

Dear Mr. Secretary-General,

I am grateful to you for your letter of July 25, 1958, in which you put two questions to the Government of Lebanon. I took up this matter with Beirut immediately and I am now in a position to transmit to you the attitude of the Government of Lebanon on these matters.

1. The Government of Lebanon is willing to conclude an agreement with the United Nations regarding United Nations military personnel stationed in Lebanon for UNOGIL purposes, similar to the one concluded early 1957 with Egypt on UNEF. The Government of Lebanon wants these United Nations military personnel to be, both in its view and in the view of the United States Government, adequate for the preservation of the independence and integrity of Lebanon.

2. The Government of Lebanon believes that these United Nations military personnel should be so armed as to be able militarily to prevent any illegal infiltration of men or smuggling of arms into Lebanese territory as well as any aggression on Lebanon of any kind, and towards these ends they would, in the performance of the tasks assigned to them, cooperate with the Lebanese armed forces.

3. Certainly the United Nations military personnel will have the rights of search and detention and the right to fire in self-defence. It is also expected that they would not be confined to the cities but would take up position at the frontiers of Lebanon to restore order and peace to those regions and to safeguard them against any aggression.

4. The Government of Lebanon is of the opinion that these United Nations military personnel should be contributed by such states as Canada, Belgium, Denmark, Holland, and the like.

I wish to thank you for the genuine interest you have shown in our situation and to express to you my desire personally as well as the desire of the Government of Lebanon to cooperate with you most constructively in the fulfilment of your duties.



I have the honour to refer to your letter concerning the assignment of three additional Canadian officers for service with UNOGIL.

The Prime Minister of Canada announced in the House of Commons yesterday that the Government has agreed to the assignment of the officers requested. The Department of National Defence has, in consequence, selected two Majors and one Captain for secondment to UNOGIL. The names of these officers are not yet available.

The officers are ready to leave as of Saturday, July 26. It has been agreed that the necessary travel arrangements should be made by the United Nations through the agents of Thomas Cooke and Son in Ottawa. Thomas Cooke should get in touch with Captain Boire of Army Movements, at CE 2-8211, Extension 6-7640. We have been informed that the officers concerned will be inoculated in accordance with United Nations instructions received at the time of the despatch of the previous group of Canadian officers for service with UNOGIL. Arrangements are also being made to obtain the necessary Lebanese visas.

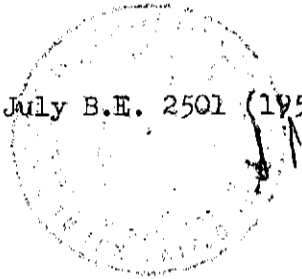



It is hoped that the Observation Group will meet with the utmost success, and that the contribution of the Government of Nepal will further the work of the Group and restore peace to the troubled area.

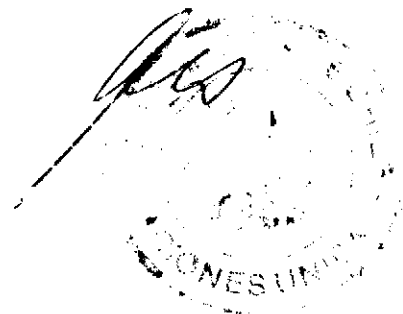
