME RPA SOLDIERS FOR RUNNING INTO THE CHECKPOINT'S ROPE AFTER THE VEH GLIDED ON THE WET ROAD. TWO 95 FLSG SOLDIERS ON BOARD THE VEH INTERVENED AND THE DRIVER WAS LATER RELEASED AND ALLOWED THE CONVOY TO PROCEED.

6. CIVPOL.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE PREFECTURES.

B. RECEIVED THE VISIT OF THE FC TO CIVPOL HQ IN KIGALI, HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE CIVPOL COMMISSIONER ABOUT THE ACTIVITIES OF UNAMIR CIVPOL.

C. PATROL TEAM TO GISENYI PREFECTURE VISITED THE GENDARMERIE BRIGADE STATION AT GISENYI TO NEGOTIATE THE RELEASE OF A UNAMIR VEH IMPOUNDED BY THE GENDARMERIE. THE GENDARMERIE AUTHORITIES FAILED TO RELEASE THE VEH. FURTHER NEGOTIATIONS TO BE UNDERTAKEN.

D. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN KIGALI ASSISTING CENTRAL CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS ARM OF THE LOCAL POLICE TO INVESTIGATE THE ARMED ROBBERY INCIDENT THAT TOOK PLACE AT IOM OFFICE IN KIGALI ON 31 MAR 95. ABOUT US\$60,000 AND A SATELLITE TELEPHONE SET WERE ALLEGEDLY STOLEN FROM THE IOM OFFICE.

E. SECTOR 6 CIVPOL ALSO REPORTED THAT A CONFERENCE ON THE ROLE OF GOVERNMENT IN SUPPORT OF VICTIMS OF WIDOWS AND ORPHANS TOOK PLACE ON 14 APR 95 AT NYAMIRAMBO SPORTS COMPLEX UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE MINISTER OF WORKS AND SOCIAL AFFAIRS. THE CONFERENCE CLIMAXED THE GOVERNMENT'S WEEK-LONG ACTIVITIES IN HONOUR OF GENOCIDE VICTIMS.

F. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IN PROGRESS.

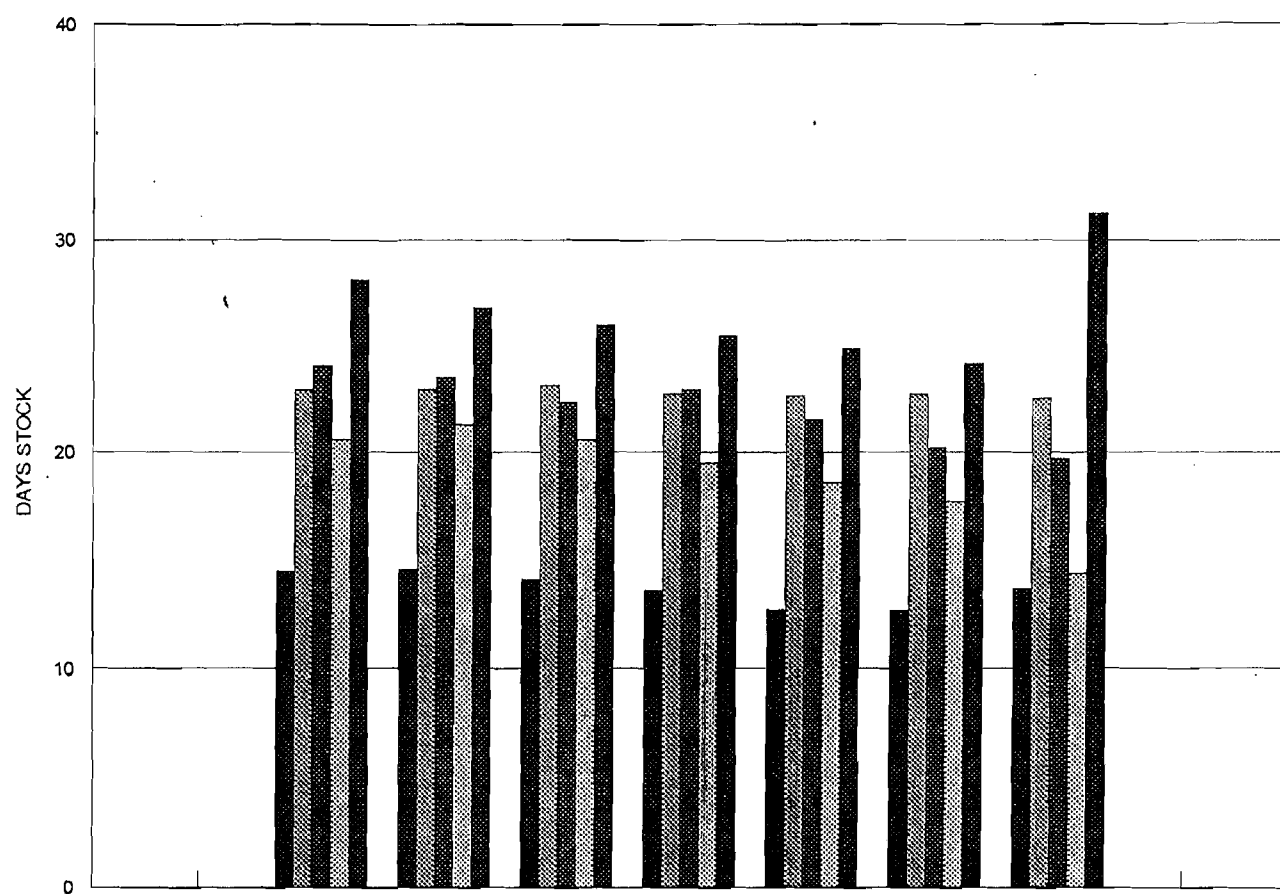

A. THE SRSG, AMBASSADOR KHAN, WAS RECEIVED BY PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHER MATTERS, RELATIONS BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT AND UNAMIR.

B. HE MET WITH MR. HASEGAWA, THE UNDP RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE, TO DISCUSS THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE TRUST

FUND, AS WELL AS PROPOSED PROJECTS FOR FINANCING.

C. HE HELD CONSULTATIONS WITH MS. TAMSIN LEAKEY OF ODA, GREAT BRITAIN, TO DISCUSS POTENTIAL PROJECTS FOR THE BRITISH CONTRIBUTION TO THE TRUST FUND.

D. THE FOLLOWING WAS REPORTED ON RADIO RWANDA ON 12 AND 13 APR 95:

(1) ON THURSDAY, 13 APRIL 1995, THE 7TH DAY OF THE MOURNING PERIOD, IN MEMORY OF THE VICTIMS OF GENOCIDE, A MARCH IS TO BE HELD IN KIGALI TO PROTEST THE NEGATIVE ROLE OF THE MEDIA, AND, IN PARTICULAR, THE ROLE PLAYED BY THE RTLM RADIO STATION AND THE FORMER DEFEATED GOVERNMENT. THE MARCH IS TO BEGIN AT THE MAIN ROUND-ABOUT IN KIGALI TOWN AND WILL THEN PROCEED TO THE FORMER HEADQUARTERS OF RTLM (RADIO TELEVISION LIBRE DES MILLE COLLINES), WHERE SPEECHES WILL BE DELIVERED ON THE TOPIC OF THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE RWANDESE MEDIA IN THE GENOCIDE. THE MARCH WILL CONTINUE TO THE FRENCH EMBASSY IN KIGALI WHERE SPEECHES WILL BE GIVEN TO CONDEMN THE ROLE OF FRANCE IN THE GENOCIDE. NEXT, AT THE BELGIAN EMBASSY WHERE THE MARCHERS WILL PROTEST BELGIUM'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR ALL THE DIVISIONS AND ETHNIC DIFFERENCES WHICH ORIGINATED DURING COLONIAL RULE IN RWANDA. THE FINAL PHASE OF THE MARCH WILL BE TO HOTEL DES DIPLOMATES WHICH WAS THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE EXILED RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ACCUSED OF ORGANISING THE GENOCIDE.

E. ON WEDNESDAY, THE LOCAL POPULATION OF GISENYI TOWN STAGED AN ANTI-UNAMIR DEMONSTRATION WHICH ENDED AT HOTEL MERIDIEN, THE GISENYI HEADQUARTERS OF UNAMIR. THE DEMONSTRATION WAS HELD PARTIALLY AS A RESULT OF AN INCIDENT IN WHICH A UNAMIR VEHICLE KILLED A YOUNG GIRL IN A TRAFFIC ACCIDENT ON TUESDAY. THE DEMONSTRATORS DEMANDED THE DEPARTURE OF UNAMIR BECAUSE UNAMIR HAD FAILED TO SAVE PEOPLE FROM GENOCIDE AND IS NOW KILLING ITS SURVIVORS.

F. ON WEDNESDAY, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, MR. ALPHONSE-MARIE NKUBITO, RECEIVED A DONATION OF THREE VEHICLES AND COMPUTERS FROM THE HEAD OF USAID IN KIGALI.

(1) IN SECTOR 2, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUED TO INTENSIFY SY MEASURES ALONG THE RWANDAN - BURUNDI BORDER.

(2) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THAT A RPA SOLDIER, WHOSE CAR WAS DAMAGED AS A RESULT OF AN ACCIDENT WITH CARE INTERNATIONAL OFFICIAL, TRIED TO TAKE THE CAR BY FORCE. AFTER NEGOTIATIONS INVOLVING MILOBS AND CIVPOL, IT WAS AGREED AMICABLY THAT CARE WOULD FENT A CAR FOR

THE RPA SOLDIER FOR TWO DAYS FOR REPAIRS TO BE COMPLETED ON HIS CAR.

