1. General Situation:

The general situation in Rwanda continues to remain stable.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

a. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities.

b. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the sectors reported that the RPA mounted snap check points in strategic parts of the towns and have intensified day and night patrols.

c. It has been reported by UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in sector 4B, Kibuye that Mr. Peter Kudnasindukanwa Officer-in-charge of Mugenero Clinic was arrested by Cyangugu R.P.A. for alleged involvement in the country's mass killings, but was released later after the intervention of local R.P.A.

d. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers of Sector 3B, Gitarama reported having patrolled Kigembe commune in Butare and the area is relatively calm.

e. It has also been reported by sector 3B, Gitarama, that a clinic in the commune formerly run by Malawi platoon has now been taken over by Medicine Sans-frontier (MSF).

1.2. Social:

It has been reported by all UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in sectors that people are conducting their businesses peacefully.

1.3. Commercial: NTR

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams continue to report about high prices of goods and services in their respective sectors.

Objet:

1. General Situation:

The general situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

- a. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities.
- b. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in sectors have reported that the RPA mounted snap check points in strategic parts of the towns and have intensified day and night patrols.
- c. The Chief operations officer CIVPOL HQ led UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers to visit Gitarama and Butare to acquaint themselves with modalities on communes security of OP RETOUR.
- d. UNAMIR CIVPOL observers in Gitarama and Butare reported that most DP's contacted have expressed dissatisfaction to move out of DP Camps to return to their homes for uncertain security in their homes as well as lack of food to feed themselves.
- e. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers Team of Kigali Sect.6 visited UNICEF Chief of Security, John Balnages who was pleased with the visit. He thanked them for initiating this kind of working relationship.

1.2. Social:

It has been reported by UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in sectors that people are going about with their routine business after a peaceful celebrated Christmas.

1.3. Commercial:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in most Sectors have reported that

businesses are conducted peacefully.

1.4. Economic:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams continued to report about high prices of goods and services in their respective areas.

1.5. Humanitarian:

- a. In Kibuye Sect.4B, UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers have reported that between 26/12 and 27/12/94 a total of 247 people from Burundi crossed into Rwanda at Kanyaru-Haut border.
- b. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers Team of Kigali Sect.6, witnessed on 29/12/94, the resettlement of 233 out of 341 refugees by officials of IOM, and were conveyed to their homes in UNHCR buses.
- c. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers Team of Kigali Sect.6, reported that total number of 256 are expected at Ndera DPs Camp today for onward resettlement in Kigali.

2. Crime Wave:

UNAMIR-CIVPOL Observers Team in Kigali visited the Gendarmerie Brigade in Kigali (Urban) where crime statistics indicate upsurge in cases of stealing.

3. Investigation:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in Sect.6, Kigali in conjunction with Gendarmerie Brigade are investigating a case of armed robbery in which the complainant one Mr Sigurdur of Remera who was robbed of various items valued at US \$ 5500.

4. Training:

The training of gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School is still in progress.

a. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in Rwanda.

1.2 SOCIAL.

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the sectors have reported that Christmas was peacefully celebrated by the locals.

1.3 COMMERCIAL.

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the country report that people are seen going about their businesses peacefully.

1.4 ECONOMIC.

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer teams continue to report high prices of goods and services in the sectors.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN.

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sector 6 KIGALI visited the NDERA DPC and where informed by the Camp Officials that there were 319 refugees in the Camp. The officials complained that refugees can not be moved in and out of the Camp because of the recent strike action by the Humanitarian Organisations' Bus drivers over non payment of their wages.

2. CRIME WAVE.

Information gathered from Gendarmerie Stations in KIGALI By UNAMIR CIVPOL OBSERVERS in Sector 6 KIGALI revealed an increase in stealing cases within the sector.

3. INVESTIGATION.

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sector 6-KIGALI are assisting in the investigation of a case of theft of personal effects reported by Mrs. Louise Carbonneau, a Staff of Human Rights (UNHCR) in KIGALI. The case is being investigated by Nyamirambo Gendarmerie Brigade Kigali.

b. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in the country observed intensified day and night foot and mobile patrol by RPA.

1.2. Social:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the country reported that the locals are seen going to churches, patronising bars and restaurants in celebration of the Christmas. The reports indicate that the Festival was observed peacefully by the natives.

1.3. Commercial:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers Teams in the country reported an increased Tempo in commercial activities apparently due to the Christmas.

1.4. Economic:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers continue to report increase in prices of goods and services in all the Sectors.

1.5. Humanitarian:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect 6, Kigali reported that most of the refugees they saw in the Ndera DPC on 23/12/94 have been moved to I Kibungo, II Gyenda, III Gashura, and in Byumba - some of the refugees interviewed by the Team were not happy with the exercise. They complained about the poor living conditions in the above mentioned areas.

