1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIREAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. FORCED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU SEEMS TO HAVE STOPPED FOR THE TIME BEING.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 29.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 17,835. OUTFLOW. NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) CIVPOL IN KIGALI PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT 100 LOCALS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THE GENDARMERIE IN THE CITY CENTER FOR VARIOUS OFFENSES IN A BID AIMED AT CURBING CRIME AND HAVE BEEN DETAINED IN A TEMPORARY DETENTION CELL AT KIGALI CITY CENTER. MOST OF THE INMATES WHO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED ARE PICK-POCKETS AND CHILDREN WHO HAVE TURNED BEGGARS. THE OFFICER IN CHARGE DISCLOSED THAT THE INMATES WOULD SOON BE TRANSFERRED TO THE RE-HABILITATION AND REFORMATORY CENTRES. INMATES COMPLAINED OF LACK OF FOOD AND WATER. HUMAN RIGHTS AND HAC INFORMED.

(2) SECTOR 1B REPORTED THAT ON 27 AUG 95 AT 0520 HRS TWO BURSTS OF 05 TO 06 ROUNDS WERE HEARD IN THE DIRECTION OF THE PRISON. RPA COULD NOT BE CONTACTED ON THE CAUSE OF THE FIRING. ACCORDING TO A LOCAL RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT ONE PRISONER WAS SHOT AND KILLED WHILE ATTEMPTING TO ESCAPE. THERE IS NO CONFIRMATION. MATTER BEING INVESTIGATED.

(3) IN SECTOR 3B AN ACCIDENT TOOK PLACE IN FRONT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF BUTARE INVOLVING AN RPA AND AN UNICEF VEHICLES. NOBODY WAS INJURED AND THE MATTER WAS RESOLVED WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF MILITARY POLICE IN THE SECTOR.

(4) THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA VISITED THE SECTOR OFFICE AND INFORMED SECTOR COMD OF A NEW SOUS-PREFECT APPOINTED FOR KIUMBA (7093) IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE SECTOR. THIS SOUS-PREFECTURE HAS NOT FUNCTIONED AFTER THE WAR.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. CIVPOL IN GISENYI PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 25 AUG 95 AT 0300 HRS 4 BANDITS DRESSED IN CIVILIAN CLOTHES AND ARMED WITH RIFLE AND A KNIFE ROBBED MWIYANIKE MSF HEALTH CENTER AT KARAGO COMMUNE OF UNDISCLOSED AMOUNT OF PROPERTY. THE BANDITS INJURED THE SECURITY GUARD WITH A KNIFE DURING THE INCIDENT. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

(1) SECTOR 2A: ARRIVAL OF A TOTAL OF 24 RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE, TANZANIA AND BURUNDI TO THE NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP. THE TRANSIT CAMP ITSELF IS EXPERIENCING ACUTE WATER PROBLEM. THE LAST TIME WATER WAS SUPPLIED BY UNHCR WAS ABOUT A MONTH AGO. HAC INFORMED.

(2) CHIEF HAC FROM FORCE HQ WAS MET BY MILOB TEAM IN RUNDA COMMUNE SECTOR 1B TO INSPECT PROGRESS OF WORK ON THE SPANISH ACTIVITY CENTER.

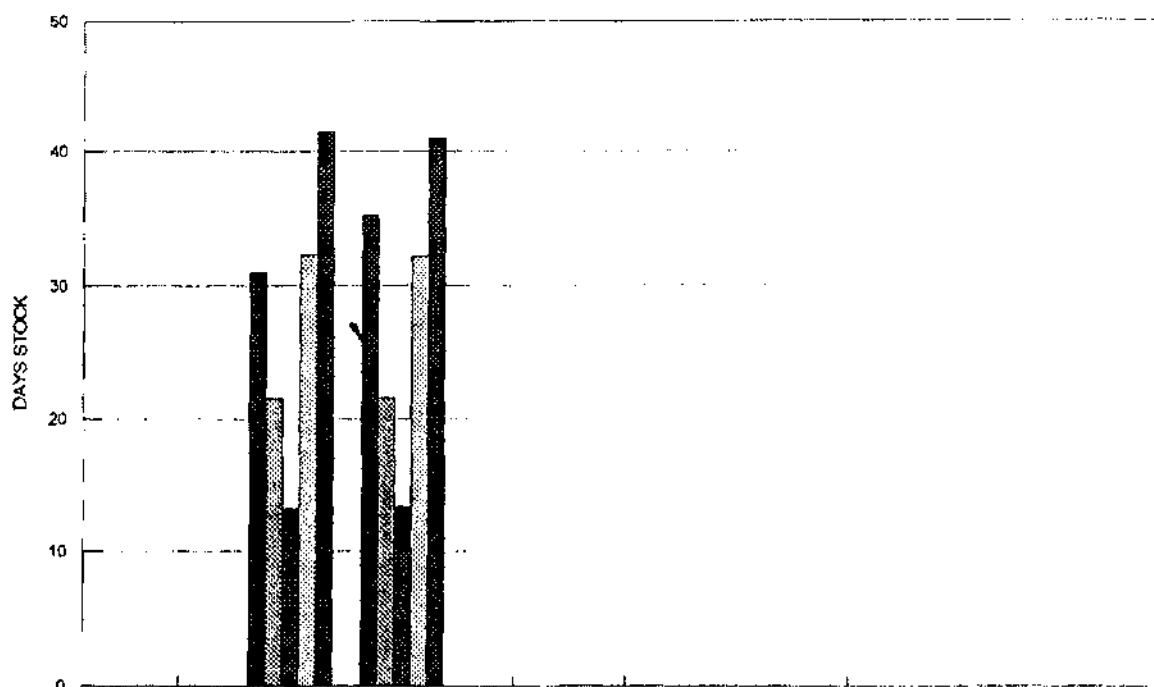

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIREAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. FORCED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU SEEMS TO HAVE STOPPED FOR THE TIME BEING.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) CIVPOL IN KIGALI PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT 100 LOCALS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THE GENDARMERIE IN THE CITY CENTER FOR VARIOUS OFFENSES IN A BID AIMED AT CURBING CRIME AND HAVE BEEN DETAINED IN A TEMPORARY DETENTION CELL AT KIGALI CITY CENTER. MOST OF THE INMATES WHO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED ARE PICK-POCKETS AND CHILDREN WHO HAVE TURNED BEGGARS. THE OFFICER IN CHARGE DISCLOSED THAT THE INMATES WOULD SOON BE TRANSFERRED TO THE RE-HABILITATION AND REFORMATORY CENTRES. INMATES COMPLAINED OF LACK OF FOOD AND WATER. HUMAN RIGHTS AND HAC INFORMED.

(2) SECTOR 1B REPORTED THAT ON 27 AUG 95 AT 0520 HRS TWO BURSTS OF 05 TO 06 ROUNDS WERE HEARD IN THE DIRECTION OF THE PRISON. RPA COULD NOT BE CONTACTED ON THE CAUSE OF THE FIRING. ACCORDING TO A LOCAL RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT ONE PRISONER WAS SHOT AND KILLED WHILE ATTEMPTING TO ESCAPE. THERE IS NO CONFIRMATION. MATTER BEING INVESTIGATED.

(3) IN SECTOR 3B AN ACCIDENT TOOK PLACE IN FRONT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF BUTARE INVOLVING AN RPA AND AN UNICEF VEHICLES. NOBODY WAS INJURED AND THE MATTER WAS RESOLVED WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF MILITARY POLICE IN THE SECTOR.

(4) THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA VISITED THE SECTOR OFFICE AND INFORMED SECTOR COMD OF A NEW SOUS-PREFECT APPOINTED FOR KIUMBA (7093) IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE SECTOR. THIS SOUS-PREFECTURE HAS NOT FUNCTIONED AFTER THE WAR.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. CIVPOL IN GISENYI PREFECTURE REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT 25 AUG 95 AT 0300 HRS 4 BANDITS DRESSED IN CIVILIAN CLOTHES AND ARMED WITH RIFLE AND A KNIFE ROBBED MWIYANIKE MSF HEALTH CENTER AT KARAGO COMMUNE OF UNDISCLOSED AMOUNT OF PROPERTY. THE BANDITS INJURED THE SECURITY GUARD WITH A KNIFE DURING THE INCIDENT. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

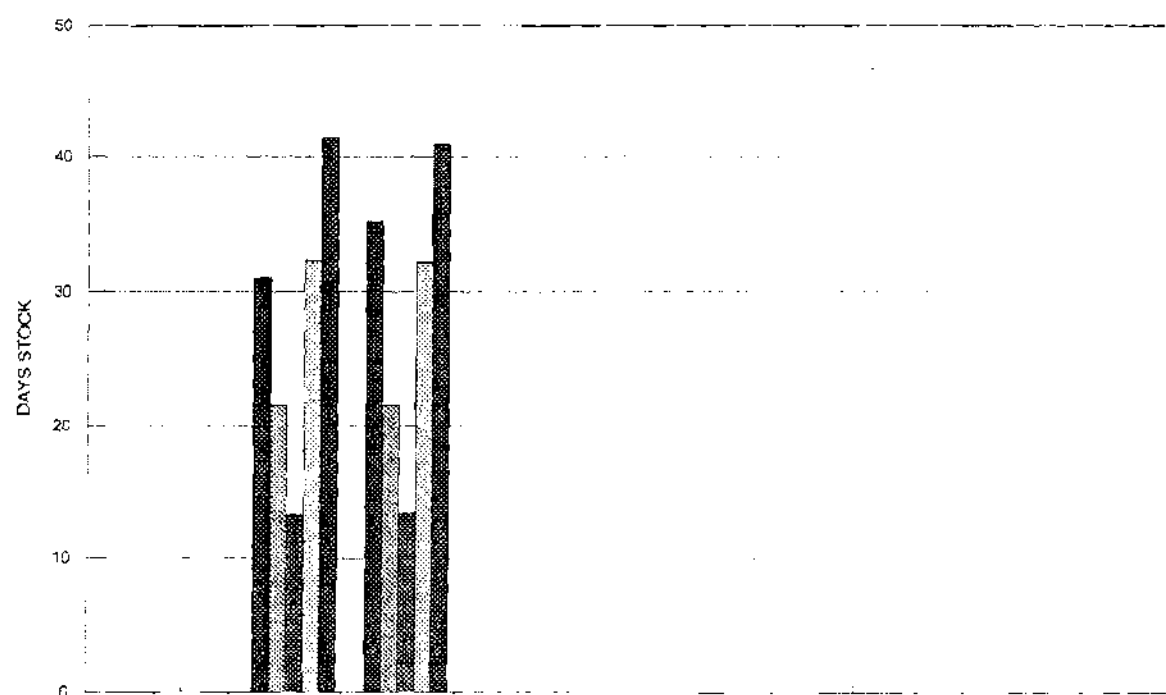

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, UNHCR HAS DECIDED TO RESUME ITS VOLUNTARY REPATRIATION PROGRAMME FROM REFUGEE CAMPS LOCATED IN GOMA AND BUKAVU, ZAIRE, DESPITE THE FACT THAT IT HAS NOT YET RECEIVED OFFICIAL WRITTEN NOTIFICATION FROM ZAIREAN AUTHORITIES OF THEIR DECISION TO STOP THE FORCIBLE REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE AND BURUNDIAN REFUGEES ON ZAIREAN TERRITORY.

B. A DELEGATION FROM THE ORGANIZATION FOR AFRICAN UNITY (OAU) LED BY THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE OAU PRESIDENT ARRIVED IN KIGALI YESTERDAY TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON THE SITUATION IN BURUNDI, AS WELL AS OTHER RELATED MATTERS. B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. AT APPROX 252015 HRS ARMED INTRUDERS BROKE INTO THE HOUSE OF MR ABDOULLAH, A BUSINESSMAN.

RESIDING NEAR CENTRE FOR ISLAMIC CULTURE, KIGALI. MR ABDOULLAH SUFFERED BULLET WOUNDS IN THE LEGS IN THE COURSE OF RESISTING THE BANDITS. THE BANDITS FLED WITHOUT LOOTING. PATROL OF GENDARMES REACHED THE SPOT WITHIN 15 MINUTES. CASE REGISTERED FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATION.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(1) PROVIDED FOUR TRUCKS TO RPA FOR SHIFTING RATIONS FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE, ON A REQUEST FROM COMMANDING OFFICER OF RPA BATTALION AT BUTARE.

(6) MILOBS VISITED KARAMA COMMUNE (GR 5631) ARRIVAL OF 59 RETURNEES WAS CONFIRMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE. MILOBS ALSO LEARNT THAT A MAN WAS KILLED AT CYANIKA (GR 5630) ON 12 AUG 95 AND THE CASE IS BEING INVESTIGATED BY RPA AUTH. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

D. SECTOR 2A REPORTED THE ARRIVAL OF 03 RETURNEES THROUGH GATUNA BORDER POST ON 24 AUGUST 1995.

E. SECTOR 2B REPORTED 301 REFUGEES AT BIRENGA TRANSIT CAMP WHO CAME FROM BURUNDI. LUTHERAN WORLD FEDERATION PROVIDED COOKING UTENSILS AND FOOD. IOM IS PROVIDING TRANSPORT TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. 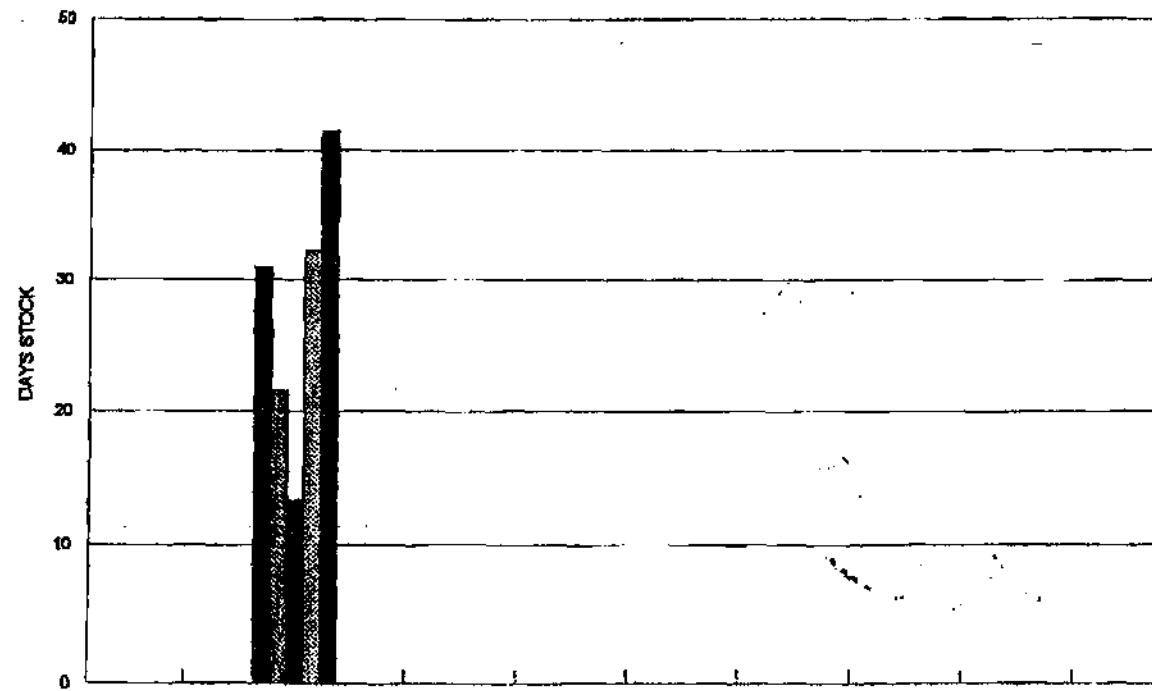

DAILY SITREP FOR 25 AUG 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. FORCED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU CONTINUED DECLINING.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 254.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE  
INFLOW - 17,737. OUTFLOW.NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG MET TODAY WITH UNHCR REPRESENTATIVE IN RWANDA MR. ROMANI URASA, TO DISCUSS THE UN'S COORDINATION EFFORTS IN RWANDA TO FACILITATE THE RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES. MR. URASA ALSO BRIEFED THE SRSG ON THE SITUATION ACROSS THE BORDER IN ZAIRE, AS WELL AS THE OUTCOME OF RECENT DISCUSSIONS HELD BETWEEN REPRESENTATIVES FROM UNCR AND THE GOVERNMENT OF ZAIRE.

B. LATER THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH MR. HARARD GNNS, THE DIRECTOR OF THE AFRICAN BUREAU AT THE GERMANY MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, AND WAS BRIEFED ON MR. GANNNS' DISCUSSIONS WITH RWANDESE LEADERS DURING HISFOUR-DAY OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA. IN PARTICULAR, THEY DISCUSSED THE CONDITION IN RWANDESE PRISONS AND THE SITUATION ALONG THE RWAND-ZAIRE BORDER.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - ONE SICK PRISONER WHO WAS TAKEN TO THE KABGAYI HOSPITAL ON 25 AUG 95 FROM NTONGWE COMMUNE GR 9057 FOR SURGERY WAS BEATEN BY THE RPA SOLDIERS AT THE HOSPITAL. MSF HIRED PERSONNEL INTERVENED AND STOPPED THE BEATING. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NSTR.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(1) IN SECTOR 4 THE COUNSELLOR OF GISHUMA COMMUNE GR 8211 UNDER MUKINBANGIRO SECTOR GR 8612, MR SEZIBERA ATHANASE, A HUTU, WAS INJURED, APPEARS TO BE POLITICALLY MOTIVATED AND SUBSCRIBES TO THE DECLARED CAMPAIGN OF TERROR LAUNCHED AGAINST THE POLITICAL LEADERS BY FRGF/INTERAHAMWE IN THE VARIOUS COMMUNES OF THE BUGARAMA

SUB SECTOR, BEGINNING EARLY JULY 95.

(2) IN SECTOR 4 ON 25 AUG 95 AT AROUND 1230 HRS, A SINGLE ENGINE AC WAS SIGHTED OVER KIRAMBO COMMUNE GR 0444 FLYING IN A SOUTH WEST TO NORTH EAST DIRECTION AT AN ALTITUDE OF 3,000 FEET. THE COLOUR WAS METALLIC WHITE GREY WITH NO VISIBLE MARKINGS.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) MILOBS REPORTED THAT MSF HAS ESTABLISHED A TEMPORARY MEDICAL CENTRE AT RWANTERU AND ARE CARRYING OUT IMMUNIZATION AGAINST POLIO, TB AND TETANUS.

