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ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION N° 011/95

SUBJECT: Security of UNAMIR Vehicles

1. Further to the previous Administrative Instructions issued on this subject, please be advised that effective 27 March 1995, all personnel to whom UNAMIR vehicles are assigned will be required to park their vehicles in the compound of the Amahoro Hotel, in the parking area of premises where UNAMIR provides security such as the Belgian Village, the Chez Lando, Trafipro or in areas where security is provided by the establishment such as the Meridien, in the absence of their being able to provide secure overnight parking at their residences. For those in a position to secure overnight parking at their residences, a statement to this effect should be sent to the CTO with copy to the Chief of Security and Safety Unit, attesting to and describing such an arrangement. These parking areas must be utilized during the hours from the cessation of official duties in the evening (including a reasonable time for shopping and meals) to resumption of duties on the following morning.
2. To assist the personnel affected by this instruction, a shuttle bus each will be available at Trafipro and Amahoro Hotel to take staff to their residences. Those buses will depart Trafipro and Amahoro Hotel every hour on the hour between 18:00 hours and 21:00 hours. Owing to the prevailing security situation in Rwanda all UNAMIR vehicles must be parked at 21:00 hours, except when exigencies of work or operational needs require that a vehicle be driven beyond that hour.
3. Not under any circumstances should UNAMIR vehicles be parked unattended, on streets or outside discos or night clubs during the hours of darkness or for prolonged periods during daytime, unless securely guarded. Loss of or damage to UNAMIR vehicles, while parked unattended in areas other than those outlined in paragraph 1 above will be regarded as being the direct responsibility of the driver or custodian of the vehicle, who will be requested to make financial restitution to the United Nations for such loss or damage.

4. When leaving the car unattended the driver must ensure that all doors, windows and trunk lids are securely locked. During overnight parking, the vehicle must be parked in a safe place such as a garage, or in a well lighted guarded area. Overnight parking at the airport will under no circumstances be permitted. The keys should never be left in an unattended vehicle.
5. All incidents of theft from/or damage to UNAMIR vehicles must be reported immediately to the Transport Section and Security Office.
6. In instances where staff to whom vehicles are assigned depart the immediate area of their assignment, their vehicles must be handed over with their keys to their immediate successor within the same section, should he/she not already have a vehicle. In the event that this is not necessary, the vehicle with its keys should be delivered to the Chief Transport Section. This will allow an opportunity for maintenance and utilization of the vehicle as may be deemed necessary.
7. Failure to observe the foregoing simple requirements, resulting from which vehicles are damaged or from which items are stolen, may cause the personnel to whom the vehicles were assigned, to have to make financial restitution to the United Nations, should subsequent Survey Board actions result in the determination that they have been negligent.

7. CLOGO only: CLOGO is requested to make arrangements for food and accommodation for the participants from 12 Jul - 14 Jul 95. The participants will be accommodated in UNAMIR Transit Camp.

8. All Contingents/MILOBS/CIVPOL will keep the CLOGO informed of their time of arrival at Kigali.

**FORCE COMMANDER'S DIRECTIVE ON THE LEGAL JURISDICTION
APPLICABLE TO UNAMIR AND RWANDAN AUTHORITIES**

References: A. UNAMIR SOPs, Part 3, Section 17, Rules of Engagement dated 24 July 1995.
B. FC Directive on Conduct, Dress and Weapon Carriage Policy dated 26 April 1995.

INTRODUCTION

1. This updated Directive is effective on receipt and cancels the earlier version which was issued on 23 July 1995. It has the support of the SRSG's office, ICRC and UNHCRFOR.

GENERAL

2. In the conduct of their duties, UNAMIR personnel may be required to hand over individuals to the Government of Rwanda. This hand over may occur as a result of Rwandan authorities seeking legal jurisdiction over foreign or Rwandan nationals.

DEFINITIONS

3. The following definitions shall apply to this Directive:

- a. "Appropriate authority" at this stage, refers only to the Prosecutor's Office. Further changes to this definition will be notified in writing by the FC.
- b. "Civilian component" consists of UN officials and of other persons assigned by the Secretary-General to assist the SRSG or made available by participating States to serve as part of UNAMIR.

- c. "Detainee" is any person who is held for committing a hostile act or hostile intent against any of the categories of people referred to in paragraphs 7d and 7e below.
- d. "Legal Jurisdiction" includes but is not limited to those situations where Rwandan authorities seek to take a foreign or Rwandan national into custody.
- e. "Military personnel of national contingents" includes military staff at UNAMIR HQ.
- f. "Official capacity" for UNAMIR troops is any time soldiers are in uniform or in civilian clothes for official functions (see Reference B).
- g. "UNHRCFOR" is the United Nations Human Rights Field Operations in Rwanda.
- h. "Visitors" includes, but is not limited to, journalists, tourists, dignitaries representing national governments and non-UNAMIR personnel permitted to enter UNAMIR premises.

AIM

4. The aim of this Directive is to outline the procedures for handing over individuals or groups of people to the Rwandan authorities.

FOREIGN NATIONALS AND RWANDAN JURISDICTION

5. Rwandan authorities may seek jurisdiction over the following categories of foreign nationals:
- a. SRSG, Force Commander and the Police Commissioner of CIVPOL;
 - b. UN civilian officials assigned to the civilian component to serve with UNAMIR;
 - c. United Nations Military Observers (UNMOs), Civilian Police (CIVPOL) and civilian personnel from overseas who are employed by the UN specifically for this mission but who are not UNAMIR staff (experts consultants) (hereinafter referred to as "experts on mission");
 - d. military personnel of national contingents who are part of UNAMIR;
 - e. personnel of UN specialised agencies;

- f. personnel of NGOs; and
- g. visitors.

6. The legal status of these categories of personnel and the hand over procedures for them are detailed at Annexes A and C respectively.

