ACCORDING TO HIM THERE IS A LACK OF TEACHERS, ACCOMMODATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE, SO THAT ONLY 223 OUT OF 273 STUDENTS CAN BE ACCEPTED. THEREFORE THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION HAS DECIDED TO SEND 250 PUPILS, THAT ARE FROM OTHER AREAS BACK HOME. THE STUDENTS REFUSED TO LEAVE THE PLACE AND ENTERED A CLASSROOM. THE PRINCIPAL OF THE SCHOOL FOUND HIMSELF AND THE OTHER TEACHERS UNABLE TO WORK UNDER THIS CONDITION, SO THE SCHOOL IS NOT OPERATING.

RWANDA MINISTER OF EDUCATION WILL NOW RECEIVE A DELEGATION OF 5 STUDENTS TO DISCUSS THE MATTER. INVESTIGATION IS GOING ON.

ONE MILOB TEAM ESCORTED A CANADIAN CONVOY FROM GITARAMA TO GIKONGORO AREA. THE CONVOY IS DUE TO TRANSPORT DISPLACED PERSONS BACK TO KIGALI.

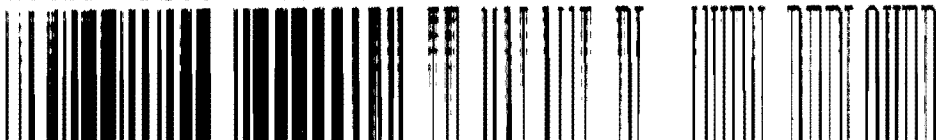

Our team of MICROBs took up the case and went to the prison yard to investigate ~~the~~ the report. According to our team, the ~~prisoners~~ authorities received them warmly. Team commanded the senior RPA soldier present by name KARASILA for his co-operation. He confirmed the reported incident. He explained that a prisoner ^{because of} by name mpitabazenga from NYANZA in the KIGEMBE commune. He was spotted by one of the RPA gds trying to escape by climbing the prison fence. It has not been proven whether the prisoner was hit or not. The prison authorities hinted that at the time of conducting the investigation, the prisoner had not been apprehended.

B. A second team escorted a team of human rights investigators from KIGALI to KARAMA (6011) for the purpose of interviewing locals there. The team was to look into cases of genocide and possibly visit locations

of mass graves. They were however refused entry in KAKAMA by RPA soldiers manning the checkpoint into the town. One of the team members from the human rights ~~invest~~ organisation reported that he was manhandled by the soldiers.

C. A third team went to Kizi to monitor checking / registration of refugees through the Kizi checkpoint. They reported that they were ~~not allowed~~ given cold reception. The RPA soldiers refused to allow them to stand at the checkpoint and asked them to move away. The team, in order to prevent confrontation, complied and took position 100 m away from the checkpoint to be able to at least, monitor proceedings from there. The claims according to the Human Rights team in the HPZ that the Bureau Communal was conscripting people into the force was found to be false. A young man resident there interviewed said he did not join the ~~for~~ military because he has never liked it, rather he was looking for a civil job. Many women and children seen are malnourished. A male orphan of about 6yrs found in the town with a shrapnel ~~wound~~ wound on his head was in bad shape. The team arranged for him to be taken to hospital.
11. NYABISINDU SQ 7040. The team visited an orphanage run by the Italians called ANTONIE. The claims that a compound housing a church, school and parish was used as a detention camp and also contained dead bodies was found to be false. Rather, the team met 2 Rev Sisters who are taking care of 7 kids whose parents were killed by interhamwe. The kids needed food and the general population need food and medicine.

The team attended a confidence-building meeting held by the RPA local council ~~and~~ ^{with} the populace. In the meeting, he warned people against taking laws into their hands. He also appealed to them to stop pointing accusing fingers at others as being interhamwe.

4. RANGO SQ 7108. The team met many displaced persons. The ~~camp~~ ^{place} is used as a transit camp for refugees. The MSF dispensary in the ~~village~~ ^{camp} was functional. So far, about 300 patients have been registered, with a daily registration of about 50-60 persons. There was a general sign of mal-nutrition. The allegation in HDZ that the camp is used as concentration camp and that there were several decomposing bodies were found to be false.

5. The Senior Team leader will travel to KIGALI on welfare trip and return same day.

5. 4. Two meetings of the UN agencies and NGOs were held in BUTARE on Sun, 14 Aug at 1400hrs and 1600hrs respectively. The meeting of 1400hrs was for NGOs providing MEDICARE while that of 1600hrs was for those providing food items. 30 representatives of the Prefecture, UN agencies and NGOs attended. Highlights of the meeting

were as follows:

He claimed he was pursued by militia in civil clothes with machetes. He also claimed he lost his wife and 2 children in the massacre of Apr/May. The team helped him from the spot to BUSORO where he was coming from. He claimed ~~to~~ that he returned from Burundi 5 days ago.

The local market was opened, and people were seen moving about their normal business. A nurse spoken to at the local dispensary claimed that she registers about 500 patients daily; and the most common sickness was malaria, dysentery and malnutrition. Drugs she met in the store were exhausted and she ~~was~~ recycles syringes and needles. This has been taken up with CONCERN and MSF in Butare.

c. At KIZI Camp SQ 6120 team met 3 bony loads of returnees going to REGALI. The returnees expressed concern over vandalism of government property in HPZ by those going to Zaire. They appealed to UNAMIR to help check further vandalism and theft of govt property. There is general lack of food and medicines for those in the camp which is made up of mainly people from GIKONGORO afraid to return home.
