Italian War Crimes.

During the past few months, a considerable number of Affidavits and Statements have been taken from repatriated Prisoners of War. Many of these have formed the basis of and have accompanied Charges filed with the Commission.

There remain, however, a number of Affidavits and Statements which relate to Charges filed with the Commission at an earlier date, i.e. those in which your reference is 269/UK/It/38 to 962/UK/It/57, the final numbers being consecutive.

I enclose a Schedule, which shows the U.N.W.C.C. references (in chronological order as regards the final number); the B.N.O. references; the date of classification, approximate in the earlier cases; the classification of the Accused; and the names of witnesses subsequent to classification. *No Answer Required*  
/ I enclose eight copies of an Affidavit of Cpl. E.H. Cuthbertson, taken since classification of the accused in this case, and eight copies of the Italian Commandant's report on the subject matter of the charge; one copy of each being for the charge filed with the Commission and seven copies for Committee 1. *Also eight copies of "Addendum" to Charge.*

*No. 4* In view of the fresh evidence, and particularly that contained in the Commandant's Report, it is submitted that reclassification is desirable. It is established that the sentry was one Filippo Casullo, and that he shot the victim in the back as he was retreating towards the centre of the Camp - i.e. making no effort whatever to escape; that there was in force an order that sentries should shoot merely on a man being "out of bounds" though within the camp; and that Grogan, the victim, was a sick man.

It appears that the Accused named in The Charge should be amended. Sommavilla appears to have been Officer of the Guard, and Orofolo or Orofalo Commandant, in succession to Armellini, who was responsible for the *harsh* Order; and the Casullo was the sentry who fired. It is suggested that the list of Accused should now run :-

....

- (1) Lt. Col. Orofolo or Orofalo, Camp Commandant
- (2) Major Armellini, Camp Commandant prior to Accused No. (1)
- (3) Captain Sommavilla, Officer of the Guard.
- (4) Pte. Filippo Casullo, Guard who fired the shot.

It may be that Sommavilla was Adjutant rather than Guard Officer, but it seems unnecessary at this stage to bring in an unnamed officer, the Adjutant or 2 i/c when all the other names are confirmed. If necessary the Adjutant can be added later.

It is submitted that all the Accused might be classified "A".

If, however, Committee I considers that any useful purpose will be served, e.g. of record, we suggest these names be put on the Commission's list of witnesses, and in future we will list all German witnesses.

3. Our UK - G/B 305 U.N.W.C.C. 1778/UK/G/302

The matters referred to are being made the subject of a separate case as they were committed by civilians. This case will be submitted in due course.

4. Our UK - G/B 311 U.N.W.C.C. 1784/UK/G/308

I have consulted with the J.A.G. who is in charge of prosecutions, and he is agreeable to the name of Inspector Gaul being removed from the list of accused if Committee I does not feel that a prima facie case has been established. Such a course will not prevent him being prosecuted in due course should the trial bring out the fact that he is implicated.

5. Our UK - G/B 317 U.N.W.C.C. 1908/UK/G/314

We have discussed this case also with the J.A.G. and we still think that the evidence is insufficient to justify a charge against O/Lt. Lindhorst as an accessory to this killing.

I have been advised by the J.A.G. that the United States authorities are conducting parallel enquiries in relation to gross ill-treatment of Ps/W during transit from Stalag Luft VI to Stalag Luft IV, which have formed the subject of the above charges.

2. The American file apparently contains a great deal more evidence than we have been able to procure, and in consequence it has been decided by the J.A.G. that the U.S. Deputy Theater Judge Advocate is in a more satisfactory position to secure that justice be done.
