A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT RPA INTENSIFIED PATROLS AND GUARDS IN READINESS FOR THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT'S VISIT TO GIKONGORO ON 11 JUN 95.

(2) SECTOR 1 MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA BN COMMANDER AT NYAGATARE REQUESTED ASSISTANCE FROM NIBATT EOD TEAM AND MILOBS TO VISIT A SUSPECTED MINE AREA AT GABIRO (4530). THE REQUEST HAS BEEN ACCEPTED AND A VISIT HAS BEEN PLANNED FOR MON 12 JUN 95.

(3) SECTOR 3 MILOBS REPORTED THAT THERE HAS BEEN A CHANGE OF COMMAND IN RUHANGO TOWN. RPA TROOPS FIRED FIVE LONG BURSTS IN THE AIR AT 102250B JUN 95 TO MARK THE HANDING/TAKING OVER CEREMONY. IN ANOTHER REPORT, THE RPA HAVE ESTABLISHED A NEW CHECK-POINT AT 730690 WHICH IS A BIT HIDDEN TO MOTORISTS. AS A RESULT, ONE MOTORIST BUMPED INTO IT WOUNDING AN RPA SOLDIER. THE SOLDIER HAS BEEN ADMITTED AT THE KABGAYI MSF HOSPITAL IN A CRITICAL CONDITION. THE DRIVER AND HIS CONDUCTOR WERE SLIGHTLY INJURED WHILE THE PASSENGERS ESCAPED UNHURT.

HE ARRIVED AT 1200 HRS AND SPOKE TO A CROWD FOR NEARLY THREE HOURS ANSWERING QUESTIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE. SPEECH CENTRED MOSTLY ON RECONCILIATION AND PRAISE FOR THE EFFORTS AND INITIATIVE OF THE POPULACE.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED CONFIDENCE PATROLS TO GITESI COMMUNE (2871). A TEAM FROM THE WORLD CHURCH IN RWANDA VISITED THE GITESI COMMUNE (2871) TO ENQUIRE ABOUT THE SECURITY SITUATION. THEY WERE BRIEFED BY MILOBS.

(7) IN SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS TO AKABUGA (4988) AND REMERA (4289) BORDER POSTS AND SURROUNDING AREAS AS PART OF OPERATION RUBY. SITUATION WAS REPORTED CALM.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B-BUTARE. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(9) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) IN THE NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR, FEARS OF INSECURITY IS GRIPPING THE LOCALS AS NEWS OF ETHIOBATT WITHDRAWAL IS KNOWN. MILOBS ASSESS THERE COULD BE ANOTHER MASS EXODUS TO ZAIRE IF WITHDRAWAL IS NOT COORDINATED AND ASSURANCE GIVEN TO THE POPULATION.

(C) MILOBS PTLs TO SEVERAL AREAS IN THE SECTOR INCLUDING THE BORDER POSTS REPORTED OF BANDITRY IN WHICH RPA SOLDIERS ARE IMPLICATED.

(D) MILOBS CONDUCTED INVESTIGATIONS ON RECENT INCIDENTS OF ARMED ROBBERY IN THEIR AOR IN WHICH BANDITS DEMANDED 50,000 RWF FROM A COUPLE AND RESORTED TO VIOLENCE WHEN THEY WERE OFFERED ONLY 5,000 RWF. THE COUPLE IS NOW AT "CENTRE DE SANTE SAINT-FRANCOIS" AT RUSIZI II.

(E) AT BURANGA (760220), RPA SOLDIERS TOOK THE MOTORCYCLE OF A LOCAL BUSINESSMAN ON 04 JUN 95 AND TOLD HIM THEY WOULD RETURN FOR HIS TELEVISION AND HIMSELF. RPA HAVE ARRESTED TWO RPA SOLDIERS AND ONE CIVILIAN WHO TOOK PART IN THIS ROBBERY. IN THE SAME TOWN, A YOUNGMAN AND HIS SISTER ALSO RECEIVED A FORMED LETTER/WRITTEN EXTORTION THREAT FROM UNKNOWN ELEMENTS ATTEMPTING TO EXTORT MONEY FROM THEM.

2. NIGERIAN SOLDIER ACCUSED OF MURDER WAS REPATRIATED TO NIGERIA SINCE ALL STATEMENTS NEEDED FOR MP REPORT AND BOARD OF INQUIRY HAVE BEEN FINALIZED. GOVT INFORMED.

(3) A HUMAN RIGHTS VEH NO VP 0657 WAS STOLLEN AT GUNPOINT AT 2300 HRS IN KIGALI ON 11 JUN 95.

