SUBJECT: COORDINATION/ESCORT/TRANSPORT REQUEST 9 DEC 94

1. The Representative of the Secretary General for Internal Displaced Persons, Dr Deng, will be visiting Rwanda between 7 and 10 December 94. Assistance regarding coordination, escort and transport is then required from you on 9 December during a field visit.

2. The group will be composed of between 4 to 7 persons (number TBC). The aim is to visit displaced persons in a camp and returnees in their communes. The Presence of those personalities is expected: prefect, bourgmestre, Commander from RPA and UNAMIR, camp chief, representative of NGOs operating on the site, representative from UNREO, UNHCR and UNHRC. Liaison with Human Rights Team on the ground to be done in order to coordinate the transport and the presence of each of the participant in time .

 - b. 1030 hours arrival in Kibeho LZ, near Kibeho camp, escort/transport required to visit the camp and discuss with the displaced; meeting with the expected guests; presence of an interpreter is requested;

SUBJECT: Helicopter Assistance for Missing NGO Search.

1. Further to your signal 291840Z Nov 94 requesting technical assistance to effectively utilise helicopter for search operations 25 nm north of Goma. G3 Air Ops flew on the last mission on 28 Nov. He is the only current SH/SAR qualified helicopter pilot assigned to this HQ and is the only member of the G3 Air ops cell.

3. In both G3 Air's and Canadian Helicopter's opinion, further search missions over the area are pointless. If the person is injured and under cover, the chances of finding him are minimal in that terrain. If the person has tried to leave the area further search patterns are worthless. Unless agencies on the ground can ascertain from the locals and police or military, a more specific area to search, further air searches are not an option.

4. By all means send a Milob or UNHCR person to be briefed on SAR patterns and methods at this HQ. However it is more a case of where to look, not how. Even with thermal imaging equipment, random searches of the area would not be productive. UNAMIR have cooperated fully in this operation but with incredibly limited air assets a realistic approach must be taken. No doubt UNAMIR's image with the agencies and NGOs are a factor in deciding if to fly further missions.

5. Please could you investigate the availability of Jet-A1 for refuelling at Goma. If more information is forthcoming UNAMIR will fully support your operations with further SAR missions. The intention is to provide a SAR mission tomorrow whilst a helicopter is in Gisenyi with the DFC. Times will be notified by radio. Note that the minimum search speed depends on the helicopters all up weight. A maximum of 4 persons in the rear cabin will allow a slower search speed to be flown.



1.A.	<p>Percentage of Original Inhabitants Returning:</p> <p>It is very difficult to obtain accurate figures from local prefectures. ICRC has completed a good data base for this region current as of 01 Nov 94. This is attached as Annex A to this report. In many sectors the present population exceeds that of the pre-war period. One cannot assume, however, that this indicates a full return of the pre-war population.</p>	<p>ICRC</p> <p>UNHCR</p>
1.B.	<p>Number of "New Comers" Settling in Sector:</p> <p>See para 1.A.</p> <p>So-called 59/60 Returnees are quantifiable "new comers" to this sector. UNHCR figures are based on current populations of NYUNDO and NYABUTWA transit camps, who will be settled in the MUTARA region of this sector. This figure is presently (6000)</p>	<p>MILOBS</p> <p>ICRC</p> <p>UNHCR</p>
1.C.	<p>Indications of Properties Being Invaded:</p> <p>Many properties and businesses in this sector were owned by strong supporters of the former government. These properties are now in many cases administered as "government property" by the prefectures.</p> <p>Each prefecture maintains a "housing committee", a function of which is to arbitrate in any property ownership dispute.</p> <p>Some returning 59/60 persons have occupied lands and houses in the MUTURA area. They have acknowledged that they expect to be "moved" at a later date. (Note: This is an increasing problem in some areas of this sector. See para 1.D.)</p> <p>There have been several incidents alleging RPA confiscation of houses for military use. See Annex B to this report.</p>	<p>MILOBS</p> <p>UNHCHR</p>

