

DAILY SITREP FOR 12 JAN 95

1. **GEN SITUATION**. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

(A) IN SECTOR 4B, 3 X MASS GRAVES WERE DISCOVERED AT GITWA (2980) IN THE MABANZA COMMUNE. GRAVES WERE UNCOVERED AND SUSPECTED TO CONTAIN ABOUT 60 BODIES. THE GRAVES DATE BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

(B) IN SECTOR 4B, HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM VISITED KIDOGO (2562) TO INVESTIGATE A REPORT OF AN ASSAULT WHICH HAD TAKEN PLACE ON 09 JAN 95. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE 'CONSEILIER' OF KIDOGO HELD A MEETING WITH THE LOCALS ON 11 JAN 95 AND TOLD THE PEOPLE NOT TO CO-OP WITH UNAMIR AND THREATENED TO ARREST THOSE WHO WOULD NOT COMPLY. LOCALS NOT CERTAIN OF THEIR SY HAVE DESERTED THEIR HOMES AND ARE NOW LIVING IN THE FIELDS. MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.** THE SRSG CONVENED A MEETING TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF SECURITY IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS. THE SRSG MET MR BERNARD DUSSAULT, SPECIAL ENVOY OF CANADA, TO DISCUSS CANADA'S ROLE IN RWANDA'S DEVELOPMENT AND REHABILITATION. THE SRSG ADDRESSED A MEETING OF NGOS TO INFORM THEM OF DEVELOPMENTS REGARDING SECURITY IN REFUGEES CAMPS, HIS MISSIONS TO ZAIRE AND TANZANIA, THE ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE AND THE GOVERNMENT'S WORKING PROCEDURES FOR NGOS. HE ALSO PRESENTED THE NGOS WITH HIS REVISED RWANDA EMERGENCY NORMALIZATION PLAN (RENP).

3. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPA.**

(1) RPA TPS WERE ALLEGED TO HAVE ARRESTED 3 PERS FOR THE MURDER OF MR NSIOGOZA AT MURAMBA (2056) (SECT 4A) IN DEC 94. THEY WERE ALSO REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED ANOTHER MAN AT GISHYITA ON 11 JAN 95. THE MAN WAS SUSPECTED TO BE A FORMER MILITIA.

(2) RPA CONTINUED TO TRAIN TPS IN THE KIBUYE CAMP.

(3) RPA REINFORCED POSNS IN SECT 4C AND 5 ESPECIALLY IN THE AREAS OF NYAMASHEKE, KINIGI GR 5440 AND ALONG THE BORDER WITH ZAIRE.

(4) RPA CARRIED OUT CORDON AND SEARCH OPS IN NYAMIRAMBO AND INTENSIFIED PATROLS WITHIN THE CAPITAL. THE OPS WAS CONDUCTED TO SEARCH FOR ARMS, AMMO, SUSPECTED MILITIA AND CRIMINALS.

(5) RPA WAS ALLEGED TO HAVE ARRESTED 3 MEN AT KAROHORO, IN SECTOR 3, ON 9 JAN 95. THEY WERE DETAINED IN BUTARE PRISON. REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS NOT KNOWN.

C. **MILITIA.**

(1) LOCALS IN SECT 4C IDENTIFIED SOME ARMED ELMS WHO HAVE TAKEN PART IN ACTS OF BANDITRY IN SECT 4C, AS FORMER RGF TPS. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(2) SHOOTING INCIDENT AT NYAMASHEKY REPORTED ON 8 JAN 95 OCCURRED AT 0100 HRS VICE 1000 AS REPORTED EARLIER.

4. **OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.**

A. **FORCE HQ.**

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED TODAY.

(2) OP RETOUR. A TOTAL OF 161 DPs WERE EVACUATED FROM CYANIKA AND RUKONDO ON 12 JAN 95.

CYANIKA - 108

RUKONDO - 53

TOTAL NUMBER OF DPs MOVED SINCE THE BEGINNING OF OP RETOUR IS 8,345. FC VISITED OP AND AFTER BRIEFINGS WITH NGOs, UNREO AND UNAMIR REPS PROVIDED FURTHER SUGGESTIONS, GUIDANCE AND DIRECTION FOR FUTURE OPS AND METHODOLOGY.

(3) COS AND DCOS OPS VISITED SECTOR 4C TO INVESTIGATE INCIDENT OF 8 JAN 95 AT NYAMASHEKY TO DETERMINE UNAMIR OPTIONS.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). CONDUCTED PTL AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) PATROL TO NGARAMA GR 264291 REPORTED THE SIT AS CALM AND RELATIONSHIP WITH RPA AND LOCALS IS SAID TO BE CORDIAL. LOCALS ONLY COMPLAINED OF LACK OF DRUGS.

(2) PATROL TO GATUZA GR 325223 REPORTED THAT THE COMMUNE WORKERS WERE YET TO BE PAID AND REASON FOR THE DELAY WAS THAT THE AMOUNT TO BE PAID WAS NOT SPECIFIED BY THE GOVT. THE WORKERS COMPLAINED OF HAVING NO MEANS OF COMMUNICATIONS.

(3) 83 LOCALS RECEIVED MED ASSISTANCE IN MED CENTRE.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) PTLs TO MUGANZA GR 8409 HAVE REPORTED THAT THE CLINIC IS STILL CLOSED. KIBAYI CLINIC GR 8494 IS FACED WITH SHORTAGE OF DRUGS AND STAFF.

(2) PROVIDED TRUCKS AND SECURITY FOR TRANSPORTING FOOD FOR TEACHERS AT MARABA COMMUNE.

(3) 08 LOCALS WERE TREATED AT KIGEMBE AND RUNYINYA CAMPS.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) PROVIDED SY FOR 38 IDPs WHO LEFT SAKE ORC GR 4454 FOR THEIR VARIOUS HOMES. ALSO PROVIDED SY FOR FOOD DISTRIBUTION AT NDAGO BY ICRC.

(3) 16 PERSONS ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH RUSUMO BORDER

POST TODAY.

(4) RAP TREATED 32 LOCALS.

(5) TWO WOUNDED PERSONS AND ONE DEAD BODY WERE BROUGHT TO RUNYOMBYI GR 4893 FROM KIGALI BY AUSMED. CAS WERE THOSE WHO WERE EVAC TO KIGALI FROM BUSANZE ON 07 JAN 95 AFTER THE SHOOTING INCIDENT.

F. SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAMBATT). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTLs IN AOR.

(1) SUB PREFECT AND BOURGMESTRES FROM THE SECTOR ADDRESSED IDPs AT CYANIKA DPC URGING THEM TO RETURN HOME AND ASSURED THEM OF THEIR SY IN THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(2) 45 LOCALS WERE GIVEN MEDICAL TREATMENT AT KADUHA.

G. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) 10 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED BY RPA IN MUBUGA, NAMES OF THOSE ARRESTED WERE HANDED OVER TO UNHCR AT KIBUYE FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS.

(2) ICRC DISTRIBUTED FOOD AND HOES AT BIRAMBO AND KIBUYE RESPECTIVELY.

(3) 26 LOCALS WERE GIVEN MEDICAL TREATMENT BY FRAFBATT.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) TRANSPORTED 27 REFUGEES FROM RUSIZI - 1 GR 7624 TO NYAGATARE.

(2) TREATED 29 LOCAL DENTAL PATIENTS.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONDUCTED FOOT AND MOBILE PTLs IN AOR.

(1) 726 RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE THROUGH GISENYI WERE RECORDED ON 11 JAN 95.

(2) 3 LOCALS REPORTED THAT FIVE PERSONS HAVE BEEN MISSING FOR THE PAST TWO MONTHS, FOUR OF THEM ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN ABDUCTED BY RPA.

(3) 211 LOCALS WERE TREATED AT MEDICAL CENTRE.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

- (1) OWS AT NDERA WAS PATROLLED BY DAY AND NIGHT.
- (2) A TOTAL OF 300 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP. NDERA CAMP NOW HOLDING 1117 IDPs.
- (3) A TOTAL OF 287 LOCAL PATIENTS WERE GIVEN MED AND DENTAL TREATMENT AT OWN CLINIC.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

- (2) BORDERS. FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC.
 - (A) GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.
 - (B) RUTETE AND RUSUMO BORDER POSTS.
 - (C) GISENYI/GOMA BORDER POST (EXCEPT UNAMIR PERS) AND CYANIKA.
 - (D) BURUNDI BORDER AT KANYARU-HAUTE (SECTOR 3).
- (3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS.
- (4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.
- (5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR. PTLS TO KABU WERE STOPPED BY RPA AT KABU CHECK POINT AND DENIED PASSAGE. PTLS RETURNED TO KIBUNGO. MATTER BEING TAKEN UP WITH RPA.
- (6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA.
 - (A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.
 - (B) PTLS TO NYANZA AND MBUYE VISITED NYANZA AND MBUYE PRISONS AND FOUND A TOTAL OF 19 DETAINEES ALLEGED TO BE FORMER MILITIA (NYANZA 2 AND MBUYE 17).
- (7) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.
 - (A) THE FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO THE SECT TO MONITOR THE PROGRESS OF OP RETOUR.
 - (B) SECTOR MILOBS PATROLLED CYANIKA, RUKONDO, KIBEHO, GABIRO (4792), REMERA AND NDAGO AS PART OF OP RETOUR. IT WAS REPORTED THAT MOST IDPs WERE RELUCTANT TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. PTLs TO NYAMISHABA CAMP FOUND THE CAMP DESERTED.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. COS AND DCOS OPS VISITED SECT 4C.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) PTLs MONITORED THE SIT IN KIGALI CITY DURING RPA CORDON AND SEARCH OPS WHICH STARTED AT DAWN AND ENDED AT ABOUT 1200HRS. THE PURPOSE OF THE SEARCH WAS TO RETRIEVE WPNS AND UNIFORMS FROM SOME RPA SOLDIERS WHO HAD DESERTED BECAUSE THEY WERE TO BE POSTED OUT OF KIGALI. SHOPS WERE CLOSED AND COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES CEASED DURING THE PERIOD OF THE OPS.

(C) PTLs TO KAGUGU AND GISOZI SUBURBS OF KIGALI, WERE INFO THAT THERE WERE UNEXPLODED ORDNANCE IN THE AREA. FORCE ENGINEER OFFICER INFO AND ACTION IN HAND.