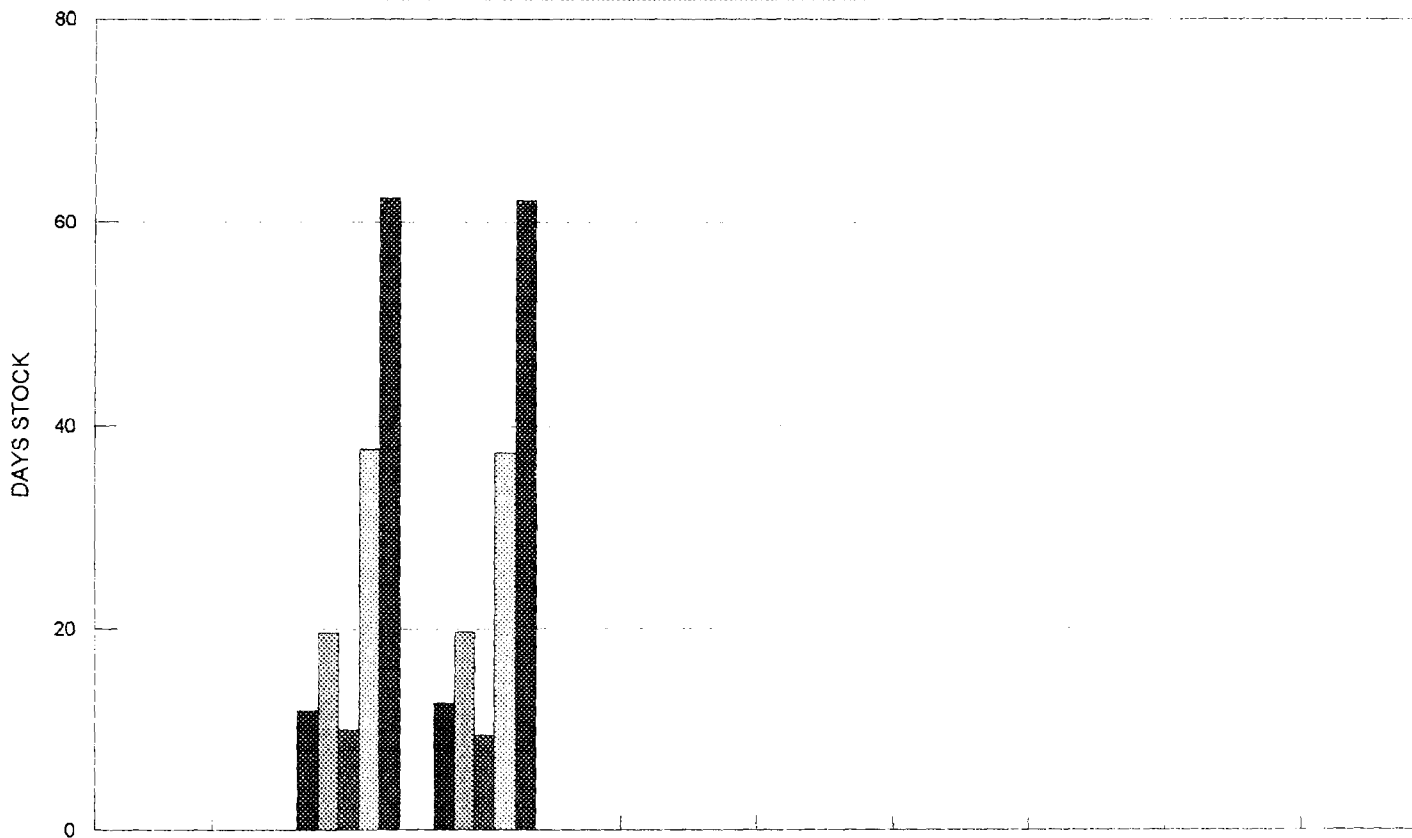

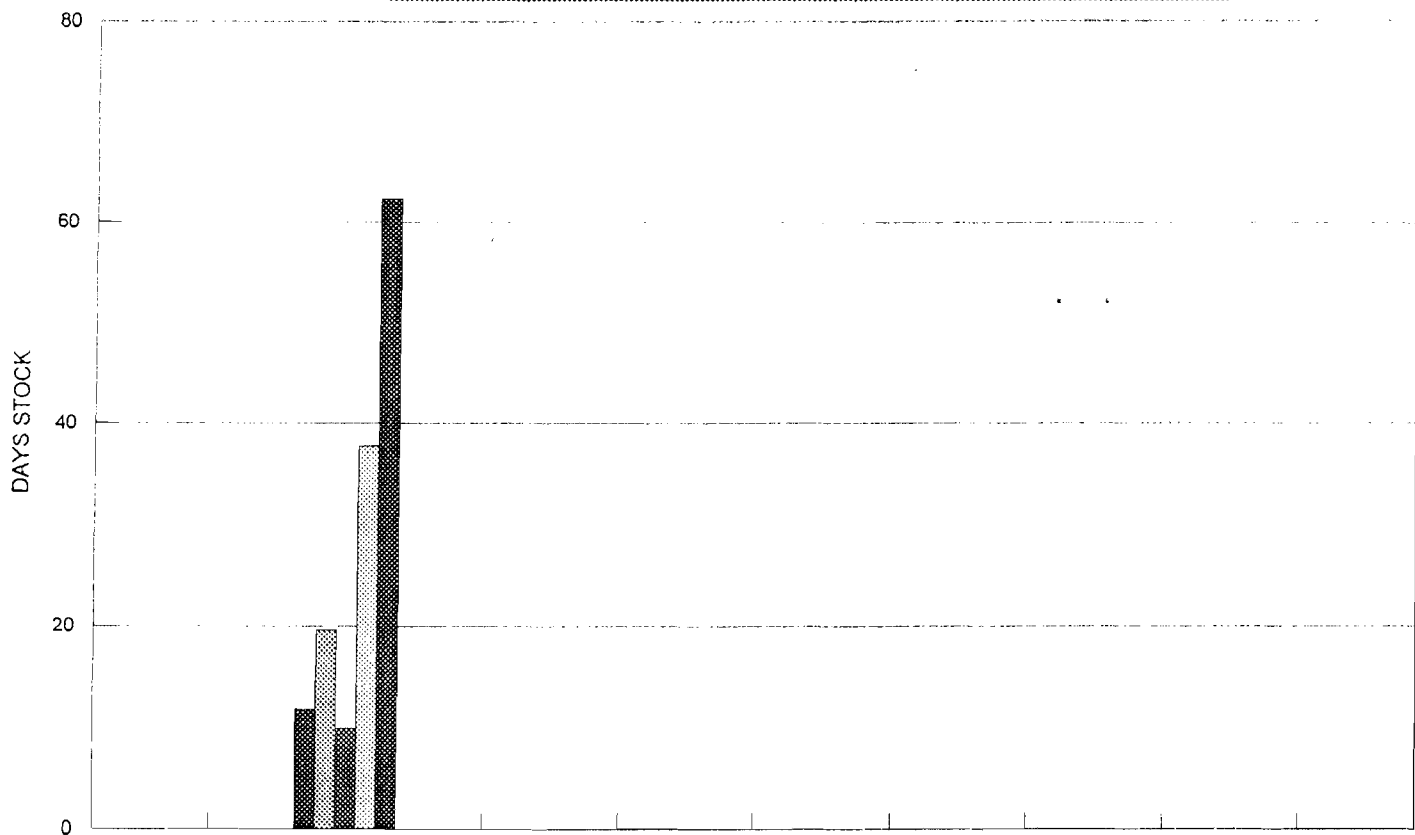

HE ALSO BLAMED THOSE WHO FAILED TO SAVE THE LIVES OF VICTIMS KILLED BEFORE THEIR EYES, AND URGED THEM ALSO TO SEEK FOR FORGIVENESS. THE PRESIDENT EQUALLY URGED THE SURVIVORS OF THE GENOCIDE TO REFRAIN FROM COMMITTING ACTS OF REVENGE AND CASTING ALL ETHNIC HUTUS IN THE ROLE OF CRIMINALS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS HAVE VACATED THE RUTARE SECONDARY SCHOOL WHICH THEY HAVE BEEN OCCUPYING SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THE WAR.

HE MENTIONED 6 NAMES OF THE BANDITS BEFORE HIS DEATH. THE 6 HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND DETAINED IN GITARE PRISON. MEANWHILE, PATROLS IN THE SECTOR TODAY RECEIVED REPORTS OF BANDIT ATTACKS ON TWO FAMILIES ON 05 AND 07 JUN AT MURURU GR 7521 AND BUREMERA GR 7622 RESPECTIVELY. IN BOTH INCIDENTS, VICTIMS WERE TRADERS/BUSINESSMEN FROM WHOM THEIR ASSAILANTS REQUESTED MONEY. INVESTIGATION IN

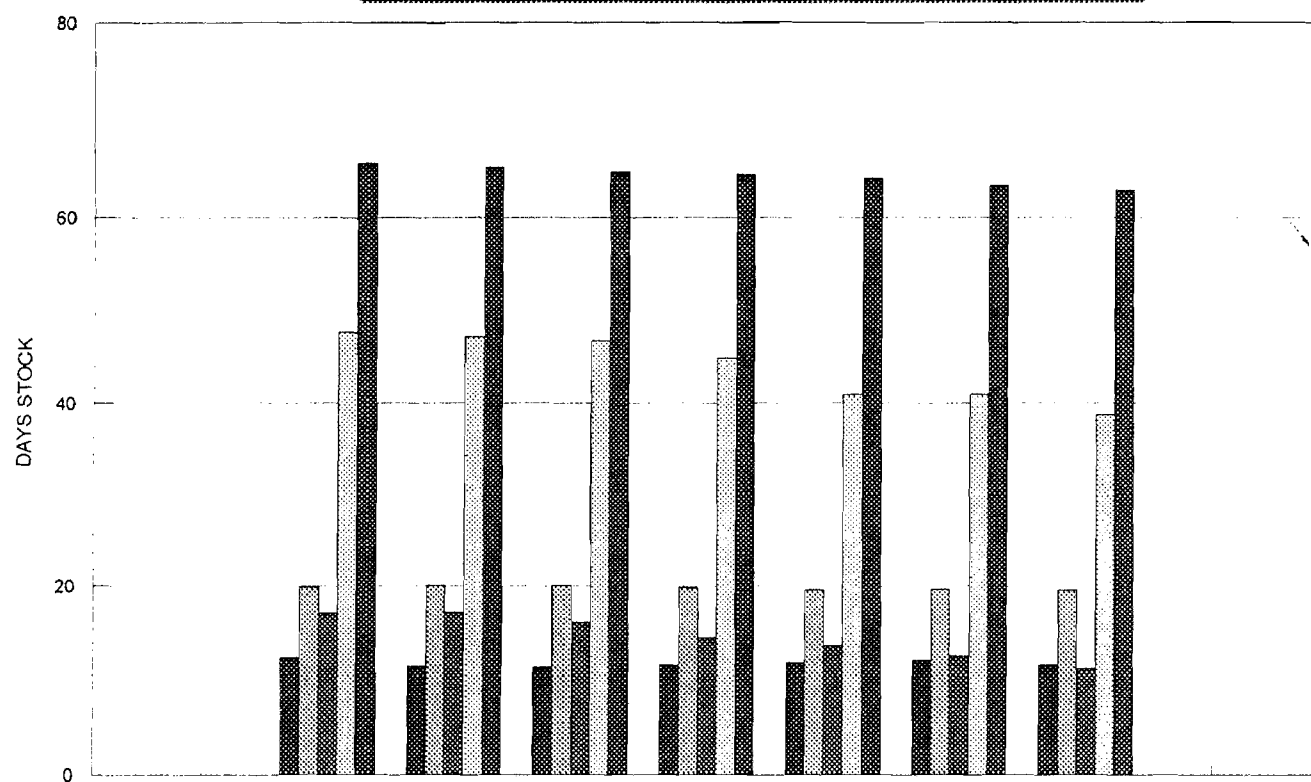

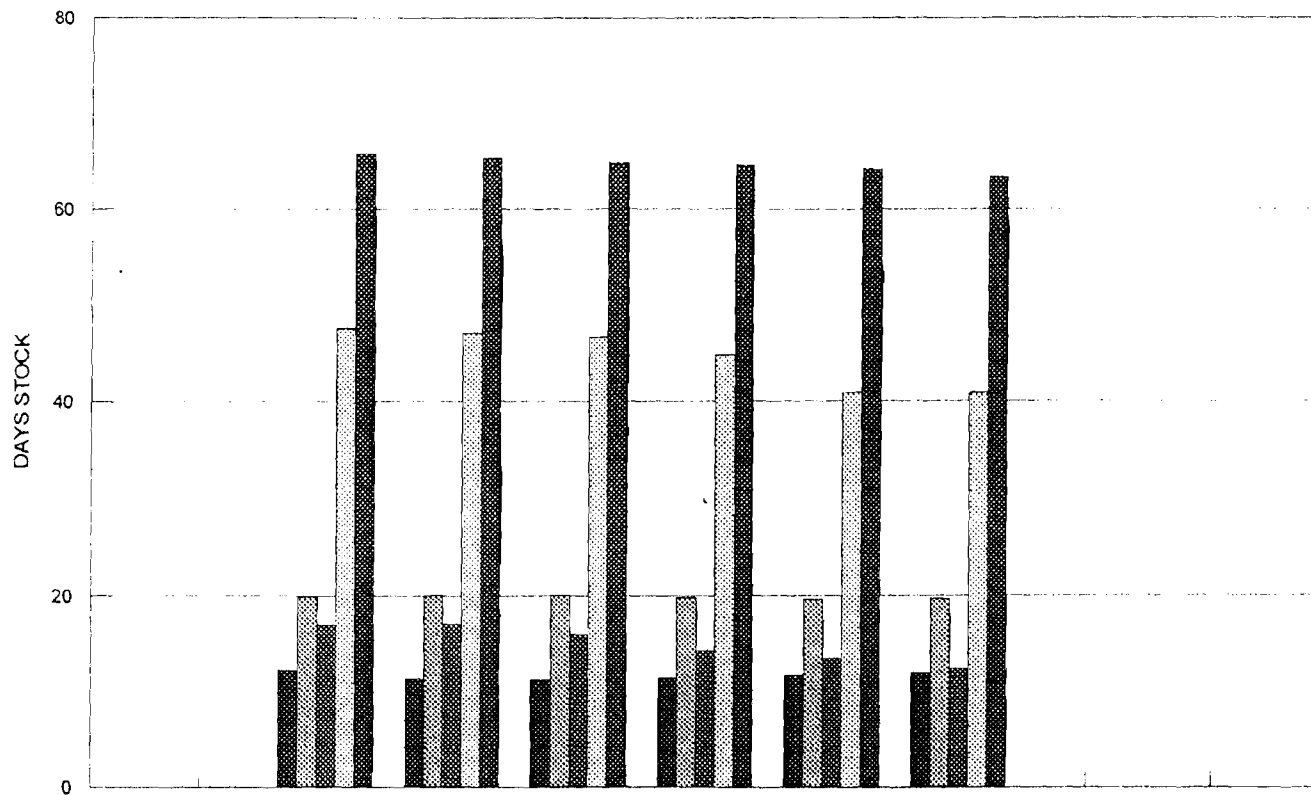



(2) TWO ACCIDENT CASES WERE REPORTED. ONE INVOLVED A UNAMIR VEH THAT SKIDDED OFF THE ROAD AND WENT DOWN THE DITCH WHILE THE OTHER INVOLVED AN INDBATT MAMBA APC THAT COLLIDED WITH A CIVILIAN MINI-BUS AT AN INTER-SECTION IN KIGALI CITY.