B. IN SECTOR 2A (KIBUNGO) THERE IS WATER SHORTAGE AT RWINKWAVU CENTRE DE SANTE GR 6782 AND NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP. THE WATER PUMP AT THE CAMP WHICH WAS SUPPLIED BY IRC IS OUT OF ORDER. THE CAMP STILL HAS 115 RETURNEES.

C. SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) - UNHCR MOVED ALL 36 VOLUNTARY RETURNEES WHO CROSSED FROM ZAIRE TODAY TO THE MUKAMIRA TRANSIT CAMP.

D. SECTOR 5C THE KABONA DISPENSARY AT RUTSIRO COMMUNE GR 430851 IS RUNNING OUT OF MEDICINE. ANOTHER TEAM VISITED GISHAVU GR 4263 MEDICAL CENTRE AND REPORTED THAT THE ONLY TUBE WELL IS OUT OF ORDER.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. THE PREFECT OF GISENYI IS HOSTING A SEMINAR/MEETING OF ALL OF THE PREFECTURE B/MASTERS. THE SUBJECT WILL BE THE HANDLING OF THE RETURNEES ONCE THEY ARE MOVED TO THE COMMUNES.

B. SECTOR 1A KIGALI, ON 25 AUG 95 UNHCR TRANSPORTED 36 RETURNEES TO NYABIKENKE COMMUNE GR 7292 AND 31 TO RUOBWE COMMUNE GR 7781. THE PREFECT ALSO INFORMED THAT 95 HAD ARRIVED IN TAMBWE COMMUNE GR 7653, 11 IN KIGOMA COMMUNE GR 7649 AND 3 IN MUKINGI COMMUNE GR 7160. THESE RETURNEES HAVE COME FROM BOTH GOMA AND GISENYI. ON 26 AUG 95 THEY WILL TRANSFER SOME RETURNEES TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THERE WILL BE ACUTE SHORTAGE OF FOOD, HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND AGRICULTURE ITEMS. HAC COORDINATING ISSUE WITH NGOS,

C. IN SECTOR 4 ON 25 AUG A TOTAL OF 20 RETURNEES WAS RECORDED, 64 TRANSPORTED TO TRANSIT CAMPS AND 1218 SENT TO THEIR COMMUNES. SECTOR HAS BEEN INFORMED THAT DISPERSION OF REFUGEES TO VARIOUS COMMUNES OF THE CYANGUGU PREFECTURE WILL RESUME ON SAT 26 AUG 95.

D. SECTOR 5, 234 RETURNEES WERE REGISTERED ON 25 AUG 95. ALL WERE TRANSPORTED TO TRANSIT CAMPS. 1037 WERE DESPATCHED

TO THEIR COMMUNES.

THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES WILL RECOMMENCE AFTER SOME AGREEMENT BETWEEN UNHCR AND COURT OS ZAIRE. ON GOVT OF RWANDA MUST GEAR UP TO RECEIVE AND RESETTLE THESE RETURNEES IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES. THIS UNDOUBTEDLY WILL CAUSE SOME ARREST. 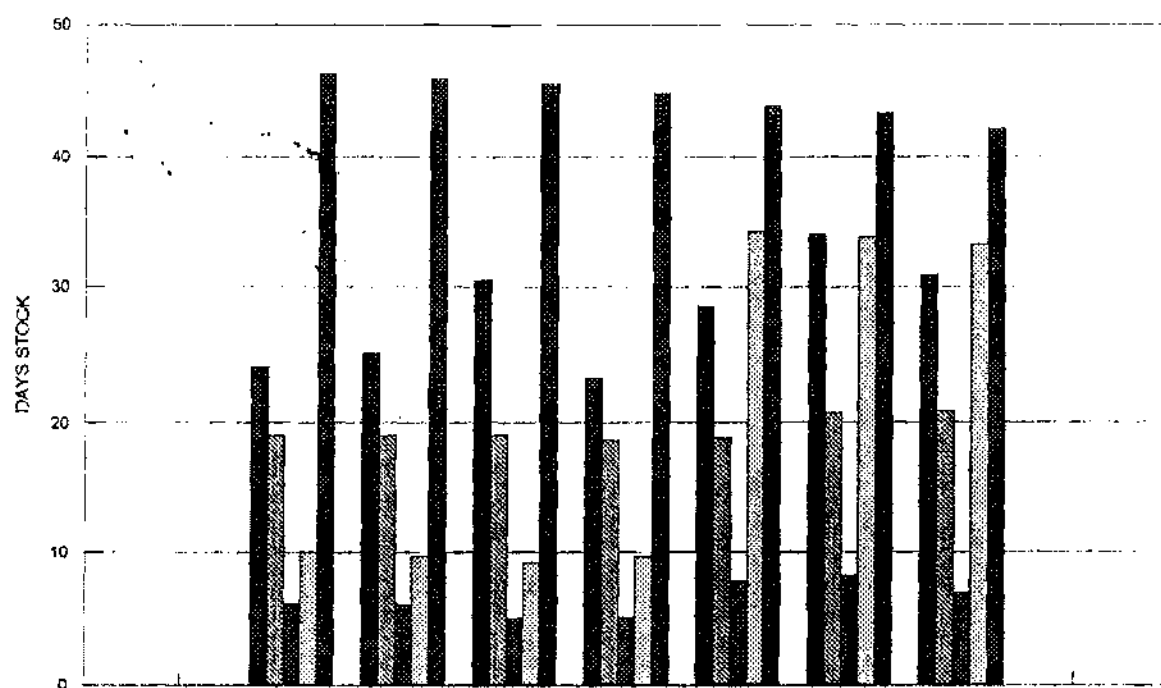

DAILY SITREP FOR 24 AUG 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. FORCED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU SHOWED A MARKED DECLINE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 419 OUT OF WHICH 96 WERE FORCED RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE, 314 SPONTANEOUS RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI, AND 9 FROM UGANDA. TOTAL OUTFLOW - NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 17,483. OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THIS MORNING AN URGENT CONSULTATION CONVOKED BY UNDP WITH DONOR COUNTRIES. THE TOPIC CONCERNED THE PLAN OF ACTION FOR THE REPATRIATION, RESETTLEMENT AND REINTEGRATION OF REFUGEES, THE PLAN OF ACTION FOR PRISONS AND JUDICIAL SYSTEM AND THE PROGRAMME FOR THE COMMUNAL POLICE TRAINING.

B. IN ANOTHER DEVELOPMENT, THE SRSG WAS INFORMED THAT GOVERNMENT OF ZAIRE HAD CLOSED ITS BORDERS AT 1200 HRS TODAY PENDING NEGOTIATIONS WITH UNHCR ON A CALENDAR FOR THE CONTINUED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES. DEADLINE FOR THE CONCLUSION OF THESE NEGOTIATIONS HAS BEEN SET FOR THE 26 AUG 95. IF NO AGREEMENT IS REACHED, IT IS LIKELY THAT THE ZAIRIAN GOVERNMENT WILL REVERT TO FORCIBLE REPATRIATION.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 1B, (GITARAMA) - MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA IS STRENGTHENING ITS PRESENCE IN KAYENZI COMMUNE (GR 8389). MILOBS OBSERVED TRUCK LOAD OF TROOPS ON 20 AUG 95. THIS WAS FOLLOWED BY THE ARREST OF ABOUT 100 LOCALS IN THE COMMUNE ON 21 AUG 95. IT IS NOT YET KNOWN WHETHER THE ADDITIONAL TROOPS WILL BE PERMANENT THERE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) CIVPOL IN GISENYI PREFECTURE PATROLLED RUBAVU COMMUNE AND REPORTED THAT ON 11 AUG 95, ONE WOMAN AND THREE CHILDREN WERE SHOT DEAD IN THEIR HOUSE WITHIN THE

COMMUNE BY PRESUMABLY BANDITS, OF WHOM FOUR MEN WERE DRESSED IN CIVILIAN CLOTHES AND TWO IN MILITARY UNIFORM. THE BANDITS STOLE 50,000 RWF FROM THE HOUSE AFTER THE INCIDENT. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) IN SECTOR 4, MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT MEMBERS OF FRGF WHO ARE AMONG REFUGEES ARE BEING APPREHENDED BY RPA. EXACT FIGURE UNKNOWN.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. IN SECTOR 2A, (BYUMBA) WFP DISTRIBUTED FOOD ITEMS TO PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHERS IN TUMBA COMMUNE AS SUPPLEMENTARY TO THEIR MONTHLY SALARIES. AMREF ALSO DONATED BOOKS, PENCILS AND PENS TO THE PRIMARY SCHOOLS.

B. IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) CARITAS DELIVERED FIVE TONS OF SEED IN NWENDO AND BWAKIRA COMMUNES.

C. IN SECTOR 5B (GISENYI), UNHCR MOVED ALL 27 VOLUNTARY RETURNEES WHO CROSSED FROM ZAIRE TODAY TO THE MUKAMIRA TRANSIT CAMP.

D. SECTOR 5A, 254 REFUGEES BROUGHT TO RUHengeri ON 23 AUG 95 FROM GISENYI WENT BACK TO THEIR VARIOUS COMMUNES ON THEIR OWN.

E. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU), OUT OF A TOTAL OF 7697 FORCED REPATRIATION SINCE 19 AUG 95, 807 HAD BEEN MOVED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES ON 23 AUG 95 AND 1325 ON 24 AUG 95, BRINGING THE TOTAL OF PERSONS MOVED TO 2132.

F. SECTOR 5 (GISENYI), OUT OF A TOTAL OF 5882 FORCED REPATRIATION SINCE 21 AUG 95, 766 WERE MOVED TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES ON 22 AUG, 1224 ON 23 AUG AND 1470 ON 24 AUG 95, BRINGING THE TOTAL OF PERSONS MOVED TO 3460.

G. 156 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI. 40 IDPs WERE EVAC BY UNHCR TO KIGALI TOWN. A TOTAL OF 222 IDPs STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

H. MALAWICOY ESCORTED REFUGEES FROM KITABI TO SHAGASHA UP TO KIBUYE.

I. NICOY PROVIDED SIX TRUCKS TO ASSIST UNHCR AND IOM TO TRANSPORT RETURNEES FROM MUKAMIRA CAMP TO THEIR VARIOUS HOME COMMUNES.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. THE BOURGMESTRE OF SAKÉ COMMUNE INFORMED SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) MILOBS THAT THE COMMUNE WAS CARRYING OUT A CENSUS OF UNOCCUPIED HOUSES IN ORDER TO PREPARE THEM FOR FORCIBLY RETURNED REFUGEES.

B. AT RUSIGA (GR 9201) SECTEUR THE COUNSELLOR WAS ADDRESSING THE LOCALS ON THE SECURITY OF THE SECTOR AND HOW THEY SHOULD WELCOME THOSE BEING EXPELLED FROM ZAIRE.

C. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) THE HUMANITARIAN OFFICER ATTENDED A CRISIS MANAGEMENT MEETING AT THE PREFECT'S OFFICE 24 AUG 95. CONTINGENCY PLANS TO STOCKPILE RESOURCES IN ANTICIPATION OF WORSENING REFUGEE SITUATION WAS DISCUSSED AMONG OTHERS. THE SITUATION IN ALL TWO TRANSIT CAMPS IN THE SECTOR NOTED TO BE SATISFACTORY AND UNDER CONTROL.

D. TOTAL FORCED REPATRIATION FOR THE DAY (24 AUG 95):

(1) RETURNEES: 96

(2) TRANSPORTED TO TRANSIT CAMPS: 903 INCLUDING LAST BACKLOG.

9. COMMENTS THE FORCED REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES BY ZAIRE WAS ON THE DECLINE ON 24 AUG 95. FROM 2275 ON 21 AUG 95, 7956 ON 22 AUG AND 3029 ON 23 AUG 95, THE NUMBER OF FORCED REFUGEES CAME DOWN TO 96 ON 24 AUG 95. THE SAME DAY ZAIRE CLAIMED THAT IT SUSPENDED ITS REPATRIATION PROGRAMME BECAUSE UNHCR CAN REALISTICALLY BEGIN REPATRIATION TO A LEVEL ACCEPTABLE BY ZAIRE SUBSEQUENTLY. THOSE RETURNEES NOT ALREADY PROCESSED INTO RWANDA WERE TRANSPORTED BACK TO THE REFUGEE CAMPS. ZAIRE'S DEMONSTRATION HAS SUCCEEDED IN DRAWING WORLD ATTENTION TO THE PROBLEMS THAT THESE SUPPOSEDLY TEMPORARY CAMPS (WITH RUNNING WATER AND FOOD DISTRIBUTION) PRESENT A THREAT TO ZAIRE AND REGIONAL SECURITY. IT ALSO SEND A CLEAR INDICATION TO THE REFUGEE POPULATION THAT THE STAY WAS NOT TO BE CONSIDERED PERMANENT.

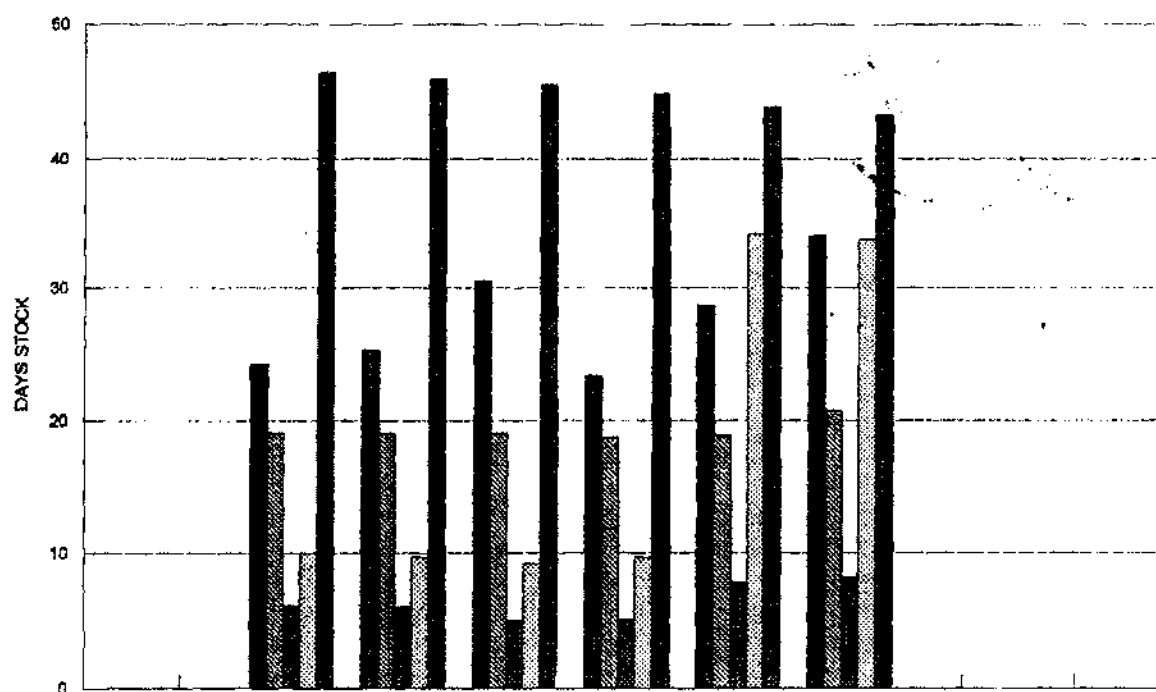

**DAILY SITREP FOR 23 AUG 95**

1. **HIGHLIGHTS.**

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. ZAIRE CONTINUES PUSHING BACK REFUGEES INTO RWANDA, ESPECIALLY OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU.

B. **BORDER CROSSING:**

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 3,612 OUT OF WHICH 3029 WERE FORCED RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE, 10 SPONTANEOUS RETURNEES FROM UGANDA, AND 573 FROM BURUNDI. TOTAL OUTFLOW - **NIL**.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - **17,064** INCLUDING **13,483** FORCED RETURNEES. OUTFLOW **NA**

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES**

A. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCY MEETING THIS MORNING WHERE THE MAIN TOPIC OF DISCUSSION WAS THE PRESENT REFUGEE INFLOW. LATER IN THE MORNING HE GAVE A PRESS CONFERENCE WHERE HE PROVIDED A FULL BRIEFING ON THE RESPONSE BY THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY AND THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT TO THE REFUGEE ALERT. HE FOCUSED HIS PRESENTATION ON THE SITUATION AT THE TWO ENTRY POINTS IN GISENYI AND BUKAVU. HE CONCLUDED BY PROVIDING A SUMMARY OF UNAMIR'S EFFORTS TO IMPROVE OR REHABILITATE THESE SITES. IN THE AFTERNOON THE SRSG MET WITH THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PRISON COMMISSION, MR CLAUDE DUSSAIDI.

B. RADIO RWANDA ANNOUNCED 23 AUG 95 THE APPOINTMENT BY THE UN SECRETARY GENERAL OF HIS REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE GREAT LAKES REGION.

PERSONS ARRESTED ARE BEING HELD IN NYARUTOVU COMMUNE JAIL. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED HEARING THE SOUND OF WEAPONS FIRE EVERY NIGHT. THE RPA SOLDIER WHO WAS

WOUNDED IN NEMBA ON 21 AUG IS BEING TREATED IN MSF HOSPITAL.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. NTR.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 1B INDBATT TRANSPORTED FIVE TONS FOOD DONATED BY MINISTRY OF EDUCATION FROM GITARAMA TO NYABIKENKE COMMUNE (GR 7292) FOR THE BENEFIT OF "GROUPE SCOLAIRE." ELECTROGAZ HAS REQUESTED FOR TRANSPORT FROM KIGALI TO GITARAMA CHEMICAL PRODUCTS FOR WATER PURIFICATION AND TO CONVEY A 600 KG TRANSFORMER FROM KIGALI TO KIGOMA COMMUNE (7649). HAC VISITED GATAGARA HANDICAPPED CENTER AND FOUND THE INSTITUTION TO BE IN DESPARATE NEED OF FOOD.

B. SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) LUTHERAN WORLDWIDE FEDERATION (NGO) DISTRIBUTED 135 BAGS OF FOOD IN THE RWAINKAVU AREA. THE BOURGEMESTRE OF RUKARA COMMUNE HAS REQUESTED FOR ASSISTANCE TO REHABILITATE THE WATER RESERVOIR IN GAHINI SECTOR SO AS TO RESTORE WATER SUPPLY IN MULUNDI AREA. 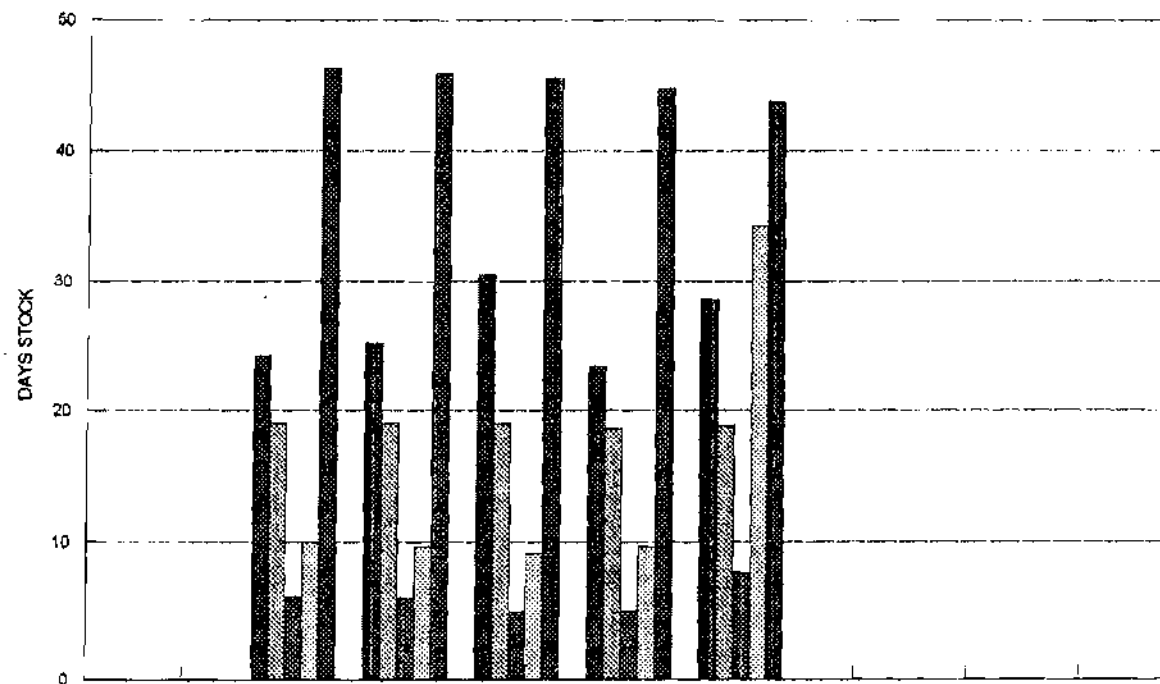

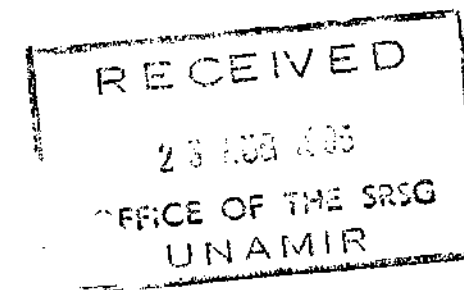

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 7,956 FORCED RETURNEES AND 7 SPONTANEOUS RETURNEES. TOTAL OUTFLOW - NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 13,452 AND OUTFLOW - 1,832.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE SRSG AND DFC IN THE COMPANY OF THE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION, THE DIRECTOR FOR HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS OF THE GERMAN MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR AND THE OAU REPRESENTATIVE VISITED THE GISENYI SECTOR HEADQUARTERS AND THE TRANSIT CAMPS, AS WELL AS THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER TO ASSESS THE IMPACT OF THE FORCED REFUGEE RETURNEES. THEY WERE ACCOMPANIED BY THE REPRESENTATIVES OF UNHCR, UNREO, UNHR OPERATION, AS WELL AS UNAMIR MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 4, MALICOY REPORTED THAT RPA HAS INTENSIFIED ITS FORCES AT THE TWO BORDER CROSSINGS RUSIZI I AND II, IN VIEW OF FORCIBLE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES.

(2) IN SECTOR 5A RUHENGARI ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS ADMITTED AT NEMBA HOSPITAL WITH BULLET WOUND. POSSIBLY CAUSED DUE TO ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE BY A FELLOW SOLDIER. THE RPA CARRIED OUT CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN NEMBA TOWN AND RECOVERED SOME WPNS, MILITARY UNIFORMS AND DRUGS. THE NUMBER OF PERSONS ARRESTED AFTER THE OPERATION IS NOT KNOWN. MILOBS ARE MONITORING.

(3) SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED BY THE RPA BETWEEN 0800-1200 HRS ON 22 AUG 95 TO SEARCH FOR WPNS. MARKETS AND SHOPS REMAINED CLOSED TILL NOON. RPA HAS INTENSIFIED ITS PATROLS IN THE AREA. NO WPNS WERE FOUND AND NOBODY WAS ARRESTED. RPA NUMBERED BETWEEN 200-300 ARE DEPLOYED AT RUSIZI I TO MONITOR THE FORCED REPATRIATION. APPROXIMATELY 50 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED BY RPA AS FRGF SUSPECTS. NO SEARCH OR DETENTION TOOK PLACE AT UVIRA.

(4) IN SECTOR 5, NICOY REPORTED THAT RPA MAINTAINED VIGILANCE THROUGHOUT THE SECTOR AND PROVIDED SECURITY AT MUKAMIRA TRANSIT CAMP (GR 3222).

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) ON 22 AUG 95 AT 1400 HRS IN THE NYAMASHEKE SUB SECTOR AN UNIDENTIFIED AIRCRAFT WAS HEARD OVER THE HANIKA SECTOR (0946) BUT WAS NOT SEEN.

(2) IN NYAMABUYE COMMUNE (7570), MBUYE SECTOR (8264), GITARAMA PREFECTURE, ONE LOCAL WAS KILLED ON 20 AUG 95 BY AN ARMED UNIFORMED MAN. IDENTITY OF KILLERS UNKNOWN. HR INFORMED.

(3) IN KIVU COMMUNE (GR 4210) GIKONGORO PREFECTURE, TWO PERSONS WERE ARRESTED, ONE OF THEM BELIEVED TO BE THE SON OF BOURGMESTRE IN NYABIMATA SECTOR. THEY WERE REPORTEDLY IDENTIFIED TO BE INVOLVED IN THE LAST YEAR GENOCIDE.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

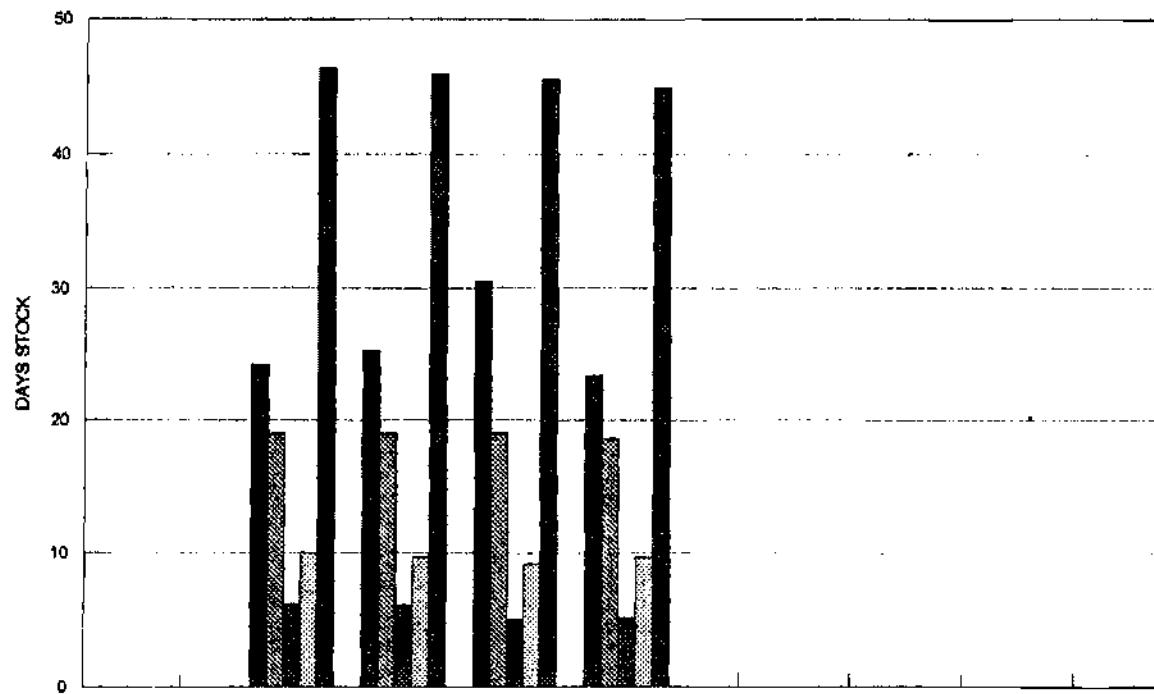

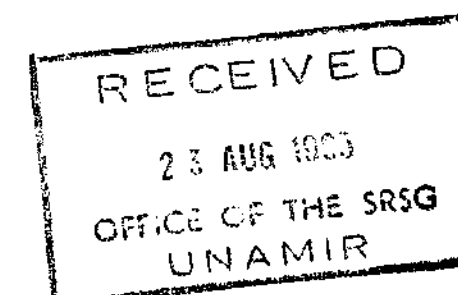

DAILY SITREP FOR 22 AUG 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. ZAIRE CONTINUES PUSHING BACK REFUGEES INTO RWANDA, ESPECIALLY OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 7,956 FORCED RETURNEES AND 7 SPONTANEOUS RETURNEES. TOTAL OUTFLOW - NIL.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 13,452 AND OUTFLOW - 1,832.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE SRSG AND DFC IN THE COMPANY OF THE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION, THE DIRECTOR FOR HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS OF THE GERMAN MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, THE BELGIAN AMBASSADOR AND THE OAU REPRESENTATIVE VISITED THE GISENYI SECTOR HEADQUARTERS AND THE TRANSIT CAMPS, AS WELL AS THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER TO ASSESS THE IMPACT OF THE FORCED REFUGEE RETURNEES. THEY WERE ACCOMPANIED BY THE REPRESENTATIVES OF UNHCR, UNREO, UNHR OPERATION, AS WELL AS UNAMIR MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 4, MALICOY REPORTED THAT RPA HAS INTENSIFIED ITS FORCES AT THE TWO BORDER CROSSINGS RUSIZI 1 AND II, IN VIEW OF FORCIBLE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES.

(2) IN SECTOR 5A RUHENGERI ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS ADMITTED AT NEMBA HOSPITAL WITH BULLET WOUND. POSSIBLY CAUSED DUE TO ACCIDENTAL DISCHARGE BY A FELLOW SOLDIER. THE RPA CARRIED OUT CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION IN NEMBA TOWN AND RECOVERED SOME WPNS, MILITARY UNIFORMS AND DRUGS. THE NUMBER OF PERSONS ARRESTED AFTER THE OPERATION IS NOT KNOWN. MILOBS ARE MONITORING.

(3) SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT A CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED BY THE RPA BETWEEN 0800-1200 HRS ON 22 AUG 95 TO SEARCH FOR WPNS. MARKETS AND SHOPS REMAINED CLOSED TILL NOON. RPA HAS INTENSIFIED ITS PATROLS IN THE AREA. NO WPNS WERE FOUND AND NOBODY WAS ARRESTED. RPA NUMBERED BETWEEN 200-300 ARE DEPLOYED AT RUSIZI I TO MONITOR THE FORCED REPATRIATION. APPROXIMATELY 50 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED BY RPA AS FRGF SUSPECTS. NO SEARCH OR DETENTION TOOK PLACE AT UVIRA.

(4) IN SECTOR 5, NICOY REPORTED THAT RPA MAINTAINED VIGILANCE THROUGHOUT THE SECTOR AND PROVIDED SECURITY AT MUKAMIRA TRANSIT CAMP (GR 3222).

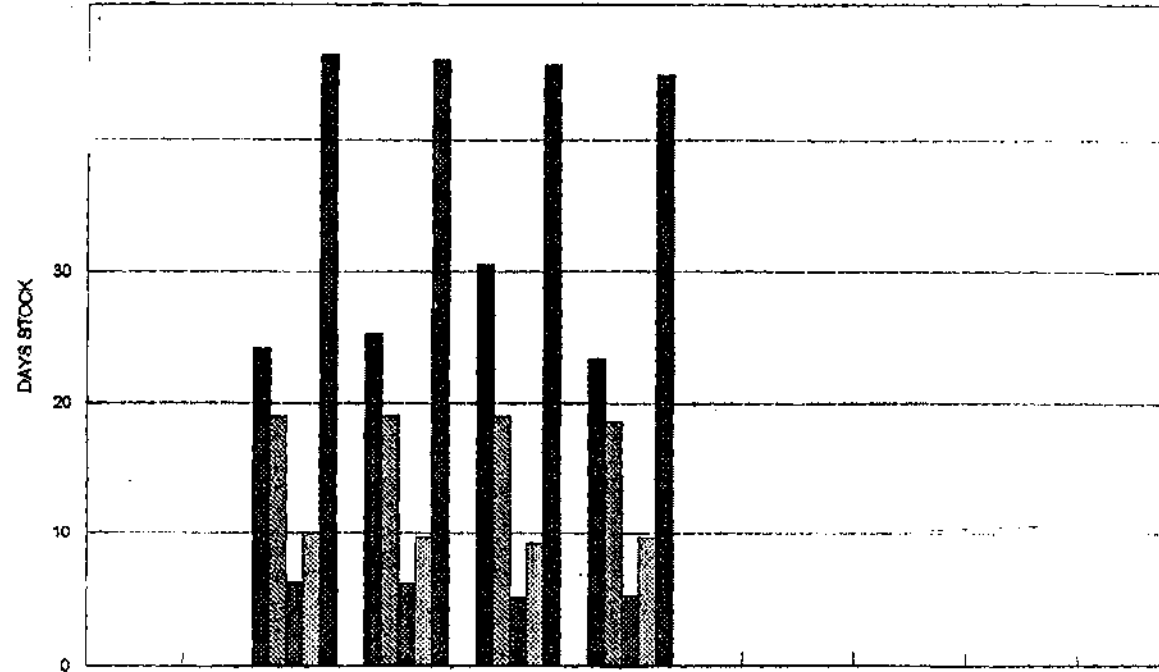

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 08 AUG TO 14 AUG 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS, ESPECIALLY ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINED TENSE. ZAIRE BEGAN PUSHING BACK REFUGEES INTO RWANDA ESPECIALLY OPPOSITE TO GOMA AND BUKAVU WHERE A TOTAL OF 2493 REFUGEES HAVE BEEN FORCIBLY PUSHED BACK BETWEEN 20 AND 21 AUG 95.

B. BORDER CROSSING: A TOTAL OF 3523 RETURNEES OF WHICH 1030 SPONTANEOUS AND 2493 FORCED, WAS RECORDED FOR THE WEEK.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE PRESIDENT OF UGANDA'S VISIT TO RWANDA

1. PRESIDENT YOWERI MUSEVENI OF UGANDA ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 14 AUGUST FOR A THREE-DAY OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA DURING WHICH HE MET WITH SENIOR RWANDESE OFFICIALS AND ADDRESSED THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY.

2. THE PRESIDENT OF UGANDA IN A SPEECH BEFORE THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY ON 14 AUGUST, APPEALED TO THE RWANDESE POPULATION TO AVOID SECTARIAN AND DIVISIVE TENDENCIES AND TO FORGE UNITY AMONG THEMSELVES. HE ALSO RECOMMENDED THAT IN ORDER TO STRENGTHEN THE RWANDESE ECONOMY, THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SHOULD PROMOTE THE PRIVATISATION OF STATE ENTERPRISES.

3. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, PRESIDENT MUSEVENI DELIVERED A SPEECH TO THE POPULATION OF GISENYI IN NORTH-WESTERN RWANDA, IN WHICH HE STATED THAT HE WOULD DO HIS UTMOST TO PREVENT THE INFILTRATION OF MEMBERS OF THE FORMER RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FORCES INTO RWANDA ALONG THE COMMON BORDER BETWEEN RWANDA, UGANDA AND ZAIRE. HE REPORTEDLY FURTHER ADDED THAT ALTHOUGH THESE FORCES WERE SUPPORTED BY FOREIGN POWERS, THEY WOULD NEVER BE ABLE TO WIN A WAR AGAINST THE CURRENT RWANDESE GOVERNMENT.

4. THE SRSG ATTENDED A PUBLIC ADDRESS GIVEN BY THE UGANDAN PRESIDENT AT THE MAIN STADIUM IN KIGALI ON 16 AUGUST IN WHICH THE UGANDAN LEADER REAFFIRMED HIS SUPPORT FOR RWANDA IN THE FACE OF GROWING THREATS OF DESTABILISATION FROM FORMER GOVERNMENT ELEMENTS. THE SRSG WAS ALSO PRESENT AT KIGALI AIRPORT TO BID FAREWELL TO MR. MUSEVENI UPON HIS DEPARTURE FROM RWANDA AT THE END OF HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO THE COUNTRY.

5. THE PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA AND UGANDA SIGNED A JOINT COMMUNIQUE ON 16 AUGUST IN KIGALI OUTLINING AREAS OF BILATERAL COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. THEY ALSO

CALLED FOR THE SPEEDY OPERATIONALISATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, THE CONVENING OF A REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, THE NEED FOR REGIONAL INTEGRATION AND MODERNIZATION, AS WELL AS AN END TO DIVISIVE AND SECTARIAN POLITICS BASED UPON RELIGIOUS AND ETHNIC FACTORS.

