DAILY SITREP FOR 31 JAN 95

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

B. INCIDENTS OF BANDITRY ALLEGEDLY COMMITTED BY BANDITS FROM ACROSS THE ZAIRIAN BORDER CONTINUE TO BE REPORTED TO MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C. DURING THE PERIOD, AN INCIDENT WAS REPORTED ON 31 JAN 95 IN WHICH BANDITS RAIDED A HOUSE AND ATTACKED 5 FAMILIES AT MUHEWE GR 8710. THE BANDITS MANAGED TO ESCAPE WITH THEIR STOLEN ITEMS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NTR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) IN SECTOR 2, RPA TROOPS AT NYARUBUYE GR 8460 ATTEMPTED TO PREVENT MILOBS FROM PASSING THROUGH THEIR CHECK POINT. IT TOOK 30 MINS OF NEGOTIATION BEFORE THE MILOB PATROL WAS ALLOWED TO PROCEED. IT APPEARS THAT ORDERS TO ALLOW MILOBS FREEDOM OF MOVEMENT ARE NOT BEING CARRIED OUT, DESPITE ASSURANCES FROM THE LOCAL BATTALION COMMANDER.

(2) IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THAT LOCALS IN NYAMABUYE COMMUNE ARE ALARMED AT THE HIGH RATE OF ARRESTS OF LOCALS BY RPA TROOPS. THE REPORT STATED THAT THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES WERE USUALLY UNAWARE OF THE ARRESTS AND MAJORITY OF THE VICTIMS, PREDOMINANTLY HUTUS, HAVE NOT BEEN HEARD OF SINCE THEIR ARRESTS. THE LOCAL POPULATION IS CURRENTLY UNEASY ABOUT THE LARGE RPA GARRISON IN GITARAMA. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 4B MILOBS REPORTED THE ARREST OF THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF MABANZA COMMUNE FOR REASONS UNKNOWN. IN A SEPARATE REPORT FRARBATT REPORTED THAT TRUCKLOADS OF LOCALS ARE BROUGHT TO THE SAME COMMUNE AT NIGHT BY THE RPA FOR INTERROGATIONS AND THE VICTIMS ARE OFTEN BEATEN UP IN THE PROCESS. HUMAN RIGHTS AND SECTOR MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(4) IN SECTOR 4C, RPA IS REPORTED TO HAVE REINFORCED ITS TROOPS ALONG THE SHORES OF LAKE KIVU DUE TO FREQUENT ACTS OF BANDITRY. THEY ALSO ARRESTED ONE LOCAL MALE OF NYAMASHEKE FOR HARBOURING A KNOWN BANDIT AND HELPING HIM TO ESCAPE TO ZAIRE.

B. FRGF. REFERENCE THE INCIDENT INVOLVING ETHIOBATT TROOPS AND BANDITS ON 28 JAN 95, IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE DECEASED BANDIT WORE A MILITARY PULLOVER AND BADGE BEARING THE PHOTO OF THE LATE PRESIDENT. ONE CORPSE WHICH WAS RETRIEVED FROM LAKE KIVU WAS IDENTIFIED AS A LOCAL OF MUGESERA GR 9438.

C. MILITIA. NTR.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) ON THIS LAST DAY OF THE MONTH, THE FC MET THE HEAD OF NGO AGENCIES AT UNREO. THEY DISCUSSED CURRENT OPERATION AND THEIR RELATIVE SUCCESS, AND IN HIS ADDRESS HE STRESSED THE NEED TO PREPARE FOR THE RETURN

OF REFUGEES OUTSIDE THE COUNTRY. HE CONCLUDED THE DAY WITH A MEETING WITH MR. KABIA, CAO AND BMS TO DISCUSS INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT OF THE GAKO CAMP.

(3) DCOS OPS, DCOS SP AND OIC OP RETOUR VISITED SECTOR 3 HQ TO DISCUSS MATTERS PERTAINING TO OP RETOUR WITH THE SECTOR COMD. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED THE KIGOMA ORC TO WITNESS THE ARRIVAL OF RETURNEES.

(4) OP RETOUR. A TOTAL OF 959 IDPs WERE EVACUATED FROM RUKONDO, KIBEHO, NDAGO AND MUKO ON 31 JAN 95.

(1) CONDUCTED PATROLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) 27 DPs ENTERED RWANDA FROM GATUNA BORDER POST.

(3) THERE WAS A MINE EXPLOSION AT GISIZA GR 096344 IN YANBISHANBI COMMUNE. ONE LOCAL HAD HER RIGHT LEG BLOWN OFF AND IS CURRENTLY RECEIVING MEDICAL TREATMENT AT AMREF HOSP.

(4) PTL TEAMS PROVIDED SECURITY FOR THE PAYMENT OF TEACHERS' SALARIES IN GARAMA GR 264291, GITUZA GR 325228, URAMBI GR 476013 AND MUHURA GR 306085. PTL TO GITUZA RECOVERED 325 ROUNDS OF AMMO IN ONE OF THE OFFICES LOCATED IN THE AREA.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 88 LOCALS AT COY HQ LOCATION.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) 70 IDPs ARRIVED AT RILIMA ORC GR 2561 WHILE 7 OTHER DPs ALSO ARRIVED KAZENZE COMMUNE TODAY. THEY WERE REGISTERED AND EVAC TO THEIR VARIOUS HOMES.

(3) A LOCAL FROM REMERA GR 6171 IN KIGARAMA COMMUNE - KIBUNGO RAN TO BN HQ FOR PROTECTION, ALLEGING THAT THE CHIEF OF REMERA WANTED TO KILLED ALL HUTUS IN THE VILLAGE INCLUDING HIM. HE FURTHER ALLEGED THAT SOME CITIZENS INCLUDING HIS SISTER HAD ALREADY BEEN KILLED. LOCAL PRESENTLY UNDER BN PROTECTION AND HRFO HAS BEEN

INFORMED. INVESTIGATIONS BY GHANBATT IN PROGRESS.

(4) 45 PERSONS ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH RUSUMO BORDER POST.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) MALICOY PTL TO KADAHO GR 5749 RECEIVED INFORMATION FROM LOCAL AUTHORITIES THAT ABOUT 60 IDPs CROSSED BRIDGE AT GR 550506 ON FOOT TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(2) MALICOY REPORTED THAT ONE IDPs WHO WAS PART OF A GROUP RETURNING TO NTONGWE COMMUNE ON 30 JAN 95, WAS THREATENED BY ONE OF THE IDPs WHO INSISTED THAT HE WAS GUILTY OF MURDER AND THAT HE WANTED TO REVENGE BY KILLING HIM. MALICOY PROVIDED SECURITY AND ESCORTED HIM BACK TO KIGOMA ORC FOR THE NIGHT. THE VICTIM WAS TODAY HANDED TO THE BOURGMESTER WHO ARRANGED FOR HIM TO BE ESCORTED BY CIVIL AUTH TO NTONGWE.

(3) MALAWICOY PTL TO NYAKIZU REPORTED THAT MANY RETURNEES ON OP RETOUR WENT STRAIGHT TO THEIR HOMES WITHOUT STOPPING AT THE ORC. ON THE AVERAGE, THE COMMUNE RECEIVES 12 FAMILIES DAILY. THE COMMUNE POPULATION IS NOW ESTIMATED AT 2300.