(3) THERE WERE THREE CASES OF UNAMIR AND NGO VEH THEFTS WHICH WERE REPORTED IN BUTARE. ALL REPORTED ROBBERIES WERE CARRIED OUT BY LOCALS IN RPA UNIFORMS AND THEY WERE ARMED. THERE WAS ALSO AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY BY SOME LOCALS IN THE RESIDENCE OF MP PERSONNEL IN KIGALI. THIS WAS FOILED.

(4) UNAMIR CASHIER, MR HUDSON MBBUYA, WHOSE MYSTERIOUS DISAPPEARANCE WAS FIRST NOTICED AT 2PM WHEN HE DID NOT RETURN TO HIS DESK AFTER LUNCH, LATER EMERGED AT ABOUT 2030 HRS VISIBLY SHAKEN, UNKEMPT AND RUFFLED. HE SAID THAT AROUND 1PM ON HIS WAY TO HIS RESIDENCE AROUND CHEZ LANDO, THREE UNKNOWN MEN, IN CIVILIAN ATTIRE WHO PRETENDED TO BE EFFECTING REPAIRS ON A MINI-BUS, ACCOSTED HIM AND FORCED HIM TO ENTER THE MINI-BUS. HE ALLEGED THAT ONE OF THE ASSAILANTS HIT HIM ON THE HEAD AND PUSHED HIM INSIDE THE BUS AND MADE HIM TO LAY ON THE FLOOR AND THEREAFTER THEY SCREECHED OFF TO AN UNKNOWN DISTINATION. HE FURTHER STATED THAT HE WAS QUESTIONED FOR ABOUT THREE HOURS AND THEN THEY COLLECTED HIS BUNCH OF KEYS, BELIEVED TO BE OFFICE AND SAFE KEYS FROM HIM. THEY WENT AWAY WITH THE KEYS, OSTENSIBLY TO OPEN AND CART AWAY MONIES IN THE SAFE, QUIETLY. THEIR PLAN FAILED. AN HOUR LATER, THEY RETURNED TO HIM WHERE HE WAS BEING HELD CAPTIVE TO TELL HIM THAT HE GAVE THEM THE WRONG KEYS. AFTER SOME MOMENT OF VACILLATION AMONGST HIS CAPTORS, HE SAID THAT THEY DROVE HIM BACK CLOSE TO HIS RESIDENCE AND GRUDGINGLY SET HIM FREE WITH A STRONG WARNING THAT HE SHOULD, FROM NOW ON, ALWAYS ENSURE THAT HE CARRIED ABOUT WITH HIM ENOUGH DOLLARS WHEREVER HE WENT READY TO BE GIVEN TO THEM WHEN THEY WOULD APPROACH HIM AGAIN, FAILURE TO DO SO, HE ALLEGED, HE WAS THREATENED THAT HE WOULD BE KILLED. THE MATTER IS BEING INVESTIGATED FURTHER BY MPs AND UNAMIR SECURITY OFFICER.

CIVPOL MONITORS IN BUTARE PREFECTURE IN MUGASA COMMUNE ON 6 JUNE 95 WAS INFORMED BY SOME IDPs THAT 154 IDPs OUT OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF 1,849 WHO RETURNED TO THE COMMUNE FROM THE CLOSED CAMP HAD BEEN ARRESTED AND DETAINED IN BUTARE PRISON BY RPA. FURTHER ENQUIRY REVEALED THAT THE DETAINED IDPs WERE SUSPECTED TO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

C. IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE A PTL TEAM VISITED KIBUYE HOSP ON 6 JUN 95 AND WAS INFORMED BY HOSP AUTHORITIES THAT THERE WERE TWO PATIENTS WITH GUN SHOT WOUNDS FROM NGOMA PREFECTURE SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN SHOT BY AN RPA SOLDIER A WEEK AGO. REASONS FOR THE SHOOTING UNKNOWN, HUMAN RIGHT INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

D. IN KIGALI PREFECTURE, PTL TEAM VISITED KIGALI CENTRAL PRISON ON 06 JUN 95 AND REPORTED THAT THE NUMBER OF INMATES HAD RISEN TO 9,439 WITH POOR SANITARY CONDITIONS. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED THE COMMANDER OF GENDARMERIE BRIGADE IN THE CITY CENTRE WHO CONFIRMED AN INCREASE IN CRIME WAVE IN KIGALI PREFECTURE. THE COMMANDER STATED FURTHER THAT NECESSARY MEASURES TO CURB THE MENACE HAD BEEN PUT IN PLACE AND APPEALED TO UNAMIR FOR LOGISTICS SUPPORT.

E. PTL TO KENZENZE COMMUNE ON 07 JUN 95 WAS INFORMED THAT 137 LOCALS SUSPECTED TO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE WERE DETAINED IN A MAKE-SHIFT DETENTION CENTRE. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

F. PTL TEAM TO RUHengeri PREFECTURE VISITED KANCINGI COMMUNE ON 6 JUN 95 AND WAS INFORMED THAT TWO LOCALS SUSPECTED TO BE FRGF KILLED THEMSELVES WITH A HAND GREN AFTER THEY WERE INFORMED BY THE OWNER OF THE HOUSE THEY WERE HIDING THAT RPA SOLDIERS WERE AFTER THEM. A LOCAL WOMAN AND A CHILD WERE ALSO ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED DURING THE INCIDENT. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

G. THE RUHengeri NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IS PREPARING GROUNDS FOR THE GRADUATION CEREMONY OF STUDENTS WHO RECENTLY COMPLETED THEIR TRAINING. ALSO PREPARATION OF HANDOUT IN ENGLISH LESSONS IS IN PROGRESS.