**B. OTHER DEVELOPMENTS IN RWANDA**

1. THE U.S. ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR INTERNATIONAL SECURITY AFFAIRS, MR. JOSEPH NYE, LEFT KIGALI ON 14 AUGUST FOLLOWING A ONE-DAY OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA. HE REPORTEDLY HELD TALKS WITH SENIOR MILITARY OFFICIALS AND VISITED THE U.S. DEMINING TEAM OPERATING IN RWANDA. THE U.S. DEPUTY ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR AFRICAN AFFAIRS, MR. VINCENT KERN, WAS ALSO ON AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA UNTIL 17 AUGUST.

2. ON 15 AUGUST, THE SRSG, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, RETURNED TO KIGALI FROM LEAVE AND RESUMED HIS OFFICIAL DUTIES.

3. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING ON 17 AUGUST WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM U.N. AGENCIES AND THE ICRC TO DISCUSS MEASURES AIMED AT IMPROVING CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS. HE ALSO MET WITH THE DEPUTY PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE ON THE TRIBUNAL'S OPERATIONS. LATER, HE HELD A MEETING WITH UNAMIR STAFF TO DISCUSS RADIO UNAMIR AND ITS TRANSMITTING CAPABILITIES INTO REFUGEE CAMPS NEIGHBOURING RWANDA.

4. ON 17 AUGUST, THE SRSG ATTENDED THE SWEARING-IN CEREMONY OF THE SIX REMAINING DEPUTIES OF THE 70-MEMBER TRANSITIONAL NATIONAL ASSEMBLY IN RWANDA. THE DEPUTIES BELONGED TO THE FOLLOWING GROUPS: RWANDESE PATRIOTIC FRONT (1), SOCIAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY (2), LIBERAL PARTY (1) AND NATIONAL ARMY (1). THE DEPUTY REPRESENTING THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLICAN MOVEMENT (MDR) WAS ABSENT AT THE CEREMONY.

**3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.**

**A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.**

(1) SECTOR 1 GITARAMA REPORTED THAT THE PRIME MINISTER HAS ANNOUNCED THAT ALL LOCAL DEFENCE FORCES (LDF) WOULD BE DISSOLVED AND THAT ALL CONCERNED WERE EXPECTED TO TURN IN THEIR IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

(2) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT AT NYAMASHEKE SUB SECTOR, JOINT PATROLLING IS BEING UNDERTAKEN AT NIGHT BY THE LOCALS ALONG WITH THE RPA. SIMILAR PATROL WAS REPORTED AT CYANGUGU SUB SECTOR.

(3) SECTOR 3B MILOB REPORTED THAT AROUND 1830 HRS ON 14 AUG 95, SIX VANS LOADED WITH TROOPS AND LUGGAGE WERE SEEN REFUELLING AT THEIR GARAGE IN BUTARE AND

LATER OBSERVED HEADING TOWARDS GIKONGORO. PRESUMABLY HEADING FOR THE ZAIRIAN BORDER.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI A RPA PATROL BROKE INTO A HOUSE ON 18 AUG 95 AT 0300 HRS WHERE THEY SUSPECTED FRGF TROOPS WERE HIDING. THE RPA OPENED FIRE AND KILLED THREE PERSONS. HR INFORMED.

(5) ON 18 AUG 95 CIVPOL AND MILOBS CONFIRMED THAT THREE PEOPLE DIED DURING AN EXPLOSION AT GISENYI PARK AT 0400 HRS. IT IS SUSPECTED TO BE CARRIED OUT BY RPA UNDER COVER OF MILITIA.

B. MILITIA/FRGF/BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU A GROUP OF 3 BANDITS KILLED A WOMAN AND HER SON WITH A GRENADE IN NYAKABUYE SECTOR (8917). WHEN THE LOCALS RAISED AN ALARM THEY FLED. NO ITEMS WERE REPORTED STOLEN. THE BANDITS ARE SUSPECTED TO BE FROM WITHIN THE LOCALITY.

(2) A COMBINED PATROL OF MILOBS AND UNHCR CONFIRMED THE REPORTS OF INFILTRATION OF ARMED PERSONS IN RUKARA COMMUNE (SQ 5601) FROM TANZANIA MOSTLY IN THE LAST MONTH. IT IS FURTHER REPORTED THAT A NUMBER OF LOCALS WERE KILLED DURING THE INCURSIONS IN THE SAME PERIOD. EXTENT OF THREAT, FREQUENCY AND IDENTITY BEING INVESTIGATED.

(3) SECTOR 4 MILOB CYANGUGU REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 1000 HRS ON 10 AUG 95, A GROUP OF 6 BANDITS ATTACKED A HOUSE IN MPMGA SECTOR SQ 9408 IN BUGARAMA COMMUNE. THE BANDITS ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM BURUNDI AND WERE REPORTEDLY ARMED WITH SMALL ARMS AND MACHETES. THEY SHOT AND KILLED A MAN AND FLED INTO BURUNDI WITH 3 COWS.

(4) TWO INCIDENTS INVOLVING EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN FRGF AND RPA OCCURRED ON 16 AUG 95 IN THE GISHWATI FOREST GR 2979, IN GISENYI SECTOR. THESE INCIDENTS SEEM TO CONFIRM THE PRESENCE OF INTERHAMWE IN THIS FOREST.

(5) IN GISENYI THE RPA LO REPORTED THAT A SEARCH WAS CONDUCTED IN GISHWATI FOREST. SOME HAND GRENADES, ANTI-TANK AND SOME ANTI-PERSONAL MINES WERE RECOVERED.

(6) IN GISENYI AREA A NGO VEHICLE (MEMISA) HIT A MINE ON 18 AUG 95 RESULTING IN DEATH OF DTWO PERSONNEL AND ONE INJURED. IT SEEMS THAT THIS NGO WAS TARGETED.

(7) TWO AIRCRAFT OVERFLIGHTS WERE OBSERVED OVER KAMEMBE SECTOR ON 16 AUG AT 10 30 AND ON 17 AUG AT 0900 HRS. THE AIRCRAFT IS BELIEVED TO BE A B-N 2 ISLANDER.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) AT A MEDAL PARADE CEREMONY PRESIDED OVER BY THE FORCE COMMANDER, 238 PERSONNEL OF INDBATT RECEIVED THEIR MEDALS. ALSO PRESENT AT THE OCCASION WERE US AMBASSADOR IN RWANDA, H.E. MR. RAWSON, AND VARIOUS CIVIL AND MILITARY OFFICIALS FROM FORCE HQ. INDBATT ALSO DONATED BEDS AND FOODSTUFFS CONTRIBUTED BY THE OFFICERS AND MEN TO MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

(3) MILOBS CONTINUED PATROLLING THE AOR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) REPORTED THAT THE "SISTERS CONGREGATION", A VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATION FROM ITALY, HAS ASSUMED CONTROL OF THE HEALTH CENTRE IN THE MUHURA COMMUNE AS THE NGO "INTER-SOS" HAS MOVED TO KIBUYE. THE HEALTH CENTRE CONTINUES TO RELY ON SUPPORT FROM "CARITAS" AND "REGION SANITAIRE" BASED IN BYUMBA. THE AUTHORITIES FORESEE THE REQUIREMENT FOR AN AMBULANCE ONCE "INTER-SOS" MOVES OUT COMPLETELY.

B. MEMBERS FROM OP SPT COY CONDUCTED A FAREWELL VISIT TO MADAME CARR ORPHANAGE (SECTOR 5 GS 3122). DURING THE VISIT A CHEQUE FOR AUS \$ 2000 WAS PRESENTED TO MADAME CARR. THE DONATION CAME FROM MONEY RAISED BY A SPECIALIST SURGEON WHO SERVED WITH FIRST AUSMED CONTINGENT.

C. SECTOR 2A MILOBS REPORTED THAT WFP AND ADRA DISTRIBUTED VARIOUS FOOD ITEMS TO RETURNEES AT KAGITUMBA SECTOR (GR 431756). ADRA WAS ALSO REHABILITATING RUGARAMA (GR 457773) AND KAGITUMBA (GR 458808) PRIMARY SCHOOLS. IT WAS ENGAGED IN PROVIDING MEDICARE FOR THE RETURNEES IN NYAGATARE RECEPTION CENTRE. ADRA ALSO DISTRIBUTED A VARIETY OF FOOD ITEMS TO LOCALS OF CYUNGO COMMUNE ON 12 AUG 95 WHILST AMREF CONDUCTED VACCINATION AGAINST THE SIX CHILDHOOD KILLER DISEASES IN THE SAME COMMUNE ON 08 AUG 95.

D. IN SECTOR 2A BYUMBA WORLD VISION IS RUNNING THE BWISIGE DISPENSARY, WHICH IS EXPERIENCING SHORTAGE OF ELECTRICITY, WATER AND DRUGS. IN CYUMBA COMMUNE AMREF IS OPERATING AND PROVIDING BUILDING MATERIALS TO THE COMMUNE. THERE IS ONLY ONE HEALTH CENTRE IN THE COMMUNE WHICH DOES NOT HAVE ELECTRICITY, WATER AND ADEQUATE STAFF TO MAN IT.

E. UNAMIR UNITS PROVIDED VEHICLES FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD, FOOD ITEMS AND OTHERS.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. CIVPOL REPORTED THAT THE FORMER BOURGMESTRE OF MUKO COMMUNE IN GIKONGORO WHO WAS REPLACED FOR HIS INABILITY TO

SOLVE THE PROBLEM OF LOCALS HAS BEEN PLACED IN CUSTODY AS A RESULT OF HIS INVOLVEMENT IN LAST YEAR GENOCIDE.

B. MILOBS IN GISENYI REPORTED THAT 35 RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI WERE TRANSPORTED TO KIBAYI BY UNHCR. RETURNEES OBSERVED WERE MOSTLY WOMEN AND CHILDREN WITH FEW OLD MEN.

C. ON 20 AUG 95 ZAIRE BEGAN PUSHING BACK HOME FORCIBLY RWANDESE REFUGEES. ON THAT DATE 42 RWANDAN ALLEGED TO BE THIEVES WERE FORCIBLY REPATRIATED THROUGH RUSIZI 1 GR 7624 IN SECTOR 4, AND 181 EVICTED FROM MUGAMBA CAMP IN ZAIRE, WERE TURNED UP AT THE BORDER POST IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI. ON 21 AUG 95, APPROX 1102 REFUGEES WERE RECORDED IN SECTOR 4, AND 1173 IN SECTOR 5. A TOTAL OF 2,493 RETURNEES WERE FORCIBLY REPATRIATED.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL.

A. A BOY OF 18 YEARS OLD WAS WASHED ASHORE LAKE KIVU ON 19 AUG 95 BY 1200 HRS IN SECTOR 5.

B. IN SECTOR 2 BYUMBA TWO BOYS BOTH AGED 18 DIED ON 14 AUG 95 AS A RESULT OF AN EXPLOSION OF SOME ORDNANCE DEVICE FOUND BY THE VICTIMS.

7. LOGISTICS. NSTR.

8. CASUALTIES NIL.

9. COMMENTS.


A. BANDITRY ACTIVITIES ARE IN THE INCREASE IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI. THE PRESENCE OF A GROUP OF INFILTRATORS IN THE GISHWATI FOREST IS VERY LIKELY NOTING THE FREQUENCY OF INCIDENTS IN THE AREA RECENTLY. THE ATTACK OF THE NGO MEMISA SEEMS TO BE WARNING THAT INFILTRATORS CAN HIT THE MOST VULNERABLE PEOPLE AT WILL.

B. THE SITUATION AT THE BORDER POSTS IN RUSIZI 1 AND GISENYI IS TENSE AND CONFUSING. ZAIRE APPEARS TO BE ATTEMPTING TO PUSH BACK THE REFUGEES INTO RWANDA AS AN EXCUSE TO EVICT UNDESIRABLE ELEMENTS FROM SOME CAMPS. THESE CAMPS HAVE PRESENTED A THREAT TO ZAIRE FOR BOTH SECURITY AND SOVEREIGNTY REASONS. WITH THE SUSPENSION OF THE ARMS EMBARGO, THE PROSPECTS OF THE RETURN OF THE FRG TO RWANDA IN THE NEAR FUTURE ARE REMOTE, WHILE PROSPECTS OF INCREASING PROBLEMS FOR ZAIRE QUITE LIKELY. SOURCES INDICATE THE REPATRIATION CURRENTLY UNDERWAY WILL CONTINUE. THE GREATEST THREAT TO RWANDA'S SECURITY WILL COME FROM ITS ABILITY TO HANDLE THE VOLUME OF RETURNEES, A THREAT TO BOTH ITS TERRITORIAL DEFENCE AND POLITICAL COHESION.

1. **HIGHLIGHTS.**

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE. ZAIRE CONTINUES PUSHING BACK REFUGEES INTO RWANDA, ESPECIALLY OPPOSITE GOMA AND BUKAVU WHERE A TOTAL OF 2270 REFUGEES HAVE BEEN FORCIBLY PUSHED BACK.

B. **BORDER CROSSING:**

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 2,923 OF WHICH 653 SPONTANEOUS RETURNEES AND 2270 FORCED. TOTAL OUTFLOW - 1832.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 5,496 AND OUTFLOW - 1,832.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES** NSTR.

B. **FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.** SECTOR 2B MILOBS REPORTED THAT IN KAYINZA COMMUNE GR 5784 SECTOR 2 KIBUNGO THREE FRGF SOLDIERS INFILTRATED INTO THE COMMUNE WITH ARMS ON 15 AUG 95 FROM ZAIRE AND ESCAPED BACK TO TANZANIA.

C. **OWN ACTIVITIES.** NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. **HUMANITARIAN** IN SECTOR 1B INDBATT TRANSPORTED FIVE TONS OF FOODSTUFFS FOR WFP FROM GITARAMA TO KAYENZI COMMUNE GR 8389 AND SIMILAR QUANTITY FROM GITARAMA TO NYABIKENKE COMMUNE GR 7292. REPS OF AFRICAN HOUSING REQUESTED FOR 60 PIECES OF PLASTIC SHEETS TO COVER 15,000 TILES THEY CONTRACTED IN THE PREFECTURE TO BUILD 10,000 HOUSES IN SURROUNDING COMMUNES. ELECTROGAS ALSO REQUESTED FOR HELP TO MOVE TRANSFORMERS WHICH WERE RECENTLY SABOTAGED IN THE PREFECTURE FROM VARIOUS LOCATIONS TO GITARAMA FOR REPAIRS. HAC INFORMED.

5. **CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.**

A. IN SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU, ON 21 AUG 95 BY 1830 HRS AT RUSIZI 1 GR 7624, RPA RECEIVED APPROXIMATELY 1100 REFUGEES WHO WERE FORCED OUT OF ZAIRE BY ZAIRIAN FORCES. THE CROSSING AT RUSIZI I WAS CLOSED AS OF 1830 HRS. THE SECTOR COMMANDER AND OTHER MILOBS PRESENT WERE TOLD BY RPA TO RETURN MORNING OF 22 AUG FOR FURTHER INFORMATION AND TO MONITOR THE SITUATION. OUT OF THESE NUMBERS, SOME REFUGEES WERE SEEN WITH LUGGAGE,

PRESUMABLY COMING FROM THE CAMPS, WHILE OTHERS HAD NO BELONGINGS WITH THEM, PRESUMABLY ASSEMBLED QUICKLY, OUTSIDE THE MAIN REFUGEE CAMPS.

B. 384 REFUGEES HAVE BEEN REPORTED AT NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP FROM 18 TO 21 AUG 95.

C. AS AT 1800 HRS 21 AUG 95, 1100 REFUGEES WERE RECORDED BY UNHCR AND HAVE CROSSED THE BORDER.

D. IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI ON 21 AUG 95, AT 900 HRS FOUR CIVILIAN BUSES AND CARS ARRIVED AT THE BORDER CARRYING 250 REFUGEES FROM MUGANGA CAMP ACROSS THE BORDER. THE SITUATION AS AT 21 AUG 95 1830 HRS WAS:-

- 1173 PERSONS RECORDED BY UNHR AND TRANSPORTED BY NICOTY TO KABALI TRANSIT CAMP (GR 3018).

- APPROX 600 PERSONS STILL AT THE BORDER POST IN THE NO MANS LAND AREA.

E. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF RETURNEES IN SECT 5 GISENYI ON 20 AUG WAS 181. OF THESE 127 WERE TRANSPORTED TO THE KABALI TRANSIT CAMP, 54 SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF AND PRISONERS FROM GOMA WERE TAKEN TO THE DETENTION CENTRE IN GISENYI. 13 CHILDREN HAD BEEN SEPARATED FROM THEIR PARENTS.

F. SITUATION AT THE END OF THE DAY 21 AUG 95 IN RESPECT OF FORCED REPARATION IS AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) SECTOR 4 - APPROX 1100 REFUGEES RECORDED.

- (2) SECTOR 5 - APPROX 1170 REFUGEES RECORDED.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL NSTR.

7. LOGISTICS NSTR.

8. CASUALTIES NSTR.

9. COMMENTS

A. THE SITUATION OPPOSITE SECTORS 4 AND 5 IN AREAS OF RUSIZI 1 AND GISENYI BORDER POSTS IS TENSE AND CONFUSING. THE UNHCR HAVE NOT PARTICIPATED IN THE TRANSPORTATION OF REFUGEES ON THE ZAIREAN SIDE. THE ZAIREANS ARE TARGETING ONLY SELECTED CAMP(S) FOR VACATION TO START WITH AND ARE AWAITING INTERNATIONAL RESPONSE. THE RPA AND THE GOVT OF RWANDA HAVE SO FAR HANDLED THE SITUATION WITH RESTRAINT AND UNAMIR IS HELPING THE MOVEMENT OF REFUGEES FROM THE BORDER TO NEARBY TRANSIT CAMPS. WITH SCARCE RESOURCES UNAMIR ITSELF WILL FIND IT VERY DIFFICULT IF THE PACE OF FORCIBLE REPATRIATION CONTINUES.

B. ACTIVITIES OF ALL UN AGENCIES AND NGOS IS BEING COORDINATED FOR EFFECTIVE RESOURCE CONTROL AND EVACUATION OF REFUGEES FROM THE BORDER AREAS TO TRANSIT CAMPS. THE SITUATION IS BEING CLOSELY WATCHED.