(3) IN SECTOR 3, MILOB ALSO REPORTED THAT THE RPA HAVE REACTIVATED TWO CHECKPOINTS AT KIBUYE GR 260700 AND AT MUBUGA GR 2463.

(4) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT ONE LOCAL REPORTED TO TROOPS AT MUSEBEYA THAT AT BISEREVANYA VILLAGE GR 384335, TWO RPA SOLDIERS AT ABOUT 122100B APR 95 ARRESTED A LOCAL ALLEGED TO BE AN FRGF SOLDIER. THE ALLEGED SOLDIER WAS SHOT DEAD WHEN HE ATTEMPTED TO GRAB A WEAPON FROM ONE OF THE RPA SOLDIERS. THE RPA COMD IN THE AREA HAS CONFIRMED THE INCIDENT BUT CLAIMS THE DEAD SOLDIER HAD REFUSED TO JOIN THE RPA. HE HAS BEEN BURIED.

(5) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 0630HRS, 20 RPA SOLDIERS FORCED THE REMAINING IDPs OUT OF RWAMIKO DPC AND TOLD THEM TO JOIN OTHERS IN KIBEHO DPC.

(6) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA PROVIDED SECURITY AT COMMUNE HQ'S WHILST REGISTRATION FOR A NATIONAL ID CARD WAS GOING ON.

(7) IN SECTOR 4C, TWO RPA LOS ACCOMPANIED MILOBS DURING THEIR RECCE TO BWEYEYE. SECTOR MILOBS ALSO REPORTED THAT ON 7 APR 95 AT RUKANO GR 0847 A YOUNG MAN AND WOMAN WERE KILLED BY RPA FOR ALLEGEDLY ATTEMPTING TO GO TO IJWI. LOCALS ARE DOUBTFUL AND SAY THAT ONE OF THE RPA SOLDIERS INVOLVED IN THE KILLING DID IT OUT OF JEALOUSY.

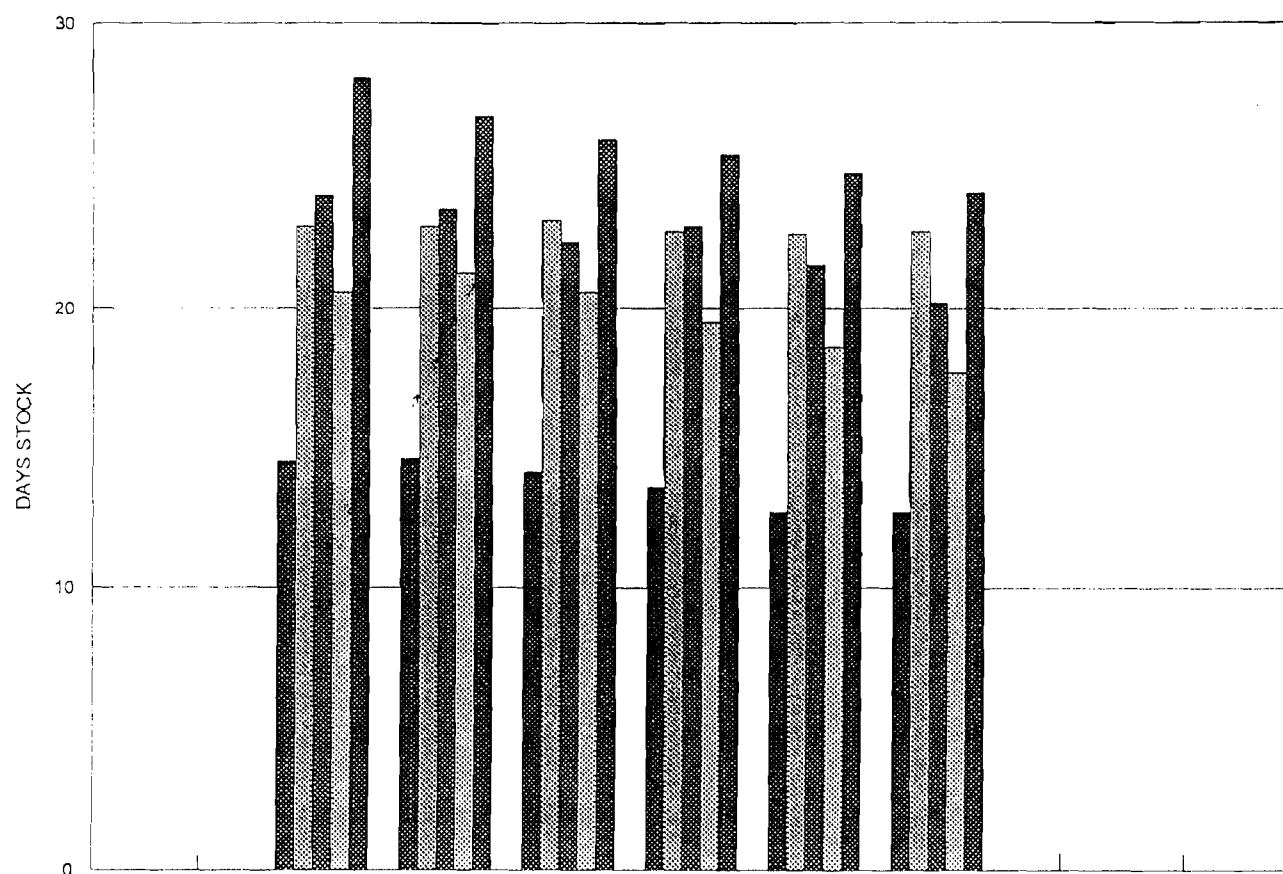



DAILY SITREP FOR 12 APR 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B TUNBATT TRUCK RETURNING FROM GISENYI TO KABALI WAS ATTACKED AT RUBAVU GR 2218 BY ABOUT 300 LOCALS WITH STONES AND STICKS. THE VEH HAD ITS WINDOWS, DOOR AND MIRROR SMASHED BY THE LOCALS WHO WERE DEMONSTRATING AGAINST UNAMIR. THE DEMONSTRATORS ALSO BLOCKED THE ROAD PREVENTING MOVEMENT OF UNAMIR VEHS TO GISENYI.

C. MILOB IN SECTOR 6 REPORTED THAT THE MEDICAL CENTRE AT BUTAMWA GR 0376 WHICH IS SUPPORTED BY MEDICINE DU MONDE WAS CLOSED WHILE MANY SICK PEOPLE WERE WAITING TO BE TREATED. PTL RETURNED TO KIGALI TO FIND OUT WHY THE CENTRE WAS CLOSED. IT LEARNED THAT THE STAFF (NGOs) WERE AFRAID OF LAND MINES AS ONE OF THEIR VEHS WAS BLOWN UP RECENTLY IN CYANGUGU AND ANOTHER KILLED IN A SHOOTING INCIDENT. MEDICINE DU MONDE HAS THEREFORE REQUESTED FOR ESCORTS FOR THEIR MOBILE MEDICAL TEAMS.

D. IN SECTOR 4B, TAC HQ REPORTED THAT THREE POSTERS WERE PLACED ON THE REAR GATE OF THE HQ BY UNKNOWN PERSONS. THE POSTERS WHICH CARRIED ANTI - UNAMIR MESSAGES WERE APPARENTLY TIMED TO COINCIDE WITH THE FC'S VISIT TO THE SECTOR. MESSAGES ON THE POSTERS WERE WRITTEN IN KINYARWANDA. THEY TRANSLATED:

- (1) WE ARE AGAINST UNAMIR DICTATORSHIP.
- (2) WE ARE AGAINST PROSTITUTION BY UNAMIR.
- (3) WE ARE AGAINST UNAMIR IN RWANDA.

THE LOCAL WHO SOUGHT PROTECTION FROM GHANBATT TROOPS, WITH HIS WIFE AND A CHILD, WERE CONVEYED BACK TO THEIR HOME BWERANKA GR 708618 INCLUDING HIS OTHER WIFE AND SIX CHILDREN WHO SOUGHT REFUGE IN A BANANA PLANTATION FOR FEAR OF POSSIBLE ARREST YESTERDAY.

(5) TPS CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SY AT UNHCR PREMISES IN KIBUNGO GR 5961.

(A) MILOB PTLs REPORTED THAT THE BOURGEMESTRES OF RUTONGO AND KIYOMBE COMMUNES WERE REPORTED TO BE TRYING PETTY CRIMINAL CASES IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES. SENTENCES RANGED FROM 1 HR TO 7 DAYS OF HARD LABOUR. THERE WERE 63 INMATES IN THE COMMUNAL HOLDING FACILITY IN RUTONGO COMMUNE. MILOBS WERE HOWEVER PREVENTED FROM SEEING THEM.

(B) THE SECTOR COMD HELD COORDINATING CONFERENCE WITH ICRC REPS IN THE SECTOR DURING THE PERIOD.

(C) UNICEF DISTRIBUTED 140 PLASTIC SHEETS TO 5 PRIMARY SCHOOLS IN THE KIYOMBE COMMUNE FOR USE AS TEMPORARY ROOFING MATERIAL.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOB PATROLS REPORTED THAT THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KAYONZA INFORMED MILOBS THAT HE WAS HOLDING DAILY MEETINGS WITH THE POPULATION TO DISCUSS THE GENOCIDE. THE PATROLS WERE ALSO INFORMED OF A GRAND MEETING TO BE HELD IN RUTONDE ON 14 APR 95 TO MARK THE END OF THE COMMEMORATION OF THE GENOCIDE.