• **RWANDAN NATIONALS AND RWANDAN JURISDICTION**

7. Rwandan authorities may seek jurisdiction over the following categories of Rwandan nationals:

- a. Locally recruited personnel who are working for the UN.
- b. Rwandans who seek UNAMIR protection.
- c. Rwandans who are detained by UNAMIR personnel for committing or who are suspected of committing a hostile act or display hostile intent (as defined in Reference A) or a serious criminal offence against Rwandan or International Humanitarian law.
- d. Rwandans who are detained for stealing and/or damaging property, or are suspected of stealing and/or damaging property belonging to, or in the care of, UNAMIR, UN humanitarian organisations or UN protected sites (see Reference A).

8. The legal status and hand over for Rwandan nationals is at Annexes A and D respectively.

9. Witnesses. Rwandan nationals who request the protection of UNAMIR because they have witnessed and/or have been the subject of serious physical abuse may be provided with such protection if their circumstances fall within the mandate and/or it is considered that a moral obligation exists for the provision of such assistance. The decision to offer such assistance will only be provided by the express authorization of UNAMIR HQ. A request for such assistance should be made as soon as possible after the initial request is made.


10. Any person in the care of UNAMIR troops are to be treated humanely, ensuring that they are provided with food, drinking water and that they are afforded safeguards in terms of health, hygiene and protection against the rigours of climate and the dangers of armed conflict.

MEMBERS OF THE RWANDAN PATRIOTIC ARMY (RPA)

11. It is not within the mandate of UNAMIR to provide protection to members of the RPA. Should a member of the RPA seek protection the member is to be advised that protection will not be given.

12. Should the person seeking protection request the assistance of UNAMIR to liaise with the appropriate RPA authority for his handover, he should be informed that UNAMIR is unable to provide protection and HQ UNAMIR is to be informed in order to coordinate all actions. HQ UNAMIR will ensure that the appropriate local and UNAMIR RPA Liaison officer are informed.

13. The person seeking protection is not to be treated as a detainee and as such may have leave UNAMIR property at any time.

PROCEDURES FOR HANDING OVER FOREIGN NATIONALS

UN CIVILIAN ASSIGNED TO THE CIVILIAN COMPONENT TO SERVE WITH UNAMIR

1. As soon as a Rwandan authority seeks legal jurisdiction over a UN civilian assigned to the civilian component to serve with UNAMIR, the SRSG, or his representative, HQ UNAMIR, and the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and UNHRCFOR must be notified. HQ UNAMIR is to dispatch Military Police (MP).
2. UNAMIR soldiers are not to allow the Rwandan authority(s) to take custody of the UN civilian unless the SRSG has given permission for this to occur. UNAMIR troops are to allow MP to liaise with the Rwandan authority(s).
3. If the Rwandan authority(s) uses force to attempt to take custody of the UN civilian, UNAMIR troops are authorised to use force in accordance with Reference A.
4. If authority is given for the hand over, the UN civilian must be taken to the appropriate Prosecutor's Office (details of these offices are at Annex E). The ICRC and UNHRCFOR are to be notified as far as possible in advance and, if possible, are to be present during the hand over. The proforma at Annex G is to be completed and signed by the UNAMIR person conducting the hand over and the person in the Prosecutor's Office to whom the hand over is made.
5. A report detailing the following is to be submitted to UNAMIR HQ, attention G1 Pers, G2, G3 Ops and the Force Provost Marshall:
 - a. name of person handed over,
 - b. location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
 - c. crime person was accused of,
 - d. name of the UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
 - e. date, time and place the person was handed to the Prosecutor's Office, and
 - f. whether an ICRC and UNHRCFOR representative was present during the handover and if not, why not.

UNMOs, CIVPOL AND EXPERTS ON MISSION

6. As soon as Rwandan authority seeks legal jurisdiction over an UNMO, CIVPOL or an Expert on Mission, the FC or his representative, the SRSG or his representative and the ICRC and UNHRCFOR must be notified. HQ UNAMIR is to dispatch MP or CIVPOL to the site. The Rwandan authority is to be reminded that these members are, under Rwandan and international law, immune from arrest, detention or the seizure of their baggage.

7. UNAMIR soldiers are not to allow the Rwandan authority(s) to take custody of an UNMO, CIVPOL or an Expert on Mission unless the FC and/or the SRSG has given permission for this to occur. UNAMIR troops are to allow MP or CIVPOL to liaise with the Rwandan authority(s).

8. If the Rwandan authority(s) uses force to attempt to take custody of the UNMO, CIVPOL or Expert on Mission, UNAMIR troops are authorised to use force in accordance with Reference A.

9. If authority is given for the hand over, the UNMO, CIVPOL or Expert on Mission must be taken to the appropriate Prosecutor's Office (details of these offices are at Annex E). The ICRC and UNHRCFOR are to be notified as far as possible in advance and, if possible, are to be present during the handover. The proforma at Annex G is to be completed and signed by the UNAMIR person conducting the hand over and the person in the Prosecutor's Office to whom the hand over is made.

10. A report detailing the following is to be submitted to UNAMIR HQ, attention G1 Pers, G3 Ops, and the Force Provost Marshall:

- a. name of person handed over,
- b. location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- c. crime person accused of,
- d. name of the UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- e. date, time and place the person was handed to the Prosecutor's Office, and
- f. whether an ICRC and UNHRCFOR representative was present during the hand over and if not, why not.

MILITARY PERSONNEL OF NATIONAL CONTINGENTS WHO ARE A PART OF UNAMIR

11. As soon as a Rwandan authority seeks legal jurisdiction over military personnel of national contingents who are part of UNAMIR, the FC or his representative, the appropriate contingent commander and the ICRC must be notified. HQ UNAMIR is to dispatch MP to the site. The Rwandan authority should be reminded that military members of the military component of UNAMIR shall be subject to the exclusive

jurisdiction of their respective participating states in respect of any criminal offences which may have been committed by them in Rwanda.

12. UNAMIR soldiers are not to allow the Rwandan authority(s) to take custody of another UNAMIR soldier unless the FC and the appropriate contingent commander have given permission for this to occur. UNAMIR troops are to allow MP to liaise with the Rwandan authority(s).

13. If the Rwandan authority(s) uses force to attempt to take custody of the UNAMIR soldier, UNAMIR troops are authorised to use force in accordance with Reference A.