1.D.	<p>Agriculture:</p> <p>Agriculture in this area is flourishing. Maintenance of pre-war crops is widespread, and much new planting has been done. Very little land goes untended. Next harvest period is Jan 95.</p> <p>Seed and tool distribution remains a priority. In this sector the coordinators of this program are CARITAS and WORLD VISION. All prefectures report a shortage of agricultural tools (hoes and machetes) as well as seed.</p> <p>A growing problem concerns the temporary occupation of vacant farms by returning 59/60 refugees who are harvesting the crops without preparing for future crops, due to their belief that they will be resettled in other areas at a future date. This problem is confined primarily to the GISENYI prefecture and is being addressed by that Prefet.</p> <p>FAO comment:</p> <p>FAO has established an office in GISENYI with the Agriculture Officer for that prefecture. 1.E.	<p>Education:</p> <p>COOPI is established at GISENYI. Purpose of this NGO group is to provide limited teacher training and to make necessary basic repairs to school buildings.</p> <p>An Education Officer has been appointed within each of the GISENYI and RUHENGRI prefectures.</p> <p>As at 01 Nov 94 there are 178 primary schools operating in the GISENYI prefecture with approximately 70,000 students in attendance. This compares to the 1989 figure of 104,000 primary students. Of the 25 secondary and 30 technical schools located here none are currently open.</p> <p>Problems identified by COOPI include:</p> <p>(1) teachers have received salary for Sep period only. Food for Work program has been slowed due to lack of truck to make distribution in the area.</p> <p>(2) schools lack desks (15,000 required) and text books, student supplies, etc. UNICEF is working on this.</p> <p>(3) most teachers (70 -75%) are unqualified. In fact, the majority are former secondary school students who await the reopening of those schools. (Note: pre-war estimate of unqualified teachers was 50 %)</p> <p>No data is available as yet from RUHENGRI area. Austrian Relief Organization is principal agent for support to education in that area. 1.F.	<p>Transport:</p> <p>Movement of returnees throughout this area is done by UNHCR / IOM using busses and trucks.</p> <p>Public transport in this region is minimal. A small number of "mini-bus" or pick up truck type vehicles are privately operated on the main GISENYI-KIGALI road.</p> <p>Some transport trucks operate in the area to transport agricultural produce to KIGALI markets. This is also a private enterprise.</p>	MILOBS UNHCR IOM
1.G.	<p>Unofficial Border Crossing:</p> <p>There is considerable cross-border movement in this sector at unofficial crossing points. This is primarily for purpose of trade / sale of agricultural produce and is characteristic of rural frontier regions.</p> <p>There is some returnee traffic through the VIRUNGA MOUNTAIN area. While accurate counts are impossible we can estimate / average the rate of return to be approximately 100 persons per 24 hour period. Most travel is at night.</p> <p>Rate of persons returning from Zaire by boat is increasing. Since 09 Sep 94 approximately 6000 persons have returned in this way. Most of these returnees are 59/60 refugees who have the money to pay for this service. Most recently, the practice is for large numbers of persons to move together for purposes of mutual protection from "bandits." (pirates?) Highest figure recorded to date on a single day was (1000) persons arriving in 10 boats. Large numbers of cattle are also being transported by boat and barge from Zaire into Rwanda. SECTION 2 - GOVERNMENT ACTIVITIES

2.A.

Treatment of Returnees by RPA:

Local population is mixed but is predominantly HUTU. In general the relationship between local population and RPA is peaceful.

There is, however, a strong concern in the RPA that many of the local population maintain their support for the former government. They suspect that infiltrators are or will be assisted by local sympathizers. Additionally, the RPA feels that many war-criminals and former soldiers remain concealed in the local population. This is reflected by a relatively high arrest rate in the sector.

The order by the Minister of Rehabilitation issued 3 weeks ago tasking all Prefets to detail wartime atrocities in their areas seems to have resulted in an increased incidence of arrest throughout the area. In relation to this investigation, civilian authorities are for the first time involved in making arrests. The report by the Prefet of RUHENGARI is now complete. The GISENYI report has yet to be completed.

There is increasing evidence of robbery and extortion by elements of the RPA against locals. Persons with money (shop owners, bar owners, etc) or property (59/60 returnees with cattle) are especially vulnerable. See Annex B to this report. RPA commanders appear to take all reports of wrong-doing seriously. There are several cases on record of disciplinary action having been administered. However, normal RPA response seems to be the posting of defaulters to a new unit in another location.