(C) INVESTIGATIONS WERE CONDUCTED INTO THE INCIDENT AT BWERANKA (GR 708618) IN WHICH A LOCAL WHO HAD ALLEGEDLY BEEN THREATENED SOUGHT PROTECTION WITH GHANBATT.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS FOLLOWED UP THE CASE OF A TEACHER FROM THE MUSMBIRA COMMUNE WHO HAD SOUGHT THE PROTECTION OF UNAMIR AND HAD BEEN PERSUADED TO RETURN HOME. THOUGH IT WAS REPORTED THAT THERE WERE NO WITNESSES AGAINST HIM AT PUBLIC MEETING HELD ON 09 APR 95, THE TEAM WAS SURPRISED TO LEARN THAT SEVERAL WITNESSES HAVE NOW COME FORWARD ALLEGING THAT THE TEACHER HAD STOLEN COWS, DESTROYED HOUSES, WAS INVOLVED IN RUMOUR-MONGERING AND HAD BEEN PERSONALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEATH OF 130 PERSONS. MILOBS ARE OF THE OPINION THAT ~~THESE~~ ALLEGATIONS ARE MOSTLY UNTRUE.

(C) MILOB PATROLLED MUSHUBATI COMMUNE (GR 6970) TO ASSESS THE CONDITIONS IN THE COMMUNAL PRISON. THERE WERE 38 INMATES IN THE PRISON. AN INTERVIEW WITH THE BOURGEMESTRE ON THE REVIEW PROCESS CONVINCED MILOBS THAT HE HAD LITTLE UNDERSTANDING OF THE RULES OF EVIDENCE. THE PATROL ALSO CHECKED ON 3 MEN IN GIKOMERO SECTOR (GR 6472) WHO HAD GONE BACK HOME AFTER SEEKING UNAMIR PROTECTION. ALL 3 PERSONS WERE LOCATED AND WERE SAFE. IN THE MUSENYI SECTOR (GR 6972), THE PATROL WAS INFORMED THAT 2 ELDERLY MEN WERE BEING HELD FOR CRIMES ALLEGEDLY COMMITTED BY THEIR SONS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(D) MILOBS PROVIDED TRANSPORT FOR THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF RUTSIRO (GR 3183) TO KAGANO (GR 3683). THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE ADDRESSED THE LOCALS ON THE GENOCIDE.

(E) MILOBS INVESTIGATED A DOUBLE MURDER REPORTED TO HAVE OCCURRED IN MWENDO ON 30 MAR 95. THE BOURGEMESTRE INFORMED THE PATROL THAT HIS OWN INVESTIGATIONS HAD REVEALED THAT THOUGH THE ATTACKERS WERE IN UNIFORM, THEY WERE PROBABLY IDPs FROM ONE OF THE CAMPS. MILOBS STRONGLY SUSPECT RPA INVOLVEMENT IN THE INCIDENT. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(F) INVESTIGATIONS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED INTO REPORT OF A MURDER ON 9 APR 95 IN KAYENZI (GR 3470). A LOCAL REPORTED TO THE PATROL THAT THE DECEASED HAD STRUCK AN RPA SOLDIER WHILE BEING INTERROGATED AND BEATEN IN KAYENZI. THE RPA BN COMD THEN ORDERED HIM SHOT. THE RPA BN COMD HOWEVER DISMISSED THE INCIDENT AS A LOCALLY MOTIVATED MURDER WITH NO RPA INVOLVEMENT.

(G) MILOB PATROLS FROM SECTOR 3 WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS IN GIKOMERO SECTOR (GR 6472) THAT SEEDS DELIVERED IN JANUARY 1995 BY CARE INTERNATIONAL HAD FAILED TO GERMINATE. THERE IS THEREFORE FOOD SHORTAGE IN THE COMMUNE. MILOBS TO LIAISE WITH NGOS TO ORGANISE FOOD AID AS A MATTER OF URGENCY.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOB PATROLS TO REMERA BORDER POST REPORTED THAT THE TWO TEACHERS WHO CROSSED THE BORDER FROM ZAIRE TO CHECK ON THE RE-OPENING OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS AT RUNYOMBI HAD BEEN TRANSPORTED TO GIKONGORO FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS.

(C) MILOBS MONITORED THE EVACUATION OF IDPs FROM THE KIBEHO CAMP. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE ALSO

CONDUCTED IN RUKONDO AND KINYAKAMARA COMMUNES. THE PATROL REPORTED THE MOVEMENT OF AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF PEOPLE INTO THE DPCs DUE TO RUMOURS ABOUT THE SECURITY SITUATION.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) RECEIVED THE VISIT OF FC AND DCMO.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS TO MBAZI COMMUNE (GR 7117) REPORTED THAT THE BOURGEMESTRE WAS REGISTERING THE INHABITANTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ISSUING THEM ID CARDS.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS REPORTED THAT WFP TRUCKS WERE STILL BEING PREVENTED FROM CROSSING THE BORDER TO BUKAVU. THE DRIVERS HAD BECOME IMPATIENT AND THREATENED TO RETURN TO KIGALI. THE WFP REP IN CYANGUGU ADVISED THEM TO REMAIN TILL 13 APR 95 FOR DIRECTIVES FROM WFP-KIGALI. MILOBS ASSESS THAT THE PREVENTION OF THE TRUCKS FROM CROSSING THE BORDER WILL LEAD TO FURTHER UNREST AND BANDITRY IN THE AREAS ALONG THE BORDER WITH ZAIRE.

(C) ABOUT 75 MOSQUITO NETS HAVE BEEN ARRANGED FOR THE MUSRICORDE ORPHANAGE IN THE SECTOR. IT IS EXPECTED THAT THEIR DELIVERY TO THE ORPHANAGE WILL TAKE PLACE ON 13 APR 95. ARRANGEMENTS MADE FOR AUSMED TO FUMIGATE THE AREA OF THE ORPHANAGE.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED GENERALLY TENSE DURING THE PERIOD. LOCALS IN GISENYI AND ADJOINING AREAS STAGED A DEMONSTRATION AGAINST UNAMIR. THE INCIDENT STARTED WITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A RD BLOCK IN THE GEN AREA OF NYUNDO (GR 2411) BY THE DEMONSTRATORS. A PASSING UNAMIR MP VEHICLE HAD ITS WINDOWS SHATTERED. BETWEEN 0745 HRS AND 0900 HRS, THE CROWD MOVED FROM THE FRONT OF THE HR HOUSE TO THE MERIDIEN HOTEL CHANTING SLOGANS AND CARRYING PLACARDS ASKING UNAMIR TO GO HOME. UP TO THIS POINT THE CROWD WAS GENERALLY PEACEFUL AND WELL CONTROLLED BY THE GENDARMES AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES PRESENT. AFTER 1030 HRS, THE MOOD OF THE CROWD BECAME AGGRESSIVE AND TWO MILOBS WERE SUDDENLY ATTACKED

AND THEIR HANDSETS WERE SNATCHED FROM THEM. MILOB TEAMS ALSO SUSTAINED LIGHT INJURIES FROM STONES THROWN AT THEM BY THE CROWD. THE GENDARMES PRESENT WARNED MILOBS AT GUN POINT NOT TO HURT ANY OF THE DEMONSTRATORS IN ATTEMPTING TO RETRIEVE THEIR MOTOROLA HANDSETS FROM THE CROWD. THE RPA LO HAD EARLIER BEEN CONTACTED AND BRIEFED BY THE MILOBS AROUND 0800 HRS AND HE HAD PROMISED TO TAKE NECESSARY ACTION, HOWEVER HE COULD NOT BE CONTACTED WHEN THE SITUATION STARTED TO DETERIORATE. THE GENDARMES WERE PRESENT DURING THE WHOLE INCIDENT BUT DID NOTHING TO CONTROL THE SITUATION EVEN AFTER BEING ASKED TO DO SO BY MILOBS. AT THE TIME OF SUBMISSION OF THIS REPORT, A ROAD BLOCK HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED AT NYUNDO (GR 2411) BY CIVILIANS AND 59/60 REFUGEES. UNAMIR VEHICLES ARE NOT ALLOWED TO PROCEED. OPERATIONS HAVE BEEN SUSPENDED ALONG THAT ROUTE UNTIL THE SITUATION IMPROVES. NO PATROLS COULD BE CONDUCTED IN THE SECTOR DUE TO THE INCIDENT.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO GIKOMERO, BUTAMWA AND KANOMBE COMMUNES REPORTED THAT THE BUTAMWA MEDICAL CENTRE OPERATED BY MEDICINE DU MONDE, WAS FOUND CLOSED WITH PATIENTS SITTING OUTSIDE. INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE HOSPITAL STAFF WERE AFRAID TO RETURN TO WORK BECAUSE ONE OF THEIR VEHICLES WAS BLOWN UP IN RECENT MINE ACCIDENT IN CYANGUGU AND ONE OF THE STAFF WAS KILLED IN A SHOOTING INCIDENT. THE NGO INTENDS TO KEEP THE CENTRE CLOSED UNTIL THEIR DEMANDS FOR ESCORTS FOR THEIR MOBILE MEDICAL TEAMS ARE MET. THE SITUATION IN ALL OTHER AREAS PATROLLED WAS NORMAL.

