

Subject: ROAD SAFETY AND THE STOWAGE OF LOADS

1. Although the final MP report on the accident in which MCpl Edouard Baouna Kaourbene has not yet been produced, initial enquiries have revealed that his death was caused when the small troop carrying vehicle in which he was a rear seat passenger became uncontrollable on a wet and very slippery stretch of unmetalled road. Fearing that the vehicle was about to roll over, he jumped and ran from it but was then hit by the truck's spare wheel as it bounced from the rear passenger compartment (in which it had been lying loose) when the vehicle came to rest on a ledge 4 feet below the road surface from which it had slipped. MCpl Kaourbene's neck was broken and he died instantly - although his vehicle was barely damaged and could be driven back to its base with the other passengers who suffered only minor injuries.

2. It seems appropriate to remember MCpl Kaourbene by stressing to others that the correct stowage and lashing of loads can save lives. Please remind all drivers and vehicle commanders of the extreme danger that can be caused by allowing heavy objects such as spare wheels, tool boxes, jacks and the like to fall from the loads that their tasks require them to convey - loose in the rear of their vehicles.

3. Rwanda's road and traffic conditions are unpredictable; please do your utmost to ensure that we do not suffer a repetition of this tragic incident. Although it did not have a bearing on this particular case, drivers and their passengers are also strongly recommended to wear seat belts when they are fitted unless operational conditions dictate otherwise.

A Modern Day Hero

In this day in age, heroism is scarce, but there are still a few people whose courage commands respect. Such is the case of a UN Austrian officer who received a great deal of praise in a letter from a Belgian family: "while risking his own life, he protected 8 Belgian citizens threatened by Rwandan militia".

The Austrian major was in the service of the United Nations in Rwanda at the outbreak of the war which was to leave its mark on him at the very least.

He also recalls a Belgian woman who owned a hotel in Gisenyi. While the Rwandan militia ransacked the hotel and carried out its carnage, he aided the woman and several members of her family to escape.

The officer was able to drive the Belgian nationals to another hotel, which was soon assailed by an armed group which massacred the reception staff with machetes and firearms as well as threatened the officer who had taken the fleeing party under his wing.

Faced with adversity, the officer fought with body and soul rather than allow himself to be intimidated. In the end, he was able to help the fleeing party by getting them safely across the border to Zaire.

Heroism is not dead.

On receipt of any hostile report, a warning order would be given to units to insure a security alert plan.

The protection of UNAMIR personnel is paramount. However a duty to protect the following is concerned :

- UNRWO - UNHCR - UNCIVPOL - NGO'S PERSONNEL - DISPLACED PERSONS - REFUGEES AND CIVILIANS IN SITES OR POPULATION UNDER THE PROTECTION OF UNAMIR FORCES.

SECURITY ALERT MEASURES

KIBUYE SUB SECTOR REPORTS THAT THE LOCALS ARE STILL NERVOUS BUT UNSURE WHY.

(A) GITARAMA TEAM:-

i) SECTOR HQ STAFF, HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS AND MILOBS COORDINATED A MEETING INVOLVING THE LOCAL BDE CDR, PREFET OF GITARAMA, PROCUREUR AND BOURGEMESTRE OF NYAMABUYE COMMUNE TO TRY TO CONVINCE THE 150 PERSONS SEEKING REFUGE AQT SECTOR HQ TO RETURN TO THEIR HOMES. THE INITIATIVE REQUIRED MOST OF THE MORNING WITH PEOPLE VISIBLY RELUCTANT TO TAKE THE AUTHORITIES WORD FOR THEIR SECURITY. ONE CITIZEN POINTED OUT TO THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT HE MIGHT BE A GOOD PERSONSBUT WITHOUT A GUN HE COULD DO NOTHING AGAINST THOSE WHO WERE HARRASSING HIM. THE PEOPLE WERE EVENTUALLY CONVINCED AFTER THE BDE CDR PROMISED TO DEAL WITH TWO PARTICULARLY BAD CASES PERSONALLY AND AFTER IT WAS AGREED THAT PEOPLE WOULD BE ESCORTED HOME BY MILOBS AND REGIBSTERED BY HUMAN RIGHTS. THEY WERE PROMISED FREQUENT FOLLOW UP B Y MILOBS. BY 1600 MOST OF THE PEOPLE HAD BEEN RETURNED TO THEIR HOMES BY MALICOY TRUCKS AND MILOBS, NO INCIDENTS REPORTED.

