A. GITARAMA TEAM

i) ONE TEAM CARRIED OUT A FOLLOW UP VISIT TO NYAMABUYE COMMUNE TO FINISH TASKS BEGUN YESTERDAY. THE MAIN ISSUE DISCUSSED WAS THE CLEANUP OF GITARAMA MARKET THOUGH A NUMBER OF OTHER MINOR HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE ISSUES WERE ALSO COORDINATED. THE TEAM SUBSEQUENTLY VISITED SHOGWE AND RULLI SECTORS OF NYAMABUYE COMMUNES WHERE THEY RECEIVED COMPLAINTS CONCERNING AN INORDINATE NUMBER OF ARRESTS BY THE RPA. BOTH COUNSELLORS STATED THAT ARRESTS CONTINUE TO BE FREQUENT AND CARRIED OUT WITHOUT REGARD TO THE CIVIL AUTHORITIES. NO WORD HAS BEEN RECEIVED FROM ANY OF THOSE ARRESTED. THE TEAM REQUESTED A LIST OF NAMES OF THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN TAKEN AS THE FIRST STEP IN FOLLOWING UP THE COMPLAINTS. WE WILL TAKE MORE INTEREST IN THE IMMEDIATE AREA AS THE POPULATION IS LARGELY HUTU AND VERY NERVOUS ABOUT THE LARGE RPA GARRISON IN GITARAMA.

ii) A SECOND TEAM VISITED FOUR SECTORS IN THE KIGOMA COMMUNE AND OBSERVED COMMUNAL WORK PROJECTS UNDERWAY IN ALL OF THEM. THE LOCALS EXPRESSED NO FEELINGS OF INSECURITY.

iii) THE SECTOR COMMANDER ACCOMPANIED THE HUMAN RIGHTS MONITOR TO THE GITARAMA PRISON. THE CONDITIONS ARE APPALLING. APPROX 4200 OCCUPY A FACILITY DESIGNED FOR 1000. FEW PRISONERS HAVE

ROOM TO LIE DOWN. MOST ARE CONFINED TO AN OPEN COURTYARD AND ARE SO TIGHTLY PACKED IN THAT THEY MUST SLEEP IN SHIFTS. AS MENTIONED EARLIER, IT IS BELIEVED THAT MANY MORE PRISONERS WILL NEED ACCOMODATION BEFORE THE COURTS CAN BE SET UP TO DEAL WITH THEM. FOR THIS REASON, SOME ATTEMPT TO ASSIST THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO EXPAND THEIR DETENTION FACILITIES WOULD SEEM TO BE ESSENTIAL. POW TYPE CAGES MIGHT BE CONSIDERED AS A TEMPORARY MEASURE.

iv) THE DCOS OPS, DCOS ADMIN AND OIC OF RETOUR VISITED SECTOR HQ TO DISCUSS PROBLEMS OF OP RETOUR WITH THE SECTOR COND. THEY THEN PROCEEDED TO KIGOMA ORC WHERE THEY WITNESSED THE ARRIVAL OF A GROUP OF RETURNING IDPS.

B. BUTARE TEAM

i) ONE PATROL WAS SENT TO KINYARU-HAUTE BORDER CROSSING. 8 RWANDESE RETURNED ON 30 JAN.

ii) ONE PATROL WENT TO SHYANDA COMMUNE. NO PROBLEMS WITH RETURNING IDPS BUT HOUSING COMMITTEE HAS YET TO BE INSTALLED.