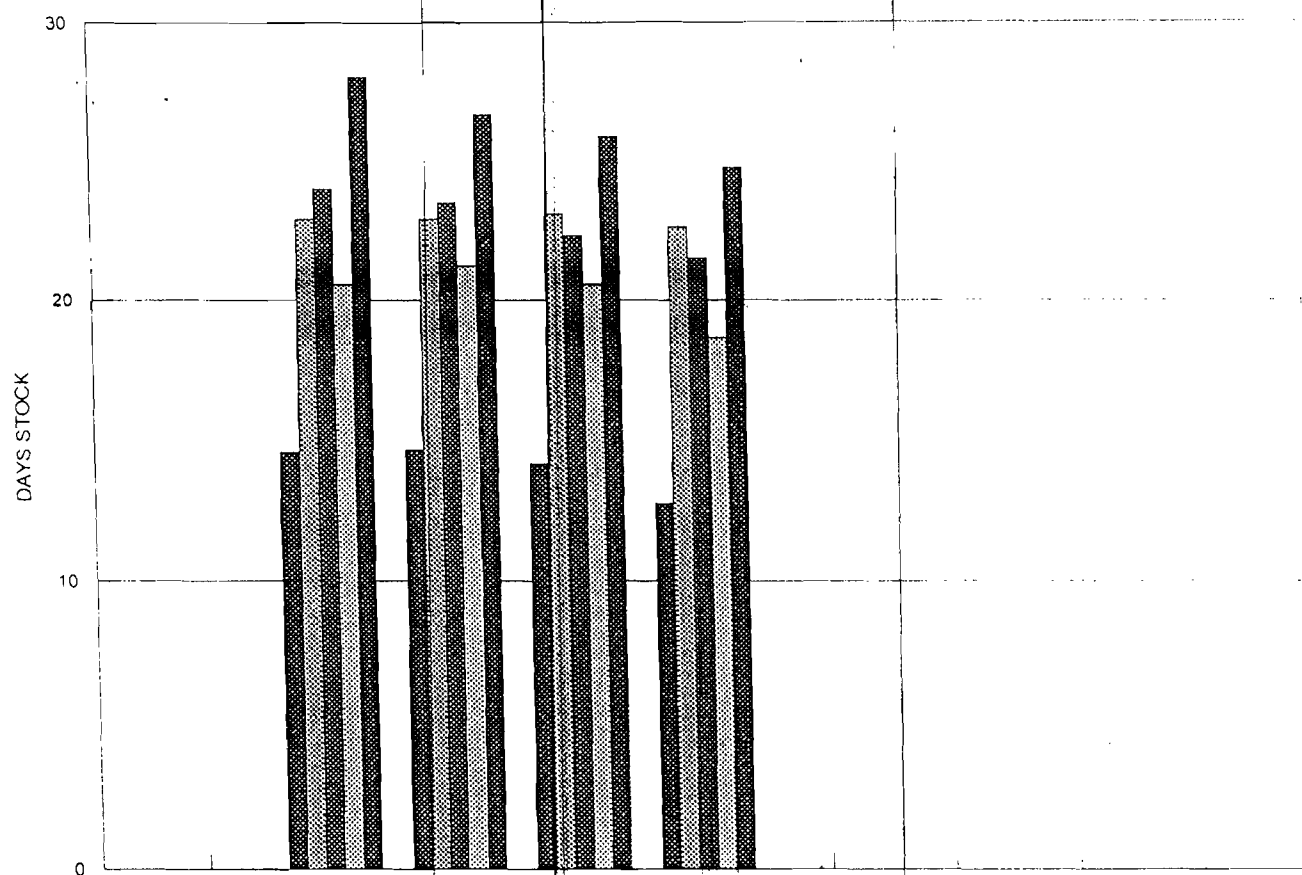

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B TUNBATT TRUCK RETURNING FROM GISENYI TO KABALI WAS ATTACKED AT RUBAVU GR 2218 BY ABOUT 300 LOCALS WITH STONES AND STICKS. THE VEH HAD ITS WINDOWS, DOOR AND MIRROR SMASHED BY THE LOCALS WHO WERE DEMONSTRATING AGAINST UNAMIR. THE DEMONSTRATORS ALSO BLOCKED THE ROAD PREVENTING MOVEMENT OF UNAMIR VEHS TO GISENYI.

C. MILOB IN SECTOR 6 REPORTED THAT THE MEDICAL CENTRE AT BUTAMWA GR 0376 WHICH IS SUPPORTED BY MEDICINE DU MONDE WAS CLOSED WHILE MANY SICK PEOPLE WERE WAITING TO BE TREATED. PTL RETURNED TO KIGALI TO FIND OUT WHY THE CENTRE WAS CLOSED. IT LEARNED THAT THE STAFF (NGOs) WERE AFRAID OF LAND MINES AS ONE OF THEIR VEHS WAS BLOWN UP RECENTLY IN CYANGUGU AND ANOTHER KILLED IN A SHOOTING INCIDENT. MEDICINE DU MONDE HAS THEREFORE REQUESTED FOR ESCORTS FOR THEIR MOBILE MEDICAL TEAMS.

D. IN SECTOR 4B, TAC HQ REPORTED THAT THREE POSTERS WERE PLACED ON THE REAR GATE OF THE HQ BY UNKNOWN PERSONS. THE POSTERS WHICH CARRIED ANTI - UNAMIR MESSAGES WERE APPARENTLY TIMED TO COINCIDE WITH THE FC'S VISIT TO THE SECTOR. MESSAGES ON THE POSTERS WERE WRITTEN IN KINYARWANDA. THEY TRANSLATED:

(A) MILOB PTLs REPORTED THAT THE BOURGEMESTRES OF RUTONGO AND KIYOMBE COMMUNES WERE REPORTED TO BE TRYING PETTY CRIMINAL CASES IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES. SENTENCES RANGED FROM 1 HR TO 7 DAYS OF HARD LABOUR. THERE WERE 63 INMATES IN THE COMMUNAL HOLDING FACILITY IN RUTONGO COMMUNE. MILOBS WERE HOWEVER PREVENTED FROM SEEING THEM.

(B) THE SECTOR COMD HELD COORDINATING CONFERENCE WITH ICRC REPS IN THE SECTOR DURING THE PERIOD.

(C) UNICEF DISTRIBUTED 140 PLASTIC SHEETS TO 5 PRIMARY SCHOOLS IN THE KIYOMBE COMMUNE FOR USE AS TEMPORARY ROOFING MATERIAL.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOB PATROLS REPORTED THAT THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KAYONZA INFORMED MILOBS THAT HE WAS HOLDING DAILY MEETINGS WITH THE POPULATION TO DISCUSS THE GENOCIDE. THE PATROLS WERE ALSO INFORMED OF A GRAND MEETING TO BE HELD IN RUTONDE ON 14 APR 95 TO MARK THE END OF THE COMMEMORATION OF THE GENOCIDE.

(C) INVESTIGATIONS WERE CONDUCTED INTO THE INCIDENT AT BWERANKA (GR 708618) IN WHICH A LOCAL WHO HAD ALLEGEDLY BEEN THREATENED SOUGHT PROTECTION WITH GHANBATT.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-KIBUYE/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS FOLLOWED UP THE CASE OF A TEACHER FROM THE MUSMBIRA COMMUNE WHO HAD SOUGHT THE PROTECTION OF UNAMIR AND HAD BEEN PERSUADED TO RETURN HOME. THOUGH IT WAS REPORTED THAT THERE WERE NO WITNESSES AGAINST HIM AT PUBLIC MEETING HELD ON 09 APR 95, THE TEAM WAS SURPRISED TO LEARN THAT SEVERAL WITNESSES HAVE NOW COME FORWARD ALLEGING THAT THE TEACHER HAD STOLEN COWS, DESTROYED HOUSES, WAS INVOLVED IN RUMOUR-MONGERING AND HAD BEEN PERSONALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DEATH OF 130 PERSONS. MILOBS ARE OF THE OPINION THAT THESE ALLEGATIONS ARE MOSTLY UNTRUE.

(C) MILOB PATROLLED MUSHUBATI COMMUNE (GR 6970) TO ASSESS THE CONDITIONS IN THE COMMUNAL PRISON. THERE WERE 38 INMATES IN THE PRISON. AN INTERVIEW WITH THE BOURGEMESTRE ON THE REVIEW PROCESS CONVINCED MILOBS THAT HE HAD LITTLE UNDERSTANDING OF THE RULES OF EVIDENCE. THE PATROL ALSO CHECKED ON 3 MEN IN GIKOMERO SECTOR (GR 6472) WHO HAD GONE BACK HOME AFTER SEEKING UNAMIR PROTECTION. ALL 3 PERSONS WERE LOCATED AND WERE SAFE. IN THE MUSENYI SECTOR (GR 6972), THE PATROL WAS INFORMED THAT 2 ELDERLY MEN WERE BEING HELD FOR CRIMES ALLEGEDLY COMMITTED BY THEIR SONS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(D) MILOBS PROVIDED TRANSPORT FOR THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF RUTSIRO (GR 3183) TO KAGANO (GR 3683). THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE ADDRESSED THE LOCALS ON THE GENOCIDE.

(E) MILOBS INVESTIGATED A DOUBLE MURDER REPORTED TO HAVE OCCURRED IN MWENDO ON 30 MAR 95. THE BOURGEMESTRE INFORMED THE PATROL THAT HIS OWN INVESTIGATIONS HAD REVEALED THAT THOUGH THE ATTACKERS WERE IN UNIFORM, THEY WERE PROBABLY IDPs FROM ONE OF THE CAMPS. MILOBS STRONGLY SUSPECT RPA INVOLVEMENT IN THE INCIDENT. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(F) INVESTIGATIONS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED INTO REPORT OF A MURDER ON 9 APR 95 IN KAYENZI (GR 3470). A LOCAL REPORTED TO THE PATROL THAT THE DECEASED HAD STRUCK AN RPA SOLDIER WHILE BEING INTERROGATED AND BEATEN IN KAYENZI. THE RPA BN COMD THEN ORDERED HIM SHOT. THE RPA BN COMD HOWEVER DISMISSED THE INCIDENT AS A LOCALLY MOTIVATED MURDER WITH NO RPA INVOLVEMENT.