	<p>Primary source of information in this sector continues to be the so-called "bush telegraph" i.e. spread of rumors by word of mouth. The investigation of incidents by MILOBS / UNHCHR shows that information, often exaggerated and incorrect, rapidly spreads among local populations, especially in rural areas. It is often surprising at how quickly incidents occurring in GOMA area camps are reported to local populations (the reverse is equally true). It can be assumed that much of this is passed word-of-mouth in the course of cross-border trading and via returning refugees.</p>	<p>UNHCR</p>
	<p>There have been several reports of "inflammatory" letters being passed from GOMA camps to local areas. Most notably these warn of impending attack by FAR forces.</p>	<p>UNAMIR PO</p>
	<p>There have been several reports of teachers or local commune leaders being arrested for the spreading of "anti-government" information. The rumor alleging local RPA recruitment of young boys was attributed to several RUHENGARI teachers who have since fled to ZAIRE.</p>	<p>NGOs</p>
	<p>New prefets were appointed at RUHENGARI and GISENYI in Nov 94. Both are popular choices with local populations. A series of rallies are now being conducted throughout both of these prefectures. These are being monitored by UNAMIR Political Officer.</p>	<p>Intl Media</p>
	<p>Rwanda radio and television have been active in this area. Foreign journalists, especially television crews, are routinely accompanied by Rwanda media advisors.</p>	
	<p>Rwanda radio was used on several occasions by the former prefet of RUHENGARI to complain publically that poor effort of certain NGO groups was delaying food distribution in the area. This led to some problems for NGOs in the region.</p>	
	<p>Discussions with senior RPA Officers indicate that BBC and VOA radio programs provide most of their outside information.</p>

2.E. Resources Available to Local Government:

A lack of resources continues to be the chief obstacle to the establishment of a smooth running local government. Areas of specific concern at this time include:

(1) The requirement of a suitable (off-road) vehicle for the Prefet and staff of GISENYI prefecture to allow movement in the sector. Former Prefet utilized his (personal) army vehicle. Presently both UNHCR and UNAMIR assist in this regard.

(2) A functioning telephone system would enhance the functioning of local governments. Much time is lost in even the most routine of actions through unavailability of communications.

(3) Basic repairs to government offices at both prefecture and commune level is required in some areas to render them usable by local officials.

(4) Office supplies of all types are requested by both Prefets. This includes even basic items such as paper and other stationary.

Quality of local government staff varies. Prefet of RUHENGARI has openly stated that some of his current staff are not qualified for their positions and that he will seek to replace them in the near future.

Government staffs are receiving salary only on an irregular basis. It is understood that salary for Sep 94 period was only paid in Nov 94. It was noted that the Prefet of GISENYI had an "account" at the Meridian Hotel for business related entertaining.

SECTION 3 - NGO and UN AGENCIES

3.A.

UN/NGO/Government Cooperation:

MILOBS

In general terms, local governments are expressing some concern that most of the aid agencies continue to concentrate efforts on short term problems with limited long term planning. Prefects of both RUHENGARI and GISENYI suggest that local populations are relatively stable and that the need now is for provision of seeds and tools, provision of infrastructure and training of personnel to operate the infrastructure.

Aid agencies are very aware of this situation. While some are now planning to "tailor" their operations to local needs, others are accepting that the "crisis" period is over and are preparing to depart.

UNHCR GISENYI office continues to provide the leadership and coordination throughout this sector. UNHCR relations with local governments and with RPA is very good. In cases where NGOs were perceived to be working in isolation or counter to the main effort UNHCR has been instrumental in re-directing the effort in a positive direction.

SUBJECT: CEASE FIRE MEETINGS BETWEEN UNAMIR, RGF AND RPF -
MERIDIEN HOTEL

1. In order to discuss the possible cease fire between the warring RGF and RPF, UNAMIR will organize confidential meetings at the MERIDIEN HOTEL.

2. As the MERIDIEN HOTEL actually is in the area controlled by RPF, free movement of their leadership is essentially guaranteed. The Representatives of RGF on the other hand need special escorts of UNAMIR.

3. Procedure. The overall commander of this operation is the Senior UNMO of Lt Col rank minimum:

a. Kigali Sector to provide:

- (1) One armed escort (RUTBAT rifle platoon).
- (2) Two BTR 80 APC.
- (3) Both have to report to Force HQ on call for their tasking.

b. MILOB HQ to provide four UNMO Teams:

- (1) Team 1: Senior UNMO and overall mission commander.
- (2) Team 2: Escort team and RGF escort lead.
- (3) Team 3: Escort team and RPF escort lead.
- (4) Team 4: Security team, to control the access to MERIDIEN HOTEL between forward positions of RPF and the meeting place, making sure that no ambush or other aggression against the RGF convoy is intended by RPF troops or any other element. This control has to be executed before and after the meeting.

c. Force HQ to contact: (F-3)

- (1) F-9 A(LO at Army HQ): He will gather the RGF representatives by the time that the escort arrives at the RGF Army Headquarters or the designated pick up point.


