86 IDPS FROM RURAMBA DPC RETURNING TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.



1. In view of the critical situation in Kibeho camp, transportation of IDPs will continue 7 days a week, including Sundays, until the IDP population in Kibeho camp is considerably reduced. You are therefore requested to inform your troops involved in the evac exercise accordingly.

1. GEN SIT. QUITE TENSE IN NDAGO, MUNINI AND KIBEHO, REST CALM.

2. POLITICAL ACTS. NTR

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES :

A. RPA SHOT DEAD 04 LOCALS AT KAMANA AFTER RELEASING THEM TO GO TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. THAT IS, INNOCENT AGED 36 YRS, NZAZIMANA INNOCENT 25 YRS, MWAAIRE AGED 30 YRS AND KABILIGI AGED 34 YRS ALL OF MUBUGA COMMUNE. THE SOLDIERS ARE NOW PREPARING DEFENSIVE POSITIONS AROUND IDP GATHERING POINT AT KAMANA. IDPS AT KIBEHO ARE NOW AGITATED AND HAVE BECOME AGGRESSIVE. THEY ARE CHARGING AT RPA ATTEMPTING TO BREAK THEIR CORDON, OCCASIONALLY BREAKING THROUGH IN GROUPS. AT 1710 HRS THE IDPS BROKE THROUGH IN THE WESTERN PART OF THE CAMP AND THERE WAS HEAVY FIRE FROM THE SOLDIERS AS THEY MASSACRED THEM. SEVERAL IDPS ARE BELIEVED TO BE LYING DEAD IN THE GALLEYS AND OVER 1000 INJURED, WAS DIFFICULT TO GO OUT AND VERIFY AS RPA KEPT FIRING IN ALL DIRECTIONS.

6. CIVIL AFFAIRS. IT HAS BEEN OBSERVED BY OWN SUBUNIT THAT RURAMBA QPCS ALMOST EMPTY. MOST IDPS HAVE RUN AWAY TO SAFER PLACES IN THE COMMUNES. CARITAS PROVIDED MEDICAL FACILITIES AT KIGEME, BUHORO, GISUNZU AND NYAMIGINA WHILE GOAL PROVIDED AT RURAMBA.

1. GENERAL SITUATION. GEN REMAINS UNSTABLE BUT RELATIVELY CALM. HOWEVER THERE WERE TWO SHOOTING INCIDENTS ON ISHARA PENINSULA (GR 0044) ON 21 APR 95 AT 2230 HRS AND AT KAVUNE (GR 9840) TODAY AT 0250 HRS. DETAILS NOT IMMEDIATELY AVAILABLE DUE TO LACK OF MOBILITY. ALSO LOCALS IN NYAMASHEKE AREA STILL CONTINUE TO SEEK PROTECTION AT THE RESIDENCE OF MILOBS AT NIGHT.

ALSO ORPHANS EXPOSED TO MOSQUITO BITES LEADING TO HIGH INCIDENCE OF MALARIA DUE TO ABSENCE OF LOUVRES IN WINDOWS. PRESENT ACCN ALSO LIKELY TO BE TAKEN OVER SINCE ORIGINALLY A PRIMARY SCHOOL. ORPHANAGE ALSO FACES PROBLEM OF REHABILITATING GROWN-UP MEMBERS OF AGE 15 AND ABOVE SINCE NO KNOWN RELATIVES OR PLACE TO SEND THEM.

4. It is further suggested that Commanding Officers visit Kibeho for a first hand assessment of the situation in the camp(s).
5. Treat matter as extremely urgent.





#### GENERAL SITUATION

The IOC continues to monitor the situation in the southern IDP camps through reports from IOC field officers, UNAMIR, NGOs and UN agencies. Four camps are now under the control of the RPA: Kibeho, Ndago, Munini, and Kamana. IDPs are only allowed to leave the camps by truck, after a security screening. Transport from the camps is slow, due to transport resources, poor road conditions caused by heavy rains, and a lack of road maintenance. At present the road from Butare is blocked by an IOM truck stuck in the mud.