(G) MILOB PATROLS FROM SECTOR 3 WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS IN GIKOMERO SECTOR (GR 6472) THAT SEEDS DELIVERED IN JANUARY 1995 BY CARE INTERNATIONAL HAD FAILED TO GERMINATE. THERE IS THEREFORE FOOD SHORTAGE IN THE COMMUNE. MILOBS TO LIAISE WITH NGOS TO ORGANISE FOOD AID AS A MATTER OF URGENCY.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) MILOB PATROLS TO REMERA BORDER POST REPORTED THAT THE TWO TEACHERS WHO CROSSED THE BORDER FROM ZAIRE TO CHECK ON THE RE-OPENING OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS AT RUNYOMBI HAD BEEN TRANSPORTED TO GIKONGORO FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS.

(C) MILOBS MONITORED THE EVACUATION OF IDPs FROM THE KIBEHO CAMP. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE ALSO

CONDUCTED IN RUKONDO AND KINYAKAMARA COMMUNES. THE PATROL REPORTED THE MOVEMENT OF AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF PEOPLE INTO THE DPCs DUE TO RUMOURS ABOUT THE SECURITY SITUATION.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) RECEIVED THE VISIT OF FC AND DCMO.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS TO MBAZI COMMUNE (GR 7117) REPORTED THAT THE BOURGEMESTRE WAS REGISTERING THE INHABITANTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ISSUING THEM ID CARDS.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS REPORTED THAT WFP TRUCKS WERE STILL BEING PREVENTED FROM CROSSING THE BORDER TO BUKAVU. THE DRIVERS HAD BECOME IMPATIENT AND THREATENED TO RETURN TO KIGALI. THE WFP REP IN CYANGUGU ADVISED THEM TO REMAIN TILL 13 APR 95 FOR DIRECTIVES FROM WFP-KIGALI. MILOBS ASSESS THAT THE PREVENTION OF THE TRUCKS FROM CROSSING THE BORDER WILL LEAD TO FURTHER UNREST AND BANDITRY IN THE AREAS ALONG THE BORDER WITH ZAIRE.

(C) ABOUT 75 MOSQUITO NETS HAVE BEEN ARRANGED FOR THE MUSRICORDE ORPHANAGE IN THE SECTOR. IT IS EXPECTED THAT THEIR DELIVERY TO THE ORPHANAGE WILL TAKE PLACE ON 13 APR 95. ARRANGEMENTS MADE FOR AUSMED TO FUMIGATE THE AREA OF THE ORPHANAGE.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED GENERALLY TENSE DURING THE PERIOD. LOCALS IN GISENYI AND ADJOINING AREAS STAGED A DEMONSTRATION AGAINST UNAMIR. THE INCIDENT STARTED WITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A RD BLOCK IN THE GEN AREA OF NYUNDO (GR 2411) BY THE DEMONSTRATORS. A PASSING UNAMIR MP VEHICLE HAD ITS WINDOWS SHATTERED. BETWEEN 0745 HRS AND 0900 HRS, THE CROWD MOVED FROM THE FRONT OF THE HR HOUSE TO THE MERIDIEN HOTEL CHANTING SLOGANS AND CARRYING PLACARDS ASKING UNAMIR TO GO HOME. UP TO THIS POINT THE CROWD WAS GENERALLY PEACEFUL AND WELL CONTROLLED BY THE GENDARMES AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES PRESENT. AFTER 1030 HRS, THE MOOD OF THE CROWD BECAME AGGRESSIVE AND TWO MILOBS WERE SUDDENLY ATTACKED

AND THEIR HANDSETS WERE SNATCHED FROM THEM. MILOB TEAMS ALSO SUSTAINED LIGHT INJURIES FROM STONES THROWN AT THEM BY THE CROWD. THE GENDARMES PRESENT WARNED MILOBS AT GUN POINT NOT TO HURT ANY OF THE DEMONSTRATORS IN ATTEMPTING TO RETRIEVE THEIR MOTOROLA HANDSETS FROM THE CROWD. THE RPA LO HAD EARLIER BEEN CONTACTED AND BRIEFED BY THE MILOBS AROUND 0800 HRS AND HE HAD PROMISED TO TAKE NECESSARY ACTION, HOWEVER HE COULD NOT BE CONTACTED WHEN THE SITUATION STARTED TO DETERIORATE. THE GENDARMES WERE PRESENT DURING THE WHOLE INCIDENT BUT DID NOTHING TO CONTROL THE SITUATION EVEN AFTER BEING ASKED TO DO SO BY MILOBS. AT THE TIME OF SUBMISSION OF THIS REPORT, A ROAD BLOCK HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED AT NYUNDO (GR 2411) BY CIVILIANS AND 59/60 REFUGEES. UNAMIR VEHICLES ARE NOT ALLOWED TO PROCEED. OPERATIONS HAVE BEEN SUSPENDED ALONG THAT ROUTE UNTIL THE SITUATION IMPROVES. NO PATROLS COULD BE CONDUCTED IN THE SECTOR DUE TO THE INCIDENT.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO GIKOMERO, BUTAMWA AND KANOMBE COMMUNES REPORTED THAT THE BUTAMWA MEDICAL CENTRE OPERATED BY MEDICINE DU MONDE, WAS FOUND CLOSED WITH PATIENTS SITTING OUTSIDE. INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE HOSPITAL STAFF WERE AFRAID TO RETURN TO WORK BECAUSE ONE OF THEIR VEHICLES WAS BLOWN UP IN RECENT MINE ACCIDENT IN CYANGUGU AND ONE OF THE STAFF WAS KILLED IN A SHOOTING INCIDENT. THE NGO INTENDS TO KEEP THE CENTRE CLOSED UNTIL THEIR DEMANDS FOR ESCORTS FOR THEIR MOBILE MEDICAL TEAMS ARE MET. THE SITUATION IN ALL OTHER AREAS PATROLLED WAS NORMAL.

(2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 47 OUT-PATIENTS AND CURRENTLY HOLDING 15 IN-PATIENTS.

(3) DEN AND PVNT MED ELMS REMAINED DEPLOYED AT GIKONGORO PROV HLTH SPT TO ZAMBATT OVER PERIOD 10 14

APR 95. 24 DEN PATIENTS WERE TREATED. PVNT MED ELM RETURNED TO KIGALI AFTER COMPLETING IT'S TASKING.

(4) A RIFLE SECTION PROV CONVOY PROTECTION FROM KIGALI TO KAGITUMBA IN SPT OF FHO/SO FOODSTUFFS VISIT TO KAMPALA DURING THE PERIOD 12 - 14 APR 95. THE SECTION RETURNED TO KIGALI AFTER ESCORTING THE OFFRS TO THE UGANDAN BORDER.

(5) AUSMED TRANSFERRED A SERIOUSLY ILL 69-YR-OLD MALE ITALIAN NATIONAL TO KIA. PATIENT WAS STRAT CASEVAC TO ITALY BY A CIV CONTRACTOR COORD BY ITALIAN CONSULATE. MBR WAS EMPLOYED IN RWANDA BY INTER SOS AND WAS ADMITTED TO AUSMED ON 8 APR 95 AFTER A VEH ACCIDENT IN GITARAMA.

(6) ENGR ELM CONDUCTED EOD TASKS AT GIKONDO GR 0882.

(7) RIFLE COY ELM PROV SECURITY AT THE MIL BKS AND CHK.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE KIA DURING THE PERIOD. A TOTAL OF 17 DEPARTED AND ARRIVED KIA.

O. UN MP COY.

(1) UNAMIR MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION SECURITY TO THE RWANDESE LOCAL AND THE NIBATT SOLDIER SUSPECTED OF MURDER.