ii) MILOB/CIVPOL PATROL TO MURAMA COMMUNE FOUND THE SITUATION

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CALM WITH NO EVIDENCE OF TROUBLE. PEOPLE WERE OBSERVED WORKING IN THEIR FIELDS BUT THERE WAS NO MARKET ACTIVITY. SIMILAR SITUATION WAS OBSERVED IN RUNDA COMMUNE BUT CONVERSATION WITH THE BOURGEMESTRE AND A PRIEST REVEALED THAT THERE IS A HIGH LEVEL OF ANXIETY OVER THE CONTINUED VENGEFUL ATTITUDE OF THE RPA. DURING A PUBLIC MEETING YESTERDAY, THE RPA REP SPOKE AGGRESSIVELY. THREE PERSONS WERE ARRESTED TODAY. FURTHER, EARLIER THIS WEEK, A WOMAN WAS BEATEN SO BADLY BY AN RPA SOLDIER THAT SHW HAD TO BE EVACUATED BY ICRC. LAST, THE BOURGEMESTRE OF RUNDA PROVIDED THE TEAM WITH A SCHEDULE OF REMEMBRANCE ACTIVITIES FOR THE COMING WEEK.

(B) KIBUYE TEAM:-

(i) A MILOB PATROL CARRIED THE BOURGEMESTRE OF RUTSIRO TO MURUNDA (3088) TO ADDRESS A PUBLIC MEETING. THE ACTIVITY WAS SUCCESSFUL.

(ii) A MILOB PATROL TO GITWA (4071) AND KIGEYO (3978) LEARNED THAT THE TENSION HAS RELAXED A LITTLE BUT NOT SO MUCH THAT LOCALS STOP SLEEPING IN THE FIELDS. FIVE ARRESTS THIS WEEK IN KIGEYO BUT NO NAMES AVAILABLE.

(iii) A MILOB PATROL TO RWAMATAMU (1557) COMMUNE FOUND THE TOWN NEARLY DESERTED. THE PATROL WAS FOLLOWED BY AN RPA

PATROL WHO TRIED TO TELL THEM THAT THEY NEEDED SPECIAL CLEARANCE TO BE THERE. AFTER PERSUADING THE RPA OTHERWISE, THE PATROL HEARD FROM THE RPA THEMSELVES THAT THEY HAD ARRESTED A LARGE NUMBER OF PEOPLE, ALL OF WHOM WERE GUILTY OF GENOCIDE.

(iv) A FOURTH MILOB PATROL TO THE TWON OF MURAMBI (4755) FOLLOWED UP AN INCIDENT REPORT FROM SEVERAL DAYS AGO ERRONEOUSLY REPORTED TO HAVE OCCURRED IN MUKONGO. ON 30 MAR 95, FIVE RPA SOLDIERS ENTERED THE HOUSE OF NDAHEMANA ENEAS AND WERE ADVISED BY HIS WIFE THAT HE WOULD PROBABLY BE FOUND AT THE HOUSE OF HIS SECOND WIFE. ON ARRIVAL AT THE SECOND HOUSE, THE SOLDIERS WERE TOLD THAT ENEAS WAS IN TOWN. THE SOLDIERS BOUND THE WIFE AND WATCHMAN AND TOOK THEM BOTH TO TWON WHERE THEY FOUND ENEAS, TIED HIM UP, AND TOOK HIM BACK TO THE FIRST HOUSE. THERE, THE SOLDIERS ASKED IF HE HAD A SON. WHEN HE AFFIRMED THAT HE DID, THE SON WAS CALLED INTO THE HOUSE AND SHOT IN THE HEAD IN FRONT OF ENEAS AND HIS WIVES. (DECEASED IS BIZIYAREMYE, BALTAZAR, AGED 21) THE SOLDIERS THEN STOLE ALL OF ENEAS' MONEY (200,000RF), RANSACKED BOTH OF HIS HOUSES AND THEN MURDERED HIM. BOTH WIVES AND ONE LOCAL WITNESS VERIFIED THE INCIDENT BUT REFUSED TO IDENTIFY THE SOLDIERS. THE MILOB TEAM COULD NOT FIND THE SOUS-PREFET OR BOURGEMESTRE TO FOLLOW UP