E. SECTOR 4A (ZAMBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) PROVIDED SY AT RUKONDO AND KIBEHO DP CAMPS DURING THE EVAC OF IDPs AND FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS AT NDAGO DP CAMP BY ICRC.

(2) PARTICIPATED IN INFORMATION CAMPAIGN AT KIRARO DPC. IDPs AT MUGANO REFUSED TO BE EVAC BECAUSE THEY WERE NOT READY, EFFORTS WOULD BE MADE TO EVAC THEM ON THURSDAY.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 67 LOCALS AT MUKO AND KADUHA.

F. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) MED STAFF TREATED 23 LOCALS IN AOR.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) TRANSPORTED 4 REFUGEES FROM RUSIZI-1 GR 7624 TO NYAGARARE.

(3) MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 16 LOCALS DENTAL PATIENTS

- (1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.
- (2) PTL TO KAGANO GR 5842 REPORTED THAT MORE THAN 1,000 REFUGEES GATHERED AT KAGANO HAVE REQUESTED FOR ACCOMMODATION AND FOOD. UNHCR HAS BEEN INFORMED.
- (3) A LOCAL ON ADMISSION AT KAYOVE HOSP GR 2792 WAS TAKEN AWAY BY RPA TPS TO AN UNKNOWN LOC. HRFO HAD BEEN INFORMED.
- (2) MED STAFF TREATED 189 LOCALS AT BN HQ.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

- (1) 572 IDPs WERE EVAC BY UNHCR TO NGENDA, GASHORA, KIBUNGO AND BUTARE. 298 IDPS STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.
- (2) 187 DPs MOVED BY INDBATT VEHS FROM KIBEHO DPC TO BUTARE.
- (3) MED STAFF TREATED 470 LOCALS AT BN HQ KIGALI.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY STABLE DURING THE PERIOD.

- (A) IN SECTOR 1, THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA VISITED KIZIGURO AND ADDRESSED ABOUT 400 LOCALS IN THE AREA.
- (B) THE BOURGEMESTRE OF MABANZA COMMUNE (GR 3473) IN SECTOR 4B ADDRESSED A GATHERING OF LOCALS IN THE COMMUNE. DETAILS BEING ASCERTAINED.
- (C) THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU AND THE CHIEF OF GENDARMES HELD A MEETING WITH LOCALS IN BUGARAMA TO PROMOTE RECONCILIATION AND TO DISCUSS THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA.

(2) BORDERS. FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC.

- (A) GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.
- (B) RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA).

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS DETAILED TEAMS TO MEET A DELEGATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL IN KIBUNGO (GR 6060), RUSUMO (GR 7549) AND NYARUBUYE (GR 8660). THERE WAS A DELAY IN THEIR ARRIVAL AT THE LOCS DUE TO RPA RESTRICTIONS ON THEIR MOVEMENTS THROUGH THEIR CHECK POINTS.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(A) SECTOR COMD VISITED THE GITARAMA PRISON. THERE WERE ABOUT 4,200 INMATES IN THE PRISON, EVEN THOUGH THE PRISON WAS DESIGNED TO HOLD ABOUT 1,000 INMATES. CONDITIONS WERE ASSESSED AS APPALLING. PRISONERS HAD BARELY ENOUGH ROOM TO LIE DOWN AND WERE REPORTED TO BE SLEEPING IN SHIFTS. MILOBS ASSESSEMENT IS THAT, THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES REQUIRE ASSISTANCE TO EXPAND THE HOLDING CAPACITY OF PRISON SINCE THE NUMBER OF DETAINEES IS LIKELY TO INCREASE UNTIL THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNALS ARE ESTABLISHED.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN NYAMABUYE COMMUNE TO MONITOR THE PROGRESS OF RETURNEES TO THE COMMUNE. THEY DISCUSSED WITH THE BOUGEMESTRE SANITATION IN THE COMMUNE AND ISSUES CONCERNED WITH HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE. THEY ALSO VISITED SHYOGWE AND RULLI SECTORS WHERE LOCALS REPORTED INCREASE IN RPA ARRESTS IN THE AREA.

(C) MILOBS ASSISTED IN THE EVACUATION OF 2 MOTOR ACCIDENT VICTIMS FROM GITARAMA TO KIGALI. BOTH VICTIMS WERE BROWN AND ROOTS EMPLOYEES.

(7) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(A) SECTOR COMD AND MILOB TEAM ESCORTED A 6-MAN TEAM FROM INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL TO RUKONDO.

(B) THE COMMISSIONER OF OP RETOUR ORGANISED A MEETING WITH REPS FROM NYAKIZU AND MUYIRA COMMUNES ON REQUIREMENTS OF DPs. THE TEAM ALSO MONITORED THE NUMBER OF DPs IN THE DPCS.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO BIRAMBO WERE FORCED TO RETURN DUE TO THE POOR STATE OF THE BRIDGE AT GR 3670.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR. SEE PARA 1A.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) IN GISENYI, MILOBS LIAISED WITH LOCAL RPA COMMANDERS TO GATHER MORE INFORMATION ON THE ARREST AND DETENTION OF AN EMPLOYEE OF CARE INTERNATIONAL. THE RPA WANTED TO QUESTION THE LOCAL ON HIS COUSIN WHO WAS REPORTED TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THE GENOCIDE. THE COUSIN IS IN EXILE.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN GIKOMERO, GIKONDO, KANOMBE COMMUNES TO MONITOR THE SECURITY SITUATION AND THE PROGRESS OF SCHOOLS, MOST SCHOOLS COMPLAINED OF THE LACK OF STATIONERY, TEXTBOOKS AND TEACHING AIDS. THEY ALSO REPORTED THAT SUPPORT BEING PROVIDED BY UNICEF AND UNESCO WAS INADEQUATE. IN ONE SCHOOL AT GIKOMERO COMMUNE, IT WAS REPORTED THAT TEACHERS HAD NOT BEEN PAID SINCE THE END OF THE WAR.

(B) MILOBS WERE INFORMED ABOUT AN INCREASE IN BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN RUSHESHE SECTOR OF KANOMBE. LOCALS WERE SAID TO BE AFRAID TO LEAVE THEIR HOMES AT NIGHT.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 21 - 28 JAN 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE MIL SIT IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY STABLE.

A. IN SECTOR 4A, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT 15 DPS WERE ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS AT A DPC AT GR 5016 BETWEEN RWAMIKO GR 4913 AND MATA GR 5117. REASON FOR THE ARREST WAS TO FORCE THE DPS AT THE CAMP TO RELEASE AN RPA SOLDIER BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN ABDUCTED BY DPS IN THE MENTIONED CAMP. 11 OF THE DPS WERE LATER RELEASED AND 4 TAKEN AS WITNESSES WHEN IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE ABDUCTED RPA SOLDIER HAD BEEN RELEASED AND WAS IN AN RPA PTL BASE IN THE AREA. THE CAMP IS NOW EMPTY.