(2) ON 12 APR 95, AT APPROX 0640 HRS, TWO MPs AND TWO TUNBATT SOLDIERS WERE ATTACKED BY ABOUT 300 RWANDESE LOCALS ABOUT 200 TO 300 METERS AWAY FROM RPA CHECKPOINT OUTSIDE GISENYI TOWN. UNAMIR MPs WERE IN GISENYI TO INVESTIGATE AN ACCIDENT AND WERE BEING ESCORTED TO MUTARA BY TWO TUNBATT SOLDIERS. 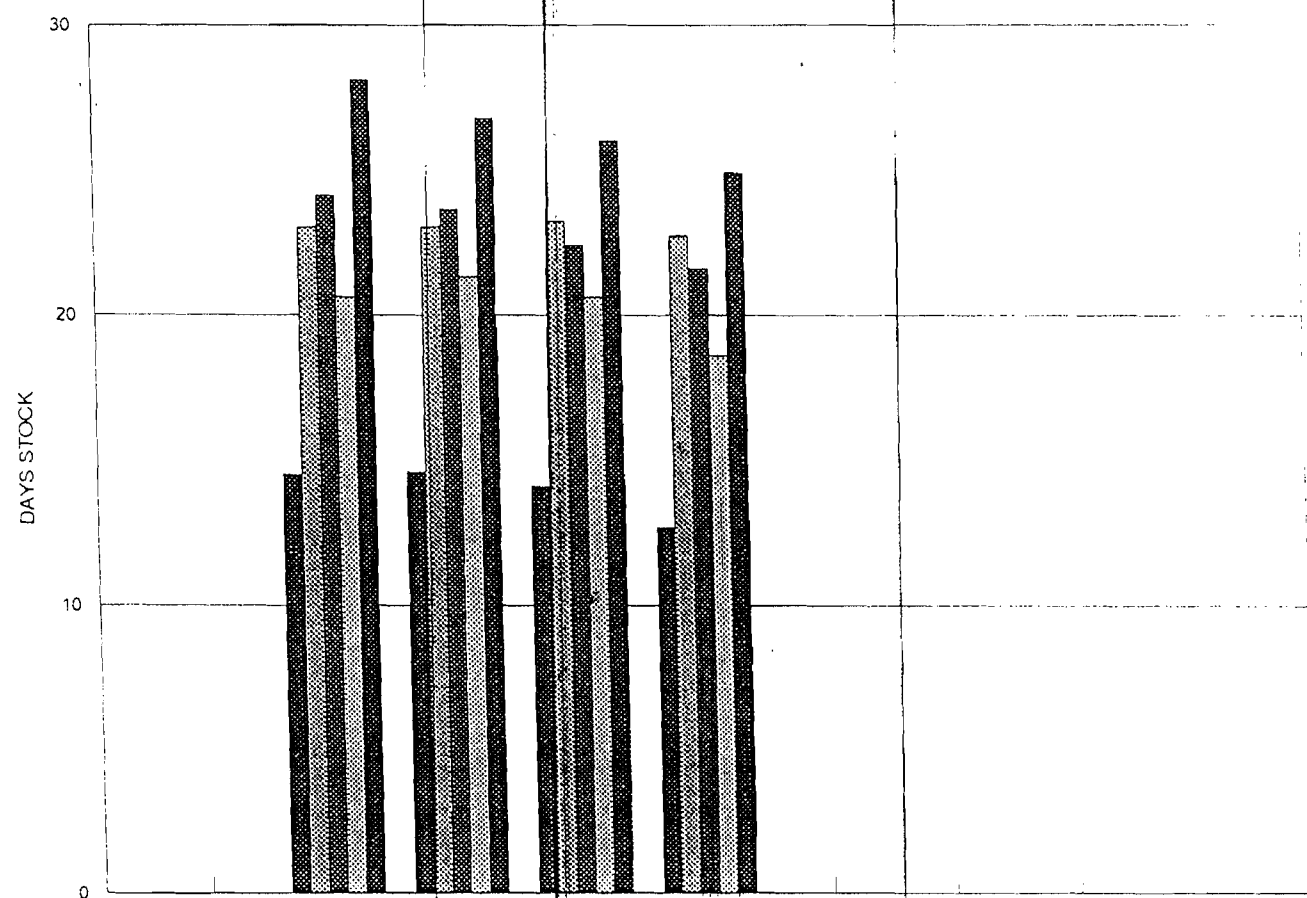

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B. THERE WAS A DEMONSTRATION AGAINST UNAMIR. ABOUT 2,000 DEMONSTRATORS, MAINLY YOUNG MEN AND CHILDREN, STARTED FROM KACYIRU MARKET 115813 AT 1330 HRS. THE CROWD MOVED TOWARDS UNAMIR HQ AT 1635HRS AND GATHERED OUTSIDE THE MAIN ENTRANCE FOR ABOUT AN HOUR AT ABOUT 1720 HRS. THEY HELD ANTI-UNAMIR BANNERS AND PLACARDS AND CHANTED ANTI-UNAMIR SLOGANS. SOME LEADERS INCLUDING THE PREFECT OF KIGALI ADDRESSED THE CROWD. SPEECHES CENTRED MOSTLY ON THE GENOCIDE. UNAMIR, UN AND THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY AT LARGE WERE ACCUSED OF HAVING DONE NOTHING TO STOP THE GENOCIDE ALTHOUGH THEY KNEW IT HAD BEEN PLANNED. SOME OF THE PLACARDS READ:

- (1) 5,000 PERSONS LEFT BY UNAMIR; KILLED AT NYANZA.
- (2) UNAMIR FORCES ARE ONLY RUNNING AFTER OUR SISTERS.

- (5) UNAMIR GO BACK AND LEAVE US ALONE.
- (6) BOUTROS TO HELL WITH YOU.
- (7) YOU DID NOTHING WHEN WE REQUIRED YOUR PRESENCE, NOW YOUR PRESENCE IS USELESS.
- (8) UNAMIR = GENOCIDE.
- (9) UN, WE HIGHLY PROTEST AGAINST AN OCCUPATIONAL FORCE IN OUR COUNTRY RWANDA. USELESS IN THE PAST, USELESS NOW, USELESS IN THE FUTURE.
- (10) BOUTROS AND MITTERAND SIDED TO DESTROY US.
- (11) SHAME TO UN.
- (12) MINUAR, LA DECEPTION DU PEUPLE RWANDAIS.

DEMONSTRATION WAS PEACEFUL WITH EFFECTIVE CONTROL BY GENDARMES AND RPA.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS CALM ALTHOUGH THE BORDER AREAS AND SELECTED COMMUNES REMAIN TENSE.

B. THERE WAS A DEMONSTRATION AGAINST UNAMIR. ABOUT 2,000 DEMONSTRATORS, MAINLY YOUNG MEN AND CHILDREN, STARTED FROM KACYIRU MARKET 115813 AT 1330 HRS. THE CROWD MOVED TOWARDS UNAMIR HQ AT 1635HRS AND GATHERED OUTSIDE THE MAIN ENTRANCE FOR ABOUT AN HOUR AT ABOUT 1720 HRS. THEY HELD ANTI-UNAMIR BANNERS AND PLACARDS AND CHANTED ANTI-UNAMIR SLOGANS. SOME LEADERS INCLUDING THE PREFECT OF KIGALI ADDRESSED THE CROWD. SPEECHES CENTRED MOSTLY ON THE GENOCIDE. - (8) UNAMIR = GENOCIDE.
- (9) UN, WE HIGHLY PROTEST AGAINST AN OCCUPATIONAL FORCE IN OUR COUNTRY RWANDA. USELESS IN THE PAST, USELESS NOW, USELESS IN THE FUTURE.
- (10) BOUTROS AND MITTERAND SIDED TO DESTROY US.
- (11) SHAME TO UN.
- (12) MINUAR, LA DECEPTION DU PEUPLE RWANDAIS.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 03 APR TO 09 APR 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL:

A. IN SECTOR 3B, MALICOY AND MILOBS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 100 ROUNDS OF SMALL ARMS WERE FIRED IN GITARAMA PRISON ON 03 APRIL 95 WHEN PRISONERS TRIED TO ESCAPE. ONE LOCAL WAS KILLED AND THREE INJURED. INVESTIGATION IS IN PROGRESS.

B. MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C INFORMED THAT THE RWANDAN BORDER HAS BEEN CLOSED TO FOOD CARRYING TRUCKS. ETHIOBATT PROVIDED SY TO WFP VEHS.

C. IN SECTOR 4C, ABOUT 10 BOATS WERE REPORTEDLY ENGAGED BY THE RPA AT ISHARA GR 0044. THIS IS THE LARGEST REPORTED ATTEMPTED LANDING. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT DUE TO RUMOURS AND INSECURITY SITUATIONS IN THE AREA LOCALS WERE COMING IN LARGE NUMBERS TO THE GENERAL HOSPITAL AND MILOBS RESIDENCE SEEKING PROTECTION.

D. A LOCAL CHIEF AND HIS SON WHO WERE RESIDENTS OF KIGONDO COMMUNE GR 580445, WERE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED BY RPA SOLDIERS WHO HAD COME FROM GITARAMA. MOTIVE FOR THE KILLING IS NOT KNOWN.

E. TUNBATT IN SECTOR 5 REPORTED THAT THE RPA BRIGADE COMD IN THE SECTOR HAS REQUESTED THE BATTALION TO VACATE ITS LOCATION AT BUSOGO BY 12 APRIL 95.

F. VIOLENCE RUMOURED TO TAKE PLACE AROUND ANNIVERSARY OF CIVIL WAR DID NOT MATERIALIZE. MANY CITIZENS, ALTHOUGH STILL SOMEWHAT APPREHENSIVE, ARE RELIEVED AND ARE SLOWLY RETURNING TO THEIR HOMES.

G. CONTRARY TO WIDE SPECULATIONS ON THE 6/7 APR 95 NO SIGNIFICANT INCIDENT OF INSECURITY OCCURRED IN KIGALI OR REPORTED IN SECTORS. SOLEMNITY MARKED THE TWO DAYS AS EXHUMED BODIES OF VICTIMS OF THE WAR WERE CEREMONIALLY REINTERRED AT GOVT DESIGNATED LOCS. AS A MARK OF RESPECT FOR THE DEAD, MARKETS AND STORES WERE CLOSED AND TRAFFIC WAS GENERALLY LIGHT.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. SEE SRSG'S WEEKLY POLITICAL UPDATE SUBMITTED SEPARATELY.

3. MILITARY

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA.

(A) IN SECTOR 3, THE RPA BDE COMD WAS ANNOYED BY THE BBC REPORT CLAIMING THAT HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS WERE DENIED ACCESS TO THE GITARAMA PRISON. IN FACT HE AND HIS OFFICIALS WERE MOST COOPERATIVE DURING THE INVESTIGATION AND TOOK INITIATIVE TO ESCORT UNAMIR PERSONNEL TO THE PRISON TO SEE THINGS FOR THEMSELVES.

(B) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT ON 06 APRIL 95, AN RPA MOBILE PATROL WAS STONED BY IDPs IN KIBEHO. RPA SOLDIERS OPENED FIRE INJURING A WOMAN. SEVERAL IDPs WERE INJURED WHEN THEY TRIED TO PASS THROUGH A BARBED WIRE FENCING TO SEEK PROTECTION IN ZAMBATT COMPOUND. ZAMBATT TROOPS SPEEDILY BROUGHT THE SITUATION UNDER CONTROL.