(C) MALI COY:-

(i) MALICOY PATROLS IN THE NTONGWE AND MUNANIRA (5557) SECTORS FOUND THE SITUATION CALM. A THIRD PATROL TO NYMUGAL (8057) HAD A VEHICLE ACCIDENT CAUSING FIVE MINOR INJURIES

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(ii) MALICOY PROVIDED TWO VEHICLES AND ESCORTS TO FERRY APPROX 100 LOCALS WHO HAD SOUGHT PROTECTION AT SECT HQ BACK TO THEIR HOMES.

D. MALAWICOY :-

(i) PATROLS SENT TO MARA (2067) AND MUSHUBATI (3278) COMMUNES. SIT CALM BUT THE PATROLS SENSED A GENERAL UNEASINESS IN THE AREAS VISITED.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES:-

(i) HUMANITARIAN OFFR ATTEMPTED TO COORD THE MOVE OF ORPHANS FROM SHOGWE ORPHANAGE TO A NEW SITE. THE INITIATIVE PROCEEDED WITH THE USUAL CONFUSTION UNTIL THE RPA DECIDED THAT IT SHOULD STOP. DESPITE THE FACT THAT THE MOVE WAS ORDERED BY THE MINISTER OF THE INTERIOR AND THAT THE KITCHEN AND SLEEPING MATERIAL HAD ALRERADY BEEN MOVED, THE LOCAL RPA STOPPED A SECOND TRIP FROM HAPPENING. THIS HAD THE EFFECT OF SEPARATING THE CHILDREN FROM FOOD AND BEDDING. PERMISSION TO PROCEED WAS RECEIVED JUST BEFORE LAST LIGHT AND THE MOVE IS STILL GOING ON.



1. This HQ fully supports your request to use helicopters for operational tasks within your sector, this is exactly what helicopter support is here to achieve.
2. Helicopter support should be bid for using the standard Air Task Request format directly to Air Ops, at least 24 hours in advance of the task. Note that Air Ops have produced a user's guide to tasking that outlines capabilities and tasking procedures. If you require a further copy or any additional information do not hesitate to get in touch.
3. Task forms should specify landing site details, there is still a high risk of landing on mines in most sectors and sites should be pre-reccecd. A helicopter will not shut down unless the area is secure, it would be better to drop a patrol and then extract them later, at a specific time.
4. The only reliable method of communicating air to ground is on Motorola channel 7, non of the other channels are compatatible with the aircraft's radios.
5. Helicopter air requests may be sent to Air Ops via UNAMIR HQ Ops, Air ops is adjacent to the Ops room for precisely that reason. Please use the standard form to ensure that no vital details are omitted. Be sure to give a callsign and contact number to enable Air ops to confirm tasks or inform users of delays; weather, aircraft unservicability and higher priority tasks may intefere with your task request.

SUBJECT: SECURITY AWARENESS OF CURRENT SITUATION

The object of this memorandum is to appraise all staff members of the day to day events within the Mission with a view of creating a sense of security awareness in the hearts and minds of all concern. Therefore it will be in everybody's interest if all security related incidents are promptly reported in writing or even verbally, to the CSO/ASC - Paul Ischlika on Telephone No.11073 - Room No.4061 on the 3rd. floor. The security awareness bulletin will be issue every Monday of the week, providing information on events which occurred during the preceding week.

1. GENERAL:

The overall security situation in Rwanda although it remains relatively calm, is of serious concern. Incidents of hostility in the Refugee camps were reported where Aid Agencies are threatening to pull out because of lack of security protection. The worst incidents were reported on 11, November (i) Musebeya in Kigongoro, in the sector 4A (N) area, where a clash between the RPA and the Displaced people in the DPs camp led to 7 killings, 13 seriously injured, and an unknown number wounded people. (ii) In Musange in Kigongoro, 7 DPs were reported killed and 4 wounded. The situation is however reported to be returning to normalcy.