The situation in Kibeho and Ndago is deteriorating rapidly due to overcrowding and lack of food, water, shelter, and sanitary facilities. Deaths are being reported from exposure and thirst in Kibeho and Ndago.

#### COORDINATION

A meeting is to be conducted at Tac HQ today, 1700hrs, to continue coordination of the humanitarian support to the current situation.

There will be a Heads of Agencies meeting in Butare on the morning of 21 April, 1995, to develop a combined strategy for dealing with the crisis. The humanitarian response is presently being coordinated from TAC-HQ Butare. Paul Howard, co-coordinator of the IOC Task Force is presently in Butare.

The humanitarian response to the crisis has been hindered by the RPAs reluctance to allow NGOs and UN agencies to free access to the KIBEHO CAMP, and reluctance on some organisations to provide assistance. It is stressed that NGO's and UN Agencies should assist with humanitarian support to maximum capacity. The current situation will only deteriorate if assistance is hesitant. This issue will be discussed at the Butare meeting 1700 hrs today.

Yesterday UNAMIR trucks moved 825 IDPs from Kibeho, the majority overnighed at a Butare waystation before proceeding to their home communes. Today UNAMIR, IOM, and UNHCR are providing transport resources for movement from the camp. Latest reports from UNAMIR indicate over 3,000 people have been moved by vehicle. The RPA are conducting security screenings before allowing anyone to board the trucks. No people are allowed to leave the camps on foot. The lack of road maintenance and the recent heavy rains may restrict population movement tomorrow.

It is reported that some children in the camp have died from exposure, others are suffering from hunger and thirst.

Last night a local employee of UNICEF was reportedly beaten to death by RPA soldiers. No other details of this incident are presently available.

#### NDAGO CAMP

There is very little food or water in Ndago, and it is reported that some people are dying of thirst. The RPA has told all NGOs to leave the area, and it is reported that MSF vehicles and journalists are stopped at roadblocks and forbidden to enter Ndago.

## GENERAL SITUATION

The IOC continues to monitor the situation in the southern IDP camps through reports from IOC field officers, UNAMIR, NGOs and UN agencies. Four camps are now under the control of the RPA: Kibeho, Ndagö, Munini, and Kamana. IDPs are only allowed to leave the camps by truck, after a security screening. Transport from the camps is slow, due to transport resources, poor road conditions caused by heavy rains, and a lack of road maintenance. At present the road from Butare is blocked by an IOM truck stuck in the mud.

The situation in Kibeho and Ndagö is deteriorating rapidly due to overcrowding and lack of food, water, shelter, and sanitary facilities. Deaths are being reported from exposure and thirst in Kibeho and Ndagö.

## COORDINATION

A meeting is to be conducted at Tac HQ today, 1700hrs, to continue coordination of the humanitarian support to the current situation.

There will be a Heads of Agencies meeting in Butare on the morning of 21 April, 1995, to develop a combined strategy for dealing with the crisis. The humanitarian response is presently being coordinated from TAC-HQ Butare. Paul Howard, coordinator of the IOC Task Force is presently in Butare.

The humanitarian response to the crisis has been hindered by the RPAs reluctance to allow NGOs and UN agencies to free access to the KIBEHO CAMP, and reluctance on some organisations to provide assistance. It is stressed that NGOs and UN Agencies should assist with humanitarian support to maximum capacity. The current situation will only deteriorate if assistance is hesitant. This issue will be discussed at the Butare meeting 1700 hrs today.

Yesterday UNAMIR trucks moved 825 IDPs from Kibeho, the majority overnights at a Butare waystation before proceeding to their home communes. Today UNAMIR, IOM, and UNHCR are providing transport resources for movement from the camp. Latest reports from UNAMIR indicates over 3,000 people have been moved by vehicle. The RPA are conducting security screenings before allowing anyone to board the

communes. Today UNAMIR, ICN, and UNHCR are providing transport resources for movement from the camp. Latest reports from UNAMIR indicate over 3,000 people have been moved by vehicle. The RPA are conducting security screenings before allowing anyone to board the trucks. No people are allowed to leave the camps on foot. The lack of road maintenance and the recent heavy rains may restrict population movement tomorrow.