(C) SECTOR 5 MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA BN COMD DEMANDED THE IMMEDIATE WITHDRAWAL OF THE TUNBATT PLATOON AT KORA PROVIDING SECURITY TO THE WFP WAREHOUSE. THE RPA COMD STATED THAT RESPONSIBILITY TO PROVIDE SECURITY FOR THE WAREHOUSE WAS THAT OF THE RPA. RPA LO IN UNAMIR HQ INFORMED.

(D) THERE WAS INCREASED INCIDENCE OF ENCOUNTERS BETWEEN THE RPA AND FRGF TROOPS IN SECTOR 4C. SOME OF THE BANDITS POSSIBLY DID NOT RETURN TO IJWI ISLAND AND RPA CONDUCTED SEARCHES FOR THEM.

(E) IN SECTOR 2, A LOCAL INFORMED GHANBATT ON 09 APRIL 95, OF THE ARREST OF 4 LOCAL HUTUS BY THE SY COMMITTEE OF BWERANKA. ONE OF THE DETAINEES REPORTEDLY DIED IN CUSTODY. THE LOCAL ALSO REQUESTED FOR UNAMIR PROTECTION FOR THE HUTUS IN BWERANKA. MILOBS, HR AND RPA INFORMED. GHANBATT AND RPA REPS FROM KIBUNGO ARE INVESTIGATING THE REPORT.

(2) FRGF ETHIOBATT INFORMED MILOBS SECTOR 4C THAT THE FRGF HAD THREATENED TO MINE THE MAIN ACCESS ROUTE FROM BUGARAMA TO CYANGUGU AND THE ROAD THROUGH NYUNGWE FOREST.

(3) MILITIA NTR.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR

(A) ON 03 APRIL 95 , THE FC CONDUCTED NORMAL MILITARY BUSINESS. HE ALSO GAVE TWO PRESS INTERVIEWS.

(B) ON 04 APRIL 95, THE FC MET THE SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE OAU AND BRIEFED HIM ON PAST AND FUTURE UNAMIR OPERATIONS. LATER, HE ATTENDED THE SENEGAL NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATION IN BUTARE.

(C) ON 05 APRIL 95, THE FC ALONG WITH THE SRSG GAVE A PRESS CONFERENCE FOCUSED ON THE ACTIVITIES PERFORMED BY UNAMIR AND THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL. LATER, THE FC VISITED KIBUYE, MALAWICOY AND THE LOCAL PRISON.

(D) ON 06 APRIL 95, THE FC MONITORED THE OPERATION INVOLVING TRANSFER OF PRISONERS FROM GITARAMA PRISON TO GISENYI. IN THE AFTERNOON, HE MET THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR AND HIS MILITARY ATTACHE TO DISCUSS THE UPCOMING EVENTS.

(E) ON 8 APR 95, THE FC VISITED SECTOR 5 AND PAID COURTESY VISIT TO MRS. CARR - AN AMERICAN CITIZEN WHO HAD BEEN LIVING IN THE REGION FOR MANY YEARS. LATER HE MET WITH MR. PRONK AND THE SRSG FOR A STORMING SESSION ON RWANDA AND ITS FUTURE. HE ALSO MET WITH MAJOR GENERAL VALERI N. DEMIN FROM THE RUSSIAN ARMY WHO WAS VISITING UNAMIR ON A FACT-FINDING MISSION.

(F) A TEAM OF STAFF OFFICERS FROM UNAMIR HQ HELD DISCUSSIONS AT TAC HQ ON PLANS BY THE GOVERNMENT TO CLOSE THE IDP CAMPS AND THE ROLE UNAMIR COULD PLAY IN ENSURING THAT THE PLAN WAS CARRIED OUT IN A PEACEFUL MANNER. PRESENT AT THE DISCUSSIONS WERE CO ZAMBATT, A REP FROM IOC, MILOBS SECTORS' 3B AND 4B AND TAC HQ STAFF.

(2) SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(A) NIBATT II ADVANCE PARTY ARRIVED ON 03 APRIL 95. 45 ARRIVALS WERE RETURNED TO NIGERIA FOR NOT BEING IN POSSESSION OF PASSPORTS.

(B) A TOTAL OF 95 LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN MED CENTRE DURING THE WEEK.

(3) SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(A) RPA ARRESTED AND DETAINED TWO GHANBATT SOLDIERS AT RUHUNDA GR 4691 FOR NOT HAVING ID CARDS ON THEM. THEY WERE LATER RELEASED WHEN THEY WERE IDENTIFIED AS UNAMIR SOLDIERS.

(B) PTLs TO KANZENZE COMMUNE REPORTED THAT LOCALS WERE BEING HARASSED ON THEIR FARMS BY UNIDENTIFIED UNIFORMED PERSONS. THIS HAS RESULTED IN LOCALS DESERTING THEIR HOMES AT NIGHT. NIGHT PTLs INTENSIFIED IN THE AREA.

(C) RWANDESE LOCALS ON BOARD 2 SUZUKI VEHICLES PLACED A STICKER BEARING A WARNING TO UNAMIR TO BE READY TO GO HOME ON A UNAMIR APC PARKED NEAR GHANBATT HQ.

(4) SECTOR 3A (MALAWICOY).

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(B) TREATED A TOTAL OF 78 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(5) SECTOR 3B (MALICOY).

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) PROVIDED TPT TO LWF TO DISTRIBUTE RELIEF ITEMS AND TO THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA FOR ROAD REPAIRS IN GITARAMA.

(C) MED STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 23 LOCALS DURING THE WEEK.

(6) SECTOR 4A (ZAMBATT).

(A) IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE NUMBER OF DPs IN KIBEHO CAMP WAS INCREASING EVERYDAY. UNCONFIRMED REPORTS INDICATE THAT THE RPA INTENDS TO MOVE DPs OUT OF THE CAMP BY FORCE BETWEEN 15 AND 20 APRIL 95.

(B) MED STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 274 LOCALS DURING THE WEEK.

(C) IN COMMEMORATION OF THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE MASSACRE, LOCALS ATTENDED MEMORIAL SERVICES IN VARIOUS COMMUNES IN THE SECTOR.

(7) SECTOR 4B (SENBATT).

(A) ESCORTED CARITAS TEAM FROM BN HQ TO CARE MONASTERY AND RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI BORDER TO BUTARE UNDER UNHCR SUPERVISION.

(B) PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 99 CIVILIANS DURING THE WEEK.

(8) SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(A) AT GATARE GR 1345, FRGF SOLDIERS REPORTEDLY KILLED A LOCAL AND STOLE LIVESTOCK FROM THE AREA.

(B) TREATED A TOTAL OF 06 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(C) 5 WFP TRUCKS LOADED WITH FOOD ITEMS PROCEEDING TO BUTARE WERE DENIED ACCESS AT AN RPA CHECKPOINT IN KAMEMBE. THE VEHs WERE LATER ALLOWED TO PROCEED AFTER NEGOTIATIONS BETWN ETHIOBATT OPS OFFR AND

LOCAL RPA CMD.

(9) SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT).

(A) PATROLS TO MUTANDA GR 6424 REPORTED THAT THE LOCALS HAD CAPTURED SOME BANDITS IN UNIFORM. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(B) MEDICAL STAFF PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 528 RWANDESE PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(C) RPA HELD A SY MEETING WITH INHABITANTS AT RUHENGARI ON MONDAY 3 APR 95. THE LOCALS WERE WARNED NOT TO ACCOMMODATE MILITIA AND NOT TO HIDE WPNS IN THEIR HOUSES. THEY WERE ALSO ADVISED TO POINT OUT TO THEIR LOCAL HEADS ANY SUSPECTED PERSON.

(10) SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).

(A) ON 06 APRIL 95, 36 LOCALS SOUGHT PROTECTION BETWEEN 2000-2300 HRS. THE LOCALS LATER RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES. A SHOT WAS ALSO HEARD NEAR THE UN SERVICE STATION.

(B) PATROL TO GIKOMERO COMMUNE OBSERVED A DETENTION FACILITY IN WHICH APPROX 200 PRISONERS WERE HOUSED.

(C) PROVIDED 7 TCVs TO SHYOGWE ORPHANAGE FOR SHIFTING 400 ORPHANS AND STAFF TO NYANZA GR 7140.

(D) MED STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 295 LOCALS AND UNAMIR CIVILIAN STAFF AT BN HQ KIGALI DURING THE WEEK.

(11) MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY STABLE DURING THE PERIOD.

(A) POLITICAL. ON 07 APRIL 95, THERE WERE POLITICAL RALLIES REPORTED IN MOST OF THE COMMUNES IN THE COUNTRY. MOST OF THE SPEAKERS SPOKE ABOUT UNITY AND RECONCILIATION AND PLEADED THAT ANOTHER GENOCIDE SHOULD NOT BE ALLOWED TO TAKE PLACE IN RWANDA.

(B) BORDERS. ALL THE BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC EXCEPT GISENYI BORDER POST WHICH WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERS.

(C) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND

MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(D) IN SECTOR 1 - BYUMBA. SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE GOAL (NGO) COMPLETED A NEW HEALTH CENTRE AT MULINDI WHICH WILL OPERATE FROM MAY 95. UNICEF HAS DONATED 140 PLASTIC SHEETS TO BE USED AS TEMPORARY ROOFS FOR THE PRIMARY SCHOOLS AT KIYOMBE COMMUNE.