3. KIGALI:

Although the security situation in Kigali city and its environs remain calm, threats on personnel and hijacking of UNAMIR vehicles have been reported. The following are tit-bits of incidents worth mentioning for the attention of staff members:

- (a) In recent times the RPA has mounted an increased number of Road Blocks and check points around the city particularly at night time. These road blocks are put up in most cases with empty crates, and not lit to be seen from afar. They have also intensified routine foot and mobile patrols around the city.

- (b) A military Convoy bringing Returnees to the city from Gitarama end on 25 October was reported to have hit and killed an old man of 50 years of age, and abandoned the body on the road. The angry relatives have demanded an explanation from UNAMIR. A letter of condolence has been written to the bereaved family, and the matter is under investigation.

This hit-and-run attitude on the part of any personnel is totally unacceptable by any International standard, and as such, cannot be tolerated or condoned. It is more honorable to own up and help resolved the matter amicably, than to leave the person to die with no remorse for human feeling. Please refer to all administrative issuances and the Force directives to conduct yourselves in line with UN regulations at all times.

- (c) On 8, November one International staff was followed in the city by some uniformed RPA soldiers driving in a small Jeep. The Staff member suspecting that he was being followed, made some tactical moves to confirm his suspicion. Realizing that he was actually followed, he headed for his residence. Arriving and finding his main entrance gate closed and in an attempt to alert his inmates to open the gate, he was immediately surrounded by his followers who started to hit at his vehicle with their AK47s in desperation. The staff member did not give up, he continued to boot his horn while making an emergency call on his radio. He finally bashed the gate and drove in while his attackers drove off. One bayonet and a 9mm round was found which, had apparently fallen off from their weapon while bashing on the vehicle. The time of incident was at 8.30pm.
- (d) On 29, October one UNAMIR International staff in the finance section in Kigiri - Nairobi was mobbed by 8 bandits along the Jomo Kenyatta Avenue around 19.30 hrs. and robbed of everything he had; Cash in Dollars and Kenyan Shillings, Calculator, shoes, spectacles and UNAMIR ID card etc. The incident was reported at the Kilimani Police station but no arrest has so far been made.
- (e) One International staff working for Candy House was attacked and assaulted by Uniformed RPA soldiers on Tuesday night 15, November at about 2145 hrs. The incident took place on a bridge on a side road within walking distance from Kigali Night Club. He was questioned and searched for dollars which he didn't have on him. He was saved by an oncoming vehicle which the attackers saw and fled into the bush. He sustained minor bruises on his face.

- (f) On 29, October one International staff was fined 10,000 Rwandee Francs by the RPA Gendarmerie for Careless driving after impounding the Vehicle UNAMIR 43 for about 10 days. The staff member had to pay before the vehicle could be released.

(g) **HIJACKING OF VEHICLES:**

- (i) On 29, October 1994 one Toyota Land cruiser No.1045 was forcefully hijacked at gun point by Armed RPA soldiers from UNAMIR Military Officer, outside his residence in Kigali city.
- (ii) On 14, November 1994 another 4 Runner Land cruiser No.1088 was hijacked from a staff member of UNAMIR. This took place around 2145 hrs. between the junction of Belgian village and the slope coming to Chez Lando on the main Airport road. At gun point he was asked to drive to a remote area where he was given some beatings and asked to get off the vehicle.

This brings the number of hijacked vehicles in two months, to four - 413, 455, (double cab pickups) and, 1045 and 1088 (4 Runner LandCruisers), besides 1016 that was hijacked on 15 October and was recovered by the RPA and returned to UNAMIR on 19 October 1994.

5. A UNAMIR Military Police Company has been established and is now operational. The military police office is located 500 meters East of the old UNICEF Building on the main Airport road, opposite the Nobiscum Restaurant.

Major J.G. Plante is the FORCE PROVOST MARSHAL, and the Detachment operates on channel 7, call sign " GOLF HOTEL ZERO. " You can contact the MP Desk Officer on telephone # 86855 and the FPM on Telephone # 86856. All accident cases should be reported to the FPM and a copy sent to the CSO/ASC.