B. IN RUKONDO CAMP, AN RPA PL COMD ATTEMPTED TO ORDER HIS TPS TO ATTACK THE AUST INF ELM WHO WAS PROVIDING SECURITY FOR THE AUST MED SCREENING TEAM TO STOP THEM FROM CONDUCTING PTLs IN THE CAMP. THE ISSUE WAS TAKEN UP WITH THE RPA SECTOR COMD.

C. DPS AT KIBEHO CAMP ARE NOT WILLING TO LEAVE THE CAMP AS ICRC CONTINUED TO DISTRIBUTE FOOD IN THE CAMP. THE ACTIVITY OF ICRC HAS ALSO ATTRACTED DPS AND LOCALS FROM OTHER CAMPS AND NEARBY HOME COMMUNES.

D. OVER 1000 FRGF FOR REINTEGRATION INTO THE RPA COMPLETED THEIR TRAINING AT GAKO TRAINING CAMP.

E. MORE MASS GRAVES WERE DISCOVERED IN SECTORS 3, 5 AND 6 IN THE GITISI, KABERA GR 8350, MUKINGI, BUSASANANA GR 2822, GASHARU GR 8087 AND NYARUNYIKA GR 8084 COMMUNES. ALL THE GRAVES DATED BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

F. THERE WAS A GENERAL CLOSE DOWN OF ALL COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES IN KAMEMBE IN SECTOR 4C, BECAUSE THE RPA HAD ORDERED ALL INHABITANTS IN THE AREA TO STAY AT HOME TO ENABLE IT TO CARRY OUT A HOUSE TO HOUSE SEARCH FOR ILLEGAL WPNS AND AMMO. THE EX WAS CONDUCTED FROM 0200 - 1200 HRS ON 26 JAN 95.

G. ON 28 JAN 95, ETHIOBATT TROOPS SHOT AND KILLED ONE BANDIT AND WOUNDED TWO OTHERS IN NYAMASHEKE GR 9740 WHEN THEIR TROOPS WERE FIRED UPON BY BANDITS WHO TRIED TO STEAL CATTLE AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS IN THE AREA. THE TWO INJURED BANDITS WERE CAPTURED AND THE STOLEN ITEMS WERE RECOVERED AND HANDED OVER TO THE OWNERS. TWO RIFLES AND ONE GRENADE FOUND AT THE SCENE OF THE INCIDENT ARE HELD BY ETHIOBATT. UNAMIR MP, MILOBS AND HRFO ARE INVESTIGATING.

(B) IN SECTOR 2, RPA ASKED MILOBS PTL TO STOP FLYING UN FLAG ON UNAMIR VEH STATING THAT THE WAR WAS OVER AND THERE WAS NO NEED FOR THE FLAG.

(C) IN SECTOR 3, RPA ARRESTED 3 LOCALS FROM KORA GR 3821 TO BIGOGWE CAMP ON 21 JAN 95. REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS NOT KNOWN AND INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(D) IN SECTOR 4A, RPA TPS IN MUKO GR 3841 REPORTEDLY IMPRISONED AND BEAT UP 24 LOCALS WHO TRIED TO RETRIEVE THEIR CATTLE FROM THE RPA.

(E) IN SECTOR 4A SOUTH, TWO RPA SOLDIERS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE SHOT A LOCAL BECAUSE OF A DISPUTE OVER THE OWNERSHIP OF 3 HERDS OF CATTLE. THE SOLDIERS HAVE BEEN TAKEN INTO RPA CUSTODY.

(F) ON 26 JAN 95, RPA SOLDIERS IN SECTOR 4B ARRESTED THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE OF MABANZA. NO REASONS WERE GIVEN FOR THE ARREST AND ON 28 JAN 95 TWO RETURNEES WERE ARRESTED AT SAKE GR 4457 IN SECTOR 2, FOR THEIR INVOLVEMENT IN THE GENOCIDE AND ARE BEING HELD AT SAKE COMMUNE PRISON BY THE RPA. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(2) RGF. ELMS OF FRGF/MILITIA WERE REPORTEDLY SEVERELY BEATEN UP IN BUKAVU CAMP GR 7442 WHEN THEY RETURNED TO THE REFUGEE CAMP TO MOVE THEIR FAMILIES ON 20 JAN 95.

(3) MILITIA.

(A) ON NI 21 JAN 95 AT BIREMBO GR 0748 IN SECTOR 4C, ARMED BANDITS SHOT 2 PERSONS KILLING ONE AND SERIOUSLY INJURING THE OTHER AND ROBBED THEM OF THEIR HOUSEHOLD EFFECTS. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT ON THE SAME NIGHT, 2 OTHER LOCALS WERE ROBBED OF THEIR CATTLE NEAR MUBUMBANO GR 0039. IN BOTH INCIDENTS, THE BANDITS ESCAPED TO IJWI ISLAND BY BOAT. IN A THIRD INCIDENT IN THE SAME SECTOR, A GP OF BANDITS ATTACKED THE HOUSE OF THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KAGANO WITH GRENADES AND PETROL FILLED BOTTLES. THEY THEN FIRED SHOTS IN THE AIR AND ESCAPED.

(B) REPORTS INDICATED THAT MILITIA ON IJWI ISLAND ARE IN FULL SUPPORT OF THE FRGF ON THE ISLAND.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(A) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(B) ON 22 JAN 95, THE FC RECEIVED MR BEVON SEVAN, ASSISTANT SEC GEN AND SECURITY COORDINATOR FOR UNNY AND DISCUSSED UNAMIR'S POSITION ON SECURITY. LATER IN THE DAY, HE ATTENDED A MEDAL AND FAREWELL PARADE FOR THE CANADIAN CONTINGENT.

(C) ON 23 JAN 95, THE FC MET MR SEVAN AND NGO REPS TO DISCUSS SECURITY CONCERNS AND EVACUATION PLANS FOR NGO AGENCIES. MR SEVAN DIRECTED UNAMIR

CSO TO PREPARE A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR THE EVACUATION OF NGOS AND CIVILIAN PERSONNEL. HE ALSO MET AN RPA LO TO DISCUSS ACCOMMODATION PROBLEMS IN UNAMIR. HE LATER HELD A MEETING WITH MR PETER HORNSBY TO DISCUSS AIRPORT SECURITY MATTERS. HE ALSO GRANTED AN INTERVIEW TO REUTERS AND MET A DELEGATION OF AUSTRALIAN MINISTERS.

(D) ON 24 JAN 95, FC MET REPS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL AND WELCOMED THEM TO RWANDA. HE ALSO RECEIVED THE USA DEMINING TEAM TO DISCUSS DEMINING IN RWANDA.

(E) ON 25 JAN 95, THE FC ATTENDED THE TUNISIAN MEDAL PRESENTATION IN SECTOR 5. HE LATER MET THE EUROPEAN COMMITTEE DELEGATION TO GIVE AN UPDATE ON THE SIT IN RWANDA. HE ALSO GAVE AN INTERVIEW TO THE TORONTO GLOBE AND MAIL AND LATER MET MRS COLE MENDEZ TO DISCUSS ISSUES OF WOMEN IN RWANDA.

