- 258) Trial of Yoshio Ogimoto, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 3rd - 11th April 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: That at a PoW camp at Hiroshima, the accused, then a civilian guard, did violate the laws and customs of war.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 5 years with hard labour.
- 259) Trial of Masafumi Sugi, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 27th March - 4th April 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Abusing, mistreating, beating and contributing to deaths, and affixing records.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 40 years with hard labour.
- 260) Trial of Masashi Sato and 2 others, Japanese nationals.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 24th March - 10th April 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Beating and mistreating numerous PoWs, resulting in the deaths of 2 Americans.  
 Verdict: Guilty, 3.  
 Sentences: Imprisonment for 20 years, with hard labour, 1.

                   "          " 5 " " " " 1.
- 261) Trial of Toshinori Asaka and 4 others, Japanese nationals.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 30th October 1946 - 21st March 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: That they wilfully, and unlawfully beat, mistreated and tortured numerous American and Allied PoWs, in some cases the treatment received by the prisoners resulting in their deaths.  
 Verdict: Guilty, 4.  
                   One person severed from the case - insane.  
 Sentences: Imprisonment for 15 years with hard labour, 1,  
                   "          " 12 " " " " 1,  
                   "          " 10 " " " " 1,  
                   "          " 1 " " " " 1.
- 262) Trial of Kosaku Hazama, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 3rd February - 19th March 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Failure to provide rations, quarters, clothing, shelter, heat and medicine, medical care and attention, contributing to deaths of numerous PoWs, beating, torture and mistreatment, misappropriation of Red Cross supplies.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 15 years with hard labour.
- 263) Trial of Tsunesuke Tsuda, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 13th March - 1st April 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Misappropriation of Red Cross supplies, mistreatment, abuse and beating of prisoners of war.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 40 years with hard labour.
- 264) Trial of Minoru Fujimoto and 5 others, Japanese nationals.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 3rd March - 16th April 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Beatings, abuses, torture, of American and Dutch PoWs.  
 Verdict: All found guilty.  
 Sentences: Imprisonment for 23 years with hard labour, 1,  
                   "          " 17 " " " " 2,  
                   "          " 15 " " " " 1,  
                   "          " 12 " " " " 1,

- 265) Trial of Takoshi Hashimoto, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 5 March - 10 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Murder, collective punishment, beating, abuse and mistreatment of Prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 8 years with hard labour.
- 266) Trial of Satoshi Oie, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 19th December 1946 at Manila, P.I.  
Charge: Murder, cruelty and torture, other assaults and mistreatments of Chinese and Filipino civilians at or near Dumaguete, P.I.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Death by shooting.
- 267) Trial of Hisamitsu Imamura and 5 others, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 20th March 1947 at Manila, P.I.  
Charge: Assault and mistreatment of Filipino civilians in the Philippine Islands.  
Verdict: One person declared insane.  
Guilty, 5.  
Sentences: Imprisonment for 10 years with hard labour, 5.
- 268) Trial of Hiroshi Ishiguro and 2 others, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 14th March 1947 at Manila, P.I.  
Charge: Murder, torture and mistreatment of Filipino civilians at Mindanao, P.I.  
Verdict: Not guilty, 2.  
Guilty, 1.  
Sentence: Death by hanging.
- 269) Trial of Tonoo Shirakura and Osamu Watanabe, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 25th March 1947 at Manila, P.I.  
Charge: Murder of Filipino civilians in the P.I.  
Verdict: Both found guilty.  
Sentences: Death by hanging, 2.
- 270) Trial of Chinsaku Yuki, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 21st March 1947 at Manila, P.I.  
Charge: Torture and murder of Filipino civilians.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for life with hard labour.
- 271) Trial of Honoichi Moriyama, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 29th April, 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: That as a civilian foreman of a Cement company employing POWs held captive by the armed forces of Japan, he did violate the laws and customs of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 12 years with hard labour.
- 272) Trial of Mokoto Kimira, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of trial: 29 - 30 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: That he wilfully and unlawfully mistreated numerous American prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for one year with hard labour.
- 273) Trial of Yoshio Sudo, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 28 - 30 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: That he did abuse and mistreat and permit persons to abuse and mistreat numerous American and Allied prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 7 years with hard labour.



- 274) Trial of Masatoshi Sawamura, Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 14 - 29 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Mistreatment, beating, torture, forcing sick men to work, the victims being American POWs.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 30 years with hard labour.
- 275) Trial of Masao Uwamori, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 14 - 28th April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beatings, abuse, mass punishment, torture of American POWs.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 3 years with hard labour.
- 276) Trial of Yukinaga Kimura, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 17 - 18 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beatings, deprivation of food and other abuses of prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 7 years with hard labour.
- 277) Trial of Tadashi Sato, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 21 - 23 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Mistreatment, torture, abuse, and neglect of American and Dutch prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 7 years with hard labour.
- 278) Trial of Toshichi Takagi, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 23rd April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating, abusing, contributing to insanity and death of American prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Death by hanging.
- 279) Trial of Ryugo Kanetsuna and Junji Mano, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 2 - 14 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating, abuse, torture and contributing to the death of American, Australian, British and Italian prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty, 2.  
Sentences: Imprisonment for 9 years with hard labour, 1.  
" " 6 " " " " " , 1.
- 280) Trial of Hajime Honda, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 12 - 14 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: That when a civilian guard at a POW camp, he violated the laws and customs of war by mistreating and abusing American and Allied POWs and in one case contributed to the death of a prisoner.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Death by hanging.
- 281) Trial of Seicki Naganuma and 4 others, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 15 April - 13 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating and mistreatment of numerous American and Allied prisoners of war.  
Verdict: All found guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 25 years with hard labour, 1.  
" " 15 " " " " " 1,  
" " 12 " " " " " 2,  
" " 5 " " " " " 1.



- 282) Trial of Bunachi Bando, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 24 - 25 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: That he wilfully and unlawfully beat, mistreated and abused numerous American and Allied POWs.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 6 years with hard labour.
- 283) Trial of Shohai Ikeda, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 12 May - 16th May 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Mistreatment, abuse and torture of numerous American and Allied POWs at a POW camp.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 15 years with hard labour.
- 284) Trial of Ryuma Hirano and Sadao Saitano, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 1 - 9 March 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Torture and mistreatment of numerous American and Allied prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Both found guilty.  
Sentences: Imprisonment for 7 years with hard labour, 2.
- 285) Trial of Saburo Matsumuro, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 1 - 9 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating, mistreating and abusing prisoners of war, failure to discharge his duty as Camp Commander, permitting personnel under his command to commit cruel and brutal acts.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 20 years with hard labour.
- 286) Trial of Miki Tarodachi and Tarokichi Nakayama, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 16th May 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating, mistreating and misappropriating Red Cross supplies, refusing available medical supplies and attention, and burning POWs.  
Verdict: Both guilty.  
Sentences: Imprisonment for 4 years with hard labour.

- 287) Trial of Tsugio Nishida, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 5 - 7 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating, abusing and torturing Prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 9 years with hard labour.
- 288) Trial of Tatsuo Ando, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 8 - 9 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating and other abuses of prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 5 years with hard labour.
- 289) Trial of Junsaburo Toshino and 8 others, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 10 March - 9 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Murder, neglect, abuse, torture and gross mistreatment of American POWs.  
Verdict: Not guilty, 3.  
Guilty, 6.  
Sentences: Death by hanging, 2,  
Imprisonment for life, with hard labour, 1,  
" " 25 years, with hard labour, 1,  
" " 20 " " " 1,  
" " 10 " " " 1,  
" " " " " 1.