C. MALI COY

i) ONE PATROL WENT FROM RUHANGO TO KADAKO (5749) AND HEARD FROM LOCAL AUTHORITIES THAT 60 IDPS PER DAY CROSS THE BRIDGE AT GR 530506 ON FOOT ON THEIR WAY BACK TO HOME COMMUNES.

ii) ONE IDP WHO WAS PART OF A GROUP RETURNING TO NTONGWE COMMUNE YESTERDAY WAS THREATENED BY ONE OF HIS NEIGHBOURS WHO INSISTED THAT HE WAS GUILTY OF MURDER AND THAT HE WANTED TO SETTLE ACCOUNTS IMMEDIATELY. THE MALICOY GUARDS REFUSED TO HAND HIM OVER AND ESCORTED HIM BACK TO THE KIGOMA ORC FOR THE NIGHT. TODAY, THEY HANDED THE INDIVIDUAL OVER TO THE BOURGEMESTRE WHO ARRANGED FOR HIM TO BE ESCORTED BY THE CIVIL AUTHORITY BACK TO HIS HOME. AS OF LAST LIGHT, THERE WAS NO FURTHER TROUBLE.

A. GITARAMA TEAM

i) ONE TEAM CONDUCTED A VISIT TO NYAMABUYE COMMUNE AND GATHERED DETAILED INFO TO SECTOR LEVEL. OF NOTE IS THE BOURGEMESTRE'S CLAIM THAT HIS MAIN PROBLEM IS PROPERTY DISPUTES ARISING OUT OF THE FACT THAT MANY VACANT HOUSES HAD BEEN OCCUPIED BY SQUATERS. THERE WERE APPROX 100 SUPPLICANTS GATHERED TO PRESENT THEIR CLAIMS WHEN THE TEAM VISITED. THE BOURGEMESTRE BELIEVES THAT MOST OF THOSE WHO FLED DURING THE WAR WERE SWEEPED ALONG WITH THE FORMER GOVT TO ZAIRE. HE DOES NOT BELIEVE THERE ARE MANY IDPS FROM HIS COMMUNE. THE COMMUNE POPULATION FIGURES ARE ONLY 1,000 SHY OF THE FORMER FIGURE. HE FEELS THAT THE FIGURE IS HIGH BECAUSE SO MANY FROM OTHER COMMUNES HAVE COME INTO LIVE HERE.

ii) A LIAISON VISIT TO TAC HQ BUTARE AND MALAWICOY WAS CONDUCTED BY THE OPSO TO DISCUSS OP RETOUR. IT APPEARED THAT THE IMPORTANCE OF DELIVERING RETURNING IDPS TO THE COMMUNE CENTRES HAD NOT BEEN CLEARLY COMMUNICATED. IT IS NOW BELIEVED THAT A WORKABLE SYSTEM IS IN PLACE BUT THE RESULTS WILL BE CLOSELY MONITORED BEFORE CONFIDENCE IS EXPRESSED.

B. BUTARE TEAM

i) ONE PATROL WAS SENT TO KINYARU-HAUTE BORDER CROSSING. 7 RWANDESE RETURNED ON 29 JAN.

ii) LAST NIGHT'S MEETING WITH THE LOCAL BDE COMD WAS POSTPONED AT THE LAST MINUTE. HOWEVER; CO GENDARMERIE BUTARE AND GIKONGORO PREFECTURES VISITED MILOBS TO DISCUSS TRAFFIC ISSUES. IT WAS AGREED THAT THEY WOULD COOPERATE CLOSELY WITH CIVPOL.

iii) ONE PATROL VISITED MBAZI COMMUNE AND WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT A HOUSING COMMITTEE HAS NOT YET BEEN FORMED. THERE ARE 400 ORPHANS STAYING WITH RELATIVES IN THE COMMUNE. OTHERWISE, THE SITUATION IS CALM.