L. AUSMED

(1) AUSMED CONTINUED TO PROVIDE MEDICAL SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT TO PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(2) AUST FORCES AT CHK TREATED 64 PATIENTS AND 6 DENTAL PATIENTS. CHK IS HOLDING 15 IN-PATIENTS.

(3) RIFLE COY ELM PROVIDED SECURITY AT THE MIL BKS AND CHK.

(4) MED SCREENING TEAM AND PROTECTIVE ELEMENT VISITED CYANIKA AND RUKONDO CAMPS IN SPT OP RETOUR. 35 IDPs WERE SCREENED. INF ELMS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN RUKONDO AND CYANIKA.

M. 1 CDHSR. THE CANADIAN SIGNAL REGIMENT CONTINUES PREPARATIONS TO DEPART TO CANADA.

(1) SIGNALS SQN. LMN ARE ASSISTING FIELD SERVICES TO INSTALL V-SAT TERMINAL AT SECTOR 2 HQ KIBUNGO. AWAITING FD SVC TECHS TO INSTALL MODEM AND UPS. INFO SECTION TP INSTALLED INMARSAT AT UNHQ KIGALI AND TAC HQ BUTARE. SYSTEM TESTING SUCCESSFUL AND TRAFFIC IS BEING PASSED BETWEEN KIGALI AND BUTARE. THE ADVANCE PARTY, CONSISTING OF THREE PERS, DEPARTED FOR MOMBASA TODAY.

(2) 3 CSG. THE FIRST TEN SEA CONTAINERS ARRIVED. THE LOADING OF BULK EQUIP WILL COMMENCE 13 JAN 95.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE SECTORS.

B. RPA ARE STILL MOUNTING SNAP CHECK POINTS IN STRATEGIC PARTS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SCREENING IS MAINLY FOR MIL VEHS.

C. IN KIGALI, BANKS, COMMERCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND MARKETS REMAINED CLOSED IN THE MORNING TO THE PUBLIC. RPA DEPLOYED ABOUT 3000 MILITARY PERSONNEL TO GUARD STRATEGIC PLACES.

D. RPA IN KIGALI CONDUCTED SEARCHES IN NYARUGENGE AND NYAMIRAMBO RESIDENTIAL AREAS TRYING TO RECOVER ARMS AND ABOUT 180 PERSONS WERE ARRESTED. THE DETENTION PLACE OF ARRESTED PERSONS NOT KNOWN.

E. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGERI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IS STILL IN PROGRESS.

ONE OF THE BANDITS WAS IDENTIFIED AS A FRGF SOLDIER WHOSE FATHER IS A FARMER IN KAGANO COMMUNE. THE ABDUCTED FISHERMEN SAID THEY WERE TAKEN TO IJWI ISLAND BEFORE THEIR RELEASE AS MENTIONED ABOVE.

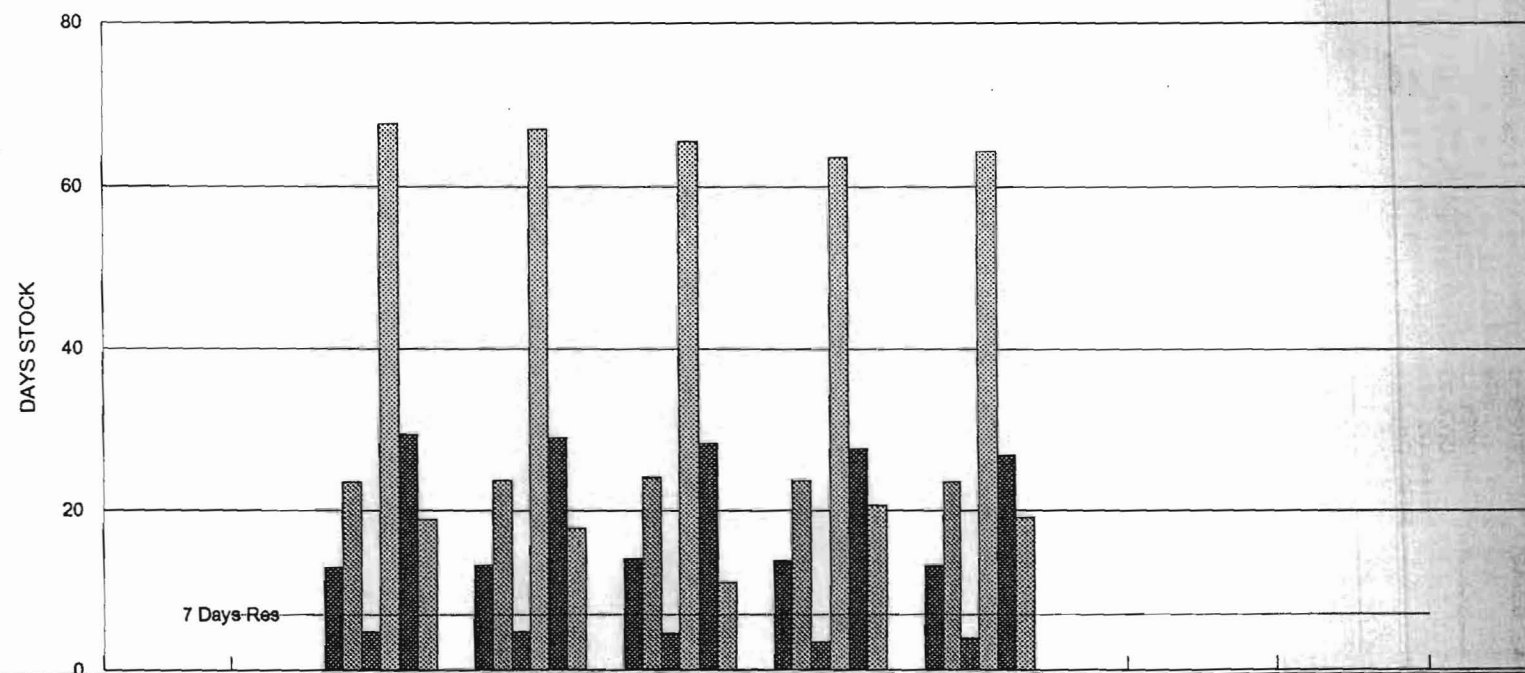

ON NI 09/10 HE MADE HIS ESCAPE UNDER RPA FIRE BECAUSE HE FEARED HE WAS GOING TO BE EXECUTED. HE ALSO SAID THAT HE BELIEVED THAT MOST OF HIS CELL MATES HAD ALREADY BEEN EXECUTED. THE SOLDIER WAS INTERVIEWED BY MILOBs IN THE PRESENCE OF SECTOR HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS.

(B) MILOBS AND UNHCR OFFICIALS ON OP RETOUR IN SAKE REPORTED THE ARREST ONE LOCAL AT THE ORC IN SAKE BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES ON CHARGES OF CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES. THE SUSPECT IS CURRENTLY IN THE CUSTODY OF LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

(C) MILOBS INVESTIGATED INCIDENT OF MASS ARRESTS BY RPA IN THE KIDOGO AREA (GR 2662). (SITREP OF 09 JAN 95 REFERS). THE COMMANDING OFFICER OF THE RILIMA PRISON DENIED ANY KNOWLEDGE OF THE INCIDENT, HOWEVER HE PROMISED TO INVESTIGATE SINCE RPA SOLDIERS WERE INVOLVED. THE BOURGMESTRES OF GASHORA AND THE COUNSELLOR OF RILIMA WHO TOOK PART IN THIS ACTION WERE NOT AVAILABLE FOR INTERROGATION.

SCHOOLS IN THE AREA LACK STATIONERY AND CLASSROOM FURNITURE. TEACHERS HOWEVER COMPLAINED THAT THEY HAD NOT BEEN PAID SINCE OCT 94. THE HOSPITAL IS REPORTED TO HAVE NO DOCTOR AND ELECTRICITY. 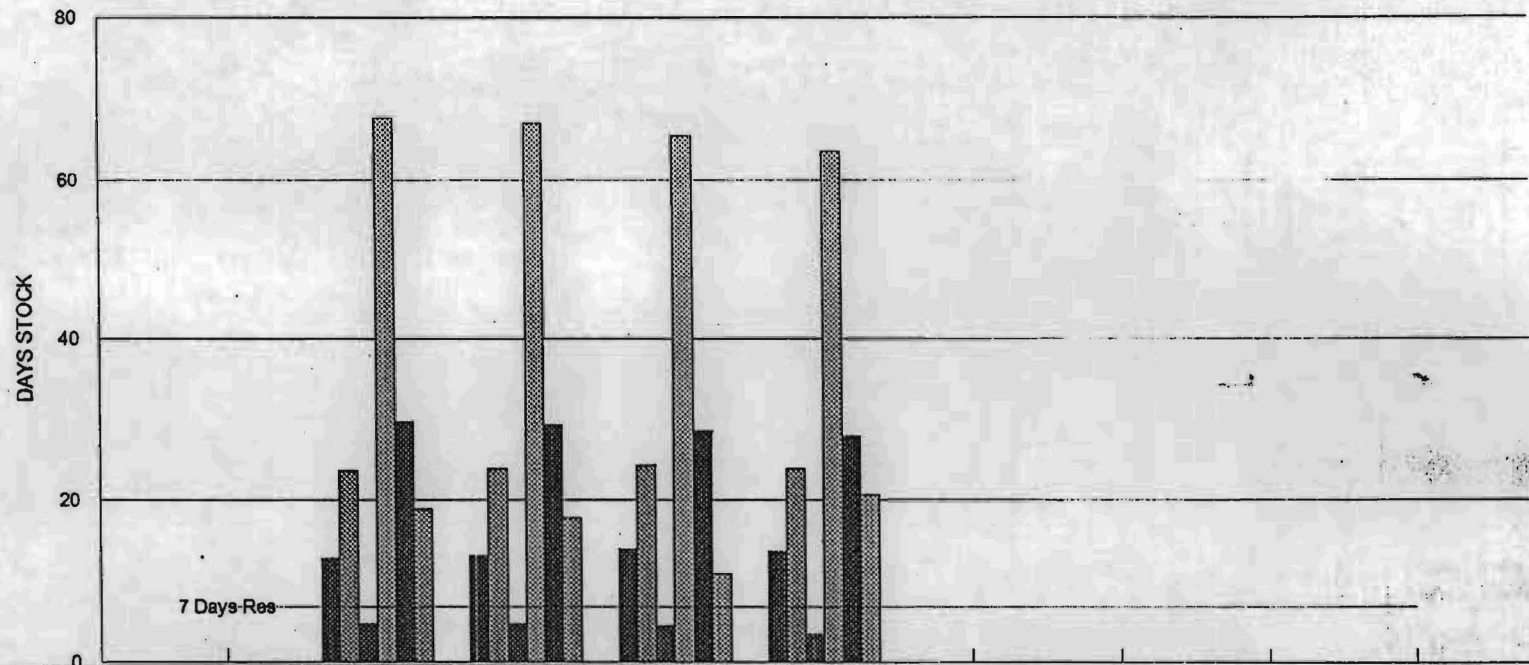

(D) RPA REINFORCED NYAMASHEKE AREA WITH MORE EXPERIENCED AND MATURE SOLDIERS. THE FULL STR OF THE REINFORCEMENT IS UNKNOWN. DETAILS BEING ASCERTAINED.

