1. General Situation:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

B. PMT KIGALI Prefecture visited the National Office for Information. A Director General of that office disclosed that Radio UNAMIR should have come into being before and during the war when there was perpetuation of genocide in the country.

C. They also visited the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Reconstruction where a Director General of the Ministry called on UNAMIR to embark on public enlightenment campaign of its goals as majority of the people of RWANDA do not know why UNAMIR is in RWANDA. He also requested that UNAMIR should see to resolve the social problems of the IDPs/Refugees.

1.2 SOCIAL

There are substantial increase in social activities in the country as observed by UNAMIR CIVPOL in the Sectors.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

People continued to go about their businesses peacefully. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Rwanda observe increase in volume of commercial activities.

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers throughout the country have noticed high prices of goods and services. Economic activities are going on unimpeded with visible increase in small scale businesses.

1. General Situation:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

B. PMT-GITARAMA Prefecture visited the Burgmestre of RUNDA Commune who assured them of his preparedness to cooperate with the team. He hinted them that the commune has a number of mass graves located at CYABALIZA, KINYAMBI, RUGALIKA and RAYENKI and that about 80,000 people are believed to have been killed within the area during the period of the war.

He further disclosed that RPA in the commune keep suspects in a temporally prison in RUNDA before being transferred to GITARAMA prisons. Human Rights monitors have been informed accordingly.

1.2 SOCIAL

There are noticeable increase in social activities in the country as observed by UNAMIR CIVPOL in the Sectors.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

People are seen going about their business peacefully. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Rwanda observe increase volume of commercial activities.

1.4 ECONOMIC

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers throughout the country have noticed high prices of goods and services. Economic activities are going on unimpeded with visible increase in small scale businesses.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN

A. PMT-GITARAMA Prefecture visited the Burgmestre of RUNDA Commune and reported that there is one govt. clinic and one privately owned clinic for EGUSE church which are faced with acute shortage of drugs.

B. They also disclosed that a number of NGOS operating in the area are distributing seedlings, farming implements and roofing materials to the locals.

C. The locals however require assistance to repair damaged bridges, restoration of pipe borne water and telephone facilities.

D. The commune has 11 primary schools which are operating with one privately owned secondary school yet to reopen. All the schools lack teaching materials and transports.

2. CRIME WAVE

2.1 UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures reported low crime wave in the country.

2.2 PMT-GITARAMA Prefecture is assisting the military police in the investigation of 2 accident cases which occurred on 8/2/95 and 10/2/95 involving UNAMIR vehicles Nos. 1936 HR and 1097.

3. Investigation:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the prefectures are assisting Human Rights Investigation Teams to investigate cases of Human Rights violations by RPA.

Objet:

1. General Situation:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Sectors.

B. PMT-KIGALI Prefecture reported that the inability of many locals to see their detained relatives on visit to KIGALI prisons, that this has raised some suspicion among the general public in view of the prevailing insecurity problems in some parts of the country. As a follow up, the team had an interview with KIGALI Deputy Prosecutor, who explained that the inmates absence was due to the transfer of some of them to other prisons as a result of over crowding. Another reason he gave was due to illhealth, where a number of them were on admission in hospitals.

C. The team also visited the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Reconstructions where the Director General accused some NGOS operating in RWANDA as "businessmen" particularly those from the European Community countries. That out of 189 NGOS in RWANDA, 24 of them have turned down the ministry's coordination plan. He further disclosed that some of them have no programme of action and concern for the victims of the unfortunate crises.

D. PMT-BUTARE Prefecture reported of the intensification of day and night foot and mobile patrols by RPA.

1.2 SOCIAL

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the prefectures reported that the locals are seen going to churches and patronising bars and restaurants peacefully.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the prefectures have reported that business activities are booming up peacefully.

1.4 ECONOMIC

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the prefectures continue to report about high prices of goods and services in their respective areas .