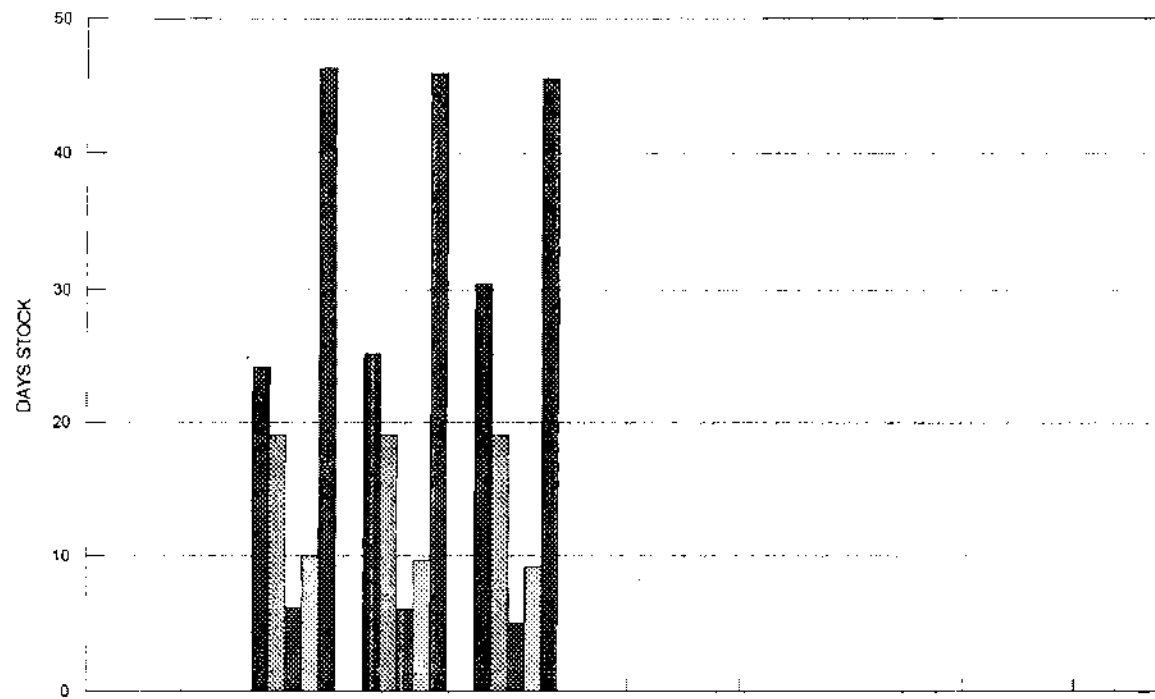

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS, ESPECIALLY ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINED TENSE. ZAIRE BEGAN PUSHING BACK REFUGEES INTO RWANDA ESPECIALLY OPPOSITE TO GOMA AND BUKAVU WHERE A TOTAL OF 2493 REFUGEES HAVE BEEN FORCIBLY PUSHED BACK BETWEEN 20 AND 21 AUG 95.

B. BORDER CROSSING: A TOTAL OF 3523 RETURNEES OF WHICH 1030 SPONTANEOUS AND 2493 FORCED, WAS RECORDED FOR THE WEEK.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE PRESIDENT OF UGANDA'S VISIT TO RWANDA

1. PRESIDENT YOWERI MUSEVENI OF UGANDA ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 14 AUGUST FOR A THREE-DAY OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA DURING WHICH HE MET WITH SENIOR RWANDESE OFFICIALS AND ADDRESSED THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY.

2. THE PRESIDENT OF UGANDA IN A SPEECH BEFORE THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY ON 14 AUGUST, APPEALED TO THE RWANDESE POPULATION TO AVOID SECTARIAN AND DIVISIVE TENDENCIES AND TO FORGE UNITY AMONG THEMSELVES. HE ALSO RECOMMENDED THAT IN ORDER TO STRENGTHEN THE RWANDESE ECONOMY, THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SHOULD PROMOTE THE PRIVATISATION OF STATE ENTERPRISES.

3. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, PRESIDENT MUSEVENI DELIVERED A SPEECH TO THE POPULATION OF GISENYI IN NORTH-WESTERN RWANDA, IN WHICH HE STATED THAT HE WOULD DO HIS UTMOST TO PREVENT THE INFILTRATION OF MEMBERS OF THE FORMER RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FORCES INTO RWANDA ALONG THE COMMON BORDER BETWEEN RWANDA, UGANDA AND ZAIRE. HE REPORTEDLY FURTHER ADDED THAT ALTHOUGH THESE FORCES WERE SUPPORTED BY FOREIGN POWERS, THEY WOULD NEVER BE ABLE TO WIN A WAR AGAINST THE CURRENT RWANDESE GOVERNMENT.

4. THE SRSG ATTENDED A PUBLIC ADDRESS GIVEN BY THE UGANDAN PRESIDENT AT THE MAIN STADIUM IN KIGALI ON 16 AUGUST IN WHICH THE UGANDAN LEADER REAFFIRMED HIS SUPPORT FOR RWANDA IN THE FACE OF GROWING THREATS OF DESTABILISATION FROM FORMER GOVERNMENT ELEMENTS. THE SRSG WAS ALSO PRESENT AT KIGALI AIRPORT TO BID FAREWELL TO MR. MUSEVENI UPON HIS DEPARTURE FROM RWANDA AT THE END OF HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO THE COUNTRY.

5. THE PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA AND UGANDA SIGNED A JOINT COMMUNIQUE ON 16 AUGUST IN KIGALI OUTLINING AREAS OF BILATERAL COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. THEY ALSO

CALLED FOR THE SPEEDY OPERATIONALISATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, THE CONVENING OF A REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, THE NEED FOR REGIONAL INTEGRATION AND MODERNIZATION, AS WELL AS AN END TO DIVISIVE AND SECTARIAN POLITICS BASED UPON RELIGIOUS AND ETHNIC FACTORS.

**B. OTHER DEVELOPMENTS IN RWANDA**

1. THE U.S. ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR INTERNATIONAL SECURITY AFFAIRS, MR. JOSEPH NYE, LEFT KIGALI ON 14 AUGUST FOLLOWING A ONE-DAY OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA. HE REPORTEDLY HELD TALKS WITH SENIOR MILITARY OFFICIALS AND VISITED THE U.S. DEMINING TEAM OPERATING IN RWANDA. THE U.S. DEPUTY ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR AFRICAN AFFAIRS, MR. VINCENT KERN, WAS ALSO ON AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA UNTIL 17 AUGUST.

2. ON 15 AUGUST, THE SRSG, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, RETURNED TO KIGALI FROM LEAVE AND RESUMED HIS OFFICIAL DUTIES.

3. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING ON 17 AUGUST WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM U.N. AGENCIES AND THE ICRC TO DISCUSS MEASURES AIMED AT IMPROVING CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS. HE ALSO MET WITH THE DEPUTY PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE ON THE TRIBUNAL'S OPERATIONS. LATER, HE HELD A MEETING WITH UNAMIR STAFF TO DISCUSS RADIO UNAMIR AND ITS TRANSMITTING CAPABILITIES INTO REFUGEE CAMPS NEIGHBOURING RWANDA.

4. ON 17 AUGUST, THE SRSG ATTENDED THE SWEARING-IN CEREMONY OF THE SIX REMAINING DEPUTIES OF THE 70-MEMBER TRANSITIONAL NATIONAL ASSEMBLY IN RWANDA. THE DEPUTIES BELONGED TO THE FOLLOWING GROUPS: RWANDESE PATRIOTIC FRONT (1), SOCIAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY (2), LIBERAL PARTY (1) AND NATIONAL ARMY (1). THE DEPUTY REPRESENTING THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLICAN MOVEMENT (MDR) WAS ABSENT AT THE CEREMONY.

**3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.**

**A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.**

(1) SECTOR 1 GITARAMA REPORTED THAT THE PRIME MINISTER HAS ANNOUNCED THAT ALL LOCAL DEFENCE FORCES (LDF) WOULD BE DISSOLVED AND THAT ALL CONCERNED WERE EXPECTED TO TURN IN THEIR IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

(2) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT AT NYAMASHEKE SUB SECTOR, JOINT PATROLLING IS BEING UNDERTAKEN AT NIGHT BY THE LOCALS ALONG WITH THE RPA. SIMILAR PATROL WAS REPORTED AT CYANGUGU SUB SECTOR.

(3) SECTOR 3B MILOB REPORTED THAT AROUND 1830 HRS ON 14 AUG 95, SIX VANS LOADED WITH TROOPS AND LUGGAGE WERE SEEN REFUELLING AT THEIR GARAGE IN BUTARE AND

LATER OBSERVED HEADING TOWARDS GIKONGORO. PRESUMABLY HEADING FOR THE ZAIRIAN BORDER.

(4) IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI A RPA PATROL BROKE INTO A HOUSE ON 18 AUG 95 AT 0300 HRS WHERE THEY SUSPECTED FRGF TROOPS WERE HIDING. THE RPA OPENED FIRE AND KILLED THREE PERSONS. HR INFORMED.

(5) ON 18 AUG 95 CIVPOL AND MILOBS CONFIRMED THAT THREE PEOPLE DIED DURING AN EXPLOSION AT GISENYI PARK AT 0400 HRS. IT IS SUSPECTED TO BE CARRIED OUT BY RPA UNDER COVER OF MILITIA.

**B. MILITIA/FRGF/BANDITRY.**

(1) IN SECTOR 4 CYANGUGU A GROUP OF 3 BANDITS KILLED A WOMAN AND HER SON WITH A GRENADE IN NYAKABUYE SECTOR (8917). WHEN THE LOCALS RAISED AN ALARM THEY FLED. NO ITEMS WERE REPORTED STOLEN. THE BANDITS ARE SUSPECTED TO BE FROM WITHIN THE LOCALITY.

(2) A COMBINED PATROL OF MILOBS AND UNHCR CONFIRMED THE REPORTS OF INFILTRATION OF ARMED PERSONS IN RUKARA COMMUNE (SQ 5601) FROM TANZANIA MOSTLY IN THE LAST MONTH. IT IS FURTHER REPORTED THAT A NUMBER OF LOCALS WERE KILLED DURING THE INCURSIONS IN THE SAME PERIOD. EXTENT OF THREAT, FREQUENCY AND IDENTITY BEING INVESTIGATED.

(3) SECTOR 4 MILOB CYANGUGU REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 1000 HRS ON 10 AUG 95, A GROUP OF 6 BANDITS ATTACKED A HOUSE IN MPMGA SECTOR SQ 9408 IN BUGARAMA COMMUNE. THE BANDITS ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM BURUNDI AND WERE REPORTEDLY ARMED WITH SMALL ARMS AND MACHETES. THEY SHOT AND KILLED A MAN AND FLED INTO BURUNDI WITH 3 COWS.

(4) TWO INCIDENTS INVOLVING EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN FRGF AND RPA OCCURRED ON 16 AUG 95 IN THE GISHWATI FOREST GR 2979, IN GISENYI SECTOR. THESE INCIDENTS SEEM TO CONFIRM THE PRESENCE OF INTERHAMWE IN THIS FOREST.

(5) IN GISENYI THE RPA LO REPORTED THAT A SEARCH WAS CONDUCTED IN GISHWATI FOREST. SOME HAND GRENADES, ANTI-TANK AND SOME ANTI-PERSONAL MINES WERE RECOVERED.

(6) IN GISENYI AREA A NGO VEHICLE (MEMISA) HIT A MINE ON 18 AUG 95 RESULTING IN DEATH OF DTWO PERSONNEL AND ONE INJURED. IT SEEMS THAT THIS NGO WAS TARGETED.

(7) TWO AIRCRAFT OVERFLIGHTS WERE OBSERVED OVER KAMEMBE SECTOR ON 16 AUG AT 10 30 AND ON 17 AUG AT 0900 HRS. THE AIRCRAFT IS BELIEVED TO BE A B-N 2 ISLANDER.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) AT A MEDAL PARADE CEREMONY PRESIDED OVER BY THE FORCE COMMANDER, 238 PERSONNEL OF INDBATT RECEIVED THEIR MEDALS. ALSO PRESENT AT THE OCCASION WERE US AMBASSADOR IN RWANDA, H.E. MR. RAWSON, AND VARIOUS CIVIL AND MILITARY OFFICIALS FROM FORCE HQ. INDBATT ALSO DONATED BEDS AND FOODSTUFFS CONTRIBUTED BY THE OFFICERS AND MEN TO MISSIONARIES OF CHARITY ORPHANAGE IN KIGALI.

(3) MILOBS CONTINUED PATROLLING THE AOR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) REPORTED THAT THE "SISTERS CONGREGATION", A VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATION FROM ITALY, HAS ASSUMED CONTROL OF THE HEALTH CENTRE IN THE MUHURA COMMUNE AS THE NGO "INTER-SOS" HAS MOVED TO KIBUYE. THE HEALTH CENTRE CONTINUES TO RELY ON SUPPORT FROM "CARITAS" AND "REGION SANITAIRE" BASED IN BYUMBA. THE AUTHORITIES FORESEE THE REQUIREMENT FOR AN AMBULANCE ONCE "INTER-SOS" MOVES OUT COMPLETELY.

B. MEMBERS FROM OP SPT COY CONDUCTED A FAREWELL VISIT TO MADAME CARR ORPHANAGE (SECTOR 5 GS 3122). DURING THE VISIT A CHEQUE FOR AUS \$ 2000 WAS PRESENTED TO MADAME CARR. THE DONATION CAME FROM MONEY RAISED BY A SPECIALIST SURGEON WHO SERVED WITH FIRST AUSMED CONTINGENT.

C. SECTOR 2A MILOBS REPORTED THAT WFP AND ADRA DISTRIBUTED VARIOUS FOOD ITEMS TO RETURNEES AT KAGITUMBA SECTOR (GR 431756). ADRA WAS ALSO REHABILITATING RUGARAMA (GR 457773) AND KAGITUMBA (GR 458808) PRIMARY SCHOOLS. IT WAS ENGAGED IN PROVIDING MEDICARE FOR THE RETURNEES IN NYAGATARE RECEPTION CENTRE. ADRA ALSO DISTRIBUTED A VARIETY OF FOOD ITEMS TO LOCALS OF CYUNGO COMMUNE ON 12 AUG 95 WHILST AMREF CONDUCTED VACCINATION AGAINST THE SIX CHILDHOOD KILLER DISEASES IN THE SAME COMMUNE ON 08 AUG 95.

D. IN SECTOR 2A BYUMBA WORLD VISION IS RUNNING THE BWISIGE DISPENSARY, WHICH IS EXPERIENCING SHORTAGE OF ELECTRICITY, WATER AND DRUGS. IN CYUMBA COMMUNE AMREF IS OPERATING AND PROVIDING BUILDING MATERIALS TO THE COMMUNE. THERE IS ONLY ONE HEALTH CENTRE IN THE COMMUNE WHICH DOES NOT HAVE ELECTRICITY, WATER AND ADEQUATE STAFF TO MAN IT.

E. UNAMIR UNITS PROVIDED VEHICLES FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD, FOOD ITEMS AND OTHERS.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. CIVPOL REPORTED THAT THE FORMER BOURGMESTRE OF MUKO COMMUNE IN GIKONGORO WHO WAS REPLACED FOR HIS INABILITY TO

SOLVE THE PROBLEM OF LOCALS HAS BEEN PLACED IN CUSTODY AS A RESULT OF HIS INVOLVEMENT IN LAST YEAR GENOCIDE.

B. MILOBS IN GISENYI REPORTED THAT 35 RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI WERE TRANSPORTED TO KIBAYI BY UNHCR. RETURNEES OBSERVED WERE MOSTLY WOMEN AND CHILDREN WITH FEW OLD MEN.

C. ON 20 AUG 95 ZAIRE BEGAN PUSHING BACK HOME FORCIBLY RWANDESE REFUGEES. ON THAT DATE 42 RWANDAN ALLEGED TO BE THIEVES WERE FORCIBLY REPATRIATED THROUGH RUSIZI 1 GR 7624 IN SECTOR 4, AND 181 EVICTED FROM MUGAMBA CAMP IN ZAIRE, WERE TURNED UP AT THE BORDER POST IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI. ON 21 AUG 95, APPROX 1102 REFUGEES WERE RECORDED IN SECTOR 4, AND 1173 IN SECTOR 5. A TOTAL OF 2,493 RETURNEES WERE FORCIBLY REPATRIATED.

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL.

A. A BOY OF 18 YEARS OLD WAS WASHED ASHORE LAKE KIVU ON 19 AUG 95 BY 1200 HRS IN SECTOR 5.

B. IN SECTOR 2 BYUMBA TWO BOYS BOTH AGED 18 DIED ON 14 AUG 95 AS A RESULT OF AN EXPLOSION OF SOME ORDNANCE DEVICE FOUND BY THE VICTIMS.

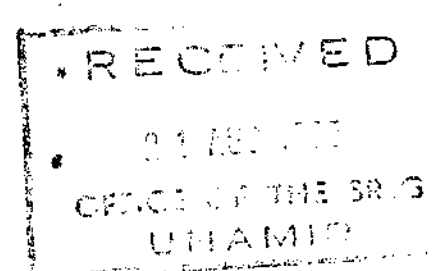

9. COMMENTS.

A. BANDITRY ACTIVITIES ARE IN THE INCREASE IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI. THE PRESENCE OF A GROUP OF INFILTRATORS IN THE GISHWATI FOREST IS VERY LIKELY NOTING THE FREQUENCY OF INCIDENTS IN THE AREA RECENTLY. THE ATTACK OF THE NGO MEMISA SEEMS TO BE WARNING THAT INFILTRATORS CAN HIT THE MOST VULNERABLE PEOPLE AT WILL.