Objet:

1. General Situation:

The general situation in Rwanda continues to be stable with visible increase in social and commercial activities.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

a. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the sectors.

b. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in the country observed intensified day and night foot and mobile patrol by RPA.

c. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in Sect 6 Kigali reported that their team and the prefect of Kigali Rural have completed their familiarization tour of communes within the sector. 16 communes were visited with RPA providing security. Report has it that they were warmly received in all communes visited.

1.2. Social:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers report that the locals are seen going about their activities peacefully.

1.3. Commercial:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers Teams in the sectors have reported that locals are shopping in markets/shops apparently in preparation for Christmas.

1.4. Economic:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers continue to report increase in prices of goods and services in all the Sectors.

1.5. Humanitarian: NTR

a. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect 6 - Kigali visited the Ndera displaced persons camp and reported that the number of refugees in the camp have increased to about 1000 persons.

b. It has been reported in Sect 3A HQ - Butare that 329 persons crossed into Rwanda between 20-12-94 and 21-12-94 from Burundi through the Kanyaru - Haute Border.

SUBJECT: CIVPOL Staffing

OBJET:

1. To implement the instructions given in UNATIONS New York cable 4184 dated 20 december 1994, the following steps may be taken:

- Regarding those observers affected by repatriation:

The total number is 31 observers, the breakdown is as follows:

Guinea Bissau	15
Jordan	2
Djibouti	8
Zambia	6

Total	31

The repatriation of these 31 observers might be staggered into following grouped departures:

- First departure on 15 January 1995 for the 15 observers from Guinea Bissau;
- Second departure on 30 January 1995 for the second group comprised of the remaining 16 observers (2 from Jordan, 8 from Djibouti, and 6 from Zambia).

2. Following the departure of these two groups, the CIVPOL staff which now numbers 80, will be reduced to 49 (15 French-speaking and 34 English speaking Observers).

3. Such an extremely reduced staff need to be quickly reinforced through the allocation of 71 new observers (composed of 47 French speakers and 24 English speakers) to restore CIVPOL's ideal strength which is estimated to be 120 observers.

4. In order to avoid other similar, inconvenient cases of repatriation in the future, it is necessary that certain very important aspects of CIVPOL's mandate and the United Nations' selection criteria be made known to the countries supplying new contingents.

5. One should emphasize to the future CIVPOL observers that the CIVPOL mandate stems from Security Council Resolution 872 dated October 1993 and resolution 965 from November 1994 which are worded as follows:

- to monitor the gendarmerie and local police and provide them with necessary surveillance and guidance;
- to assist in the establishment and training of a new integrated national police force.

To implement these mandates, the following actions are required:

- deployment of CIVPOL observers in all sectors;
- assist Prefects in the areas of preserving law and order and complying with existing laws;
- monitor police and gendarmerie operations;
- investigate all infractions related to local authorities particularly human rights violations;
- oversee the process for the return of refugees and displaced persons, investigate and report all incidents resulting from disputes committed by wrongdoers acting alone or in groups;
- assist in setting up training centers for local police in the Prefectures;
- develop accelerated training program for the local police;
- monitor the selection of local policemen and the issuing of identification cards;
- assist in the disarming program and facilitate in the integration of the former RGF gendarmes in Rwanda;
- follow the programme of the training of gendarmerie;
- train instructors;
- assist the military observers and troops in the areas related to police work;

6. The duties described above are many and must be implemented within a specific operational framework and with the appropriate human resources.

7. Therefore the operational concept adopted by CIVPOL for future observers is as follows:

- to be deployed in each Prefecture in teams of at least 7 observers assigned to monitoring, investigation and training;
- animate the Gendarmes Training Centre of Ruhengeri; and
- coordinate activities listed above via Headquarters.

8. It is important to remember that in accordance with the wishes of the Rwandan Government - for which the training of police force is a major concern, the Security Council's new resolution also underlines this essential task. In fact, for Rwandan government, the police training program is an efficient way of establishing a police force to handle tasks involving public safety, to support the judiciary and to preservation Human Rights.

9. Therefore to efficiently fulfil these mandates, future observers must fully satisfy the following selection criteria which stem from conditions set by United Nations:

- be an officer in the police force or gendarmerie with some experience in the area of service in police or gendarmerie units.
- be familiarized with the training of agents;
- be able to read, write and speak fluently :
 - in French and have some ability to speak english (for French-speaking observers);
 - in English and have some ability to speak French (for English-speaking observers);
- posses a valid driver's licence;
- know how to type;
- have physical conditioning required for teaching;

10. Finally, with regards to the 10 CIVPOL officers from Germany, we await their arrival with great anticipation as this support will contribute in part to the replenishment of the large number of CIVPOL personnel soon to be repatriated.

3. Such an extremely reduced staff need to be quickly reinforced through the allocation of 71 new observers (composed of 47 French speakers and 24 English speakers) to restore CIVPOL's ideal strength which is estimated to be 120 observers.

4. In order to avoid other similar, inconvenient cases of repatriation in the future, it is necessary that certain very important aspects of CIVPOL's mandate and the United Nations' selection criteria be made known to the countries supplying new contingents.