It is reported that some children in the camp have died from exposure, others are suffering from hunger and thirst.

Last night a local employee of UNICEF was reportedly beaten to death by RPA soldiers. No other details of this incident are presently available.

#### NDAGO CAMP

There is very little food or water in Ndago, and it is reported that some people are dying of thirst. The RPA has told all NGOs to leave the camp, and it is reported that UN agencies, and journalists are stopped at roadblocks and forbidden to enter Ndago.

WFP. WFP has offered a large quantity of high protein biscuits to IOC. Distribution programme to be planned at Butare Meeting today.





SUMMARY

Calm anniversary of the genocide  
The 6th April anniversary passed calmly. The rumours surrounding that date proved unfounded. They nevertheless caused a considerable increase in people moving into camps. Outflow from camps was very small.

Commune assistance urgently required  
To date there has still been little concrete assistance to commune administrative and judicial officials. This is seen as a high priority need if large numbers of IDPs are to be received in good order.

Ministerial supervision in the field  
The Minister of Rehabilitation and Social Integration will personally supervise Operation Retour activities in the field next week, in an effort to revitalise the operation.

THE 6TH APRIL ANNIVERSARY

National commemoration of the genocide  
The national ceremony of commemoration was held on Rukero hill overlooking Kigali on 7 April. Senior political figures from Burundi, Uganda, the Netherlands and Germany joined the government of Rwanda in marking the first anniversary of the start of the genocide. The remains of many genocide victims and some war casualties, recently exhumed from shallow mass graves, were laid to rest.

Week of mourning  
Despite inevitable rumours of violence surrounding the anniversary, the country was reported very quiet throughout. A week of mourning will continue until 13 April, with many offices working half days until then.

SECURITY

Intensified camp patrols

The RPA and UNAMIR intensified patrolling in and around the camps, with UNAMIR patrolling day and night throughout the weekend. In the event, although camp inhabitants said they were afraid, the

The RPA and UNAMIR intensified patrolling in and around the camps, with UNAMIR patrolling day and night throughout the weekend. In the event, although camp inhabitants said they were afraid, the security situation remained generally calm in all camps.

### Kibeho camp incident

The one exception, reported by UNAMIR, was at 1900 hours on 6 April near Kibeho camp, when IDPs blocked the path of an RPA vehicle by placing a log across the road. When the RPA attempted to remove it they were met with insults and stone-throwing from IDPs. RPA soldiers fired into the air. At least one RPA soldier fired at the IDPs, wounding a 35-year-old woman in the leg and arm. UNAMIR arrived and escorted the RPA to the edge of the camp.

## TRANSPORT

### IDM operations

IDM suspended all operations in Rwanda on 4 April, following an armed robbery of the IDM office in Kigali. On 10 April, however, IDM decided to recommence operations.

### Low figures

Because of the national genocide remembrance holiday, transport from the camps was suspended from 6 to 10 April inclusive. Very few IDPs were transported from the camps. On 9 April, the figure was 102. On 4 April the figure was only 36, giving a total for the week of 138. There was no movement reported on 5 April. This brings the total number of people transported by vehicle from camps under Operation Retour since it began on 29 December to 41,706.

## STRATEGY

### Renewed operations

An immediate goal is to enable people who moved into camps for the 6 April anniversary to return home, now that rumours surrounding the date have been shown to be false. It is also urgent to revitalise the operation to enable IDPs in all the remaining camps to return home. It is planned that renewed operations begin to take effect next week. An information campaign, relaunched in the camps, will combine with assistance to the priority receiving communes to make it easier for those who wish to return home to do so. Under the strategy agreed in the Integrated Task Force, food distribution to the remaining camps will be ended according to a schedule that has yet to be finalised.