(F) THE FC ATTENDED THE AUSTRALIAN MEDAL CEREMONY AND PRESENTED MEDALS TO THE CONTINGENT ON 26 JAN 95. HE THEN GAVE A PRESS CONFERENCE TO THE AUSTRALIAN PRESS CORPS. (B) LOCALS IN KIVUYE HAVE REPORTED TO PTLs IN THE AREA THAT THEIR RELATIVES IN CAMPS IN ZAIRE ARE WILLING TO RETURN HOME BUT ARE BEING PREVENTED BY THE FRGF AND THE MILITIA. THEY HAVE REQUESTED UNAMIR ASSISTANCE GET THEIR RELATIVES HOME.

(C) PTL TO GASEKE RECOVERED VARIOUS TYPES OF AMMO, ANTI PERS MINES AND GRENS. THE TEAM ALSO LOCATED A MINEFIELD AT ZOKO.

(D) US DEMINING TEAM VISITED LOC ON 28 JAN 95 AND WAS BRIEFED AND SHOWN AROUND BY NICOY EOD TEAM. UXOs THAT HAVE BEEN RECOVERED WERE SHOWN TO THE TEAM.

(E) MED STAFF TREATED 686 LOCALS IN AOR.

(4) **SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT)**.

(A) A TOTAL OF 729 IDPs ARRIVED AT RELIMA AND NGENDA ORC GRID 2561. THEY WERE REGISTERED AND EVAC TO THEIR VARIOUS HOMES.

(C) GHANBATT REPORTED THAT THE RPA SOLDIER WHO WAS REPORTEDLY HELD BY IDPs AT DPC GR 5016 BETWEEN RWAMIKO GR 4913 AND MATA GR 5117 WAS FOUND AT AN RPA PTL BASE IN THE AREA AND 11 OF THE 15 DPs ARRESTED AS A RESULT OF THE MENTIONED INCIDENT HAVE BEEN RELEASED AND WERE UNDER GHANBATT PROTECTION. MILOBS ALSO OBSERVED AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF NOMADS AND CATTLE AROUND THE AKAGERA NATIONAL PARK.
- (5) **IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO.**
- (A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.
- (B) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN SEVERAL PARTS OF THEIR AOR. THE PATROLS INCLUDED AN INVESTIGATION INTO HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS IN KABILIZI IN MUGESERA COMMUNE (SEE SITREP 29 JAN 95 PARA 4K). THE THREE MEN WHO CLAIMED THEY WERE BEING SOUGHT BY THE RPA AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES WERE INTERVIEWED. THE MENTIONED LOCALS ARE NOW UNDER THE PROTECTION OF GHANBATT TROOPS.

HE ADDED THAT THE POPULATION IN THE COMMUNE WAS HIGH BECAUSE MOST OF THE LOCALS WERE NEW, NOT ORIGINAL INHABITANTS.
- (B) MILOBS, TOGETHER WITH MALAWICOY OFFERS CONDUCTED A LIAISON VISIT TO TAC HQ BUTARE TO DISCUSS OP RETOUR. THE IMPORTANCE OF CONVEYING RETURNEES TO ORCs WAS STRESSED. A WORKABLE SYSTEM FOR THE RETURN OF IDPS TO ORCs HAS NOW BEEN ESTABLISHED.

AND TWO COWS INTO ONE OF THEIR BOATS. WHEN ETHIOBATT TRIED TO ARREST THEM, THE BANDITS THREW A GRENADE AT THEM. ETHIOBATT TROOPS OPENED FIRE ON THE GROUP WOUNDING TWO OF THE BANDITS SERIOUSLY. TWO OTHER BANDITS WHO WERE WOUNDED BY ETHIOBATT FIRE BUT TRIED TO ESCAPE BY SWIMMING ACROSS THE LAKE AND POSSIBLY COULD HAVE DROWNED. ONE ETHIOBATT SOLDIER SUFFERED HEAD INJURIES FROM THE GRENADE EXPLOSION. A WELL KNOWN EMPLOYEE OF THE CATHOLIC MISSION WAS KILLED ON THE SPOT. 





WITH THE UNAMIR FORCE COMMANDER, MAJOR GENERAL TOUSIGNANT, AND LATER MET THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, H.E. MR ALPHONSE-MARIE NKUBITO, AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY IN RWANDA, MR JEVENAL NKUSI.

B. AN AUSTRALIAN MILITARY AND PARLIAMENTARY DELEGATION VISITED THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR UNAMIR, DR. A.H. KABIA. THE DELEGATION WAS LED BY SENATOR STEPHEN LOCCOSLEY, PRESIDENT OF THE COMMISSION FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS, DEFENCE AND COMMERCE OF THE AUSTRALIAN PARLIAMENT. DURING THE COURSE OF THE VISIT THEY EXCHANGED VIEWS ON THE CURRENT SITUATION IN RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

(3) OP RETOUR. A TOTAL OF 1,700 IDPs WERE EVACUATED FROM CYANIKA, RUKONDO AND KIBEHO TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES ON 26 JAN 95.

DPS WOULD ALSO BE ALLOWED TO DISEMBARK ONLY AT ORCS IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES. MILOBS INTEND TO IMPROVE THE PROCEDURE IN COOPERATION WITH UNHCR.

(A) NEWLY-POSTED MILOBS TO THE SECTOR WERE TAKEN ON A FAMILIARISATION TOUR OF VARIOUS LOCATIONS AND COMMUNES IN THE SECTOR. THEY WERE ALSO CONDUCTED ROUND THE DPCs IN KIBEHO, NDAGO, MUNINI AND KAMANA.

A. OVER 1000 FORMER GOVERNMENT FORCES GRADUATED AT GAKO TRAINING CAMP AND WILL ASSUME APPOINTMENTS IN THE RPA.

B. IN SECTOR 3 MILOBS REPORTED THAT 4 MASS GRAVES SUSPECTED TO CONTAIN ABOUT 100 BODIES WERE DISCOVERED AT GITISI. MALICOY IN THE SAME SECTOR ALSO REPORTED TWO OTHER MASS GRAVES AT KAREBA GR 8350. ALL THREE MASS GRAVES DATE BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

A. AN ADVANCE TEAM FROM THE OFFICE OF THE PROSECUTOR FOR

THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA IS ON AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA FROM 23 JANUARY - 4 FEBRUARY 1995 TO PREPARE FOR THEIR IMMINENT COMMENCEMENT OF OPERATIONS IN RWANDA. MEMBERS OF THIS TEAM HAVE ALREADY MET THE FORCE COMMANDER, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, H.E MR. ALPHONSE-MARIE NKUBITO, AND REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE UN HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATION IN RWANDA. THEY INTEND TO MEET OTHER GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND TO VISIT LOCATIONS OUTSIDE KIGALI, INCLUDING CRIME SITES, TRANSIT CENTRES AND REFUGEE CAMPS.