14. If authority is given for the hand over, the UNAMIR soldier must be taken to the appropriate Prosecutor's Office (details of these offices are at Annex E). The ICRC and UNHRCFOR are to be notified as far as possible in advance and, if possible, are to be present during the hand over. The proforma at Annex G is to be completed and signed by the UNAMIR person conducting the hand over and the person in the Prosecutor's Office to whom the hand over is made.

15. A report detailing the following is to be submitted to UNAMIR HQ, attention G1 Pers, G3 Ops, and the Force Provost Marshall:

- a. name of person handed over,
- b. location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- c. crime person accused of,
- d. name of the UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- e. date, time and place the person was handed to the Prosecutor's Office, and
- f. whether an ICRC and UNHRCFOR representative was present during the hand over and if not, why not.

PERSONNEL OF UN SPECIALISED AGENCIES

16. As soon as a Rwandan authority seeks legal jurisdiction over a member of a UN specialised agency, the SRSG or his representative, the appropriate head of agency and the ICRC and UNHRCFOR must be notified. HQ UNAMIR is to dispatch MP to the site.

17. UNAMIR soldiers are not to allow the Rwandan authority(s) to take custody of a member of a UN specialised agency unless the SRSG and the appropriate head of the agency have given permission for this to occur. UNAMIR troops are to allow MP to liaise with the Rwandan authority(s).

18. If the Rwandan authority(s) uses force to attempt to take custody of a member of a UN specialised agency, UNAMIR troops are authorised to use force in accordance with Reference A.

19. If authority is given for the handover, the person must be taken to the appropriate Prosecutor's Office (details of these offices are at Annex E). The ICRC and UNHRCFOR are to be notified as far as possible in advance and, if possible, are to be present during the hand over. The proforma at Annex G is to be completed and signed by the UNAMIR person conducting the hand over and the person in the Prosecutor's Office to whom the hand over is made.

20. A report detailing the following is to be submitted to UNAMIR HQ, attention G1 Pers, G3 Ops, and the Force Provost Marshall and the UN agency concerned:

- a. name of person handed over and the agency they work for,
- b. location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- c. crime person accused of,
- d. name of the UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- e. date, time and place the person was handed to the Prosecutor's Office, and
- f. whether an ICRC and UNHRCFOR representative was present during the hand over and if not, why not.

INTERNATIONAL PERSONNEL OF NGOS

21. As soon as a Rwandan authority seeks legal jurisdiction over an international member of an NGO, HQ UNAMIR, the appropriate head of the NGO agency and the ICRC and UNHRCFOR must be notified. HQ UNAMIR is to dispatch MP to the site.

22. UNAMIR soldiers are to allow the Rwandan authority(s) to take custody of a international member of an NGO if that person(s) is identified as having legal authority (ie., (ie Gendarme, Prosecutors). UNAMIR troops are to allow MP to liaise with the Rwandan authority(s).

23. Should handover take place, the person must be taken to the appropriate Prosecutor's Office (details of these offices are at Annex E). The ICRC and UNHRCFOR are to be notified as far as possible in advance and, if possible, are to be present during the hand over. The proforma at Annex G is to be completed and signed by the UNAMIR person conducting the hand over and the person in the Prosecutor's Office to whom the hand over is made.

24. A report detailing the following is to be submitted to UNAMIR HQ, attention G1 Pers, G3 Ops, and the Force Provost Marshall:

- a. name of person handed over and the NGO they work for,

- b. location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- c. crime person accused of,
- d. name of the UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- e. date, time and place the person was handed to the Prosecutor's Office, and
- f. whether an ICRC and UNHRCFOR representative was present during the hand over and if not, why not.

INTERNATIONAL PERSONNEL OF UNAMIR CONTRACTORS

25. As soon as a Rwandan authority seeks legal jurisdiction over an international member of a UNAMIR contractor, HQ UNAMIR, the appropriate head of the UNAMIR contractor and the ICRC and UNHRCFOR must be notified. HQ UNAMIR is to dispatch MP to the site.

26. UNAMIR soldiers are to allow the Rwandan authority(s) to take custody of a international member of an UNAMIR contractor if that person(s) is identified as having legal authority (ie., Gendarme, Prosecutors). UNAMIR troops are to allow MP to liaise with the Rwandan authority(s).

27. Should handover take place, the person must be taken to the appropriate Prosecutor's Office (details of these offices are at Annex E). The ICRC and UNHRCFOR are to be notified as far as possible in advance and, if possible, are to be present during the hand over. The proforma at Annex G is to be completed and signed by the UNAMIR person conducting the hand over and the person in the Prosecutor's Office to whom the hand over is made.

28. A report detailing the following is to be submitted to UNAMIR HQ, attention G1 Pers, G3 Ops, and the Force Provost Marshall:

- a. name of person handed over and the UNAMIR contractor they work for,
- b. location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- c. crime person accused of,
- d. name of the UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- e. date, time and place the person was handed to the Prosecutor's Office, and
- f. whether an ICRC and UNHRCFOR representative was present during the hand over and if not, why not.

VISITORS

29. As soon as a Rwandan authority seeks legal jurisdiction over a visitor, HQ UNAMIR, UNHRCFOR and the ICRC should be notified. HQ UNAMIR is to dispatch MP to the site.

30. UNAMIR soldiers are to allow the Rwandan authority(s) to take custody of a visitor if that person(s) is identified as having legal authority (ie Gendarme, Prosecutors). UNAMIR troops are to allow MP to liaise with the Rwandan authority(s).

31. If possible the person should be taken to the appropriate Prosecutor's Office (details of these offices are at Annex E). The ICRC and UNHRCFOR are to be notified as far as possible in advance and, if possible, are to be present during the hand over. The proforma at Annex G is to be completed and signed by the UNAMIR person conducting the hand over and the person in the Prosecutor's Office to whom the hand over is made.

