1. Introduction :

On Sunday, 29th October 1995 at about 14.50 hours the Operations Officer at Milobs Hqtrs Cyangugu reported to UNCIVPOL team Cyangugu that he received a report, that the office of the ICRC had been broken into in the night of Saturday, 28/10/95 and that the incident require CIVPOL immediate investigation.

2. Facts of the case:

On 28th October 1995, the Staff of ICRC in Cyangugu held a Send-off Party in honour of a departing colleague named NADYA (f). The party commenced at about 19.00 hours. When the party was in session, unknown thief or thieves broke into one of the offices through the rear window and gained entrance through the Ruzizi/Cyangugu side of the road as the ICRC building situates along Ruzizi and Kamembe market roads. The following items were listed as stolen by Mr. SANDOZ ALAIN, the Administrator of ICRC Cyangugu:

- a) one Harddisk Computer Compaq Centura 486
- b) one Printer "Brother"
- c) one UPS (Stabilizer) Control Part
- d) one Keyboard Compaq and
- e) the sum of FRW 3500, all property of ICRC.

Estimated value is US\$ 4000.

3. Investigation:

Consequent upon the report, Captain Lajili Abdenaceur and ASP Thomas Addi were detailed to investigate. They proceeded to the scene of crime and met Mr. Sandoz Alain, the Administrator of ICRC, who confirmed the incident and conducted them around. He narrated to the team, that on 29th October 1995, he was informed by Mr. MUGGLER Hugo, the Relief Administrator of ICRC, that he noticed on opening his office, that his office had been broken into by unknown bandits and the property listed in paragraph two above stolen. The team interrogated Mr. Muggler. He revealed that at the close of work on 28/10/95 he locked his office and that there are three guards namely,

1. Emmanuel Simboleur, 24 years old,
residing in Kamembe
2. Theobart Rwiliniza, 39 years old,
residing in Kamembe and
3. Jean-Marie Nshimiimana, 24 years old,
residing in Kamembe

responsible for the night security of the premises but that on the date of the incident the night guards were all involved at the gate on direction and protection of vehicles since there was a Send-off Party in honour of their colleague. Hence they were absent from the patrol areas. That the sound from the music and noise created a cover to the bandits and prevented the guards from hearing. Mr. Sandoz on his part hinted, that the theft occurred between 22.00 hours of 28/10/95 and dawn of 29/10/95. He said, he did not suspect anybody but that when the party was in progress he spotted two young uninvited guest amongst the invitees drinking and added that he would not be able to identify any of them if seen. He confirmed the active involvement of the three guards on security duties at the party's venue within the premises on the night of the incident.

On Monday, 30th October, 1995, the CPMT visited the scene of crime in company of the investigating officers and met Mr. Sandoz Alain, the Administrator of ICRC who briefed the CPMT and invited Mr. Muggler to conduct the team around. He first showed the team an office before his own where the bandits attempted to gain an entry but could not cut the iron rod barring the window. The bandits then abandoned the office and went to Mr. Muggler's office, which had no proper burglary proof as we observed that the big iron bar was missing thereby creating a big opening for any intruder to pass through. We observed that the bandit or bandits carefully used a diamond blade to cut an opening through the window-glass big enough to penetrate his hand to unlock the window which was equally insecure. We then demanded to be taken to the fence perimeter and observed that the Ruzizi Road side of the fence is made of barbed wire and several areas were spotted compressed and we concluded that the bandits must have entered the premises through one of the compressed areas. We also observed that the two windows had no sandbags stacked against them as others.

At the end of the visit I informed the ICRC Administrator of my intention to direct the investigators to interrogate the nightguards. He consented.

On Wednesday, 1st November 1995, at about 18.30 hours, a team comprising Capt. Abdennaceur LAJILI and Capt. Bernhard LENHARD visited the premises of ICRC to interrogate the night guards and observed, that none of the guards could speak English or French languages.

An official of ICRC they met, explained to the team that two of the guards had been in their employment for one year and the third guard for 4 months and that they have implicit confidence in the guards. That they have never found the guards wanting at all. The official disclosed further that

suspicion could be placed on the former guards discharged several weeks ago when there was an incident of theft in the ICRC warehouse but quickly cut in to say, that this theory was purely speculative. The team in furtherance of the investigation made contacts with several present CIVPOL team informants to nose around for information about the stolen items and the perpetrators. Those on duty at the road blocks were also alerted and the ICRC made an official complaint to the Gendarmerie.

4. Findings:

The following are our findings:

1. We found that by the imposing location of the building which is a corner house, lying on two main streets, this act would have been prevented if the fence was a concrete or brick wall;
2. That the absence of the guards from their usual patrol beats created the necessary vacuum needed by the bandits;
3. That the offence is carried out by professional burglars who were in possession of burglarious implements and are experts in cutting of window glasses or glasses generally as the opening on the glass was expertly done;
4. That the guards dismissed some weeks ago may be responsible for the theft as a revenge for their dismissal;
5. That the involvement of the three guards on party security and leaving other part of the premises bare was ill-advised;
6. That the evidence of good character of the guards given by an official of ICRC is counter-productive as one year is not enough time to access a kleptomaniac;
7. That his physical presence or pretending to be seen by other guards occasionally at the party venue could be a smoke-screen.
8. That it is possible for an insider (a guard) to arrange for members of his syndicate to operate at a given time and circumstance in this case the Send-off Party.

5. Recommendation:

From the observations made, I hereby recommend the following security measures:

1. That all such buildings be fitted with burglary alarm in future;

2. That all intending guards to be employed should be properly screened with a look into their past criminal records, if any;
 3. That the prefet or any VIP within the area should be made to attest that the intended guard is clean;
 4. That burglary proof be provided on all the doors and windows and a device fitted inside to lock the window securely from inside with padlocks;
 5. That burglary alarm should in addition be secretly installed out of the knowledge of all the local staff.
6. Comments:

It is crystal clear that the act was perpetrated by a group who are very familiar with the ICRC complex and the timing of the offence goes to buttress this assertion. I therefore strongly recommend that the Gendarmerie already aware of this crime should work on this theory.