B. AN OFFICIAL GRADUATION CEREMONY WAS HELD FOR 73 OFFICERS AND 1011 SOLDIERS ON WEDNESDAY, 25 JAN 95 AT GAKO MILITARY CAMP IN KIGALI RURAL PREFECTURE, AS PART OF A PROGRAM TO INTEGRATE 2,242 SOLDIERS OF THE FORMER RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FORCES INTO THE NEW RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ARMY FOLLOWING COMPLETION OF A FIVE-MONTH TRAINING COURSE. THE FOLLOWING FORMER RGF OFFICERS WERE GIVEN NEW APPOINTMENTS; BRIG (NOW COL) MARCEL GATSINZI, APPOINTED DEPUTY CHIEF OF STAFF OF THE ARMY, COL NDUBWAMI APPOINTED CHIEF OF GENDERMERIE AND LT-COL BAVUGAMESHI, APPOINTED CHIEF OF PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION. ANOTHER GROUP OF 900 SOLDIERS IS STILL UNDERGOING THEIR TRAINING AND WILL GRADUATE IN THE NEAR FUTURE. THE DFC DELIVERED A MESSAGE ON BEHALF OF THE SRSG TO COMMEMORATE THIS OCCASION. THE VICE-PRESIDENT OF RWANDA WHO IS ALSO THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE WELCOMED THE SOLDIERS TO RPA AND ENCOURAGED OTHER FRGF MEMBERS TO FOLLOW SUIT.



1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY STABLE:

A. MILOBS IN SECTOR 2 AND 5 REPORTED THAT RETURNEES FROM TANZA NIA AND ZAIRE REVEALED THAT THERE WAS GENERAL HARASSMENT AND SOMETIMES KILLINGS OF REFUGEES IN THE CAMPS BY THE MILITIA WHEN CAUGHT ATTEMPTING TO RETURN TO RWANDA. THEY ALSO REPORTED THAT ZAIRIAN HUNDE ETHNIC GROUPS WERE ATTACKING THE REFUGEES IN ZAIRIAN REFUGEE CAMPS. REASONS FOR THE ATTACKS WERE NOT GIVEN.

B. RPA DENIED MILOBS AND ICRC ACCESS IN SECTOR 3 WHEN THEY TRIED TO SEE THE BOURGMESTER OF RUSATIRA COMMUNE IN BUTARE PREFECTURE AND DETENTION CENTRES IN KIBUYE TOWN DESPITE HAVING REQUIRED DOCUMENTS.

C. FREQUENT CROSS BORDER ACTS OF BANDITRY, LOOTING AND MURDER REPORTED TO BE RAMPANT IN SECTORS 4C AND 5 HAVE CREATED APPREHENSION AND FEAR AMONG LOCALS.

D. A NUMBER OF MASS GRAVES WERE DISCOVERED IN SECTORS 3 AND 6. THE GRAVES DATE BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA.

(A) RPA CONTINUED TO CONDUCT FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS AND MOUNTED SNAP ROAD BLOCKS IN MAJOR TOWNS AND VILLAGES.

(B) RPA ARRESTS OF COUNSELLORS AND LOCALS HAVE BEEN REPORTED IN SECTORS 2, 3, 4A (SOUTH), 4C AND 5. REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS RANGE FROM BEING SUSPECTED MILITIA TO BEING FORMER GOVT OFFICIALS.

(C) KILLINGS OF LOCALS AND SUSPECTED ACTS OF BANDITRY BY RPA WERE REPORTED IN SECTOR 4C. IN SECTOR 5, RPA FORCED DPs TO LEAVE MATABA GR 7110 AND IN THE PROCESS 5 IDPs WERE KILLED.

(2) FRGF

(A) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C REPORTED THAT INFORMATION RECEIVED INDICATED THAT A NUMBER OF FORMER RGF TPS ARE NOW PRESENT AT BUKAVU AND IJWI AREA. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THERE ARE BETWEEN 40 - 50,000 REFUGEES ON IJWI ISLE.

(B) RGF ACTIVITIES WERE ALSO REPORTED TO BE ON THE INCREASE IN ZAIRE TO THE DISLIKE OF THE ZAIRIAN AUTH. ZAIRIAN TPS WERE REPORTED TO BE PATROLLING REFUGEE CAMPS.

(3) MILITIA THREE MEN BELIEVED TO BE EX-MILITIA FROM GIKONGORO ALLEGEDLY THREATENED TO KILL RETURNEES IN MURAMA COMMUNE (SECT 3) INCL THEIR PARENTS ON THE NIGHT OF 16/17 JAN 95. THE THREE MEN FLED WHEN THEY HEARD OF RPA PRESENCE. THEY HOWEVER DESTROYED CASSAVA PLANTS WITH THEIR MACHETES BEFORE THEIR DEPARTURE.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR

(A) THE FORCE COMMANDER RECEIVED MR BILL CLARENCE FROM THE HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION. HE VISITED THE VICE PRESIDENT OF CONGRESS WHO REQUESTED UNAMIR'S HELP IN DIFFERENT AREAS. THE CHAD DELEGATION, WHICH WAS IN THE COUNTRY, CAME

TO SAY FAREWELL UPON CONCLUSION OF THEIR VISIT AND EXTENDED AN OFFICIAL INVITATION TO THE FC TO VISIT CHAD. THE FC HAD A EXTENDED DISCUSSION WITH AN OFFICIAL OF OXFAM AND LATER MET THE UNHCR SPECIAL ENVOY TO DISCUSS THE SITUATION IN THE IDP CAMPS. HE ALSO HELD A DISCUSSION WITH MR PETRIE OF UNREO. HE WAS INTERVIEWED BY BRUCE WALLACE OF McCLAIN MAGAZINE.

(B). 6,128 IDPS WERE EVACUATED DURING THE WEEK. A TOTAL OF 14,995 IDPS HAVE SO FAR BEEN EVAC FROM SECTOR 4A TO THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES SINCE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE OPERATION RETOUR.

(2) SECTOR 1 (NICOY).

(A) CONDUCTED PTL AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(B) AT RUSHAKI RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN RPA AND LOCALS IS CORDIAL. MOST OF THE PEOPLE WHO FLED DURING THE WAR ARE YET TO RETURN. IT WAS CONFIRMED THAT EXCEPT TEACHERS, ALL CIVIL SERVANTS IN THE COMMUNES HAVE NOT BEEN PAID THEIR SALARIES. THE LOCALS ALSO COMPLAINED OF SHORTAGE OF DRINKING WATER IN THE AREA. THE ONLY MACHINE WHICH WAS PUMPING WATER FOR THE COMMUNES WAS DAMAGED DURING THE WAR. THE LOCALS HAVE REQUESTED UNAMIR ASSISTANCE. THE ONLY CLINIC IN THE COMMUNE ALSO LACKS DRUGS.

(C) A DP CAMP HAS SUDDENLY EMERGED IN NYAGATARE GR 378570. MOST OF THE DPs CAME FROM KAGITUMBA GR 504822. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE DPs HAVE BEEN GROUPED TOGETHER BY THE RPA FOR SCREENING PURPOSES. THE DPs ARE BEING TAKEN CARE OF BY ADRA. ALSO IN THE AREA IS THE WFP WHICH IS PROVIDING RELIEF AID TO LOCALS.

(D) AT BUSHARA GR 112314 EOD TEAM DML SEVERAL UXO AND MINES. AT SHANGASHA GR 088316 A MINE FIELD HAS BEEN LOCATED AND IT HAS BEEN MARKED. AT NYANBISHANBI GR 105281, THE ROADS LEADING TO THE VILLAGE AND PRIMARY SCHOOL IN THE AREA WERE CLEARED OF MINES AND ARE NOW FIT FOR USE.