(P) RPA DURING THE WEEK EXCHANGED FIRE WITH EX-RGF SOLDIERS WHO CAME TO NYAMASHEKE CHURCH TO ROB THE MISSION. THE RGF SOLDIERS ESCAPED.

(2) **FRGF** FRGF SOLDIERS FROM NEARBY CAMP ON IJWI ISLAND IN ZAIRE CONTINUED ACTS OF BANDITRY IN THE AREAS OF GAFUNSO GR 9239, NGOMA GR 9637, RUZIZI I GR 9001 AND MUKINJA GR 0141. LOCALS WERE REPORTEDLY NOT SATISFIED WITH THE OVERALL RESPONSE OF THE RPA.

(3) **MILITIA**

(A) A SHOOTING INCIDENT TOOK PLACE AT THE KAMEMBE ORPHANAGE IN SECTOR 4C ON THE NIGHT 03/04 JAN 95. ASSAULT RIFLES AND HAND GRENADES WERE USED. IT IS UNKNOWN WHO CARRIED OUT THE ATTACK BUT SECTOR 4C MILOBS COULD FIND NO EVIDENCE LINKING IT WITH FORMER RGF TROOPS. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(C) THE FC MET LCOL LAMONTAGNE FROM CANADA TO GET A BRIEFING ON THE DEINDUCTION OF CANCON.

(2) **SECTOR 1 (NICROY).**

(A) CONDUCTED PTL AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(B) A COMBINED WORSHIP WITH OWN TPS AND LOCALS AT BYUMBA CATHOLIC/PROTESTANT CHURCH WAS HELD TO MARK THE NEW YEAR.

(C) A TOTAL OF 446 LOCALS RECEIVED MED ASSISTANCE IN MED CENTRE DURING THE WEEK AND ALSO DONATED RELIEF MATERIALS TO BYUMBA ORPHANAGE. 27 REFUGEES WERE PICKED UP FROM KAGITUMBA GR 504822 TO KIGALI.

(3) **SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT).** AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

(4) **SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY).**

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(B) IN MURABO GR 7098, THE NUMBER OF RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI WAS REPORTED INCREASING WEEKLY. MANY PEOPLE FROM BUHORO HAVE NOT YET RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES.

(C) SENT PATROLS TO MPANDA GR 5607, RUSENGE GR 5904, BUNGE GR 5501 AND JALI GR 5900. THE PATROL

REPORTED THAT THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS CALM HOWEVER THE LOCALS HAVE REPORTED THAT FOOD ASSISTANCE TO THE AREAS WAS NOT FORTH-COMING DUE TO BAD CONDITION OF ROAD.

(E) PATROLS TO RUNYINYA GR 8600 REPORTED THAT THOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION HAS IMPROVED CONSIDERABLY IN THE AREA, FEW DPS WERE OBSERVED TO HAVE RETURNED TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOMES DUE TO UNCERTAINTY OF THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA.

(G) PTLs SENT TO NYAKIZU GR 5797 OBSERVED THAT THE NUMBER OF RETURNEES HAS NOW INCREASED TO AN AVERAGE OF ABOUT 50 PERSONS PER DAY. 97 TENTS HAVE BEEN BUILT AT NYAKIZU COMMUNE FOR RETURNEES AND MORE TENTS ARE BEING CONSTRUCTED.

(H) TREATED A TOTAL OF 70 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(5) **SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT)** CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) BN COMD HELD A MEETING WITH RPA BN COMD IN KIBUNGO GR 6162. MEETING WAS SUCCESSFUL AND RPA BN COMD PROMISED TO SORT OUT PROBLEMS WITHIN THE PL LOC IN BARE GR 5348.

(C) MED STAFF ATTENDED TO NINE PERSONS WHO WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED IN TRAFFIC ACCIDENT AT KIBUNGO AND LATER TRANSFERRED THEM TO MSF HOSP.

(D) PATROL BASES AT KIBEHO AND MUNINI PROVIDED SY FOR THE EVAC A NUMBER OF IDPs FROM NDAGO GR 52561 TO BUTARE AND FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD BY UNHCR RESPECTIVELY DURING THE WEEK.

(E) AICF ACTIVITY IN GIKONGORO PREFECTURE WAS TERMINATED BY THE RPA.

(F) TPS AT RILIMA AND RUHUHA PROVIDED SY AND PROTECTION FOR RETURNEES IN SECTOR 2 PENDING THEIR REGISTRATION AND EVAC TO THEIR HOMES.

(6) **SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAMBATT)**. CONDUCTED PTLs, ESCORTS AND GUARD DUTIES IN AOR.

(A) PROVIDED SECURITY DURING REPATRIATION OF DPS AT CYANIKA DPC.

(B) A TOTAL OF 976 PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY MEDICAL STAFF DURING THE WEEK.

(7) **SECTOR 4B (FRAFATT)**. CONDUCTED PTLS, ESCORTS AND GUARD DUTIES IN AOR.

(A) DEPUTY CHIEF OF STAFF, SENEGALESE ARMED FORCES VISITED THE SECTOR AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE AND RPA BN COMD.

(B) ESCORTED ORPHANS FROM MUBUGA TO GISENYI VIA GITARAMA.

(C) PROVIDED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO 136 CIVILIANS DURING THE WEEK.

(8) **SECTOR 4C (EHTIOBATT)**. CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT MOBILE PTLS IN AOR.

(A) DEPLOYED TROOPS AT ICRC WAREHOUSE, KAMEMBE AIRPORT GR 7827, KIRAMBO GR 0444, NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP, MDM HOSPITAL AND GISAKURA TEA FACTORY.

(B) ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOYS CARRYING A TOTAL OF 1451 DPs FROM NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP TO KITABI GR 3520 DURING THE WEEK.

(B) REGIMENTAL MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED A TOTAL OF 1,433 CIVIL PATIENTS AT CLINIC DURING THE PERIOD.

(11) **MILOB GP HQ**. PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS WERE CARRIED OUT DURING THE PERIOD. ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO UNREO AND NGOS. EXCHANGE OF OLD RWANDESE CURRENCY TO NEW ONES TOOK PLACE WITHIN THE COUNTRY DURING THE PERIOD. RPA PROVIDED SY FOR THE MONEY CHANGING EXERCISE WITHIN THE WEEK.

(A) **POLITICAL**.

I. SUB-PREFECT AT RUHANGO SECTOR 3 ALLEGEDLY URGED LOCALS AT A PUBLIC MEETING NOT TO CO-OPERATE WITH UNAMIR.

II. EVEN THOUGH THE CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE HAS ENDED, IT APPEARS THAT MANY PEOPLE WERE UNABLE TO EXCHANGE THEIR OLD NOTES DUE TO SHORTAGES OF THE NEW CURRENCY.

(B) BORDERS. MOST OF THE BORDER POSTS WERE CLOSED DURING THE PERIOD.

(C) IN SECTOR 1 - BYUMBA. PTLs WERE CONDUCTED IN THE SECTOR AND NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(D) IN SECTOR 2 - KIBUNGO. PTLs WERE CONDUCTED IN THE SECTOR DURING THE WEEK.

I. SECTOR MILOBS PTLs COVERED RWAMAGANA GR 4784, KAYONZA GR 5886, KABARONDO GR 6270, RUKIRA GR 7557, RUSUMO GR 7548 AND BORDER AREAS. AT RUKIRA, THE BOURGEMESTRE REPORTED THAT BANDITS WERE CROSSING FROM TANZANIA TO STEAL BUILDING MATERIALS.

II. A SMALL CAMP OF RETURNEES FROM UGANDA WAS DISCOVERED IN KANYONGA. THERE WERE 35 CHILDREN AND 6 ADULTS. MOST OF THE CHILDREN WERE REPORTED TO BE ORPHANS OR UNACCOMPANIED. UNHCR AND UNREO OFFICIALS INFORMED.

(E) IN SECTOR 3 - GITARAMA. SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN AOR.

I. INVESTIGATED THE ALLEGED KILLINGS BY RPA RESULTING IN THE EXODUS OF ABOUT 700 PERS FROM MUGINA TO NEMBA SECTOR 5. LOCALS UNWILLING TO GIVE OUT INFO ON ISSUE. MILOBS MET BOURGEMESTRE OF MUGINA COMMUNE ON MENTIONED ISSUE. IT WAS DECIDED THAT MILOBS SHOULD BE PRESENT AT A CONFERENCE OF ALL RPA SECTOR HEADS ON 10 JAN 95 TO INVESTIGATE AND DISCUSS THE ALLEGATION. MILOBS NOW TAKING UP ISSUE WITH RPA BDE COMD AND GITARAMA PREFECT.

II. SECTOR HQ HOSTED CONFERENCE OF 15 NGOS OPERATING IN THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE. OPERATIONAL PROBLEMS OF NGOS AND NGOS COMPLAINTS OF OCCASIONAL HARASSMENT BY RPA TROOPS WERE DISCUSSED.

(F) **IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO.**

I. MILOBS INVESTIGATIONS OF ALLEGED KILLINGS AND ARRESTS AT GISHETA GR 4898 REVEALED THAT ON 02 JAN 95 AT 0600HRS, 21 RPA TPS ENTERED GISHETA AND KILLED ONE HABIMANA ANATOL, A FORMER RGF SOLDIER. THEY ALSO APPREHENDED THREE OTHER PERS. THE RPA TPS WENT AWAY WITH THE BODY AND THE ARRESTED PERS TO NYAKIZU GR 5796. THE RPA TPS WERE ACCOMPANIED BY THREE CIVS WHO POINTED OUT THE VICTIMS. LOCALS ALSO CONFIRMED THAT 4 BODIES WERE SEEN FLOATING IN THE AKAVUGUTE RIVER, SOUTH OF KAMANA. INVESTIGATION CONTINUES.