(E) IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO. MILOBS MONITORED A PEACEFUL MARCH OF ABOUT 5,000 CIVILIANS FROM THE OFFICE OF THE SOUS PREFECT IN RWAMAGANA GR 487846 THROUGH KIGERAMA GR 6170, GISHALI JUNCTION GR 4658 AND RUTONDE GR 4884. THE CEREMONY INCLUDED A MEMORIAL SERVICE AT THE RWAMAGANA SCHOOL PARK FOR BOTH CHRISTIANS AND MOSLEMS AND A BURIAL OF 70 CORPSES AT SOVU GR 478788. THE SOUS PREFECT ADDRESSED THE GATHERING AND URGED THEM TO FORGET THE PAST. HE ALSO APPEALED TO UNAMIR TO BRING TO JUSTICE PERSONS WHO HAD TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE AND WERE HIDING UNDER THEIR PROTECTION.

(F) IN SECTOR 3 - GITARAMA.

I. MILOBS RECEIVED SEVERAL REPORTS OF MASS ARRESTS BY THE RPA. THE SPATE OF ARRESTS HAVE BECOME ALARMING IN THE SECTOR AS THE REPORTS HAVE BEEN CONFIRMED BY MILOBS AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS. THIS HAS RESULTED IN AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF LOCALS SEEKING PROTECTION.

II. MILOBS PATROLS TO BWAKIRA GR 5061 WERE INFORMED OF MASS ARRESTS AND ALLEGED KILLINGS BY THE RPA. THE PATROLS WERE ALSO INFORMED THAT THE TUTSIS WERE STEALING LIVESTOCK FROM HUTUS ON THE PRETEXT THAT THEIR GOODS HAD BEEN STOLEN BY THE HUTUS DURING THE WAR.

III. A MILOB PTL TO THE MURAMBA GR 2056 AND NYAKIBINGO GR 2656 SECTORS OF GISOVU COMMUNE WERE INFORMED ABOUT LARGE SCALE ARRESTS BY RPA. AROUND 50 FAMILIES HAD LEFT FOR DP CAMPS SOUTH OF GIKONGORO AREA. THE LOCALS WERE HESITANT TALKING TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL BECAUSE THEY FEARED THEY WOULD BE ARRESTED BY THE RPA.

IV. A JOINT MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS/CIVPOL TEAM INVESTIGATED THE GITARAMA PRISON SHOOTING INCIDENT. IT WAS CONFIRMED THAT ONE PERSON WAS KILLED AND THREE OTHERS RECEIVED GUNSHOT

WOUNDS. WHILE THE RPA FEARED AN ATTEMPT OF MASS ESCAPE, THE PRISONERS WERE GRIPPED WITH FEAR ABOUT RUMOUR THAT THEY WOULD BE KILLED EN MASSE SOON.

(G) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO.

I. PATROLS TO MUKO GR 3841 AND KARAMBO GR 4634 COMMUNES WERE INFORMED OF NUMEROUS ARRESTS BY THE RPA IN THE AREA.

II. PATROLS TO MUDASOMWA GR 4222, GISUNZU GR 4117 AND UWINGUGU GR 4017 REPORTED THAT THE RPA IS ALLEGEDLY TAKING PEOPLE TO THE NYUNGWE FOREST AND KILLING THEM. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

III. PTLs TO CYANIKA GR 5630, RUKONDO GR 5538 AND MIHERE GR 5489 REPORTED THAT A LOCAL WAS MACHETED TO DEATH BY RPA SOLDIERS WHO ALSO SHOT DEAD HIS SON AT KIGOBE GR 580445.

IV. MILOBS PATROLS TO THE DPCS REPORTED THAT THERE WAS A LARGE INFLUX OF PEOPLE INTO IDP CAMPS FROM THE SURROUNDING COMMUNES.

(H) IN SECTOR 4B - BUTARE. MILOBS CARRIED OUT AIR RECCE OF THE RWANDA/BURUNDI BORDER AND OBSERVED THAT MOST VILLAGES OF KIBAYI COMMUNE 8497 LOOKED ALMOST DESERTED WHILE A LARGE CONCENTRATION OF RPA TROOPS WAS NOTICED AT MUYIRA 8639.

(I) IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU.

I. BANDITRY ACTIVITY IS STILL ON THE INCREASE IN THE SECTOR.

II. 22 WFP TRUCKS DETAINED AT RUSIZI 2 WERE ALLOWED TO RETURN TO UNHCR WORKSHOP ON IN CYANGUGU.

III. ON 09 APRIL 95, AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF SUSPECTED BANDITS ATTEMPTED 3 LANDINGS NEAR MATABA COVE GR 9942. RPA FIRED ON THE BOATS AND SUNK ONE WHILE THE REST ESCAPED.

IV. MILOBS CARRIED OUT AIR RECCE OF THE ENTIRE SECTOR BORDERS AND ESPECIALLY THE RAIN FOREST. AT BWEYEYE 1111, THEY OBSERVED A TWO-PLATOON SIZE RPA POSITION. THEY ALSO OBSERVED BUSES AND OTHER VEHs AT PANZI CAMP 7321. IT WAS STRONGLY SUSPECTED THEY WERE MILITARY PERS THAN REFUGEE CAMP INMATES.

(J) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI. MILOBS MONITORED THE CEREMONY TO COMMEMORATE THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE GENOCIDE IN GISENYI TOWNSHIP. SPEECHES WERE MADE BY THE PREFECT OF GISENYI AND OTHER DIGNITARIES PRESENT. THE REMAINS OF SOME OF THE VICTIMS WERE ALSO RE-INTERRED. THE CEREMONY WAS ATTENDED BY A LARGE NUMBER OF PEOPLE. IT WAS ALSO PEACEFUL CONTRARY TO EARLIER SPECULATIONS.

(K) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI. MILOBS PATROLS IN GIKOMERO, KANOMBE AND NYARUGENGE COMMUNES WERE INFORMED THAT THE KIGALI CENTRAL PRISON AND ANOTHER IN GR 058854 WERE OVERCROWDED AND THAT ICRC WAS RENOVATING THE KIGALI CENTRAL PRISON TO MAKE IT MORE CONDUCIVE AND HABITABLE.

(12) FORCE ENGR COY.

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(B) COMPLETED DEMINING OF MT REBERO AND RECOVERED 7 GRENADES, 3 X 60 MM BOMBS, 1 X 105 MM BOMB, 3 ROCKET SHELLS AND SMALL ARMS AMMO.

(13) AUSMED

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE MEDICAL SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT TO CITIZENS OF RWANDA.

(B) TREATED A TOTAL OF 322 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 42 DENTAL PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD. CHK IS CURRENTLY HOLDING 12 IN - PATIENTS.

(14) AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. A TOTAL OF 131 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

(15) UN MP COY

(A) UNAMIR MP COY CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDESE LOCAL.

(A) INVESTIGATED TWO CASES OF THEFT AND A ROBBERY CASE IN KIGALI.

(C) OP RALENTIR STILL IN PROGRESS.

(16) 95 FLSG NORMAL RESUPPLY RUNS WERE MADE TO THE VARIOUS CONTINGENTS IN THE SECTORS. NIBATT ROTATION WAS SUPPORTED WITH TPT AND RATIONS WHILE THE EX LASTED.

4. UNCIVPOL

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN SECTORS.

B. ON 01 APRIL 95, CIVPOL MONITORS IN GISENYI PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT 7 ARMED MEN ATTACKED A HOUSE IN GISENYI. ONE LOCAL WAS KILLED AND ANOTHER SERIOUSLY INJURED. TWO SUSPECTS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND ARE IN RPA CUSTODY IN GISENYI.

C. PATROL TEAM IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT 150 LOCALS, MAINLY HUTUS HAD DESERTED THEIR HOMES AND SOUGHT PROTECTION WITH THE SECTOR HQ IN VIEW OF THE RUMOURS OF PLANNED ATTACK BY FRGF AND REPRISAL ACTIONS BY THE RPA.

D. PATROL TEAM IN KIGALI REPORTED THAT THE TOP RWANDESE GOVT OFFICIALS INCLUDING THE PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, PRIME MINISTER AND REPS OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY ATTENDED REBURIAL CEREMONIES IN KIGALI. THE TEAM FURTHER REPORTED THAT UNAMIR CAME UNDER SEVERE CRITICISM BY GOVT OFFICIALS SOCIETY LEADERS DURING THEIR ADDRESS TO THE NATION.

E. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGERI NATIONAL TRAINING SCHOOL IS STILL IN PROGRESS.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES

A. OP RETOUR. A TOTAL OF 138 IDPs WERE EVAC DURING THE WEEK, BRINGING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF DPs MOVED SINCE OP RETOUR TO 42,652.

B. MEDICAL. FORCE MEDICAL STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 1962 LOCALS DURING THE WEEK THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY PROVIDING PRIMARY HEALTH CARE.

C. TRANSPORTATION. UNAMIR PROVIDED TRANSPORT ASSISTANCE FOR THE FOLLOWING:

- (1) TRANSPORTATION OF SEEDS.
- (2) TRANSPORTATION OF REFUGEES.
- (3) TRANSPORTATION OF PRISONERS.

9. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. A TOTAL OF 09 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR

VEHICLES WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD.

10. CONCLUSION. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED TENSE BUT SHOWED A REMARKABLE IMPROVEMENT. THE COMMEMORATION OF THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE GENOCIDE PASSED OFF PEACEFULLY AGAINST ALL EXPECTATIONS, WITH NO UNTOWARD INCIDENT IN ANY PART OF THE COUNTRY. UNAMIR WAS HOWEVER SINGLED OUT FOR SEVERE CRITICISM BY GOVT OFFICIALS FOR ITS ROLE DURING AND AFTER THE WAR. THE BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN SECTOR 4C, CONTINUED TO RISE WITH INCREASED ENGAGEMENTS BETWEEN THE RPA AND FRGF TROOPS. OP RETOUR HAS COME TO A GRINDING HALT DUE TO FEAR OF REPRISAL FROM THE RPA IN THE HOME COMMUNES.