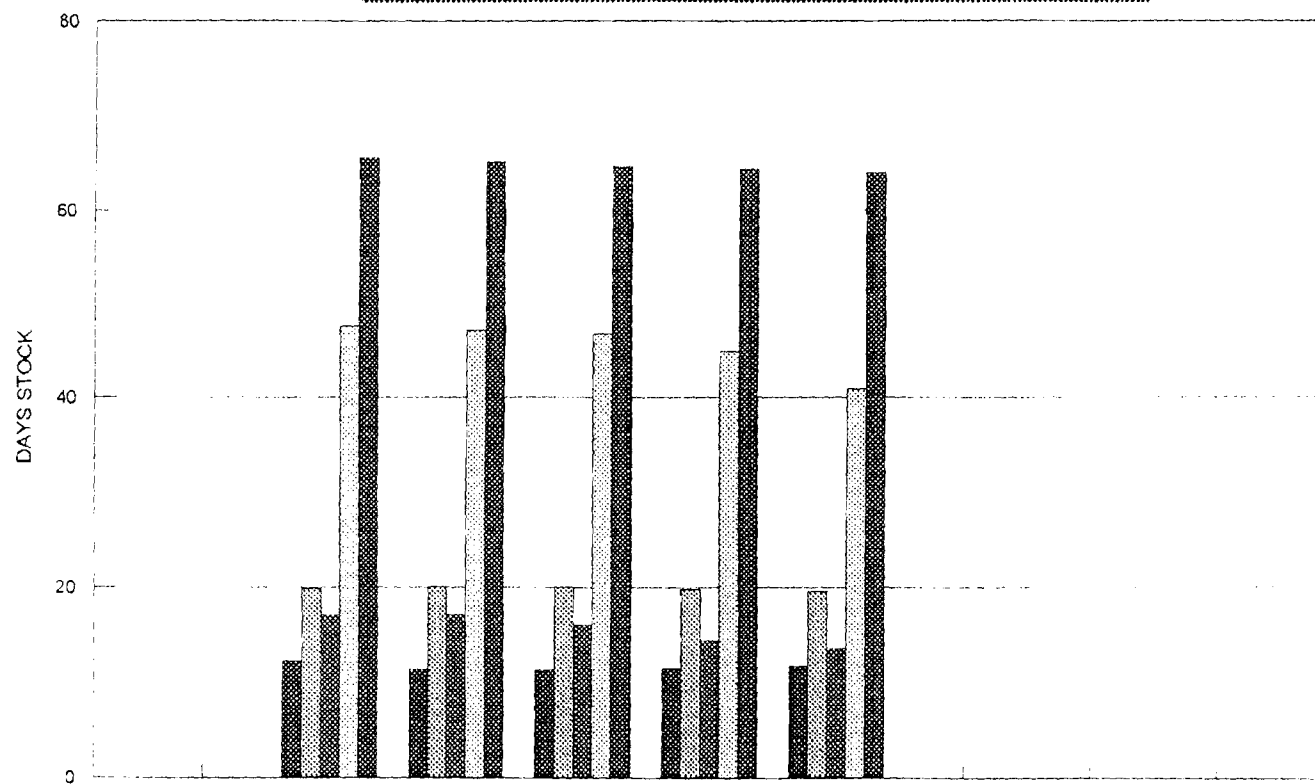

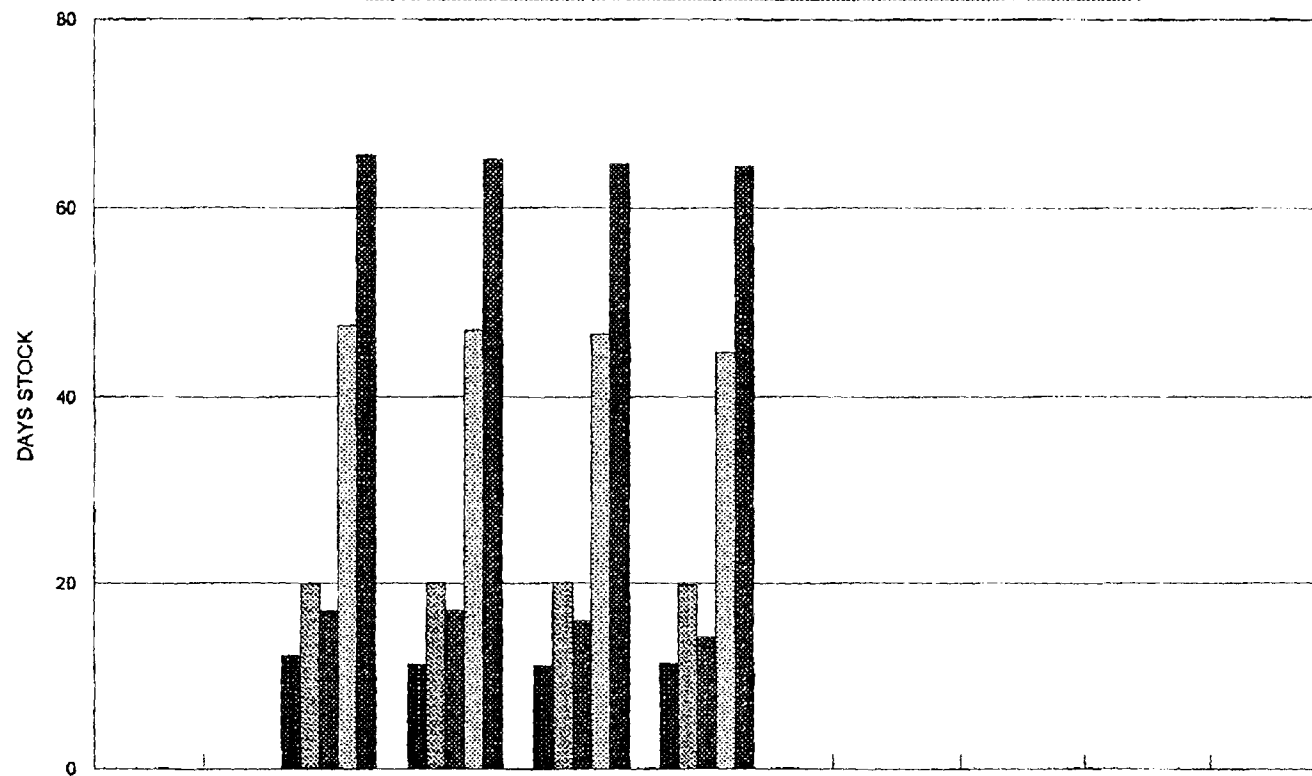

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD

HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS STABLE ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS REMAINED TENSE.

B. OVER THE PAST MONTH THERE HAVE BEEN INCREASING INDICATIONS TO SUGGEST INTENSIVE TRAINING AND CONCENTRATION OF FRGF TROOPS CLOSER TO RWANDAN BORDERS. REPORTS FROM ZAIRE INDICATE THAT THE ZAIRIAN PARLIAMENT ARE BECOMING IMPATIENT WITH THE CONTINUED EXISTENCE OF THE REFUGEE CAMPS ON THEIR BORDERS WITH RWANDA. FURTHERMORE, THE PROBABILITY OF DWINDLING AID TO THE CAMPS AND THE RESULTANT INCREASE IN CRIME AND THE PERSISTENT RUMOURS OF RWANDAN ACTION AGAINST THE REFUGEE CAMPS IF THERE IS NO RESOLUTION TO THEIR CONTINUED EXISTENCE HAS FURTHER INCREASED THE ANXIETY OF ZAIRIAN PARLIAMENTARIANS.

C. WITHIN RWANDA THE INCREASED INCURSIONS AND ACTS OF SABOTAGE BY FRGF PERSONNEL FROM ACROSS THE BORDERS IN SECTORS 3A, 4B, 4C AND 5 AND PERSISTENT RUMOURS OF AN IMMINENT ATTACK BY 50,000 FRGF MASSED ON THE BORDER IN THE JUN/JUL PERIOD HAVE RESULTED IN THE REDEPLOYMENT OF LARGE NUMBERS OF RPA TROOPS TO BORDER AREAS OVER THE LAST FEW WEEKS. THESE REDEPLOYMENTS COVER THE LIKELY FRGF APPROACHES.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR RWANDA, AMBASSADOR SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, WAS IN NEW YORK THROUGHOUT THE WEEK WHERE HE ATTENDED MEETINGS WITH SENIOR UNITED NATIONS OFFICIALS TO DISCUSS PLANS FOR UNAMIR'S FUTURE MANDATE.

B. A BELGIAN JUDGE ISSUED AN INTERNATIONAL ARREST WARRANT FOR THREE FORMER RWANDESE MILITARY OFFICERS FOR THEIR ALLEGED INVOLVEMENT IN GENOCIDE, INCLUDING A FORMER ARMY COLONEL ACCUSED OF ORDERING THE ASSASSINATION OF THE LATE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA AND TEN BELGIAN PEACEKEEPERS PROVIDING HER WITH PROTECTION.

C. RADIO RWANDA ANNOUNCED THAT IN A MEETING PRESIDED OVER BY THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO, THE PARTICIPANTS COMPLAINED ABOUT THE TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED ON RWANDESE NATIONALS BY TANZANIA ON ITS BORDER POST WITH RWANDA WHERE MANY RWANDESE ARE APPARENTLY DENIED VISAS TO ENTER TANZANIA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS.

D. A JOINT COMMISSION, COMPRISED OF SENIOR REPRESENTATIVES FROM UNAMIR, THE ICRC, THE OFFICES OF THE PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER, AND VARIOUS OTHER GOVERNMENT MINISTRIES, HELD ITS INITIAL MEETING TO DISCUSS MEASURES AIMED AT IMPROVING CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS. UNAMIR'S PROPOSED CONTRIBUTION COULD INCLUDE THE PROVISION OF LOGISTIC SUPPORT AND ASSISTANCE IN PRISON REFURBISHMENT AND TRANSPORTATION.

E. THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE IN WHICH HE STATED THAT THE CONSEQUENCES OF THE CONTINUED SUPPLY OF ARMS TO RWANDESE REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES WOULD AFFECT NOT ONLY RWANDA, BUT ALSO THE ENTIRE REGION. HE ADDED THAT DESPITE ATTEMPTS AT DESTABILISING RWANDA FROM ABROAD, THE SECURITY SITUATION THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY'S TERRITORY WAS UNDER CONTROL.

F. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER,

MR. FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, MADE A TWO-DAY VISIT TO BURUNDI WHERE HE HELD TALKS WITH BURUNDIAN OFFICIALS AND VISITED A RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMP. THE PRIME MINISTER STATED IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA THAT IN A JOINT COMMUNIQUE SIGNED BETWEEN THE TWO GOVERNMENTS, RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS WOULD VISIT THE RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMPS IN BURUNDI TO URGE THE ESTIMATED 200,000 RWANDESE REFUGEES LOCATED THERE TO RETURN HOME.

G. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE DEFENCE MINISTERS OF RWANDA, ZAIRE AND BURUNDI PLANNED TO MEET "IN THE NEAR FUTURE" TO DISCUSS SECURITY PROBLEMS ALONG THEIR COMMON BORDERS.

3. **MILITARY**

A. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES**

(1) **RPA/GENDARMERIE**.

(A) MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT ARRESTS AND HARASSMENTS OF LOCALS STILL CONTINUE IN SECTOR 3A BY RPA AND IT IS ALLEGED THAT SOME LOCALS SLEEP IN THE BUSH DUE TO FEAR OF RPA ARRESTS. STILL IN THE SAME SECTOR, MALAWICOY REPORTED SOME LOCALS IN MUGUNDA GR 4368 HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THE RPA FOR NO APPARENT REASONS AND FOOD SENT TO THE PRISONERS BY RELATIVES IS BEING EATEN BY THE SOLDIERS.

(B) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4B REPORTED THAT RPA PLATOON AT KIGEMBE GR 7093 IS BEING PULLED OUT FOR REDEPLOYMENT AT THE BURUNDI BORDER. RPA CHECK POINT AT SHYANDA GR 7718 IS REPORTED TO HAVE SUBJECTED BOTH PEDESTRIANS AND MOTORISTS WHO PASS THE CHECK POINT TO BODY AND BAGGAGE SEARCHES. UNAMIR AND NGO PERS HAVE SO FAR BEEN EXEMPTED.

(C) IN SECTOR 6, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA ARE STILL IMPROVING THEIR DEFENCES AROUND HOTEL ROMERO L'HORIZON GR 0880.