SECURITY GUIDELINES:

- (i) Carry your ID card with you at all times. If you are issued with a Motorola Radio, you are advised to carry it with you as well.

- (ii) Avoid going out on your own and staying out too late at night. It is advisable that you go out in groups of two or more, and where possible, go in convoys of two or more vehicles.
- (iii) Avoid driving at night in remote and isolated areas in the city. Know safe streets and routes.
- (iv) Avoid using local taxis and privately owned cars particularly at night time, except if you know the private car owner. Should you be forced to use a local taxi, you must always be in the company of somebody you know and trust too well. Relying on Registration number plates of taxis is not enough.
- (v) Should you be attacked, you should always try to be calm and firm, and courteous. Never show signs of stress and intimidation, even though you may feel intimidated.
- (vi) Avoid all forms of arguments with your attackers even where you have your right.
- (vii) It is always in your best interest to yield to the demands of your attackers and where possible establish some kind of rapport with them.
- (viii) Stop only at established road blocks/check points, and avoid giving lifts to non UN personnel. Do not stop at hand signals of any kind at night, especially in suspicious circumstances and areas.
- (ix) Should you be trailed at night, avoid heading for your residence especially if it is a distance away from you. You should always try to head for Public houses specially HQ where there is crowd and call for help on your radio describing your exact location.
- (x) Above all, please do not discard "COMMON SENSE" as it will assist you to appreciate the situation on the ground, make sensible deductions and take decisions in your best interest. REMEMBER YOUR LIFE COMES FIRST, AND THEREAFTER, ALL OTHER THINGS SHALL BE ADDED UNTO YOU.

AIDE-MEMOIRE
VOICE PROCEDURE

PURPOSE

1. The purpose of this aide-memoire is to prescribe the basic radio-telephone procedure that shall be used on all UNAMIR radio nets.

GENERAL

1. Transmissions by radiotelephone will be as short and concise as possible consistent with clearness. Since personnel other than trained operators frequently operate radio equipment, all personnel must be cautioned that transmissions by radio are subject to intercept and therefore have no security.

2. Adherence to prescribed procedure is mandatory. Unauthorized departures from or variations in prescribed procedure often create confusion, reduce reliability and speed, and are therefore prohibited. If the procedure prescribed herein does not cover a specific operating requirement, initiative and common sense should suffice.

3. The following basic rules are essential and should be strictly enforced:

a. no transmission shall be made which has not been authorized by proper authority.

b. the following practices are forbidden:

(1) unofficial conversation between operators.

(2) excessive time consumed in tuning, changing frequency or adjusting/testing equipment.

(3) profane, indecent or obscene language.

(4) transmitting at speeds beyond capabilities of receiving operator.

4. To utilize circuit time more efficiently, all messages or their substance should be written down prior to transmission. Those messages which must be delivered by the receiving operator to another person or which are preceded by proword MESSAGE shall be written down.

5. Transmissions by radiotelephone shall be as short and concise as practicable consistent with clarity. The use of standard phraseology enhances brevity.

6. Transmissions over radiotelephone should be clear with natural emphasis on each word (except the prescribed pronunciation of a numeral), and should be spoken in natural phrases, not word by word.

7. To avoid interfering with other traffic, an operator shall listen to make certain that a circuit is clear before making any transmissions thereon.

DISCIPLINE

1. Good discipline is essential to the efficient working of radio nets. Irrespective of rank, the CONTROL STATION is in charge of the net, and is responsible for its discipline. Radio discipline includes:

- a. correct use of procedures;
- b. opening and closing of nets or stations;
- c. keeping net or circuit on correct frequency; and
- d. maintenance of radio watch by all stations.

ESTABLISHING COMMUNICATIONS

1. Before conducting regular traffic over radiotelephone circuits, it may be necessary to make contact with other stations involved to ascertain that communication is possible.

EXAMPLE A (Conditions good):

1. 2A transmits:
Two Three - THIS IS - Two Alfa - OVER.
2. 23 answers the initial call:
Two Three - OVER.
3. 2A having nothing for 23, transmits:
Two Alfa - ROGER - OUT.

