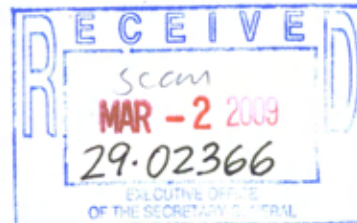

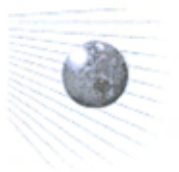

Dear Masumi,

Thank you for your message.

Nikhil briefed HLCP on the decision of the GA regarding the alignment of strategic plans of UN system organizations with the Comprehensive Policy Review of operational activities.

But there is no on-going process in HLCM or UNDG about this. This is not really needed however as this recommendation is for the governing bodies to implement. The issue is also not stricto sensu one of simplification and harmonization in the way it is usually understood. We will report on implementation as part of the follow-up to the TCPR.

So we would suggest that there is no need to follow-up on UNIDO's suggestion with CEB or UNDG.