32. A report detailing the following is to be submitted to UNAMIR HQ, attention G1 Pers, G3 Ops, and the Force Provost Marshall:

- a. name of person handed over and their affiliation or nationality,
- b. location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- c. crime person accused of,
- d. name of the UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
- e. date, time and place the person was handed to the Prosecutor's Office, and
- f. whether an ICRC and UNHRCFOR representative was present during the hand over and if not, why not.

PROCEDURES FOR HANDING OVER RWANDAN NATIONALS

LOCALLY RECRUITED PERSONNEL

1. As soon as a Rwandan authority seeks legal jurisdiction over any locally recruited personnel, the SRSG or his representative and the ICRC must be notified. HQ UNAMIR is to dispatch MP to the site. UNHRFOR is to be notified immediately.
2. UNAMIR soldiers are not to allow any Rwandan authority(s) to take custody of locally recruited personnel unless the SRSG has given permission for this to occur. UNAMIR troops are to allow MP to liaise with the Rwandan authority(s).
3. If the Rwandan authority(s) uses force to attempt to take custody of locally recruited personnel, UNAMIR troops are authorised to use force in accordance with Reference A.
4. UNHRFOR is to be permitted to speak to the locally recruited person.
5. If authority is given for the hand over, the person must be taken to the appropriate Prosecutor's Office (details of these offices are at Annex E). The ICRC are to be notified as far as possible in advance and, if possible are to be present during the hand over. UNHRFOR is to be present during the hand over. (Note: No hand over is to be delayed more than 24 hours without UNAMIR HQ permission on the sole basis that the ICRC and/or UNHRFO are not present.) The proforma at Annex G is to be completed and signed by the UNAMIR person conducting the hand over and the person in the Prosecutor's Office to whom the hand over is made.
6. A report detailing the following is to be submitted to UNAMIR HQ, attention G1 Pers, G2, G3 Ops, and the Force Provost Marshall:
 - a. name of person handed over,
 - b. location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
 - c. crime person accused of,
 - d. name of the UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
 - e. date, time and place the person was handed to the Prosecutor's Office, and

- f. whether an ICRC and/or UNHRCFOR representative was present during the hand over and if not, why not.

RWANDANS SEEKING PROTECTION OF UNAMIR

7. It is not within the UNAMIR mandate to give Rwandan nationals protection. Circumstances may arise where protection to an individual or a group of individuals will be given under International Humanitarian Law because they are about to suffer death or serious bodily injury and there are no appropriate Rwandan authorities available to offer timely assistance. Such circumstances will be rare and in such cases UNAMIR HQ is to be notified immediately.

PERSONS DETAINED BY UNAMIR TROOPS

8. They are to be searched, disarmed and segregated. At all times they are to be treated in accordance with the principals of minimum force as detailed at Reference A. UNAMIR HQ is to be notified immediately of the circumstances surrounding the detention. HQ UNAMIR is to dispatch MP to the site. UNAMIR troops are to allow the MP to liaise with the Rwandan authority(s).
9. The detainee(s) is to be told the reason for his detention.
10. They are to be identified and their personal details recorded. The reason for the detention is also to be recorded.
11. A safe and secure place is to be arranged as a temporary place of custody. Detainees are to be kept in custody by UNAMIR troops for the minimum time necessary. A detainee is to be kept in custody for no more than 24 hours unless they have the permission of UNAMIR HQ. Detainees are to be provided with food, water, shelter and medical attention as required. ICRC is to be informed immediately and is to be allowed to have access to these detainees.
12. Detainees and the property found in their possession are to be handed to the appropriate Prosecutor's Office (details of these offices are at Annex E). The detainee is to be allowed to keep all property essential for his/her comfort and survival (eg food and water).
13. The ICRC (if possible) and the UNHRCFOR are to be notified and present during the hand over. The proforma at Annex B is to be completed and signed by the UNAMIR person conducting the hand over and the person in the Prosecutor's Office to whom the hand over is made.
14. Detainees are not to be handed to any other RPA authorities. A Prosecutor's Office is the only authorised office for the processing and handing over of detainees in Rwanda.
15. A report detailing the following is to be submitted to UNAMIR HQ, attention G1 Pers, G2, G3 Ops and the Force Provost Marshall:
- a. name of the detainee,

- b. location where the person was detained,
- c. crime person accused of,
- d. name of the UNAMIR person who detained the detainee,
- e. date, time and place the detainee was handed to the Office of the Prosecutor, and
- f. whether an ICRC and/or UNHRCFOR representative was present during the hand over and if not, why not.

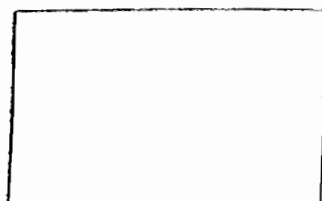

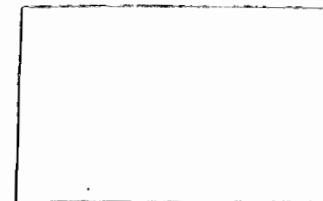

**DIRECTIVE ON THE LEGAL JURISDICTION APPLICABLE TO UNAMIR AND
RWANDAN AUTHORITIES**

The aim of this directive is to out-line the procedures for handing over individuals or group of people to the Rwandan authorities.

By this directive the SRSG, FC and the CIVPOL Commissioner have been accorded Diplomatic Immunity and privilege under International Law, this implies that they are not to be handed over to Rwandan authority under any circumstance.

CIVPOL

Under these procedures all members of CIVPOL are immune from :

- Legal process for all acts performed by them in their official capacity.
- Arrest, detention and seizure of their personal baggage. This implies that none of UN *personnel* can be handed-over to the Rwandan authority without the concurrence of the FC or the SRSG.
- If authority has been given then a report detailing the following is to be sub-mitted to UNAMIR HQ attention - G1 Personnel, G3 Ops and Force Provost Marshal.
 - a) Name of the person handed-over,
 - b) Location where the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
 - c) Crime person accused of,
 - d) Name of UNAMIR person(s) who was present when the Rwandan Government sought jurisdiction,
 - e) Date, time and place the person was handed to the prosecutor,
 - f) Whether ICRC and UNHFOR Representative was present during the handing over and if not why ?