- 290) Trial of Hideo Yasutake, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 23 - 29 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Beating, abuse, torture, contributing to the death of American and Dutch prisoners of war.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 12 years with hard labour.
- 291) Trial of Hiroichi Uno, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 29 April - 7 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Beating, mistreating and otherwise abusing PoWs.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 10 years with hard labour.
- 292) Trial of Yoshio Nakanishi, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 12 - 16 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Beating, abusing and torturing Prisoners of war.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 15 years with hard labour.
- 293) Trial of Ryoichi Higashigouchi, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 29 May - 4 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Abuse, beating and mistreatment of numerous American and Allied prisoners of war.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 25 years with hard labour.
- 294) Trial of Seitaro Hata and 4 others, Japanese nationals.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 1 - 28 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Misappropriation of Red Cross supplies, failure to provide adequate medical attention, mistreatment, beating and possible responsibility for deaths of PoWs.  
 Verdict: One accused withdrawn from the case.  
 Four found guilty.  
 Sentences: Imprisonment for 25 years with hard labour, 1,  
 " " 20 " " " " 1,  
 " " 15 " " " " 2.
- 295) Trial of Yoneo Murakami, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 2 - 3 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Mistreatment, abuse, and beating of PoWs.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 5 years with hard labour.
- 296) Trial of Matsuzo Mumi, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 28 May - 2 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Mistreatment, torture and abuse of PoWs and misappropriation of Red Cross supplies.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 6 years with hard labour.
- 297) Trial of Sachio Egawa and 3 others, Japanese nationals.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 23 March - 2 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Beating, abuse, causing disability and death to prisoners of war.  
 Verdict: All guilty.  
 Sentences: Death by hanging, 1,  
 Imprisonment for life, 2,  
 " " 20 years, 1.
- 298) Trial of Gisaburo Mariyama, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 20 May - 4 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Beating, abusing, torturing and contributing to the deaths of prisoners of war.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 15 years with hard labour.



- 299) Trial of Toshitake Kojyo (Kojiro) a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 5th - 28th March 1947 at Manila, P.I.  
Charge: Wilfully and unlawfully permitted members of the Japanese army, then under his command and did participate in the killing of an unarmed non-combatant Filipino civilian.  
Verdict: Not guilty.
- 300) Trial of Akira Takeshita, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 4th - 16th October 1946 at Manila, P.I.  
Charge: Murder, cruelty and torture, other assaults and mis-treatments of civilians in the Philippine Islands.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 25 years with hard labour.  
Confirmed.
- 301) Trial of Kinsaku Kobayashi and 4 others, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 24th March 1947 at Manila, P.I.  
Charge: Murder and attempted murder of Filipino civilians.  
Verdict: 1 dismissed without prejudice by prosecutor. Not yet apprehended.  
Guilty, 4.  
Sentence: Death by hanging, 1.  
Imprisonment for life, with hard labour, 3.  
Death sentence commuted to life imprisonment.  
Two life sentences commuted to imprisonment for 10 years. One life sentence confirmed.
- 302) Trial of Tetsuo Kobayashi, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 14 October 1946 - 2 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: That when a probationary officer in the Medical Dept. of the Japanese army, he wilfully and unlawfully refused and failed to furnish adequate and available medicine, medical treatment and hospitalization, contributing to the deaths of one or more POWs and that he converted to his own use Red Cross and other supplies intended for the use and benefit of Allied POWs.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 20 years with hard labour.
- 303) Trial of Yasuhiko Kuroiwa and Yagohei Iwata, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 31 March - 3 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating, abuse and mistreatment of prisoners of war.  
Verdict: One accused severed from the case on motion by the prosecutor.  
The other, Iwata, found guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 12 years with hard labour.
- 304) Trial of Isamu Ishihara, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 5th April, 1946 at Shanghai.  
Charge: That he committed cruel, inhuman and brutal atrocities against American Prisoners of War. (7 charges).  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for life with hard labour.  
Confirmed.
- 305) Trial of Toru Miki, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 19th April 1946 at Shanghai.  
Charge: Wilfully and unlawfully committing cruel, inhuman and brutal atrocities and other offences against certain American Prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 25 years with hard labour.