(2) CL-1(LO at RPF HQ, CND): He is to ensure that RPF agrees with the movement of the escort through their lines and that cease fire action is taken along the route.

(3) KT-9 (Tunisian Coy Comd): He will deploy a complete platoon in all round defence at MERIDIEN. Another section will ensure security of the entrance, corridors and meeting hall.

d. RUTBAT rifle platoon is to insure close security of RGF representatives in and around the APCs and inside MERIDIEN HOTEL.

e. RPF leadership to move with their own escort and an UNMO escort team. This escort will stay outside of the perimeter occupied by Tun Coy. RPF escort to be not more than two sections.

f. After the meeting, RPF will leave first with their escort, controlled by the RGF escort leader. Subsequently but no later than 30 minutes after the departure of RPF leaders, the escort will bring the RGF representatives back to their HQ.



2. A preliminary inspection of the camp by MILOBS showed that with the exception of the main access road to the camp and the accommodation area, other parts are generally overgrown with weeds and appear quite unsafe to traverse.
3. Two booby traps were recently discovered and were disarmed by the RPA. It is feared that there could be more elsewhere in the camp.
4. Currently, a gendarmerie unit is stationed in the camp and there are plans to improve the general environment for increased activity, including training. This cannot, however, be carried out because of the mine and booby trap threat.
5. It is therefore requested that a technical inspection of the GISENYI Gendarm Camp be conducted at the earliest opportunity for subsequent clearance. Thank you.

1. THE SITUATION ALONG THE RWANDA/ZAIRE BORDERS INSIDE SECTOR 4C'S AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY CAN GENERALLY BE DESCRIBED AS CALM.

THE STRETCH FROM THE GOMBANIRO TIP GD 9397 TO THE RUZIZI 1 GD 2476 HAS BEEN QUIET SAVE FOR A FEW BANDIT INCIDENTS PERPETRATED BY INSIDE CRIMINALS.

2. IN SUBSECTOR BUBARAMA A DECLINE IN THE SECURITY SITUATION WAS OBSERVED ALONG THE BURUNDI RATHER THAN ZAIRE BORDERS ~~ESPEC~~ ESPECIALLY IN THE GIKUNDAMVURA AND SURROUNDING AREAS GD 9309.

WORTH TO NOTE WAS THE INCIDENT OF ~~THE~~ 15 NOV 94 WHERE A GROUP OF ABOUT 20 ^{FORMER} CONFIRMED ANTARAHAMWE RAIDED A VILLAGE AND STOLE FOODSTUFFS AND MONEY AND RETREATED BACK INTO BURUNDI WHERE THEY ARE SAID TO HAVE SETUP A BASE.

3. IN THE CYANGURU AND BUBARAMA SUBSECTORS REFUGEES HAVE CONTINUED TO POUR INTO RWANDA THROUGH THE RUZIZI 1, 2, AND 4 BORDER POSTS, AND CHECK POINTS BY RPA HAVE REVEALED THAT MOST HAVE HAD NO HIDDEN AGENDA BUT GENUINE RETURNEES.





2. It is a common sight to see UNAMIR vehicles parked in front of restaurants and bars during afternoon working hours on Fridays. This practice is unacceptable and will not be tolerated. One has to be mindful of the presence of various UN specialized agencies and NGOs operating in the same area who will view this attitude of UNAMIR personnel with distaste and accompanying negative comments. It is also morally wrong for us to start feeling too free too soon.
3. It is therefore to be brought to the notice of all under command that UNAMIR is still operating its 7 day working routine in a week since the situation in Rwanda is far from normal and that all must continue to maintain the same working momentum throughout the week. Time for 'O' Gp on Sunday mornings will however continue to be 0930 hrs instead of 0800 hrs. At the appropriate time, a review of these instructions will be carried out.

