Distribution of surplus food in Albertville.

1. Pursuant to your request as expressed in your memorandum dated 5 April 1964, a complete survey had been undertaken by Mr. Schmid, Administrative Assistant in Albertville with the view of reconstructing the accounts of the food distribution.

2. You will notice from the enclosed documentation that considerable efforts have been made in order :

- a) to take stock of the items of food remaining for distribution;
- b) reconstruct details of food distribution effected by Mr. Lajeune together with necessary verification in accordance with the instructions which have been issued;
- c) establish beneficiaries (authorized or unauthorized).

3. Mr. Schmid explains in his memorandum to Mr. Saunders the difficulties he encountered in obtaining all information required. You will agree that the survey undertaken is far from complete, however I do not see any further possibility to pursue this matter due to present difficulties; our people in Albertville are faced with, of which you are certainly aware of.

Dear Mr. Whyatt-John,

With reference to your letter of May 29th, I think there has been a general misunderstanding between UNESCO "experts" and "teachers". In fact there is only one expert, Mr. Jannone, and he did not distribute anything to himself.

But UN circles commented unfavourably the fact that food was given to UNESCO "teachers" who are supposedly receiving a salary and have PX facilities, when it seems that there exist in Luluabourg numerous more needy people and institutions. One example: internates are supposed to prepare meals for 40 francs a meal, which is actually impossible. It would have been definitely wiser to allocate this food items to internates, orphanages and other institutions where UNESCO provides teachers.

Hoping this will help you to settle this problem, I remain

It has been agreed that ONUC surpluses may be bought by staff members under the following procedure:

- 1) Interested staff members should apply to the Chief Administrative Officer for particular items or equipment.
- 2) They will later be informed whether or not the item in question is available for disposal.
- 3) The price, which must be paid in hard currency, will be the assessed value of the item determined by application of the official rule for depreciation.
- 4) Staff members concerned should inform the Administration of their final decision about the purchase.
- 5) The sale will be considered completed after payment through Finance Section and the release of the item to the staff member.

- 6) Staff members are reminded of the terms of the agreement between the United Nations and the Republic of the Congo which require that all articles imported free of duty shall not be sold on Congolese territory to third parties save on conditions approved by the Government. They should follow the procedure actually in force, particularly in regard to motor cars, requesting prior authorization of the Congolese authorities and paying customs duties.