(2) **FRGF/MILITIA**.

(A) INVESTIGATIONS BY SECTOR 4C MILOBS ABOUT ALLEGED BUILD-UP OF FRGF FORCES ALONG ZAIRIAN BORDER COULD NOT CONFIRM THE REPORTS. RPA TROOPS ALONG THE BORDER WERE HOWEVER TENSE DUE TO THESE REPORTS. SITUATION BEING MONITORED.

(C) BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 03 1115-1140B JUN, CONTINUOUS

MORTAR FIRING WAS OBSERVED COMING FROM IJWI ISLAND. FALL OF SHOT AND TARGET COULD NOT BE IDENTIFIED. SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN A PRACTICE, AS MORTAR WAS FIRING IN SAME PLACE WHERE SEVERAL SMALL ARMS PRACTICES OCCURRED IN THE PAST FEW WEEKS.

(D) ON 02 JUN, 5,000 PERS ATTENDED A SECURITY MEETING AT RUHENGARI. AUTHORITIES INDICATED THAT LOCALS WERE HARBOURING SUBVERSIVE ELMS. THEIR PLANNED SOLUTION IS TO ORGANIZE COMMUNITIES INTO "NYUMBA KHUMI" (10 HOUSE SECTORS) WHO WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PATROLLING THEIR AREAS BY NIGHT. THE MILITARY WILL PATROL STRATEGIC POINTS. ALSO AUTHORITIES URGED THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR ARRESTS TO CONDUCT MORE THOROUGH INVESTIGATIONS BEFORE LAYING CHARGES.

(B) ON 31 MAY, WITH THE AIM TO UPDATE CONTINGENTS AND STAFF, PRIOR TO THE MANDATE VOTE, THE FC MET WITH UNAMIR CONTINGENT COMMANDERS AND STAFF. HE LATER MET THE BRITISH AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA AND HIGH COMMISSIONER TO UGANDA, MR EDWARD CLAY. HE CONCLUDED THE DAY BY HAVING A DISCUSSION WITH THE HEAD OF RADIO UNAMIR ON AN ACTION PLAN TO DEAL WITH ALLEGATIONS FROM RWANDESE GOVT OFFICIALS THAT RADIO UNAMIR HAD BROADCAST FALSE STATEMENTS ABOUT GOVT OFFICIALS AND THEIR MOV'T WITHIN THE COUNTRY RELATING TO THE KIBEHO MASSACRE.

(C) ON 01 JUN, THE FC MET UNAMIR SENIOR CIVILIAN POLITICAL STAFF TO UPDATE THEM ON MANDATE PROGRESS IN NEW YORK AND TO DISCUSS STRATEGY DURING THE NEXT WEEK.

(D) ON 3 JUN, THE FORCE COMMANDER CALLED UPON THE VICE PRESIDENT, MAJ-GEN PAUL KAGAME. IN A "FRANK AND CORDIAL" MEETING, THE TWO TALKED ABOUT A NUMBER OF ISSUES RELATING TO THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN

UNAMIR AND THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA AND THE RPA.

LATER, HE MET WITH MR BILL CLARENCE OF HRFOR TO BE UPDATED BY HIM ON THE ISSUE OF THE EIGHT PERS WHO SOUGHT PROTECTION WITH GHANBATT AT KIBUNGO IN APRIL AND THE CASE OF AN EYE WITNESS TO RPA SPONSORED EXECUTIONS IN SECTOR 4C EARLIER THIS YEAR.

III. MILOBS PTLS TO MURAMA INTERVIEWED A FAMILY THAT RECENTLY RETURNED FROM ZAIRE WHO CONFIRMED THAT SOME MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE BEING CARRIED OUT BY FRGF TROOPS IN WALIKALI ABOUT 70KM FROM GOMA BUT MORE INTENSE ACTIVITIES WERE NOTICED AT MUSISI.

V. PATROLS TO MUGINA COMMUNE GR 9267 WERE INFORMED THAT DESPITE RPA PRESENCE IN THE AREA, ACTS OF BANDITRY WAS STILL BEING COMMITTED ON THE EASTERN PART OF THE COMMUNE.

VI. SECTOR MILOBS AND REPS OF MALI COY ATTENDED A REBURIAL CEREMONY AT TAMBWE COMMUNE (7653).

VII. PATROLS TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE (8274), WERE INFORMED OF CATTLE RUSTLING BY BANDITS ARMED WITH HOME-MADE WEAPONS SUCH AS PANGAS AND AXES. AT RUTSIRA COMMUNE, THE PTL RECEIVED REPORTS OF RPA HARASSMENT OF LOCALS IN THE AREA. IT WAS ALSO ALLEGED THAT RPA TROOPS HAVE STOLEN A GRINDER FROM KUZINGA VILLAGE (3691) IN MURUNDA SECTEUR. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

MUBUGA COMMUNE HAVE NOT REOPENED BECAUSE PARENTS HAVE REFUSED TO RELEASE THEIR CHILDREN OF SCHOOL-GOING AGE TO ATTEND CLASSES. NGOS IN THE COMMUNE WERE REPORTED TO BE CLOSING DOWN THEIR OPERATIONS IN THE COMMUNE DUE TO THE CLOSURE OF THE KIBEHO AND NDAGO CAMPS.

III. PATROLS TO MUKO COMMUNE (3742) REPORTED THAT RPA CONDUCTED ROTATION OF ITS TROOPS IN THE AREA ON 22 MAY 95. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA HAS IMPROVED. THERE WERE NO REPORTS OF ROBBERY, LOOTING AND KILLINGS.

C. IN CYANGUGU PREFECTURE, CIVPOL TEAM REPORTED THAT ON 28 MAY 95 AT ABOUT 2130HRS A MEMBER OF MEDICINE DU MONDE WAS ROBBED OF HIS VEHICLE BY ARMED BANDITS 1 KM FROM THE KAMEMBE CHECK POINT. HE SUSTAINED INJURIES DURING THE ATTACK BUT MANAGED TO ESCAPE. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

D. REF OUR SITREP DATED 30 MAY 95 PARA 6C, THE TEAM WAS ALLOWED ACCESS TO KIGALI PRISONS ON 30 MAY 95 AFTER NEGOTIATIONS WITH LOCAL AUTHORITIES. THE PRISON CURRENTLY HOLDS 9,343 INMATES. THE CONDITIONS OF THE PRISONERS IS STILL DEPLORABLE. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

E. 500 RPA SOLDIERS WERE SEEN DEPARTING KIGALI ON THE GITARAMA ROAD ON 30 MAY 95. REPORTS INDICATE THAT THE TROOPS WERE FOR REINFORCEMENT AT THE BORDERS FOLLOWING THE INTERNATIONAL MEDIA REPORT ON FRGF INFILTRATION INTO THE COUNTRY.

F. THE TRAINING OF GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL IN PROGRESS.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. UNAMIR CONTINUED TO PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO IDPs FORCIBLY REMOVED FROM DPCs IN SECTOR 4A.

6. TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. A TOTAL OF 06 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHICLES WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD.

10. CONCLUSION.

A. THE CONCENTRATION OF FRGF TPS ON THE RWANDA - ZAIRE BORDER INDICATING AN IMMINENT ATTACK ON RWANDA POSES GREAT SECURITY CONCERN FOR BOTH UNAMIR AND RWANDESE. THIS STATE OF AFFAIRS HAS BEEN COMPOUNDED BY AN INCREASE IN BANDITRY INCURSIONS BY FRGF PERSONNEL FROM ACROSS THE BORDER. IN THE WAKE OF THIS APPARENT INSECURITY RPA TPS HAVE INTENSIFIED THEIR PRESENCE ON THE BORDERS AND PUT UP A NUMBER OF CHECK PTS IN THE COUNTRY.

B. LACK OF FOOD AND OTHER AMENITIES STILL PRESENT THE BIGGEST PROBLEM BEING ENCOUNTERED BY THE RETURNEES IN THE COMMUNES. ARRESTS OF LOCALS BY RPA FOR COMPLICITY IN THE GENOCIDE AND OTHER OFFENCES HASN'T BEEN AS RAMPANT IN MOST AREAS. THIS COULD BE ATTRIBUTED TO THE GOVERNMENT'S CONSTANT CALLS FOR RECONCILLATION AND THEIR DESIRE TO LIMIT THE ARRESTS FOR GRAVE OFFENCES ONLY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, YESTERDAY ENDED HIS TWO-DAY VISIT TO BURUNDI WHERE HE HELD TALKS WITH BURUNDIAN OFFICIALS AND VISITED A RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMP. THE PRIME MINISTER STATED IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA THAT IN A JOINT COMMUNIQUE SIGNED BETWEEN THE TWO GOVERNMENTS, RWANDESE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS WOULD VISIT THE RWANDESE REFUGEE CAMPS IN BURUNDI TO URGE THE ESTIMATED 200,000 RWANDESE REFUGEES LOCATED THERE TO RETURN HOME.

B. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE DEFENCE MINISTERS OF RWANDA, ZAIRE AND BURUNDI PLANNED TO MEET "IN THE NEAR FUTURE" TO DISCUSS SECURITY PROBLEMS ALONG THEIR COMMON BORDERS.

IT WAS LEARNT THAT THE LOCAL SERGEANT AT THE CHECK-POINT WAS ONLY TRYING TO HARASS THE OUTGOING SECTOR COMMANDER FOR SENDING HIM OUT OF A SOCIAL FUNCTION ORGANISED BY THE SECTOR RECENTLY. THE SERGEANT WAS DRUNK AND HAD TO BE SENT OUT. THE MATTER HAS BEEN REPORTED TO THE BN COMMANDER.