CHANNEL 13 WAS UNUSABLE FROM 2000HRS 29 JAN TO APPROX 1200HRS 30 JAN AND IS NOT WORKING NOW. CHANNEL 12 IS OVER CROWDED. POOR COMMUNICATIONS CONTINUE TO HAMPER OUR OPS. BUTARE MILOBS ARE STILL AWAITING THE ARRIVAL OF TECHNICIANS TO MOVE THE BASE STATION. THE UNIVERSITY AUTHORITIES ARE GETTING RESTIVE AT THE DELAY IN VACATING THE PREMISES. FURTHER, OP RETOUR TASKS HAVE BEEN COMPLICATED BY THE LACK OF AVAILABLE BASE STATION OR VEHICLE MOUNTED RADIO FOR MALICOY; SEPERATE PAPER FOLLOWS.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 281800 TO 291800B JAN 951. GENERAL SITUATION. CALM.2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED NYABISINDU TO ATTEEND A SOLEMN CEREMONY INVOLVING THE EXHUMATION OF THE REMAINS OF RELATIVES OF HIS WIFE FROM A MASS GRAVE NEAR THE FAMILY HOME. THE LOCATION OF THE MASS GRAVE WAS INDICATED BY AN ALLEGED LEADER OF THE GROUP WHICH CARRIED OUT THE GENOCIDE IN THE AREA DURING THE WAR. THE CEREMONY WAS ALSO ATTENDED BY THE SECTOR CDR, THE CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS PD OPERATIONS AND A MILOBS TEAM FROM THE SECTOR. THE BODIES WERE REBURIED IN COFFINS IN THE FAMILY COMPOUND.

- i) ONE TEAM ESCORTED THE PRESIDENT AS DESCRIBED ABOVE.
- ii) A BICYCLE PATROL ALONG THE FOOTPATHS IN THE GITARAMA AND MUSHUBATI COMMUNES DISCOVERED THAT HUMANITARIAN AID IS BEING DISTRIBUTED UNEVENLY. THE RESIDENTS OF GIHUMA SECTOR (7068) COMPLAINED THAT THEY RECEIVED A FRACTION OF THE SEEDS DELIVERED TO GITARAMA SECTOR. OTHERWISE, THE INHABITANTS SEEMED QUITE AT EASE THOUGH SOMEWHAT HUNGRY.
- iii) DRIVER TRAINING WAS CONDUCTED FOR THOSE MILOBS NOT IN POSSESSION OF A DRIVERS LICENSE. IT IS GOING TO TAKE SOME TIME TO BRING THEM UP TO AN ACCEPTABLE STANDARD.

A. GITARAMA TEAM

i) ONE TEAM TRAVELLED TO BUTARE TO LOOK INTO THE PROCEDURE FOR PROCESSING IDPS THROUGH THE WAY STATION AND TO TRY TO FIND THE SOURCE OF OUR COMMUNICATIONS PROBLEMS. THEY WERE SURPRISED TO FIND THAT THE UNREO REP AT THE WAY STATION HAD NOT BEEN MADE AWARE OF THE PROBLEM CAUSED BY THE PRACTICE OF DROPPING IDPS OFF ALONG THE WAY TO THEIR COMMUNES. WHEN THE REACTION OF THE BOURGEMESTRE OF NTONGWE WAS DESCRIBED TO HIM, HE AGREED WITH THE NECESSITY TO GIVE CLEAR DIRECTION TO HIS DRIVERS AND GUARDS TO ENSURE THAT IDPS MADE IT TO THE REGISTRATION POINT AT THE ORC OR COMMUNE CENTRE. HE ALSO AGREED TO LOOK INTO THE POSSIBILITY OF ARRANGING RPA GUARDS TO ACCOMPANY IDPS TO HELP THEM GET TO THEIR DESTINATION.

ii) ONE TEAM DID A FOLLOW UP VISIT TO MUKINGI COMMUNE AND NAYABISHINDU COMMUNE. THE TEAM DISCOVERED 4 MASS GRAVES IN MUKINGI AND 3 IN NAYABISINDU. SINCE TODAY IS SATURDAY NO OFFICIAL WERE PRESENT IN THE COMMUNE HQ. THE TEAM ALSO UPDATED SRSG'S WEEKLY REPORT AT SECT LEAVEL IN MUKINGI.

iii) THE SECTOR COMMANDER HAS RETURNED FROM LEAVE AND HAS BEEN BRIEFED.

