DAILY SITREP FOR 13 AUG 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIREAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 58 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 1,944 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) AN RPA PLATOON IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SECURITY OF THE KAMEMBE COMMUNE OFFICE (8031). THIS PLATOON CARRIES OUT NIGHT PATROL OF THE AREA WITH 5 - 6 SOLDIERS AT A TIME ALONG WITH LOCALS WHO HAD BEEN RECRUITED TO PATROL WITH THEM. THERE ARE SIMILAR COORDINATED PATROLS IN THE AREAS OF NKANGA (8132) AND CYUMUMBA (8333). IN THESE TWO SECTORS THERE IS A TOTAL OF 40 TO 50 RPA TROOPS DEPLOYED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) SECTOR 1 (GITARAMA) MILOBS REPORTED THAT A GRENADE EXPLOSION OCCURED ON 10 AUG 95 IN FRONT OF THE "FLORIDA" RESTAURANT IN THE CENTER OF GITARAMA NO CASUALTY REPORTED. IT APPEARS THAT THE OWNER IS A HUTU AND THERE IS COMPETITION WITH ANOTHER CAFE CALLED "NECTAR" WHICH IS OWNED BY A TUTSI. INVESTIGATION ONGOING.

(2) SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTS THAT A GROUP OF 3 BANDITS KILLED A WOMAN AND HER SON WITH A GRENADE IN NYAKABUYE SECTOR (8917). WHEN THE LOCALS RAISED AN ALARM THEY FLED. NO ITEMS WERE REPORTED STOLEN. THE BANDITS ARE SUSPECTED TO BE FROM WITHIN THE LOCALITY.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED IN THE WHOLE AOR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) REPORTED THAT THE "SISTERS CONGREGATION", A VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATION FROM JALY, HAS ASSUMED CONTROL OF THE HEALTH CENTER IN THE MUHURA COMMUNE AS THE NGO "INTER-SOS" HAS MOVED TO KIBUYE. THE HEALTH CENTER

CONTINUES TO RELY ON SUPPORT FROM "CARITAS" AND "REGION SANITAIRE" BASED IN BYUMBA. THE AUTHORITIES FORESEE THE REQUIREMENT FOR AN AMBULANCE ONCE "INTER-SOS" MOVES OUT COMPLETELY.

B. UNHCR REP CLARIFIED THAT THE DATE OF TRANSPORTATION OF THE 200 REFUGEES FROM IJWI ISLAND TO NYAMASHEKE HAS NOT BEEN FINALISED.

C. MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) DISCUSSED THE EXPECTED REFUGEE CROSSING 14-15 AUG WITH RPA. THE RPA GAVE ASSURANCE THAT THEY WOULD PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO THE REFUGEES FROM ZAIRE IF THEY COME. A MILOB PATROL TOGETHER WITH REPS FROM UNHCR/NGO INTEND TO MONITOR THE SITUATION.

D. A TOTAL OF 19 LOCAL PATIENTS WERE GIVEN MEDICAL ASSISTANCE THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY THE MEDICAL CENTRES IN THE VARIOUS SECTORS.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. CIVPOL REPORTED THAT THE FORMER BOURGMESTER OF MUKO COMMUNE IN GIKONGORO WHO WAS REPLACED FOR HIS INABILITY TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM OF LOCALS HAS BEEN PLACED IN CUSTODY AS A RESULT OF HIS INVOLVEMENT IN LAST YEAR GENOCIDE.

B. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTS THAT TRUCK NUMBER TZ 76983 WHICH IS CARRYING FOOD AND MEDICINE IS STILL WAITING PERMISSION TO CROSS INTO ZAIRE AT UVIRA 1 BORDER POST.

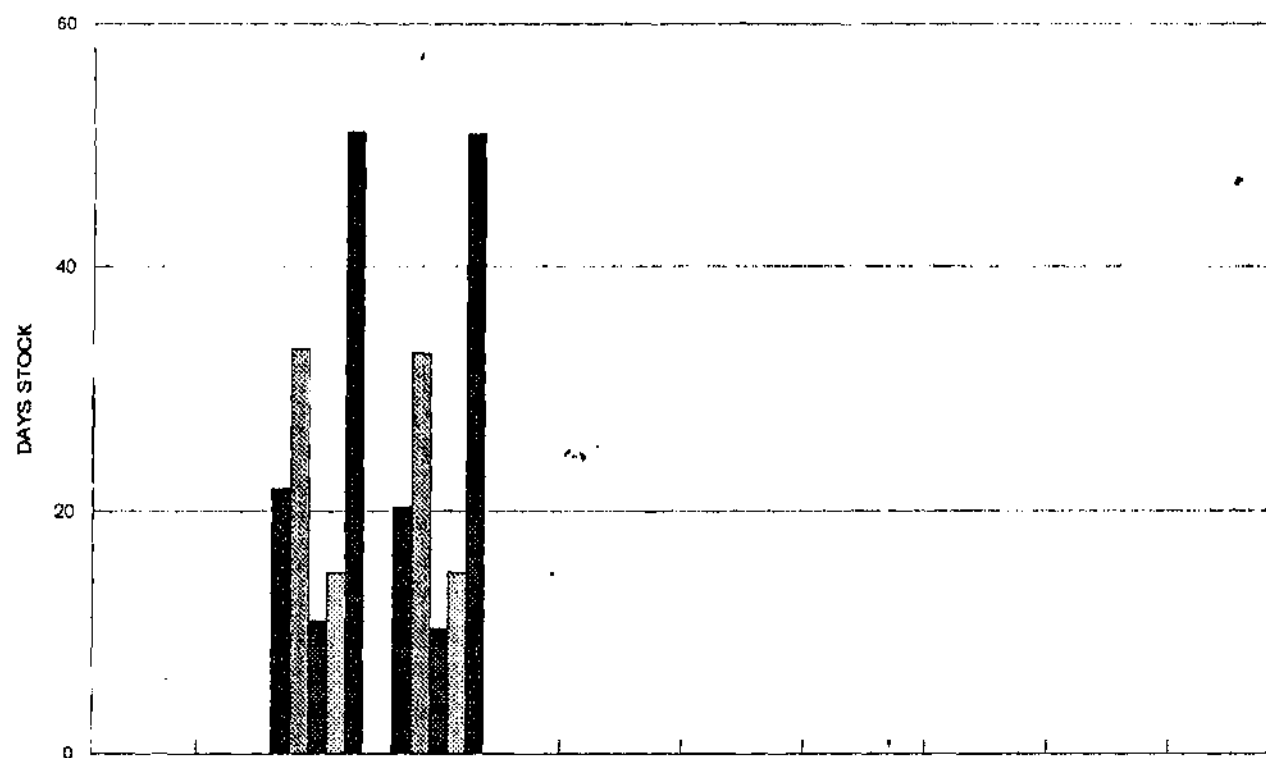



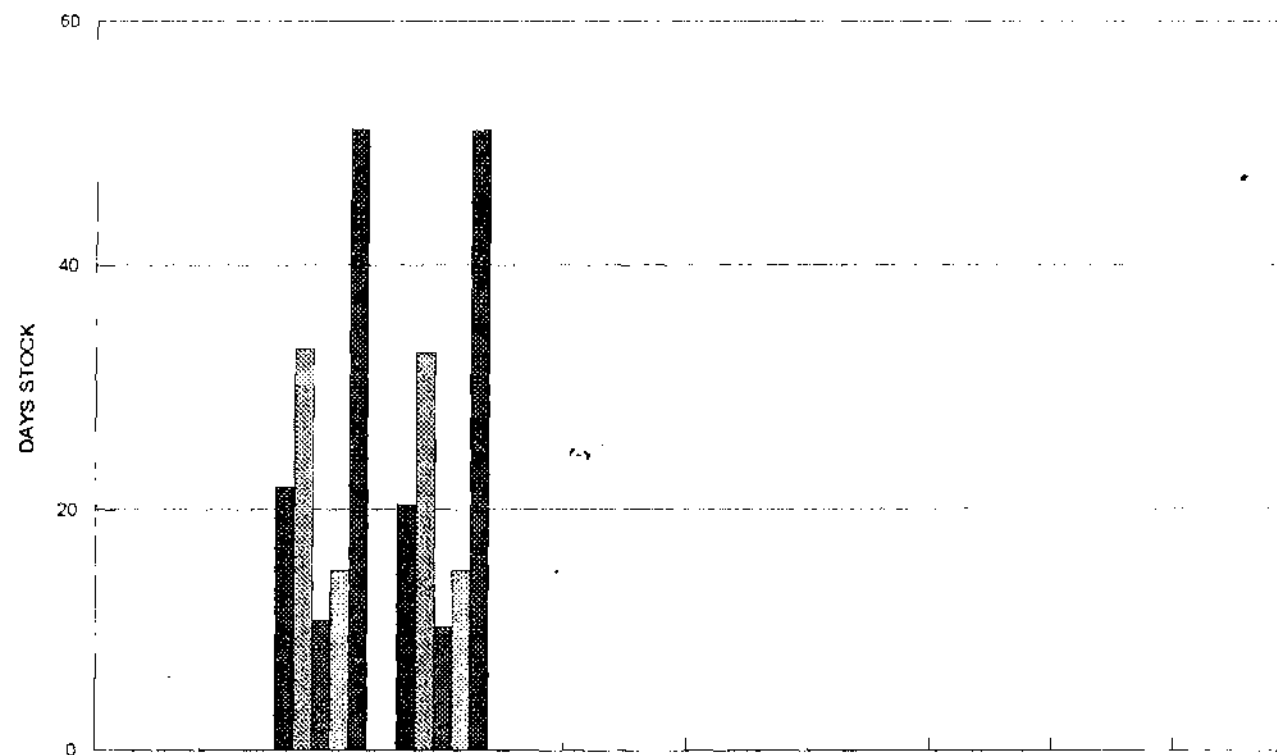

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 95 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 1,886 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. NSTR.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY NSTR.

(1) IN BUTARE AT 1145HRS ON 12 AUG 95, THREE UNARMED MEN DRESSED IN RPA UNIFORM ATTEMPTED TO BREAK INTO A MILOBS RESIDENCE. THEY FLED ON BEING CHALLENGED BY ONE MILOB WHO WAS OFF DUTY AND PRESENT IN THE HOUSE.

AT (2) FIRING BY A GROUP OF ARMED MEN TOOK PLACE ON 11 AUG 2300 HRS AT BASA SQ 2414 IN RUBAVU COMMUNE SQ 2213, IN SECTOR 5 NYUNDO. FOUR MEMBERS OF A FAMILY WERE KILLED, AND ONE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

D. IN THE SECTORS ON 12 AUG AT APPROXIMATELY 0800HRS A PICK UP VEHICLE BELONGING TO THE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION, WITH FIVE CIVILIANS AND THREE RPA SOLDIERS, CAME UNDER A MINE WHICH EXPLODED IN GENERAL AREA OF BWIZA (GR 3792). THE DRIVER OF THE VEHICLE SUSTAINED MULTIPLE FRACTURE INJURIES, WHILE TWO OTHERS HAD OTHER INJURIES. MORE DETAILS BEING ASCERTAINED.

4 HUMANITARIAN

(1) AT NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP (GR 7549), IN SECTOR 2 KIBUNGO 239 RETURNEES WERE RECORDED FROM BURUNDI, TANZANIA AND ZAIRE FROM 01 TO 12 AUG 95 AND ONLY 125 RETURNEES ARE REMAINING IN THE CAMP. THE REST HAVE BEEN REPATRIATED TO THEIR COMMUNES.

(2) INDBATT TRANSPORTED 10 TONS OF THE WFP FOOD FROM GITARAMA TO RUTOBWE COMMUNE GR 7781.

(3) GHANBATT PROVIDED ONE TCV TO ICRC TO CONVEY FUELWOOD FOR KIBUNGO PRISON.

(4) 68 IDPS ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP. 33 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR. 126 ARE WAITING FRO EVACUATION.

(5) A TOTAL OF 79 MEDICAL AND 28 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT THREE FUEL TANKERS WHICH WERE DENIED PERMISSION TO PASS, CROSSED INTO ZAIRE ON 12 AUG 95. HOWEVER ONE LORRY CARRYING MEDICINE AND GROCERIES IS STILL AWAITING PERMISSION TO CROSS.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL

A. IN BUGARAMA SECTOR 4, AN EX MAGISTRATE WHO WAS RELEASED FROM PRISON AND SOUGHT PROTECTION TO UNHR, WAS HANDED OVER ON 12 AUG 95 BY THIS AGENCY TO UN CIVPOL FOR SECURITY REASONS UNTIL MONDAY 14 AUG 95. THE MATTER IS BEING TAKEN UP BY HUMAN RIGHTS WITH HIGHER AUTHORITIES.

B. ON 11 AUG 95 AT 1500 HRS IN KACYIRU, KIGALI, A GROUP OF RPA SOLDIERS KNOCKED AND KICKED ON THE DOOR OF A HOUSE INHABITED BY SIX UNITED NATIONS VOLUNTEERS (UNV). THE UNVs CALLED UNAMIR MILITARY POLICE, BUT BEFORE THEY ARRIVED, THE RPA SOLDIERS HAD LEFT. THE RPA SOLDIERS REPORTEDLY TOLD THE WATCHMEN (RWANDESE) AT THE HOUSE THAT THEY HAD COME TO SEARCH THE HOUSE FOR WEAPONS.

8. LOGISTICS. ROUTINE ACTIVITIES WERE CARRIED OUT. NORMED CARGO TO ARRIVE ON 140600 AUG 95.

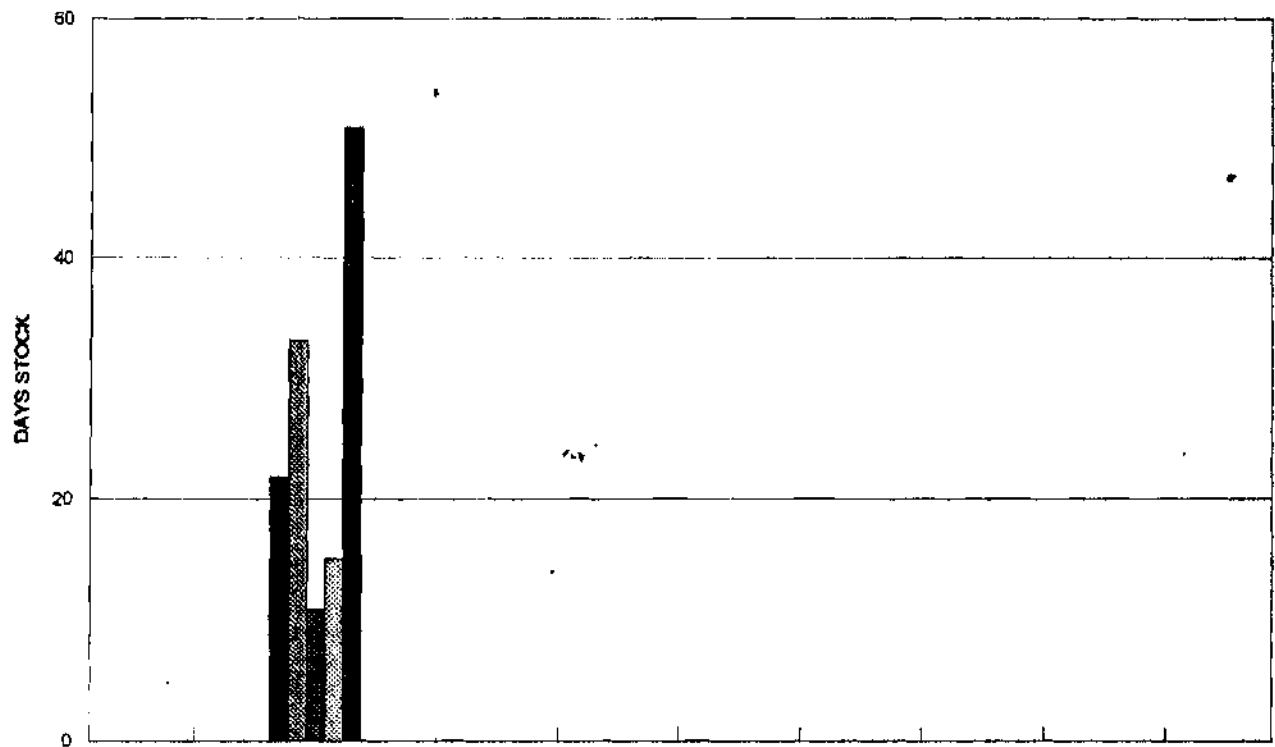

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. IN ANNOUNCING THAT THE NON-ALIGNED MEMBERS OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL, AT THE INITIATIVE OF RWANDA AND SUPPORTED BY THE U.S.A., HAD PROPOSED THE LIFTING OF THE U.N ARMS EMBARGO ON RWANDA, RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT FRANCE AND THE U.K. WERE OPPOSED TO SUCH A MOVE.