B. THE SITUATION AT THE BORDER POSTS IN RUSIZI 1 AND GISENYI IS TENSE AND CONFUSING. ZAIRE APPEARS TO BE ATTEMPTING TO PUSH BACK THE REFUGEES INTO RWANDA AS AN EXCUSE TO EVICT UNDESIRABLE ELEMENTS FROM SOME CAMPS. THESE CAMPS HAVE PRESENTED A THREAT TO ZAIRE FOR BOTH SECURITY AND SOVEREIGNTY REASONS. WITH THE SUSPENSION OF THE ARMS EMBARGO, THE PROSPECTS OF THE RETURN OF THE FRG TO RWANDA IN THE NEAR FUTURE ARE REMOTE, WHILE PROSPECTS OF INCREASING PROBLEMS FOR ZAIRE QUITE LIKELY. SOURCES INDICATE THE REPATRIATION CURRENTLY UNDERWAY WILL CONTINUE. THE GREATEST THREAT TO RWANDA'S SECURITY WILL COME FROM ITS ABILITY TO HANDLE THE VOLUME OF RETURNEES, A THREAT TO BOTH ITS TERRITORIAL DEFENCE AND POLITICAL COHESION.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 44 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 2,573 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES NSTR.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. NSTR

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. MILOBS SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT ON 19 AUG AT ABOUT 0100 HRS THREE BANDITS CAME ON BOAT TO ISHART FROM IJWI WAY TO THE MAIN ROAD THERE WERE CHALLENGED BY THE RPA, NEAR ISHARA-NYAMASHEKE ROAD JUNCTION (GR 08417). BANDITS TRIED TO RUN AWAY. RPA OPENED FIRE AND KILLED ONE OF THEM. OTHER MANAGED TO ESCAPED.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. PATROLLING CARRIED OUT IN AOR AND SITUATION REPORTED CALM.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. GHANBATT DONATED SOME FOOD ITEMS TO KIBUNGO ORPHANAGE.

B IN SECTOR 2A AT MUHURA COMMUNE AN NGO NAMEDAS INTER SOS, CARRIED OUT A VACCINATION PROGRAMME TO 200 CHILDREN OF AGES BETWEEN 4 AND 9 MONTHS. THE TARGETED FIGURE IS ABOUT 1000 AND THE PROGRAMME WILL CONTINUE AT COMPLETION.

C. AT KINYAMI COMMUNE IN SECTOR 2A THERE IS ONLY ONE HEALTH CENTRE WHICH IS RUNNING SHORTAGE OF WATER AND THE STAFFS HAVE TO BUY THE WATER AT THE COST OF 30 RFR TO SUSTAIN THE CENTRE. "PAM" THE ONLY NGO WORKING HERE TODAY DISTRIBUTED FOOD AMONG THE PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHERS.

D. A TOTAL OF 137 LOCALS PATIENTS WERE TREATED IN AOR.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. IN SECTOR 5B THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION HELD A

BN COMMANDERS, BDE COMMANDER GENDAMARIE, UNHCR STAFF AT GISENYI AND THE CHIEF OF UNHCR FROM KIGALI. THE AGENDA OF MEETING WAS TO WORK OUT THE METHODOLOGY TO ACCOMMODATE THE LARGE NUMBER OF RETURNEES ARRIVING AT THE BORDER.

B. IN SECTOR 4 ON 19 AUG 95 IN THE AFTERNOON A GROUP OF 42 RWANDAN REFUGEES ALLEGED TO BE THIEVES BY THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES WERE FORCIBLY PUSHED INTO RWANDA AT RUSIZI 1 GR 7624. THE REFUGEES WERE BROUGHT ALL TIED UP AND CHAINED BY THE ZAIRIAN SOLDIER ACCOMPANYING THEM. THEY WERE GENERALLY YOUNG MEN OF 20 - 30 YEARS OF AGE AND WERE MAINLY HUTUS. THEY WERE DISMOUNT AT THE GUN POINT AND WERE FORCED TO ENTER INTO RWANDA. RPA ON THE SPOT OBJECTED BUT FAILED TO DO ANYTHING AND REFUGEES WERE TAKEN INTO THE RWANDAN SIDE BY THE RPA AND AN ATTEMPT BY THE UNHCR TO CONTACT THEM OR TO KNOW WHERE THEY WERE BEING TAKEN WERE WARDED OFF BY ANGRY RPA SOLDIERS, WHO TOLD THE UNHCR STAFF TO GO AWAY. SUBSEQUENTLY THE RETURNEES WERE TAKEN AWAY BY THE RPA AT ABOUT 1830 HR'S TO AN UNKNOWN DESTINATION. ATTEMPTS TO KNOW THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE RETURNEES ON 20 AUG 95 BY OWN PATROLS AND OTHER AGENCIES HAVE ALSO PROVED FUTILE. DETAILS BEING FOUND OUT.

C. AT ABOUT 1800 HR'S ON 19 AUG MILOB CAME TO KNOW THAT A LARGE SCALE OF RETURNEES WHO HAD TURNED UP AT THE BORDER POST NO - 1. TWO TEAMS WERE SENT IMMEDIATELY AND WAS CONFIRMED THAT ABOUT 150 - 200 RETURNEES WERE AT THE BORDER POST. RETURNEES INFORMED MILOB THAT THEY WERE FORCIBLY EVICTED FROM THE MUGUMBA CAMP AT ZAIRE BY THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES. THE RETURNEES WERE ALLOWED TO ENTER AT THE BORDER (POST BUT KEPT AT SECURITY HOUSE FOR THE NIGHT. THIS WAS INFORMED TO ALL CONCERN INCLUDING THE RPA BN COMMANDER WHO LATER SAID THAT THIS WAS A NORMAL OCCURRENCE. HOWEVER THE SECTOR MILOBS, HR TEAMS, UNHCR AND THE NGO'S WERE ACTIVATED TODAY AT 0600 HR'S TO MONITOR THE SITUATION AT BOTH THE BORDER POST. IT WAS LEARNT THAT APPROX 180 RETURNEES WERE PRESENT AT BORDER POST NO - 1 (GR 159126) WAITING TO BE CLEARED. HOWEVER ONLY 14 RETURNEES WERE FORMALLY REGISTERED ON 20 AUG 95 AS AT 1500 HR'S. A TOTAL OF 127 RETURNEES WERE TRANSFERRED TO KABALE TRANSIT CAMP ( GR 3018 ). 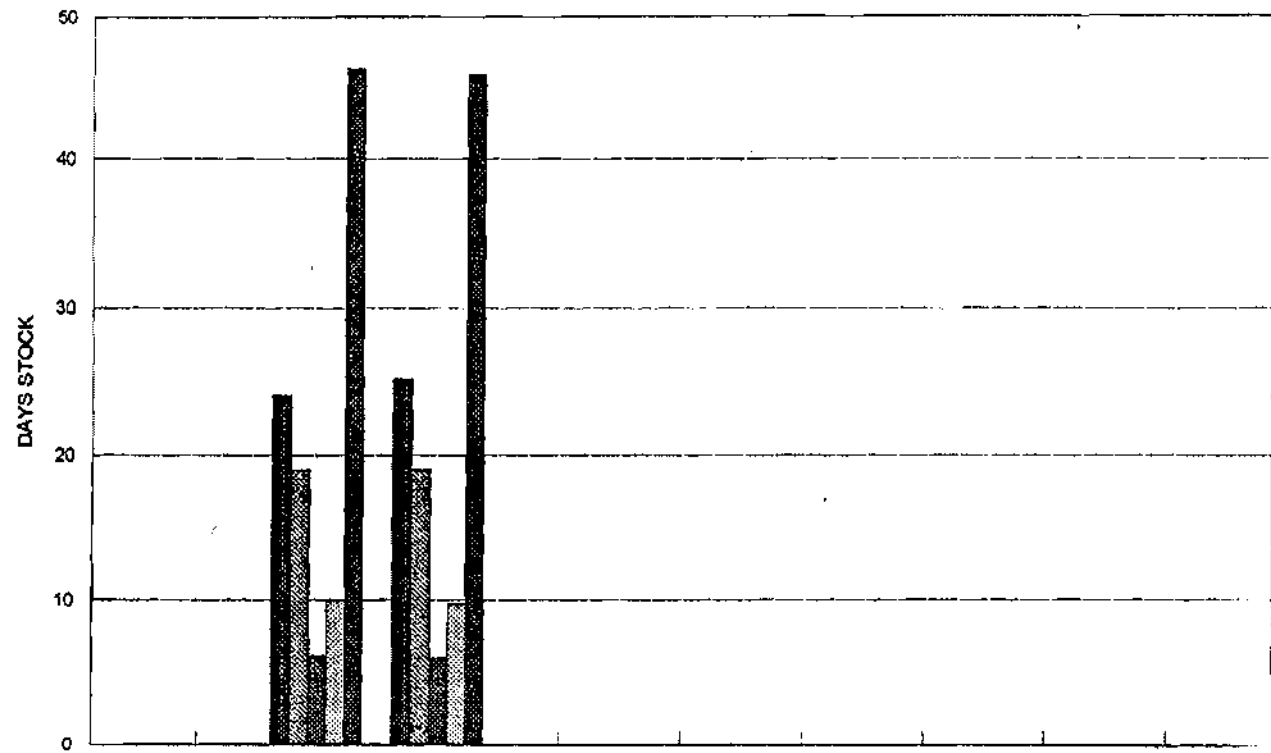

RETURNEES INFORMED MILOB THAT THEY WERE FORCIBLY EVICTED FROM THE MUGUMBA CAMP AT ZAIRE BY THE ZAIRIAN AUTHORITIES. THE RETURNEES WERE ALLOWED TO ENTER AT THE BORDER [POST BUT KEPT AT SECURITY HOUSE FOR THE NIGHT. THIS WAS INFORMED TO ALL CONCERN INCLUDING THE RPA BN COMMANDER WHO LATER SAID THAT THIS WAS A NORMAL OCCURRENCE. HOWEVER THE SECTOR MILOBS, HR TEAMS, UNHCR AND THE NGO'S WERE ACTIVATED TODAY AT 0600 HR'S TO MONITOR THE SITUATION AT BOTH THE BORDER POST. 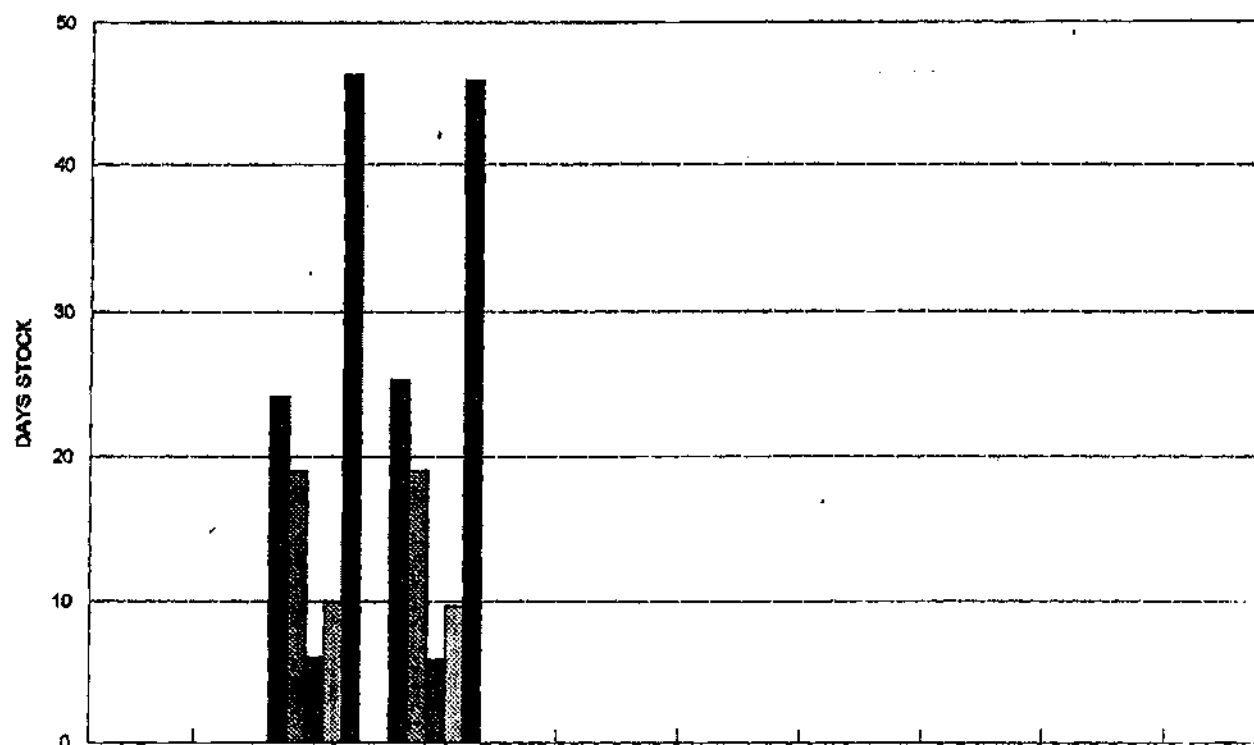

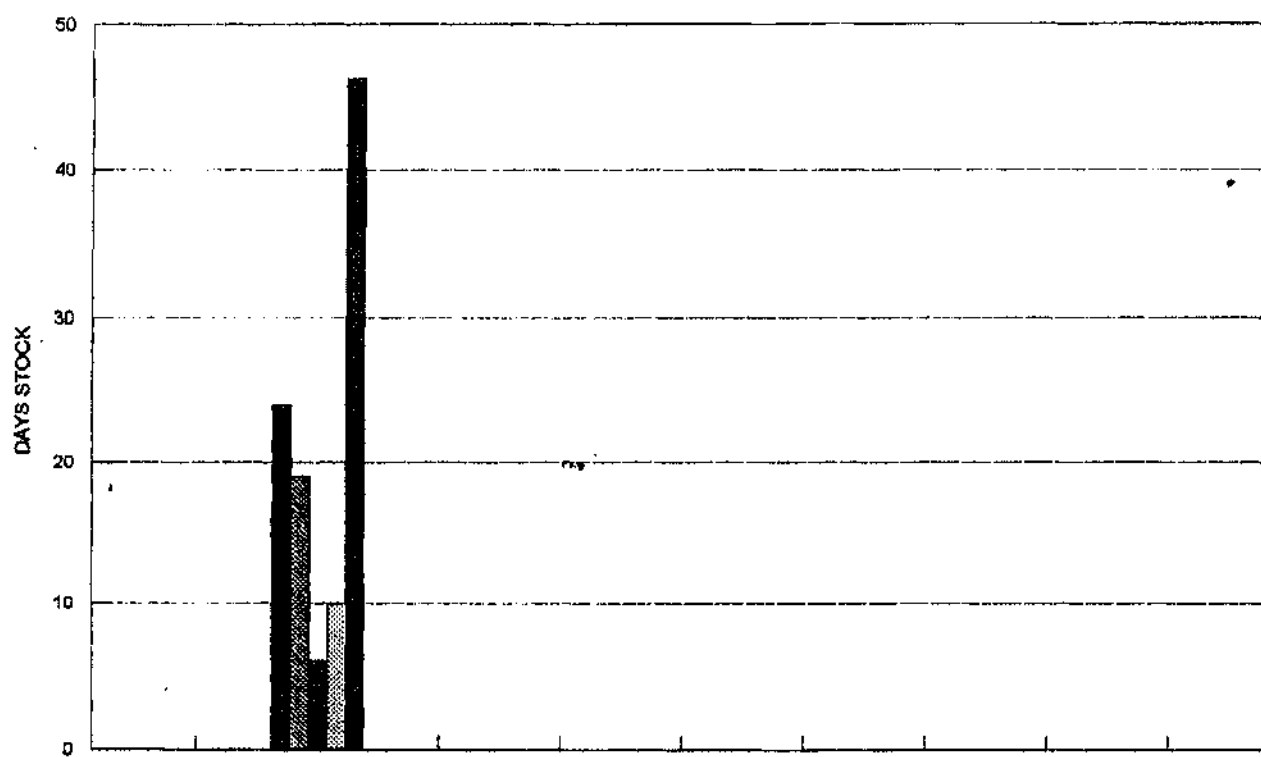

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 76 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 2,407 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES YESTERDAY, THE SRSG ATTENDED THE SWEARING-IN-CEREMONY OF THE SIX REMAINING DEPUTIES OF THE 70-MEMBER TRANSITIONAL NATIONAL ASSEMBLY IN RWANDA. THE DEPUTIES BELONG TO THE FOLLOWING GROUPS: RWANDESE PATRIOTIC FRONT (1), SOCIAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY (2), LIBERAL PARTY (1) AND NATIONAL ARMY (1). THE DEPUTY REPRESENTING THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLICAN MOVEMENT (MDR) WAS ABSENT AT THE CEREMONY.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) RPA IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO) REPORTED TO HAVE CARRIED OUT A LARGE NUMBER OF ARRESTS OF LOCALS AT MUGUBA (5202) AND RWAMILO (4914) COMMUNES ON 17 AUG 95. REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS WERE YET TO BE CONFIRMED AND THE NUMBERS ARRESTED AND/OR DETAINED HAVE NOT BEEN DISCLOSED. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

(2) SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT AN RPA PATROL BROKE INTO A HOUSE AT 0300 HRS ON 18 AUG 95 WHERE THEY SUSPECTED FRGF TROOPS WERE HIDING. THEY HAD VISITED THE HOUSE AT 1900 HRS THE PREVIOUS EVENING BUT RETURNED IN THE MORNING AND DEMANDED THAT THE HOUSE BE SEARCHED. THE OCCUPANTS OF THE HOUSE REFUSED TO OPEN THE DOOR BUT INSTEAD THREW A GRENADE. THE RPA OPENED FIRE AND KILLED THREE OCCUPANTS AND ARRESTED ONE. MILOB PATROL COULD NOT FIND EVIDENCE OF A GRENADE IN THE AREA AND NO WEAPONS WERE RECOVERED FROM THE HOUSE. THE RPA CLAIM THAT ONE FRGF WAS KILLED AND ANOTHER ARRESTED AND WAS BEING INTERROGATED. HUMAN RIGHTS ARE INVESTIGATING.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. IN SECTOR 5 GISENYI, A NGO VEHICLE (MEMISA) HIT A MINE ON THE MAIN ROAD BETWEEN KAYOVE AND KIBUYE. TWO PEOPLE WERE INJURED, BUT FINALLY ONE DIED, AT MURUNDA HOSPITAL, ONE IN KIGALI AFTER BEING EVAC BY AIR.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - INDBATT TRANSPORTED 10 TONS OF FOOD IN THE NYABIKENKE COMMUNE (7292) AND 5 TONS OF FOOD FROM GITARAMA TO MUGINA COMMUNE (9267). UNHCR VEHICLES CONTINUED DELIVERY OF WFP FOOD FROM GITARAMA TO THE VARIOUS COMMUNES.

B. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) - ACCORD (NGO) IS REBUILDING SCHOOLS IN NGARAMA COMMUNE AND IS ALSO PROVIDING SEEDS AND SECOND- HAND CLOTHES TO THE NEEDY. ADRA (NGO) IS RUNNING A FOOD-FOR-WORK PROGRAM BY RECONSTRUCTING THE ROADS. ICRC IN THEIR PARENT TRACE PROGRAM WILL HAVE 6 OF THE 184 ORPHANS AT THE NGARAMA CHILDREN'S HOME REUNITED WITH THEIR PARENTS ON 26 AUG 95. IN BUYOGA COMMUNE, PAM (NGO), YESTERDAY DISTRIBUTED FOOD TO 148 SCHOOL TEACHERS IN THE COMMUNE AND WILL CONTINUE ON A MONTHLY BASIS. WFP HAS ALSO EMBARKED ON A FOOD-FOR-WORK PROGRAM TO FIX THE ROADS IN THE COMMUNE.

C. SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) - BOURGEMESTRE OF MARABA COMMUNE REPORTED THAT WFP DISTRIBUTED FOOD ITEMS LIKE MAIZE AND BEANS THREE MONTHS AGO AND HAD PROMISED TO RETURN. THEY WERE YET TO SHOW UP. THERE ARE 104 PRISONERS IN THE MARABA COMMUNE PRISON.

D. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) - SWEDISH NGO PENTECOST RECEIVED A SWEDISH GOVERNMENT GRANT OF RFr 200,000 RECENTLY. THE HOSPITAL HAS 50 BEDS AND TREATS AN AVERAGE OF 200 PATIENTS DAILY. THE CLINIC AT NKUNKU WAS FOUND TO BE OPERATING NORMALLY BY MSF. IT HAS 20 BEDS.

E. 37 IDPS ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP. 12 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR. 156 ARE AWAITING EVAC.

F. SIGCOY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FOOD ITEMS.

G. 108 PATIENTS WERE TREATED IN THE AREA.

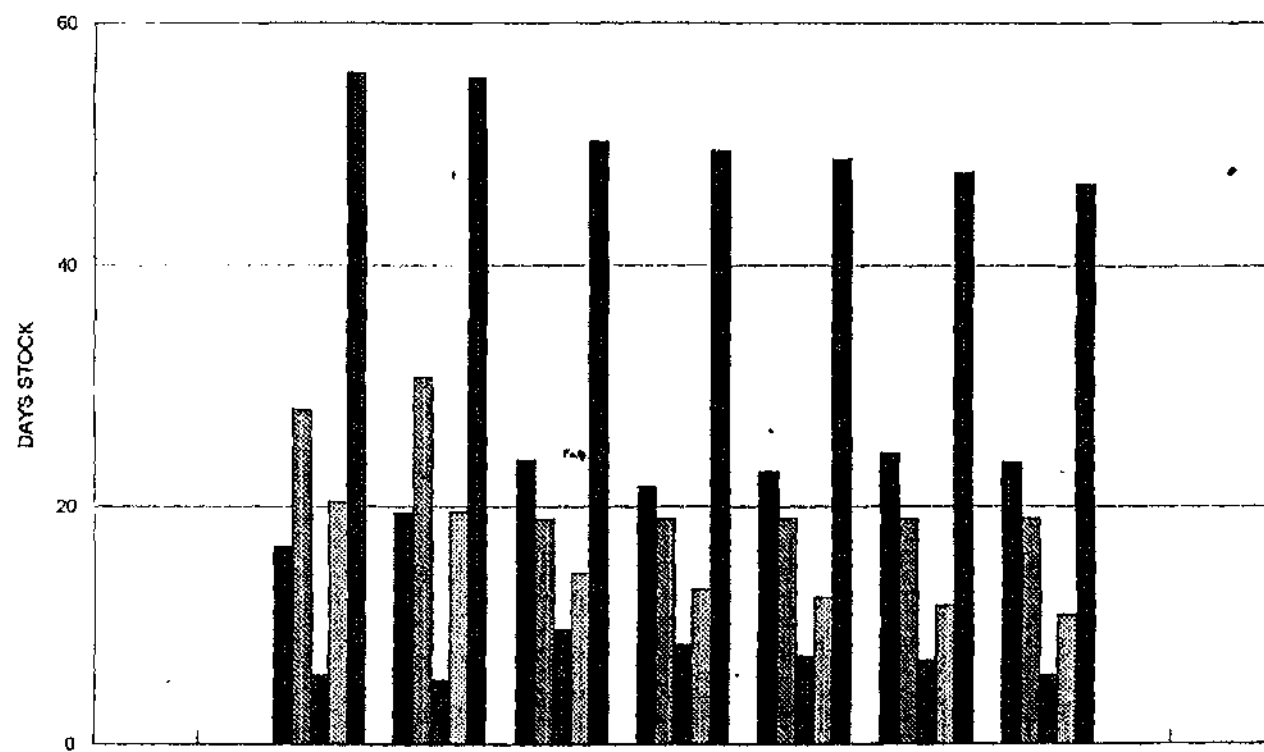

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING TODAY WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM U.N. AGENCIES AND THE ICRC TO DISCUSS MEASURES AIMED AT IMPROVING CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS. HE ALSO MET WITH THE DEPUTY PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA TO RECEIVE AN UPDATE ON THE TRIBUNAL'S OPERATIONS. LATER, HE HELD A MEETING WITH UNAMIR STAFF TO DISCUSS RADIO UNAMIR AND ITS TRANSMITTING CAPABILITIES INTO REFUGEE CAMPS NEIGHBOURING RWANDA.

B. THE PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA AND UGANDA SIGNED A JOINT COMMUNIQUE YESTERDAY IN KIGALI OUTLINING AREAS OF BILATERAL COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES. THEY ALSO CALLED FOR THE SPEEDY OPERATIONALISATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, THE CONVENING OF A REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON SECURITY, THE NEED FOR REGIONAL INTEGRATION AND MODERNIZATION, AS WELL AS AN END TO DIVISIVE AND SECTARIAN POLITICS BASED ON RELIGIOUS AND ETHNIC FACTORS.

INTIMIDATING THE LOCAL STAFF AND CALLING UNHCR FOREIGN STAFF CRIMINALS WHO ARE AIDING IN THE PERPETRATION OF CRIMES. MATTER BEING TAKEN UP WITH APPROPRIATE GOVT AUTHORITIES.

(4) IN GIHIGANO (9301) NEAR BUGARAMA CITY ALSO IN SECTOR 4, RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BURNT DOWN A HOUSE BELONGING TO A LOCAL. IT WAS ALLEGED THAT THE MAN REFUSED TO MEET RPA'S DEMAND WHICH WAS NOT MADE KNOWN. ANOTHER LOCAL WHO TRIED TO ASSIST TO PUT OFF THE FIRE WAS BEATEN UP.

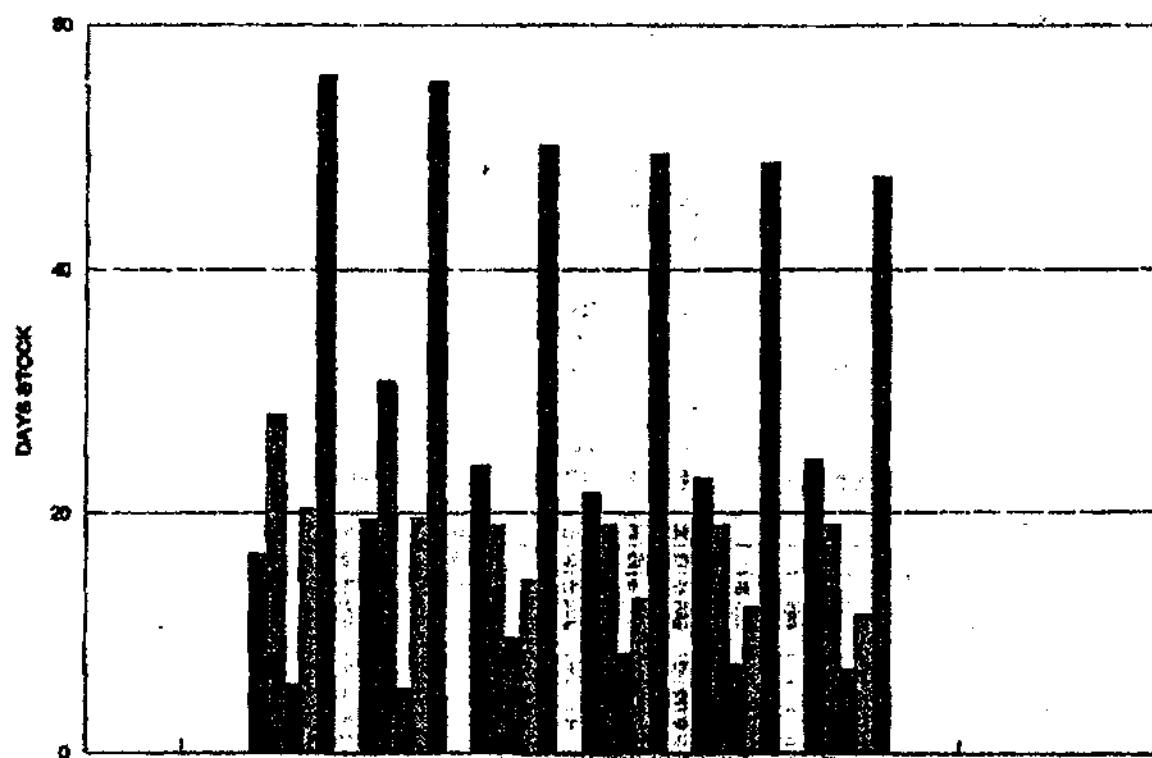

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE PRESIDENT OF UGANDA, MR YOWERI MUSEVENI, DELIVERED A SPEECH TO THE POPULATION OF GISENYI IN NORTH-WESTERN RWANDA, IN WHICH HE STATED THAT HE WOULD DO HIS UTMOST TO PREVENT THE INFILTRATION OF MEMBERS OF THE FORMER RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FORCES INTO RWANDA ALONG THE COMMON BORDER BETWEEN RWANDA, UGANDA AND ZAIRE. HE REPORTEDLY FURTHER ADDED THAT ALTHOUGH THESE FORCES WERE SUPPORTED BY FOREIGN POWERS, THEY WOULD NEVER BE ABLE TO WIN A WAR AGAINST THE CURRENT RWANDESE GOVERNMENT.

B. THE SRSG ATTENDED A PUBLIC ADDRESS GIVEN BY THE UGANDAN PRESIDENT AT THE MAIN STADIUM IN KIGALI TODAY IN WHICH THE UGANDAN LEADER REAFFIRMED HIS SUPPORT FOR RWANDA IN THE FACE OF GROWING THREATS OF DESTABILISATION FROM FORMER GOVERNMENT ELEMENTS. THE SRSG WAS ALSO PRESENT AT KIGALI AIRPORT TO BID FAREWELL TO MR MUSEVENI UPON HIS DEPARTURE FROM RWANDA AT THE END OF HIS OFFICIAL VISIT TO THE COUNTRY.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 2, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT AN RPA SOLDIER FROM 201 BDE ATTEMPTED TO INFILTRATE INTO TPS LIVING AREA AT 1820 HRS. HE WAS ARRESTED AND HANDED OVER TO RPA AUTHORITY.

(2) IN SECTOR 1B, THE RPA BDE COMD HAD AN EXTENSIVE MEETING WITH THE SECTOR COMMANDER IN WHICH MATTERS PERTAINING TO SECURITY SITUATION AND CURRENT OCCURRENCES IN THE AREA WERE DISCUSSED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 1, GITARAMA RPA BDE COMD CONFIRMED THAT NUMEROUS ACTS OF SABOTAGE HAD BEEN COMMITTED IN GITARAMA

PREFECTURE. THESE INCLUDED THE FOLLOWING:

(A) EMPTYING OF OIL FROM SIX ELECTROGAS STATION TRANSFORMERS.

(B) SYSTEMATIC BURNING OF EUCALYPTUS FORESTS.

(C) BURNING OF RETURNEES HOUSES AND PLANTATIONS.

(D) SUSPECTED MOVEMENT OF INTERAHAMWE IN NYAKABANDA (GR 6597), NYABIKENKE (GR 7292) AND KAYENZI (GR 8389) ARMED WITH RIFLES AND GRENADES

(2) TWO FIRE INCIDENTS OCCURRED ON 16 AUG 95 IN THE GISHWATI FOREST (GR 2979), IN GISENYI SECTOR. THESE INCIDENTS SEEM TO CONFIRM THE PRESENCE OF INTERHAMWE IN THE FOREST.

(3) ON 16 AUG AT 1030 HRS A TWIN ENGINE TURBO PROP AIRCRAFT OVERFLEW KAMEMBE SECTOR (GR 7825)

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) MILOBS WERE INFORMED BY UNHCR REP THAT ON MONDAY 14 AUG 95, 453 REFUGEES ENTERED RWANDA FROM BURUNDI AND MORE REFUGEES ARE BEEN EXPECTED ON 17 AUG 95.

B. IN SECTOR 1, GITARAMA INDBATT TRANSPORTED 08 TONS OF BRICKS FROM SHYGOE TO GITARAMA FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF LATRINES. 08 TONS OF WOOD WERE TRANSPORTED BY INDBATT FROM MUSHUBATI COMMUNE (GR 6770) TOM JAM INTERNATIONAL ORPHANAGE AT KABGAYA. UNHCR TRUCKS DELIVERED WFP FOOD FROM GITARAMA TO VARIOUS COMMUNES.

C. SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) MILOBS REPORTED ACR (NGO) IS BUILDING A HEALTH CENTRE AT TAMBWE (GR 227582) AND MSF IS REHABILITATING RUKOMO HEALTH CENTRE (GR 473276) BOTH OF MUVUMBA COMMUNE.

D. SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) REPORTED 19 PEOPLE ARRIVED AT NYAKARAMBI UNHCR TRANSIT CAMP FROM ZAIRE. THE CAMP HAS BEEN PROVIDED WITH A WATER TANK. THREE GHANBATT TRUCKS AND ONE UNHCR BUS FERRIED PEOPLE FROM RUSUMO TO NYARABUYE COMMUNE DURING THE VISIT OF THE UGANDAN PRESIDENT.

E. SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) REPORTED THAT AICF CLINIC INCHARGE

AT RUHASHYA COMMUNE REVEALED THE SHORTAGE OF DRUGS AND REQUESTED FOR 18 MATTRESSES AND ONE AMBULANCE. THE BOURGMESTRE OF THE SAME COMMUNE REVEALED THAT THEIR 150 PRISONERS IN RUHASHYA COMMUNE PRISON AND REQUESTED FOR, TRANSPORT TO TAKE 130 PRISONERS TO NYANZA PRISON AT NYABISINDU COMMUNE.

F. SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) MILOBS WERE INFORMED BY UNHCR REP THAT THE SECURITY OF REFUGEE CAMPS IN ZAIRE IS BEEN PROVIDED BY A FORCE CALLED " ZAIRIAN CONTINGENT FOR THE SECURITY OF THE CAMPS" WHICH IS BEEN PAID BY UNHCR. HE ALSO CONFIRMED THE SHIFTING OF THE CAMPS OPPOSITE CYNGUGU PREFECTURE IN-WARDS INTO ZAIRE WILL COMMENCE NEXT WEEK. THE RECONNAISSANCE TEAM FROM FORCE ENGINEERS CARRIED OUT THE SURVEY TASK AT THE MDM ORPHANAGE IN KAMEMBE (GR 179278). AT NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP, THERE WERE 44 NEW RETURNEES WHICH BROUGHT THE TOTAL NUMBER TO 103.

G. SECTOR 5B (KIBUYE) REGISTERED 60 RETURNEES IN THE ORGANIZED REPATRIATION.

H. 56 IDPs ARRIVED NDERA CAMP. 122 IDPs EVAC BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO AND BUTARE. A TOTAL OF 617 IDPs STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

H. 185 PATIENTS WERE TREATED.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. CIVPOL TEAM VISITED RUHASHYA CLINIC WITHIN THE COMMUNE AND FOUND ONE LOCAL WHO WAS BADLY BEATEN BY UNKNOWN PEOPLE AFTER HE WAS SUSPECTED OF BEING INTERHAMWE. THE TEAM EVACUATED THE LOCAL TO BUTARE HOSPITAL FOR FURTHER TREATMENT. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

B. IN SECTOR 5, RUHENGARI, THE BOURGMESTRE OF CYANINGO WAS ARRESTED SOME DAYS AGO. HE IS PRESENTLY DETAINED IN RUHENGARI PRISON. REASONS UNKNOWN. INVESTIGATIONS ON GOING.

C. SECTOR 4 (CYNGUGU) REPORTED THE FOLLOWING:

(1) A VEHICULAR ACCIDENT INVOLVING A TOYOTA PICKUP OF MINISTRY OF JUSTICE IN NYUNGWE FOREST AT (GR 086258). THE VEH CRASHED WHILE TRYING TO AVOID A PEDESTRIAN. ONE DIED AND 03 WERE INJURED AND EVACUATED TO BUSSHENGE HOSPITAL.

(2) THE MONKEY OBSERVATION POINT AT PINDURA (GR 1326) IN NYUNGWE FOREST WAS OPENED TO TOURISTS TODAY

6. SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL IN SECTOR 2A, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 14 TWO 8 YEARS OLD BOYS DIED AS A RESULT OF

AN EXPLOSION OF SOME ORDNANCE DEVICE THAT WAS FOUND BY THE VICTIMS AND LATER TAMPERED WITH THEREBY RESULTING IN THEIR DEATH. THE BOYS CAME FROM MURUMBA SECTOR OF KIYOMBE COMMUNE (GR 0840).