B. BUTARE TEAM

i) FAX REPORT NOT AVAILABLE YET. COMMS PROBLEMS CONTINUE TO PLAGUE US.

ii) ONE TEAM TO KANYARU-HAUTE BORDER CROSSING. ONLY TWO RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI ON 27 JAN. OTHER PATROLS CURTAILED DUE TO FUEL SHORTAGE.

C. MALI COY

i) TWO PTLs SENT TO NYAKOGO (6255), AND LOCAL FOOT PATROL IN NTONGWE TOWN CENTER. THE PEOPLE OF NYAKOGO ARE PREOCCUPIED WITH TENDING AND HARVESTING THEIR CROPS BUT ARE BRACING THEMSELVES FOR AN EPIDEMIC OF MEASLES.

ii) ESCORTED BROWN AND ROOT CONVOY FROM KIGALI TO KIGOMA AND BACK.

D. MALAWI COY

i) CONTINUED SECURITY DUTIES AT TAC HQ AND COY HQ. SPORTS DAY HELD AT KIGEMBE. OTHER ACTIVITIES WERE CURTAILED DUE TO FUEL SHORTAGE.

5. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES

i) THE HUMAN RIGHTS REP REPORTED SEVERAL DAYS AGO THAT THE PRESENT POPULATION OF GITARAMA PRISON HAS REACHED 4,448. IT IS DESIGNED TO ACCOMODATE 1,000. THE MATTER WAS TAKEN UP WITH THE WARDEN AND THE BRIGADE COMMANDER AND THEY EXPRESSED A WILLINGNESS TO CLEAN UP AN AREA FOR INCREASED EXPANSION AND TO TRY TO GET THE GISENYI AND KIBUYE PRISONS BACK IN OPERATION. NEVER THE LESS, ONE BI-PRODUCT OF OP RETOUR IS BOUND TO BE INCREASED PRESSURE ON THE PRISONS. IT MAY BE WORTH INVESTIGATING A SOURCE OF FUNDS TO HELP THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT ESTABLISH HUMANE HOLDING FACILITIES IN WHICH SUSPECTS CAN BE HELD UNTIL THE TRIBUNAL DEAL WITH THEM.

 - ii) A SECOND TEAM VISITED THE MUKINGI COMMUNE AND WERE SHOWN A MASS GRAVE NEAR THE COMMUNE BUREAU AND WERE GIVEN A HISTORY OF THE GENOCIDE BY A MEMBER OF THE MARIST ORDER. THE TEAM WAS INVITED TO COME BACK FOR A DETAILED RECCE OF MASS GRAVE SITES. THE COMMUNE IS FENCING THESE OFF AND IS PLANNING TO BUILD MONUMENTS AT EACH.
 - iii) DURING A VISIT TO MURAMA COMMUNE, A MILOB TEAM WAS ADVISED THAT THEFTS OF CATTLE BY FORMER MILITIA MEMBERS IN THE RUKONDO CAMP CONTINUE TO BE A PROBLEM DESPITE RPA PATROLS. THE BOURGEMESTRES OF BOTH MURAMA AND MASANGO BELIEVE THAT THE HIGH NUMBER OF RECENT RETURNEES ON FOOT IS DUE TO THEIR RECENT UNREO SPONSORED VISITS TO RUKONDO.
 - iv) A TEAM VISITED NTONGWE COMMUNE TO OBSERVE THE ARRIVAL OF RETURNING IDPS AND TO ASSESS THE EFFICIENCY OF THE PROCEDURE