II. SECTOR MILOBS PATROLLED RUKONDO AND CYANIKA CAMPS AS PART OF OP RETOUR.

III. SECTOR MILOB PTLs COVERED NYAMIGINA DPs CAMP AND REPORTED INFLUX OF DPs INTO RWAMIKO CAMP FROM MGANDA, AND MBASI COMMUNES DUE TO INSECURITY IN THE COMMUNES.

(G) **IN SECTOR 4B - KIBUYE.**

I. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS WITHIN KIBUYE AND HAVE REPORTED THAT ALL DPs IN KIBUYE HAVE BEEN EVAC. THE LAST DPs WERE EVACUATED ON 02 JAN 95.

II. ESCORTED SECTOR HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM ESCORTED TO MUSHUBATI (3278) TO INVESTIGATE ALLEGED HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS.

(H) **IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU.** MILOBS CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

I. THE SECTOR WAS GENERALLY UNSTABLE DURING THE PERIOD DUE TO ACT OF BANDITRY BY ALLEGED FRGF TROOPS.

II. MILOBS INVESTIGATED ALLEGED DETENTION BY RPA OF 100 OUT OF 700 RETURNEES TO KIBUYE FROM CYANGUGU AND FOUND ALLEGATION BASELESS.

III. MILOBS HAVE COMPLETED THEIR INVESTIGATIONS INTO THE ALLEGED RPA KILLING OF MSF EMPLOYEE MR NARCISSE NGENDAHIMANA. IT HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED THROUGH A TESTIMONY BY THE REMAINING VICTIM, MR PASCAL NYAMISHABA THAT THE TWO EMPLOYEES WERE ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS ON PATROL AND WERE ACCUSED OF

VIOLATING A CURFEW. THEY WERE THEN TAKEN TO A RESIDENCE WHERE THEY WERE SEVERELY BEATEN WITH RIFLE BUTTS AND STONES, FOR APPROX 30 MINUTES. THEY WERE LATER TAKEN TO AN RPA CAMP LOCATED 500M FROM MSF CAMP. ON THE WAY, ONE VICTIM FAILED TO WALK AND THEY SHOT HIM DEAD. THE REMAINING VICTIM WAS HELD OVERNIGHT IN A ROOM AND LATER RELEASED THE FOLLOWING DAY AFTER INTERVENTION BY ONE RPA OFFICER.

(I) **IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.**

I. SECTOR MILOBS PATROLS COVERED GISENYI AND BORDER POSTS, RUHENGARI, CYANIKA GR 7152, KIDAHU GR 7047, BUTARO GR 8244 AND CYERU GR 8135. SIT CALM IN AREAS PATROLLED.

II. MILOBS PROVIDED ESCORT FOR TRUCKS CONVEYING ORPHANS FROM MUBUGA, SOUTH OF KIBUYE TO GISENYI AND CONDUCTED A JOINT INVESTIGATION OF ALLEGED KILLINGS IN MUTURA (3323) WITH SECTOR HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM.

IV. INVESTIGATION WERE ALSO CONDUCTED IN MUTURA GR 3323, MOTOVU GR 2929 WHERE ALLEGED KILLINGS WERE EARLIER REPORTED. INVESTIGATION IS STILL IN PROGRESS. RPA IS REPORTED TO BE CARRYING OUT A SEPARATE INVESTIGATION ON THE KILLINGS.

(J) **IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI.** CONDUCTED PTLs WITHIN SECTOR. RPA USHERED IN THE NEW YEAR WITH SMALL ARMS FIRE IN THE AIR.

I. MILOBS PATROLLED THE CITY, NDERA AND RUBUNGO COMMUNES. PTLs VISITED THE ORPHANAGE RUN BY THE GOVT WITH THE HELP OF GERMAN EMERGENCY DOCTORS. 201 ORPHANS WERE IN THE HOME AND CONDITIONS WERE GOOD.

II. OTHER MILOB TEAMS ALSO PATROLLED THE RUGENGE AND GATSATA AREAS TO MONITOR THE PROGRESS OF THE SCHOOLS IN THE AREA. UNICEF IS REPORTED TO BE PROVIDING BOOKS AND TRAINING FOR THE TEACHERS IN MOST OF THE SCHOOLS, HOWEVER SHORTAGES OF STATIONERY AND FURNITURE ARE STILL REPORTED.

(12) **AUSMED** THE SPT FORCE PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(A) OPS RITUAL RECCE COMMENCED ON 02 JAN 95,

VISITED THE TAC HQ, KIBEHO AND CYANIKA. MEETING WITH NGOS TO CONCERN FIRST AID POINT AND ESCORT PARTIES DEPARTED BYUMBA AND GITARAMA TO ASSIST WITH DELIVERY OF ITEMS TO RWANDA AUTHORITIES.

(B) FOUR AUSMED VEHS AND DRIVERS INVOLVED WITH RPA IN NEW CURRENCY DISTRIBUTION TASKS TO KIBUNGO AND BUTARE.

(C) CONDUCTED AME FOR 6 RWANDA CIVILIANS WHO RECEIVED BLASTS AND GUNSHOT WOUNDS FROM AN ATTACK BY THE RPA AT BUSANZE GR 435920. SIX SERIOUSLY WOUNDED. PATIENTS ADMITTED TO OUR FAC. IN ADDITION WE EVAC 4 OTHER PERS TO BN HOSP.

(D) MED SCREENING TEAM AND PROTECTIVE ELEMENT VISITED CYANIKA CAMP IN SPT OF OP RETOUR. PROVIDED MEDICAL SCREENING DURING THE PERIOD.

(E) TREATED A TOTAL OF 356 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 33 DENTAL PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD.

(13) 1 CDHSR.

(A) THE REGT CONTINUED PREPARING FOR DEPARTURE. WORK IS PRESENTLY BEING DONE TO PREPARE THE STADIUM FOR ITS RETURN TO THE GOVERNMENT.

(B) PROVIDED 5 VEHS TO ASSIST THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTE NEW CURRENCY.

(C) SIGNALS SQN. LMN ASSISTED FD SVC IN CONDUCTING A LINE RECCE AT THE PROPOSED LOCATION FOR UNAMIR HQ. CONDUCTED A HF LINK TEST BETWEEN SECTOR HQs AND KIGALI. TEST WAS SUCCESSFUL.

(14) AIR OPS. THE SITUATION AT THE AIRPORT REMAINS CALM.

(A) NORMAL MOVEMENT OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL CONTINUES. HOWEVER RPA HAS TIGHTENED SECURITY ON MOV OF VEHICLE INCLUDING UNAMIR VEHS GOING INTO AIRPORT TO PICK UP SUPPLIES. NGOS STILL CONTINUE TO ROUTE SOME RELIEF SUPPLIES THROUGH KIA THOUGH FACING DIFFICULTIES IN CLEARANCE DUE TO THE CLOSE SCRUTINY BY CUSTOMS.

(A) A TOTAL OF 37 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

(15) UN MP COY

(A) ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED IN THE KIGALI

AREA AND SECURITY SITUATION WAS NORMAL. HOWEVER A TOTAL OF 5 MALES WERE ARRESTED FOR UNAUTHORISED ENTRY INTO UNAMIR PROPERTY.

(B) MR ELISAFANCE MAJAMBERE STILL UNDER PROTECTION OF MP COY.

4. **UNCIVPOL**

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE SECTORS.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL OBSERVERS TEAMS IN THE COUNTRY OBSERVED INTENSIFIED DAY AND NIGHT FOOT AND MOBILE PATROL BY RPA.

C. A REPORT CAME FROM UNAMIR CIVPOL OBSERVERS TEAM IN SECTOR 6, KIGALI STATING THAT:

(1) THE PUBLIC PROSECUTOR OF KIGALI MR. FRANCOIS NSANZUWERE DISCLOSED THAT KIGALI PRISON HAD 6,081 INMATES. 1,338 OF THIS FIGURE (6,081) HAVE ALREADY BEEN INTERROGATED. HE SAID THOSE NOT IMPLICATED BY HARD EVIDENCE WILL BE RELEASED. HE CALLED FOR LOGISTICAL ASSISTANCE FROM UNAMIR AND OTHER HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES.

(2) THE DEATH TOLL IN KIGALI PRISON IS ON AVERAGE OF 1 TO 5 ON A DAILY BASIS AND THAT STARVATION IS ROOT CAUSE.

5. **HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES**. IOM/UNHCR TRANSPORTED IDPS FROM VARIOUS DP CAMPS TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES IN KIGALI AND SECTOR 2. ALSO PARTICIPATED IN OP RETOUR.

6. **CIVIL AFFAIRS**. NTR.

7. **LOGISTICS**.

A. **SUPPLY**. THE MOVE TO TRAFIPRO WAREHOUSE WILL COMMENCE THIS WEEK. THE SITE WILL PROVIDE FOR 3 UNDERGROUND FUEL STORAGE TANKS WHICH WILL BE USED TO CONDUCT TRUCK AND CONVOY REFUELLING. THE MAIN WATER POINT WILL BE RELOCATED THERE.

B. **FOOD**. DISTRIBUTION OF 7 DAYS RESERVE OF BOTTLED WATER TO CONTINGENTS HAS BEEN COMPLETED.

C. **TRANSPORT**. AS PER 25 - 31 DEC WEEKLY SITREP.

D. **MAINTENANCE**. AS PER 25 - 31 DEC WEEKLY SITREP.

8. **CASUALTIES**. NIL.

9. **TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS**. A TOTAL 6 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHS WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD WITH ONE MINOR AND ONE FATAL INJURY. BOTH INJURIES WERE SUSTAINED BY NON UNAMIR PERS.

10. **CONCLUSION**. THE SHOOTING INCIDENT AT BUSANZE, IN WHICH 14 PEOPLE WERE KILLED AND OVER 30 INJURED HAS SERIOUSLY DAMAGED THE CONFIDENCE OF THE DP POPULATION IN THE RPA, REGARDING THEIR ABILITY TO PROVIDE SECURITY BOTH IN THE DP CAMPS AND IN THE HOME COMMUNES. THE RPA IS ADVISED NOT TO REPEAT THE BUZANZE INCIDENT IF THE TRUST OF DPs IN SECTOR 4A IS TO BE REGAINED.

DAILY SITREP FOR 09 JAN 95

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. AUSMED REPORTED THAT IN CYANIKA APPROX 100 IDPs GOT ON OP RETOUR TRUCKS DUE TO FEARS FOR THEIR SAFETY IN HOME COMMUNES AND AVAILABILITY OF FOOD IN NEIGHBOURING CAMPS.