### IDPs accused of crimes

The Integrated Task Force is considering options for those who have a criminal case to answer. The immediate problem is where to put them, while there is insufficient prison space and procedures are not yet in place to process the probably many IDPs currently in the camps who fall into this category.

Camps were reported calm during the period of national mourning around 6 and 7 April, despite the recent mass exodus from Rwasinko camp, whose population walked mainly to Kibeho camp.

##### Growth of southern camps

Kibeho camp is now estimated as holding at least 120,000 people. According to the camp leader (put in place by IDPs), the population of Kamana camp grew by over 4,500 people in the week to 5 April. The camp population is now estimated at just under 40,000. In Muringi the camp chief reported only about 400 new arrivals over the same period, mostly from the neighbouring Kivu commune.

##### Northern camps unchanged

The populations of the smaller, more northern camps near Gikongoro town (Nyamigina, Gishuramba and Bubero) remained relatively stable.

##### Camp populations - correction

The survey published in the 3 April IDP Bulletin incorrectly gave the number of IDPs in the camps as at 23 March who originate from Nyakizu commune as 21,150. The actual figure was 31,650, making Nyakizu the commune with most IDPs due to return to it. The figure represents 12.90% of the total camp populations.

#### COMMUNES

##### Commune meetings

Human Rights field officers recently organised successful meetings in Mugina and Runda communes of Gishuramba prefecture. The meetings were chaired by the respective bourgmestres but also attended by the Minister of the Interior, and gave inhabitants an opportunity to ask questions about arrests, human rights and other issues. About 500 people attended each meeting. Another has been requested by the bourgmestre in Mugina commune. The Human Rights team plans similar meetings in all other communes in Gishuramba as soon as practicable, in order to help bourgmestres to raise confidence. Mugina and Runda, which are close to Kigali, have seen more arrests than other communes, reportedly because of infiltration by militia or former government forces.

##### Needs in communes

Many basic needs in communes are still unmet. For example, in Nyazo commune (Butare prefecture) water supply is not functioning. Some empty houses are said to remain. The commune office has only one typewriter, and the building needs refurbishment. In Mugina (Butare prefecture) the bourgmestre gave lack of transport and limited investigative personnel as the reason for some prisoners having stayed in the commune prison for up to 2 months. More support for the judicial process at commune level is urgently needed. The water system is not functioning. The only empty

Most empty houses are said to remain. The commune has one typewriter, and the building needs refurbishment. In Muyira (Butare prefecture) the bourgmestre gave lack of transport and limited investigative personnel as the reason for some prisoners having stayed in the commune prison for up to 2 months. More support for the judicial process at commune level is urgently needed. The water system is not functioning. The only empty houses remaining are reported to be uninhabitable. The commune office has no typewriter, and again the office building is in need of work. Until now, there has been no positive response from international organisations in this regard even after an appeal for commune rehabilitation programme done in February.

#### CROSS-BORDER MOVEMENTS

##### Movement to Burundi

The bourgmestre of Muyira reported people passing through his commune en route from Ntongwe, claiming that Burundi was their destination. Overall movement to Burundi is, however, not reported to be large.

##### Movement from Burundi

Some movement from Burundi has been recorded, with the Kamana camp chief counting 543 new arrivals from Burundi during the reporting period.

#### VISITS

The Dutch Minister for Development Cooperation, Mr JP Pronk, visited the IOC on 8 April for discussions on Operation Retour, on receiving communes, and on assistance particularly to administrative and judicial infrastructure at commune level.

#### COORDINATION

The Minister of Rehabilitation and Social Reintegration, Dr Jacques Bihozagara, intends personally to supervise Operation Retour operations from Butare next week, alongside the local government officials and international organisations involved in the operation.

IOM, who suspended all operations in Rwanda after a robbery on 2 April, have now resumed operations. IDP convoy movements were suspended between 6-10 April in respect of the national Remembrance holiday.