REPORTED YESTERDAY. IT DID NOT GO WELL. THE BOURGEMESTRE GREETED US ANGRILY ON OUR ARRIVAL AND ACCUSED UNAMIR OF HAVING DROPPED OFF THE SEVENTY IDPS HE HAD BEEN ADVISED TO EXPECT YESTERDAY INSTEAD OF BRINGING THEM TO THE COMMUNE. HE WENT ON TO SUGGEST THAT THE RECENT COMMUNE RECCE THAT RESULTED IN 3 ARRESTS WAS A DELIBERATE TRAP SET BY UNAMIR TO TEST HIS RESOLVE. WE PARTED AMICABLY ENOUGH AFTER AN HOUR OF HEATED DISCUSSION IN WHICH HE REVEALED THAT HIS WHOLE FAMILY HAD BEEN MASSACRED ALONG WITH 12000 OTHER MEMBERS OF HIS COMMUNE. THE CONVOY FINALLY ARRIVED WITH 7 MEN, 10 WOMEN AND 35 CHILDREN. WE HAD BEEN ADVISED TO EXPECT 38. TOMORROW, A MILOB TEAM WILL GO TO THE BUTARE WAY STATION TO TRY TO DISCOVER WHERE THE MIX UP OCCURS.

v) HUMAN RIGHTS TEAMS CONTINUE TO BE ACTIVE IN OUR AREA AND HAVE AGREED TO SHARE THE MONITORING OF ARRIVING IDPS. MILOBS WILL DO SPOT CHECKS OF RETURNEE WELFARE USING THE REGISTRATION SHEETS PROVIDED BY UNHCR.

B. BUTARE TEAM

i) ONE TEAM PATROLLED TO KANYARU-HAUTE BORDER CROSSING AND REPORTED THAT RWANDA TODAY. NO EXIT FIGURES AVAILABLE.

OP RETOUR WAS DISCUSSED AND A PRACTICAL SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEM OF REGISTRATION AND FOLLOW UP WAS REACHED. i) MILOBS AND MALICOY ASSISTED IN EMERGENCY TREATMENT AND EVACUATION OF RWANDESE LOCALS INVOLVED IN A TRAFFIC ACCIDENT ON THE MAIN GITARAMA KIGALI ROAD 1 KM EAST OF MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE. ONE CASUALTY WAS EVACUATED DIRECTLY TO KIGALI, SEVEN WERE TAKEN TO GITARAMA HOSPITAL AND ONE DIED AT THE SCENE OF THE ACCIDENT. TWO OF THOSE TAKEN TO GITARAMA DIED TODAY. IN ANTICIPATION OF FURTHER SUCH ACCIDENTS, THIS SECTOR WILL INVESTIGATE THE CAPACITY OF LOCAL FACILITIES TO HANDLE SERIOUS ACCIDENTS.

ii) ONE MILOB TEAM CONDUCTED A COMMUNE VISIT TO NYAMABUYE. FEW CONSEILS COULD BE FOUND AND THE BOURGEMESTRE WAS ABSENT AT THE PREFECTURE MEETING. IT WAS CONFIRMED THAT THERE ARE PROPERTY OWNERSHIP PROBLEMS IN THE GITARAMA SECTOR AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITY ANTICIPATES SOME DIFFICULTY IN SORTING IT OUT AS MORE PEOPLE COME BACK. THE TEAM WAS ALSO ADVISED THAT THERE ARE 316 ORPHANS IN GITARAMA, ALL OF WHOM HAVE BEEN TAKEN IN BY NEIGHBOURS. FOOD IS NOT PLENTIFUL.

THE POLICY OF NOT DISTRIBUTING FOOD AT THE ORCS IS WELL UNDERSTOOD HOWEVER THERE OUGHT TO BE SOME PROVISION TO PREVENT WOMEN AND CHILDREN GOING HUNGRY IN THE EVENT THAT THINGS DO NOT GO AS PLANNED. A SMALL EMERGENCY SUPPLY COULD BE HELD BY THE SECURITY DETACHMENT AT EACH ORC OR AT SECTOR HQ.