1.5 HUMANITARIAN

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in BUTARE prefecture reported that the following number of refugees entered RWANDA from BURUNDI-through KANYARU-HAUTE border post:

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Monitoring Team in GIKONGORO Prefecture on arrival at GIKONGORO visited the Gendarmerie Brigade Stn. and had discussions with the Commander, who expressed satisfaction about the visit and showed his intention to cooperate with the team.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

People are seen going about their business peacefully. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Rwanda observe increase in volume of commercial activities.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN

3. Investigation:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in GESENYI Prefecture is assisting the Human Rights Field Team in GISENYI in investigating a case of arbitrary arrest of 2 locals, staff of Electrogaz by RPA. The reason for their arrest yet unknown.

B. The team is also rendering assistance to the Human Rights Field Investigation Team in a case of mysterious disappearance of a Toyota lorry from Gendarmerie brigade station, the property of one Mr. GYSELINCK, a staff of Caritas International.

C. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams continued monitoring of pending cases of Human Rights violations in Gendarmerie Brigades in the sectors.

Objet:

1. General Situation:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Sectors.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in Sect. 5B had discussions with the Administrator of Medicines Sans Frontiers (MSF) Health Centre who reported to them of RPA soldiers incessant harassment to the workers/patients by entering into the health centre and armed with military weapons against the centre's standing orders. Human Rights Field Office has been informed accordingly.

C. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6 met with Chief of Staff of the National Gendarmerie HQ Col. DEOGRATIAS NDIBWAMI who expressed great appreciation to UNAMIR CIVPOL for the support rendered in areas of technical assistance for the National Gendarmerie in RWANDA. He however requested for more assistance in the specialized units such as investigations, forensic analysis, finger printing and allied services.

D. The Chief of Communal Police of RWANDA met with UNAMIR Chief Police Training Officer and 3 other CIVPOL Observers from KIGALI Sector 6 at CIVPOL HQ on 8/2/95. Their discussion bothered on the modalities of training the first batch of the Communal Police in RWANDA..

1.2 SOCIAL

There are noticeable increase in social activities in the country as observed by UNAMIR CIVPOL in the Sectors.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

People are seen going about their business peacefully. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Rwanda observe increase in volume of commercial activities.

1.4 ECONOMIC

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers throughout the country have noticed high prices of goods and services. Economic activities are going on unimpeded with visible increase in small scale businesses.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4C monitored the distribution of food items by WFP to 6,000 persons. They also visited BUGARAMAN and found the area calm. They again monitored the crossing into RWANDA of 10 refugees from BUKAVU-ZAIRE. A total of 300 refugees are awaiting evacuation at NYAGATARE Transit Camp.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4B reported that there is a prison at BIRAMBO with inmates who are being fed by their relatives and appealed to UNAMIR for assistance.

The team further visited KIRUNDA hospital and disclosed that 2 persons have been severely wounded by unknown person(s) and are on admission. No arrest so far made. The hospital authorities further disclosed to the CIVPOL Observers that the prevalent disease in the area is measles with an average of 20 patients daily and 5 deaths a week.

Objet:

1. General Situation:

The general situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

a. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Sectors.

b. The UNAMIR CIVPOL Commissioner in company of the OSRSG/CIVPOL Liaison Officer visited Ruhengeri Gendarmerie National Training School to evaluate the progress in the training programme.

c. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6 reported that the Human Rights Team investigating the assault on a Kigali based journalist disclosed to them that the investigation so far indicates that the attack was an assassination attempt. The Commission further disclosed that the investigation report has been submitted to its HQ in Geneva.

d. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4B reported that there have been arbitrary arrests of locals by the RPA soldiers within Kibuye town for undisclosed offences. The situation is being monitored.

1.2. Social:

There are noticeable increase in social activities in the country as observed by UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers in the sectors.

1.3. Commercial:

People are seen going about their businesses peacefully. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Rwanda observe increase in volume of commercial activities.

1.4. Economic:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers throughout the country have noticed high prices of goods and services. Economic activities are going on unimpeded with more small scale business entrepreneurs emerging on a daily basis.

1.5. Humanitarian:

a. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6 monitored the resettlement of 617 refugees from Ndera DPC to their various homes. They also reported that 200 DPS were still in the Camp and more are expected from the sectors.

b. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 3A patrolled Kanyaru - Haute Border and monitored the crossing into Rwanda through Burundi of 10 refugees.