B. IN KIGALI, A UNAMIR HELI AND CREW PLUS PASSENGERS WAS DETAINED FOR 2 HRS 30 MINUTES FROM 1530 HRS LOCAL TIME AT THE AIRPORT FOR FLYING TOO CLOSE TO THE PRESIDENTIAL PALACE IN KIGALI. HOWEVER AT 1800 HRS, THE HELI AND CREW PLUS PASSENGERS WERE RELEASED.

C. MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA TROOPS IN SECTOR 2 REPORTEDLY ATTACKED A FAMILY OF ABOUT 20 PEOPLE IN KIDOGO GR 2662 AROUND 1700 HRS ON 9 JAN 95. TWO MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY WERE ARRESTED ON CHARGES OF BEING INTERHAMWE BUT LATER MANAGED TO ESCAPE. THE FAMILY IS CURRENTLY UNDER THE PROTECTION OF UNAMIR TROOPS IN RELIMA. GHANBATT PATROL SENT TO THE AREA ON RECEIPT OF THE REPORT REPORTED THE AREA CALM. MILOBS AND GHANBATT TROOPS CONDUCTING INVESTIGATIONS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. NTR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA.

(1) IN SECTOR 3 MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA IN NYABISINDU COMMUNE ARRESTED ONE RETURNEE ON ALLEGATIONS OF BEING FORMER INTERAHMWE. MATTER HAS BEEN REFERRED TO SECTOR 3 HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM FOR INVESTIGATION.

(2) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS SHOT AND KILLED A 42 YR OLD MAN IN RUGARAGIA GR 8239 IN HIS HOUSE WHEN HE REFUSED TO OPEN THE DOOR TO HIS ROOM FOR HIS ARREST. THE MAN WAS ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN AN AGITATOR IN A REFUGEE CAMP IN ZAIRE. HE WAS KILLED BY SHOTS FIRED AT HIS DOOR. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT IN KAZUNGU GR 8434. AN RPA SOLDIER ROBBED A MAN OF 2,000 RWANDESE FRANCS AND THEN KILLED HIM.

(3) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4A HAVE REPORTED THAT UNCONFIRMED REPORTS INDICATE THAT RPA TROOPS HAVE ASSAULTED SOME OF THE DPS IN NDAGO CAMP AND ORDERED THEM TO RETURN HOME. THERE IS A REPORTED GENERAL RELUCTANCE AMONG THE DPS IN NDAGO TO LEAVE THE CAMPS. SECTOR 4A MILOBS INVESTIGATING.

(4) IN SECTOR 4A NORTH, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED TWO LOCALS IN RUKONDO GR 5538 FOR CATTLE RUSTLING.

(5) IN SECTOR 4A SOUTH, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT SOME RPA SOLDIERS CAME TO THE NEW DP CAMP SITE AT RUNYOMBI GR 4792 TO QUESTION THE ERECTION OF TENTAGE FOR THE DPS. THEY ORDERED THE GHANBATT TPS TO STOP. WHEN THE OC QUESTIONED THEIR REASONS, THE RPA COMD SAID "MILLIONS OF PEOPLE HAVE DIED IN RWANDA, AND SO IF ONE PERSON DIES, IT DOES NOT MEAN THAT THE HEAVENS SHOULD COME DOWN".

(6) IN SECTOR 4B, MILOBS REPORTED THAT TWO RETURNEES WERE ARRESTED BY RPA IN GISOVU AND NIBWOBURYO FOR STEALING. ANOTHER RETURNEE WAS ALSO ARRESTED ON A CHARGE OF BEING INTERAHMWE. BOURGEMESTRE OF GISOVU COMMUNE HAS CONFIRMED THE ARRESTS.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED TODAY. THE FC RECEIVED THE VISIT OF CANADIAN CDS ON SUNDAY AND DISCUSSED THE CURRENT AND FUTURE PARTICIPATION CANADIAN TROOPS WITH UNAMIR. TODAY HE HAD THE VISIT OF MR URASSA FROM UNHCR TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON REFUGEE REPATRIATION.

(2) OP RETOUR. A TOTAL OF 223 DPs WERE EVACUATED FROM CYANIKA AND NDAGO DPs CAMPS ON 9 JAN 95. THE DPs WERE DESTINED FOR KIGALI AND KIBUNGO AREAS.

TOTAL NUMBER OF DPs MOVED SINCE THE BEGINNING OF OP RETOUR IS 7,375.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). PATROL TEAM CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT PATROLS AND MAINTAIN SECURITY IN OWN AOR.

(1) EVAC 120 DPs FROM KIGITUMBA GR 504822 TO VARIOUS LOCATIONS. 500 DPs STILL AWAITING EVAC. DPs REQUIRE MED ASSISTANCE FROM NGOS AS THEY ARE SUFFERING FROM VARIOUS COMMUNICABLE DISEASES. 127 LOCALS TREATED AT MED CENTRE.

(2) GATUNA BORDER POST IS NOW OFFICIALLY OPEN.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY) CONDUCTED PTLs TO RUKIRA GR 6613, RAMBA GR 5514 AND NYARUNAZI GR 7798 DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) PTLs TO RUKIRA (6613) INDICATED THAT LOCALS FROM ABYAZA (6813) HAVE BEEN COMING TO RUKIRA TO DESTROY UNOCCUPIED HOUSES TO PREVENT RETURNEES FROM SETTLING DOWN IN THE COMMUNE. IT HAS ALSO BEEN OBSERVED THAT, MOST OF THE RETURNEES TO THE AREA ARE COMPELLED BY LACK OF ACCN TO GO BACK TO THE DP CAMPS. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(2) PTLs SENT TO RAMBA REPORTED THAT THE ONLY PROBLEM FACING THE LOCALS WAS SHORTAGE FOOD AID. RELIEF AGENCIES OPERATING IN SECTOR 3 INFORMED.

(3) AT NYARUNAZI PTLs REPORTED THAT MOST OF THE INHABITANTS OF THE AREA HAVE RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES. THE PATROL WAS HOWEVER DENIED ACCESS TO THE COMMUNE HQ BY RPA AT GR 768986.

(4) ESCORTED UNHCR PERS TO BUYENZI IDP CAMP.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED PTL AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) 83 DPs ARRIVED AT SAKI ORC GR 4454 ON 09 JAN 95 ON OP RETOUR.

(3) IN RUNYOMBI GR 4893 DPs HAVE BEEN MOBILISED TO CONSTRUCT ACCESS ROADS, CULVERTS AND TENTAGE FOR THE DPs FROM BUSANZE GR 9145.

(4) BN COMD ORGANISED NEW YEAR PARTY FOR THE ORPHANS AT THE ORPHANAGE CENTRE AT KIBUNGO. THE BN BAND WAS IN ATTENDANCE.

(5) 68 PERSONS ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH RUSUMO BORDER POST TODAY.

(6) LOCALS AT KABERE II GR 0351 RAN AWAY AS GHANBATT PTL TEAM APPROACHED THE TOWN DUE TO REPORTED RPA HARASSMENT. THE PTL REASSURED THE LOCALS AND INFORMED THEM THAT THERE WOULD BE REGULAR UNAMIR PTLs IN THE AREA.

(7) RPA SOLDIERS AT MUHAZI GR 4590 VISITED C COY HQ AT GISHALI GR 4788 AND DISCUSSED SY WITHIN THE COMMUNE WITH THE GHANBATT OC. THE RPA SOLDIERS ALSO PROMISED TO LIFT THEIR RESTRICTIONS ON MOVEMENT OF UNAMIR PERS THROUGH THEIR ROAD BLOCKS.

(8) IOM, UNHCR AND ICRC REPS VISITED A COY LOCATION RUNYOMBI TO ASSIST IN RESETTLING THE DPs FROM BUSANZE.

(10) CANADIAN CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF PAID A WORKING VISIT TO HIS TROOPS AT GIKONGORO.

F. SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAMBATT). CONTINUED WITH PTLs AND PROVISION OF GUARD IN AOR.

(1) PROVIDED SECURITY FOR REPATRIATION OF 180 DPs AT CYANIKA DP CAMP FOR OP RETOUR.

(2) A TOTAL OF 95 LOCALS WERE TREATED BY MEDICAL TEAMS IN MUKO AND KADUHA.

G. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT. 27 PEOPLE RECEIVED MEDICAL CARE AT FRAFBATT.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOY OF 31 DPs PROCEEDING TO BUTARE FROM NYAGATARE UP TO KITABI GR 3520. TRANSPORTED 35 REFUGEES FROM RUSIZI-1 GR 7624 TO NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP. BN COMD VISITED GISHOMA, BUGARAMA, SHARA AND NDERA TO ASSESS THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR. MANAGERESS OF NEMBA ORPHANAGE GR 7619 REPORTED OF AN ATTACK WITH GRENS ON AN ORPHANAGE NEAR RUHENGARI COMMUNE GR 5634 ON NIGHT OF 04 JAN 95. TREATED 258 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT). CONDUCTED PTLS AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) RMO TREATED 293 LOCAL CIVIL PATIENTS AT OWN CLINIC.

(2) 358 IDPs DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO NGENDA, KIBUNGO, RUHENGARI AND BUTARE. 502 IDPs REMAINING IN THE CAMP.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. A LARGE NUMBER OF THE POPULATION ARE REPORTED TO BE STILL HOLDING LARGE AMOUNTS OF OLD CURRENCY DUE TO THEIR INABILITY TO CHANGE THEM DURING THE CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE. THERE ARE NO PLANS AS OF NOW TO EXTEND THE PERIOD FOR THE EXCHANGE OF OLD CURRENCY.

(7) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS PATROLLED NDAGO AND CYANIKA CAMPS AS PART OF OP RETOUR. 223 DPS WERE TRANSPORTED FROM BOTH CAMPS TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.

(A) SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN GISHYITA (GR 2161), MUBUGA (GR 2463I), RWAMATAMU (GR 1656) AND GISOVU.

(B) THE PATROL TO GISOVU WAS ACCOMPANIED BY SECTOR HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS TO INVESTIGATE THE ALLEGED RPA ARRESTS OF RETURNEES.