Also all UN Civilian Officials assigned to the Civilian Component consultants or Military are immune from legal process for all acts performed by them in their official capacity but the international personnel of NGO's, International personnel of UNAMIR contractors and visitors have no immunity unless they have entered into a bilateral arrangement with the Rwandan Government in the absence of that they can be handed over on demand of proper legal authority.

SUBJECT: Response to my absence from duty

Dear sir,

I am sorry to hear that the Director of Ruhengeri Training School reported to you that I was not on duty since 27th September, 1995, up to now.

It is true that on 28th September, 1995, I was on premises of EGENA when the Director decided a holiday for all employees of UNAMIR at Training School because of the unexpected death of the Captain Touré. He also suggested that everybody should come up to Kigali to offer sympathy to you.

That day since the vehicle was full, I decided to catch the public transportation and I arrived in Kigali late in evening; to the point I was not able to join everybody to your place.

The following day on September 29, 1995, I didn't go back to Ruhengeri because our office is always closed from Thursday to Sunday, since the instructors get off classes every Thursday noon, and they only come back the following Monday.

This was also the end of the month and I was supposed to get my salary on Monday October 2, 1995, but unfortunately when I arrived at Amahoro there was a note stating that the pay will be on Tuesday October 3, 1995. Therefore I had to wait for another day in Kigali.

Briefly, I was back to Ruhengeri but since October 5, 1995 I didn't see the Director of Ruhengeri Training School. Until last Monday October 9, 1995, although I was on duty. It is only that Monday of October 9, 1995 that the Director told me to get ready for my trip to Kigali to see the Commissioner.

I tried to find out from him the reason why I should see you, and he only told me that I will know everything from the Commissioner.

Sir, to conclude, I really apologize and insist that I didn't miss my job because of irresponsibility, and it is unfortunate that I didn't have any communication with the Director of Ruhengeri Training School.

SOME REAL HAPPENINGS

CASE 1

Around 5th April 95, on the road Mbilizi - Cyangugu, an antitank mine blast destroyed a car from MDM, killed on the spot two persons and injured three more. At that time it was vastly announced a programmed reburial ceremony to take place in Mbilizi on 7th April, as part of the commemorative events in honour of last year's genocide victims.

When the mine blast occurred due to its tremendous power, the double cabin pickup truck flew about 12 metres, crossed transversely the road and stopped its fly hitting heavily the ground, and lying finally as it were coming from the opposite direction.

But those that put the antitank mine were not satisfied with it. During the night time they placed some antipersonnel mines around the destroyed car. They calculated that the natural curiosity of the people around had to push them to examine the remains of the vehicle ... Unfortunately they were right ... A lady lost a leg in that trap ...

CASE 2

Three boys aged 7, 9 and 11 years old were playing as usual in their neighbourhood, not so far from Kigali town. They were playing with an improvised football, made of plastic bags tied, in the local typical fashion, and coloured by the red ground.

The ball suddenly went out of the camp. One of the children run to take it before falling on a ditch. When he was near of the ball, he saw some strange can lying on the ground, and picked it up, he forgot the ball and run to show the thing to the other boys playing with him, his small brother and his cousin. Then they started trying to grab the new toy from the owner's hands ... And the explosion happened ... Two children died on the spot and the third one at the hospital.

CASE 3

On August 19th at 1530 hours, Memisa's small suzuki jeep with three persons inside was destroyed by an antitank mine near Kiziza one kilometre from their job, the Murunda hospital, before reaching the bridge at the junction with Gisenyi Kibuye road. The people at the hospital heard the blast and went immediately to help them.

One nurse died instantly due to the multiple injuries, and the driver one and half hours later. The third person, a 8½ months pregnant lady sustained burns in around the half of her body's surface, a fracture on one wrist joint and other injuries. She, as the driver, received resuscitation aid. She was evacuated with an UNAMIR helicopter to Kigali for further aid.

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MINE AWARENESS

A - Precautions for Driving

- 1 - Only main roads are to be considered as relatively safe.
- 2 - Always follow in the fresh tracks of another vehicles or the lead vehicle (no less than 30 metres between vehicles).
- 3 - Flack jackets should be used as a seat cushion and a foot protection.

Sand bags (filled with sand) are the best

Protection - (Half filled and packed to form a floor cover).

Wear the seat belts (front and rear), roll down the windows - doors unlocked.
- 4 - Stay on the road at halts.
- 5 - Never approach unexploded ordnance that you come across.

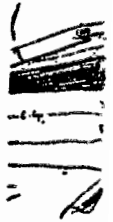
B - Where to expect Mines

- 1 - Bottle necks like head of bridges, fords in swamps, defiles, etc.
- 2 - On the edge of the roads and tracks which have been cleared.
- 3 - Anywhere on unpaved roads which have not been cleared.
- 4 - In diversions around obstacles.
- 5 - In exit from roads.
- 6 - Around destroyed bridges or sabotaged sides.
- 7 - In damaged roads.
- 8 - In old battlefields that have not been cleared or recorded.

C - Warning signs for Mines and Booby traps. If there are no mine marking signs or fences, and no mines can be seen, the following signs may indicate the presence of mines:

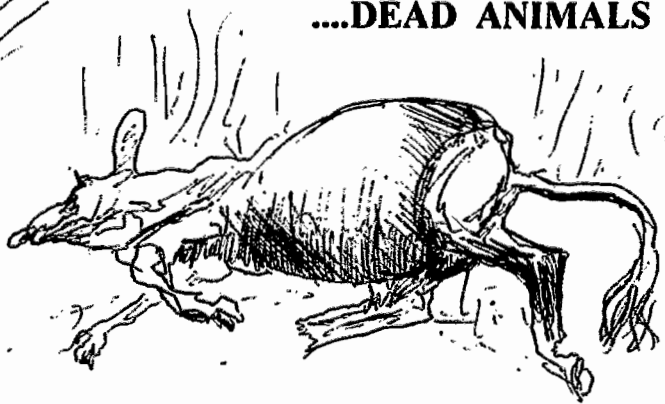

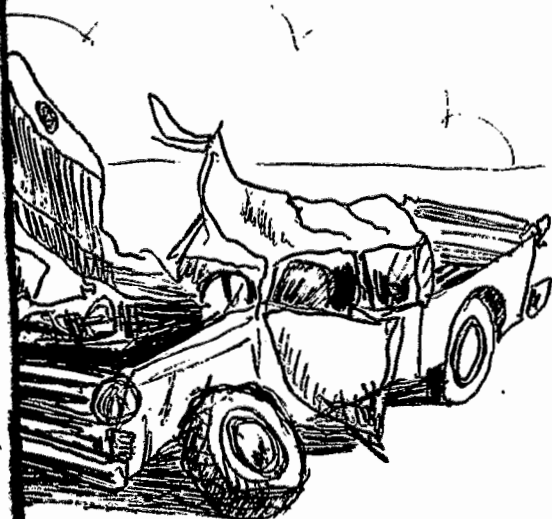

- *The presence of trip wires is a good indication of booby traps.*

Simple Precaution: *Never move off roads or path which are in daily use - If possible never use unpaved or dirt roads, if paved roads are available.*

DO NOT TAKE UNNECESSARY RISKS.

D - Actions on discovering a Mine

When on foot:

- 1 - *Stop and remain calm.*
- 2 - *Walk back the same way you walked into the minefield - If it's possible, use the same footprints - If you are not sure use a metal stick/bayonet for probing.*
- 3 - *Mark the mined area with whatever is at hand - so others will avoid the danger.*
- 4 - *Report your location by radio through your chain of command - If you have no radio, report ASAP to the nearest authority.*
- 5 - *If you have a map, mark the place in order to register the danger area and pass the grid references through your chain of command.*
- 6 - *If possible, stay in the area and point out the place where the mine was found.*