2. Crime Wave:

a. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6 - visited Gendarmerie brigades in Kigali and reported increase in stealing cases in Gikondo area in the past 48 hours.

b. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in other sectors reported low crime wave with the exception of Sectors 4A and 4B where there have been incursion of banditry.

3. Investigation:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams continue to monitor cases of Human Rights violation pending with gendarmerie brigade in the sectors.

4. Training:

The training of gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School is in progress.

Objet:

1. General Situation:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Sectors.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect.6 reported that the Human Rights field team in a bid to gather more intelligence on the attack on a Kigali based journalist went to NYAMIRAMBO on 4/2/95. The team were surrounded by a number of RPA soldiers armed with sundry military weapons who prevented them from having contacts with the locals who might be useful in consolidating evidence. The witnesses on observing the security situation became hostile. The Human Rights team disclosed to UNAMIR CIVPOL observer team that three vehicles carrying under cover agents trailed them from the scene at NYAMIRAMBO to their location in the city centre.

C. 24 UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers from Guinea Bissau (15), Djibouti (8) and Jordan (1) who did not meet the required qualification as UNCIVPOL Observers were repatriated to their home countries.

1.2 SOCIAL

There are noticeable increase in social activities in the country as observed by UNAMIR CIVPOL in the Sectors.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

People are seen going about their business peacefully.
UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Rwanda observe increase in volume of commercial activities.

1.4 ECONOMIC

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers throughout the country have noticed high prices of goods and services. Economic activities are going on unimpeded with more small scale business entrepreneurs emerging on a daily basis.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect 5B. patrolled CYANIKA border post and monitored the crossing of 49 refugees into Rwanda from UGANDA.

1. General Situation:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Sectors.

B. The CIVPOL Commissioner in Company of the Director of Training from the Gendarmerie HQ, UNAMIR, Chief Police Training Officer and Director of studies visited the RUHENGARI Gendarmerie Training School to access and evaluate the training programme.

C. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 3A and 3B have observed intensification of vehicle, motorcycle and foot patrol by RPA in the areas.

D. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6 reported that most visitors to KIGALI prisons could not locate their relations in custody. CIVPOL Observer Team conducting investigation into this development.

1.2 SOCIAL

There are noticeable increase in social activities in the country as observed by UNAMIR CIVPOL in the Sectors.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

People are seen going about their business peacefully.
UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Rwanda observe increase in volume of commercial activities.

1.4 ECONOMIC

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers throughout the country have noticed high prices of goods and services. Economic activities are going on unimpeded with more small scale business entrepreneurs emerging on a daily basis.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6A reported that 2 NGOs namely I. Open Relief Center and II. Integrated Operation Center are presently standing by to look into problems of damaged and occupied IDP/Refugees homes with a view to providing solutions.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 3 reported the deteriorating cemetery condition in the prison. Prison authority is appealing the UNAMIR for assistance.

2. CRIME WAVE

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in the Sectors reported low crime wave with the exception of Sectors 4A and 4B where there have been cases of banditry.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 3A reported that bandits armed with machetes suspected to have come from GIKONGORO IDPS attacked BUTTURO Village in RUNINYA.

C. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4B reported that a gang of about 8 bandits attacked the house of a local in RWAMATAMU killing him and injuring 4 others including a 6 months old child. The bandits who are suspected to come from ZAIRE also stole valuable property.

D. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer vehicle No. 1083 allocated to Sect. 4B was involved in an accident while on patrol to RAMATAMU Commune. 2 persons sustained minor injuries, treated and discharged at FRABATT Hospital. Vehicle extensively damaged.

1. General Situation:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Sectors.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 3A patrolled RUSATIRA Commune in connection with murder of three persons on 30 Jan. 95. Names of deceased are ASIMATA MURAKAREBA aged about 12 yrs. MULINDABABISHA 12 YRS. and NYIRIBAKWE. 2 suspects arrested on 31 Jan. 95 in connection with the case were released for lack of evidence. Also 40 people have been detained in a cell for allegedly committing genocide. According to RPA local Comdr. 2nd Lt. PATRICK LUMUMBA suspects awaiting conveyance to BUTARE and KIGALI prisons.