(C) HOSPITAL IN MABANZA COMMUNE IS REPORTED TO BE RUNNING OUT OF DRUGS FOR THE TREATMENT OF TUBERCULOSIS. IN THE SAME SECTOR AN NGO CRWRC DISTRIBUTED 3200 HOES TO LOCALS IN RWAMATAMU COMMUNE.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR DURING THE PERIOD. TWO EMPLOYEES OF CARE SUSTAINED INJURIES WHEN SOME UNIFORMED BANDITS FIRED INDISCRIMINATELY ON THEIR HOUSE IN BUKAVO. MILOBS CONDUCTING INVESTIGATIONS.

(10) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) CANADIAN CDS AND ENTOURAGE VISITED THE SECTOR HQ. THEY WERE RECEIVED AND BRIEFED BY SEC COMD. THE CDS ALSO VISITED THE DPCS AND REFUGEE PROCESSING CENTRES IN GISENYI.

(C) MILOBS ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOY OF 276 REFUGEES FROM GISENYI TO MUKAMIRA (GR 5129) AND NGORONGERO (6059).

SUBJECTS DISCUSSED INCLUDED POPULATION FIGURES AND THE SHORTAGE AND POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS TO THE SUPPLY OF SOCIAL AMENITIES AND ESSENTIAL SERVICES. THE PROGRESS OF AGRICULTURAL ACTIVITIES WAS ALSO DISCUSSED. THE GENERAL DIRECTOR OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE PROMISED TO PROVIDE MILOBS WITH HIS PLANS FOR THE YEAR.

(1) AT ABOUT 2140 HRS, 9 JAN 95 UN MP PATROL ATTENDED THE SCENE OF A FIRE IN THE VICINITY OF THE INDBATT COMPOUND, KIGALI, RWANDA. FIRE WAS LOCATED WITHIN A CIVILIAN RESIDENCE NEAR THE UN COMPOUND AND WAS CAUSED WHEN THE OCCUPANT OF THE RESIDENCE POURED KEROSENE ON A BURNING LAMP. NO DAMAGE TO UN PROPERTY AND NO INJURIES TO UN PERSONNEL.

(2) UN MP COY ARE STILL PROVIDING CLOSE PROTECTION AT AMAHORO STADIUM.

(3) ROUTINE PATROLS BEING CONDUCTED THROUGHOUT THE KIGALI AREA.

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE SECTORS.

B. SECURITY DUTIES AND PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED BY CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN THE SECTORS.

D. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IS STILL IN PROGRESS.

7. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES.

A. OP RETOUR CONTINUED. A TOTAL OF 223 DPs WERE EVAC FROM CYANIKA AND NDAGO DP CAMP. AID AGENCIES IN THE CAMPS AND IN BUTARE ARE UNABLE TO CONFIRM THE REASON FOR THE POOR TURNOUT IN THE CAMPS. THEY SUSPECT THAT THE IDPs HAVE HEARD ABOUT THE INCIDENT AT BUSANZE.

B. OP RETOUR WILL CONTINUE TOMORROW AT CYANIKA AND NDAGO HOWEVER IF THE TURNOUT IS AGAIN POOR, UNREO WILL SHIFT THE TRANSPORT ASSETS TO RUKONDO CAMP AND TRANSPORT DPs TO COMMUNES WHERE ORCs ARE SET UP AND RUNNING.

C. HAC AND UNREO REPS ATTENDED A MEETING AT SECTOR 3 HQ GITARAMA TO DISCUSS THE ARRIVAL OF DPs TO GITARAMA PREFECTURE FROM RUKONDO. OPERATIONS SHOULD BE ABLE TO COMMENCE THURSDAY OR FRIDAY. TWO OF THE FOUR ORCs IN THIS AREA ARE SET UP. HAC REP CONFIRMED SECTOR 3 SECURITY PLAN FOR COMMUNES AND ORCs IN THEIR AREA. SECURITY ORDER IS BEING FOLLOWED.

RPA VEH WAS FOUND TO BE AT FAULT FOR THE ACCIDENT AND WAS TOTALLY DAMAGED. ACCIDENT OCCURRED AS A RESULT OF THE RPA VEH CROSSING THE CENTRE LINE AT A HIGH SPEED AND HITTING THE UNAMIR VEH HEAD ON. NO INJURIES SUSTAINED BY EITHER PARTY.