(3) SECTOR 4C MILOBS, REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS ON THE NIGHT OF 03 JUN 95, HARASSED LOCALS AND FORCED THEM TO CLOSE THEIR SHOPS AND BARS AT 1800HRS INSTEAD OF THE NORMAL TIME OF 2000 HRS. IT IS FURTHER ALLEGED THAT THEY WENT TO SOME HOUSES AND ASKED TO IDENTIFY RESIDENTS BY THEIR TRIBES. THIS HAS CAUSED PANIC AMONG THE INHABITANTS OF BUGARAMA CITY (9002) WHERE IT HAPPENED.

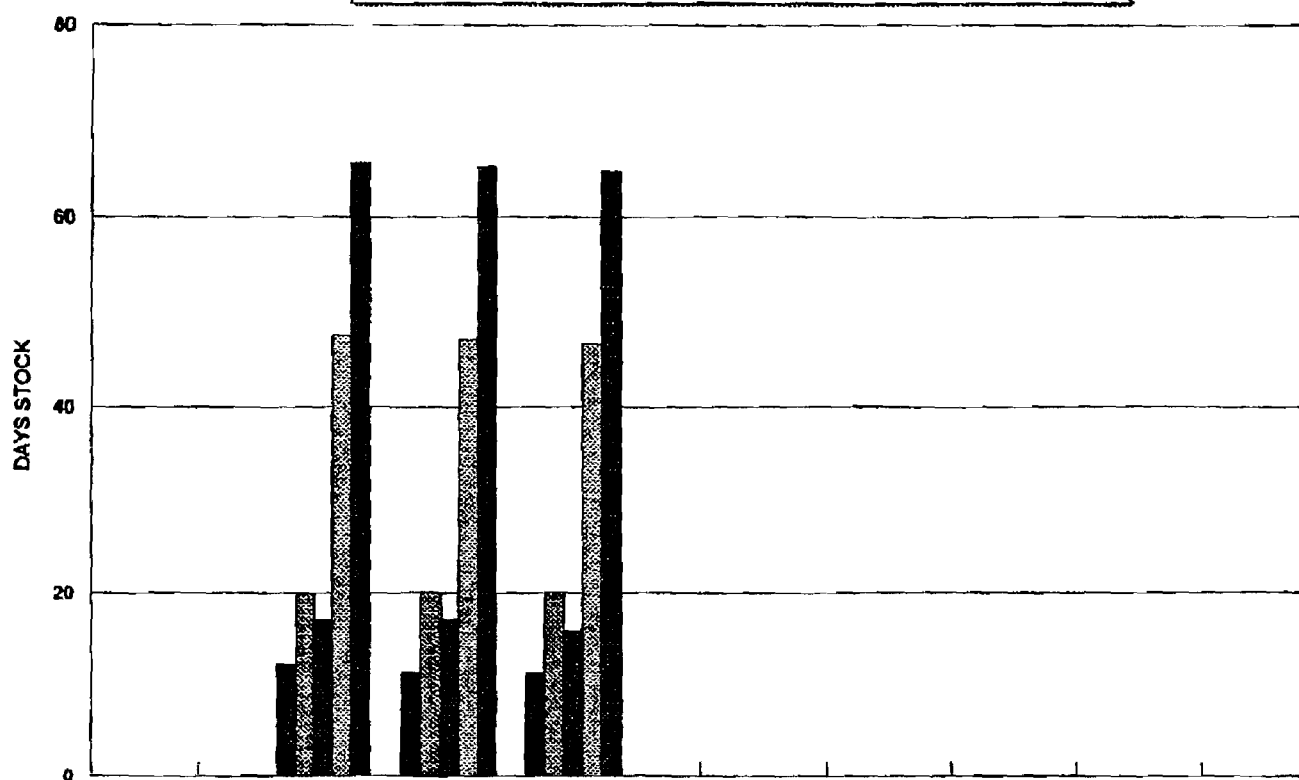

A. THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS FOR RWANDA LEFT KIGALI TODAY FOR A ONE-DAY VISIT TO NEIGHBOURING BURUNDI.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT, ACCORDING TO VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, UNDER THEIR NEW MANDATE, UNITED NATIONS TROOPS REMAINING IN RWANDA WOULD MERELY ACT AS OBSERVERS, REPORT ON SECURITY, JUSTICE, RECONCILIATION AND THE DEVELOPMENT PROCESS, AND INFORM THE FOREIGN COMMUNITY ON THE SITUATION IN RWANDA. ACCORDING TO THE REPORT, THE VICE PRESIDENT EMPHASIZED THAT UNITED NATIONS TROOPS WOULD NOT BE INVOLVED IN ENSURING SECURITY FOR RWANDA AS THAT WAS THE GOVERNMENT'S RESPONSIBILITY.

C. A TEAM OF THE JOINT COMMISSION ON PRISON REFORM IN RWANDA VISITED CYANGUGU, KIBUYE AND GISENYI IN WESTERN RWANDA TO INSPECT PRISON SITES AND CONDITIONS.

SECTOR MILOBS BELIEVED RPA WAS ROTATING TROOPS AS THREE OTHER VEHICLES WERE SEEN CARRYING TROOPS IN THE OPPOSITE DIRECTION, TOWARDS KAMEMBE GR 7622. ANOTHER ROTATION WAS CARRIED OUT IN THE BUGARAMA SUB-SECTOR.

(4) IN SECTOR 6, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA ARE STILL IMPROVING THEIR DEFENCES AROUND HOTEL ROMERO L'HORIZON GR 0880.

B. MILITIA/FRGF.

(1) AT MUHERE GR 8015, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT TWO CIVIL SERVANTS OF MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE WERE SHOT BY ARMED ELEMENTS FROM ZAIRE AT 022337B JUN 95. ONE OF THEM DIED

AND THE OTHER WAS WOUNDED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(2) BETWEEN THE HRS OF 03 1115-1140B JUN, CONTINUOUS MORTAR FIRING WAS OBSERVED COMING FROM IJWI ISLAND. FALL OF SHOT AND TARGET COULD NOT BE IDENTIFIED. SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN A PRACTICE, AS MORTAR WAS FIRING IN SAME PLACE WHERE SEVERAL SMALL ARMS PRACTICES OCCURRED IN THE PAST FEW WEEKS.

(3) ON 02 JUN, 5,000 PERS ATTENDED A SECURITY MEETING AT RUHENGARI. AUTHORITIES INDICATED THAT LOCALS WERE HARBOURING SUBVERSIVE ELMS. THEIR PLANNED SOLUTION IS TO ORGANIZE COMMUNITIES INTO "NYUMBA KHUMI" (10 HOUSE SECTORS WHO ARE RESPONSIBLE TO PATROL THEIR AREAS BY NIGHT). MILITARY WILL PATROL STRATEGIC POINTS. ALSO AUTHORITIES URGED THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR ARRESTS TO CONDUCT MORE THOROUGH INVESTIGATIONS BEFORE LAYING CHARGES.

IN THE FIRST, THE WHEREABOUTS OF THESE PERSONNEL IS NO LONGER CERTAIN AND IN THE SECOND, THE INDIVIDUAL WILL BE INTERVIEWED BY SIU PERSONNEL FROM HRFOR ON MONDAY, 5 JUNE 95.