B. THE DEPUTY PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA HAS ANNOUNCED THAT THE TRIBUNAL'S CHIEF PROSECUTOR AND PRESIDENT WOULD BE VISITING RWANDA AT THE END OF AUGUST TO HOLD TALKS WITH SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT ON 7 AUG 95, THE COMMISSION ON REPATRIATION COMPOSED OF REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA AND TANZANIA, AND UNHCR, BEGAN A WORKING VISIT TO BURUNDI AND TANZANIA IN AN EFFORT TO URGE RWANDESE REFUGEES TO RETURN HOME.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.**A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.**

(1) RPA CONDUCTED A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION NEAR SECT 1 MILOBS HQ IN KIGALI. THIS WAS IN RESPONSE TO GUNSHOTS THAT WERE FIRED THE PREVIOUS NIGHT (10 AUG 95). NO FURTHER INFORMATION AVAILABLE.

(2) IN SECTOR 1 GITARAMA TWO FEMALE OFFICERS FROM HR WERE SUBJECTED TO A DETAILED SEARCH, INCLUDING THEIR DOCUMENTS, BY RPA SOLDIERS.

(3) MILOBS RUHENGARI WERE INFORMED THAT RECENTLY 300 ANTI PERSONNEL MINES WERE DEMINED BY ONLY THREE RPA SOLDIERS, ALONG THE BORDER WITH UGANDA/ZAIRE IN VOLCANO MOUNTAIN AREA UNDER KINIGI AND NKUMBA COMMUNES. THIS WAS

CONFIRMED BY THE RPA LO.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY

(1) CASES OF BANDITRY WERE REPORTED IN GIKONI SECTOR GR 5237, GIKONGORO, RESULTING IN THE LOSS OF COWS AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS BY THE VICTIMS.

(2) ON 10 AUG SIX BANDITS CARRIED OUT AN ARMED ROBBERY AT KIRANGA GR 7908, IN SECTOR 4, GISHOMA COMMUNE. THEY RAN AWAY WITH THREE COWS.

(3) ON 9 AUG 95 AT ABOUT 2130 THERE WAS AN ATTEMPTED SABOTAGE ON AN ELECTRIC PYLON CLOSED TO THE COMMUNE OFFICE OF KIBILIRA GR 5785, IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI. MINOR DAMAGES WERE RECORDED.

(4) SOME UNIDENTIFIED PERSONNEL TRIED TO ROB THE HOUSE OF WORLD CONCERN INTERNATIONAL NEAR HOTEL MERIDIAN, KIGALI. RRF WAS CALLED FOR AT 102030 HRS, BUT THE INTRUDERS FLED AWAY BEFORE RRF'S ARRIVAL ON THE SITE. 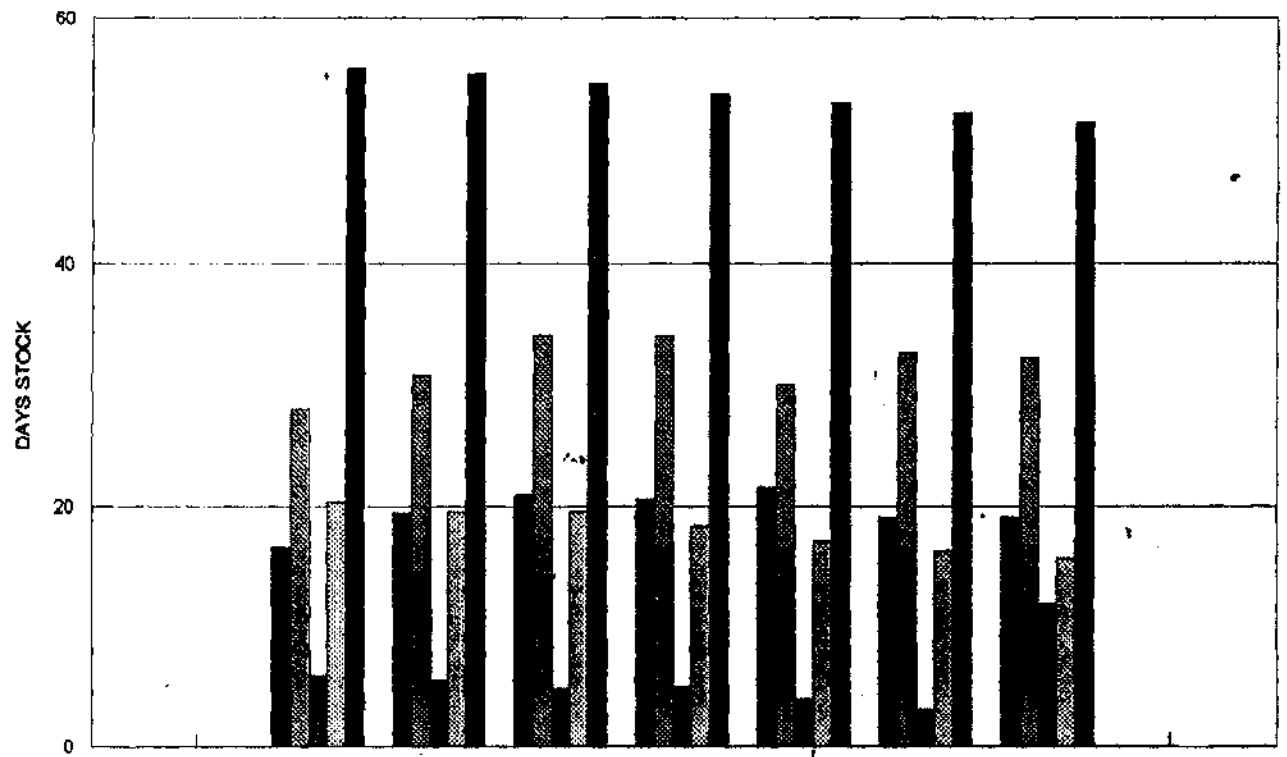

DAILY SITREP FOR 10 AUG 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 64 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 1,791 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA FOLLOWING HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO BELGIUM, THE RWANDESE FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, STATED WITH REGARD TO THE REPORTED BELGIAN PROPOSAL FOR A NATIONAL DIALOGUE WITH RWANDESE REFUGEES, THAT NO DIALOGUE WAS NECESSARY AS THE PRINCIPLES OF THE ARUSHA ACCORD, INCLUDING DEMOCRACY, POWER-SHARING AND NATIONAL RECONCILIATION, WERE ALREADY THE BASIS FOR THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT'S ACTIONS. ON THE PROPOSAL FOR A REGIONAL CONFERENCE TO DISCUSS THE PROBLEM OF REFUGEES, MR. GASANA STATED THAT, FOLLOWING THE CONCLUSIONS OF THE NAIROBI SUMMIT AND THE BUJUMBURA MEETING, NO CONFERENCE OF THE KIND WAS NEEDED EXCEPT FOR A MEETING TO COLLECT FUNDS REQUIRED PURPOSES FINANCING REFUGEE REPATRIATION.

IT WAS GATHERED THAT THERE IS A DIRECTIVE GIVE BY PREFECT OF KIGALI TO ARREST ANYONE FOUND CHANGING FOREIGN CURRENCY ON THE BLACK MARKET NO MATTER HIS/HER STATUS OR NATIONALITY.

(2) RPA PREVENTED SECT 4 MILOBS PATROL TEAM TO RUSIZI I FROM CROSSING THE FOOT BRIDGE TO OBTAIN REFUGEE FIGURES FROM UNHCR OFFICE ON ZAIRIAN SIDE MILOBS WERE TOLD TO OBTAIN FIGURES FROM UNHCR OFFICE IN CYANGUGU.

(3) SECTOR 1 (GITARAMA) RPA WAS IMPLICATED IN MURDER OF ONE LOCAL, IN MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE (GR 8274) ON 07 AUG 95 ACCORDING TO FINDINGS OF A JOINT MILOB/CIVPOL INVESTIGATING TEAM. - ALSO A BELGIAN SISTER INFORMED

MILOBS THAT RPA ARRESTED 2 GUARDS WHO WERE AT THE HOUSE OF THE RWANDESE PRIEST KILLED IN KAMONYI SECTOR LAST WEEK.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NSTR.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES.

(1) FC MET WITH DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RIGHTS WATCH AND THEY DISCUSSED THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM AND THE SITUATION IN THE RWANDESE PRISONS.

(2) HE ALSO MET WITH UNRWO REPRESENTATIVES TO DISCUSS POSSIBLE ACTIONS NEEDED TO BE TAKEN TO IMPROVE THE CONDITIONS IN THE RWANDESE PRISONS.

IN THE SECTORS

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) SECTOR 2 MILOBS (BYUMBA) REPORTED A MEETING AT KIBUNGO BETWEEN BOUREGMESTRES AND SHOPKEEPERS IN THE PREFECTURE AT THE PREFECTS OFFICE. PAYMENT OF TAXES AND RENT BY THE SHOPKEEPERS WERE DISCUSSED.

(3) SECTOR 3 MILOBS (GIKONGORO) REPORTED THAT THE NEW BOURGMESTRE OF MUKO COMMUNE (GR 3841) WHO WAS APPOINTED FOLLOWING DEMONSTRATIONS AGAINST THE OLD ONE ASSUMED OFFICE EFFECTIVE 07 AUG 95. THE FORMER WHO WAS ACCUSED OF ADMINISTRATIVE MALPRACTICE IS REPORTEDLY IN DETENTION AT GIKONGORO.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 3 MILOBS GIKONGORO REPORTED THAT 499 PERSONS WERE EVACUATED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNE IN MUBUGA (GR 5202) FROM MURAMBI IDP CAMP (GR 5125) BRINGING THE TOTAL NUMBER EVACUATED SINCE THE PROGRAMME BEGAN 4 DAYS AGO TO 953. UNHCR, ICRC, MALICOY AND SOLIDARITY CONTINUE TO PROVIDE FOOD, MEDICAL SUPPORT AND TRANSPORTATION TO THE RETURNEES. HOWEVER SOME IDPS INTERVIEWED, WHO WERE REGISTERED TO GO TO RWAMIKO COMMUNE (GR 4914) EXPRESSED FEAR OF INSECURITY AND THEREFORE OPTED TO BE TAKEN TO KIBEHO (GR 5107).

B. IN SECTOR 3 (BUTARE) BOURGMESTRE OF RUNYINYA COMMUNE (GR 6012) HAS REQUESTED THAT ONE HUNDRED ORPHANS OF AGE BETWEEN TWO AND TWELVE YEARS IN THE AREA BE MOVED TO AN ORPHANAGE BECAUSE OTHER FAMILIES KEEPING THEM WERE UNABLE TO PROVIDE FOR THEIR BASIC NEEDS.

C. A TOTAL OF 408 MEDICAL AND 14 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED.

D. MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE BOURGEMESTRE OF RUSUMO COMMUNE WAS EXPECTING ABOUT 30,000 RETURNEES FROM TANZANIA IN THE NEXT FEW DAYS FOLLOWING THE TRIPARTITE CONFERENCE HELD AT NGERA IN TANZANIA.

5. HUMANRIGHTS. CIVPOL FROM CYANGUGU WAS INFORMED BY 3 PERSONS FROM HR OFFICE CYANGUGU THAT A FORMER MAGISTRATE WHO WAS IN DETENTION FOR ALLEGED BY PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE, AND WHO WAS RELEASED TWO WEEKS AGO HAS SOUGHT REFUGE IN THEIR OFFICE AS HIS WIFE HAS BEEN THREATENED BY THE RPA.
6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF RUNYINYA COMMUNE INFORMED SECTOR 3 MILOBS BUTARE OF BIG POPULATION INCREASE IN THE COMMUNE FROM A PREVIOUS 13,000 TO ABOUT 30,600. MANY OF THE RETURNEES WERE FROM ZAIRE AND BURUNDI.
7. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL NSTR.
8. LOGISTICS FUEL RESTRICTIONS WERE LIFTED AND ALL ISSUING FACILITIES OPEN. AFTER TERMINATION OF PETRORWANDA STRIKE AND RESUMPTION OF FUEL DELIVERIES.
9. CASUALTIES ONE NIGERIAN SOLDIER RECEIVED MINOR WOUNDS DURING A DEMONSTRATION/TRAINING SESSION WHEN A FUSE EXPLODED.

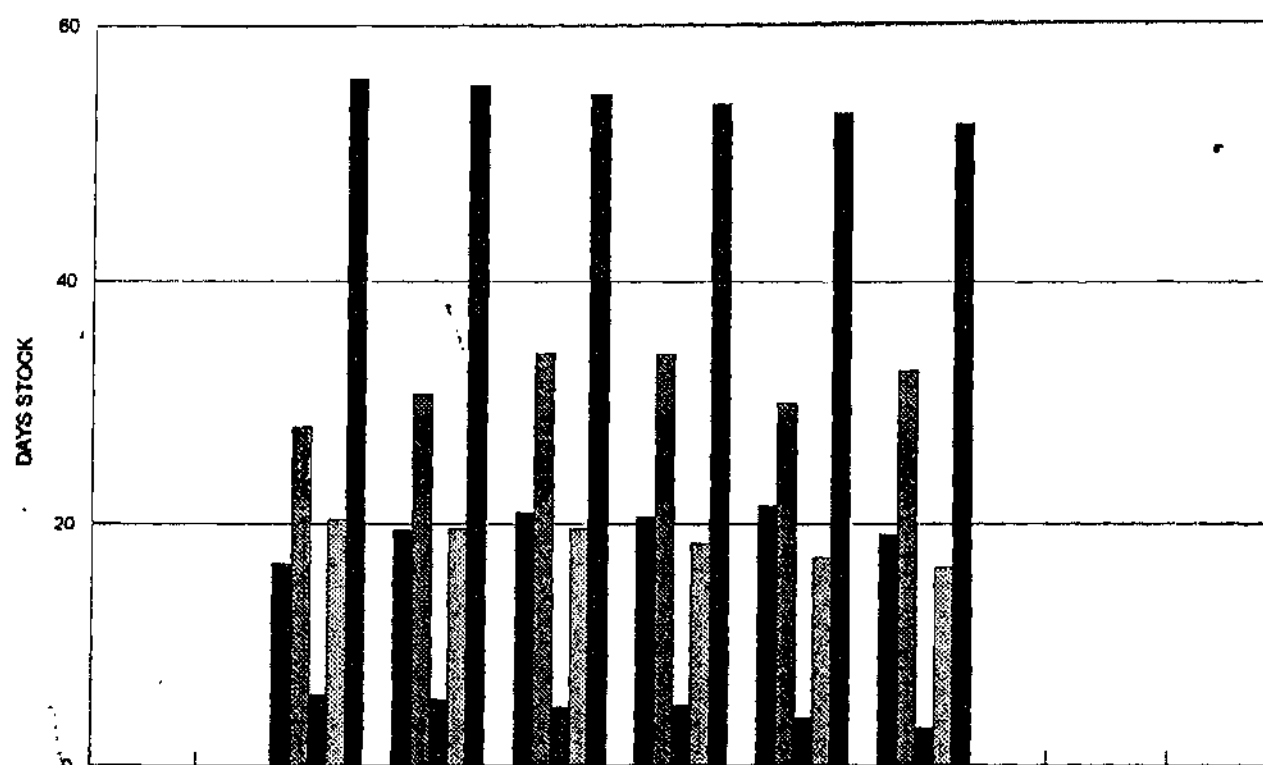

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES IN SEC 1, THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA WENT TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE (GR 8274) TO DISCUSS SECURITY PROBLEMS WITH THE ACTING BOURGEMESTRE.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. SECTOR 1 GITARAMA, REPORTED AN INCREASE OF RPA PRESENCE IN GITARAMA CITY AND KABGAYI.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) ON 8 AUG 95 10 TO 15 MEN, SOME OF THEM IN UNIFORM, KILLED A LOCAL FROM KAMAYANZA CELLULE GR 8277, IN MUSAMBIRA (GR 8275), GITARAMA PREFECTURE. THE VICTIM'S WIFE WAS HIT ON THE HEAD.

(2) IN SECTOR 4 AT KIRANGIRA (GR 9300), UNHR REPORTED THAT FOUR BODIES OF SUSPECTED FRGF SOLDIERS WHO WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN SHOT BY RPA SLDRS WERE PHOTOGRAPHED BY UNIDENTIFIED UN PERSONNEL. DETAILS OF JOINT INVESTIGATION BY MILOBS AND UNHCR IN PROGRESS.

(3) IN SECTOR 5, GISKENYI, ON 08 AUG 95 AT AROUND 2330 HRS, RPA WENT TO A HOUSE WHERE A MEETING WAS BEING HELD BY PEOPLE ALLEGEDLY SUPPORTING THE PREVIOUS GOVT. A GRENADE WAS ROBBED FROM THE HOUSE WHICH PROMPTED THE RPA TO OPEN FIRE, KILLING TWO PEOPLE AND TWO OTHERS WERE APPREHENDED. ONE PERSON ESCAPED.

(4) IN SECTOR 1, KIGALI, ON 7 AUG 95 AT ABOUT 1830 HRS FIVE ARMED MEN INCLUDING TWO DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORM SUSPECTED TO BE RPA ROBBED THE INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE OF RED CROSS CASHIER THE SUM OF \$200,000 US DOLLARS IN HIS OFFICE. THE BANDITS ORDERED 8 OTHER PERSONS WHO WERE THERE TO LIE DOWN AND WERE ALSO ROBBED OF UNDISCLOSED AMOUNTS OF MONEY. CIVPOL INVESTIGATING.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES.

(1) FC VISITED MALAWICOY AT SHAGASHA IN SECTOR 4 TO MEET THE TROOPS AND ACQUAINT HIMSELF WITH PROGRESS SINCE THEIR ARRIVAL ON 06 AUG 95. DURING BRIEFING, THE MILOB SECTOR COMD STATED THAT THE TENSION WHICH EXISTED BETWEEN MALAWICOY AND THE RPA WAS GRADUALLY BEING RESOLVED.

(2) OTHER SECTORS NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

A. IN SECT 5, RUHENGARI, WFP DELIVERED 40 TONS OF FOOD TO THE GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL.

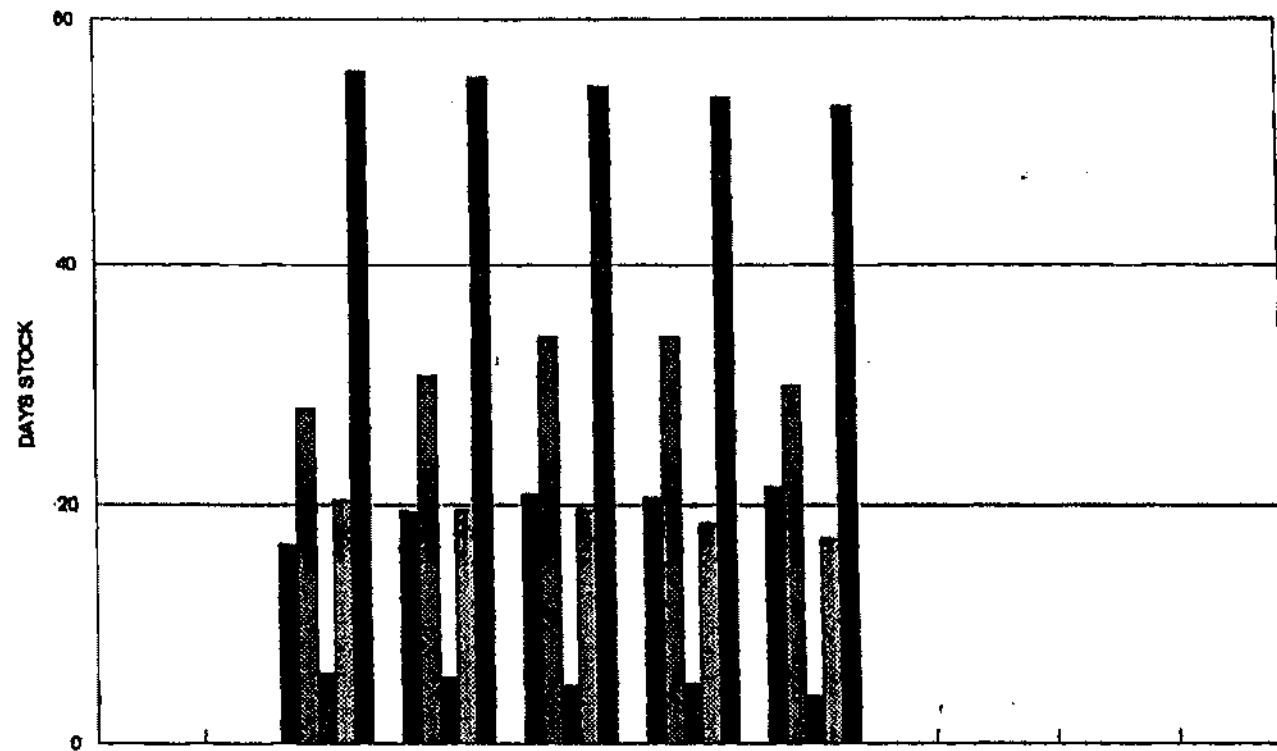

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 160 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 1,727 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES IN SEC 1, THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA WENT TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE (GR 8274) TO DISCUSS SECURITY PROBLEMS WITH THE ACTING BOURGEMESTRE.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. SECTOR 1 GITARAMA, REPORTED AN INCREASE OF RPA PRESENCE IN GITARAMA CITY AND KABGAYI.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) ON 8 AUG 95 10 TO 15 MEN, SOME OF THEM IN UNIFORM, KILLED A LOCAL FROM KAMAYANZA CELLULE GR 8277, IN MUSAMBIRA (GR 8275), GITARAMA PREFECTURE. THE VICTIM'S WIFE WAS HIT ON THE HEAD.

(2) IN SECTOR 4 AT KIRANGIRA (GR 9300), UNHR REPORTED THAT FOUR BODIES OF SUSPECTED FRGF SOLDIERS WHO WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN SHOT BY RPA SLDRS WERE PHOTOGRAPHED BY UNIDENTIFIED UN PERSONNEL. DETAILS OF JOINT INVESTIGATION BY MILOBS AND UNHCR IN PROGRESS.

(3) IN SECTOR 5, GISENYI, ON 08 AUG 95 AT AROUND 2330 HRS, RPA WENT TO A HOUSE WHERE A MEETING WAS BEING HELD BY PEOPLE ALLEGEDLY SUPPORTING THE PREVIOUS GOVT. A GRENADE WAS ROBBED FROM THE HOUSE WHICH PROMPTED THE RPA TO OPEN FIRE, KILLING TWO PEOPLE AND TWO OTHERS WERE APPREHENDED. ONE PERSON ESCAPED.

(4) IN SECTOR 1, KIGALI, ON 7 AUG 95 AT ABOUT 1830 HRS FIVE ARMED MEN INCLUDING TWO DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORM SUSPECTED TO BE RPA ROBBED THE INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE OF RED CROSS CASHIER THE SUM OF \$200,000 US DOLLARS IN HIS OFFICE. THE BANDITS ORDERED 8 OTHER PERSONS WHO WERE THERE TO LIE DOWN AND WERE ALSO ROBBED OF UNDISCLOSED AMOUNTS OF MONEY. CIVPOL INVESTIGATING.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES.

(1) FC VISITED MALAWICOY AT SHAGASHA IN SECTOR 4 TO MEET THE TROOPS AND ACQUAINT HIMSELF WITH PROGRESS SINCE THEIR ARRIVAL ON 06 AUG 95. DURING BRIEFING, THE MILOB SECTOR COMD STATED THAT THE TENSION WHICH EXISTED BETWEEN MALAWICOY AND THE RPA WAS GRADUALLY BEING RESOLVED.

(2) OTHER SECTORS NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. IN SECT 5, RUHENGARI, WFP DELIVERED 40 TONS OF FOOD TO THE GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL.

B. IN SECTOR 4, UNHCR REPS FROM NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP REVEALED THAT BETWEEN 14 AND 16 AUG 95, 200 REFUGEES WOULD BE TRANSFERRED FROM IJWI ISLAND TO NYAMASHEKE SECTOR (GR 9841). THOSE WHO WISH TO RETURN TO THEIR COMMUNES WILL BE REPATRIATED SUBSEQUENTLY.

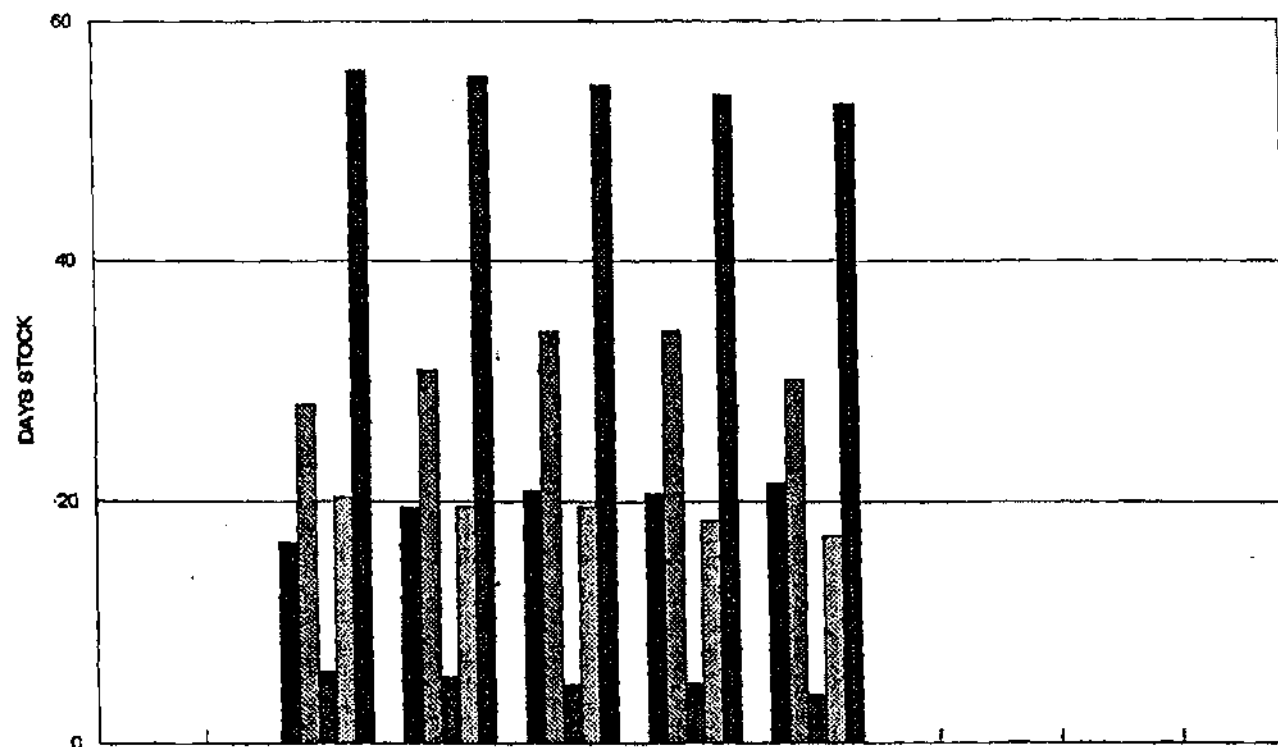

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 160 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA

(2) TOTAL OUTFLOW FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 1,395 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE FORCE COMMANDER AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION MET WITH THE PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUSTICE RICHARD GOLDSTONE, TO DISCUSS SECURITY ARRANGEMENTS AND OTHER ASPECTS OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL'S OPERATIONS IN RWANDA AND ABROAD.

B. THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT'S OFFICE ISSUED A COMMUNIQUE YESTERDAY IN WHICH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT EXPRESSED ITS CONCERN ON THE DISASTROUS SITUATION RESULTING FROM PRISON OVERCROWDING IN RWANDA AND APPEALED TO THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO ASSIST RWANDA IN THE AREA OF JUSTICE.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, YESTERDAY MET WITH RWANDESE MILITARY OFFICERS STUDYING IN BELGIUM DURING THE COURSE OF HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO THE COUNTRY. MR. GASANA REPORTEDLY STATED IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA THAT THE RESERVATIONS EXPRESSED BY MOST OF THE MILITARY OFFICERS TO HIS INVITATION FOR THEM TO RETURN HOME WAS UNDOUBTEDLY DUE TO PROPAGANDA FROM RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMPS.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. IN SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU MILOBS WERE DENIED ACCESS TO RUSIZI II.

B. FRGF MILITIA BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 5, NICOY WAS INFORMED BY THE RPA LO THAT ON SUNDAY MORNING, THIRTY ARMED MEN WEARING MILITARY UNIFORM, INFILTRATED INTO RUBAVU (GR 2213) THROUGH THE ZAIRIAN BORDER. THERE WAS A SIXTY-MINUTE EXCHANGE OF FIRE, LEAVING THREE OF THE INFILTRATORS DEAD AND NO CASUALTY ON THE RPA SIDE. OTHER INFILTRATORS FLED BACK TO

ZAIRE.

(2) THE RPA LO REPORTED THAT ON 060200 HRS SOME INFILTRATORS FIRED AT A RPA POSN IN BYAHI (GR 1716) FOR ABOUT ONE HOUR AND IN THE SHOOT-OUT TWO INFILTRATORS WERE KILLED AND ONE INJURED. THEY WERE CARRYING WEAPONS AND WEARING STRANGE UNIFORMS. ON INTERROGATION, IT WAS LEARNT THAT THEY WERE MEMBERS OF INTERAHAMWE.

(3) IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE ON 7 AUG 95 AT ABOUT 2300 HRS A POWER FAILURE WAS CAUSED BY THE EXPLOSIVE DESTRUCTION OF A POWER LINE PYLON NEAR THE VILLAGE OF GIHAGO (3083). THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE CLAIMED TO BE THE WORK OF INTERHAMWE FROM ZAIRE.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 KIBUYE A 15 TON TRUCK BELONGING TO CARITAS DETONATED A MINE IN THE AREA OF RUGARAGATA (3218) ALONG THE ROAD FROM RUTSIRO TO MABANZA. NO INJURIES REPORTED.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED IN ALL SECTORS.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. 58 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI AND RUHENGARI. 109 IDPs DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO MURAMBI, GASHORA, KIBUNGO AND BUTARE. A TOTAL OF 166 IDPs STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

B. IN SECTOR 1 KIGALI, THE NGO "SAVE THE CHILDREN" MET WITH LOCALS IN SECTOR RUHANYA (9380) IN COMMUNE MBONGO. THE AIM WAS TO GET PHOTOS OF MISSING CHILDREN SO THAT THEY COULD BE TRACED IN REFUGEE CAMPS IN ZAIRE.

C. A TOTAL OF 112 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 39 DENTAL WERE TREATED.

D. TRANSPORTATION OF FOOD ITEMS AND OTHER ITEMS WAS PERFORMED BY ALL CONT UNITS.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. SECTOR 3 BUTARE REPORTED THAT IN MUGANZA COMMUNE THERE ARE 8 x COOPERATIVES CONSISTING OF 688 MEMBERS FORMED AND ENGAGED IN RICE AND COFFEE PRODUCTION, 3 x COOPERATIVES OF 47 MEMBERS ENGAGED IN HONEY PRODUCTION AND 10 MORE COOPERATIVES APPLYING FOR REGISTRATION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL BY THE BOURGEMESTER.

B. IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI SEVEN BODIES WERE WASHED ASHORE IN THE TWO LAST DAYS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL. IN SECTOR 5 RUHENGARI THERE WAS AN EXPLOSION AT 0940 HRS AT THE GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL. IT WAS SUSPECTED TO BE AN ANTI-PERS MINE.
7. LOGISTICS UNAMIR SERVICE STATION KIGALI REOPENED 08 AUG 95, HOWEVER ALL VEHS LESS PTL VEHS AND 2ND LINE TASKED SP VEHS WILL BE ISSUED ONLY 20L.

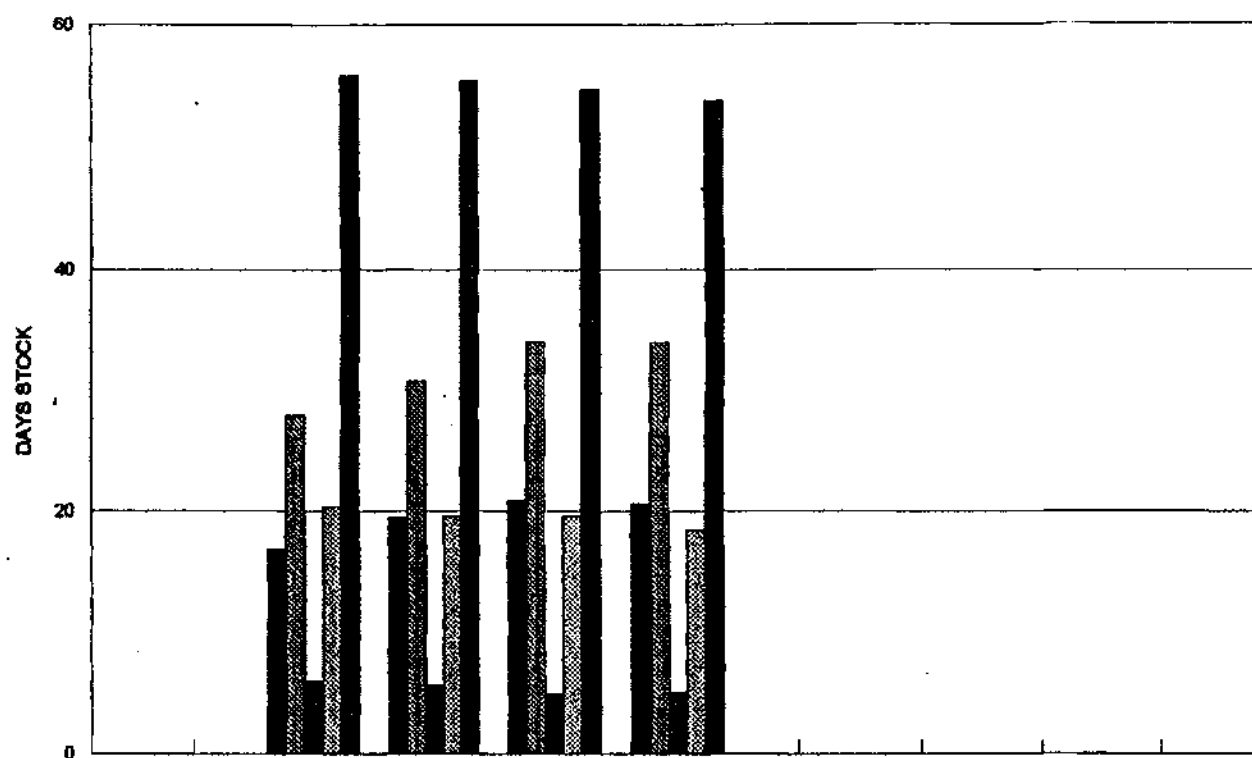

DAILY SITREP FOR 07 AUG 951. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL IN FLOW FOR THE DAY 62 AND TOTAL OUT FLOW NA

(2) TOTAL OUT FLOW FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 1,235 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, ON SUNDAY OPENED A THREE-WEEK SEMINAR FOR THE TRAINING OF PROSECUTORS IN KIGALI. THE TRAINEES, WHO INCLUDE MILITARY PERSONNEL, WILL RECEIVE INSTRUCTION ON NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL PENAL CODES AND INVESTIGATION TECHNIQUES. THE PRIME MINISTER REPORTEDLY STATED IN HIS OPENING SPEECH, THAT THE DELAY IN SETTING UP RWANDESE JUDICIAL INSTITUTIONS WAS JUSTIFIED IN LIGHT OF THE NEED TO EXERCISE CAUTION IN ESTABLISHING A NEUTRAL JUSTICE SYSTEM TO ASSIST IN ACHIEVING NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND IN ERADICATING THE CULTURE OF IMPUNITY.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 5, NICOY REPORTED RPA'S MAJOR REDEPLOYMENT IN THE SECTOR. TRUCKS LOADED WITH SOLDIERS AND KIT BAGS WERE OBSERVED MOVING INTO THE SECTOR WHILE SOME WERE SEEN LEAVING.

(2) RPA CHECKPOINT TROOPS IN GIFUMBA (GR 6892) IN SECTOR 1B GITARAMA FORCIBLY SEARCHED A MILOB PATROL VEHICLE. THE TEAM LDR REFUSED TO HAVE HIS PERSONAL BAG SEARCHED SINCE IT CONTAINED PATROL REPORTS. THE TENSE SITUATION WAS DIFFUSED BY THE ARRIVAL OF AN RPA 2/LT WHO REFUSED TO GIVE HIS NAME. ISSUE BEING TAKEN UP WITH RPA COMD.

(3) THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA EXPRESSED HIS CONCERN ABOUT THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE SECTOR. HE LINKED THE CURRENT WAVE OF PROBLEMS TO THE ARRIVAL OF THE NEW RPA BN IN GITARAMA. HE ALSO RECOMMENDED THE INTRODUCTION OF A WELL-TRAINED GENDARMERIE GP KNOWN AS OFFICERS DE POLICE JUDICIAIRE' (OPJ) TO AFFECT ARRESTS.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES. IN SECTOR 1 INDBATT GUARDS AT PRESIDENTIAL HANGAR REPORTED THE SOUND OF 11 SHOTS HEARD FROM

THE GENERAL DIRECTION OF THE RUNWAY OF THE KIGALI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT AT 0115 HRS 07 AUG 95.

C. OTHER SECTORS NSTR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. IN SECTOR 2 BYUMBA CARITAS AMREF AND WFP DISTRIBUTED FOOD ITEMS TO THE LOCALS OF CYUNGO COMMUNE.

B. IN SECTOR 5 RUHENGERI UNHCR TRANSPORTED 635 RETURNEES AND DISTRIBUTED BLANKETS AND FOOD ITEMS TO LOCALS. NICOY MEDICAL PL ESTABLISHED A MOBILE DISPENSARY IN KAYOVE AND GAVE MED STUFFS TO THE COMMUNE AUTHORITIES.

C. FORCE ENGR COY CONTINUED ERECTION OF SECURITY FENCING IN ONTRACOM.

D. A TOTAL OF 199 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 8 DENTAL WERE TREATED.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. THE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION OF RWANDA HAS DIRECTED THE CLOSURE OF THE TUTSI REFUGEE CAMP AT MURAMBI (GR 516291) IN SECTOR 3 GIKONGORO.

B. THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA ANNOUNCED A SECURITY MEETING WITH ALL BOURGEMESTRES TO HELD ON 11 AUG 95 TO REVIEW THE PRACTICE OF THE LAST FIVE MONTHS OF CONDUCTING NIGHT PATROLS BY CIVILIANS IN THE COMMUNES. HE ADDED THAT TRAINING FOR COMMUNAL POLICE WOULD BEGIN IN THE PREFECTURE ON 12 AUG 95.

C. SEVERAL COMMUNE PRISONS/CACHOT WERE REPORTED TO STILL HAVE DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL. IN SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU THE SITUATION IS STILL TENSE AFTER THE REPORTED SHOOTING INCIDENT OF 4 AUG 95. BOTH MALAWICOY AND RPA COMDS WERE REPORTED TO BE MAKING EFFORTS TO CONTROL THEIR TROOPS.

7. LOGISTICS HOLDINGS OF DIESEL FUEL HAS ONCE AGAIN DROPPED TO A CRITICAL LEVEL CAUSING REFUEL AND MOVEMENT RESTRICTION TO BE INVOKED. SHORTAGE IS DUE TO RESUPPLY PROBLEMS CAUSED BY A STRIKE OF PETRORWANDA EMPLOYEES THUS STOPPING ALL CUSTOM CLEARANCES OF BULK FUEL.

8. CASUALTIES IN SECTOR 3 GIKONGORO MALICOY REPORTED THAT AT 1320 HRS, ONE SOLDIER FROM FORCE SIG COY WAS INJURED IN RECAST OF ANTENNA. HE SLID ON IRON SHEET AND FELL DOWN. HE IS BEING TREATED BY MED TEAM.

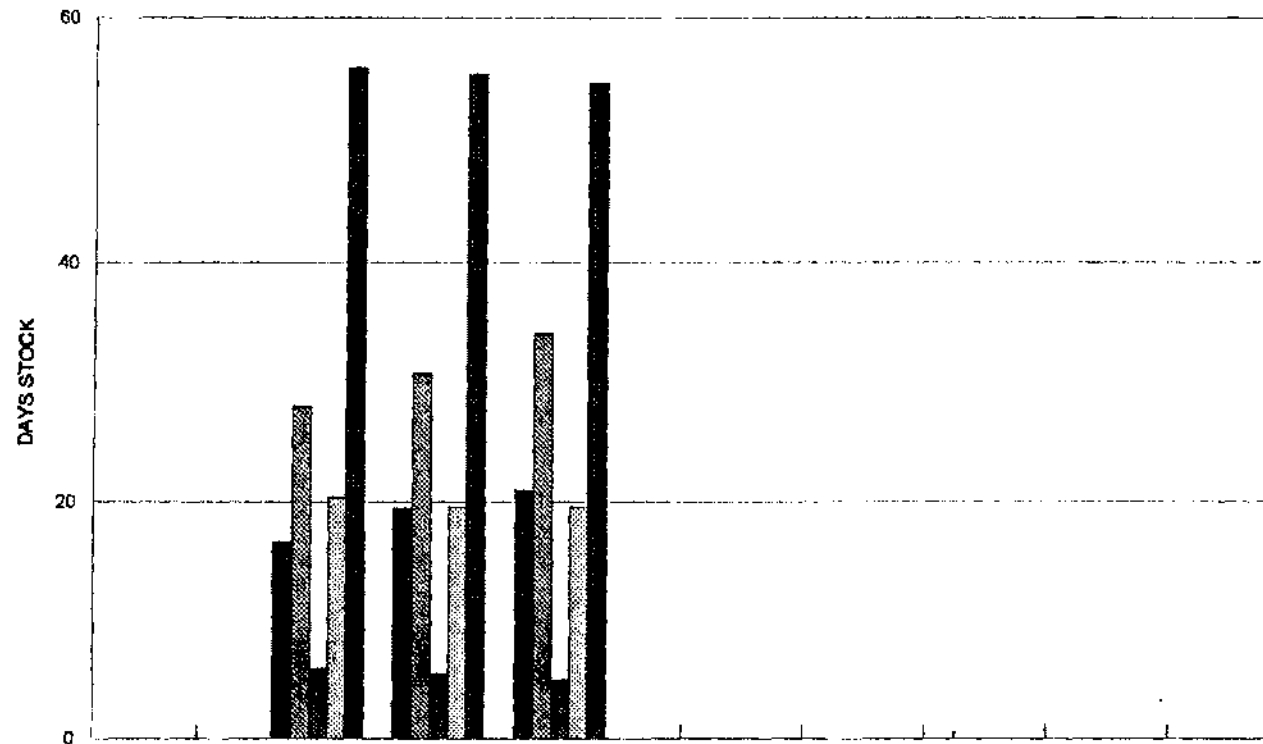

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 31 JUL TO 07 AUG 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS, ESPECIALLY ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINED TENSE.

B. TWO INCIDENTS WERE RECORDED BETWEEN RPA AND UNAMIR TROOPS:

(1) ON 1 AUG IN KIGALI FOUR AUSMED PERS WERE ASSAULTED BY RPA AFTER INTERFERING IN A MOTORCADE. TWO RECEIVED MINOR INJURIES.

(2) ON 4 AUG 95 IN KAMEMBE SECTOR 4, TWO MALAWI SOLDIERS WERE SHOT BY RPA, AFTER RUNNING A ROAD BLOCK.

C. THE SOUS PREFECT OF GIKONGORO AND TWO PRIESTS FROM MASANGO GR 6254 AND TABA COMMUNE GR 8883 BOTH IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE WERE ALSO KILLED ON 1 AUG.

D. BORDER CROSSING: A TOTAL OF 1322 RETURNEES WAS RECORDED FOR THE WEEK.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT AN RPA COMPANY BEGAN A TRAINING COURSE ON DEMINING SUNDAY IN RUHENGARI IN NORTH WESTERN RWANDA WITH ASSISTANCE OF US MILITARY EXPERTS.

B. RADIO RWANDA ON 03 AUG 95 CONFIRMED THE ASSASSINATION ON 01 AUG 95 OF THE SUB-PREFECT OF GIKONGORO MR. ORESTE HABINSHUTI, AND THE HEAD PRIEST OF THE KAMONYI ROMAN CATHOLIC PARISH IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE, FATHER PIE NTAHOBARI.

C. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, ON THE 6 AUG 95, OPENED A THREE WEEK SEMINAR FOR THE TRAINING OF PROSECUTORS IN KIGALI. THE TRAINEES WHO INCLUDE MILITARY PERSONNEL, WILL RECEIVE INSTRUCTION ON NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL PENAL CODES AND INVESTIGATION TECHNIQUES.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 5, RUHENGARI, NICOY REPORTED RPA'S MAJOR DEPLOYMENT. TRUCKS LOADED WITH SOLDIERS AND KIT BAGS WERE OBSERVED MOVING INTO THE SECTOR WHILE SOME WERE SEEN LEAVING.

(2) ON 1 AUG 95 AT RUSEBEYA GR 4783, IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE, RPA SOLDIERS ATTACKED A TIN MINING SITE IN THE NEARBY VILLAGE OF RWAMASIZI, KILLING 13 PEOPLE.

B. MILITIA/FRGF/BANDITRY.

(1) SECTOR 4 MILOBS CYANGUGU REPORTED A SKIRMISH BETWEEN RPA TROOPS AND UNIDENTIFIED HOSTILE ELEMENTS AT KAMEMBE COMMUNE (GR 8031) ON 30 JUL 95 AT 0030 HRS. THE RPA LO BRIEFED MILOB PATROLS THAT UNIDENTIFIED ARMED ELEMENTS FIRED 2 RIFLE GRENADE LAUNCHERS AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE IN KAMEMBE. THE EXPLOSION CAUSED SOME DAMAGE TO THE COMMUNE OFFICE.

(2) IN SECTOR 5, BYUMBA, NICOY REPORTED THAT ACCORDING TO THE RPA LO ON 03 AUG AT ABOUT 2300H LOCALS, SUSPECTED TO BE PEOPLE IN FAVOUR OF THE FRGF, DESTROYED A WATER PIPELINE AT GISA (GR 1914) WITH EXPLOSIVES.

(3) TWO AIRCRAFT OVERFLIGHTS BY A BN-2 ISLANDER WERE OBSERVED OVER KAMEMBE IN CYANGUGU SECTOR ON 3 AND 4 AUG 95.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR HQ.

(A) FC VISITED ONTRACOM PRISON SITE IN KIGALI WHERE IT WAS EXPECTED THAT MORE THAN 5,000 PRISONERS WOULD BE HOUSED AFTER ITS COMPLETION IN SEP-OCT TIMEFRAME. IT IS A PROJECT CO-SPONSORED BY UNAMIR, UNDP AND ICRC. FORCE ENGINEERS ARE A MAJOR PART OF THE PROJECT TASK.

(B) FC MET WITH RPA LO TO DISCUSS AN INCIDENT OF ASSAULT BY RPA SOLDIERS FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT'S MOTORCADE ON SOME AUSMED SOLDIERS.

(C) A NEW TRANSIT CAMP HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED AT KABALI IN MUTURA COMMUNE, THE FORMER SITE OF TUNBATT HQ.

(D) FC GAVE PRESS INTERVIEWS TO DIE ZEIT (GERMANY) JOURNALIST AND RADIO UNAMIR. TOPICS DISCUSSED INCLUDED THE GENERAL SITUATION, PROGRESS IN OUR NEW MANDATE AND DETAILS ON UNAMIR'S JOINT PROJECT WITH ICRC AND UNDP ON THE ONTRACOM PRISON SITE.

(E) FC MET WITH UNHCR REPS, MRS URASA AND FAUB ERT. THEY INFORMED THE FC THAT THERE WERE APPROX 2,000 REFUGEES FROM THE '59 CASELOAD THAT WERE NOW AVAILABLE TO RETURN TO RWANDA COMMENCING SOON. BASED ON A SECURITY ASSESSMENT BY UNHCR, THEY REQUIRE A TRANSPORT AIRCRAFT RATHER THAN

BUSES TO MOVE THESE PEOPLE FROM BUJUMBURA TO KIGALI. (CODE CABLE ISSUED CONTAINS FURTHER DETAILS AND RECOMMENDED OPTIONS FOR UNHQ INFO AND ADVICE).

8. CASUALTIES TWO SOLDIERS EACH FROM AUSMED AND MALAWICOY WERE INJURED AS RESULT OF INCIDENTS WITH RPA. ONE SOLDIER FROM SIG COY WAS INJURED AS HE SLID ON IRON SHEET AND FELL DOWN. ALL ARE IN GOOD CONDITION.

9. COMMENTS.

(A) THE KILLING OF TWO SOUS-PREFCTS LAST WEEK AND THIS WEEK APPEARS TO BE POLITICALLY MOTIVATED SINCE BOTH SOUS PREFECTS WERE CONSIDERED AS MODERATE HUTUS WHO COOPERATED WITH AND WERE SYMPATHETIC TO THE CURRENT GOVERNMENT.

(B) THE GENERAL SITUATION REMAINS STABLE EVEN THOUGH BANDITRY ACTIVITIES AND MURDERS WERE ON THE INCREASE. IN CERTAIN AREA UN PERSONNEL HOWEVER WERE NOT TARGETED.