A REPORT CAME TO LIGHT TODAY OF A NIGHT VISIT TO MURAMA COMMUNE BY 3 MEN FROM GIKONGORO AREA WHO CLAIMED TO HAVE MILITIA AFFILIATIONS AND WHO THREATENED TO KILL ALL THOSE WHO HAD RETURNED FROM THE CAMPS. THEY WERE CARRYING MACHETES AND ALLEDGEDLY THREATENED THEIR OWN PARENTS. THEY LEFT AS SOON AS THEY LEARNED OF THAT THE RPA HAD BEEN CALLED BUT NOT BEFORE USING THEIR MACHETES TO HACK DOWN A NUMBER OF CASAVA PLANTS.

i) ONE TEAM WENT TO MASANGO, MURAMA AND RUKONDO. PURPOSE - ROUTE RECCE TO RUKONDO DPC. THE ASSISTANT BOURGEMESTRE REPORTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN ONLY 150 RETURNEES DURING THE MONTH OF JAN. A NEWLY REPORTED MASS GRAVE FROM THE APR/MAY PERIOD WAS REPORTED. DETAILS TO FOLLOW BY 20 JAN.

ii) A SECOND MILOB TEAM WENT IN SEARCH OF MASS GRAVES IN THE MUYIRA, TAMBWE AND KIGOMA COMMUNES. A TOTAL OF 21 GRAVE SITES WERE REPORTED. THEY WERE ALLEGED TO CONTAIN OVER 10,000 BODIES IN TOTAL BUT IT WAS IMPOSSIBLE TO ESTIMATE THE VALIDITY OF THESE CLAIMS OWING TO THE DIFFERENCE IN SIZE AND SHAPE OF EACH AND DUE TO THE GRASS THAT HAS COMPLETELY COVERED EACH SITE. DETAILS TO FOLLOW BY 20 JAN.

NO MEDICAL ASSISTANCE; MANY MENENGITIS AND MALARIA CASES IN THE SECTOR. NO NGO ACTIVITIES. RPA PRESENCE, STR UNKNOWN. LOCALS REQUEST URGENT MEDICAL HELP, SEEDS AND FARMING TOOLS. MSF TO BE CONTACTED.
3. RUNGO SECTOR. (6539) POPULATION 674 FAMILIES AS COMPARED TO 2000, BEFORE THE WAR. 180-190 RETURNED FROM GIKONGORO DPC AND FROM ZAIRE. 1 NEWLY DISCOVERED MASS GRAVE OF 100 PERSONS (GR 6537). RPA : 1 SECTION. LOCALS IN THIS AREA VERY KEEN TO HAVE ALL THEIR NEIGHBOURS BACK WITH THEM.

5. A PLAN INITIATED BY UNREO TO ESCORT 14 RETURNEES TO VISIT THEIR HOME SECTORS IN THE NTONGWE COMMUNE RAN AFOUL OF A RELUCTANT BOURGEMESTRE WHO COULD NOT BE ADVISED AHEAD OF TIME DUE TO SHORT LEAD TIME. THE BOURGEMESTRE FURTHER OBSERVED TO THE MIL OB TEAM THAT HE DID NOT LIKE THE IDEA OF RECEIVING RETURNEES WITHOUT REGISTRATION AND WITHOUT NOTIFICATION. HE EXPLAINED THAT MANY RESIDENTS HAVE REASON TO FEAR SOME OF THE RETURNEES AND ADVISED THAT UNLESS WE HAD SOME SCREENING SYSTEM, THE LOCAL RPA WOULD BE OBLIGED TO ENSURE THAT UNAMIR WAS NOT IMPORTING CRIMINALS.

6. MILOB TEAMS ATTEMPTING TO GATHER INFORMATION ON SECTORS ARE HAMPERED BY LINGUISTIC DIFFICULTIES. MANY SECTORS HAVE NO ONE LEFT CAPABLE OF SPEAKING EITHER FRENCH OR ENGLISH. WE URGENTLY REQUIRE AT LEAST THREE MORE INTERPRETERS IF WE ARE TO CARRY OUT THE TASKS THAT WE HAVE BEEN GIVEN. AN INITIAL ATTEMPT TO RESOLVE THIS AT OUR LEVEL HAS BEEN STARTED BUT YOUR SUPPORT MAY BE REQUIRED TO ENSURE THAT UNAMIR HQ UNDERSTANDS THAT OUR NEED IS NOT FOR SCHOLARS BUT RATHER FOR PERSONS ABLE TO INTERPRET SIMPLE CONVERSATIONS FROM KINYARWANDA INTO EITHER FRENCH OR ENGLISH.