C. I. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4B disclosed that 62 persons drawn from NWENDO, KIVUMU and BWAKIRA Communes are undergoing police training under the command of RPA. The training started on 2/12/94.

II. Patrolled RAMATAMU Commune, revealed that on 31/1/95 bandits armed with grenades and guns entered BUTAMBO village allegedly from ZAIRE on a boat and took away 2 persons and later abandoned them. Also on the same day bandits stole 3 cattle cows and murdered the owner. Investigation in progress.

1.2 SOCIAL

The locals are observed carrying out their social activities throughout the country peacefully.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers Team continue to report increase in commercial activities through out RWANDA.

1.4 ECONOMIC

The prices of goods and services continued to remain exorbitant as reported by UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in the country.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6 disclosed that a total of 833 Refugees were resettled in KIGALI between 21/1/95 and 28/1/95 and a total of 15.024 IDP were resettled in RWANDA with the same period.

2. CRIME WAVE

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in Sector 6 visited Gendarmerie Brigades in Kigali, and disclosed that there were no reported cases of violent crimes.

3. Investigation:

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6 still monitoring the alleged case of serious assault/wounding and human right violations on a KIGALI based renowned JOURNALIST.

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams continue monitoring all pending cases of human rights violations with Gendarmerie brigades in the Sectors.

1. General Situation:

The security situation in Rwanda continues to remain calm.

1.1 Political and Administrative activities:

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Sectors.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 3A reported the attack at NYAGISENYI in RUSATIRA Commune by bandits suspected to have come from GIKONGORO DPC. 3 persons were killed and one injured in the incident. 2 suspects were arrested by the RPA. CIVPOL Observers monitoring the investigation.

C. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4B disclosed that 62 persons drawn from NWENDO, KIVUMU and BWAKIRA Communes are undergoing police training under the command of RPA. The training started on 2/12/94.

D. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 6 reported that a local Journalist, EDWARD MUTSINZI who is also a known critic of the RPF Government was seriously wounded in an attack by unknown Persons. The victim is receiving medical treatment at AUSTMED KIGALI. The government of RWANDA has instituted an investigation panel on the matter.

8 UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers from DJIBOUTI and 1 from JORDAN who do not meet the required qualifications as UNCIVPOL Observers

were repatriated to their respective home countries today.

1.2 SOCIAL

The locals are observed carrying out their social activities throughout the country peacefully.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers Team continue to report increase in commercial activities through out RWANDA.

1.4 ECONOMIC

The prices of goods and services continued to remain exorbitant as reported by UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in the country.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN

A. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 3A reported that 2 Refugees crossed into RWANDA from BURUNDI through the KANYARU-HAUTE border on 31/Jan. 1995.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4B patrolled to BWAKIRA ACHIYIDA hospital, the medical Doctor disclosed an outbreak of measles and malaria. Drugs available but appealed for Motorola radio-sets for their 2 vehicles.

C. UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Team in Sect. 4C monitored the crossing of 20, and 16 Refugees from BUGARAMA and RUSIZI respectively into RWANDA. They also disclosed that 544 Refugees are awaiting evacuation to their various homes from the NYAGATARE transit camp.

C. SECT. 4C.
Reported that a local, HASABURAMA GABRIEL was shot dead by RPA soldiers at about 21.00 Hrs on 29. Jan. 1995 at RUGUTI Village for resisting arrest.

D. SECT. 6.
Reported that International Prosecutors charged with compilation of relevant records on genocide detainees have requested the National Gendarmerie HQ. to submit investigation reports and other relevant documents/exhibits in respect of locals who have been allegedly accused of genocide during the war.

1.2 SOCIAL

The locals are observed carrying out their social activities peacefully throughout the country peacefully.

1.3 COMMERCIAL

UNAMIR CIVPOL Observers Team continue to report increase in commercial activities through out RWANDA.

1.4 ECONOMIC

The prices of goods and services continued to remain exorbitant as reported by UNAMIR CIVPOL Observer Teams in the country.

1.5 HUMANITARIAN