Yesterday approximately 6000 people held a peaceful demonstration outside UNAMIR HQ in Kigali to protest UNAMIRs withdrawal from Rwanda last year during the genocide. Today a similar demonstration was held in Gisenyi.

Movement: Some of the 300 people from Kivuru sector and 40 families from FUGI sector have been seen by a MINIREISO rep back in their collines.

Security: Today 1000 hrs RPA troops entered Kivugiza camp and forced the IDPs to leave immediately. Many people ran to Kibeho camp and some to Ruramba leaving behind their possessions. In another incident RPA soldiers told the IDPs in Rwamiko camp to leave.

Cooperation: Senbatt accompanied the RPA to make "CONSTATS DE DECES" for 2 murders, one on 6/4 in Fugi sector and the other on 7/4 in Muhembe sector.

The bourgmestre of Nyakizu commune is waiting for IDPs to return home. He expects that he will have help from international community and NGOs for emergency cases in this operation.

Camps: In Kamana camp according to chef du camp that the IDP figures has reached to 40000. The newcomers to the camp are from Nshili, Nyakizu, Kivu, and from Burundi.  
In Munini, Ndago and Kibeho camp situation is reported to be calm.

Border movement: RPA, Bourgmestre Huye and MINIREISO rep met with the bourgmestres of Mwumba and Busiga ( border communes in Burundi) to discuss cross-border population movement). As the Bourgmestre was unavailable, no confirmation on what effect this has had on border movements and security is known.

A peaceful march was held in Kigali today at 16:00 hrs to protest against the negative role of media, and RTLM radio station in particular , and the former defeated government in genocide.

UNAMIR has commenced work on a project with the Rwandan Government to help ease the overcrowded prison conditions.

HE DENIED ANY KNOWLEDGE OF CRIMINAL ELEMENTS IN REFUGEES CAMPS AND CONDEMNED THE ACTIONS OF THE RPA. REGARDLESS, IT IS FELT HERE THAT THE PREVENTION OF THESE TRUCKS CROSSING WILL INEVITABLY LEAD TO FURTHER UNREST AND BANDITRY IN ZAIRE AND BOREDR AREAS OF RWANDA. IT IS ASSUMED THAT AT LEAST MOST OF THE TRUCKS WILL BE ORDERED BACK TO KIGALI, HOWEVER, IT IS POSSIBLE THAT SOME FOOD TRAILERS MAY REMAIN BEHIND. (SOURCE-WFP DRIVERS, AS SUGGESTED BY LOC RPA). THERE IS NO DETAILS AVAL AT THIS REGARDING ATTACK AT BIRAWA IN ZAIRE, OTHER THAN THE FOL: THERE IS A KNOW ISLAND LOC NAMED IBNDJE THAT IS USED AS A STOPOVER FOR NEW ARRIVALS FROM IJWI ENROUTE TO BIRAWA. BIRAWA IS KNOWN TO HAVE POP OF ABOUT 20,000 REFUGEES AND IS LOC ON SOUTHERN PENINSULA JUTTING EASTWARD TOWARD IJWI. THERE HAVE BEEN RECENT NEW ARRIVALS THAT WERE INITIALLY LANDED IN BIRWA, THEN SETTLED INTO KABIRA CAMP. ALL THESE NEW ARRIVALS WERE FROM IJWI AND WERE A MAIN FACTOR IN UNHCR STATS LAST SHOWING A SURGE OF WHAT WAS THOUGHT AS NEW RWANDANS SEEKING REFUGEES STATUS, WHEN IN FACT THE BULK CAME FROM IJWI AND HAD BEEN THERE FOR SOME TIME. THERE ARE CURENTLY SOME RELIABLE SOURCES ASSISTING TO GAIN ANSWERES TO UNAMIR QUESTIONS AND THERE REPORTS ARE ANTICIPATED TOMORROW BY MID AFTERNOON. RPA WILL ALSO BE QUERIED BEFORE THAT TIME.