5. One should emphasize to the future CIVPOL observers that the CIVPOL mandate stems from Security Council Resolution 872 dated October 1993 and resolution 965 from November 1994 which are worded as follows:

- to monitor the gendarmerie and local police and provide them with necessary surveillance and guidance;
- to assist in the establishment and training of a new integrated national police force.

To implement these mandates, the following actions are required:

- deployment of CIVPOL observers in all sectors;
- assist Prefects in the areas of preserving law and order and complying with existing laws;
- monitor police and gendarmerie operations;
- investigate all infractions related to local authorities particularly human rights violations;
- oversee the process for the return of refugees and displaced persons, investigate and report all incidents resulting from disputes committed by wrongdoers acting alone or in groups;
- assist in setting up training centers for local police in the Prefectures;
- develop accelerated training program for the local police;
- monitor the selection of local policemen and the issuing of identification cards;
- assist in the disarming program and facilitate in the integration of the former RGF gendarmes in Rwanda;
- follow the programme of the training of gendarmerie;
- train instructors;
- assist the military observers and troops in the areas related to police work;

6. The duties described above are many and must be implemented within a specific operational framework and with the appropriate human resources.

7. Therefore the operational concept adopted by CIVPOL for future observers is as follows:

- to be deployed in each Prefecture in teams of at least 7 observers assigned to monitoring, investigation and training;
- animate the Gendarmes Training Centre of Ruhengeri; and
- coordinate activities listed above via Headquarters.

8. It is important to remember that in accordance with the wishes of the Rwandan Government - for which the training of police force is a major concern, the Security Council's new resolution also underlines this essential task. In fact, for Rwandan government, the police training program is an efficient way of establishing a police force to handle tasks involving public safety, to support the judiciary and to preservation Human Rights.

9. Therefore to efficiently fulfil these mandates, future observers must fully satisfy the following selection criteria which stem from conditions set by United Nations:

- be an officer in the police force or gendarmerie with some experience in the area of service in police or gendarmerie units.
- be familiarized with the training of agents;
- be able to read, write and speak fluently :
 - in French and have some ability to speak english (for French-speaking observers);
 - in English and have some ability to speak French (for English-speaking observers);
- posses a valid driver's licence;
- know how to type;
- have physical conditioning required for teaching;

10. Finally, with regards to the 10 CIVPOL officers from Germany, we await their arrival with great anticipation as this support will contribute in part to the replenishment of the large number of CIVPOL personnel soon to be repatriated.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

a. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers HQ continued co-ordination and monitoring of activities of observers in the sectors.

b. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers at Sectors 3B and 6, Gitarama and Kigali respectively observed increased RPA vehicular and foot patrols round the clock in both sectors.

c. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ assisted the MILOBS in Sect-2, Kibungo in transferring a witness in a murder case at Sect-2, Kigarama into protective custody in Kigali. Presently the witness is in CANCON custody in Kigali Amahoro Stadium pending further arrangements to the protective custody.

d. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in Kigali visited the prefect of Kigali (Rural) who disclosed that most communes in the prefecture are suspected to have mines, and requested UNAMIR's assistance in clearing the areas affected, of the mines.

e. The prefect of Kigali (Rural) has appealed to UNAMIR authorities through UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in Sect-6, Kigali to assist the prefecture in the rehabilitation and reconstruction of the roads and bridges damaged during the war which he pointed out are affecting economic and social activities in the sector.

f. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Kigali - Sector 6 accompanied the Prefect of Kigali (Rural) on familiarization tour of Kanzenze Commune. The Prefect thanked the CIVPOL Commissioner for providing him with transport to facilitate his tour of communes in the Prefecture. SUBJECT: Need for observer reinforcements at CIVPOL

1. I respectfully draw your attention to the difficulties CIVPOL has encountered since opening its Gendarme Training Center in Ruhengeri particularly in the area of personnel.

2. The training of the 2nd contingent of gendarmes in Ruhengeri which was initially scheduled to begin on 14 November 1994 did not effectively commence until 12-12-94. This contingent is comprised of 300 gendarme cadets and 20 assistant instructors from the 1st contingent.

3. It should also be noted that the training program for the 2nd contingent developed by CIVPOL and approved by the Rwandan government hinges upon the appointment of 90 CIVPOL observers over half of which to be French-speaking. To this day, as indicated in my previous correspondences, CIVPOL have 80 observers of which scarcely 15 are capable of teaching in French.

4. Therefore given that the training program at the Ruhengeri school was already adopted by UNAMIR and the Rwanda government, which commits the two parties ipso facto, I must honour this commitment by taking the following steps:

- Recall and assign to Ruhengeri all French-speaking observers previously deployed to the prefectures and made available to teach as well as most of those at CIVPOL headquarters.
- Assign to Ruhengeri, all gendarmerie officers and military observers on detachment.

5. Despite this arrangement, please note that the scheduled hours accorded to each instructor surpasses by far all the pedagogical standards due to the number of students which have been divided into six classes of 50 cadets.