(E) PROVIDED MED ASSISTANCE TO A TOTAL OF 537 LOCALS.

(3) SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

(4) SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY).

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN ACP. OBSERVED MANY LOCALS RETURNING TO THEIR HOMES IN THE SECTOR.

(B) MALAWICOY PTL TO KABULEMERA GR 6110 IN RUNYINYA COMMUNE REPORTED THAT ON THE NIGHT OF 16 JAN 95 TWO LOCALS WERE MATCHETED BY BANDITS FROM GIKONGORO. THE VICTIMS SUSTAINED HEAD INJURIES AND WERE TAKEN TO THE MSF DISPENSARY AT THE COMMUNE FOR TREATMENT. THE BANDITS WERE ARMED WITH GRENS, MATCHETES AND STONES. THE RPA WERE INFO OF THE INCIDENT; THEY WERE HOWEVER UNABLE TO STOP THE BANDITS.

(C) AT NDAGO GR 5201 PTLs REPORTED THAT TWO MEN WERE MATCHETED TO DEATH BY UNKNOWN ATTACKERS IN THE CAMP. LOCALS STILL UNWILLING TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES BECAUSE OF THE SY SIT. UNAMIR AND RPA HAVE INTENSIFIED PTLs IN THE AREA.

(D) TREATED A TOTAL OF 59 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(5) SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(A) A NON-DENOMINATIONAL CHURCH SERVICE AND MOSLEM PRAYERS WERE HELD BY GHANBATT CHAPLAIN AND IMAM AT PTL BASE IN RUNYOMBNI ON 15 JAN 95. LOCALS AND SOME DPs ATTENDED THE SERVICE.

(B) IN SECTOR 2, PTLs TO MUGESERA REPORTED THAT THERE ARE ABOUT 2,000 YOUNG MEN HELD IN MUGESERA PRISON.

(C) GHANBATT MED TEAM AND HUMAN RIGHTS REPS VISITED AND TREATED PRISONERS IN MUGESERA PRISON GR 4764.

(D) TREATED A TOTAL OF 178 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(6) SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAMBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs, ESCORTS AND GUARD DUTIES IN AOR.

(A) INCREASED PTLs AND MAINTAINED A 24 HR PRESENCE IN RUKONDO AND CYANIKA DP CAMPS AND HOME COMMUNES WITHIN THE SECTOR.

(B) PROVIDED TRANSPORT AND SY TO THE MEDIA TEAM FROM REUTERS, BBC, VOA, NEW YORK TIMES, MACLEANS (CANADA), NFB (CANADA) AND PAFFO WHO VISITED CYANIKA CAMP TO INTERVIEW IDPs.

(C) 22 IDPs WHO WERE TAKEN TO SECTOR 2 ON 14 JAN 95 TO VERIFY FOR THEMSELVES THE SY SITUATION IN THE HOME COMMUNES WERE BROUGHT BACK ON 16 JAN 95.

(D) DPs IN MURAMBI DPC REFUSED TO REGISTER FOR REPATRIATION AS THEY WERE STILL APPREHENSIVE OF

THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES.

(E) TWO BOURGMESTERS FROM GITARAMA AND MASANGO COMMUNES WITH REPS FROM SOME UN AGENCIES ADDRESSED IDPs IN RUKONDO DP CAMP AND ASSURED THEM OF THE SY SITUATION IN THE HOME COMMUNES.

(F) UNREO INFORMED CYANIKA IDPs THAT THE DP CAMP WOULD BE CLOSED BY 24 JAN 95.

(G) A TOTAL OF 770 PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY MEDICAL STAFF DURING THE WEEK.

(7) SECTOR 4B (FRAFATT). CONDUCTED PTLs, ESCORTS AND GUARD DUTIES IN AOR. PTL SENT TO NDABA REPORTED THAT A LOCAL WAS ATTACKED ON NIGHT OF 16 JAN 95 BY THREE MILITIA MEN.

(8) SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT MOBILE PTLs IN AOR.

(A) TRANSPORTED A TOTAL OF 32 REFUGEES FROM RUSIZI - 1 GR 7424 TO NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP WITH OWN TRUCKS.

(B) ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOYS CARRYING A TOTAL OF 429 DPs FROM NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP TO KITABI GR 3520.

(C) PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 165 CIVILIANS.

(D) ETHIOBATT REPORTED TWO GREN EXPLOSIONS WHICH KILLED 2 LOCALS AND SERIOUSLY INJURED SIX OTHERS. EOD TEAM SENT TO THE AREA FOUND AND DML TWO OTHER GRENS.

(9) SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CARRIED OUT PATROLS AND SECURITY DUTIES THROUGHOUT THE SECTOR.

(A) SOME RETURNEES FROM KAREBA GR 4224 HAVE COMPLAINED THAT THEIR HOMES HAVE BEEN OCCUPIED BY REFUGEES OF 1959, AND WANT THEIR HOUSES BACK. UNHCR IS INVESTIGATING THE MATTER.

(B) RPA PTL DENIED TUNBATT PTL ACCESS TO NORTH MUTUVO GR 2829.

(C) PTLs TO GITEBWE REPORTED THAT THE DIRECTOR OF PRIMARY SCHOOLS IN GITEBWE GR 4811 HAS MENTIONED THAT PUPILS HAVE REFUSED TO ATTEND CLASSES BECAUSE THEY ARE SCARED OF RPA REPRISALS.

(D) MEDICAL STAFF PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 576 RWANDESE PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(10) SECTOR 6 (INDBATT). CARRIED OUT VEH PTLS AND PROVIDED SECURITY FOR ALL UN INSTALLATIONS WITHIN THE SECTOR.

(A) PTL TEAM IN KIGALI DISCOVERED A NUMBER OF ASSORTED AMMUNITION IN THE VILLAGE OF KABEZA GR 087795.

(B) REGIMENTAL MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED A TOTAL OF 1,701 CIVIL PATIENTS AT CLINIC.

(11) MILOB GP HQ. PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS WERE CARRIED OUT DURING THE PERIOD.

(A) POLITICAL.

I. A POLITICAL RALLY WAS HELD AT NYAGAHANGA CHURCH COMPOUND IN SECT 1. ABOUT 60 PERS ATTENDED.

II. IN SECTOR 2 RPA COMD AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES ADDRESSED 512 REFUGEES FROM BURUNDI AT NGENDA AND URGED THEM TO RETURN TO THEIR COUNTRY. THEY WERE HOWEVER TOLD TO WAIT UNTIL GOVT GAVE CLEARANCE.

III. PREFECT OF GITARAMA HELD A CONFERENCE WITH ALL BOURGEMESTERS TO DISCUSS SECURITY IN THE AREA. CONFERENCE WAS ATTENDED BY RPA 305 BDE COMD.

IV. THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA ADDRESSED A POLITICAL MEETING OF ABOUT 1,000 LOCALS AT MUHURA.

(B) BORDERS. BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED DURING THE PERIOD EXCEPT GISENYI BORDER POST WHICH WAS CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERS.

(C) IN SECTOR 1 - BYUMBA. PTLS WERE CONDUCTED IN THE SECTOR.

I. BOURGEMESTRE OF MUVUMBA REPORTED THAT NO FOOD HAS BEEN DISTRIBUTED IN THE AREA SINCE EARLY DEC 94. THE BOURGEMESTRE ALSO MENTIONED THAT THE RETURNEES REQUIRE TENTS, SEEDS AND FARM IMPLEMENTS.

II. HUMAN RIGHTS PERS MET THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA AND DISCUSSED THE POSSIBILITY OF SETTING UP A WORK GROUP TO WORK OUT REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A LOCAL JUDICIAL SYSTEM.

III. MILOBS ESCORTED NICOY ENGRS TO CLEAR BUSHARA GR 088327, NYABISHAMBI GR 098287 AND UKABUKA GR 100315 OF MINES AND UXOs.

(D) IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO. PTLs WERE CONDUCTED IN THE SECTOR.

I. MILOBS ESCORTED UNREO AND RPA DELEGATION TO MUGESERA COMMUNE. DELEGATION VISITED IDPs WHO RECENTLY RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES FROM SECT 4A.

II. SECTOR MILOBS HELD A MEETING WITH LOCAL AUTH OF RELIMA ON 15 JAN 95 TO DISCUSS SY, ARRESTS AND PROSECUTION OF PEOPLE IN THE AREA.

III. IN NYAMATA, MILOBS CARRIED OUT INVESTIGATION ON REPORTS OF MOVEMENT OF PEOPLE TO BURUNDI. LOCAL AUTHORITIES REPORTED THAT PEOPLE WERE NOT MOVING TO BURUNDI, HOWEVER THEY BELIEVED THAT THE MILITIA HAD MOVED FROM TANZANIA TO BURUNDI AND WERE RECRUITING PEOPLE FOR TRAINING IN TANZANIA.

IV. GHANBATT (SECT 2) WAS INFO BY LOCALS OF KAZENZE AND MUGESERA THAT LOCAL AUTH AND RPA IN THE AREAS HAVE BEEN HARASSING THEM. THE LOCALS IN THE 2 COMMUNES REQUESTED FOR UNAMIR PROTECTION. GHANBATT HAS INTENSIFIED PTLs IN THE AREA. GHANBATT ALSO INFO MILOBS THAT 3 PERS HAD SOUGHT REFUGE AT GHANBATT PLATOON POSN IN RWANTERU GR 7948.

V. UNHCR HAS SET UP A RECEPTION CENTRE AT MATIMBA TO CATER FOR RETURNEES FROM UGANDA. 11,925 RETURNEES HAVE SO FAR BEEN REGISTERED. THE CENTRE HOWEVER LACKS BEDDINGS, SANITARY FACILITIES, GOOD DRINKING WATER AND DRUGS. AN OUTBREAK OF SMALL POX AND MALARIA HAS BEEN REPORTED AND THERE ARE 422 RETURNEES STILL LIVING IN THE RECEPTION CENTRE.

(E) IN SECTOR 3 - GITARAMA. SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN AOR.

I. IN MUYIRA THE POPULATION WAS REPORTED TO BE SPARSE EVEN THOUGH MOST OF THOSE WHO FLED DURING THE WAR HAD RETURNED. THEY REPORTED LACK OF DRINKING WATER, FOOD, FARMING IMPLEMENTS AND SEEDS IN THE COMMUNE.

II. IN NTONGWE COMMUNE, RETURNEES WERE REPORTED TO BE LIVING IN SHELTERS BECAUSE

THEIR HOMES WERE DESTROYED DURING THE WAR. THE RETURNEES HAVE ASKED FOR BUILDING MATERIALS, FARMING TOOLS AND SEEDS.

III. PTLS TO RWABICUMA REPORTED THAT THERE WERE NO RETURNEES NOR ANY NGO ACTIVITIES TAKING PLACE IN THE AREA. THERE IS AN OUTBREAK OF MALARIA AND MEASLES AND THE LOCALS NEED MED AID. THERE IS ALSO NO ELECTRICITY AND CLEAN WATER IN THE AREA.

IV. IN NYARUSANEE AREA, PTLS REPORTED THAT OUT OF 6,000 INHABITANTS BEFORE THE WAR, 3,000 WERE KILLED AND ABOUT 1,000 NOW LIVE IN CAMPS IN ZAIRE. MENINGITIS AND MALARIA WERE COMMON IN THE AREA. THERE IS NO NGO ACTIVITY IN THE AREA. LOCALS NEED TOOLS AND SEEDS.

V. MILOBS PTLS TO MYIRA, TAMBWE AND KIGOMA COMMUNES WERE SHOWN A TOTAL OF 21 MASS GRAVES CLAIMED BY LOCALS TO CONTAIN OVER 10,000 BODIES. THE GRAVES DATE BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

(F) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO.

I. THE AUTH OF RUKONDO HAVE ORDERED DPs TO REMOVE ALL UNAUTH SHOP STRUCTURES FROM THE CAMP. RPA SUPERVISED THE REMOVAL OF THE STRUCTURES.

II. MILOBS ALSO PATROLLED CYANIKA CAMP AS PART OF OP RETOUR. MORE DPs ARE NOW WILLING TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE ENTHUSIASM OF THE DPs TO RETURN HAD NOT BEEN ANTICIPATED. DPs INTERVIEWED ANNOUNCED THAT THEY WERE NOW SATISFIED WITH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY. SOME DPs WERE CONVEYED TO THE BUTARE AREA TO ASSESS THE SECURITY SITUATION FOR THEMSELVES.

III. SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN RURAMBA, BUHORO, MUDASOMWA, NYAMIGINA, MUGANO, KAMANA AND KIZI CAMPS. THE TOTAL DPs IN THE CAMPS WAS ESTIMATED AT 52,000.

IV. NDAGO AND MUNINI CAMPS REPORTED TO HAVE 59,000 AND 20,000 IDPs RESPECTIVELY. A TOTAL OF ABOUT 5,000 IDPs HAVE LEFT NDAGO CAMP FOR THEIR HOMES COMMUNES.

(G) IN SECTOR 4B - KIBUYE. SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN AOR. LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN MURINDA SAID THAT SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN THE AREA

REQUIRE EXTENSIVE REPAIRS BEFORE THEY COULD RE-OPEN IN FEBRUARY SINCE MOST OF THEM WERE DAMAGED DURING THE WAR.

(H) IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU. MILOBS CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

I. ABOUT 50,000 RWANDESE WERE REPORTED TO BE LIVING ON IJWI ISLAND.

II. TWO INCIDENTS OF BANDITRY IN THE RWESERO SUB-SECTOR WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD. IN THE FIRST INCIDENT AT RWESERO, 20 BANDITS ARMED WITH AUTOMATIC WEAPONS AND SPEARS AND DRESSED IN MIXED CIVILIAN AND MILITARY UNIFORMS ATTACKED A LOCAL HOUSEHOLD AND ROBBED IT OF HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND SEVERAL LIVESTOCK. FIVE TEENAGE SONS IN THE HOUSE WERE TIED UP BEFORE THE BANDITS MADE THEIR ESCAPE IN THE DIRECTION OF GASAYO GR 9941. IN THE SECOND INCIDENT, ANOTHER HOUSEHOLD WAS ROBBED OF 2 COWS AND 25,000 RFR. ONE OF THE ESCAPING BANDITS WAS SHOT AND KILLED BY AN RPA SOLDIER. IT IS BELIEVED THAT BANDITS ESCAPED TO IJWI ISLAND IN BOATS.