A.GITARAMA TEAM

MILOB TEAMS CARRIED OUT PATROLS TO SECTOR LEVEL IN BOTH MUYIRA AND NTONGWE COMMUNES. THE TEAM THAT WENT TO MUYIRA FOUND CONSEILS AVAILABLE IN NYAMUYAGA, MUTUTU AND MUNYINIYA. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN ALL THREE SECTORS WAS REPORTED AS VERY GOOD WITH NO PROPERTY DISPUTES AND SUFFICIENT HOUSING TO ACCOMMODATE MOST OF THOSE WHO HAVE RETURNED. THIS COMMUNE WAS ONLY RECENTLY SETTLED AND MOST OF THE INHABITANTS FLED EARLY DURING THE WAR TO BURUNDI. CONSEQUENTLY, IT WAS SPARSELY POPULATED AND THERE WAS LITTLE DESTRUCTION. THERE WERE RELATIVELY FEW WAR DEATHS AND MOST OF THE POPULATION HAD ALREADY RETURNED. THE MAIN PROBLEM IS POOR DRINKING WATER. FARM TOOLS, SEEDS AND FOOD ARE ALSO IN SHORT SUPPLY AND THERE IS LITTLE NGO ACTIVITY IN THE AREA. THE TEAM THEN VISITED THE BRIDGE AT BUSORO AND FOUND THAT A SMALL FERRY HAS BEEN PUT INTO PLACE FOR FOOT AND BICYCLE TRAFFIC. THERE WERE ONLY TEN PEOPLE WORKING ON THE APPROACH AND THE ROAD LEADING FROM THE BRIDGE DUE WEST TO THE GITARAMA ROAD IS VIRTUALLY IMPASSABLE.

THE SECOND TEAM VISITED GITOVU, RUTOBU, KINAZI AND GAKO SECTORS OF NTONGWE COMMUNE. THE SECURITY SITUATION WAS REPORTED AS GOOD BUT THERE IS LITTLE FARMING ACTIVITY DUE TO A SEVERE SHORTAGE OF TOOLS AND SEEDS. FIGURES OF RETURNEES IN THE FIRST TWO SECTORS WERE ENCOURAGING HOWEVER THE CONSEILS OF EACH OF THE SECOND TWO HAD NO FIGURES AVAILABLE. ALL SECTORS HAD EXPERIENCED CONSIDERABLE DESTRUCTION AND, WHILE MOST PEOPLE ARE BACK IN THEIR OWN VILLAGES, MANY OF THEM ARE FORCED TO CAMP OUT BECAUSE THEIR HOMES WERE DESTROYED. THERE ARE NO MATERIALS AVAILABLE FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND FOOD IS IN SHORT SUPPLY. VERY LITTLE NGO ACTIVITY.

At approximately 1000h on 15 Jan 95, a Rwandese national by the name of HAKIZIMANA, YURIYANE took refuge with the Mali troops

at KABGUYI from 2 RPA soldiers in hot pursuit. They claimed that they had orders to arrest the civilian for murder. The civilian had come from NYAMABUYE commune, SHOGWE sector as part of the carrying party for his cousin, who was ill and had come by stretcher to KABGUYI for medical attention. The soldiers were requested to produce evidence of their orders. They could not and left. They have not come back. The civilian was given food and shelter for the night. The matter was passed to the GITARAMA Human Rights team on 16 Jan. They prepared a letter to the CO of 31st Bn, GITARAMA requesting help in resolving the matter. The civilian will be given asylum until a reply is received from the RPA. He will be turned over to them if the Bn comd can assure us that he is aware of some evidence against M. HAKIZIMANA. If not, M. HAKIZIMANA will be transported back to SHOGWE and turned over to the counsell of his sector with a request that he be charged properly or left alone.