6. In addition, it is important to point out that this reallocation, while it may resolve the immediate problems of the shortage of instructors at the Ruhengeri center, will in time have far reaching consequences on CIVPOL activities. Indeed, the absence of French-speaking observers in the Prefectures and at Headquarters will translate as follows:

- impossibility of commencing the training of a local police force in each Prefecture of the country which was to begin on January 15;
- reduction of liaison activities with local authorities (Prefect, gendarmerie, Prosecution Department);
- an overall lull in relations with the justice (including the Prosecutor and Director of Prisons) as well as the use of French-language documents.

7. Thus it seems quite clear that the 12 French-speaking observers, reassigned to the training program, will face considerable difficulties in fulfilling the training requirement dictated in the Security Council's new Resolution 965. An additional factor which will make the present situation even worse is the question of the observers' length of stay. Of the twelve observers (10 Malians and 2 Djiboutians), 5 Malians will reach the end of their contract by January in other words during the course of the training program. This situation risks compromising the current training session as well as the projected training of the local police force.

8. It is thus necessary to urgently envisage the following solutions:

- maintain the contracts for the 5 Malians and extend them by 6-month to cover the current training session. The 5 Malians are as follows:
 - Lieutenant Colonel Arouna Traouré
 - Commander Anatole Sangaré
 - Captain Nimetigna Traoré
 - Captain Moussa Sanogo
 - Captain N'golo Ouattara
- issue an urgent call for more French-speaking observers to insure the continuation of the training of the gendarmes, as well as that of the local police whose program is due to commence on 15 January 1995 at the request of the Rwandan government.

9. From the analysis above it appears clear that CIVPOL suffers from a considerable lack of adequate personnel. However, the duties imposed by the preceding mandates, which were reinforced by other mandates in the new Resolution 965, are many and must be implemented with the appropriate human and material resources. As a function of these factors, CIVPOL has adopted the following plan:

- deploy a team of at least 7 observers (3 French-speaking and 4 English-speaking) in each Prefecture to carry out monitoring, investigations and training;

- activate the gendarme training center in Ruhengeri; and
- coordinate the activities listed below through headquarters.

10. To accomplish this task, an indispensable team of 120 observers is required to correctly implement the duties delegated to the CIVPOL.

11. This personnel will be assigned as follows:

- Headquarters	18
- Liaison officers = 2 at FHQ and 2 at MILOBs HQ	4
- Ruhengeri Training Center = Instructors and training staff	20
- Kigali (Prefecture and Rural)	15
- Other Prefectures = 7 observers per Prefecture	63
Total	120

Within this group and given the upcoming opening of training centers in each Prefecture for the local police force, it is desirable to have at least 62 French-speaking observers:

- Headquarters	8
- Liaison officers	2
- Ruhengeri Training Center	15
- Kigali (Prefecture and Rural)	10
- Other Prefectures = 3 per Prefecture x 9	27
Total	62

If CIVPOL already has 12 French-speaking observers, the required number will drop to 50 observers.

12. I would like to take this opportunity to draw your attention to the selection criteria designed to insure the success of CIVPOL's efforts. The criteria which stem from conditions set by the United Nations are as follows:

The candidate must:

- be an officer in the police force or gendarmerie with experience in the area of service in police or gendarmerie units.
- have experience in the training of cadets;
- be able to speak, read and write fluently in French and have some command of English;
- possess a valid driver's license;
- know how to type;

- have physical conditioning required for teaching;

13. To recap, the successive mandates delegated to CIVPOL, particularly those arising from the Security Council's new Resolution 965 which imposes a set of objectives to be attained, requires that a staff of sufficient quantity and quality be made available to this service as soon as possible.

With the adoption of Resolution S/1994/965 on 30 November 1994, the United Nations Security Council decided to contribute to improving security in Rwanda through the establishment and training of a new national police force.

This new situation definitely entails a re-reading of the training program which we developed together in response to the concerns of the Security Council.

With regards to the training of 300 gendarmes initially scheduled for 21 November 1994, after receiving a list of urgent needs for the smooth operation of the program, the Special Representative of the Secretary General undertook the task of contacting United Nations agencies to satisfy these needs in view of the difficulties you are now encountering.

In addition, following the two visits to the gendarmerie school by a joint team of CIVPOLs and gendarmes, it seemed necessary to proceed with repairs to the buildings to insure a proper supply of water and electricity. This situation is currently being examined by UNAMIR.

This seems an appropriate time to propose Monday December 12, 1994 as the opening date for the training program. I would also like to request that you kindly make available ten Rwandan instructors to the Center's directors to teach the following subjects in accordance with the jointly agreed upon curriculum:

Economics	=	1
General Criminal Law	=	2
Special Criminal Law	=	2
Penal Procedure	=	2
First Aid and Civilian Protection	=	1
History and Geography in Rwanda	=	2

To these 10 instructors we should add military trainers, whose selection I leave in your capable hands as well as the number needed for the School's Secretariat.