(I) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.

I. SECTOR MILOBS ATTENDED A COORDINATING CONFERENCE ON THE MODALITIES FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ORCS IN GOMA CORRIDOR. CONFERENCE WAS ATTENDED BY REPS FROM VARIOUS NGOS. IT WAS DECIDED TO INCLUDE THE PREFECT AND BOURGEMSTRE IN THE PLANNING OF THE SCHEME TO ENSURE SUCCESSFUL IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAMME.

II. MILOBS PATROL TO THE BORDER AREAS INDICATED THAT THERE IS A REPORTED INFLUX OF RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE BY BOATS.

(J) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI. CONDUCTED PTLS WITHIN SECTOR.

I. MILOB PATROLS COVERED BUTAMWA, ARAYABA AND DRUSORORRO AREAS TO MONITOR THE HUMANITARIAN SITUATION. SCHOOLS ARE REPORTED TO BE OPEN IN THE COMMUNE. HOWEVER THE ATTENDANCE IS NOT AS LARGE AS THE PRE-WAR ATTENDANCE. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS ALSO REPORTED CALM.

II. SECT MILOBS CONDUCTED PTLS TO INVESTIGATE AND LOCATE MASS GRAVES IN THE SECTOR. 3 X MASS GRAVES LOCATED WEST OF

NYAMIRAMBO GR 691761 ARE SUSPECTED TO CONTAIN 450 BODIES. AT KIMIHURURA, TWO MASS GRAVES WERE LOC AT GR 090830 AND GR 089843. THE FIRST SAID TO HAVE THE CORPSE OF FORMER MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURE AND HIS FAMILY AND THE SECOND SUSPECTED TO CONTAIN ABOUT 1,000 CORPSES. ANOTHER MASS GRAVE WAS LOC AT RUBUNGO COMMUNE GR 179906 WITH ABOUT 150 CORPSES.

III. SECTOR MILOBS CARRIED OUT PTLS TO INVESTIGATE AND LOC MASS GRAVES IN BUTAMWA, GIKOMERO, GIKONDO, KACYIRU AND KICUKIRO COMMUNES. A TOTAL OF 10 MASS GRAVES CONTAINING APPROXIMATELY 19,971 BODIES HAVE BEEN LOC. THE MASS GRAVE AT GIKONDO WAS ESTIMATED TO CONTAIN 10,950 BODIES. ONE OF THE GRAVES DISCOVERED CONTAINED 3 CORPSES ESTIMATED TO BE ABOUT ONE MONTH OLD. THE REST OF THE MASS GRAVES DATE BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR. THE TEAM ALSO DISCOVERED A HOUSE AT GR 0778 WITH 10-20 CORPSES IN IT STILL UNBURIED.

(12) AUSMED THE SPT FORCE PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(A) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 263 PATIENTS. CHK HELD 86 IN PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(B) MED SCREENING TEAM AND PROTECTIVE ELEMENT IN SPT OF OP RETOUR IN THE WEEK SCREENED 355 IDPs AND TREATED 77 DENTAL PATIENTS AT KIBEHO, CYANIKA, RUKONDO AND MAMARESHO CAMPS.

(C) INT ELM AND PREVENTIVE MED ELM DEPLOYED AT CYANGUGU TO CONDUCT INT LIAISON AND INFORMATION GATHERING.

(D) MED ELM AND SEC CONDUCTED MED CHECK OF SCHOOL CHILDREN AT KAGANZA GR 6951. ELMS EXAMINED AND TREATED 579 CHILDREN.

(E) AUSMED ELM DELIVERED MED SUPPLIES TO CLINIC AT KIBILIRA.

(13) 1 CDHSR. PREPARATIONS FOR REDEPLOYMENT AND THE HANDOVER TO 95 FLSC CONTINUED.

(A) SIGNALS SON. NTR.

(B) 3CSG. REDEPLOYMENT LOADING CONTINUES.

(C) MEDICAL. MEDICAL TEAM RETURNED FROM GAGENZA. THEY HELPED TO GIVE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

TO 1205 SCHOOL CHILDREN.

(14) AIR OPS. . NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. A TOTAL OF 112 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE WEEK.

(15) UN MP COY

(A) PROVIDED POLICE AND SECURITY SERVICES THROUGHOUT KIGALI.

(B) HANDED OVER 3 SUSPECTS FROM GHANBATT TO THE LOCAL PROSECUTOR IN KIGALI.

4. UNCIVPOL

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE SECTORS.

B. THE NEWLY ARRIVED GERMAN CIVPOL OBSERVERS COMPLETED THEIR ORIENTATION PROGRAMME.

C. IN SECTOR 5, CIVPOL COMMISSIONER IN COMPANY OF OFFICERS FROM THE GENDARMERIE HQ VISITED THE RUHENGARI GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL TO ASSESS AND EVALUATE THE PROGRESS AT THE SCHOOL. A TEAM OF JOURNALISTS FROM UNAMIR RADIO VISITED THE TRAINING SCHOOL TO INTERVIEW THE STAFF WITH A VIEW OF INFORMING THE PUBLIC ON THE TRAINING OF THE GENDARMES.

D. THE PUBLIC PROSECUTOR OF KIGALI MR. FRANCOIS NSANZUWERE DISCLOSED THAT KIGALI PRISON HAD 6,081 INMATES. 1,338 OF THIS FIGURE (6,081) HAVE ALREADY BEEN INTERROGATED. HE SAID THOSE NOT IMPLICATED BY HARD EVIDENCE WILL BE RELEASED. HE CALLED FOR LOGISTICAL ASSISTANCE FROM UNAMIR AND OTHER HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES.

E. THE DEATH TOLL IN KIGALI PRISON IS REPORTLY ON AVERAGE BETWEEN 1 TO 5 ON A DAILY BASIS. THAT STARVATION IS THE MAJOR CAUSE.

A. ROUTINE IOM/UNHCR TRANSPORTATION OF IDPS TOOK PLACE FROM NDERA WAY STATION IN KIGALI TO COMMUNES IN KIBUNGO AND SOUTH KIGALI. OP RETOUR CONTINUED.

B. UNREO HELD A SEMINAR ON THE GENOCIDE IN RWANDA.

6. CIVIL AFFAIRS. NTR.

7. LOGISTICS. AS PER PREVIOUS WEEKLY SITREP.

8. CASUALTIES. NIL.

9. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. A TOTAL 4 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHS WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD. NO CASUALTIES OR MAJOR DAMAGE RESULTED.

10. CONCLUSION. THE GENERAL SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS CALM. THERE WAS HOWEVER A MARKED INCREASE IN ACTS OF BANDITRY IN THE COASTAL TOWNS AND VILLAGES IN SECTORS 4C AND 5, PROBABLY BY FRGF ELEMENTS FROM ACROSS THE BORDER. THE MOTIVE IS TO OBTAIN FOOD AND ALSO CREATE A CLIMATE OF INSECURITY IN THE AFFECTED AREAS.
