

I wish to inform you that your letter of 2 August 1972 addressed to the Secretary-General was considered by the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples at its 882nd meeting, on 17 August 1972.

With regard to your suggestion that a United Nations visiting mission be sent to the Territory of Guam, I would draw your attention to the fact that for a number of years the Special Committee and the General Assembly have adopted resolutions in which an appeal has been made to administering Powers to permit the access of visiting groups to the Territories under their administration. It has been owing to the failure of the United States Government to respond positively to this appeal that the Special Committee has not as yet been able to dispatch a visiting mission to Guam. While I intend to pursue this matter with the Permanent Representative of the United States to the United Nations, you may wish to approach the appropriate United States authorities directly on the question.

In view of your expressed readiness to furnish information on the Territory of Guam, the Special Committee would be prepared to hear you at such time as is mutually convenient.

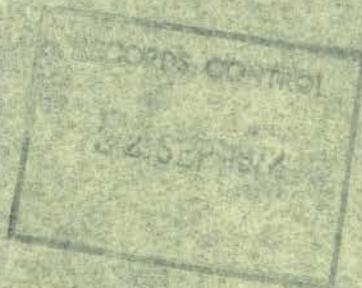