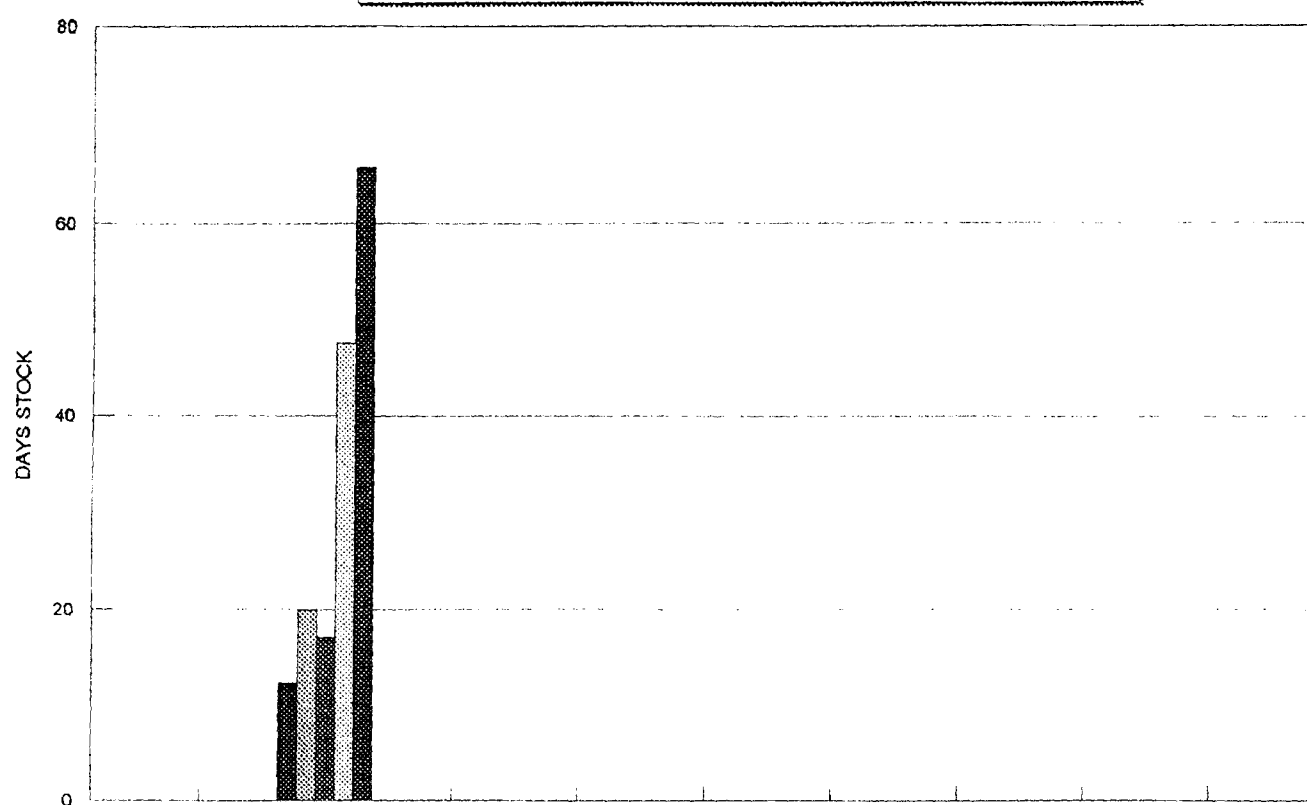



2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. A JOINT COMMISSION, COMPRISING OF SENIOR REPRESENTATIVES FROM UNAMIR, THE ICRC, THE OFFICES OF THE PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER, AND VARIOUS OTHER GOVERNMENT MINISTRIES, HELD ITS INITIAL MEETING TODAY TO DISCUSS MEASURES AIMED AT IMPROVING CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS. UNAMIR'S PROPOSED CONTRIBUTION COULD INCLUDE THE PROVISION OF LOGISTIC SUPPORT, ASSISTANCE IN PRISON REFURBISHMENT AND TRANSPORTATION OF PRISONERS AND MATERIALS.

B. THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE TODAY IN WHICH HE STATED THAT THE CONSEQUENCES OF THE CONTINUED SUPPLY OF ARMS TO RWANDESE REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES WOULD AFFECT NOT ONLY RWANDA, BUT ALSO THE ENTIRE REGION. HE ADDED THAT DESPITE ATTEMPTS AT DESTABILISING RWANDA FROM ABROAD, THE SECURITY SITUATION THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY'S TERRITORY WAS UNDER CONTROL.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) MILOBS IN SECTOR 6 REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUE TO CARRY OUT RANDOM PTLs AND ROADBLOCKS. THE RPA CAMP AND FORMER PRISON IN KAGASA GR 1277 WAS FOUND ABANDONED.

(2) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5 REPORTED THAT, THE RUHENGERI RPA BN COMD, THE LOCAL GENDARMERIE COMD AND THE BOURGMESTRE OF THE KIGOMBE COMMUNE HELD A SECURITY MEETING IN THE STADIUM FROM 1100 TO 1400 HRS TODAY.

(3) SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT TWO UNHRFO PERS WERE HELD FOR THREE HOURS FROM 1000HRS TO 1300HRS AT AN RPA CHECKPOINT NEAR CYANGUGU WHEN THEY REFUSED TO ALLOW THE RPA TO LOOK THROUGH THEIR DOCUMENTS. THEY WERE HOWEVER ALLOWED TO PROCEED WHEN THEY SUCCUMBED TO THE RPA REQUEST. THE INTERVENTION BY MILOBS AND HR LO WAS UNSUCCESSFUL.

(4) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4B REPORTED THAT RPA PLATOON AT KIGEMBE GR 7093 IS BEING PULLED OUT FOR REDEPLOYMENT AT THE BURUNDI BORDER. RPA CHECK POINT AT SHYANDA GR 7718 IS REPORTED TO HAVE SUBJECTED BOTH PEDESTRIANS AND MOTORISTS WHO PASS THE CHECK POINT TO BODY AND BAGGAGE SEARCHES. UNAMIR AND NGO PERS HAVE SO FAR BEEN EXEMPTED.

(6) SECTOR 1 MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA CHECKPOINT AT KIBALI GR 0523 IS STILL VERY ACTIVE AND CONTINUES TO LOG PARTICULARS OF ALL PERSONS AND VEH'S PASSING THROUGH THAT CHECKPOINT.

(7) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 3 REPORTED, THAT THE RPA MAINTAINED A VERY STRONG PRESENCE IN GITARAMA TODAY BECAUSE OF THE DEMONSTRATION AT KIBGAYI.

B. MILITIA/FRGF. IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ARMED ELEMENTS FROM ZAIRE STOLE LIVESTOCK, FOOD AND CLOTHING FROM A LOCAL AT NYAMASHEKE BETWEEN 1900-2100HRS ON 01 JUN 95.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

THEY INTEND TO VISIT THE CURRENT AND PROPOSED PRISON SITES ON 03 JUN 95. IN A SHOW OF GOOD FAITH, PREVIOUS RESTRICTIONS ON UNAMIR HELICOPTER MOVEMENT WAS EASED BY RPA TO ALLOW THE COMMISSION UTILISE AIR RECONNAISSANCE.

(4) IN THE AFTERNOON THE FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO THE NDERA TRANSIT CAMP AND MET WITH NGO OFFICIALS, THE CAMP COMMANDANT AND SEVERAL OF THE RESIDENT POPULATION. LATER HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH SEVERAL SENIOR STAFF INCLUDING THE CAO, CISS AND DCOS SP. A NUMBER OF POINTS RELATING TO MISSION ADMINISTRATION WERE COVERED.

ISSUE BEING TAKEN UP WITH RPA COMD.

(2) CONDUCTED NORMAL RESUPPLY TO NIBATT.

(3) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE TRANSPORT ASSISTANCE TO TUNBATT IN SECTOR 5, TO FACILITATE ITS REDEPLOYMENT.

B. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN GITARAMA REPORTED THAT A JOINT CIVPOL AND HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WENT TO NYABIKENZE COMMUNE ON 01 MAY 95 TO INVESTIGATE ALLEGATIONS BY A LOCAL REPRESENTATIVE OF PARENTS/TEACHERS ASSOCIATION (PTA) OF A PRIVATE COLLEGE IN THE COMMUNE THAT 20 LOCALS AT KIGURAGURO IN NYABIHENZE COMMUNE HAVE DISAPPEARED UNDER MYSTERIOUS CIRCUMSTANCES AND IT IS FEARED THAT THEY HAVE BEEN EXECUTED BY THE RPA. IN THE COURSE OF THE INVESTIGATIONS, 3 RPA SOLDIERS ARRIVED AT THE SCENE AND DEMANDED TO KNOW WHAT THE TEAM WAS DOING. THE PETITIONER FOR FEAR OF BEING HARASSED BY THE RPA, WAS SENT TO GITARAMA BY THE TEAM. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

C. CIVPOL PTL IN KIGALI WERE DENIED ACCESS TO KANOMBE COMMUNE BY RPA SOLDIERS AT A CHECKPOINT NEAR THE AIRPORT. THE SOLDIERS CLAIMED A WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES WAS NECESSARY BEFORE THE TEAM WOULD BE ALLOWED TO PATROL THE AREA.

D. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN BUTARE REPORTED THAT 50 PRISONERS HAVE BEEN RELEASED FROM NTYAZO COMMUNE PRISON ON 25 MAY 95 AFTER UNDERGOING CLEARANCE FORMALITIES BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

E. CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN RUHENGARI REPORTED THAT THIEVES ENTERED THE RESIDENCE OF THE MANAGER OF AUSTRIAN RELIEF PROGRAMME ON THE NIGHT OF 30 MAY 95 AND STOLE 60 ROOFING SHEETS. A DATSUN WITH REGISTRATION NUMBER 597 VAZ WAS ALSO STOLEN. BOTH CASES HAVE BEEN REPORTED TO GENDARMERIE OFFICE IN RUHENGARI FOR INVESTIGATION.

