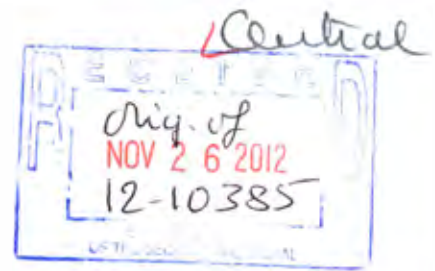

Dear Secretary General:

We (Tamils for Obama) would like to congratulate you and the UN on the creation of the new nation of South Sudan. This is a significant success. It ended a possibly genocidal civil war and created a relatively safe and secure homeland for the potential victims. We think it is an example of the United Nations at its best.

We hope that such an effort can be mounted in Ceylon. There the Tamils have been victimized ever since Ceylon's independence in 1948. Our wish is to have a referendum similar to the one that you and the UN conducted in Sudan recently. This referendum would ask the (mostly Tamil) people of northeastern Ceylon if they wish to live in a safe and secure Tamil Homeland.

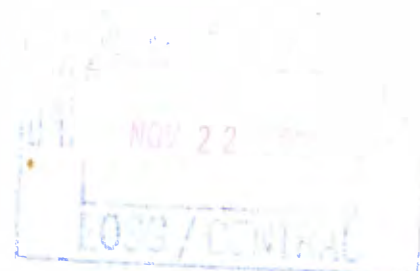
We have collected 50,000 signatures on a petition asking that such a referendum be held. It is our hope that we may meet with you and present this petition to you. Can we make an appointment to meet you and present this document at your convenience?

We have already presented this petition to US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and to Assistant Secretary of State for South and Central Asian Affairs and former United States Ambassador to Sri Lanka Robert Blake.