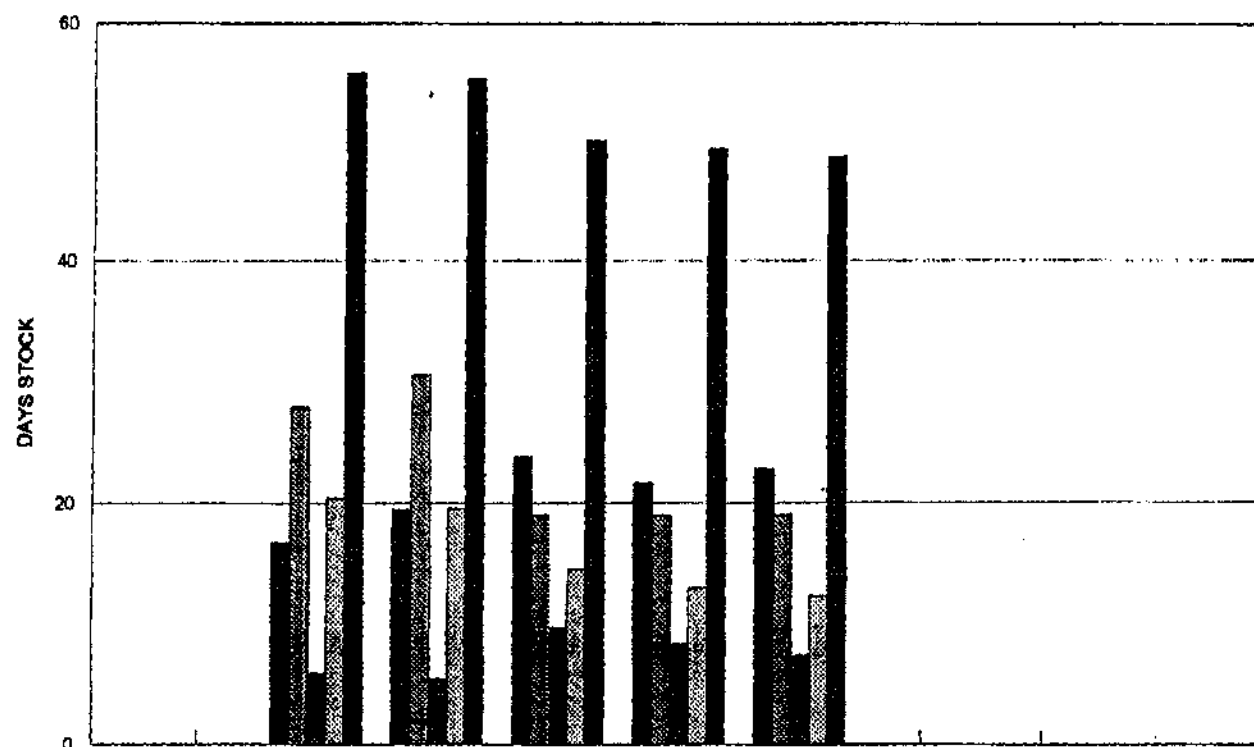

DAILY SITREP FOR 15 AUG 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY 49 AND TOTAL OUTFLOW NA.

(2) TOTAL FOR THE MONTH OF AUG TO DATE ARE INFLOW - 2,245 AND OUTFLOW - NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

A. YESTERDAY, THE SRSG, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, RETURNED TO KIGALI FROM LEAVE AND RESUMED DUTIES OFFICIALLY.

B. THE PRESIDENT OF UGANDA, MR YOWERI MUSEVENI, IN A SPEECH BEFORE THE RWANDESE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY YESTERDAY, APPEALED TO THE RWANDESE POPULATION TO AVOID SECTARIAN AND DIVISIVE TENDENCIES AND TO FORGE UNITY AMONG THEMSELVES. HE ALSO RECOMMENDED THAT IN ORDER TO STRENGTHEN THE RWANDESE ECONOMY, THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SHOULD PROMOTE THE PRIVATISATION OF STATE ENTERPRISES.

C. MILOB RUHENGARI REPORTED THAT THE PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA AND UGANDA WHILE GOING TO GISENYI STOPPED ON THE ROAD IN FRONT OF RUHENGARI PREFECT OFFICE FOR ABOUT 5 MINUTES TO GREET THE PEOPLE. AROUND 2,000 PEOPLE WERE PRESENT TO WELCOME BOTH THE PRESIDENTS ALONG THE ROAD.

D. SECTOR 5 (GISENYI) MILOB REPORTED THAT THE PRESIDENTS OF RWANDA AND UGANDA VISITED GISENYI TODAY. THEY ADDRESSED THE PEOPLE AT GISENYI STADIUM. THE UGANDAN PRESIDENT EXPRESSED HIS SUPPORT FOR THE POLICIES PURSUED BY THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT. HE ALSO CALLED FOR THE INTERNATIONAL SUPPORT IN THE PROSECUTION OF THOSE WHO COMMITTED THE GENOCIDE, ADDING THAT RWANDA SHOULD REFRAIN FROM A BLIND KIND OF REVENGE. HE HOWEVER STATED THAT THE INTERAHAMWE MUST STAY IN ZAIRE.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) MILOB FROM SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT AT NYAMASHEKE SUB SECTOR, JOINT PATROLLING IS BEING UNDERTAKEN AT NIGHT BY THE LOCALS ALONG WITH THE RPA. THIS COMMENCED APPROX ONE WEEK BACK. SIMILAR PATROL WAS REPORTED AT CYANGUGU SUB SECTOR.

(2) SECTOR 3B MILOB REPORTED THAT AROUND 1830 HRS ON 14 AUG 95, SIX VANS LOADED WITH TROOPS AND LUGGAGES WERE SEEN REFUELING AT THEIR GARAGE IN BUTARE AND LATER OBSERVED HEADING TOWARDS GIKONGORO. PRESUMABLY HEADING FOR THE ZAIRIAN BORDER.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) A COMBINED PATROL OF MILOBS AND UNHCR CONFIRMED THE REPORTS OF INFILTRATION OF ARMED PERSONS IN RUKARA COMMUNE (SQ 5601 ) FROM TANZANIA MOSTLY IN THE LAST MONTH. IT IS FURTHER REPORTED THAT A NUMBER OF LOCALS WERE KILLED DURING THE INCURSIONS IN THE SAME PERIOD. EXTENT OF THREAT, FREQUENCY AND IDENTITY BEING INVESTIGATED.

(2) SECTOR 4 MILOB CYANGUGU REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 1000 Hrs on 10 AUG 95, A GROUP OF 6 BANDITS ATTACKED A HOUSE IN MPMGA SECTOR SQ 9408 IN BUGARAMA COMMUNE. THE BANDITS ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE COME FROM BURUNDI AND WERE REPORTEDLY ARMED WITH SMALL ARMS AND MACHETES. THEY SHOT AND KILLED A MAN AND FLED INTO BURUNDI WITH 3 COWS.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES. NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. SECTOR 1A (KIGALI) MILOBS REPORTED THAT NORD SUD (NGO) CONTINUES TO ASSIST FARMERS IN RUSHASHI COMMUNE. AFRICARE IS PROVIDING MEDICINES TO THE CLINIC IN THE SAME COMMUNE.

B. SECTOR 2A MILOBS BYUMBA REPORTED THAT WORLD VISION RUNS THE BWISIGE DISPENSARY, WHICH IS EXPERIENCING SHORTAGE OF ELECTRICITY, WATER AND DRUGS. IN CYUMBA COMMUNE AMREF IS OPERATING AND PROVIDING BUILDING MATERIALS TO THE COMMUNE. THERE IS ONLY ONE HEALTH CENTER IN THE COMMUNE WHICH DOES NOT HAVE ELECTRICITY, WATER AND ADEQUATE STAFF TO MAN IT.

C. SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE SHORTAGE OF MEDICINE IN ZAZA HEALTH CENTRE (SQ 4859) RUN BY IMC IS STILL CONTINUES. ICRC DISTRIBUTED PLATES AND MUGS IN RUKARA COMMUNE (SQ 5601).

D. MILOBS FROM SECTOR 3B BUTARE REPORTED THAT THE STAFF MEMBERS OF KABILIZI CLINIC GR 5935 COMPLAINED THAT THEY LAST GOT THEIR WAGES IN MAY 95. THE CLINIC ALSO REQUESTED FOR WATER SUPPLY. A GERMAN NGO RHENANIE PALATINE HAS DONATED 1,500 PCS ROOFING TILES TO RUNYINYA COMMUNE WHICH ARE STILL LYING IN KIGALI. THE BOURGEMESTRE ASKED FOR ASSISTANCE TO TRANSPORT THE MATERIALS FROM KIGALI.

E. 64 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE. 40 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHR TO KIBUNGO. 214 ARE STILL WAITING FOR EVAC.

F. INDBATT PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FOR COOKING BRICKS AND SIG COY PROVIDED ONE TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FROM KIGESE TO KIBAYA AND FROM KIBAYA TO RUNDA.

H. 141 PATIENTS WERE TREATED.

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS.

A. MILOBS FROM SECTOR 5B GISENYI REPORTED THAT A TEAM FROM RADIO UNAMIR VISITED THE SECTOR TODAY. THEY CONDUCTED INTERVIEWS WITH VARIOUS LOCALS AND SOME NGOS.

B. SECTOR 4 MILOB REPORTED THAT VEHICLE TRUCK NUMBER TZ - 76983 CARRYING MEDICINE AND GROCERIES IS STILL AWAITING PERMISSION AT UVIRA 1 TO CROSS INTO ZAIRE.

C. MILOBS IN GISENYI REPORTED THAT 35 RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI WERE TRANSPORTED TO KIBAYI BY UNHCR. RETURNEES OBSERVED WERE MOSTLY WOMEN AND CHILDREN WITH FEW OLD MEN.

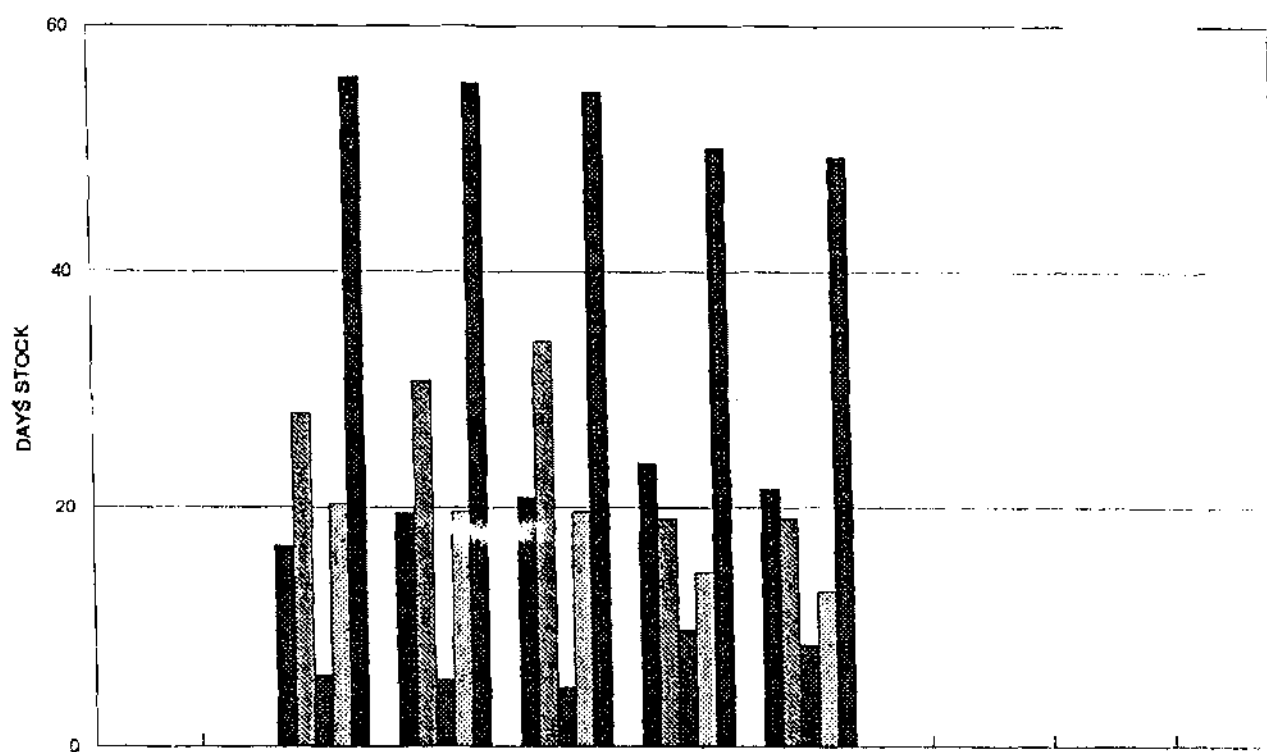

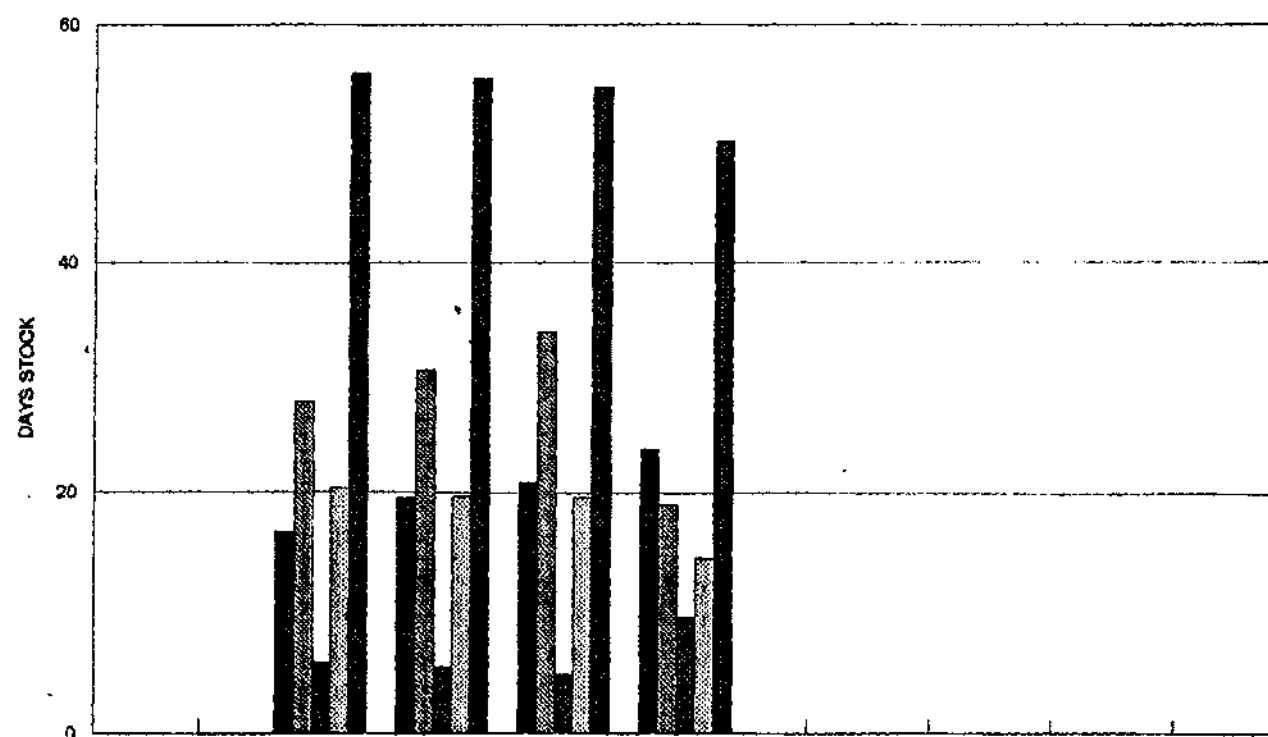

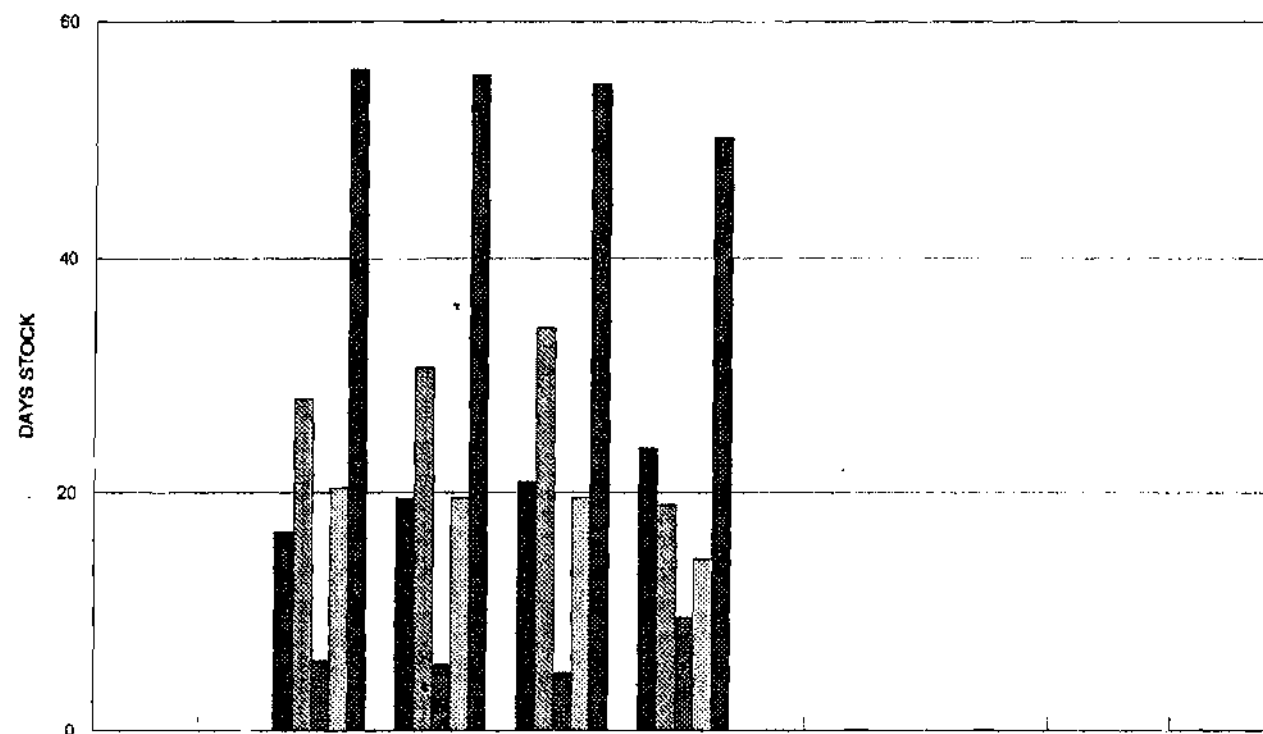