Review of CIVPOL activities

As specified in the preliminary report from the Secretary General on the United Nations Assistance Mission in Rwanda (S/1994/1333 date 6 October 1994) the activities of the Civilian police has modified its mission to keep pace with the changing situation in Rwanda.

Thus in addition to monitoring the activities of the National Gendarmerie, local police, and civilian authorities as far as human rights violations are concerned, the Civilian Police (CIVPOL) will also aid the Rwandan government in developing a new National Gendarmerie and a new local police through the training of personnel for these 2 (two) police corps. CIVPOL will also aid the military observers and troops in the areas relative to police work.

The training of gendarmes constitutes one of the priorities of the new government so that it may quickly get a handle on the problems of public safety and human rights violations in the country and make the criminal investigative police more efficient. The authorities have renewed this interest on numerous occasions. Given the government's urgent and great need for the training of 6,000 (six thousand) elements in the National Gendarmerie - the principal police force - as provided in the Arusha Accords (Article 85, Section 3, Chapter II), CIVPOL has developed an adapted, progressive, and accelerated training program which may be implemented in the framework of the UNAMIR mandate with contributions from Rwandan. This program comprises of :

- The accelerated training of 103 (one hundred three) gendarmes in 45 days in order to urgently meet the security needs in the city of Kigali.

The graduation ceremony for the class comprised of 99 (ninety-nine) cadets and 3 (three) officers was held on 5 November 1994 in Kigali in the presence of high-ranking Rwandan officials including the Vice-President and Minister of Defense Major-General Paul KAGAME who took this occasion to express his gratitude to UNAMIR for its exemplary assistance and to solicit its continuing assistance.

These new gendarmes were recently deployed throughout the country.

- The training of 300 (three hundred) gendarmes for deployment throughout the country will last 16 (sixteen) weeks and begin as of 21 November 1994.
- The training of 100 (one hundred) instructors to be selected from a pool of 400 (four hundred) gendarmes with some former training will last 12 (twelve) weeks and begin 3 April 1994. Later these instructors will themselves assure the training of gendarme cadets in order to meet the estimated numbers required by the government.

CIVPOL estimates that it could, at the initiative of the Rwandan government, and with the help of third party countries in the framework of a bilateral or multilateral agreement, conduct a training program for gendarmerie officers. Such a training program requires human resources and materials which cannot be provided within the framework of the present

UNAMIR mandate. It is nevertheless desirable that the officer training program be implemented along side the training of the gendarmes so that they may rapidly obtain a quality instruction.

The training of local police is also a factor contributing to the reinforcement of public safety and to the respect of human rights. Thus while CIVPOL teams deployed in the prefectures continue to monitor the activities of civilian authorities in the area of human rights violations, they will also aid the Prefects put into place a local police force in each commune. A program was developed for this end.

Please note that all training programs (gendarmerie or the local police) include in addition to the strictly professional course subjects, classes on human rights which will be taught with the help of the human rights observers.

CIVPOL will assist UNAMIR security personnel as well as to the military police - not yet operational - in carrying out investigations, while maintaining a liaison with the Rwandan National Gendarmerie.

Finally in the framework of the application of the Rwanda Emergency Normalization Plan (RENP) prepared by the Special Representative of the Secretary General, CIVPOL, following a meeting with the judiciary authorities, visited Kigali prison during the first week of November where there are serious problems requiring urgent answers. These include overcrowding of inmates; the lack of adequate health care, bedding and hygiene; the dilapidation of the buildings and the security arrangements.

Kigali prison, built for 2000 (two thousand) inmates, currently holds 5040 (as of 08/11/1994) including 111 women of which 35 are with child, and 95 children between the ages of 10 and 14. The average mortality rate is 5 (five) a day.

Similar conditions prevail in the other two prisons operating in the country, Butare and Gitarama. This situation demands the attention of the international community, at a time when an International Tribunal responsible for the prosecution of crimes of genocide has just been set up by the United Nations.

To carry out its duties, CIVPOL has currently 80 civilian police observers. It is also aided by 6 military observers officers of the gendarmerie for training purposes. Out of these 80 observers, only 25 can read, write and teach in French which presents serious problems as far as numbers trained are concerned. To carry out the gendarmerie and local police training course it would be desirable to ensure that the expected 10 observers (to bring the total to 90) be francophones and bring another 20 francophone police observers to CIVPOL so that there will be three francophones per prefecture. This is justified by the fact that teaching is carried out in French and that the only reference books available, some supplied by the Malian Defence Ministry others purchased on the market in Kigali are in French.

It would also be desirable to have a budgetary item prepared to cover expenses involved in the making of files, office supplies and reference works and all necessary teaching materials.

Serious difficulties caused by the lack of vehicles remain and hinder the deployment of observers. Finally due to the sensitive nature of certain inquiries, the number of international secretaries should be brought to two so that these files are taken away from local staff.

The reinforcements mentioned above should help improve the performance of CIVPOL in this delicate matter and thus contribute to the success of UNAMIR.