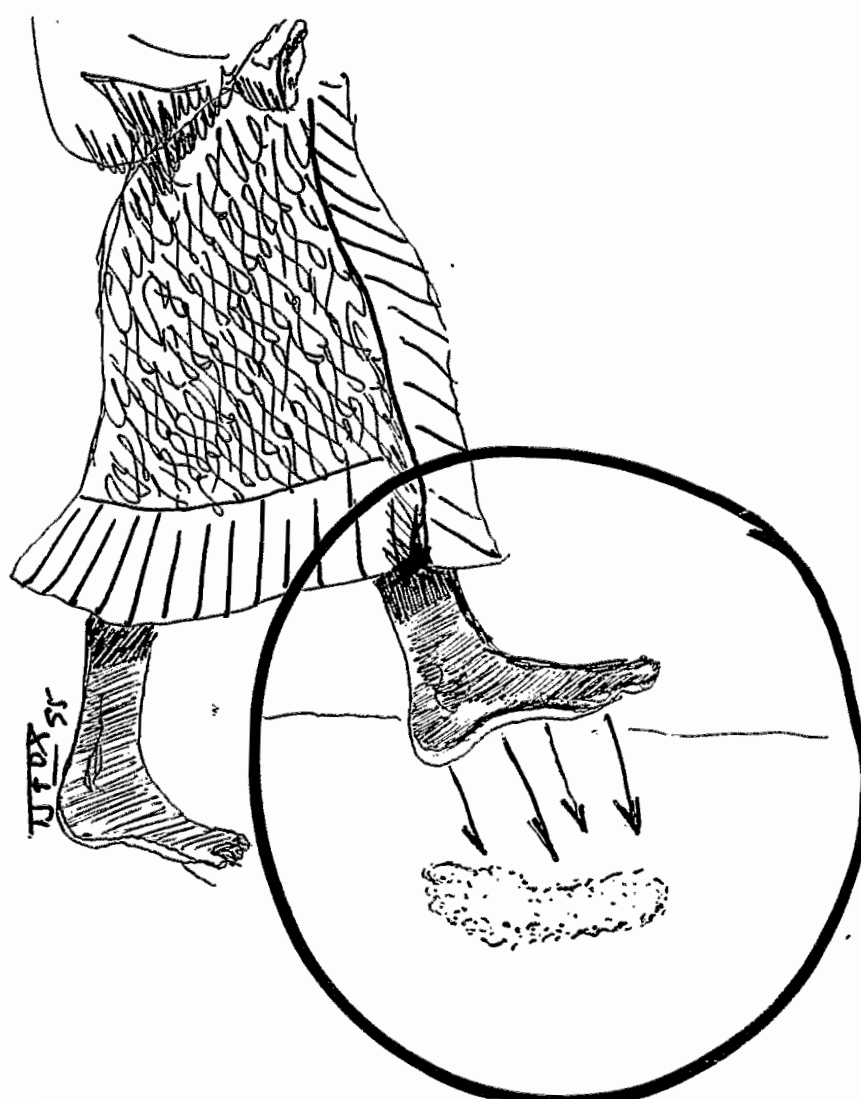

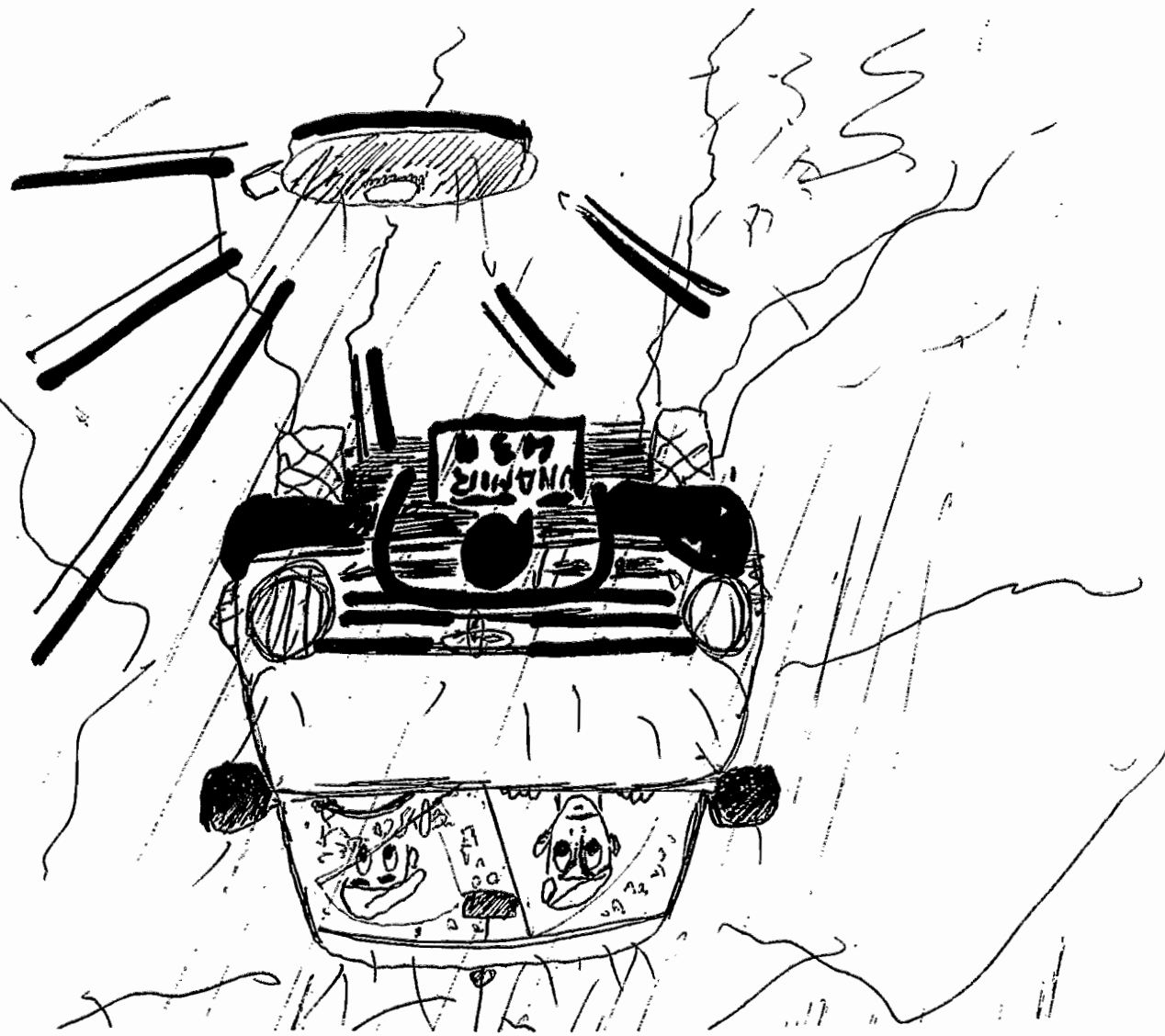

- **DO NOT TOUCH OR MOVE THE MINE/BOMB**
- **DO NOT TRY TO DETONATE IT BY THROWING STONES OR SHOOTING AT IT**

If in a vehicle:

- 1 - *Stop immediately and stay calm.*
- 2 - *Stay in your vehicle, even if you have a blown tyre or have a damaged vehicle.*
- 3 - *Carefully observe the terrain around your vehicle, trying to find other mines.*
- 4 - *Check that everyone is wearing a seat belt front and rear - If you have flack jackets, check that everyone in the vehicle has one under them.*
- 5 - *Roll down all the windows.*
- 6 - *Notify your location through your chain of command by radio.*
- 7 - *Perform a radio check with your handies.*
- 8 - *Stay with your vehicle and wait for engineer assistance to get you out - You may already have driven through a mined area.*

If you have to leave your vehicle:

- 9 - *Do not move the steering wheel.*
- 10 - *Put on any protective gear you may have.*
- 11 - *Climb over the seats and leave the car from the rear - Walk carefully back along the vehicle tracks.*
- 12 - *Move all your passengers out the same way, at 20 metres intervals, dressing in protective clothes if they have.*

If you have to move the vehicle before help arrives:

- 3 - *Be sure you first performed steps (1) to (7) above.*

14 - *Dismount all the passengers as in (11) and (12) above, except one that remains as an assistant in the rear of the vehicle where he can see the vehicle tracks.*

15 - *Guided by the assistant, the driver slowly reverses out following in his tracks.*

16 - *If there are two vehicles, the rear vehicle moves first reversing 50 mg the lead vehicle then follows in reverse.*

17 - *If it is dark, wait in the car until daylight, unless given instructions to the contrary*

NEVER WALK AROUND THE VEHICLE

18 - *Close the road, and clearly mark any diversion you have made.*

19 - *Report to the nearest authority available.*

E - Actions on a Mine incident

When on foot:

1 - **DO NOT IMMEDIATELY RUN TO THE CASUALTY**
STOP, stay calm and assess the situation.

2 - *Only one person move to the casualty, moving in his exact footprints, and apply immediate first aid, standing as near to the point of detonation of the mine as possible - If his footsteps are not clear, do not risk another casualty, but hand-clear a path to the casualty using a prodder/bayonet.*

3 - *Notify your location and alert CASEVAC system.*

4 - *Do not attempt to move the casualty until helps arrives, unless it is absolutely necessary.*