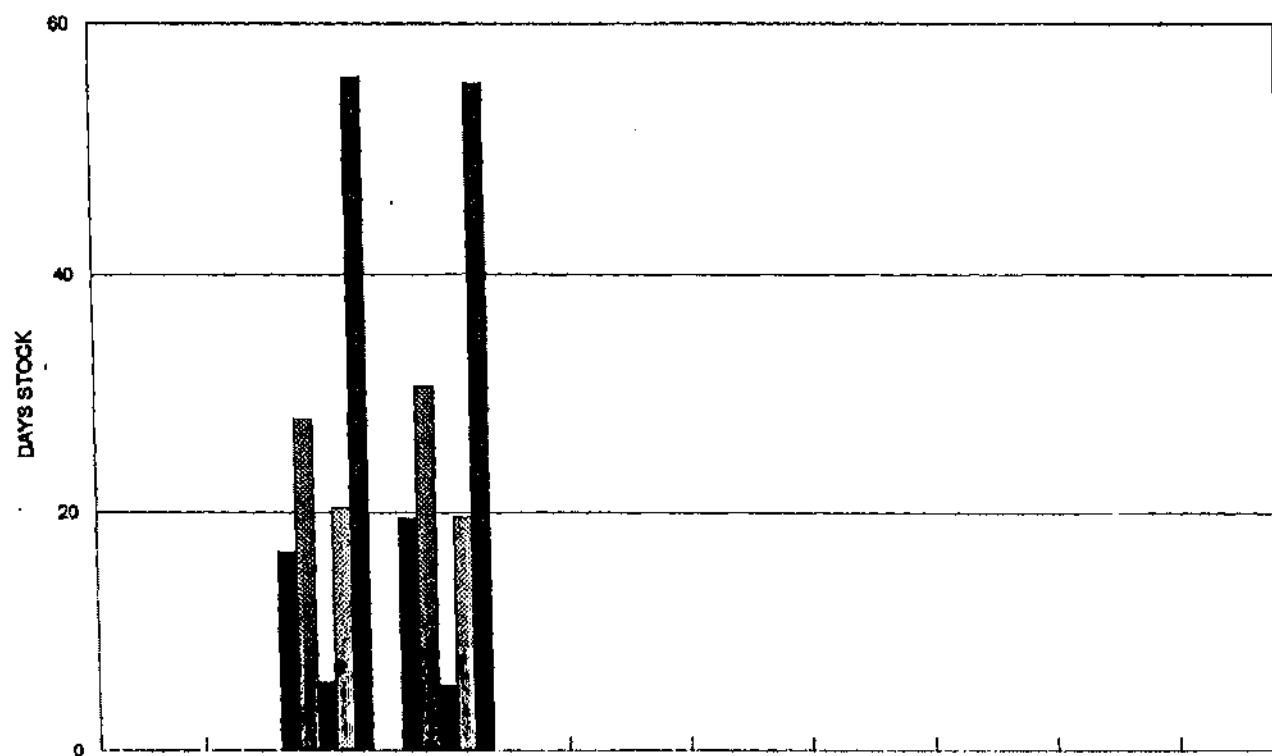

(C) RUSIZI BORDER POSTS 1 & 2 AND BORDER POSTS UVIRA IN SECT 4 (RWANDA/ZAIRE) REMAIN CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT.

(D) GISENYI BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO ALL COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC EXCEPT UNAMIR PERS. TRAFFIC STILL CLOSED TO HUMANITARIAN AID TO GOMA CAMPS.

(E) BOTH BORDER POSTS AT SECTOR 3B - NO CHANGE.

(F) THE RWANDA - ZAIRE BORDER AT UVIRA GR 8900 REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC EXCEPT REFUGEES ESCORTED BY UNHCR.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1 - KIGALI/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) TEAMS CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS IN THEIR AOR. SITUATION WAS REPORTED CALM.

(C) MILOBS ASSESSED THAT RECENT INCIDENTS AND REACTION OF LOCALS TO DISMISSAL OF BOURGEMESTRE OF MUGINA COMMUNE (GR 9267) WERE INDICATORS OF CONTD TENSION IN THE SECTOR. LOCALS ARE APPREHENSIVE THAT THE SITUATION COULD DETERIORATE TO THE LEVEL OF THE PRE-GENOCIDE ERA.

(5) IN SECTOR 2 BYUMBA/KIBUNGO. THE GENERAL SITUATION IN THE SECTOR WAS CALM DURING THE PERIOD. PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED IN THE AOR AND THE SITUATION FOUND NORMAL.

(6) IN SECTOR 3 - GIKONGORO/BUTARE.

(A) MILOB PATROLS TO RWAMIKO REPORTED THAT THE SECURITY SITUATION THERE SINCE THE DEPARTURE OF ZAMBATT HAD DETERIORATED. THERE WERE REPORTED INCREASING ACTS OF BANDITRY AND RPA HARASSMENT OF LOCALS INCLUDING RAMPANT/INDISCRIMINATE ARRESTS.

(B) PATROL TEAM TO NYAMAGABE COMMUNE (GR 5427) WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT AT RUSASA SECTOR (GR 5320), ON 29 JUL 95 AT ABOUT 2200 HRS FIVE ARMED SOLDIERS AND FOUR CIVILIANS BESIEGED THE RESIDENCE OF A LOCAL MALE. A GRENADE WAS LOBBED BY ONE OF THE SOLDIERS WHICH KILLED THE 27-YEAR-OLD WIFE OF THE LOCAL. VARIOUS UNSPECIFIED ITEMS WERE REPORTEDLY STOLEN FROM THE HOUSE. SIMILAR BANDITRY ACTIVITIES ARE TAKING PLACE IN THE AREA. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(7) IN SECTOR 4 - CYANGUGU.

(A) THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR WAS RELATIVELY QUIET EXCEPT FOR CYANGUGU TOWN WHERE AN UNEASY CALM WAS REPORTED AFTER THE SHOOTING INCIDENT INVOLVING LOCAL RPA TROOPS AND MALAWICOY TROOPS ON 04 AUG 95. RPA IS APPARENTLY CARRYING OUT A DISINFORMATION CAMPAIGN ABOUT THE INCIDENT. AT 2030 HRS ON 04 AUG 95, A FEW LOCALS INTERCEPTED A MILOB AND ACCUSED HIM OF SHOOTING RPA SOLDIERS. AN INVESTIGATIVE PATROL CONDUCTED IN KAMEMBE REVEALED THAT WHILST SOME LOCALS REGARDED THE INCIDENT AS UNFORTUNATE, A CROSS SECTION BLAMED THE MALAWIANS FOR VIOLATING PROCEDURAL NORMS. ONE LOCAL, HOWEVER, WAS OF THE OPINION THAT THE RPA ARE FEELING RATHER PROUD FOR HAVING SHOT THE UNAMIR SOLDIERS. HE CLAIMED TO HAVE OVERHEARD RPA SOLDIERS SAYING THAT THE INCIDENT WAS THE BEGINNING OF MORE TO COME.

(B) THE DFC VISITED MALAWICOY AT SHAGASHA AND WAS BRIEFED BY THE MILOBS SECTOR COMD ON THE EVENTS OF 04 AUG 95.

(8) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI/RUHENGARI/KIBUYE.

(A) MILOB PATROLS TO KARISIMBI (GR 4035) WERE INFORMED BY AN NGO PERS WORKING IN THE VICINITY OF THE VOLCANO THAT BETWEEN 5 - 7 SHOTS OF AUTOMATIC RIFLE FIRE WERE HEARD IN THE AREA ON 03 AUG 95 AT ABOUT 1100 HRS. NO FURTHER DETAILS WERE GIVEN. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(B) ANOTHER TEAM PATROLLED NYAMUGALI COMMUNE WITH RPA LIAISON OFFICER AT RUHENGARI AS A FOLLOW UP TO

EARLIER REPORTS ABOUT LAND MINES IN THE AREA WITH A VIEW TO IDENTIFYING THEIR LOCATIONS. THE TEAM DID NOT FIND ANY MINES.

(C) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS TO KANAMA (GR 2712) AND NYAMYUMBA (GR 2006) COMMUNES. AT KIGARAMA (GR 2807) IN KANAMA COMMUNE, LOCALS INFORMED MILOBS THAT RPA BEAT UP TEN MEN, WHO HAD BEEN APPOINTED AS LOCAL POLICEMEN, FOR VIOLATING CURFEW RESTRICTIONS IN THE AREA. THE POLICEMEN WERE PATROLLING THE AREA AT THE TIME. ALSO AT BAHIMBA CELLULE (GR 2807) RPA REPORTEDLY LOOTED THE PROPERTY OF A LOCAL TRADER FOR HAVING LISTENED TO A RECORDED CASSETTE PRAISING THE FORMER GOVERNMENT.

H. FORCE SIG COY.

(1) VSAT TERMINAL AT KIBUYE REPAIRED AND MADE FUNCTIONAL.

(2) SIG COY PROVIDED 1 TRUCK FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM RUGALIKA TO NYAMAHURU AND FROM SHELII TO GHASAHURU ON THE REQUEST OF A LOCAL ORGANISATION - ARDEC.

I. FORCE ENGR COY. PROVIDED TWO DUMP TRUCKS FOR SHIFTING OF LATERITE FROM NYANZA SITE TO TRANSIT CAMP ANNEXE.

J. AUSMED.

(1) TREATED A TOTAL OF 51 OUT-PATIENTS AND CURRENTLY HOLDING 11 IN-PATIENTS.

DAILY SITREP FOR 04 AUG 95.

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

(1) REFERENCE OUR SPECIAL SITREP DATED 04 AUG 95, AT ABOUT 1330 HRS A MALAWI S/SGT WAS DRIVING A UNAMIR LANDOVER IN TOWN WITH SOLDIERS IN CIVILIAN ATTIRE AS PASSENGERS. WHEN HE WAS TURNING TO THE MARKET HE VIOLATED ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATIONS WHEREBY HE TURNED WHILE ANOTHER VEHICLE WAS APPROACHING AHEAD AT A DISTANCE OF APPROX SIX METRES.

(2) THE GENDAMARIES WERE IN THE VICINITY AND THEY APPROACHED HIM DEMANDING TO TAKE HIM TO THEIR BRIGADE HQ TOGETHER WITH HIS VEHICLE. HE REFUSED TO DO SO AND DURING THE COURSE OF DISCUSSIONS A MALAWI OFFICER CAME AT THE SCENE. AS THE OFFICER STARTED NEGOTIATING WITH THE GENDAMARIES THE S/SGT'S VEHICLE LEFT THE SCENE WITH ABOUT 8 PERSONS ON BOARD WITH THE GENDAMARIES IN PURSUIT FOLLOWED BY THREE RPA VEHICLES. AFTER ABOUT SIX KILOMETRES FROM KAMEMBE TOWN THE RPA VEHICLE TRIED TO OVERTAKE AND BLOCK THE ROAD WHICH THE S/SGT DENIED. LATER ON HE STOPPED AFTER BEING PRESSURISED BY PASSENGERS ON BOARD. DURING A BRIEF SCUFFLE THE RPA OFFICER AND ONE OF HIS SOLDIERS STARTED FIRING INJURING TWO. ONE WAS SHOT ON THE LEFT LEG AND THE OTHER ON LEFT ARM. BOTH CASUALTIES DID NOT SUSTAIN ANY FRACTURES AND WERE REFERRED TO GIHUNDWE HOSPITAL WHERE THEY ARE ADMITTED. THE DRIVER FLED THE SCENE WITHOUT INJURIES. OUR TROOPS WERE UNARMED EXCEPT FOR TWO GUARDS.

(3) WHEN THE MALAWI OFFR ARRIVED AT THE SCENE, HE AND 7 OTHER PASSENGERS INCLUDING THE TWO CASUALTIES, WERE TAKEN TO GENDAMARIE STATION AND WERE KEPT IN CUSTODY. THEY WERE RELEASED AT 1805 HRS. THE SITUATION WAS RETURNED TO NORMAL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, AT A PRESS CONFERENCE HELD IN BRUSSELS DURING HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO BELGIUM, STATED THAT RELATIONS BETWEEN BELGIUM AND RWANDA, WHICH HAD BEEN TENSE FOLLOWING THE KIBEHO INCIDENT, HAD IMPROVED FOLLOWING MR. GASANA'S DISCUSSIONS ON THE SUBJECT WITH BELGIAN OFFICIALS.

B. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT SOUTH AFRICAN ARCHBISHOP DESMOND TUTU YESTERDAY IN LONDON CALLED FOR THE LIFTING OF THE U.N. ARMS EMBARGO ON RWANDA, WHICH HE REPORTEDLY CLAIMED WAS IMPEDING THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT'S EFFORTS TO ENSURE SECURITY IN RWANDA.

C. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA ON THURSDAY, 03 AUG 95, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF JUSTICE, MR. ALPHONSE-MARIE NKUBITO,

STATED THAT THE LOCAL TRIALS OF GENOCIDE SUSPECTS IN RWANDA HAD BEEN SUSPENDED LAST APRIL PENDING THE RECRUITMENT OF ADDITIONAL MAGISTRATES TO ENSURE THE OBSERVANCE OF PROPER JUDICIAL PROCEDURES IN THE TRIALS.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 5, NICOY REPORTED THAT RPA LO REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 032300B AUG 95, LOCALS SUSPECTED TO BE PEOPLE IN FAVOUR OF THE FORMER GOVERNMENT, DESTROYED A WATER PIPELINE AT GISA (GR 1914) WITH EXPLOSIVE. AT PRESENT, THERE IS NO PIPED WATER IN THE ENTIRE GISENYI AREA. A TEAM VISITED THE SCENE WITH AN OFFICIAL OF ELECTROGAS AND ASSESSED THAT THE DAMAGE COULD BE REPAIRED IN TWO DAYS.

(2) SECTOR 2A MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA LIAISON OFFICER VISITED THE SECTOR HQ TO KNOW THE PURPOSE OF THE HELI FLIGHT YESTERDAY. HE WAS TOLD THAT IT WAS IN CONNECTION WITH THE SUSPECTED CHOLERA OUTBREAK.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

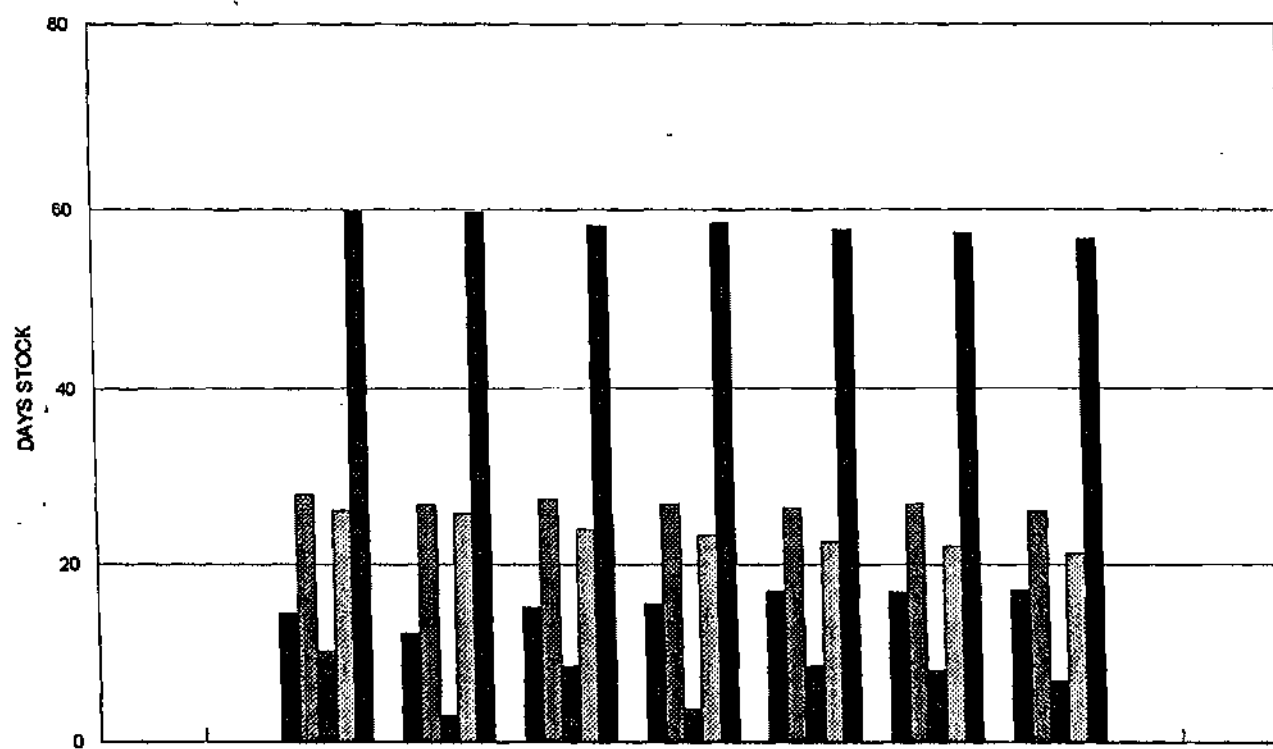

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RADIO RWANDA ON 03 AUG 95 CONFIRMED THE ASSASSINATION ON TUESDAY NIGHT, 01 AUG 95 OF THE SUB-PREFECT OF GIKONGORO, MR. ORESTE HABINSHUTI, AND OF THE HEAD PRIEST OF THE KAMONYI ROMAN CATHOLIC PARISH IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE, FATHER PIE NTAHOBARI.

B. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION, MR ANASTASE GASANA, WHO IS ON AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO BELGIUM, HELD TALKS ON WEDNESDAY WITH THE BELGIAN MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND THE BELGIAN STATE SECRETARY IN CHARGE OF COOPERATION, TO DISCUSS WAYS OF CONTINUING COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. THE GOVERNMENT OF BELGIUM HAS REPORTEDLY AGREED TO PROVIDE 800 MILLION BELGIAN FRANCS OF ASSISTANCE TO BE USED FOR REFUGEE REPATRIATION.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT MR. GASANA ALSO MET, IN BRUSSELS, REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EUROPEAN UNION WHICH HAS REPORTEDLY PLEDGED ECUS 25 MILLION OF ASSISTANCE, TO BE DISBURSED BY UNHCR AND NGOS, DESTINED FOR RWANDESE REFUGEES LIVING IN TANZANIA AND BURUNDI, AS WELL AS RECENT RETURNEES TO RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) MILOBS IN GITARAMA REPORTED THAT THREE RPA SOLDIERS "ARRESTED" 2 WOMEN IN THE KABGAYI ECONOMAT. ONE WOMAN WAS RELEASED AFTER THE BISHOP APPEALED TO THE PRIME MINISTER WHO IN TURN CONTACTED THE RPA BDE COMD AT HOME AND ORDERED THE RELEASE OF THE WOMAN. THE BDE COMD ACTED QUICKLY. HOWEVER, HE IS BELIEVED TO HAVE HELD SOME RESENTMENT TOWARDS THE BISHOP BECAUSE THE BISHOP WENT TO GOVT AUTHORITIES WHEN THIS COULD HAVE BEEN SOLVED AT A LOCAL LEVEL.

(2) GITARAMA SECTOR: MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA BDE COMD HAS REQUESTED AN UPDATE ON THE INVESTIGATION CONCERNING THE UNAMIR HELICOPTER IN SECTOR 5C WHERE SOMEONE FROM UNAMIR WAS ALLEGED TO HAVE TOLD LOCALS NOT TO REPORT INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES TO THE RPA.

(3) IN BUTARE MILOBS REPORTED THAT KIGEMBE COMMUNE (GR 7093) PLATOON WAS SEEN PACKING, PROBABLY IN READINESS FOR ROTATION. AT MUGANZA COMMUNE (GR 8407) A NEW BATTALION IS IN PLACE AFTER ROTATION ON 02 AUG 95.

(4) IN CYANGUGU AREA RPA COY IN KARENGERA GR 9116 IS DEPLOYED AS FOLLOW: KARENGERA - PLATOON NAKABUYE (GR 9116) - COMPANY HQ AND PLATOON CIMERWA (GR 8907) - PLATOON.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

I. IN SECTOR 4, MILOBS REPORTED THAT:

(1) AT APPROXIMATELY 2300 HRS 24 JUL 3 UNIDENTIFIED MEN ATTEMPTED TO FORCE ENTRY INTO A HOUSE IN THE VILLAGE OF RWIBONGO (GR 8308) AND WERE CHALLENGED BY THE VILLAGERS. THE RPA SOLDIERS IN THE AREA FIRED AT THE INTRUDERS WHO MANAGED TO ESCAPE. IT WAS REPORTED THAT ONE OF THE INTRUDERS, MR KAMONA, AN FRGF SOLDIER, DIED FROM INJURIES SUSTAINED AT RUHOKO (GR 8309) IN THE GISHOMA COMMUNE ON 29 JUL 95. THE MOTIVE FOR INTRUSION IS UNDER INVESTIGATION.

(2) ON 02 AUG AT APPROX 1900HRS AN EXPLOSION PRESUMABLY A MINE BLAST, OCCURED IN KAMEMBE AREA, 200 YARDS NORTH WEST OF THE PREFECT'OFFICE (GR 778268).

II. IN SECTOR 3 MILOB PATROL VISITED MUSEBEYA COMMUNE (GR 4038) AND FOUND THAT THERE WERE ISOLATED CASES OF STEALING OF COWS AND THE EXTORTION OF MONEY.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) FC GRANTED AUDIENCE TO COL GOWEN, A U.S. FOREIGN SERVICE OFFICER WHO IS IN KIGALI ATTACHED TO THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL.

(2) FC GAVE PRESS INTERVIEWS TO DIE ZEIT (GERMANY) JOURNALIST AND RADIO UNAMIR. TOPICS DISCUSSED INCLUDED THE GENERAL SITUATION, PROGRESS IN OUR NEW MANDATE AND DETAILS ON UNAMIR'S JOINT PROJECT WITH ICRC AND UNDP ON THE ONTRACOM PRISON SITE.

(3) FC MET WITH UNHCR REPRESENTATIVES MR URUSA AND MR FAUBERT. THEY INFORMED THE FC THAT THERE ARE APPROX 2,000 REFUGEES FROM THE '59 CASELOAD THAT ARE NOW AVAILABLE TO RETURN TO RWANDA COMMENCING NEXT WEEK. BASED ON A SECURITY ASSESSMENT BY UNHCR, THEY REQUIRE A TRANSPORT AIRCRAFT RATHER THAN BUSES TO MOVE THESE PEOPLE FROM BUJUMBURA TO KIGALI. UNHCR WILL MOVE THEM TO RESPECTIVE COMMUNES AND SITES UPON ARRIVAL IN KIGALI. UNHQ NY SHOULD

BE AWARE THERE ARE SEVERAL AREAS OF CONCERN IN SUCH A TASK. UNAMIR DOES NOT HAVE THE BUDGET TO FINANCE THIS TASK. IT IS PRESUMED THAT UNHCR WOULD FUND THE TASK. COSTING WOULD BE BETWEEN 60,000 TO 100,00 DOLLARS. REGARDLESS, UNAMIR AC ARE UNAVAILABLE NOW DUE TO THE COMMITMENT OF CURRENT REPATRIATION OF TROOPS. THIS IS SEEN AS AN APPROPRIATE TASK IN LIGHT OF ONE OF THE TASKS IN UNAMIR'S MANDATE WHICH IS TO ASSIST IN THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE (CODE CABLE ISSUED CONTAINS FURTHER DETAILS AND RECOMMENDED OPTIONS FOR UNHQ INFORMATION AND ADVICE).

(4) FC MET WITH NORWEGIAN DELEGATION TO DISCUSS THEIR OBSERVATIONS AFTER THE TECHNICAL VISIT OF CURRENT UNAMIR MEDICAL FACILITIES AND NEEDS. THEY ARE AWARE THEY WILL HAVE TO REVISE THEIR REQUIREMENT AND UPGRADE THEIR CAPABILITY. IT IS REALIZED THEIR SERVICE WILL BE LESS THAN AUSMED'S CAPABILITY, WHICH MEANS THAT THEY WILL UNABLE TO DEAL WITH LARGE-SCALE EMERGENCIES, WOULD HAVE TO RELY ON EVAC TO NAIROBI AND WOULD BE UNABLE TO PROVIDE MED COVERAGE TO NATIONALS. THE CONCERN OF LACK OF MEDICAL STAFF IN THE HQ WAS ALSO DISCUSSED. WITH NO MEDICAL OFFICER ON STAFF IT WAS FELT THAT MANY PRO-ACTIVE PROGRAMS AND TECHNICAL ADVICE TO THE FC WOULD CEASE AND BE A DETRIMENT TO THE MISSION. IT IS URGED THAT UNHQ NY SUPPORT THE POSTING OF A DOCTOR ON STAFF TO CONTINUE WITH DIRECTION AND TECHNICAL GUIDANCE ON PROGRAMS SUCH AS PREVENTIVE MEDICINE ASSISTANCE AND INSPECTIONS.

(1) MALICOY PLATOON DEPLOYED AT MASANGO (6254) DEPARTED ON 03 AUG 95 TO GIKONGORO. THE OTHER PLATOONS WERE MOVE ON 04 AUG 95 FROM GITARAMA AND RUHANGO TO THEIR NEW LOCS.

(2) 435 TONS OF FOOD STILL AWAITING TRANSPORT RESOURCES TO BE MOVED FROM GITARAMA TO VARIOUS COMMUNES. IT IS RECOMMENDED TO HAVE AT LEAST TWO TRUCKS PER DAY TO SUPPORT THIS TASK. NOTHING WAS TRANSPORTED ON 03 AUG 95.

(3) INDBATT PROVIDED ESCORT TO BROWN AND ROOT WATER TANKER FOR NIGHT SHIFT DUTIES.

(4) INDBATT TOOK OVER SECURITY DUTIES OF REFORMED SECTOR 1 (GITARAMA PREFECTURE) FROM MALICOY WITH EFFECT FROM 030600 HRS.

(5) 101 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI. 38 IDPs DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO. A TOTAL OF 267 NOW AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

(6) INDBATT REPAIRED A GENERATOR IN THE 'SISTER'S OF

CHARITY' ORPHANAGE AT KIGALI.

(7) ONE TRUCK WAS PROVIDED TO ARDEC (AGENCE RWANDAISE POUR LE DEVELOPPEMENT ET LA COOP) FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FOR BAKING BRICKS IN RUNDA PARISH. THE TRUCK CARRIED WOOD FROM KICESE TO RUNDA, KABEZA TO YAMAHURU AND KABEZA TO KIBAYA.

(8) MED STAFF TREATED 37 MEDICAL AND 11 DENTAL PATIENTS AT OWN CLINICS.

(4) TEAM FROM FMO ACCOMPANIED BY GHANA MED TEAM VISITED RUSUMO AND RUKIRA COMMUNES TO ASSESS EXTENT OF THE REPORTED OUTBREAK OF CHORELA AND CSM IN ABOVE-MENTIONED COMMUNES. NO SUPPORTING EVIDENCE DISCOVERED, REPORT THOUGHT TO BE FALSE.

(5) MED STAFF TREATED 65 LOCALS IN AOR.

E. SECTOR 4. NORMAL DUTIES WERE CONDUCTED IN AOR. NSTR.

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE CONDUCTED IN AOR.

(2) CONTINGENT 2IC, SENIOR NURSING OFFR AND MILOB HUMANITARIAN OFFICER VISITED KAYOVE (GS Z792) IDP CAMP TO SEEK POSSIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING HUMANITARIAN CLINIC THERE. TREATMENT IS LIKELY TO TAKE EFFECT FROM MON 07 AUG 95.

(3) NICOY SUPPLIED POTABLE WATER TO MADAM ROSE CARR IMBABAZI ORPHANAGE IN MUTURA (GS 3222).

G. MILOBS GP

(1) POLITICAL. SECTOR 1, GITARAMA, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA BRIGADE COMMANDER WAS UPSET WITH A UGANDAN NEWSPAPER ARTICLE WHICH QUOTED A UNAMIR SOURCE, AS SAYING "OUR

MILITARY ADVISORS SAW ONE SOLDIER IN UNIFORM OUTSIDE THE HOUSE", TALKING OF THE RUHANGO SOUS-PREFECT'S HOUSE. THE BDE COMD'S UPSET STEMMED FROM THE FACT THAT AN OFFICIAL SPOKESMAN WOULD REPORT THAT THE UNIFORMED MAN WAS A "GOVERNMENT SOLDIER" WHEN IT WAS NOT PROVEN THAT THE UNIFORMED MAN ONE. IT WAS REQUESTED THAT UNAMIR HQ BE MORE DISCREET AND TACTFUL NOT TO EQUATE "UNIFORMED MEN" WITH RPA SOLDIERS IN ANY INTERFACE WITH THE PUBLIC. COMMENT. THE UNAMIR SPOKESMAN RELEASED THE INFORMATION AS "AN UNIFORMED MAN" AND WAS THUS MISQUOTED.

REPORT ON THE MURDER OF MR. HABINSHUTI ORESTE.

BACKGROUND: THE DECEASED AGED ABOUT 35 YRS WAS LAST SEEN DRINKING WITH SOME LOCALS AT THE GUEST HOUSE, GIKONGORO ON 01 AUG 95. HE WAS SAID TO HAVE LEFT THE PREMISES AT ABOUT 2300 HRS ONLY TO BE ACCOSTED AT THE GATE BY TWO UNIDENTIFIED ARMED MEN WHO LATER TOOK HIM AWAY. HOWEVER, IN THE EARLY HOURS OF 02 AUG 95, BETWEEN 0400 AND 0600 HRS, HIS BODY WAS FOUND NEAR THE BRIDGE OF NWOGO RIVER (6021) BORDERING GIKONGORO/BUTARE PREFECTURES. AT THE TIME OF DISCOVERY, THE BODY WAS REPORTED STILL WARM.

ACTION TAKEN: ON RECEIPT OF THE REPORT, CONTACTS WERE ESTB WITH THE LOCAL RPA, THE PREFECT OF GIKONGORO AS WELL AS THE LOCAL AUTH, THE HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM AND THE CIVPOL, BUT NOTHING CONCRETE HAD BEEN RECEIVED AS TO THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE MURDER OF THE DECEASED MAN. IT WAS FURTHER REPORTED THAT THE BODY WAS SENT TO BUTARE HOSP FOR AUTOPSY. A TEAM COMPRISING TWO MILOBS, A REP OF THE HR AND A LOCAL UNAMIR INTERPRETER VISITED BUTARE AND CFM THAT THE BODY WAS COLLECTED ON 02 AUG 95 BY THE PREFECT TO GIKONGORO. THE TEAM ALSO REPORTED THAT HE WAS SHOT BESIDE HIS RIGHT EAR. BURIAL TOOK PLACE ON 03 AUG 95 AFTER A CHURCH SVC.

COMMENTS: ALTHOUGH NO CONCRETE EVIDENCE HAS BEEN ADDUCED SO FAR, ALL INFO ABOUT THE INCIDENT POINT TO THE FACT THAT THE LOCAL AUTH THEMSELVES HAVE SOMETHING TO HIDE IN OUR EFFORTS TO GET TO THE ROOT OF THE MATTER. THE DECEASED WAS SAID TO HAVE BEEN REPLACED/RELIEVED OF HIS POST AS SUB-PREFECT A FEW DAYS BEFORE THE INCIDENT IN WHAT INSIDERS EXPLAINED WAS BECAUSE OF SOME POLITICAL INFIGHTING. IF THIS WAS TRUE, THEN THE LOCAL AUTH MUST BE IN THE BEST POSN TO EXPLAIN. THEIR EFFORTS AND COOP IN THE CONDUCT OF INVESTIGATION INTO THE MATTER REMAIN UNCLEAR.

(A) GATUNA, BUZIBA AND KAGITUMBA BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO ALL TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) RUSIZI BORDER POSTS 1 & 2 AND BORDER POSTS UVIRA IN SECT 4 (RWANDA/ZAIRE) REMAIN CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. MILOB PATROL WAS PERMITTED TO GO TO RUSIZI - 2 THROUGH RPA CHECK POST AT GR 749226 AFTER THE SECTOR COMMANDER INFORMED THE LOCAL RPA COMMANDER TO ISSUE INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CHECK POST.

(C) THE RWANDA/BURUNDI BORDER AT BUGERAMA CITY REMAINED OPEN.

(D) GISENYI BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO ALL COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC EXCEPT UNAMIR PERS. TRAFFIC STILL CLOSED TO HUMANITARIAN AID TO GOMA CAMPS.

(E) BOTH BORDER POSTS AT SECTOR 3B - NO CHANGE

(F) THE RWANDA - ZAIRE BORDER AT UVIRA GR 8900 REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC EXCEPT REFUGEES ESCORTED BY UNHCR.

(G) RWANDA/UGANDA BORDER CROSSING AT CYANIKA REMAINED OPEN.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. NORMAL ACTIVITIES WERE PERFORMED.

(4) IN SECTOR 1 - KIGALI/GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) MILOB TEAM DEPLOYED TO MASANGO COMMUNE (GR 6254) TO INVESTIGATE A REPORT THAT A PRIEST HAD BEEN KILLED IN THIS AREA. THE INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE VICTIM WAS A LOCAL, MR BIRENYIMONA FRANCOIS, KILLED 01 AUG 95 AT APPROX 2200 HRS IN HIS RESIDENCE BY RPA SOLDIERS. THE CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THE KILLING ARE UNCLEAR. INVESTIGATIONS CONTINUE.

(C) MILOBS CONDUCTED FOLLOW-UP INTO THE MURDER OF THE CATHOLIC PRIEST OF KAMONYI SECTEUR (9079) IN TABA- COMMUNE (8883) TWO DAYS AGO. THEY FOUND A CHURCH SERVICE BEING CONDUCTED FOLLOWED BY A BURIAL CEREMONY IN THE KABGAYI CEMETERY. THIS EVENT WAS ATTENDED BY APPROXIMATELY 2000 PEOPLE.

(5) IN SECTOR 2 BYUMBA/KIBUNGO. MILOBS VISITED THE HEALTH CENTRE AT RUHUNDA (GR 4691) AND REPORTED CASES OF MALARIA AND MALNUTRITION. THEY ALSO REPORTED A SHORTAGE OF DRUGS AND A REQUIREMENT FOR AN AMBULANCE TO TRANSPORT EMERGENCY CASES TO RWAMAGANA HOSPITAL .

(6) IN SECTOR 3 - GIKONGORO/BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN GIKONGORO AOR. NTR.