EXAMPLE B (Conditions difficult):

1. 2A transmits:
Two Three - Two Three - THIS IS - Two Alfa -
Two Alfa - RADIO CHECK - OVER.
2. 23 transmits:
Two Alfa - Two Alfa - THIS IS - Two Three -
Two Three - WEAK - OVER.
3. 2A having nothing for 23, transmits:
Two Three - THIS IS - Two Alfa - ROGER -
OUT.

RADIO CHECKS, SIGNAL STRENGTH
AND READABILITY

1. A station is understood to have good signal strength and readability unless otherwise notified. Strength of signals and readability will be exchanged only when requested or when difficulty is experienced.

2. The prowords listed below are for use when initiating and answering queries concerning signal strength and readability.

a. General

RADIO CHECK what is my signal strength and readability
i.e. How do you hear me.

ROGER i have received your last transmission
satisfactorily. (the omission of comment
on signal strength and readability is
understood to mean that reception is loud
and clear. If reception is other than
loud and clear it must be described with
the prowords from paragraphs b and c
below).

NOTHING HEARD to be used when no reply is received from
a call station.

b. Report of signal strength

LOUD your signal strength is very strong.

GOOD your signal strength is good.

WEAK your signal strength is weak.

VERY WEAK your signal strength is very weak.

FADING at times your signal strength fades to
such an extent that continuous reception
cannot be relied upon.

c. Report of readability

CLEAR excellent quality.

READABLE quality is satisfactory.

UNREADABLE the quality of your transmission is so bad
that i cannot read you.

DISTORTED having trouble reading you because your
signal is distorted.

WITH
INTERFERENCE having trouble reading you due to
interference.

NODUFF

1. NODUFF is used when an emergency occurs such as a helicopter MED EVAC, upon hearing NODUFF all stations on the circuit shall stay off the air until the emergency is over.

PHONETIC ALPHABET

1. When necessary to identify any letter of the alphabet, the standard phonetic alphabet shall be used. This alphabet is listed below:

2. Difficult words or groups within the text of plain-text messages may be spelled using the phonetic alphabet and preceded by the proword " I SPELL". If the operator can pronounce the word to be spelled, he will do so before and after the spelling to identify the word.

EXAMPLE: "Cantenary - I SPELL charlie alfa november tango echo november alfa romeo yankee - Cantenary".

"Rendez vous point is - I SPELL uniform november india mike alfa kilo".

PRONUNCIATION OF NUMERALS

1. To distinguish numerals from words similarly pronounced, the proword "FIGURES" may be used preceding such numbers.

2. When numerals are transmitted by radio, the following rules for their pronunciation will be observed:

3. Numbers will be transmitted digit by digit, except that exact multiples of thousands may be spoken as such.

4. The decimal point is to be spoken as "DAY-SEE-MAL".

EXAMPLE: 123.4 is to be spoken as "wun too tree DAY-SEE-MAL fow-er".

5. Dates shall be spoken digit by digit, with months in full.

6. Roman numerals shall be transmitted as the corresponding arabic numerals preceded by the word "ROMAN".

ABBREVIATION IN THE TEXT

1. Abbreviation in the text are transmitted as follows:

a. initials used alone or in conjunction with short titles shall be spoken phonetically.

EXAMPLE: "Para A" - shall be spoken as "Paragraph Alfa".

"APC" - shall be spoken as "Alfa Papa Charlie".

b. personal initials shall be spoken phonetically, prefixed by the word "INITIALS".

EXAMPLE: "G.M. Smith" - shall be spoken as "INITIALS Golf Mike Smith".

c. abbreviations frequently used in normal speech may be used in the same manner when transmitted by voice.

EXAMPLE: "NATO" - may be spoken as "NATO".

d. punctuation shall be spoken as follows:

PROWORDS

1. Prowords are pronounceable words or phrases which have been assigned meanings for the purpose of expediting message handling on circuits where radiotelephone is employed. In no case shall a proword or a combination of prowords be substituted for the textual component of a message.

2. The following prowords are authorized for general use:
