



We wish to acknowledge with thanks your letter of 5 June 1946 with Tracer No. 1 addressed to the Department of Agriculture attached.

We have checked the items listed on the Tracer against our accounting records, and have found that in all cases the commodities covered by the bills of lading have been recorded on our books, using estimated prices in most cases, inasmuch as the invoices have not been received by us.

We have given your kind offer to send us copies of these tracers much consideration, and we have come to the conclusion that these reports do not contain any information additional to that which we now normally obtain from the shipping reports issued by our Ocean Shipping Division. It is from these shipping reports that we obtain the numbers of the bills of lading issued against the cargo on each ship. We then obtain copies of all the bills of lading so that we have complete details of the commodities on each ship.

We wish to thank you very much for having brought this new report of yours to our attention.



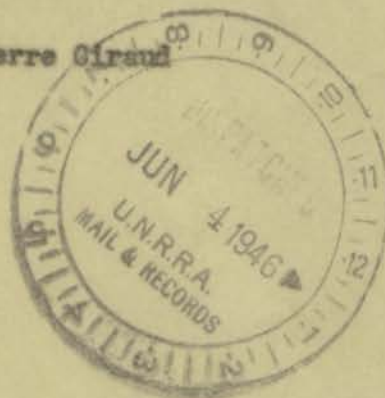

The circular cable about the eligibility of UNRRA Fellows for Section 3(7) visas which you have sent at our suggestion to your representatives in Warsaw, Prague, Belgrade and Athens may be sent also to your representatives in Rome, Vienna, Moscow (for the two Russian republics) and Shanghai.

As a result of some adverse press comment in U.S. and presumably as result of reports from Belgrade, State Department are pressing us for detailed information on some aspects of control and distribution of UNRRA supplies as there have been suggestions that these are not being handled in accordance basic Resolutions. All measures being taken by us to present facts to State Department and request you specifically give factual replies to information requested by Headquarters from time to time as quickly as possible. This is essential for us to help you, and for State Department to help UNRRA.

2. Request further that you call upon US and UK Embassies and endeavor arrive at arrangements whereby any information received by them reflecting adversely on your operation be brought by them to your notice immediately so that good faith of Mission towards both UNRRA Charter and Yugoslav Government can be frankly established and any abuses which might from time to time arise can be adjusted in friendly atmosphere between yourself, Yugoslav Government and all others concerned.

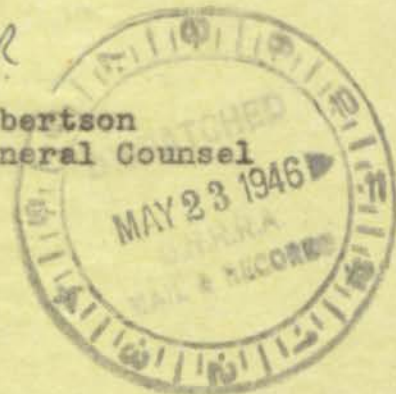

There is attached a mimeographed report on the "Agricultural Conditions and Food Prospects in the Philippines" based on a recently completed survey by the UNRRA Agricultural Staff of the Southwest Pacific Area Office, under the supervision of Glen Briggs, Chief Agricultural Rehabilitation Officer.

The objectives of the survey were to ascertain the total area sown to rice and estimate the size of the 1945-46 crop; to locate the principal deficiency and surplus regions in the coming year; to estimate production of corn and other supplementary foodstuffs during the next six to twelve months; to discover to what extent work animals and farm implements have been depleted during the war and to establish the extent of the deficiency in each region; to ascertain the extent of destruction of transport and processing facilities in the different provinces and particularly the adequacy of these facilities for handling prospective production or bringing in essential imports to deficiency regions; and to provide a factual basis for the most effective allocation of UNRRA supplies and to provide a means of resisting political pressure in their distribution.

The purpose of the survey was to provide a basis for a rational food policy through the difficult year of 1946 and to provide a basis for a sound agricultural rehabilitation program.

A feature of this report comprising a field survey of almost 8000 farms taken in some cases while liberation was underway, perhaps worth special mention, is that it provides for the first time in scientific and objective terms, the story of the impact of war on the agriculture of an invaded nation.

Following a visit to your office yesterday of Miss Elise Thompson, Executive Director of the United Nations Council of Philadelphia, and her promise that we would send you today a resume of the organization plan which we followed for the Philadelphia Committee, Emergency Food Collection, - we are glad to give you the following.

In the early part of March the United Nations Council of Philadelphia requested former Justice Owen J. Roberts and the writer to serve as co-chairmen of a committee to inaugurate this collection in Metropolitan Philadelphia. The Mayor of Philadelphia was invited to serve as honorary chairman.

Leaders of Churches, Civic Organizations, Business Groups, and Citizens of Philadelphia were separately contacted and asked to serve as members of a Philadelphia Committee. In every instance, emphasis was given to the sponsorship of this Food Collection by UNRRA, and it is our belief that acceptances to serve as members of the General Committee and as chairmen of specific committees were received by reason of this UNRRA sponsorship.

The Philadelphia Committee, numbering 130 men and women leaders of our city, was formally organized in the Mayor's Reception Room at City Hall on April 23rd. All of the intervening time from the first week of March to this April 23rd date was devoted to obtaining members of this General Committee, setting up the separate committees, and augmenting the personnel by people specifically trained for that committee's activity.

In order to emphasize the importance of the Organization Meeting, we requested our Mayor to send a telegraphic call to the entire list of 130 members which we provided in complete detail one week before the date agreed upon for organization. He issued the call five days before the date with an urgent appeal to attend. Eight regrets were received from members who had out-of-town engagements. The balance of the total number was present at the meeting in what the Mayor declared as the most genuine response to an appeal for a welfare effort or civic effort every experienced in City Hall.

On that occasion we presented the chairmen of the special committees who constitute now the Advisory Committee, and we concentrated our organization of these committees to a minimum of twelve committees, such as:

BOY SCOUTS

CHURCH

COLLECTION

EDUCATIONAL

FOOD INDUSTRY

PACKING AND SHIPPING

PUBLICITY

RADIO

RETAIL STORES

SECURITY

UTILITIES & CIVIC ASS'NS.

WOMEN'S GROUPS

It is a proudful fact that not one person asked to serve as chairman of a specific committee declined. For your information we are attaching a copy of this Advisory Committee chart.

Believing that it might be helpful to a National Committee in guiding local groups in their organization plans, we are making reference to several angles concerning these special committees:

BOY SCOUTS - The Boy Scout Organization is not permitted to collect money, and therefore could not participate in the sale of food coupons to which we will later refer. They will, however, be organized for the actual collection of canned food in such places as churches and community houses which may prefer the actual canned food project; and they will also be used to circularize neighborhoods with Hand Bills. The enthusiasm that Boy Scouts can promote makes them a priceless asset in a project such as this.

CHURCH - The Church Committee will number some 40 clergymen - leaders of churches in Philadelphia, but our Committee has been held down to a total of seven representing the Protestant and Jewish Churches. (It is our understanding that the Catholic Church is to have its own drive and therefore did not wish to be included on our General Committee, although they were one



of the first contacts we made.) There will be sent from this headquarters a letter to every Protestant and Jewish clergyman in Philadelphia who number more than a thousand calling upon them to include in their sermon on Mother's Day, May 12th, - which is the opening date for the Drive set by the National Committee - a plea for their congregations' support of this Food Collection and a stepping-up of any program that may already be existent in their respective churches. We are also calling upon these clergymen to continue to emphasize the response to this Drive throughout the dates of the Drive and to include it in any radio addresses or platform talks that they, personally, may be making.

COLLECTION - As an evidence of the unusual cooperation which we are enjoying, the Chairman of this important Committee is the gentleman who served as General Chairman of Philadelphia's Clothing Drive held this past winter, and he will be assisted by the "key men" of his Clothing Committee.

EDUCATIONAL - The Secretary and Business Manager of the Board of Education of Philadelphia will supervise the collection of food in every Public School in Philadelphia, even to the point of its physical collection and depositing it in the central receiving station which is our city's largest armory. The President of one of our universities will direct the program in the colleges and private schools.

FOOD INDUSTRY - A unique plan introduced by the Food Industry Committee of Philadelphia organized for charitable campaigns will be the principal factor of Philadelphia's participation. This plan calls for the sale of books of tickets, each book to contain thirty tickets at a face value of 15¢ each, tickets to be printed in the form and illustrated as a can of food. This plan has four outstanding advantages:

More food will be made available per dollars contributed than had the actual canned goods been placed or sold in retail stores.

Considerable expenses, labor, confusion and suspicion will be eliminated.

A better and more practical assortment of foods will be made available for shipment to distressed countries.

An accurate accounting of all money contributed will be possible.

We will be very glad, if it is desired at any time, to give to you, a national committee, and through you to local groups a graphic picture of the operation of this plan.

PACKING AND SHIPPING - The actual packing of canned goods collected in churches and schools, and a few organizations that prefer it, will be done by prisoners from our House of Correction under police supervision. They will be taken daily to the central receiving station, fed by our School System cafeteria, and returned to the prison at the end of the day. All canned goods collected will be cartoned and sealed at this end ready for delivery to the car side, from where it shall be shipped in accordance with instructions that will be received from the National Committee.

PUBLICITY -

RADIO - Too much emphasis cannot be given to the major importance to the Publicity and Radio Committees, and the vital part they play in such a project. We contacted the headquarters of the Red Cross in this area and asked for the loan of their Public Relations Director and staff to supervise this entire publicity program. The request was immediately granted, and we pass it on as the most effectual way of having this angle locally handled.

On the Radio Committee, every station and commentator is part of this important Committee.

RETAIL STORES - Rather than concentrate participation by the major merchants' associations in this city, its president, who is serving as our Chairman, suggested that the Committee be called Retail Stores which takes in every category large and small - other than food stores (of which there are six thousand in this city, all of whom are participating in the Food Industry Plan.)

SECURITY - The Assistant Superintendent of Police of the City of Philadelphia is the Chairman of this Committee and will provide and supervise the men who do the actual packing of food from the penal institution.

UTILITIES AND CIVIC ASSOCIATIONS - This, in fact, covers all public utilities, large and small, civic, service, welfare, fraternal, and patriotic organizations.

WOMEN'S GROUPS - Every woman's club, civic organization, previous war service organization, volunteer agency, and such are members of this vast Women's Group which directly will be charged with the selling of these food coupons to the public at large and from booths in our large department stores.

In brief, this is the "PHILADELPHIA PLAN". We had one visit from a representative of the National Committee, but other than giving us a set of bulletins prepared by that Committee



he had little to offer in suggestions for organization other than what we were able to show him we had already set up.

We, of course, are anxious to receive any further help that may come by suggestion from you or the National Committee to improve our plan in any possible way.

Dear Ed:

This is in reply to your inquiry as to whether UNRRA has made purchases of former Government surplus property from speculators. I understand that your inquiry is limited to direct purchases by UNRRA and that you are checking through Treasury Procurement to determine whether it has made any purchases of this character for UNRRA account.

As you know, our direct purchases represent only a very small proportion of our total procurement and are, by and large, limited to administrative supplies and relatively small emergency acquisitions of relief or rehabilitation supplies. These purchases are generally made on the basis of competitive bidding and it is possible that in particular instances the property acquired was in fact formerly government surplus. To ascertain this, it would be necessary for us to trace back all our acquisitions to their original source. I can, however, advise you with certainty that we have not knowingly acquired surpluses from any source other than government purchasing or disposal agencies.
