CAMPAIGN FOR A PEACE TREATY BETWEEN THE U.S. AND NORTH KOREA (DPRK) AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SOUTH-NORTH (NORTH-SOUTH) JOINT DECLARATIONS

The Korean peninsula is at high risk of another war. If there is a new war in the peninsula, it will likely be nuclear – and Koreans as well as the rest of the world will be affected.

The Korean War, (1950-1953) never resulted in a peace treaty – so the war-state has continued.

To resolve this intense conflict, we need to end the current 60 year state-of-war in Korea, and end the U.S.'s hostility against the DPRK; and the U.S. needs to sign a Peace Treaty with North Korea.

In addition, the June 15th and October 4th declarations should be carried out to resolve the antagonism between South and North (North and South). The declarations were adopted by two leaders of both sides of Korea, and were welcomed by the whole Korean people in North, South & overseas. They are the pathways towards self-reliant reunification and peaceful prosperity, and the U.N. Assembly unanimously supported them.

We are against war and we demand the following for peace and the reunification of Korea:

1. End the 60 year old Korean War and sign a Peace Treaty between DPRK and the U.S.
2. Respect and implement the South-North (North-South) joint declarations.
3. Support the creation of an international environment for peace and reunification of Korea by the U.N. Security Council and the countries related to the division of Korea
