**PLANNING GUIDANCE FOR FIXED INSTALLATION SECURITY IN KIGALI -
SECTOR 6**

Reference:

A HQ UNAMIR 5000.12 (Ops) dated 30 Aug 94.

1. It is intended to issue planning guidance for the security requirements of fixed installations in Kigali (Sector 6), in the near future. The purpose of this guidance is to ensure conformity between units and with Security Alert Measures (SAMs) (to be issued). This guidance is likely to include:

- a. A description of the fixed installations in Kigali.
- b. A summary of the security measures required at each location, to include:
 - (1). Sentry manning.
 - (2). Entry/exit procedures.
 - (3). Mobile/roving patrols.
 - (4). Communications requirements.
- c. Rapid Reaction Force (RRF) planning guidance - RRF details already issued as Reference A.
- d. Command and Control.
- e. Wider applicability of procedures to other fixed installations.

In order to facilitate the planning process, action addressees are asked to submit their current orders for the security of installations in Kigali to G3 Plans by **Thu 20 Oct 94**.

Washington - A Congressional Committee approved legislation Wednesday setting a 1 March cut-off date for US military intervention in Haiti. The measure, approved by the House of Representatives Foreign Affairs Committee on a party-line 27-15 vote, gives President Clinton after-the-fact authorization for the operation. In addition to setting a date, the legislation limits the mission of US forces in Haiti to protecting American citizens, stabilizing the security situation to permit progress towards democratic rule and facilitating delivery of humanitarian aid. RWANDA

Paris - The UN is considering the use of force to move defeated Rwandan ex-government soldiers out of refugee camps near the border in Zaire, according to a report obtained by AFP Wednesday. In a report to Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali dated 19 September, UN envoy Shaharyar Khan said the UN might have to invoke Chapter VII powers, which provide for the use of force, to move some 16,000 soldiers away from the border and deeper into Zaire.

UN spokesmen in Geneva and New York said they did not know of the report but cautioned that any UNAMIR operation would need approval by the Security Council. Diplomats said such approval was rather unlikely for the time being. Khan's move comes amid growing fears that the defeated troops are planning an offensive to restart Rwanda's civil war, and amid attempts to end their intimidation of civilian refugees. (AFP)

MIDDLE EAST

Jerusalem - Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin may attend a regional economic conference in Casablanca next month alongside high-ranking officials from throughout the Arab world, his spokesman said Wednesday. This would mark the first time an Israeli Prime Minister would meet senior officials from a large number of Arab countries since Yitzhak Shamir launched Middle East peace talks in Madrid three years ago. (REUTERS)

US/RUSSIA

Washington - President Bill Clinton and Russian President Boris Yeltsin set about improving economic ties between the two countries Wednesday and drumming up millions of dollars in US investment to Russia. The leaders launched their second day of summit talks with discussions on widening trade and addressing demands from Russia that it be treated as an equal partner on the economic level and not as a charity