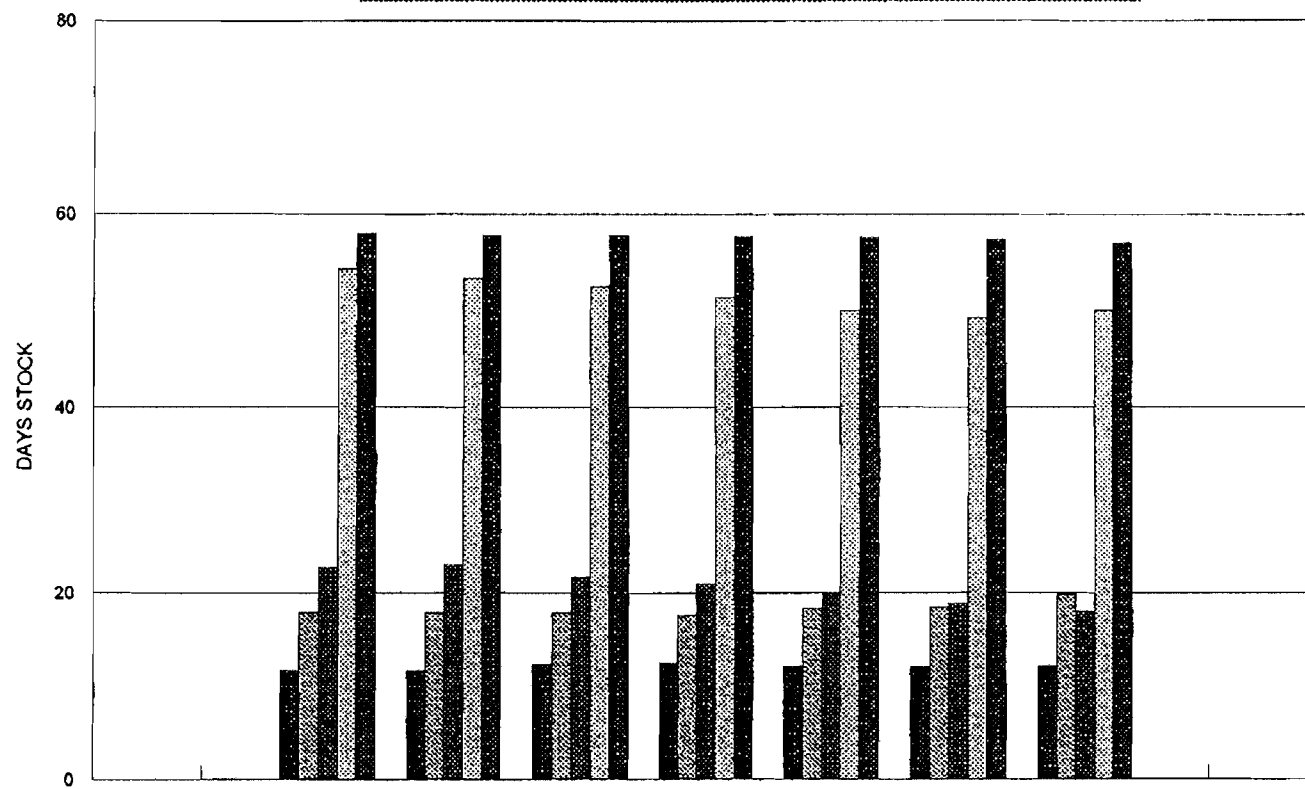

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. A JOINT COMMISSION, COMPRISING OF SENIOR REPRESENTATIVES FROM UNAMIR, THE ICRC, THE OFFICES OF THE PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER, AND VARIOUS OTHER GOVERNMENT MINISTRIES, HELD ITS INITIAL MEETING TODAY TO DISCUSS MEASURES AIMED AT IMPROVING CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS. UNAMIR'S PROPOSED CONTRIBUTION COULD INCLUDE THE PROVISION OF LOGISTIC SUPPORT, ASSISTANCE IN PRISON REFURBISHMENT AND TRANSPORTATION OF PRISONERS AND MATERIALS.

B. THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME, HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE TODAY IN WHICH HE STATED THAT THE CONSEQUENCES OF THE CONTINUED SUPPLY OF ARMS TO RWANDESE REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES WOULD AFFECT NOT ONLY RWANDA, BUT ALSO THE ENTIRE REGION. HE ADDED THAT DESPITE ATTEMPTS AT DESTABILISING RWANDA FROM ABROAD, THE SECURITY SITUATION THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY'S TERRITORY WAS UNDER CONTROL.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) MILOBS IN SECTOR 6 REPORTED THAT RPA CONTINUE TO CARRY OUT RANDOM PTLs AND ROADBLOCKS. THE RPA CAMP AND FORMER PRISON IN KAGASA GR 1277 WAS FOUND ABANDONED.

(2) MILOBS IN SECTOR 5 REPORTED THAT, THE RUHENGERI RPA BN COMD, THE LOCAL GENDARMERIE COMD AND THE BOURGMESTRE OF THE KIGOMBE COMMUNE HELD A SECURITY MEETING IN THE STADIUM FROM 1100 TO 1400 HRS TODAY.

(3) SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT TWO UNHRFO PERS WERE HELD FOR THREE HOURS FROM 1000HRS TO 1300HRS AT AN RPA CHECKPOINT NEAR CYANGUGU WHEN THEY REFUSED TO ALLOW THE RPA TO LOOK THROUGH THEIR DOCUMENTS. THEY WERE HOWEVER ALLOWED TO PROCEED WHEN THEY SUCCUMBED TO THE RPA REQUEST. THE INTERVENTION BY MILOBS AND HR LO WAS UNSUCCESSFUL.

(4) MILOBS IN SECTOR 4B REPORTED THAT RPA PLATOON AT KIGEMBE GR 7093 IS BEING PULLED OUT FOR REDEPLOYMENT AT THE BURUNDI BORDER. RPA CHECK POINT AT SHYANDA GR 7718 IS REPORTED TO HAVE SUBJECTED BOTH PEDESTRIANS AND MOTORISTS WHO PASS THE CHECK POINT TO BODY AND BAGGAGE SEARCHES. UNAMIR AND NGO PERS HAVE SO FAR BEEN EXEMPTED.

(6) SECTOR 1 MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA CHECKPOINT AT KIBALI GR 0523 IS STILL VERY ACTIVE AND CONTINUES TO LOG PARTICULARS OF ALL PERSONS AND VEH'S PASSING THROUGH THAT CHECKPOINT.

(7) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 3 REPORTED, THAT THE RPA MAINTAINED A VERY STRONG PRESENCE IN GITARAMA TODAY BECAUSE OF THE DEMONSTRATION AT KIBGAYI.

B. MILITIA/FRGF. IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT ARMED ELEMENTS FROM ZAIRE STOLE LIVESTOCK, FOOD AND CLOTHING FROM A LOCAL AT NYAMASHEKE BETWEEN 1900-2100HRS ON 01 JUN 95.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) THE FORCE COMMANDER DISCUSSED WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF THE PROGRESS OF MANDATE DISCUSSIONS OCCURRING AT UNHQ NEW YORK. (3) LATER IN THE MORNING HE MET WITH A SELECT GROUP OF RWANDESE OFFICIALS WHO HAVE BEEN BROUGHT TOGETHER AS THE COMMISSION OF PRISONS IN RWANDA. THEY INTEND TO VISIT THE CURRENT AND PROPOSED PRISON SITES ON 03 JUN 95. IN A SHOW OF GOOD FAITH, PREVIOUS RESTRICTIONS ON UNAMIR HELICOPTER MOVEMENT WAS EASED BY RPA TO ALLOW THE COMMISSION UTILISE AIR RECONNAISSANCE.

(4) IN THE AFTERNOON THE FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO THE NDERA TRANSIT CAMP AND MET WITH NGO OFFICIALS, THE CAMP COMMANDANT AND SEVERAL OF THE RESIDENT POPULATION. LATER HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH SEVERAL SENIOR STAFF INCLUDING THE CAO, CISS AND DCOS SP. A NUMBER OF POINTS RELATING TO MISSION ADMINISTRATION WERE COVERED.

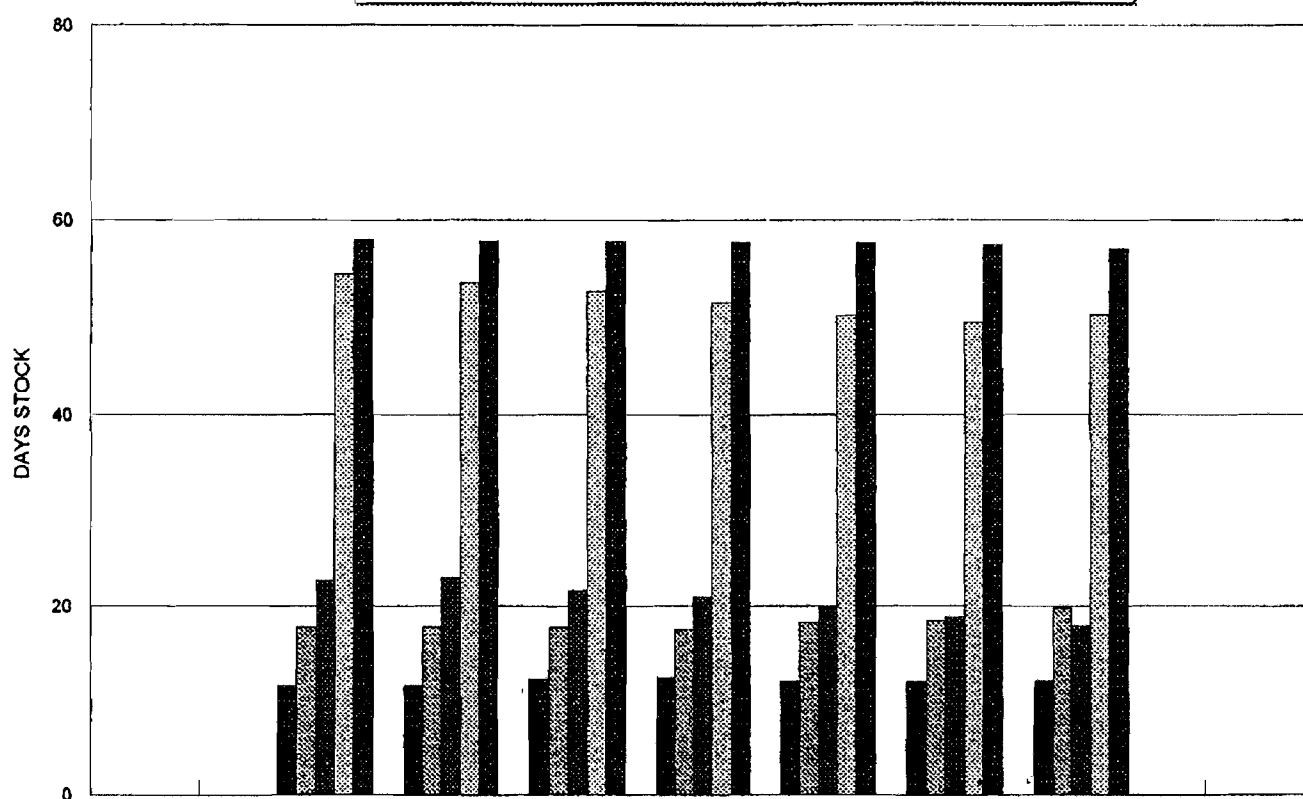