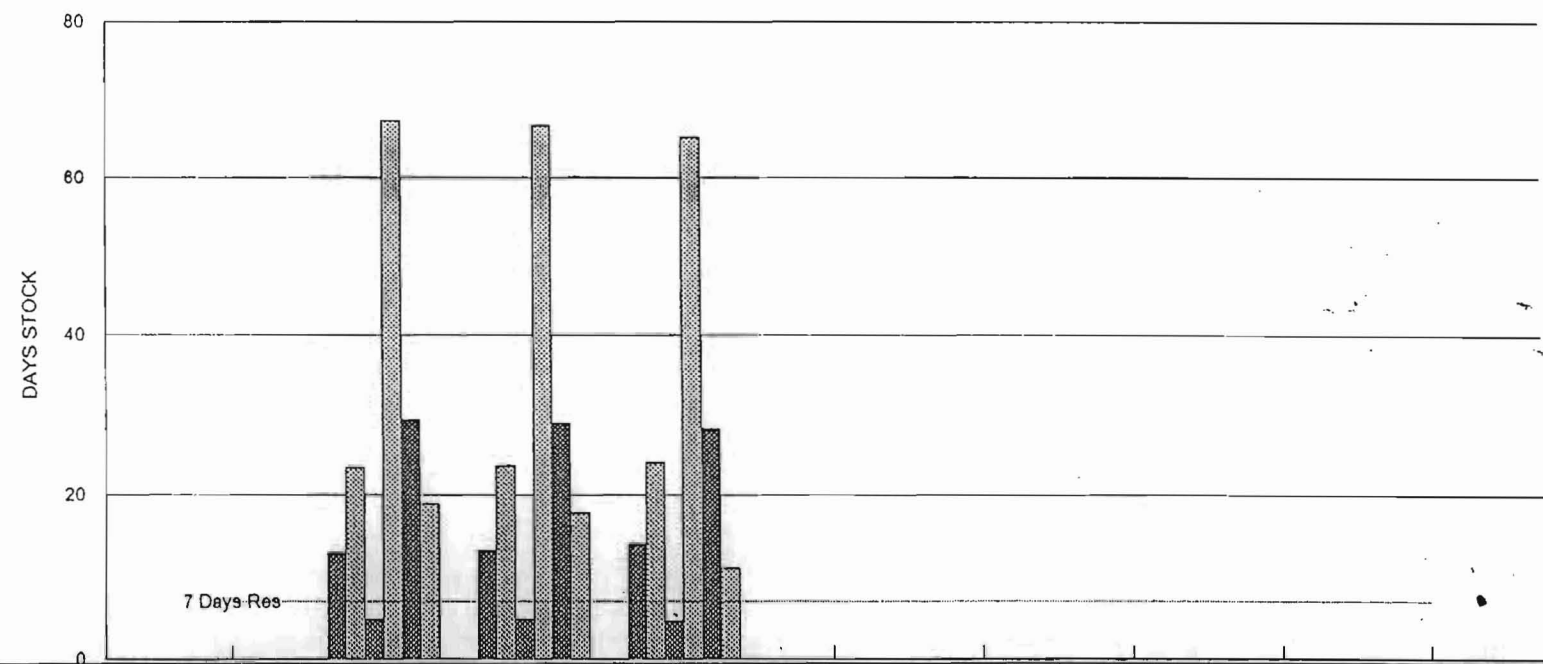

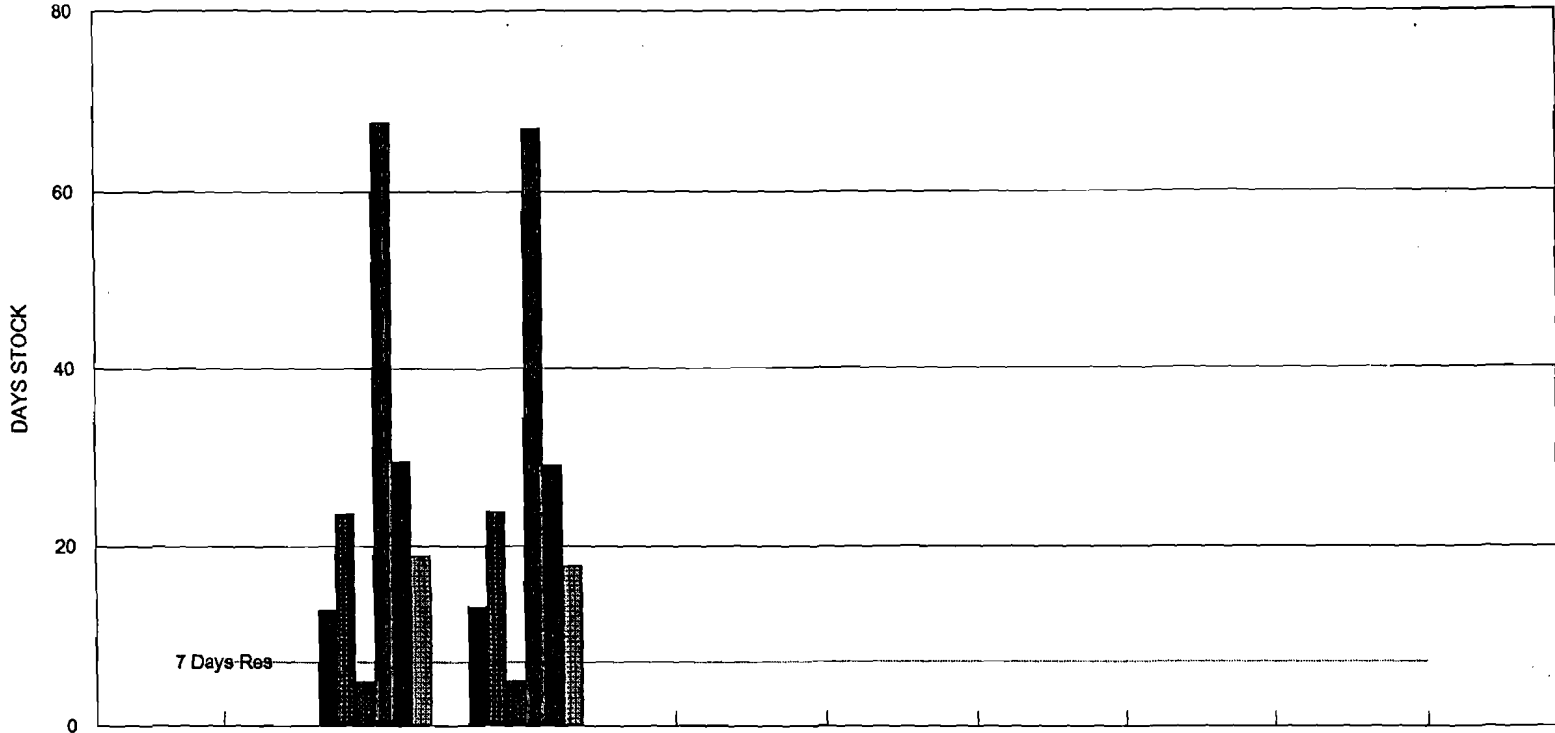

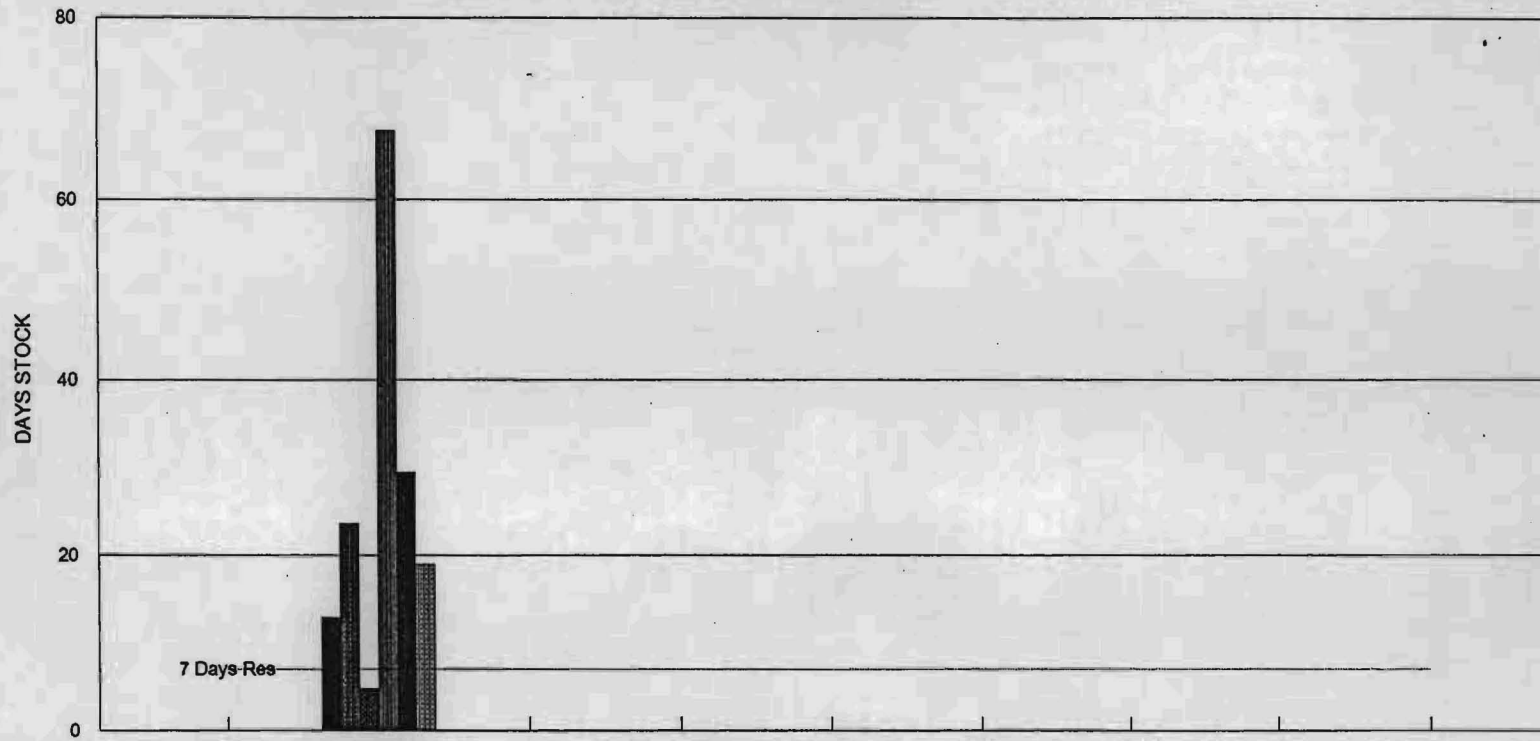

A. TUNBATT REPORTED THAT A MASS GRAVE WITH ABOUT 300 CORPSES HAS BEEN LOCATED AT MUHANGA GR 4500. THE GRAVE DATES BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

B. GHANBATT REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 06/07 JAN 95 RPA TROOPS ENTERED BUSANZE IDP CAMP GR 4491 AND OPENED FIRE RESULTING IN FEW DEATHS AND INJURIES TO MANY. EARLIER, RPA HAD WARNED THE IDPs TO VACATE THE CAMP AS THEY SUSPECTED PRESENCE OF RGF/MILITIA AND BURUNDI NATIONALS IN CAMP. PARA 1A OF OUR SITREP AT 31 DEC 94 REFERS. HUMAN RIGHTS AND A MED TEAM HAVE BEEN DESPATCHED TO THE MENTIONED LOC TO INVESTIGATE THE INCIDENT AND TO GIVE FIRST AID TO THE WOUNDED RESPECTIVELY. FURTHER DETAILS FOLLOW.

(2) ONE MADAM MUKASINE DIDACIENNE FROM GIKONGORO REPORTED TO GHANBATT TAC HQ THAT HER HUSBAND MR MURUMRANEZA BONIFACE A WORKER OF AICF WAS TAKEN AWAY BY 2 RPA ARMED SOLDIERS AND A CIVILIAN AT ABOUT 062300B JAN 95 FROM THEIR HOUSE AT GIKONGORO. INVESTIGATION ON GOING WITH THE LOCAL GENDARMERIE COMD.

B. **FRGF.** AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE TOOK PLACE BETWEEN RPA TROOPS AND TROOPS BELIEVED TO BE FRGF TROOPS NEAR RUZIZI I BORDER GR 9001 BETWEEN 0200 HRS AND 0300 HRS ON 6 JAN 95. INCIDENT OCCURRED WHEN A UNIFORMED PERSON OPENED FIRE WHEN CHALLENGED BY RPA AT THE BORDER. RPA RETURNED FIRE. SPORADIC AUTOMATIC FIRE WAS FIRED FROM THE ZAIRIAN SIDE TOWARD THE RPA. THE UNIFORMED PERSON FIRED AT BY RPA WAS SEEN FALLING INTO THE RIVER.

(2) PATROL BASE AT KIBEHO PROVIDED SY AT KIBEHO AND NDAGO DP CAMPS DURING FOOD DISTR BY ICRC AND EVAC OF 312 IDPs TO BUTARE RESPECTIVELY.

(3) 491 IDPs ARRIVED NGENDA GR 0644. ALL EXCEPT 75 DEPARTED HOME AFTER REGISTRATION. GHANBATT TPS PROVIDED SY TO THE REMAINING IDPs AT THE COMMUNE OFFICE.

F. SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAMBATT). CONDUCTED SECURITY AND PATROL DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) PROVIDED SECURITY TO CARE INTERNATIONAL IN GARA GR 5536 AND TRUCKS FOR OP RETOUR AT CYANIKA DURING REPATRIATION OF 1185 IDPs TO BUTARE. 138 LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL AID FROM MED TEAMS.

G. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR AND NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT. 48 PEOPLE RECEIVED MEDICAL CARE AT FRAFBATT.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. ESCORTED A UNHCR CONVOY OF 374 IDPs TO BUTARE AND KITABI GR 3520 FROM NYAGATARE AND MURURU.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR. ONE MAN REPORTED TO TUNBATT THAT HIS SON HAS BEEN MISSING SINCE 01 JAN 95. HE BELIEVES HIS SON HAS BEEN ABDUCTED BY UNKNOWN PERSONS. A MASS GRAVE WITH ABOUT 300 CORPSES HAS BEEN LOCATED AT MUHANDA GR 4500. MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 93 LOCALS.

J. SECTOR 6 (INDBATT). CONTINUED CONDUCTING DAY AND NIGHT

VEHICLE PATROLS AND ESCORT DUTIES TO BROWN AND ROOT CONVOYS. 494 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP. 400 HAVE BEEN DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO ORCs AND HOME COMMUNES. 976 IDPs ARE STILL IN NDERA CAMP. RMO TREATED 238 LOCALS.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. NTR.

(2) BORDERS. SOME BORDERS REMAINED CLOSED. GISENYI/GOMA BORDER POST WAS PARTIALLY OPEN FOR REFUGEES, EXPATRIATE STAFF AND OTHER FOREIGNERS BUT NOT FOR ROUTINE TRAFFIC.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR AND NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN GASHORA, RELIMA, KANZENZE, RUTETE GR 2242, NTARAMA, KIBUNGO, RUSUMO AND NGENDA GR 0644. SITUATION WAS REPORTED NORMAL. HELI RECCE WAS ALSO CONDUCTED ALONG BURUNDI-TANZANIA BORDER. NO CROSSINGS WERE OBSERVED, HOWEVER AN UNAUTHORISED CROSSING POINT WAS SITED AT GR 4445.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA.

(A) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN NYAKIZU AND GISHAMVU GR 6505. THE SITUATION WAS REPORTED CALM. RETURNEES WERE REPORTED TO BE SETTling INTO THEIR HOME COMMUNES WITH MINIMUM PROBLEMS.

(B) MILOBS MET THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA AND SUB-PREFECT OF RUHANGO TO DISCUSS THE ALLEGATION THAT THE SUB-PREFECT OF RUHANGO HAD ASKED LOCALS NOT TO COOPERATE WITH UNAMIR. THE ISSUE WAS AMICABLY RESOLVED AT THE MEETING.

(7) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. CONDUCTED PTLs WITHIN AOR.

(A) TEAM TOOK PART IN OP RETOUR. THEY COVERED RWAMIKO AND KIBEHO AND REPORTED THE SITUATION TO BE CALM. THE TEAM ALSO REPORTED THAT THERE IS INFLUX OF DPs FROM RWANIKO TO KIBEHO. ABOUT 100 TO 150 PEOPLE ARRIVED AND CLAIMED KIBEHO DP CAMP WAS SAFER THAN RWAMIKO.

(B) MILOBS ESCORTED SECTOR HUMAN RIGHTS PERSONNEL TO RUTSIRO GR 3182 TO VISIT INMATES AT THE PRISON.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. CONDUCTED PTL WITHIN AOR.