PROJECT OF CIVPOL ORGANISATION

CIVPOL's mandate in accordance with Security Council Resolutions 872 on October 1993 will be :

To monitor the Gendarmerie and Communal Police and provide supervision and advice to these bodies as required.

According to Operation order N° 16 CIVPOL tasks are :

- a) Be prepared to assist the Broad based Union government BBGNU to build a new Gendarmerie.*
- b) Monitor the process of the return of Rwandese refugees /displaced persons and their resettlement.*
- c) Monitor the Police/Gendarmerie security situation.*
- d) Investigate any case of violations in conjunction with local authorities through:*

- 1. Mobile patrolling.*
- 2. Investigation of complaints.*
- 3. Continuous liaison with all the parties.*
- 4. Investigate on and reporting of any incidents of harassment of refugees/displaced persons by illegal gangs or individuals.*
- 5. Investigate cases of human right violation.*
- 6. Assist local authorities in maintaining law and order.*
- 7. Assist Milobs and ground troops in police matters.*

In order to effect these tasks, staff and various section's assignments are contained in the administrative framework here attached.

So CIVPOL will be organised as follow:

1. At the central level there will be the ~~General~~ Headquarters composed of

- CIVPOL Commissioner.
- Deputy CIVPOL Commissioner.
- Secretariat.
- Four Divisions led by:
 - Chief Police Operations Officer,
 - Chief Police Investigations Officer,
 - Chief Police Monitoring Officer,
 - Chief Administration and Logistic officer respectively.

2. At the Sector's level there will monitoring teams which ~~are~~^{are} under the orders of the head of monitoring teams.



Report on CIVPOL activities

Pursuant to Security Council Resolution 872 defining the initial UNAMIR mandate, CIVPOL has been in charge of monitoring the gendarmerie and local police and providing them with the required supervision and counsel. When UNAMIR was established, sixty CIVPOL observers carried out monitoring and investigative activities. After the outbreak of the war, all CIVPOL personnel was withdrawn to Nairobi and the force was gradually reduced to 15 and later to 5 officers, all of them from Mali.

New developments in Rwanda and the successive UNAMIR mandates had made it necessary to deploy a sufficiently large number of CIVPOL observers to match the growth in military units and military observers.

As a matter of fact, the evolving situation in post-war Rwanda is still dominated by increasing incidents of lawlessness, especially in the southwest of the country where supporters of the previous regime are committing a growing number of robberies, looting, threats and even murders.

At this moment, no real police force exists in the country apart from an embryonic gendarmerie made up of RPF soldiers who are striving to maintain order and security in the country.

For this reason, the Broad-based Transitional Government has, from the very beginning, sought assistance from UNAMIR to urgently develop a police structure across the country.

In response to this request, Force Commander General Romeo Dallaire selected, because of his experience, Colonel Cheik Oumar Diarra, then Chief Liaison Officer, to head CIVPOL and undertake the training of the new gendarmes.

Given the small number of CIVPOL observers, after contacting General Paul KAGAME, the Vice-President and Minister of Defense, it seemed appropriate to begin by training a group of 103 elements comprised of 100 cadets and three officers in order to create a mixed unit of gendarmes as an immediate response to the security problems in the city of Kigali. Other training programs were gradually developed by the CIVPOL personnel as the expected 90 observers were put into place.

It was thus with the meager resources available that significant efforts were undertaken with the aid of the Malian Ministry of Defense and Security to develop the training programs and obtain the necessary texts and documents.

The Vice-President and Minister of Defense's appreciation for UNAMIR's aid in training gendarmes was evident and demonstrates, at the very least, the competency with which this training program was carried out as well as the good relations that CIVPOL has been able to cultivate with authorities at the Ministry of Defense.

The CIVPOL program of activities which was adopted together with the Rwandan authorities includes the following:

- the training of 100 gendarmes
- the training of 300 gendarmes
- the training of 100 instructors
- the training of local police (10 police per commune)

Naturally this program does not cover the need to train 6,000 gendarmes as requested by the Rwandan government which cannot be met by UNAMIR for obvious reasons, as the main objective remains to aid in the urgent development of an infrastructure capable of handling the numerous security problems in the country.

The Minister of Interior had expressed his opposition to the deployment of CIVPOL observers to conduct monitoring and investigative missions in the prefectures. However when Colonel Cheick Oumar Diarra put forward his explanations and reassurances during his audience with the Minister to discuss the matter, the Minister stated his willingness to instruct the Prefects to collaborate with CIVPOL.

The CIVPOL teams in the prefectures will thus be responsible for helping the prefects develop a local police (selection, recruitment, and training).

The totality of CIVPOL activities including its largest component - training - as well as monitoring and investigations should contribute greatly to the success of UNAMIR's mandate. which is why it is essential to have both quality and quantity, an efficient organization, as well as the means in vehicles and communications.

Personnel

- Out of a total of 90 observers, 70 are in place.
- Out of the 70 observers, 25 are French-speakers and are able to read, write, and teach in French.

Given the importance of training gendarmes and local police in French and given that the codes are in French, it is necessary that the 20 remaining observers be French-speakers.

Organization

- At a central level, there is a headquarters and the training center management.
- A team must be deployed in each prefecture.
- The question of CIVPOL's subordination to the FC or SRSG has long remained unanswered and constitutes a handicap to the decision-making process when dealing with the problems encountered by CIVPOL and is the reason why the CIVPOL's problem in finding an office was only resolved this week.

Means in Vehicles and Communications

The efficient operation of CIVPOL requires vehicles. To this day, CIVPOL possesses 11 vehicles - 7 of which are in working order. Thus despite my numerous requests, CIVPOL has yet to receive the needed vehicles for its deployment and as a result has remained stranded in GITARAMA since its arrival in Rwanda. Efforts are indispensable at this level. I should add that 6 (six) military observers, all gendarmes, are helping CIVPOL in the framework of this training, bringing the total number to 76 for 7 (seven) vehicles.

As far as communications are concerned, the problem is less serious since CIVPOL could, at least in the beginning, use the existing facilities in the sectors. To sum up, CIVPOL's main activity is training. But following the recent agreement with Rwandan authorities concerning deployment, the real problem which continues to hinder other activities remains the lack of vehicles.

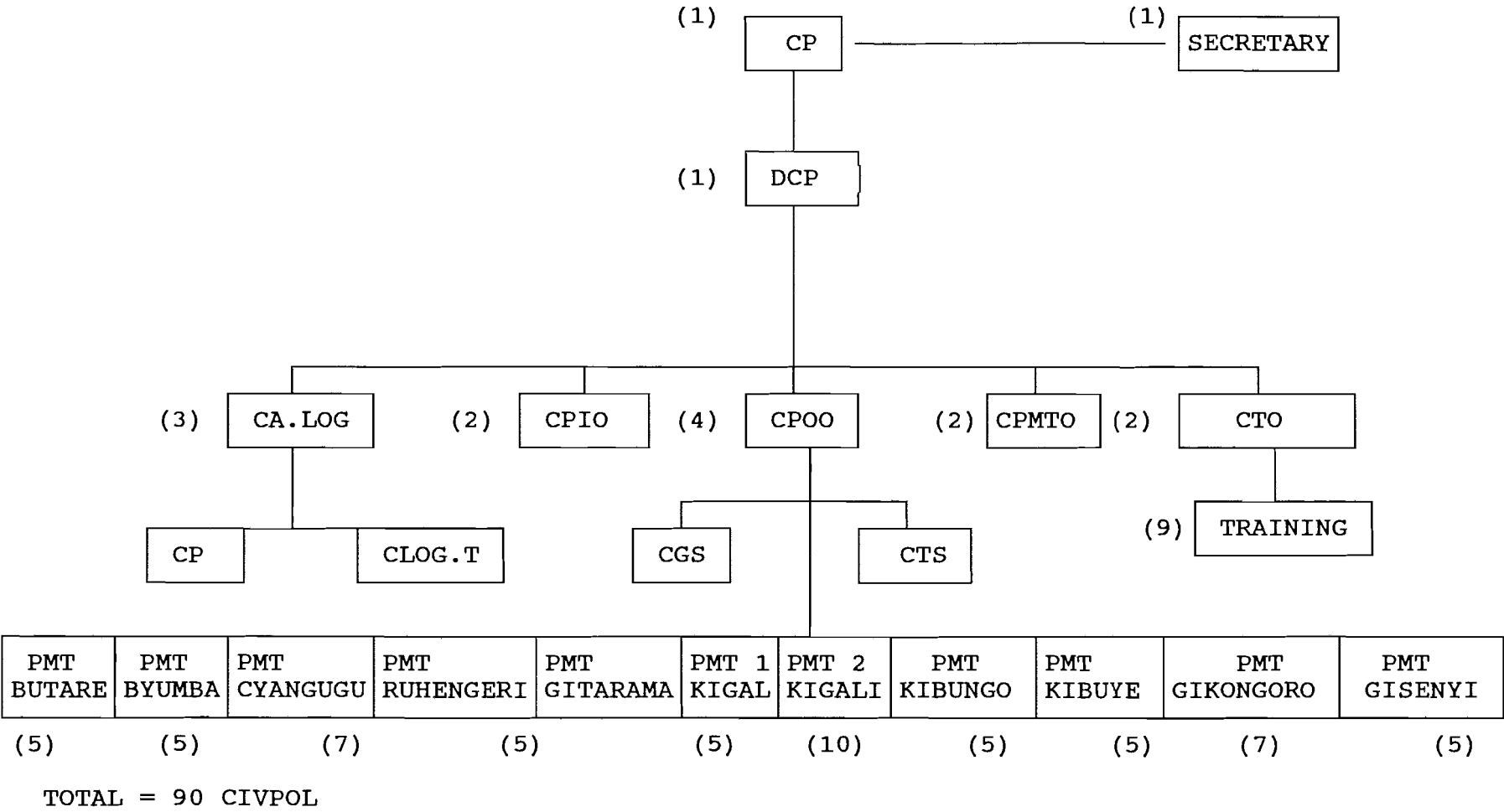

I. JOB SPECIFICATION OF CIVPOL COMMISSIONER (CPC)

1. Head of Civilian Police (Civpol).

2. Make sure of the following :

● Carrying out tasks contained in the operation order № 16 according to resolution 872/05 OCT 1993 of the Security Council.

- Control of all Civpol activities.

- Collaborating closely with the Chief of Military Observers (CMO).

- Liaison to local Gendarmerie National HQ, National Police HQ, Justice and Humanitarian Organisations.

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II. JOB SPECIFICATION OF D.CPC

(DEPUTY CIVPOL COMMISSIONER)

1. Support CPC in all kind of work.
2. Substitution for CPC in case of absence of being on special order.
3. Coordination of all CIVPOL sections.
4. Responsible for internal security and alert evacuation plans.
5. Responsible for discipline of all CIVPOL Officers.
6. Investigations of internal disciplinary affairs.
7. Responsible for setting up the duty officer in HQ.
8. Responsible for the duty roster of CPOO, CPMTO, CPIO, and CA.Log.

III. CHIEF POLICE OPERATIONS OFFICER (CPOO)

1. Head of operations section.

2. Responsible for :

2.1. Coordination of all investigations and monitoring operations.

2.2. Daily report to the CPC until 10.00 hrs.

2.3. Draft of a written weekly SITREP until Monday 10.00 hrs. The SITREP will be signed by the CPC and distributed to all components, all CIVPOL sections and Police Monitor Teams.

2.4. Record of all incidents concerning Rwanda Gendarmerie and Police.

2.5. Plan of duty roster at CIVPOL headquarters.

2.6. Secretary of CPC meetings and draft a report.

2.7. Organization of CIVPOL meetings and draft reports.

2.8. Transmissions - Radio and Telephone communications.

2.9. Messages transmission.

2.10. All CIVPOL files.

2.11. He is assisted by a team of Police Officers.

VI. CHIEF ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTIC OFFICER (CALOG)

1. Head of administration, logistics, personnel and transport section.
2. Responsible for :
 - 2.1. Registration of all incoming and outgoing mail.
 - 2.2. Filing all records.
 - 2.3. Opening personnel files about all Police Monitors.
 - 2.4. Handling the time sheets, leave and CTO applications and check their dates.
 - 2.5. Drafting general and special orders concerning personnel, transport and logistic matters. Draft general orders to all police monitors and have it signed by the CPC.
 - 2.6. Procurement, assignment, service and control of all vehicles.
 - 2.7. Investigation in case of accidents and other damages involving CIVPOL vehicles.
 - 2.8. Support of all sections and stations with office equipments and other materials.
 - 2.9. Procurement and assignment of radio equipment.
 - 2.10. Assignment of valuable equipment like vehicles, Radios, Computers, etc have to be recorded. The responsible officer has to sign the receipt of the equipment.
 - 2.11. He is assisted by a team of Police Officers.

V. JOB SPECIFICATION OF CPMO

(Chief Police Monitoring Officer)

1. Take charge exclusively under the authority of the CPC of the organization and the leading of the Police Monitor Teams.
2. Keep close contact with local gendarmerie and Police.
3. Monitor the process of the return of Rwandese refugees/displaced persons and their resettlement.
4. Monitor the Gendarmerie/Police security situation.
5. Investigate any cases of violation in conjunction with Police /Gendarmerie through :
 - 5.1. Mobile Patrolling.
 - 5.2. Continuous liaison with all parties.
 - 5.3. Assist local authorities in maintaining law and order.
 - 5.4. Assist MILOBS and ground troops in Police matters.
6. Try to get confidence with all parts of local population.
7. Report serious incidents concerning the Police work immediately to CPC.
8. Write a weekly sitrep about activities of PMT. The Sitrep must reach the HQ not later than 08.00 hrs. each Monday together with weekly time sheet.
9. Make confidence with the area of the concerning district.
10. Responsible for :

10.1. Daily report to CPC about actual cases.

10.2. Duty roster of all Police monitors of the PMT.

11. Live together and collaborate closely with the Milobs of the different sectors.

12. He is assisted by a team of Police officers.

IV. JOB SPECIFICATION OF CPIO

(chief police investigation officer)

1. Investigate any cases of violations in conjunction with local authorities through:
 - 1.1. Investigation of complaints.
 - 1.2. Investigating and reporting of any harrassment of refugees/displaced persons by illegal gangs or individuals.
 - 1.3. Investigation of cases of human rights violations.
2. Assist Milobs and ground troops in police matters.
3. Try to get confidence with all parts of local population .
4. Report serious incidents concerning the police work immediately to CPC
5. Write a weekly sitrep about activities of investigation section. The sitrep HQ not later than 8.00 hrs each monday together with weekly time sheet.
6. Make confidence with the area of the concerned district.