- 306) Trial of Matsukichi Muta and Sadamu Takeda, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 15 - 25 April 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating and mistreatment of numerous American and Allied PoWs, in one case being connected with the death of two prisoners.  
Verdict: Guilty, 2.  
Sentences: Death by hanging, 2.
- 307) Trial of Nagayasu Kawabe, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 26-27 May 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Wilfully, unlawfully converted to his own use Red Cross supplies, and permitted members of his Command to beat and abuse numerous American and Allied PoWs.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 5 years with hard labour.
- 308) Trial of Tetsuo Mizuno and 7 others, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 2 April - 6 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Abuse and mistreatment of numerous American and Allied PoWs.  
Verdict: Guilty, 8.  
Sentences: Imprisonment for 40 years with hard labour, 3,  
" " 30 " " " " 1,  
" " 20 " " " " 1,  
" " 10 " " " " 1,  
" " 5 " " " " 1,  
" " 3 " " " " 1.
- 309) Trial of Tatsuro Fujita and 4 others, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 28 May - 6 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Killing of an American PoW.  
Verdict: Guilty, 5.  
Sentences: Imprisonment for 5 years with hard labour, 4,  
" " 2 " " " " 1.
- 310) Trial of Kunizo Katsuki, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 4th June 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating, abusing, torture and gross mistreatment of British prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 5 years with hard labour.
- 311) Trial of Yokio Ogo and 9 others, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 26th February 1947 at Manila, P.I.  
Charge: Murder, cruelty and torture of Filipino civilians.  
Verdict: 6 accused dismissed, without prejudice, by the Prosecution.  
4 found guilty.  
Sentences: Death by hanging, 1,  
Imprisonment for life with hard labour, 1,  
" " 50 years, with hard labour, 1,  
" " 30 years, " " " 1.
- 312) Trial of Seijiro Yamamoto and 3 others, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 9 - 19 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Violations of the laws and customs of war.  
Verdict: One accused severed from the case.  
One found not guilty.  
Two found guilty.  
Sentences: Imprisonment for 2 years with hard labour, 1,  
" " 1 " " " " 1.



- 313) Trial of Shichisaburo Yajima, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 9 - 24 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Mistreatment, abuse, decapitation and command responsibility.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for life with hard labour.
- 314) Trial of Katsunosuke Watanabe, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 17 - 24 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Refusing medical aid to, abusing, beating and mistreating POWs, in some cases contributing to their deaths. Failure to restrain members of his command and permitting them to commit cruel and inhuman acts.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 12 years with hard labour.
- 315) Trial of Fukujiro Akiyama, a Japanese national.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 19 - 23 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Torture, beating and abusing POWs.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentence: Imprisonment for 2 years with hard labour.
- 316) Trial of Takaji Ryu and Kazuo Tanaka, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 16 - 19 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: Beating, abusing, torturing Prisoners of war.  
Verdict: Guilty.  
Sentences: Imprisonment for 7 years, with hard labour, 1,  
" " " 2 " " " " 1.
- 317) Trial of Kiyoshi Obayashi and Masao Nakanishi, Japanese nationals.  
J. Date & Place of Trial: 24 - 25 June 1947 at Yokohama.  
Charge: No information available.  
Verdict: Both guilty.  
Sentences: Imprisonment for 25 years with hard labour, 1,

- 320) Trial of Masataka Kaburagi and 17 others,  
Date & Place of Trial: 28th February 1946 at Shanghai.  
Charge: Wilfully and unlawfully committing cruel, inhuman and brutal atrocities against certain American POWs.  
Verdict: Not guilty, 1.  
Guilty of all or parts of the charge, 17.  
Sentences: Death, 5,  
Imprisonment for life, 1,  
" " 20 years, 1,  
" " 15 " 3,  
" " 12 " 3,  
" " 3 " 2,  
" " 2 " 1,

 Sentence: Imprisonment for 5 years with hard labour, 1,

- 322) Trial of Hiroyuki Morita, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 30 June - 3 July 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Abuse, mistreatment and beating of Australian POWs.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 15 years with hard labour.
- 323) Trial of Nobuhiro Miyakawa, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 1 - 7 July 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Mistreatment, torture, abuse and beating of American and British POWs.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 22 years with hard labour.
- 324) Trial of Taizo Mimura, a Japanese national.  
 J. Date & Place of Trial: 25 June - 3 July 1947 at Yokohama.  
 Charge: Beating, abuse and misappropriation of Red Cross supplies for Prisoners of war.  
 Verdict: Guilty.  
 Sentence: Imprisonment for 5 years with hard labour.

Date & Place of Trial: The trial commenced on 8th July 1947 at Nuremberg.  
Charge: Committing war crimes and crimes against humanity, including murder, ill-treatment and deportation to slave labour of POWs and other members of the armed forces of nations at war with Germany and of civilian populations of territories occupied by the German armed forces, plunder of public and private property, wanton destruction of cities, towns and villages, and other atrocities and offences against civilian populations.



- 342) Trial of Ulrich Greifelt and 13 others, (Subsequent Proceedings Case No. 8). RKFDs (Reichs Commissariat for the strengthening of Germanism.)

 Charge: Crimes against Humanity and War Crimes... including murder of more than one million persons, tortures, atrocities and other inhumane acts, and also membership in criminal organisations.
- 344) Trial of Alfried Krupp von Bohlen und Halbach, Owner and Directing Head, and 11 others, Officials of the Krupp Firm and Family Enterprise. (Subsequent Proceedings Case No.10)  
 Date & Place of Trial: The trial will be held at Nuremberg.  
 Only the Indictment has been received so far.

Charge: That, acting in pursuance of a common design... they did, at or near the vicinity of Flossenbug Concentration Camp and its out-camps,...between 1 January 1942 and 8th May 1945, wilfully, deliberately and wrongfully encourage, aid, abet and participate in the subjection of Poles, Frenchmen, Yugoslavs, citizens of the Soviet Union, Norwegians, Danes, Belgians, citizens of the Netherlands, citizens of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, British subjects, stateless persons, Czechs, citizens of the United States of America and other non-German nationals who were then and there in the custody of the then German Reich and members of the armed forces of nations then at war with the then German Reich who were then and there surrendered and unarmed prisoners of war... to killings, beatings, tortures, starvation, abuses and indignities, the exact names and numbers of such persons being unknown, but aggregating many thousands.

Verdict: Trial of Stepan Sezetynskyi (accused No.45) to be continued at a later date because of the delays involved in translating from French, Polish and other languages into Russian as well as English and German.

Not Guilty, 11, (against 6 of whom the charges were withdrawn on the 113th day of trial.)

**Charge:** That they participated in a common design and a criminal conspiracy, particularly by dissemination of illegal orders which brought about the mistreatment and killing of surrendered and unarmed prisoners of war; that they were members of certain organizations declared criminal by the I.M.T. at Nuremberg, with the knowledge that these organizations were being used in the commission of acts declared criminal by that tribunal; and eight charges of specific murders committed on certain dates and at certain places, of surrendered and unarmed prisoners of war, all of which occurred in Germany during the war. (10 charges in all).

Transcript available only until 34th day of trial.  
Verdict and sentences to follow.

**374) Trial of Frans Auer and 13 others. (The Muehldorf trial).**

**Date & Place of Trial:** 1st April - 13th May 1947 at Dachau.

**Charge:** A copy of the charge is not included in the transcript available to the Secretariat, but reference is made in the proceedings to part of it, as follows: That the Concentration Camp Muehldorf was a sub-camp of Dachau. The Prosecutor referred to a new form of Indictment, i.e. that acting together, in a common design, they operated a concentration camp and that their illegal and murderous acts were only included as part of the principal act, the operation of the camp.

Charge: (2) As Charge 1, but the acts took place at Dachau, and concerned members of the armed forces of nations then at war with the then German Reich, who were then and there surrendered and unarmed prisoners of war in the custody of the then German Reich.

- (4) That together with other persons, ...they did wrongfully encourage, aid, abet and participate, to their own use and benefit, in obstructing and preventing the receipt and delivery of Red Cross and other parcels, containing food and clothing, consigned to members of the Armed Forces of the United States of America, who were then and there surrendered and unarmed prisoners of war in the custody of the then German Reich.
- Verdict: Two accused found Not Guilty on 7th day of trial.  
All other accused acquitted.