SECTOR MILOBS MONITORED HELI EVACUATION OF 11 SICK ORPHANS FROM KIBUYE TO GISENYI.

(9) **IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.**

(A) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED GENERALLY UNSTABLE DURING THE PERIOD. THIS WAS DUE TO THREATS OF ROBBERY RECEIVED FROM BANDITS. THERE IS A SEVERE SHORTAGE OF NEW CURRENCY IN THE SECTOR. THIS IMPLIES THAT MANY PEOPLE WERE UNABLE TO EXCHANGE THEIR OLD CURRENCY. THERE IS HOWEVER A REAL THREAT OF ROBBERY FOR THOSE WHO MANAGED TO EXCHANGE THEIR OLD CURRENCY, ESPECIALLY FOR THE NGOS AT BUSHENGE HOSPITAL. IT IS ALSO THOUGHT THAT THE ATTEMPTED INCURSIONS BY BOAT INTO THE SECTOR MAY HAVE BEEN FOR THE PURPOSES OF INSERTING OLD CURRENCY AND NOT TO ACHIEVE MILITARY ENDS.

(B) MILOBS PROVIDED TRANSPORTATION FOR THE EVACUATION OF SICK PERSONS IN BUGARAMA TO THE HOSPITAL.

(C) MILOBS COORDINATED AND HOSTED THE D/DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RIGHTS TO RWANDA AND SPECIAL INVESTIGATION TEAM. SOME MILOBS WERE INTERVIEWED BY THE HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM FOR INFORMATION ON TRIBUNAL DOCUMENTATION.

(E) MILOBS INVESTIGATED REPORTS THAT 100 OUT 700 RETURNEES TO KIBUYE FROM CYANGUGU WERE DETAINED BY RPA TROOPS. AS AT 061500B JAN 95, NO PERSONS OUT OF THE MENTIONED GROUP HAD BEEN DETAINED.

(F) MILOBS HAVE COMPLETED THEIR INVESTIGATIONS INTO THE ALLEGED RPA KILLING OF MSF EMPLOYEE MR NARCISSE NGENDAHIMANA. IT HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED THROUGH A TESTIMONY BY THE REMAINING VICTIM, MR PASCAL NYAMISHABA THAT THE TWO EMPLOYEES WERE ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS ON PATROL AND ACCUSED OF VIOLATING A CURFEW. THEY WERE THEN TAKEN TO A RESIDENCE WHERE THEY WERE SEVERELY BEATEN WITH RIFLE BUTTS AND STONES, FOR APPROX 30 MINUTES. THEY WERE LATER TAKEN TO AN RPA CAMP LOCATED 500M FROM MSF CAMP. ON THE WAY, ONE VICTIM FAILED TO WALK AND THEY SHOT HIM DEAD. THE REMAINING VICTIM WAS HELD OVERNIGHT IN A ROOM AND LATER RELEASED THAT FOLLOWING DAY AFTER INTERVENTION BY ONE RPA OFFICER.

(10) **IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.** CONDUCTED PTL WITHIN AOR.

(A) LOCALS OF CIFUMBA GR 5243, NYABITSINDE GR 5042, BANNISIGU GR 4638 AND BISATE GR 4640 HAVE COMPLAINED OF FREQUENT CATTLE RUSTLING BY BANDITS.

(B) INVESTIGATION WERE ALSO CONDUCTED IN MUTURA GR 3323, MOTOVU GR 2929 WHERE ALLEGED KILLINGS WERE EARLIER REPORTED. INVESTIGATION IS STILL IN PROGRESS. RPA IS REPORTED TO BE CARRYING OUT A SEPARATE INVESTIGATION ON THE KILLINGS.

(11) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. CONDUCTED PTL WITHIN AOR. MONEY EXCHANGE EXERCISE WAS STILL IN PROGRESS IN THE AREAS PATROLLED. HOWEVER SOME LOCAL COMPLAINED OF RESTRICTIONS ON THEIR MOVEMENT BY RPA TROOPS ESPECIALLY AT NIGHT.

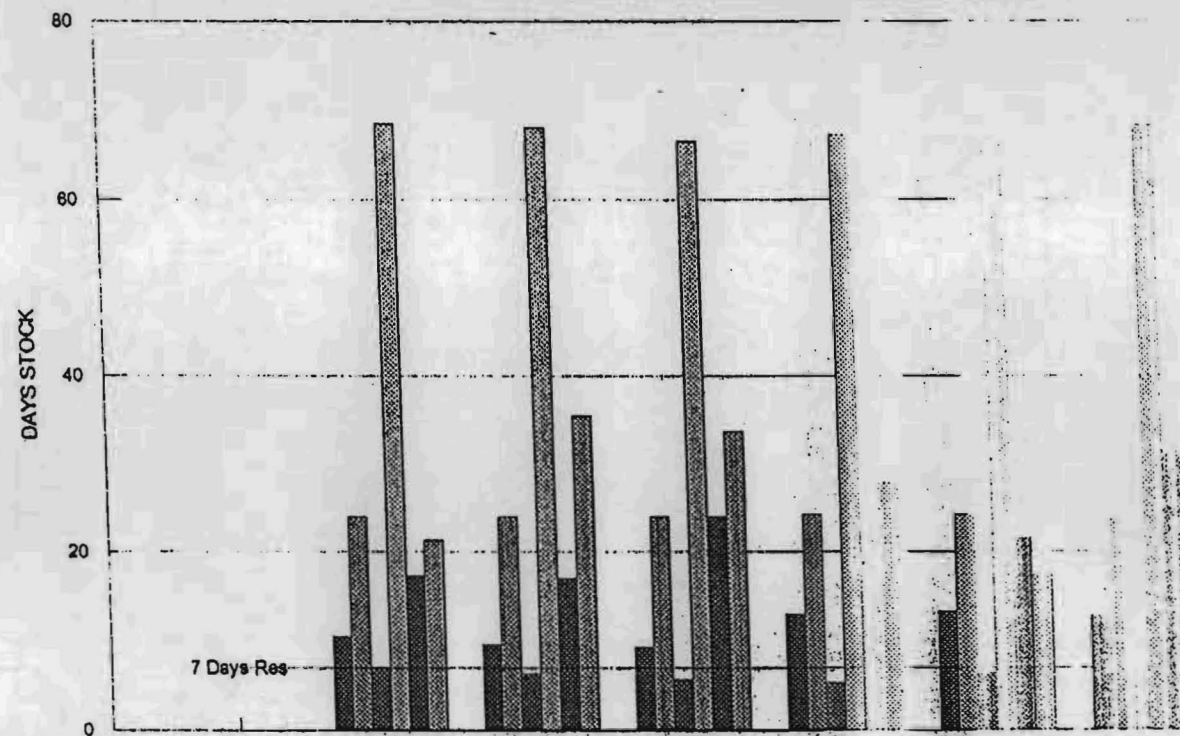

PRESENT WERE GHANBATT OPS OFFR, PREFECT OF GIKONGORO AND RPA BN 2IC IN GIKONGORO.

(9) **IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.** THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. POPULATION WAS HOWEVER REPORTED TO BE VERY UNEASY DUE TO SHOOTING INCIDENT AT KAMEMBE ORPHANAGE ON NIGHT 03/04 JAN 95.

(10) **IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.**

(A) SECTOR MILOBS ESCORTED TWO BROWN AND ROOT CONVOYS FROM GITARAMA TO GISENYI.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS REPORTED THAT ONE STAFF OF CARE INTERNATIONAL FELL OUT OF THEIR BOAT ON THE LAKE AROUND 1650 HRS. MESSAGE HAS BEEN PASSED TO FHQ FOR AIR SEARCH AND RESCUE. INDIVIDUAL COULD NOT BE LOCATED SO FAR.

(11) **IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.** SECTOR MILOBS WERE DESPATCHED TO GATHER INFORMATION ABOUT NGOs' ACTIVITIES IN KIGALI SECTOR. 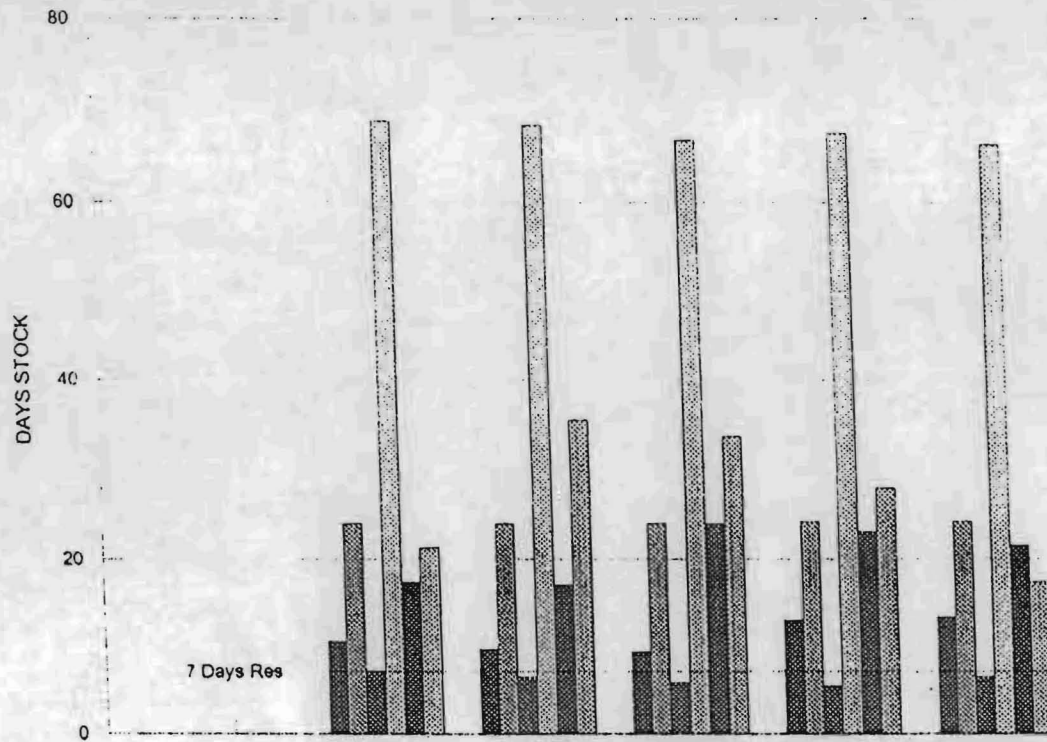