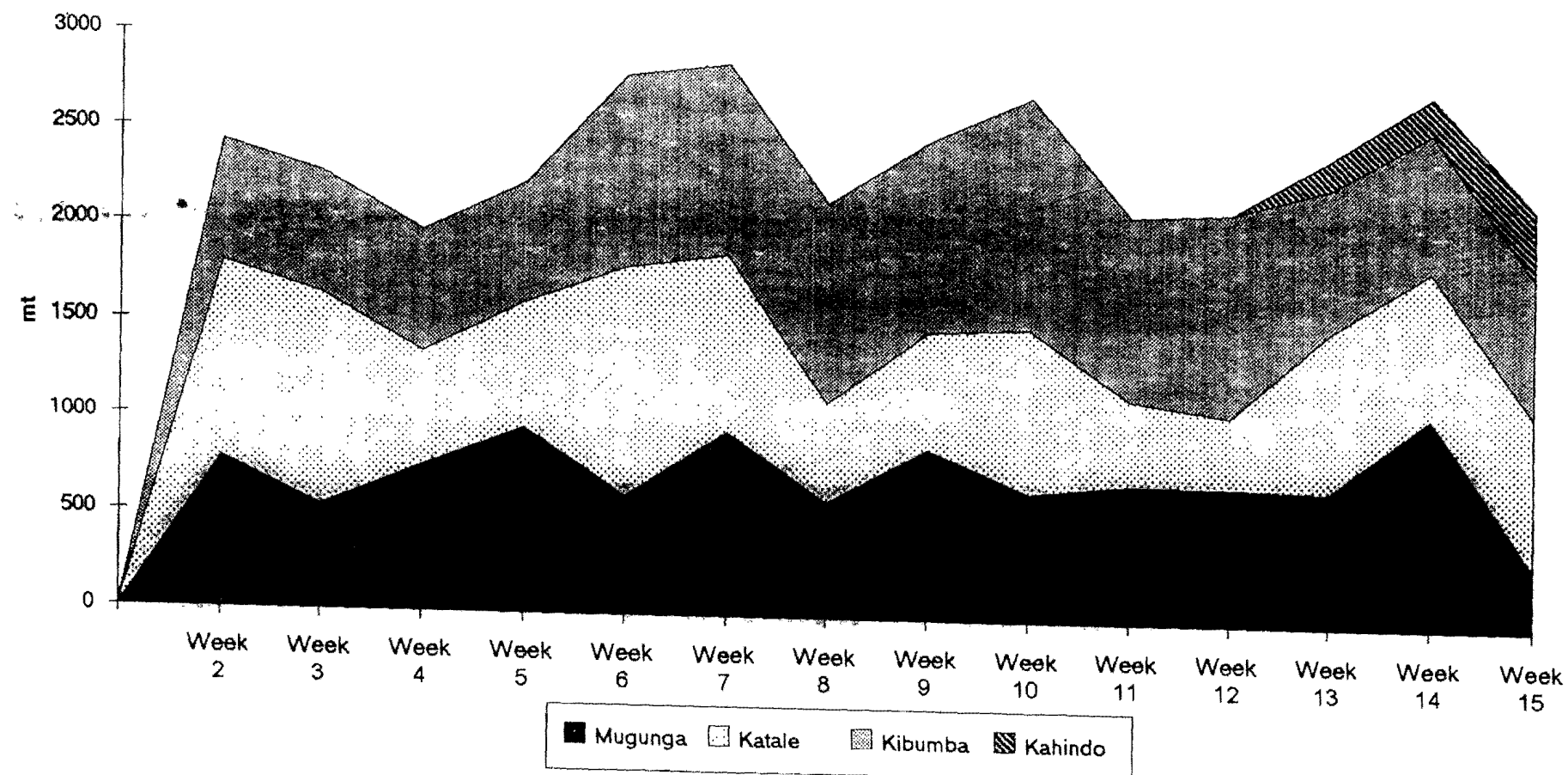

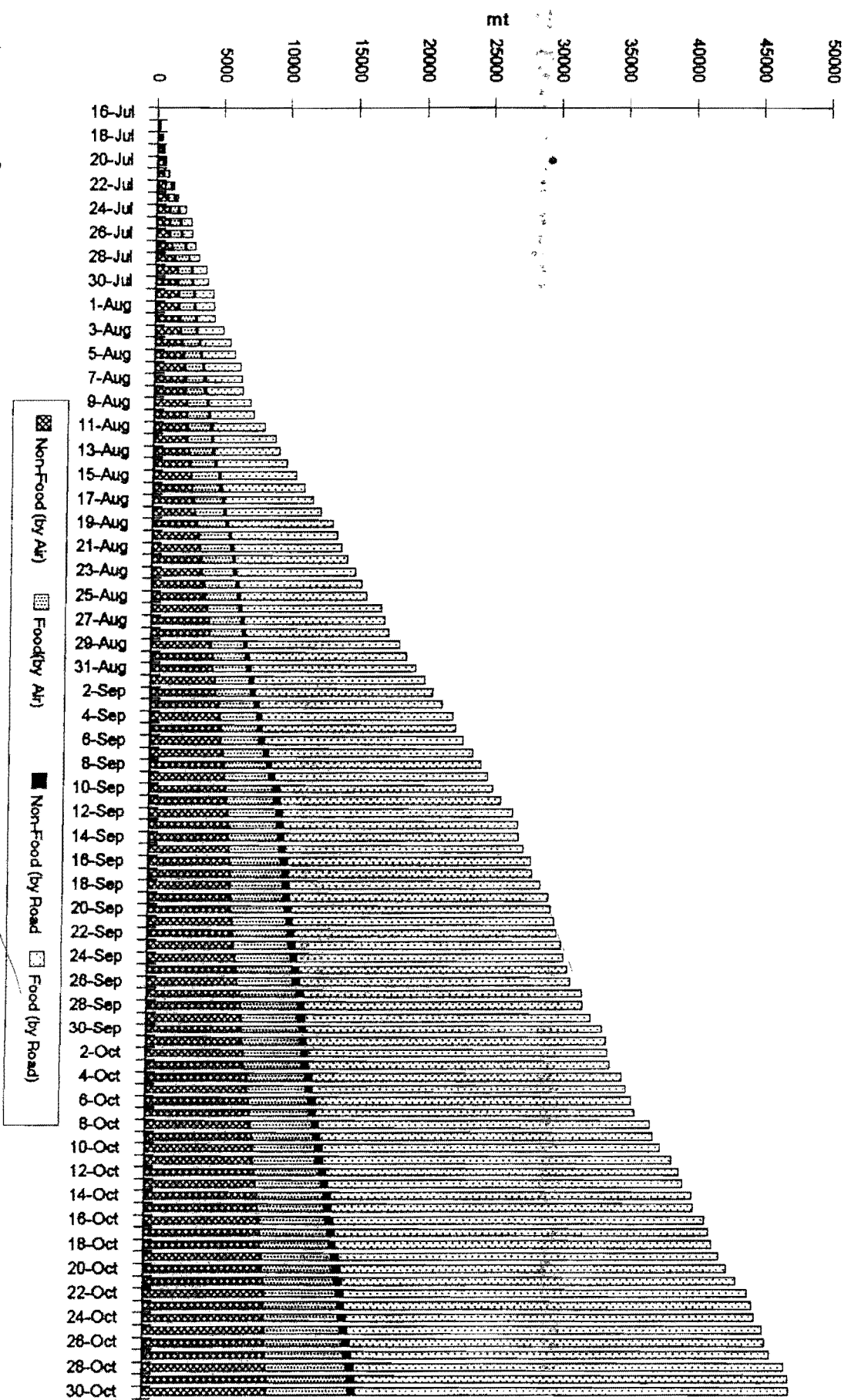

1. Reference A directs all commanders to increase UN presence in refugee camps within RWANDA. Contingency plans have been developed to reinforce certain sectors in the event that displaced persons (DPs) are forcibly removed from their camps.


2. Clearly, if this situation arises, the potential for confrontation will emerge. Under these circumstances, a sound understanding of the applicable Rules of Engagement is fundamental.

3. Reference B mandates UNAMIR to "contribute to the security and protection of displaced persons, refugees and civilians at risk in RWANDA" and "Recognizes that UNAMIR may be required to take action in self-defence against persons or groups who threaten protected sites and populations, United Nations and other humanitarian personnel or the means of delivery and distribution of humanitarian relief".

4. Reference C provides clear guidance for the application of Resolution 925. The following provisions should be specifically noted:

- a. Authority to use force. The use of force is authorized to protect the above designated individuals against forcible removal from the camps which they occupy (Ref C, para 8).
- b. The principles for the use of force must be adhered to (Ref C, para 7).
- c. Challenge and escalation procedures are to be followed (Ref C, paras 14 and 15).

- d. Units involved in the protection of DP camps are to remain on State GREEN (Annex A to Ref C) until ordered otherwise.