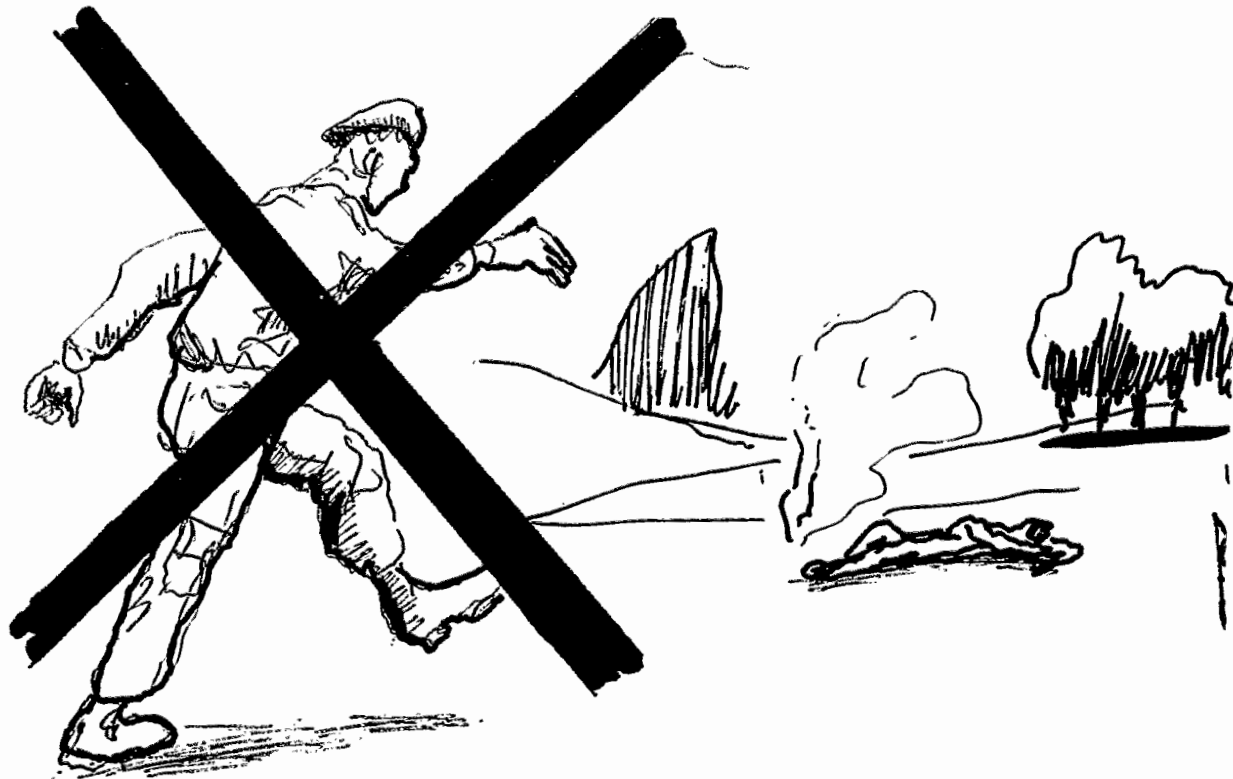
5 - *Using a prodder/bayonet, hand clear an area around the casualty, and enlarge the path back from the casualty to a safe area, for use by the medical team - Remember that a stretcher party carrying a heavy load requires a wide cleared area to walk on.*

6 - *If the patient is conscious, one member of the party should stay with him/her to give comfort and reassurance.*

If in a vehicle which hits a mine:

1 - *STOP immediately and restrain the impulse of run away of the vehicle - Stay calm*

- 2 - *If your radio is working notify your location and alert CASEVAC system.*
- 3 - *If your vehicle has been damaged, give immediate first aid to any casualties.*

If another vehicle is damaged:

**DO NOT IMMEDIATELY RUN TOWARD THE CASUALTIES
STOP AND CONSIDER**

- 4 - *Notify your location and alert CASEVAC system.*
- 5 - *Look - Check for access to the stricken vehicle, which may be the front or rear, reaching the vehicle by foot or with your vehicle.*

If you decide to reach the damaged vehicle by foot:

- 6 - *Leave your vehicle by climbing over the seats and leaving from the rear - Put on protective clothing and walk back along your own wheel tracks - Move passengers out in the same way.*
- 7 - *Find an area where the damaged vehicle's tracks and your own coincide, and walk to the damaged vehicle along its tracks.*

DO NOT WALK AROUND THE DAMAGED VEHICLE

- 8 - *Enter the damaged vehicle from the rear, and carry out immediate first aid to any casualties.*
- 9 - *Stay with the vehicle, and wait for medical help and engineer assistance to get you out.*

If you have to move a casualty.

- 10 - *Using a prodder/bayonet, clear an area around the vehicle so the casualty can be extricated from it.*
- 11 - *Clear a path from the damaged vehicle back to safe ground and carry the casualty*

along it - Wait for CASEVAC assistance.

If you decide to reach the damaged vehicle

- 12 - Perform steps (4) and (5) above.*
- 13 - Open all windows and doors - Doors should always be unlocked.*
- 14 - Move forward or backwards in the tracks of the other vehicle from the point of both tracks coincide - Move right up to the stricken vehicle.*
- 15 - Using doors or windows get onto the roof of your vehicle.*
- 16 - Assess injuries and administer first aid, keeping the chain of command informed of the injuries to assist medical teams preparations.*
- 17 - If it's possible, move the casualties to your vehicle.*
- 18 - Slowly reverses or move forward in your own vehicle tracks.*
- 19 - Move to a safe area for AIR MEDEVAC or the nearest Aid Post - Keep the chain of command informed.*
- 20 - If it is dark wait in the car until daylight, unless given instructions to the contrary.*
- 21 - Report to the nearest authority available.*
- 22 - Close the road, and clearly mark any diversion you have made.*

Thereafter the UN person will be responsible for the conduct and general behaviour of the guest in question. As Officers representing our various countries, we should be aware that our conduct and moral behaviour in general should be exemplary so as not to tarnish the good image of UNAMIR or undermine our security.

3. The security guards at the gates of Belgium Village and Chez Landos are to maintain a register for guests and are to take note that guest must be personally signed in and out by a UN ID carrying Officer. This does not affect the policy of permitting NGO personnel access to special functions/happy hour parties.

4. We hope that this directive will put to end the problems and confusion that was generated earlier regarding the above mentioned issue.

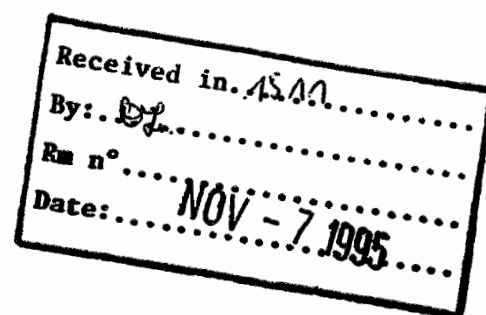