(B) PTL TO MUSEBEYE COMMUNE GR 4038 IN GIKONGORO AREA LEARNED THAT A TOTAL OF 1230 PEOPLE MIGRATED INTO THE COMMUNE FROM OTHER NEIGHBOURING COMMUNES AFTER THE CLOSURE OF IDP CAMPS IN THE PREFECTURE. THE BURGERMASTER REQUESTED THAT THERE WAS NEED TO MOVE THESE PEOPLE OUT OF THE AREA BECAUSE HE BELIEVED IT POSED A SECURITY THREAT TO THE COMMUNE.

(C) MILOB TEAM PATROLLED NYAMAGEBE COMMUNE (GR 5427) AND OBSERVED THE DISTRIBUTION OF LANTERNS AND BLANKETS TO INDIGENT FAMILIES AT GIKONGORO (GR 5126), REMERA (GR 4926) AND NGILYI (GR 4526) SECTORS. THEY ALSO REPORTED THE BURIAL OF THE SOUS-PREFECT WHO WAS KILLED ON 2 AUG 95 THAT TOOK PLACE IN GIKONGORO.

(D) MILOB PATROL VISITED RUSATIRA COMMUNE (GR 7431) AND FOUND MSF HAVE STOPPED SERVICING THE LOCAL CLINIC DUE TO INADEQUATE SUPPLY OF DRUGS IN THE CLINIC. MEDICAL STAFF AT THE CLINIC HAD NOT BEEN PAID SINCE SEPT 94 AND THEY REQUESTED AID FROM ANY WILLING NGO OVER THE MATTER.

(7) IN SECTOR 4 - CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) THE DCMO VISITED KIRAMBO COMMUNE (GR 0444), NYAMASHEKE ORPHANAGE AND COMMUNE (GR 9841) AND SPENT THE NIGHT AT KIRAMBO.

(C) PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED TO SEVERAL AREAS IN THE SECTOR INCLUDING THE RWANDA/ZAIRE BORDER. SITUATION WAS FOUND TO BE CALM.

(D) ON 3 AUG AT 1410 AN AIRCRAFT IDENTIFIED AS A BN-2 ISLANDER OVERFLEW KAMEMBE SECTOR GR 7825.

(8) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI/RUHENGERI/KIBUYE.

(A) MILOB TEAM HELI PATROL WAS CONDUCTED TO VERIFY THE LOC OF A UNHCR SETTLEMENT ACROSS THE GISHWATI FOREST. THE SETTLEMENT IS LOCATED AT GR 3794 APPROXIMATELY 1.5 KM NORTH OF THE VILLAGE OF BWIZA. THE HELICOPTER DID NOT LAND AS NO SUITABLE LANDING ZONE WAS AVAILABLE. A ROAD PATROL CONDUCTED A ROUTE RECCE ALONG THE ROAD BWIZA - RAMBA (GR 4893) - GATUMBA (GR 6187) - KABINGO (GR 6109).

(B) MILOB PATROL VISITED RWERERE COMMUNE (GR 8535) AND FOUND OUT FROM LOCAL INHABITANTS THAT THE RPA HAD INCREASED THE FREQUENCY OF PATROLS IN KINYANZOU SECTOR. THERE WERE NO REPORTS OF KILLINGS OR BANDITRY IN THE AREA FOR THE PAST 7 DAYS.

(C) THE DCMO VISITED THE AREA AND CARRIED OUT DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PREFECT THAT CENTERED ON THE BURGERMASTER'S DEMANDS FOR WRITTEN PERMITS IN ORDER TO PATROL THE AOR.

(D) MILOB TEAM LEARNED OF AN INCIDENT IN RUSEBEYA (GR 4783). ON 1 AUG 95 AT APPROX 0500 HRS RPA SOLDIERS ATTACKED A MINING SITE IN THE VILLAGE OF RWANASIZI, BURNING DOWN 10 HUTS, SHOT AND KILLED 13 PEOPLE. THE TEAM VISITED THE SITE AND SAW 9 OF THE DEAD LYING IN THE OPEN AND SAW THE GRAVES WHERE THE OTHER 4 VICTIMS WERE BURIED. THE REASON FOR THE KILLING HAS NOT BEEN DETERMINED BUT LOCALS SUSPECT IT COULD HAVE BEEN AS A RESULT OF EXPLOITATION OF THE MINE. THE OFFICIALS CLAIMED THAT THE INCIDENT WAS DONE BY INTERAHAMWE. THE SECTOR COMMANDER PLANNED TO VISIT THE BURGERMASTER AND COUNCILLOR OF RUTSIRO TO GET THEIR VERSION OF THE STORY.

(E) MILOBS PATROL VISITED THE PREFECTURE REFUGEE/RETURNEE CAMP AT NYAMISHABA (GR 2572). THERE WERE UNDISCLOSED NUMBER OF PEOPLE WHO ARRIVED FROM GISENYI LAST NIGHT AND THEIR NEXT MOVEMENT IS UNKNOWN. THEY ALSO VISITED THE MEDICAL CENTRE AT NYABINAGA (SC 1452) WHERE THE DIRECTOR REPORTED THAT THEY ARE DEALING WITH RISING EPIDEMIC OF MEASLES WHICH HAD BEEN GOING ON FOR THE LAST 2-3 MONTHS. THEY ARE PRESENTLY CARRYING OUT VACCINATIONS.

THE TEAM ALSO REPORTED THAT DURING A JOINT WEEKLY BRIEFING WITH NGOS, UNHCR REPRESENTATIVE IN THE PREFECTURE INFORMED THAT A RADIO STATION HAS BEEN INSTALLED AT NGARA IN TANZANIA TO BROADCAST TO REFUGEES IN TANZANIA IN THE LOCAL LANGUAGE, FRENCH AND SWAHILI WITH A VIEW OF URGING THEM TO RETURN HOME.

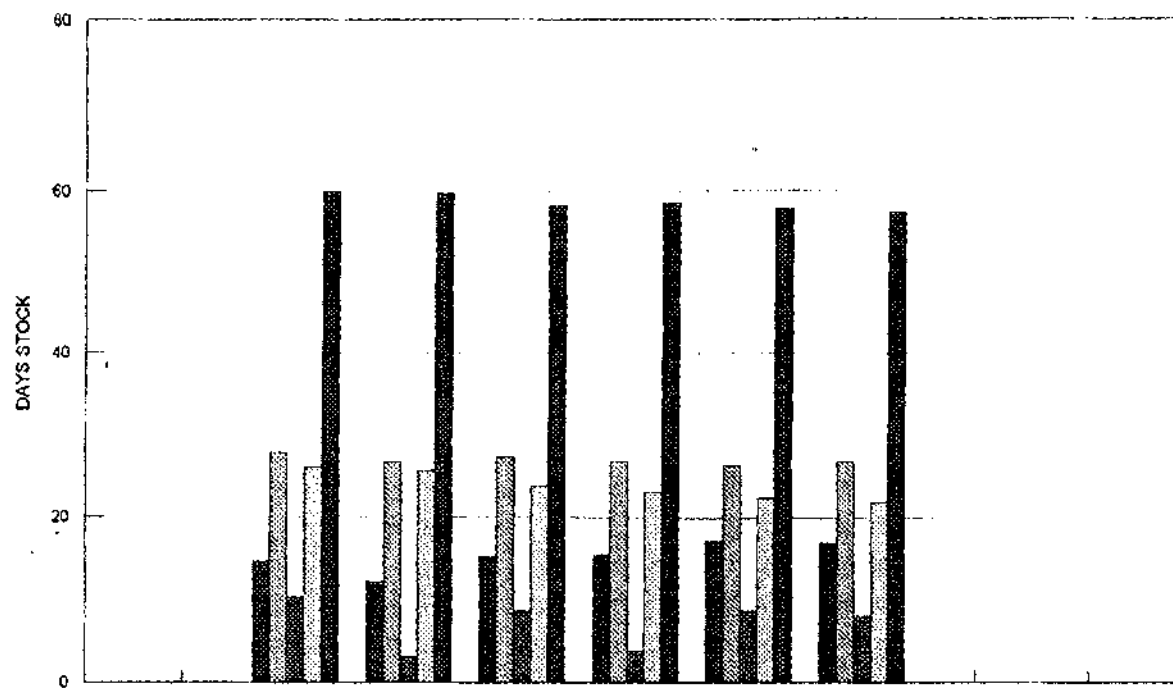

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. IT APPEARS THAT ANOTHER SOUS PREFECT WAS ASSASSINATED IN SECTOR 3. (PARA 3B (2) BOTH KILLINGS APPEAR TO BE POLITICALLY MOTIVATED SINCE BOTH SOUS-PREFECTS WERE CONSIDERED MODERATE HUTUS WHO COOPERATED WITH AND WERE SYMPATHETIC TO THE CURRENT GOVERNMENT. RPA PRESENCE IN THE AREA HAS BEEN INTENSIFIED.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, IS ON AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO BELGIUM AIMED AT IMPROVING RELATIONS AND COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. HE IS ALSO EXPECTED TO VISIT THE NETHERLANDS WHERE HE WILL HOLD TALKS WITH GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND MEET WITH DUTCH PARLIAMENTARIANS.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES. THE PREFECT OF RUHENGARI, THE RPA BN COMD AND HEAD OF GENDARMERIE RUHENGARI, PRESIDED OVER A PUBLIC MEETING AT THE STADIUM, FOLLOWING THE DEMONSTRATION AGAINST THE PROMOTION OF THE BOURGEMESTRES OF RUHONDO AND KIGOMBE COMMUNES. THEY WARNED THE PUBLIC THAT THE GOVERNMENT WILL NOT TOLERATE SUCH ACTS FURTHER. ABOUT 3,000 PEOPLE WERE PRESENT.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) SECTOR 4 MILOBS REPORTED THAT MILOB AND CIVPOL PATROLS WERE PREVENTED FROM PROCEEDING TO RUSIZI II (7422) BY RPA IN TWO SEPARATE INCIDENTS.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) AT 021015 AUG 95, THE BISHOP OF KABGAYI COMPLEX IN GITARAMA INFORMED MILOBS SECTOR 1 GITARAMA THAT A RWANDAN PRIEST FROM KAMONY CHURCH IN TABA COMMUNE GR 8883 WAS KILLED APPROXIMATELY AT 1930 HRS 1 AUG CLOSE TO HIS RESIDENCE. SEE PARA 4G. (4) D.

(2) MILOB PATROLS TO KARAMA (6327), MUSANGE (5347) COMMUNES AND GIKONGORO TOWNSHIP WERE INFORMED THAT BANDITRY WAS STILL GOING ON IN THE COUNTRYSIDE. ANOTHER SOUS-PREFECT MR HABINSHUTI ORESTE WAS KILLED BETWEEN 2040 AND 2200 HRS LAST NIGHT. THE BODY OF THE DECEASED WAS DUMPED BESIDE A BRIDGE ON ROAD GIKONGORO-BUTARE. CIRCUMSTANCES ARE NOT YET CLEAR AND MILOBS ARE INVESTIGATING.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) FC MET WITH LCOL LEWIS, BRITISH DEFENCE ATTACHEE

BASED IN KAMPALA AND GAVE A GENERAL BRIEF ON THE CURRENT SIT IN THE MISSION.

(3) FC UNDERTOOK HIS FIRST VISIT TO NICOY AT NYUNDO IN SECTOR 5 TO CONFIRM THE STATUS OF THE UNIT SINCE ITS MOVE FROM BYUMBA PREFECTURE. NO GREAT PROBLEMS WERE OBSERVED AND LOCAL RELATIONS APPEAR GOOD. HE ALSO PRESENTED UNAMIR CERTIFICATES AND MEDALS TO SOME MEMBERS OF THE COMPANY. MILOBS GAVE AN UPDATE SITREP SINCE THE FC'S LAST VISIT TO THE AREA LAST MONTH. BORDERS SEEM MORE OPEN TO PEOPLE AND VEHICULAR TRAFFIC. A NEW TRANSIT CAMP HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED AT KABALI IN MUTURA COMMUNE, THE FORMER SITE OF TUNBATT HQ.

(4) THE FC TOOK TIME TO VISIT MRS. CARR AT HER RESIDENCE AND THE ORPHAN CHILDREN IN HER CARE. THE FC WAS SPECIFICALLY INTRODUCED TO CERTAIN CHILDREN OF CONCERN AND HE WAS PERSONALLY BRIEFED BY MRS. CARR ON NEED AND ACCOMPLISHMENT OF THE ORPHANAGE. DURING THE FC'S VISIT, THE BOURGEMESTRE OF MUTURA COMMUNE ARRIVED AT MRS. CARR'S RESIDENCE AND RUDELY COMPLAINED OF HIS DISSATISFACTION OF THE ARRIVAL OF A UNAMIR HELICOPTER TO HIS COMMUNE WITHOUT HIS KNOWLEDGE. HE THREATENED TO ENTER THE HOUSE AND TO INTERRUPT A LUNCH BEING GIVEN BY MRS. CARR FOR THE FC. THE FC EXPLAINED THAT HE WAS AN INVITED GUEST AND THAT THE RPA AUTHORITIES HAD BEEN INFORMED. WHEN ASKED BY THE FC IF HE SHOULD INFORM MGEN KAGAME OF THE BOURGEMESTRE'S DISPLEASURE, THE BOURGEMESTRE REPLIED THAT IT WOULD NOT BE NECESSARY AND QUICKLY DEPARTED, APOLOGETIC.

(1) THE ADVANCED GUARD (ONE PLATOON) OF MALICOY DEPARTED TO GIKONGORO.

(2) INDBATT GUARD AT BBC REPORTED SOUND OF SEVEN SINGLE ROUNDS HEARD FROM THE GENERAL DIRECTION OF PARLIAMENT BUILDING. INVESTIGATION WAS INCONCLUSIVE.

(3) 32 IDPs ARRIVED NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE. 66 IDPs WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KANZENZE. A TOTAL OF 132 IDPs STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

(4) INDBATT PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR DELIVERY OF WOOD FOR COOKING BRICKS IN RUNDA PARISH. THE TRUCK CARRIED WOOD TO SOME PLACES WITHIN THE COMMUNE.

(2) NICOY HOSTED FC ON HIS INITIAL VISIT TO NYUNDO SINCE MOV FROM BYUMBA. HE WAS BRIEFED BY THE CONTINCO NICOY AND MILOBS. THE FC VISITED MADAM CARR ORPHANAGE AT MUTURA.

G. MILOB GP. CONTD COORDINATION AND MONITORING MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(1) POLITICAL.

(A) THE BOURGEMESTRE OF MARABA COMMUNE (GR 6321) IN BUTARE SECTOR INFORMED A MILOB PATROL THAT HE HAD RECEIVED INSTRUCTIONS FROM THE BUTARE PREFECT THAT FUTURE MILOB PATROLS SHOULD NOT BE CONDUCTED UNLESS THEY PRODUCED WRITTEN AUTHORITY FROM THE PREFECT'S OFFICE. THIS INSTRUCTION WAS GIVEN AFTER THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KABGAYI COMMUNE COMPLAINED ABOUT THE CONTINUED VISIT OF MILOB TO HIS SECTOR.

(B) MILOBS RUHENGARI REPORTED THAT AN UNCONFIRMED NUMBER OF PERSONS RESPONSIBLE FOR ORGANISING A DEMONSTRATION ON 31 JUL 95 HAD BEEN ARRESTED FOR PROTESTING AGAINST THE GOVERNMENT DECISION TO PROMOTE THE BOURGEMESTRES OF RUHONDO AND KIGOMBE COMMUNES. SECTOR HR MONITORS ARE FOLLOWING THE SITUATION.

(C) THE GITARAMA PUBLIC PROSECUTOR MET THE MALICOY OC TO DISCUSS THE INTERVIEWS TO BE HELD WITH THE VARIOUS WITNESSES INVOLVED IN THE SOUS PREFECT'S MURDER INVESTIGATIONS, INCLUDING THE SERGEANT WHO WAS AT THE HOUSE ON THE NIGHT OF THE INCIDENT. INTERVIEWS TOOK PLACE AT THE MALICOY PL POSN IN RUHANGO AT 0900 HRS 2 AUG 95.

(2) BORDERS.

(A) GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO ALL TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA) AND RUTETE (RWANDA/BURUNDI) - NTR.

(C) RUSIZI BORDER POSTS 1 & 2 AND BORDER POSTS UVIRA IN SECT 4 (RWANDA/ZAIRE) REMAIN CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT.

(D) GISENYI BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO ALL COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC EXCEPT UNAMIR PERS. TRAFFIC STILL CLOSED TO HUMANITARIAN AID TO GOMA CAMPS.

(E) BOTH BORDER POSTS IN BUTARE SECTOR - NO CHANGE.

(F) THE RWANDA-ZAIRE BORDER AT UVIRA GR 8900 REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC EXCEPT REFUGEES ESCORTED BY UNHCR.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. NORMAL ACTIVITIES WERE PERFORMED.

