

Subject:- CLOSING OF UNIT/CONTINGENT SUBSISTENCE
ACCOUNTS

1 The attention of the Chief Logistics Officer has been directed, by the Secretary- Property Survey Board, to a recent incident in which a self-accounting unit departed CONGO without submitting a final closing Subsistence Return. As a result of this failure by the unit to comply with standing instructions, the Chief, Unit Stores and Accounts Control Section was obliged to compile a return from documents made available by the Supply Depot and Military Personnel.

2 This is a lengthy process and precludes the possibility of a unit disputing the final closing overdrawals figures which are used as the basis for the preparation of a case to the Secretary - Property Survey Board wherein a recommendation is made that the value of overdrawals be claimed from the Contingent's Government.

3 In order that Contingents' Accounts may be cleared finally, prior to their departure or the departure of the rear party, the following procedure will be adhered to without fail:-

- a. All monthly returns will be submitted in sufficient time to reach this Headquarters not later than the 10th day of the month following the month during which the transactions took place that are being accounted for except that, in the case of a unit closing out, the return will be submitted on the last day of accountability.


- b. No exception to para (a) will be permitted. All units are reminded that the return consists of four forms; the 11-1, 11-2, 11-3 and 11-4. These forms- with the exception of the 11-4, are all daily forms- that is to say that the transactions recorded on the 11-1, 11-2 and 11-3 are recorded on the day applicable. This in turn means that the compilation of the account on form 11-4 should be able to be finalised in a very brief period of time.
- c. All subsistence returns are to be addressed as follows:-

Unit Stores and Accounts Control Section,
ONUC (Box 59)
LEOPOLDVILLE

and all reference to Supply and Purchase Control is to be ignored.

4 All overdrawals are to be reduced by underdrawing rations on the depot and by the return of stocks in hand to the Supply Depot on normal issue vouchers. The reserve ration is to be returned on vouchers separate to those mentioned in the first sentence of this paragraph and are to be clearly marked " RESERVE RATION".

5 Should any of the points raised in this instruction **kindly** not be understood the Liaison Officer should visit the Unit Stores and Accounts Control Section in Room-16, Le ROYAL, LEOPOLDVILLE. If no. questions are raised by Liaison Officers by 30 Sep 63 then it will be **presumed** that this instruction is fully understood and **action** is being planned accordingly.

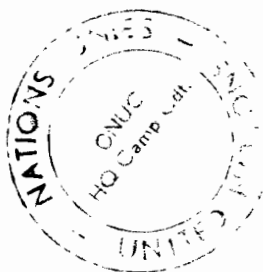



1. At about 1450 hours 19 SEP 62, ONUC ID Card No 60176 Sgt OTIRI Godfrey, Nigerian, Nigeria Army Medical Corps, CAMP N'GALIEMA, LEOPOLDVILLE, came to this office in person and reported the theft of his overnight bag containing personal articles.
2. I interviewed Sgt OTIRI, and a verbal statement was obtained. He stated that at about 2300 hours 14 SEP 62, prior to leaving CAMP N'GALIEMA, he left his overnight bag containing three or four letters, a Savings Account Pass Book, and one pillow slip, in the room of an Indian NCO at the Camp. He added that there were a number of servicemen in the room, but he could not identify them if he was to see them again. Sgt OTIRI, went on to say that when he returned to the Indian NCO's room, at about 0800 hours 15 SEP 62, he could not find the overnight bag or the contents. He made inquiries and also searched the area, but with negative results.
3. In view of the minor value of the missing articles, of about \$2.50, plus the lapse of time between the loss being discovered on 15 SEP 62, and the time it was reported to this office on 19 SEP 62, it is felt that further investigation is not warranted. This case will be considered closed at this office, unless otherwise directed.

In accordance with your instruction this report covers internal administration for the week ending 1st Sept.

1. Repairs/ Maintenance

He is employed in the Dining Hall and is a constant source of trouble to the Cooking Staff and the Catering Officer. He has been grossly insubordinate and has, on occasion, adopted a threatening attitude to the NCOs of the Staff. I would request that, if possible, he be given alternative employment outside this Camp.