(4) IN SECTOR 1 - KIGALI \GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) TEAMS CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS IN THEIR AOR. ONE TEAM INVESTIGATED A REPORTED CASE OF MINES IN KANOMBE COMMUNE (KIGALI). THE BOURGMESTRE PROMISED TO ESCORT MILOBS TO THE SUSPECTED AREA ON 04 AUG 95.

(C) IN GITARAMA MILOB CONDUCTED PATROLS TO BULINGA (6679) AND NYAMABUYE (7570) COMMUNES. SEVERAL SECTORS IN THESE COMMUNES WERE VISITED. MILOBS HAD ACCESS TO COMMUNAL CACHOTS AND SAW THE INMATES. SITUATION WAS CALM. HOWEVER, REPORTS OF BANDITRY WERE RECEIVED.

(D) MILOBS CONDUCTED INVESTIGATIONS INTO THE MURDER OF A CATHOLIC PRIEST OF RWANDESE NATIONALITY AT KAMONYI SECTOR (9079) IN TABA COMMUNE (8883). THE PRIEST, FATHER PIE NTAHOBARI, WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE KAMONYI PARISH AND WAS SHOT LAST NIGHT. VARIOUS SOURCES GAVE DIFFERENT VERSIONS OF EVENTS. ONE RELIABLE SOURCE SAID THE PRIEST WAS STOPPED AT THE ENTRANCE OF HIS RESIDENCE BY SOME UNIDENTIFIED ARMED ELEMENTS IN UNIFORM. HE WAS THEN TAKEN TO A NEARBY BANANA PLANTATION AND SHOT. TWO GUARDS IN THE RESIDENCE CORROBORATED THIS VERSION BUT CLAIMED THE PRIEST ONLY STOPPED ABOUT A 100 METRES FROM THE RESIDENCE AND CALLED ONE OF THEM TO COME FOR THE CAR KEYS. THEY CLAIMED THEY DID NOT SEE ANYBODY STOPPING THE PRIEST. THIS COULD BE FOR FEAR OF CONSEQUENCES IN DENOUNCING THE MURDERERS. ALL SOURCES AGREED THAT THE PRIEST WAS STOPPED AT ABOUT

1900 HRS AND SHOT 30 MINUTES LATER. THE BODY WAS SEEN IN THE MORNING BY AN 11 YEAR-OLD BOY. WHEN MILOBS INTERVIEWED LOCALS, THEY CLAIMED THAT THEY DID SEE THREE RPA SOLDIERS GOING TO THE PRIEST'S RESIDENCE AND ONE OF THEM ENTERED THE BANANA PLANTATION WHERE THE PRIEST WAS SHOT. AT THE MURDER SCENE THIS MORNING WERE THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA, TWO REPS FROM INSPECTEUR DE POLICE JUDICIAIRE, A REPORTER FROM RADIO RWANDA AND ANOTHER FROM KENYA METEKE AND A FEW RPA SOLDIERS.

(5) IN SECTOR 2 BYUMBA/KIBUNGO.

(A) CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN THE MUHURA (GR 3008), MUVUMBA (GR 2646) AND GITI (GR 2303) COMMUNES TO MONITOR THE HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES OF NGOS AND THE CONDITIONS IN SOME OF THE LOCAL PRISONS. SITUATION WAS CALM.

(B) MILOBS KIBUNGO INVESTIGATED AND CONFIRMED THE OUTBREAK OF CHOLERA AND MENINGITIS IN THE RUSUMO AREA. THE BOURGEMESTRE REPORTED THE DEATH OF 6 PERSONS FROM THE OUTBREAK. FMO STAFF WILL INVESTIGATE FURTHER.

(C) PATROLS FROM KIBUNGO TO SEVERAL AREAS REPORTED THE SITUATION WAS CALM. THERE IS LACK OF DRINKING WATER IN MOST COMMUNES.

(6) IN SECTOR 3 - GIKONGORO\BUTARE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN GIKONGORO AOR. NTR.

(B) PATROLLED RUNYINYA (6012), SHYANDA (7718) AND GISHAMVU (6505) COMMUNES. LOCALS WERE SEEN GOING ABOUT NORMAL ACTIVITIES. SITUATION WAS CALM.

(C) PATROLLED KANYARU-HAUTE BORDER POST. SOME RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI WERE SEEN GATHERED AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE BROUGHT BY UNHCR. IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS AT THE POST REPORTED A DECREASE IN OUTFLOW OF TRAFFIC TO BURUNDI DUE TO THE INSECURE SITUATION IN THAT COUNTRY.

(7) IN SECTOR 4 - CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) THE SECTOR COMMANDER VISITED NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP (8124) AND THE INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS AT KAMEMBE AND FOUND THE SITUATION CALM.

(8) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYE/RUHENGERI/KIBUYE.

(A) MILOB RUHENGERI CONDUCTED HELI PATROL TO MANY COMMUNES AND THE CENTRAL HYDRO-ELECTRIQUE-NTARUKA (7137). THE HEADMASTER OF JANJA SECONDARY SCHOOL IN NDUSU COMMUNE COMPLAINED OF LACK OF MATERIALS, LOW ATTENDANCES POWER, LACK OF TEACHERS AND GENERATION.

(B) OTHER PATROLS WENT TO MUKINGO (5029) AND NKULI (4724) COMMUNES. LIAISED WITH IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS AT CYANIKA BORDER POST.

(C) IN GISENY MILOBS ESCORTED FC'S TEAM DURING HIS VISIT TO NICOY LOC. THEY CONTINUED WITH THE TEAM TO MRS. CARR'S ORPHANAGE IN MUTURA COMMUNE.

(D) IN KIBUYE MILOB TEAM PROVIDED ASSISTANCE TO A SIGNAL REPAIR TEAM THAT WENT TO UNAMIR REPEATER SITE ON KARONGI MOUNTAIN.

(E) MILOBS PATROLLED MORUNDA (3088) IN RUTSIRO COMMUNE. THE TEAM WAS TASKED TO MEET THE DCMO WHO VISITED THE SECTOR LATER IN THE DAY.

H. FORCE SIG COY.

(1) CONTINUED WIRING WORK FOR TELE EXTENSION LINES AT NEW UNAMIR HQ, TRAFFIPRO.

(2) MAINTENANCE AND SERVICING OF REPEATERS FOR CH 16 CARRIED OUT AT MOUNT KARONGI.

I. FORCE ENGR COY.

(1) CONTINUED TO DEPLOY ONE EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER AND ONE MOTOR GRADER IN ONTRACOM.

(2) PROVIDED TWO DUMP TRUCKS AND ONE TRAILOR FOR CARRYING LATERITE FROM NYANZA SITE TO TRANSIT CAMP ANNEXE.

J. AUSMED. TREATED A TOTAL OF 56 OUT-PATIENTS, 15 DENTAL PATIENTS AND CURRENTLY HOLDING 11 IN-PATIENTS.

K. AIR OPS. THE SITUATION IN KIA REMAINED NORMAL AND A TOTAL OF THIRTEEN FLIGHTS WERE OBSERVED.

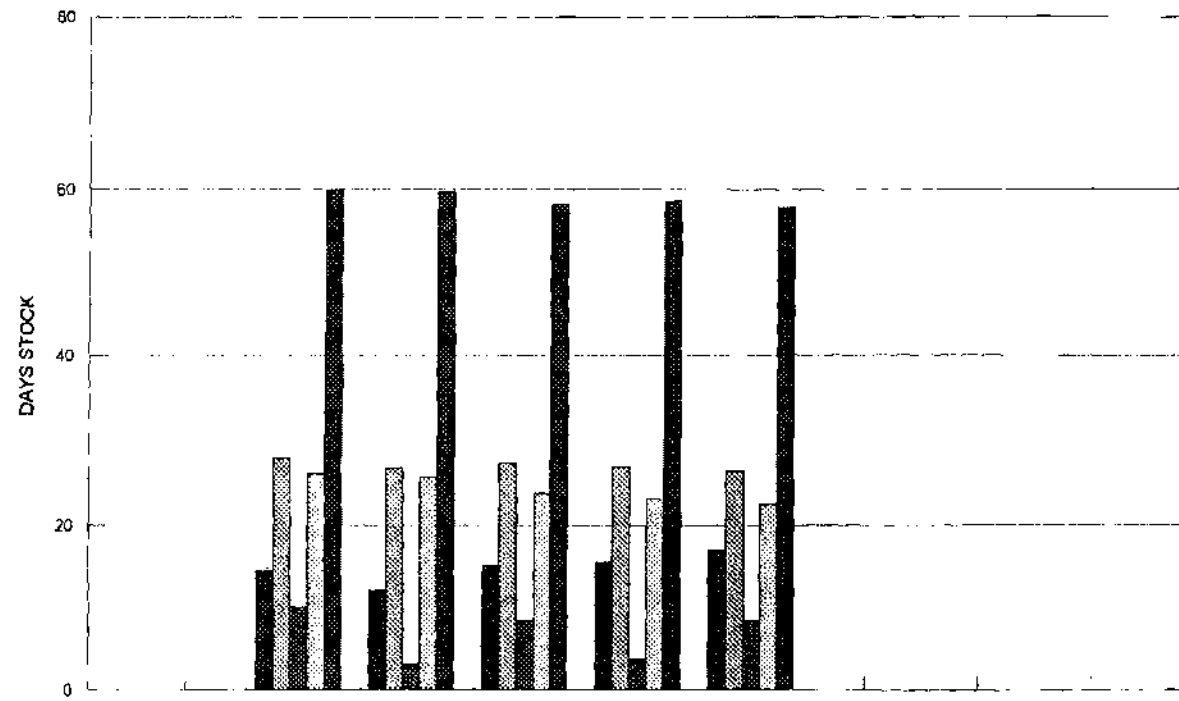

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIREAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. AT 010920B AUG 95, AN AUSMED VEH WAS STOPPED BY RPA IN KIGALI AT (GR 093347). FOUR AUSMED PERS WERE FORCIBLY REMOVED FROM THEIR VEH AND ASSAULTED. ONE PERS REQ HOSPITALISATION AFTER RECEIVING A RIFLE BUTT-STROKE TO THE HEAD. PERS WPNS (TWO F88 STEYRS AND AMMO) AND COMMS WERE CONFISCATED. IT TOOK THE INTERVENTION OF THE FORCE PROVOST MARSHAL AN RPA MAJ AND SOME UNAMIR STAFF OFFRS BEFORE AUSMED PERS, WPNS AND VEH WERE RELEASED AT 1020 HRS. THE AUSMED VEH WAS ACCUSED OF INTERFERING WITH A PRESIDENTIAL MOTORCADE. SEE SEPARATE CODE CABLE SENT ON 1 AUG 95.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, AT AN OFFICIAL LUNCHEON GIVEN ON SUNDAY FOR SOUTH AFRICA'S ARCHBISHOP DESMOND TUTU, RWANDESE PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU STATED THAT EVEN IF THE PROBLEMS OF SOUTH AFRICA WERE NOT SIMILAR TO THE PROBLEMS OF RWANDA, THE SAME SOLUTION USED IN SOUTH AFRICA COULD BE APPLIED IN RWANDA.

B. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT AN RPA COMPANY BEGAN A TRAINING COURSE ON DEMINING SUNDAY IN RUHENGARI IN NORTH WESTERN RWANDA WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF U.S. MILITARY EXPERTS.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) SECTOR 3B MILOBS REPORTED THE ROTATION OF TROOPS OF THE 301 BDE WITHIN THE VARIOUS COMMUNES IN BUTARE DURING THE PERIOD.

(2) SECTOR 4 MILOBS REPORTED A SKIRMISH BETWEEN RPA TROOPS AND UNIDENTIFIED HOSTILE ELEMENTS AT KAMEMBE COMMUNE (GR 8031) WHICH OCCURRED AROUND 0030 HRS ON 30 JUL 95. THE RPA LO BRIEFED MILOB PATROLS THAT ON THE DAY IN QUESTION, UNIDENTIFIED ARMED ELEMENTS FIRED 2 RIFLE GRENADE LAUNCHERS AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE IN KAMEMBE. THE EXPLOSIONS CAUSED SOME DAMAGE TO THE COMMUNE OFFICE. SEVERAL BULLET MARKS WERE ALSO OBSERVED ON THE WALLS OF THE BUILDING. RPA TROOPS WERE DEPLOYED TO COVER THE POSSIBLE WITHDRAWAL ROUTES OF THE ATTACKERS ALONG LAKE KIVU BUT NO ARRESTS WERE MADE. CONSEQUENTLY A MEETING WAS HELD BETWEEN THE RPA BDE COMD, KAMEMBE BOURGEMESTRE AND THE LOCALS WHO WERE WARNED TO DESIST FROM AIDING INFILTRATORS SINCE THE RPA ALLEGE THAT THE INCIDENT COULD NOT HAVE TAKEN PLACE WITHOUT THEIR COVERT ASSISTANCE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NSTR.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) FC VISITED ONTRACOM PRISON SITE IN KIGALI WHERE IT IS EXPECTED THAT 5,000 (PLUS) PRISONERS WOULD BE HOUSED AFTER ITS COMPLETION IN SEP-OCT TIMEFRAME. IT IS A JOINT PROJECT OF UNAMIR, UNDP AND ICRC. FORCE ENGINEERS ARE A MAJOR PART OF THE PROJECT.

(3) FC MET WITH RPA LO TO DISCUSS AN INCIDENT OF ASSAULT BY RPA SOLDIERS FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT'S MOTORCADE ON SOME UNAMIR SOLDIERS. THE ASSAULT APPEARED TO BE AN ACTION TAKEN BY SOME OVERZEALOUS LOCAL COMDS IN THE MOTORCADE ITSELF. THE FC DIRECTED THE RPA LO TO ENSURE THE VICE PRESIDENT WAS MADE AWARE OF THE INCIDENT, ADDING THAT THE INCIDENT WOULD BE FORMALLY REPORTED.

B. SECTOR 1.

(1) MALICOY DEPARTURE TO GIKONGORO DELAYED TILL FRI 04 AUG 95 DUE TO LACK OF ACCOMMODATION UNTIL THE DEPARTURE OF THE ZAMBIAN CONTINGENT.

(2) INDBATT GUARD AT BBC REPORTED SOUND OF FIVE SINGLE ROUND HEARD FROM THE GENERAL DIRECTION OF MERIDIEN HOTEL.

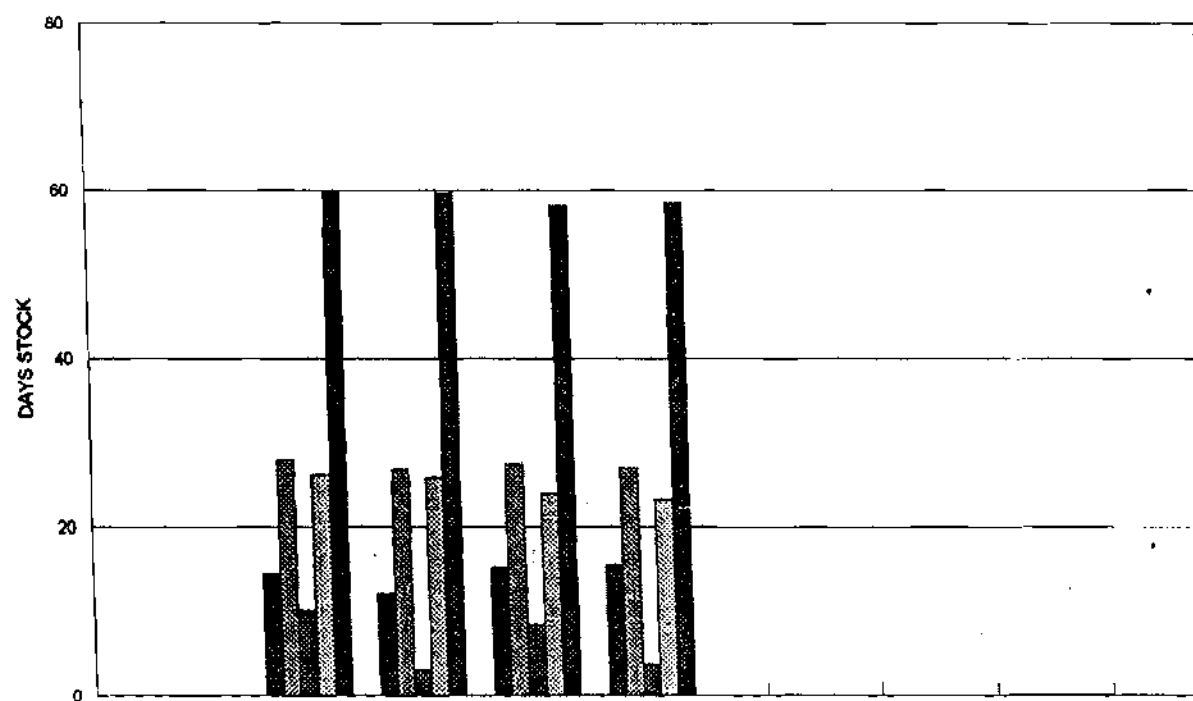
